OBS MARCH TO TEST MARKET

The two-day OBS March Selected Two-Year-Olds in



Training sale kicks off at 2 p.m. today, followed by an 11 a.m. session Wednesday. Heavy rain and wind postponed the breeze shows to the weekend, and was also the culprit for a later post time today. Weather aside, consignors agree that OBSMAR should serve as a better barometer of current market conditions than the first two juvenile auctions this season.

"Miami is a strange place, and always has been," consignor Ciaran Dunne of Wavertree Stables offered. "There are so many people that kind of just go through the motions down there, because they feel that if anything is worth buying, the two big houses will buy it and they can't compete."

He continued, "The first sale [OBSFEB], we sold what--60 something horses? I don't know how you judge the market on that. So, really, this is the first time we're going to dip our toe in, so to speak. It will be interesting."

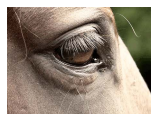
This year's catalogue features 183 fewer lots than 2009, a sale topped by El Kingdom (El Prado {Ire}) for \$450,000. Last year also produced GI Champagne S.

hero Homeboykris (Roman Ruler), as well as Saturday's GIII Tampa Bay Derby winner Odysseus (Malibu Moon).

"We've been fairly busy, and we're hoping that, with less horses than last year and having some nice horses, we'll do all right," Leprechaun Racing's Mike Mulligan commented. "If there were 40 or so top-end horses last year, maybe that number drops to 20 this year. Hopefully, that'll get some of the buyers down to the other horses--the \$40,000-to-\$80,000 horses--and that market will heat up because there's less inventory. But you just don't know what the market's going to bring you." **OBSMAR Coverage cont. p3**

Breeders have made quite a few attempts over the years to establish stallions from a South American background in the North American industry, but most of these stallions have enjoyed only patchy success at best.

The most notable exception has to be Forli, who left an indelible mark on the breed by siring the aptly named Special--plus Swale's dam Tuerta--during his years at Claiborne. Those years also yielded a fistful of American Grade I performers, headed by the incomparable Forego, and Europe also witnessed high-class performances from the likes of Thatch, Formidable, Posse, Home Guard, Gay Fandango and Sadeem.

Perhaps Forli succeeded where others failed simply because he was the most talented racehorse among them, a winner of his first nine starts, and we mustn't underestimate the advantage he enjoyed from being supported by Claiborne and its clients.

The last two weekends have raised the tantalising possibility that Candy Ride, another import from Argentina, could eventually make a similar impact. With Misremembered taking the GI Santa Anita H. and Sidney's Candy the GII San Felipe S., Candy Ride now ranks fourth on the leading sires' table, behind stallions standing the 2010 season at fees of \$100,000, \$75,000 and \$100,000. **Cont. p2**

Candy Ride's fee this year, in his first season at Lane's End, is a much more modest \$25,000, which makes him the lowest-priced stallion in the top 10. What's more, he owes his position to progeny sired at fees of \$10,000 and \$12,500, as his fee never rose higher than \$12,500 in his first five seasons.

Hill 'n' Dale Farm clearly did a fine job with him in those early years, as Candy Ride now had six graded winners to his credit from the 202 named foals in his first two crops, including three Grade I winners (the others being Capt. Candyman Can and Evita Argentina).

Perhaps it isn't too fanciful to mention Candy Ride in the same breath as Forli, as this unbeaten horse also proved himself one of the most talented horses produced by Argentina. Indeed, he was talented enough to rank alongside Mineshaft and Johar as the leading American-trained older horses on the 2003 International Classifications. That rating reflected the excellence of his performance in the G1 Pacific Classic, in which he lowered the track record in defeating Medaglia d'Oro. It was a great shame that he never again made it to the races, despite being kept in training in 2004.

Although his opening fee of \$10,000 was no doubt influenced by this lengthy period out of the limelight, his modest price was surely more a reflection of the fact that Candy Ride is a son of Ride the Rails. While Ride the Rails (Cryptoclearance) was good enough to finish second to Holy Bull in the Florida Derby, he didn't manage a graded victory. Arguably the most interesting thing about him was his 4x3 inbreeding to Alablue, an influential broodmare who numbers the likes of Revidere, Proper Reality and Harlan's Holiday among her many successful descendants.

Ride the Rails is clearly proving no handicap to Candy Ride's stallion career, though I wonder whether a greater influence in Candy Ride's pedigree is his broodmare sire Candy Stripes, who also gave us Invasor and Leroidesanimaux.

