ESKENDEREYA HEADS PLETCHER WORKERS

The Todd Pletcher barn was busy Sunday morning, sending out a slew of GI Kentucky Derby hopefuls over the Palm Meadows training track. Zayat Stable's

Eskendereya (Giant's Causeway), readying for a likely start in the GI Florida Derby at Gulfstream Mar. 20, led the charge. The GII Fountain of Youth S. winner breezed an easy half-mile in :49 1/5 under jockey John Velazquez. "I thought he worked very well," said Pletcher, who supervised workouts for nearly 20 stakes runners yesterday. "We were looking for him to go a half in :49, and that's exactly what he did. He galloped out well, and I'm very pleased. Our most likely scenario for him is to run in the Florida Derby. He still has one work to go, but I don't see any reason to change anything at this point. That would be the logical thing to do."

Another Pletcher charge possible for the Florida Derby is WinStar Farm's **Rule** (Roman Ruler), who breezed five panels in 1:01 1/5 in company with Stronach Stable's

five-year-old **Harlem Rocker** (Macho Uno), a probable starter in next Saturday's \$300,000 GII Gulfstream Park H. Rule was taking down his first graded stakes in the GIII Sam Davis S. at Tampa Bay Feb. 13. "[Rule]... went extremely well," said Pletcher. "I'd like to keep them [Eskendereya and Rule] separated. I'll have to talk to Elliott [Walden of WinStar Farm], but the back up would be the GI Wood Memorial [Aqueduct Apr. 3]."

has been retired, *Racing Post* reports. The six-year-old mare had been targeting the Mar. 27 G1 Dubai World Cup, but those plans were scrapped after she bled from the nose when eighth in Thursday's G2 Al Maktoum Challenge - Round 3 at Meydan. Winner of last year's G1 Japan Cup,

Vodka will be sent to Ireland to be covered by Sea the Stars (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}). Named champion two-year-old for 2006, she made history the following season when she became the first filly in 64 years to win the Japanese Derby. The bay won five international Group 1 races in her career, en route to Horse of the Year and champion older mare honors for 2008 and 2009. Trained by Katsuhiko Sumii for owner Yuzo Tanimizu, Vodka retires with a record of 26-10-5-3 and \$13,147,826 in earnings.

Weather Could Keep 'Lucky' in Cali...

Trainer Bob Baffert left the door open Sunday morning to keeping ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ **Lookin at Lucky** (Smart Strike) in California for Saturday's GII San Felipe S. at Santa Anita, rather than shipping for the GII

Rebel S. at Oaklawn Park on the same day. "I'll look at the weather at Oaklawn and if it looks like snow, I'll just keep him here," Baffert said. "But right now, the Rebel looks pretty firm. We have a lot of questions that have to be answered, wearing blinkers for the first time in a race

and running on dirt for the first time. The closer you get to the Kentucky Derby [May 1], the better off you are knowing the answers." Baffert has had to keep one eye on the weather channel all winter. In February, his charge Conveyance (Indian Charlie) won Oaklawn's GIII Southwest S. after a frozen track delayed that race for six days. The long-range forecast for Hot Springs looks largely positive, however. Weather.com calls for a few showers Friday, with mostly cloudy conditions Saturday and highs in the upper 50s.

Meanwhile, Baffert said that **Misremembered** (Candy Ride {Arg}), winner of Saturday's GI Santa Anita H. is being considered for the \$500,000, GII Oaklawn H. Apr. 4

Blind Luck (Pollard's Vision), who finished third, beaten two necks, as the 1-2 favorite in the GI Santa Anita Oaks, will likely make her next start in the GII

Fantasy S. at Oaklawn Park Apr. 5. The Grade I-winning miss exited the race in fine fettle, according to connections. "She ran very good and came back good," said Dan Ward, assistant to trainer Jerry Hollendorfer. Ward said there had been "no discussions at all" on whether Hollendorfer would make a rider change from Rafael Bejarano for the Fantasy. "I like Raffy a lot and I know he wants to win just as much as we do," said Ward.

Hall of Fame conditioner Richard Mandella said **Setsuko** (Pleasantly Perfect), second as the chalk to Alphonse's Bet (Tribal Rule) in Saturday's GIII Sham S. at Santa Anita, came out of the race fine. "We'll probably look at the GI Santa Anita Derby," Mandella added. Trainer Mike Machowsky says he'll regroup with ☆

"TDN Rising Star" ☆ **Nextdoorneighbor** (Lido Palace {Chi}), who faded to seventh after setting the pace in the Sham. "I'm not really sure why he was on the lead," Machowsky said. "I have no plans for him right now."

