JODY SLEW GETS GREEN LIGHT

Martin Racing Stable LLC & Dan Morgan's **Jody Slew** (Slew City Slew), whose status for today's GII Fair Grounds Oaks in New Orleans had been in serious doubt all week long, looks a likely starter after training to the satisfaction of trainer Bret Calhoun yesterday morning. "She looked good," Calhoun told *Daily Racing Form* Thursday. "If it's status quo [today], we plan on running. I'm glad I got to see what I did today. I feel much better than I did four or five days ago." A \$9,500 Keeneland September yearling purchase, the bay enters the Oaks off a two-race winning streak, including a nose success from pacesetter **Quiet Temper** (Quiet American) in the GIII Silverbulletday S. Feb. 20. She will look to remain perfect in main-track routes in an event which has produced four recent winners of the GI Kentucky Oaks (Ashado, 2004; Summerly, 2005; Proud Spell, 2008; and Rachel Alexandra, 2009). The Oaks was not contested in 2006 in the aftermath of Hurricane Katrina. Starlight Partners' **Ailalea** (Pulpit) is the lukewarm 3-1 favorite on Mike Diliberto's morning line, but is a candidate to find little love at the windows. Impressive in winning the GIII Tempted S. going Aqueduct's one-turn mile Nov. 7, she was forced to miss the GII Demoiselle S. with injury. She has but one prep this season, a mid-pack sixth in the seven-furlong GII Forward Gal S. at Gulfstream Jan. 31. She tries a two-turn route for the first time, must work out a trip from the 11 hole and her Palm Meadows worktab does not inspire. Red Oak Stable's **Shezacrazygirl** (Ide) is cross-entered for today's Crescent City Oaks for which she would be a heavy favorite, but is likely to start in the Oaks, according to trainer Al Stall Jr. **Field p3**

Awesome Act Tunes Up for Wood...

Awesome Act (Awesome Again), last-out winner of the GIII Gotham S. at Aqueduct, turned in his first serious workout since that race, drilling six furlongs in 1:14.05 over the Belmont training track yesterday morning. "We decided to give him an easy week [after the Gotham] and then the weather wasn't so good," said trainer Jeremy Nosedá, who arrived in the Big Apple Tuesday evening and was to return to his base in England on Thursday night. "We didn't have tack on him for about eight or nine days. This was his first proper piece of work in two and a half weeks." Of Thursday's move, he added, "The work was there to help put us back on schedule and he went as we wanted. It will do him good and get him sharp. He had a good blow, which will do his wind good. I hope that work put him right."

Backtalk Blazes in Fair Grounds Work...

Considering the last black-type event to be contested over six furlongs at Fair Grounds this year, the Feb. 20 Pan Zareta S., was won by the four-year-old filly Double Espresso (Medaglia d'Oro) in a time of 1:10.82, it's fair to characterize yesterday's work by Triple Crown hopeful **Backtalk** (Smarty Jones) as blazingly fast. Too fast, if you ask trainer Tom Amoss, who watched his charge fly through the distance in a bullet 1:09.60. The next fastest six-furlong drill Thursday was 1:13.60. Backtalk, owned by Gold Mark Farm, is preparing for an intended tilt in the GII Illinois Derby at Hawthorne Apr. 3.

“He worked too quick,” said Amoss, who, incidently, trains Double Espresso for Gold Mark. “He was working with a couple of opponents, and it just didn't go right. We gave the other horses more of a head start than we intended to, but he's an athlete and he caught 'em. But he did a lot in doing so. Our concern is how much it took out of him.”

According to Amoss, Backtalk was meant to break off about 10 lengths behind his stablemates, but when they left the three-quarter pole, he was 20 lengths behind them. “And he won by about four or five lengths,” said Amoss, who added that Backtalk, despite his exertions, didn't seem overly tired or winded after the work. “He didn't drink too much water--he drank about half a bucket, which is about average,” said Amoss. “By the time I'd driven from the front side to the backside, he seemed like he was fine. He ate his lunch, and he looks all right. We're hoping he's going to bounce out of it well. He's a big kind of horse and we have nine days, so we think we're fine. But we're concerned.”

A debut winner at Churchill last June, Backtalk made it two straight in the GIII Bashford Manor S. there in July. He got up for his second graded success in the GII Sanford S. at Saratoga, but lost his unbeaten record when fourth to Dublin (Afleet Alex) in the GI Hopeful S. Sept. 7. Trying two turns and synthetics for the first time in the GI Dixiana Breeders' Futurity at Keeneland, he ran a flat eighth as the chalk. Amoss opted to skip the Breeders' Cup and returned Backtalk in a softer spot, the Feb. 26 Sportsman's Paradise at Delta Downs, and the chestnut posted a professional 3/4-length win ([video](#)).