Invasor was every bit as talented as Candy Ride, to the extent that he was rated two pounds higher on the International Classifications, so it is going to be interesting to see whether he too can fly the flag for Argentina as a stallion.

Sidney's Candy--as his name suggests--was bred by Sidney and Jenny Craig, who also bred the Grade III winner Chocolate Candy from Candy Ride, who carried the Craigs' colors in the States. Sidney's Candy is out of Fair Exchange, who managed nothing better than a third in five appearances. On the other hand, Misremembered's dam Beyond Perfection was good enough to win the GII Del Mar Debutante and GIII Bay Meadows Oaks, and the dams of Capt. Candyman Can and Chocolate Candy were also stakes winners.

Although Fair Exchange didn't show a great deal of ability, there is no faulting her pedigree, as she is by Storm Cat out of the Grade I turf winner Exchange. Unlike her daughter, Exchange had a long and successful career on the track. Her record of 15 wins from 30 starts featured Grade I wins for Sidney Craig in the Santa Barbara H. over 1 1/4 miles at five and in the Matriarch S. over 1 1/8 miles at six. Unfortunately, Fair Exchange was her only named foal. With a sire and a second dam who both scored over 1 1/4 miles, there is no reason why 1 1/16 miles should prove the limit of Sidney's Candy's stamina.

The fact that Fair Exchange is by Storm Cat is significant, as Capt. Candyman Can is out of a Storm Creek mare and Evita Argentina is out of a daughter of Forest Wildcat. My immediate reaction to this was that Candy Ride, as a member of the Fappiano male line, had probably been inundated with mares from the Storm Cat line. A bit of research showed that this wasn't the case in his first two seasons, but three graded winners will surely have changed all that.

The French Connection...

Hubert Guy's California-based Bloodstock Management Services made a name for itself by purchasing horses privately in Europe and sending them across the pond to race in the United States. The prestigious honor roll includes four Breeders' Cup winners--1996-97 GI Breeders' Cup Sprint champions Lit de Justice (El Gran Senor) and Elmhurst (Wild Again), as well as 1999 and 2001 GI Breeders' Cup Mile victors Silic (Fr) (Sillery) and Val Royal (Fr) (Royal Academy). However, as the value of the U.S. dollar continued to weaken the past few years, the 52-year-old native of France decided to shift his focus.

"My bread-and-butter business was importing horses from Europe to the United States, but because of the dollar-to-Euros situation two or three years ago, it didn't look as good for my clients, financially," said Guy, who has purchased no fewer than 21 Grade/Group 1 horses since opening shop in the early 1980s. "In the late 1990s and early 2000s, the dollar was worth about .85 cents to the Euro. But now, it's \$1.50 to the Euro. On top of it, you also have Sheikh Mohammed and others buying so many horses in Europe--the horses we used to bring back to America--and pointing them for the Dubai Carnival. You could still find nice horses, but you have to pay a tremendous amount for them. So I switched to buying at the yearling and two-year-old sales."

Guy got off to a quick start at the sales, purchasing subsequent graded stakes winner Soul Warrior (Lion Heart) as a yearling. He acquired the son of Urmia (Meadowlake) for \$95,000 at Keeneland September, then successfully pinhooked him through Nick de Meric's consignment at the following year's OBSMAR sale for \$290,000. Bearing the colors of Zayat Stables, Soul Warrior went on to upset GI Kentucky Derby winner Mine That Bird (Birdstone) in last term's GII West Virginia Derby.

"I started as a seller at the two-year-old sales, but then said, 'I'm here, I might as well start looking at the preview and start selecting some horses to race, too.'"

So far this season, Guy has signed tickets on five juveniles for a total of \$605,000. He picked up four two-year-olds at OBSFEB--[hip 21](#), a \$180,000 El Corredor colt; [hip 61](#), a \$115,000 Trippi filly; [hip 78](#), a \$60,000 Bellamy Road colt; and [hip 144](#), a \$110,000 Stormy Atlantic colt. He added one more at Fasig-Tipton Calder, acquiring [hip 63](#), a colt by Rockport Harbor, for \$140,000,

"The four at OBS were for European clients that race in France and Dubai, and the one at Calder was for a California client," Guy revealed. "I buy for clients, and I also buy for myself as well. It all depends."

What does Guy look for in potential purchases at the two-year-old sales?

"I look at the breeze first, then take a look at the individual," he explained. "Of course, you look at the pedigree, too, but the main guideline to start with is the breeze. You want an athletic horse that will not only be a speedball, but can also go a distance of ground. Sometimes horses breeze very well, but can only go five or six furlongs. I look for fillies and colts that can go a mile or further, look sound and are going to be runners."

