'TUSCAN' LIGHTS OUT AT SANTA ANITA

Tuscan Evening (Ire) (Oasis Dream {GB}) arrived in North America as a maiden, but has subsequently blossomed into Southern California's top distaffer on grass. She earned a career high in the GII Royal Heroine Mile S. at Hollywood Park July 11, then was eighth in the GI John C. Mabee S. at Del Mar Aug. 16 and third in the GIII Senator Ken Maddy H. at Oak Tree Oct. 17. She has been nearly unbeatable since those defeats. Heroine of the GII Las Palmas H. on the Breeders' Cup undercard Nov. 6, the bay was a solid second to Ventura (Chester House) in the GI Matriarch S. in Inglewood Nov. 28. Tuscan Evening prevailed by a length in the GIII Monrovia H. down the hill Jan. 3 and by 2 1/4 lengths in the GII Buena Vista H. over a mile at this venue Feb. 15, and was favored here despite having to negotiate an extra furlong. Clear on the lead through a leisurely half of :49.78, she shrugged off a challenge from Cat by the Tale at the top of the stretch to complete the hat trick. SUN TO SHINE ON BARRETT'S?

A later date in March finds the Barretts Selected Sale of Two-Year-Olds in Training set to take place today, with clouds giving way to sunshine by the time selling starts at 2 p.m. local time at Hinds Pavilion. After a cautious start to the juvenile sales market in February, both Fasig-Tipton Calder and OBS March boasted gains in median and average, albeit with trimmed catalogues, and consignors are hopeful that trend will continue this afternoon. "I think the market is starting to climb," consignor Eddie Woods remarked. "You saw it a bit in Miami, but that's always been a boutique sale, and remains that way. We got into a very good sale for the quality of horse at OBS March, and that's a barometer of the real world." With Barretts now following OBS March on the sales calendar, consignors Jerry Bailey and Ciaran Dunne voiced similar opinions about the potential positive impact for this auction. "There were a lot of people sitting on their hands here, thinking, 'Well, there's 500 next week,' and now there aren't those horses next week," Dunne said. Bailey, who sold the \$525,000 topper at OBS March, offered, "The California trainers would go out to OBS March and shop it hard. Now, this is it. Maybe they were successful out there and maybe they weren't, but, if they've still got money, they'll spend it here." Barretts Hip Happenings, p4

After the Tommy Stack barn had captured the first three races on this opening card of the 2010 Irish Flat season, Pollen had a formidable stable run to uphold and did so in game style to record a first black-type success. She had captured the Irish Lincolnshire H. at this fixture 12 months ago and run only four times thereafter, culminating in a fourth in the Listed Knockaire S. at Leopardstown in November. Towards rear early, the homebred challenged wide and after gaining the advantage approaching the furlong pole was always holding Devoted to You in the drive to the line. "She's a tough mare and carried me into the race and picked up when I needed her to," jockey Billy Lee said of the winner, who is now bound for the G3 Gladness S. back at this venue Apr. 11. "When Johnny [Murtagh] quickened [on Devoted to You], I thought he might have the race won there, but she battled hard and galloped all the way to the line." Triple Threats

FLORIDA DERBY TOP THREE TO KENTUCKY

The top three finishers in the GI Florida Derby will all train up to the May 1 GI Kentucky Derby, *Daily Racing Form* reports. **Ice Box** (Pulpit), the 20-1 upset winner of Saturday's race, will ship to Churchill Downs around the first week of April. "He's had three 1 1/8-mile races in a row," trainer Nick Zito told *DRF*. "I don't see the point of running anywhere. There's absolutely nothing to gain." **Pleasant Prince** (Indy King), a nose behind Ice Box in second at 25-1, will fly to Lexington on Wednesday to train over Keeneland's Polytrack surface. "I've probably had a thousand works [over the surface] and I could count on one hand the number of horses that have gotten hurt there," trainer Wesley Ward told the publication. **Rule** (Roman Ruler), third in the Florida Derby after contesting the pace as the 9-5 favorite, will ship to Churchill Downs around Apr. 20.

