## ZENYATTA WORTH THE WEIGHT

Jerry and Ann Moss's two-time Eclipse Award-winning distaffer **Zenyatta** (Street Cry {Ire}) kicks off her much-anticipated six-year-old campaign in Saturday's GI Santa Margarita Invitational H., conceding anywhere from 12 to 19 pounds to her seemingly overmatched rivals. The undefeated mare, making her first appearance since beating the boys in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic Nov. 7, would become the first horse since Bayakoa (Arg) in 1990 to carry as much as 127 pounds to victory in the historic event. Zenyatta will look to give trainer John Shirreffs back-to-back scores in the Santa Margarita, having saddled Life Is Sweet (Storm Cat)

last year. The big mare has the respect of her rivals. Said A.C. Avila, who entered **Made for Magic** (Cape Canaveral), "It's true [Zenyatta] is not Horse of the Year. To me, she's Horse of the Decade." And about the prospects of an upset? "It's impossible to beat the monster," he said.

## PARAGALLO GUILTY ON 33 COUNTS

Disgraced Thoroughbred owner Ernie Paragallo was convicted Wednesday on 33 of 34 counts of misdemeanor animal cruelty in a non-jury trial, according to published reports. A one-time leading owner on the New York circuit who raced the likes of Unbridled's Song and champion Artax, Paragallo came under fire last April, when all of the 177 horses on his Center Brook Farm were taken into custody by the Columbia-Greene Humane Society when they were discovered to be severely malnourished and reportedly infested with lice. His license was subsequently revoked. "Race horses--whether they are in training, retired from racing, or in active competition at our tracks--must be properly cared for in accordance with the laws of the State of New York," John Sabini, chairman of the New York Racing and Wagering Board, said in a statement. "The verdict issued today by Greene County Judge George Pulver Jr. sends a message that serious consequences await those who fail to provide proper care and sustenance to horses. All of us involved in the regulation of pari-mutuel wagering have a duty to ensure that the horrendous conditions found at Center Brook Farm in April 2009 never again manifest themselves in the barns and pastures of New York State." A sentencing hearing is scheduled for May 18. Paragallo, 52, faces a maximum fine of \$1,000 per count and up to two years in jail. He is free on \$5,000 bail and plans to appeal Wednesday's verdict.

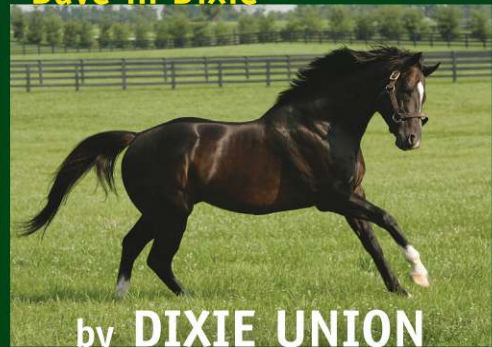

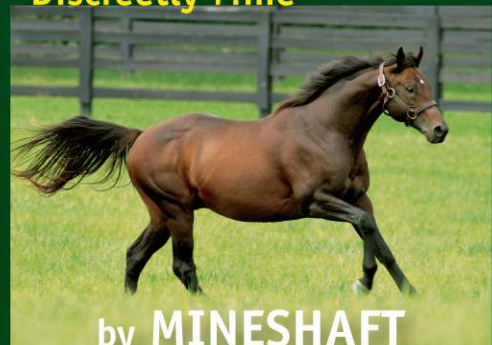

*"Gentlemen, we must all hang together or we shall most assuredly all hang separately."*

While Ben Franklin wasn't in the chamber while the New Jersey horsemen and racetracks hammered out the landmark agreement reported in yesterday's *TDN*, the participants did well to heed the sentiments he



uttered upon signing the Declaration of Independence in 1776.

I believe we will look back on the brave collective action of the groups--the New Jersey Thoroughbred Horse-

men's Association, led by Dennis Drazin and John Forbes; the Sports and Exposition Authority, led by Bob Kulina and Dennis Robinson; and the New Jersey state government, led by new governor Chris Christie, with Bob Mulcahy and Jon Hanson on his transition team--as nothing short of historic.

Just as the Declaration of Independence was the result of a group of individuals banding together to change their future through improved governance, I believe the action of the New Jersey groups will radically change the future of horse racing in America.