Even with the encouraging results of the Fasig-Tipton Calder sale, Guy, like many others, isn't completely convinced that the market is out of the woods yet.

"Yes and no," Guy explained. "You have to go beyond the numbers with the Calder sale. Everybody ends up on the same horses. It was good for the market and tremendous for the sellers of the 20 horses that made money, but the whole picture isn't as good-looking as that sale says. The few real nice horses sold real well, but what happened to the rest of them? That doesn't hide the fact that a few horses got sold. Not to be negative, but there's no middle and no bottom market--it's as simple as that. Money is still very tight." -SS

Florida Sires Could Do Well on Day One...

The reasoning goes that buyers tend to lean toward more established sires in a down market, but several first-year sires are making a case for themselves in 2010. Champion **Bernardini** (A.P. Indy), not surprisingly, leads all freshman sires with two to sell for an average of \$510,000 (at Calder, he had a \$500,000 colt and a \$520,000 filly). Henny Hughes (Hennessy) is the second-leading sire with two or more to sell. A Darley stallion like Bernardini, he has seen six of his youngsters sell for an average of \$225,833, including a \$700,000 colt at Calder.

This afternoon, however, some less flashy freshman sires could make an impact, including a few intriguing Florida stallions.

With Distinction, a Grade III-winning son of Storm Cat who stands at Hartley/De Renzo Thoroughbreds for \$7,500, has six catalogued at March. Consignor Cary Frommer is high on the chances of her **With Distinction**, a filly who sells toward the end of trading this afternoon as hip [168](#). The bay, a Jan. 1 foal, is a product of SW and MGSP Laurica (Tactical Advantage).

"She's big, scopey and stands over a lot of ground," enthused Frommer. "And she's fast. Lisa McGreevy picked her out for Michael Sucher as a yearling here at OBS."

Hip 168 breezed an eighth in [:10 2/5](#) at the first under-tack show.

Halcyon Hammock's **With Distinction** filly, hip [71](#), got the distance a tick faster, going in a bullet [:10 1/5](#).

"She's the best filly I've had here since I sold Foxy Danseur [\$280,000, OBS March 2007]," said consignor Hal Hatch. "She's tall, scopey and has plenty of muscle, and she's real smart."

Dean De Renzo, who fielded several inquiries about **With Distinction** yesterday on the sales grounds, said the size of the fillies is indicative of their sire.

"He's the biggest Storm Cat you've ever seen," he said. "He's out of an Alydar mare."

A.P. Indy's Grade II winner **Congrats** has thrown a number of good-looking juveniles at the sales this year, including several at March. The 11-year-old, who stands at Vinery for a fee of \$4,500 in 2010, is a full-brother to the very useful sire **Flatter**. **Congrats**'s March reps include Off the Hook's hip [124](#). The son of the stakes-winning mare For All Who Dream (Eltish) impressed with a [:22 flat](#) quarter-mile breeze Saturday.

"The stride-length people will like him," said consignor Joe Appelbaum. "He went in [:22](#) flat, but did it in such a nice way. He's a neat colt--he was training with our Calder group the whole while, but we felt this was a better spot for him. He's gotten a good amount of interest. The **Congrats** seems to be well-received this year."

Langfuhr's son **Imperialism** never broke through at the highest level, but he was a three-time Grade II winner who showed his ability with placings in the GI Kentucky Derby (third) and GI Santa Anita Derby (second). He has just one catalogued at March, Southern Chase Farm's hip [95](#). A well-muscled, strong-looking colt, hip 95 is a son of Dover Court (Gold Alert), and breezed a quarter in [:21 3/5](#) Saturday.

"We love this horse," said consignor Greg Dodd. "On a scale of 1 to 10 as a mover, he's a 12. He's a pretty-moving son of a gun."

Dodd added that he's heard nothing but good things about the members of **Imperialism**'s first crop.

“We have had a lot of people come to see this horse who have Imperialisms, and everyone I’ve talked to love theirs,” Dodd said. “We’re actually breeding two mares to Imperialism this year. Ironically, at almost the exact same time this colt was breezing Saturday at 8:25 a.m., his daddy was covering one of our mares.”

going to have to rely on that. He’s fairly mellow, and he’s nice. And I love Jump Start as a stallion--he’s so honest.”