"We hope that Vale of York makes a full recovery soon, but obviously right now, all future plans are on hold for him," Godolphin's Racing Manager Simon Crisford reported on the stable's web site. After concluding his juvenile campaign with a game victory in the Breeders' Cup, Vale of York returned to run fifth in the Mar. 4 Listed Al Bastakiya at Meydan in his most recent trip to the post.

This May 1 foal hadn't been asked to do much at the farm, but skipped over the track during her **:10 2/5** work Friday. She is a homebred for David Lanzman, and is a half-sister to 2009 GI Wood Memorial S. hero I Want Revenge (Stephen Got Even). "She's a beautiful filly who looks more like her mother and her brother [than her sire]," said consignor David Showalter. "The only problem is that we don't have the mare anymore." Shortly after producing this filly, Group 1 winner Meguial was sold back to her native Argentina, covered on Southern Hemisphere time by Chapel Royal. Sommer Smith added, "She's an attractive horse with a lot of quality. She's a May foal and has some maturing to do, so we didn't want to lean on her, but she went in **:10 2/5** and did it very easily."

7, c, Forest Wildcat--Miss Cheektowaga, by Crafty Friend
Consigned by Jerry Bailey Sales Agency, Agent I

This powerfully made bay, a Gulf Coast Farm homebred, worked in **:10** before going a bit wide on the turn. He has a lot in common with another Jerry Bailey alumnus by Forest Wildcat. "He's a fast horse and very much resembles [MGSW] Salute the Sarge, who we raised and sold [for \$300,000] out here in [2007]," noted Bailey, who was the leading consignor at this venue last year. "He's jumped through all the hoops, and is very smart and sound." His dam is a half-sister to GSW More Smoke (Smoke Glacken) and GISP Squallacious (Summer Squall).

"We really don't try to do that, because he's a big horse and because of how tight the turn is. We want them to go out there and do it right, to be free-moving, and whatever happens after that is basically up to the horse. To see a big horse handle that turn speaks volumes as to how athletic he is." O'Hara, who sold seven at this venue last year, including SW Well Deserved, added, "He was a private purchase as a yearling in late September. He likes to train, and I've not had one issue with him in all the time we've had him."

This chestnut filly shared Friday's fastest time for a quarter-mile, **:20 4/5**, with her barnmate (see below) and another youngster. Thomas picked her up for \$40,000 at KEESEP; she hails from the versatile Crim-son Saint family. "She's is out of an A.P. Indy mare, so she stands over a lot of ground," Thomas explained. "She's a big, strong filly, and acts like she'll be able to go a distance. She's also got a good mind; I know FuPeg's got a bit of a reputation, but she's not like that all. I find that with my better horses, you don't really train them--you just try to keep them between the lines." Thomas added, "They've been the stars all year at the farm. They're both very fast and very good movers. They both have two-turn families with some grass in the pedigrees, and that's the type of horse I've had the most success with."

Saturday Hero (Carson City) and Beautiful Treasure (Unbridled).

110, c, More Than Ready--Eishin Bridled, by Unbridled

This grey colt posted a swift :33 1/5 for three furlongs Friday. "I like to work horses at different distances to showcase each of them," Smith explained. "They told me his splits were :9 4/5, :20 3/5 and :33 1/5; most of my horses are fit to go three-eighths at the farm." Smith picked up the half-brother to GISP Be Smart (Smarty Jones) and SP Eishin Large Hill (El Corredor) for \$100,000 at KEESEP. "I bought him as a yearling from Jerry Bailey and Gulf Coast, and their record speaks for itself," she noted. "I feel very comfortable buying horses from them--they're very good at what they do. The first horse I bought from them turned out to be [GSW] E Z Warrior (Exploit). I love this colt--he's beautiful. The More Than Readys all seem to run well. He's got a nice pedigree, and having Unbridled on the bottom side gave him some length and elegance--he's got a long pretty head and neck."