This past summer, the *TDN's* first magazine piece discussed a 'prescription for racing,' with much of the discussion dealing with the economic deterioration across all levels of the sport. By every standard of measure--in terms of betting handle, sales revenue, purses, stud fees--the decline has only accelerated since we published the story, just six months ago.

Racing's only path to a future is to find a way that the revenue created by producing racing is greater than the expenses associated with doing so. The subsidized, government-handout route is precarious and fleeting, at best. Finally, someone has stood up to reverse the trend of the last 30 years, which can be summed up as follows: more and more, cheaper and cheaper racing.

Remember when racing in New York closed for the winter? Remember when there were circuits? Remember boutique meets that created excitement in their geographic areas? I'm sure that when you walk into Monmouth Park this summer on a Friday, Saturday or Sunday, you're going to feel like something special is going on. I'm sure that when you walk into a simulcast, or log onto an ADW, you're going to have an opportunity to participate in some of the most bettable racing in recent memory. And I'm sure that Monmouth Park will better be able to please its customers, on- or off-site, more so than any track in recent memory.

We are finally taking a page from the world's most successful operations like Hong Kong, France and Japan, and heading in the direction we must in trying to create large handle over fewer races, thereby generating economics that can work for our future--consistent, high-quality, deep fields; owners able to pay their bills; fans recognizing that something important is going on.

In the Declaration, Thomas Jefferson wrote: *Prudence, indeed, will dictate that governments long established should not be changed for light and transient causes; and accordingly all experience has shown that mankind are more disposed to suffer, while evils are sufferable.*

Racing in my home state suffered those evils long enough. We all owe a debt of gratitude to the founding fathers of our own, homegrown New Jersey revolution.

# Letters TO THE EDITOR

While many people are congratulating themselves and taking bows for “saving” New Jersey Thoroughbred racing, the real question of what will happen next year goes unanswered. The new arrangement, which was actually forced on the horseman, does not add any money to the amount of purse dollars that will be distributed. The purse dollars are simply being compacted into fewer days. The money contributed from the casinos is part of the \$50 million that will be distributed plus the underpayment that is owed to purses from last year.

Next year, it is assured that the casinos will not be contributing any money to purses and the unpaid dollars will have been distributed in 2010. It is likely that the purse structure will collapse in 2011. Where will the authors of this year's great plan be standing then?

As New York gets slots (eventually), and Delaware and Philadelphia expand to table games, Atlantic City casinos, intentionally tucked away from the New Jersey population centers, will have lost more of their clients. Their solution is to try kill New Jersey racing by lobbying against our racetracks. Brilliant! They must know who their former customers were and where they are now. All they need to do is send out a few underemployed executives and check the license plates at Delaware and Philadelphia Park. If that does not do the trick wait until Aqueduct opens and they will then understand why their casinos are empty.

It is not possible that they do not understand all this. For years, they paid the New Jersey racetracks not to seek to build casinos. Yet the neighboring states built them and there went the business anyway. Partnering with Monmouth Park and the Meadowlands would have been a bright move. The Meadowlands is especially well located to become as good a casino location as anywhere in the United States. So why not pursue that combination of sports, horseracing and casinos? The answer appears to be greed!

## NTRA REPORT FROM CAPITOL HILL



### IMMIGRATION REFORM A PRIORITY FOR OBAMA

Comprehensive immigration reform legislation is a priority for the Obama administration in 2010. President Obama has announced specific goals for the new legislation, including a way to resolve the status of an estimated 12 million illegal immigrants in the United States. To do this, the president wants legislation that requires illegal immigrants to register, pay a fine for being in the U.S. illegally, learn English and pay taxes or leave the country. He also wants additional border security and enforcement against employers who utilize undocumented workers.

A key White House meeting on immigration reform was postponed early this week. The scheduled meeting was to bring together President Obama, Senate Judiciary Immigration Subcommittee Chairman Charles Schumer (D-NY) and Sen. Lindsey Graham (R-SC). The meeting has not yet been rescheduled.

Sen. Schumer and Sen. Graham have been working to craft legislation that would reform the nation's immigration laws. The president told both parties that if they can craft a bill to address his goals, he is intent on working with them for resolution.

Or are the folks from Pennsylvania, Delaware and New York just smarter than the people who are the leaders of New Jersey? I hope not.