75, c, Medaglia d’Oro--Colorado Song, by Pine Bluff
Consigned by Eisaman Equine, agent

From the family of Tomorrows Cat and Teton Forest and produced by a half-sister to MSW and MGSP Tomorrows Sunshine (Silver Deputy), this colt looked good breezing an eighth in :10 3/5 Saturday. He was acquired for a modest \$25,000 by Eisaman Equine at last year’s Fasig-Tipton Kentucky October sale, and has done plenty of growing in the interim, reports Shari Eisaman.

“When I bought him, he wasn’t a big, huge horse,” she said. “But he just started growing. He’s changed so much, and now he looks like the sire. He’s a big, long-back, low-moving Medaglia d’Oro. He just floats over the racetrack. He’s typical of that sire.”

Her first three to the races, all now winners, include the good sprinter Ikigai (Whywhywhy), winner of the Gill Mr. Prospector S. at Gulfstream. An \$80,000 KEESOP yearling purchase, the colt breezed a quarter in :22 2/5 at the under-tack show. “He very much resembles the sire, but is a hair bigger,” said consignor Eddie Woods. “He’s a good mover, has a bit of pedigree and is a nice horse. There’s a lot to like about him.”

93, c, Smart Strike--Dixie Holiday, by Dixieland Band
Consigned by Niall Brennan Stables, agent

Leading sire Smart Strike was responsible for the second-highest-priced lot at Fasig-Tipton Calder, a colt acquired by Demi O’Byrne for \$825,000. That one was out of a Dixieland Band mare, and is thus similarly bred to this bay, who breezed an eighth Saturday in a co-bullet :10 1/5. Hip 93 is a half to the ill-fated Holiday Runner (Meadowlake), a stakes-winning juvenile who had already produced MGISW Seventh Street (Street Cry {Ire}) and GSP Reynaldothewizard (Speightstown) when she sold for a sale-topping \$2.15 million last year at Fasig-Tipton November. She died Feb. 6 after foaling complications. “He’s the obvious one,” Niall Brennan said. “Obviously, the page is huge, and he’s a Smart Strike who’s a lovely individual. And he breezed great.”

At the first under-tack show, the colt breezed a furlong in a snappy **:10 2/5**. "He's a nice, balanced, athletic colt," said consignor Nick de Meric. "He seems to handle any surface, really."

A registered New York-bred, this Apr. 27-foaled bay hails from the immediate family of the top sprinter Affirmed Success, as his dam is a full-sibling to the GI Cigar Mile, GI Carter H. and GI Vosburgh S. winner. His second dam is a stakes-placed half to Exbourne. David McKathan signed the ticket for this colt for \$80,000 at Fasig-Tipton Saratoga. At Saturday's under-tack show, he stopped the clock in **:10 3/5** for a one-furlong move.

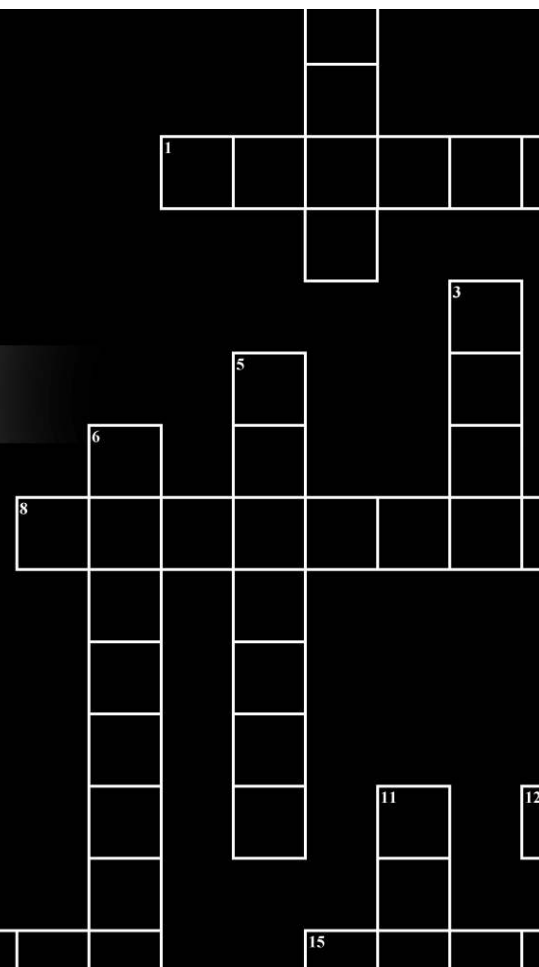