"I saw him the day he was born, I saw him next to his mom and when he was weaned, and I liked him the whole time," Smith recalled. "Then he went to the yearling sales, and I bought him [for \$85,000 at FTKJUL], so I've seen him grow up." The Florida-bred, a half-brother to MSW She's Our Annie (Medaglia d'Oro), is from the first crop sired by A. P. Warrior (A.P. Indy), a graded-stakes winner on turf and dirt for Stan Fulton in California. "I love freshman sires--I always try to pick out horses by freshman sires," Smith added. "Since A. P. Warrior did so well out here as a racehorse, I thought this was the right place to bring him. I love that he's out of a Roar mare. He's a good broodmare sire, and I think it adds some substance to the A.P. Indy line, which can be kind of tall and lean. He's big, powerful horse. He's got brilliant speed, and I think he's got two-turn capability."

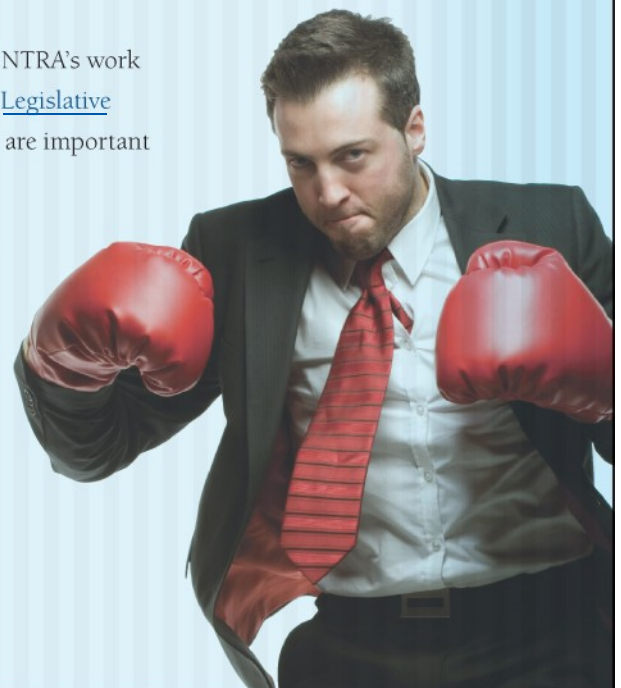

Gulfstream Program Altered Due to Calder Quarantine:

Management at Gulfstream canceled the first and sixth races Sunday due to a temporary quarantine of horses stabled at Calder. The remainder of the card was run as scheduled. Dr. Mike Short, DVM for the Florida State Department of Agriculture, ordered the Calder barn area closed late Saturday afternoon in response to an unidentified sick horse. While horses stabled at Gulfstream, Palm Meadows and other South Florida facilities remain unaffected, the move impacted more than a third of the 118 horses entered Sunday. Yesterday's first race was a \$12,500 maiden claimer; the sixth race was a \$15,000 claimer. "We felt it was only fair to the horsemen who have invested time and money to participate in Sunday's races, to go forward as planned wherever possible," said Gulfstream President and GM Ken Dunn. Entries for Wednesday and Thursday's have already been drawn, with no changes planned until more is known about the status of the Calder barn area. Entries for Friday's program at Gulfstream will be taken and drawn Sunday.

Horsemen Protest Prompts Cancellation of Big A 1st:

The horses for Aqueduct's first race yesterday did not arrive at the security barn by 8:00 a.m., the designated deadline, and as a result the race was cancelled. The reason the horses did not arrive on time was by design, as New York horsemen purposely missed the deadline in order to bring attention to a stalled slots deal that has been sitting on the table for some nine years. In conjunction with the protest, horsemen and breeders held a rally at Belmont Park between noon and 2 p.m. The horsemen released a statement that read:

"We apologize to our fans and horseplayers for any disappointment or inconvenience the cancellation of today's first race might have caused. Because there is a rally at Belmont Park today sponsored by the NY Horsemen (NYTHA) and the NY Breeders (NYTB) concerning the very survival of the Thoroughbred industry in New York State; its 35,000 jobs and \$2.4 billion in revenue. We felt this rally deserved our undivided attention. We hope today's gathering will underscore the frustration the horsemen, the breeders and the communities that surround and support the racetracks and farms throughout the state are feeling from the nine years of broken promises and inaction from our leaders in Albany. Frankly, enough is enough. Thank you for your understanding, your support and patience. See you for the second race."