Susan Roy and Vinery Stables' **Awesome Act** (Awesome Again) was no worse for the wear Sunday after his breakout win in the GIII Gotham S. at Aqueduct. The chestnut was making his first start on dirt in the

Gotham, and now will be pointed toward the GI Wood Memorial S. at Aqueduct Apr. 3. "We won't do much between now and then...just keep him sound and head to the Wood," said Wayne Tanner, assistant to trainer Jeremy Nosedo, who returned

to Newmarket following the colt's 1 1/4-length victory. "He'll be back cantering at least by Wednesday, possibly Tuesday." Awesome Act was originally scheduled to fly from England the week before the Gotham, but bad weather precluded that trip. He finally arrived in New York on Wednesday, and had only a brief tour around the training track at Belmont Friday after being released from quarantine. "He basically walked up to the race," said Tanner. "The two days in quarantine really didn't bother him at all." Tanner added that the colt, who had one win in five starts in Europe last summer before shipping to be a close-up fourth in the GII Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf at Santa Anita, was a "real professional." Said Tanner, "He travels for pleasure. If he's traveling behind, whoever is in front of him, he'll pass. It takes a good one to get him off the bridle." The Gotham's second- and third-place finishers could also be headed to the Wood Memorial. Trainer Rick Dutrow Jr. said Sunday morning that **Yawanna Twist** (Yonaguska) was being considered for the nine-furlong race. "We're pleased with him," said Dutrow by telephone from Florida. "He came out of the race well." Kelly Breen said **Nacho Friend** (Friends Lake), third in the Gotham, was also possible.

Buddy's Saint, 'Eightyfive' Coming Along...

Buddy's Saint (Saint Liam) is coming along well after a rough, off-the-board finish as the favorite in the GII Fountain of Youth at Gulfstream Feb. 20, reports trainer

Bruce Levine. The dual graded stakes winner will breeze five furlongs next Saturday at Gulfstream Park as he prepares for the GI Wood Memorial S. at Aqueduct Apr. 3. "He rebounded nicely," said Levine. "He'll breeze Saturday, probably breeze twice more after that, and return to New York the week before the Wood." Buddy's Saint, forced to take

up abruptly going into the first turn of the Fountain of Youth, finished ninth behind Eskendereya (Giant's Causeway).

Another early-season Triple Crown hopeful who is coming off a rough start--to put it mildly--is Harold Lerner's **Eightyfiveinafifty** (Forest Camp). The **TDN Rising Star** dropped his rider, jumped a rail and ran around the barn area in his stakes debut in the Whirlaway S. at Aqueduct Feb. 6. He registered his first breeze since the race last Thursday, going five furlongs over the inner track in 1:00.03. It was the fastest of 11 moves at the distance that day. "He worked great," Contessa said. "I really don't have plans for him. We're nominated to everything--the Wood, the Derby Trial, everything--but I want to work him twice more before I make a decision. That's his norm though--he goes in a minute and he does it so easy."

RACHEL SCHOOLS; ASMUSSEN TALKS FITNESS Horse of the Year **Rachel Alexandra** (Medaglia d'Oro) schooled in the Fair Grounds paddock before and during Saturday's seventh race. The champ, cool and professional during the schooling, is preparing for her first start of 2010 in this Saturday's \$200,000 New Orleans Ladies S. Asmussen said Rachel Alexandra would have one more session in the paddock--most likely during Friday's races. 'Rachel' is scheduled to have her final serious drill before Saturday's race this morning, and Asmussen admitted that his star charge isn't quite at her best. "I'm very concerned about her fitness level," he said. "She's not 100-percent fit for this, and we're aware of that. She's had six works in six months. But she's a very physical horse; she is Rachel. Her gallops have been very strong." According to the Fair Grounds notes, Rachel Alexandra will be the first reigning Horse of the Year to race in New Orleans since the great Hall of Famer Whirlaway took the Fair Grounds H. in 1942.

He was sidelined four months after that effort, but followed up with a Belmont allowance score May 20. Second behind Sal the Barber in the July 1 Don Jack S. at that track, the bay took another break before running a close-up fourth in an optional claimer in Elmont Oct. 11 that proved to be his 2009 finale.