It was a productive Sabbath for the Brady family's Mill House stable registered two winners on the afternoon. First, 🌟 **"TDN Rising Star"** 🌟 **Trappe Shot** (Tapit) won his second straight race by double-digit lengths when taking down a statebred NW1X at

Gulfstream Park. Two hours later, the up-and-coming four-year-old filly **Hour Glass** (Petionville) secured her first black-type event in Aqueduct's six-furlong, \$60,000 Wheel Turn S.

Hour Glass was making her third start for Mill House. The bay, a \$42,000 KEESOP yearling acquisition by Anthony Dutrow, had two wins in four starts when she was acquired privately by Mill House in December and switched to Todd Pletcher's barn. Steve Young, Mill House's racing manager, advised on the purchase, and was happy the filly was able to make

amends after finishing a tough-luck fourth in the GII Barbara Fritchie S. at Laurel Feb. 15.

Hour Glass, who had won an Aqueduct optional claimer in her first start for Mill House, was sent off the 2-1 chalk in her stakes debut in the Fritchie and ran her heart out, closing down the center of Laurel's stretch to be beaten 3/4 lengths as part of a thrilling five-horse photo ([video](#)).

"I'm sure there are three or four people who feel that about their horses that day, but she could have won that race as easily as she finished fourth," said Young.

Asked what attracted Mill House to the filly in the first place, Young explained, "When we looked at her, she was part of a group of horses around the mid-Atlantic area that can all run. Horses like Cuvee Uncorked (Cuvee) and Strut the Canary (Mineshaft), who won today [in a Philly Park allowance]. She was lightly raced, and we thought there was some blue sky to her, and she showed up every time Tony Dutrow led her over there. We had liked her for a while, and finally in December we got everyone on board and got the deal done."

Young said that Hour Glass was an athletic, medium-sized filly. "She's the type of horse that looks bigger under tack than in the stall," he said. "But she's very well balanced and has very good mechanics about her."

With a nice runner in the older filly division, Mill House also sports one of the more intriguing, if unproven, three-year-old colts in the nation in Trappe Shot. Young purchased the colt, who is trained by Kieran McLaughlin, for a record-breaking \$850,000 at FTMMAY.

"He's a super-talented horse," said Young, on hand at Gulfstream to watch the chestnut win by over a dozen lengths yesterday. "He passed the grade in his first time against winner as impressive as you can do. He'll go back to New York, and he'll probably go a little farther next time.

There's a myriad of options--the GIII Withers S., etc.--but we'll let Kieran make those decisions. He's out of a Private Account mare who is the dam of a Grade I winner in New York [Miss Shop, by Deputy Minster], and everything pedigree wise tells you he should go long. But until they do it, you're never 100-percent sure."

Mill House's recent success belies its modestly sized five-horse stable, which also includes the promising sophomore filly **Katy Now** (Tiznow). Another who was acquired privately over the winter, Katy Now finished second to Saturday's GII Bonnie Miss S. heroine Devil May Care (Malibu Moon) in her second career start at Saratoga last August. She broke her maiden in a Keeneland maiden in October, then doubled up with a four-length allowance win at Churchill Nov. 28 for Lothenbach Stables and Ian Wilkes. Like Hour Glass, Katy Now was turned over to Todd Pletcher after being purchased by Mill House.

"She's a nice filly," said Young. "She'll make her first start as a three-year-old pretty soon." -LM

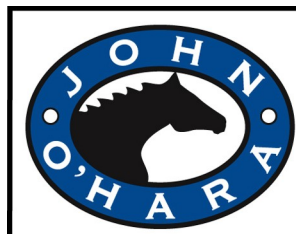

Aidan O'Brien later said, "I was happy with how all the horses worked and a number of them are in contention to run in the Guineas, but no decisions will be made for a few weeks yet."

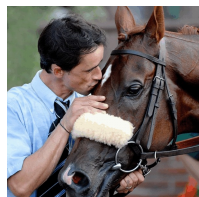