“If you watch the replay of the race, he got bounced around and had to check on the far turn, so turning for home he had a lot to do,” said Amoss. “I think he got quite a bit out of that race.”

Amoss said that a return trip to Churchill Downs for the GI Kentucky Derby will hinge on a big performance from Backtalk in the nine-furlong Illinois Derby.

“It'll be the longest distance Backtalk has ever raced, and he's yet to prove he can go a true distance of ground,” said Amoss. “So he'll need to show that he is indeed a horse that routes well on the dirt, and from there we'll make some decisions.” -LM

Toni Hodge, manager of the G1 Dubai World Cup quarantine stables and a former exercise rider:

“Ski Dubai. It’s my weekly haunt during the summer—skiing is my passion. We usually go for a couple of hours at a time. Some of my friends snowboard and I ski. It’s our night out, especially in the summer when it’s 48 (Centigrade, or about 118 degrees Fahrenheit) outside. We put on our wooly hats and ski suits and go skiing. If you go on a weekend, it can be quite busy, but on weekdays in the summer, it’s really good. They give lessons, and some of my friends who had never skied actually learned how in Dubai. It’s great for children, too, as they have a children’s park, and it’s really reasonable to go—it only costs about 120 dirhams (about \$33) for two hours.”

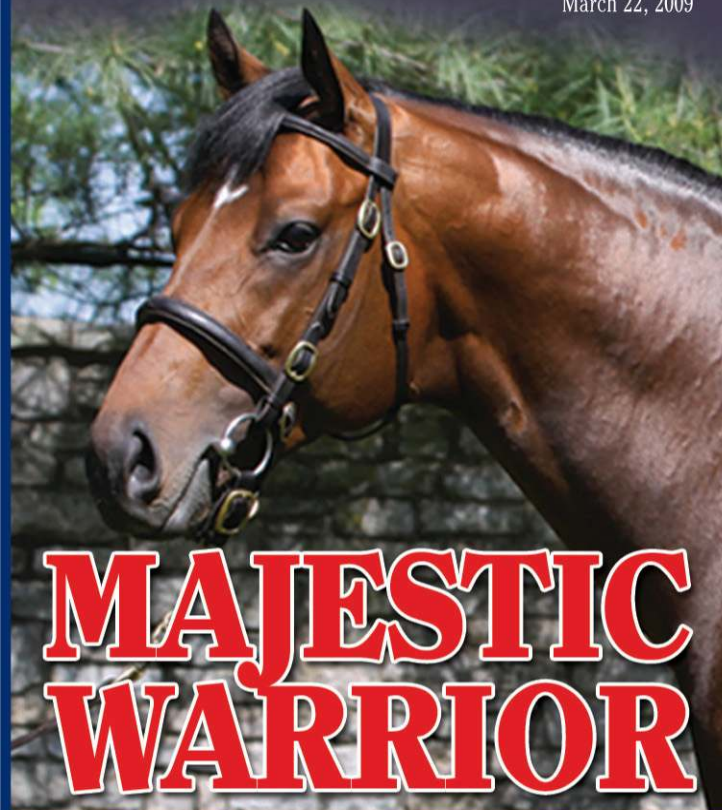

Tony Lacy, a bloodstock agent based in Lexington and a former assistant to trainer Erwan Charpy in Dubai; he currently is the North American representative for the French-based sale company Arqana:

"I would pick the Madinat Jumeirah, the resort complex right beside the Burj Al Arab [the iconic Dubai hotel that looks like a sailboat and is surrounded by the Arabian Gulf]. It's almost like a theme park. It has all Arabian-style architecture and many restaurants and a souk [shopping area] patterned after the traditional souks of this region."

In the souk, shoppers can find everything from hand-made Moroccan lamps to top quality Pashmina shawls to oil paintings by regional artists. In addition to the souk, the sprawling Madinat Jumeirah (which means Jumeirah City, with Jumeirah the major Dubai-based hotel brand) encompasses the stunning luxury hotels Mina A'Salam, which is styled like an ancient Arabian citadel; and Al Qasr, which means "The Palace" and is designed like a sheikh's summer residence. There also are villas, 44 restaurants and bars, a theater, the Wild Wadi Waterpark and even a turtle rehabilitation center where injured or ill turtles are cared for and returned to territorial United Arab Emirates waters. A series of man-made waterways connects different areas of the Madinat Jumeirah, and visitors can take special water taxis fashioned like old-fashioned abras (small boats) to restaurants and other places within the complex.

Location: Al Sufouh Road

Jim Cornes, a former assistant to trainer Kieran McLaughlin in Dubai who now oversees the international stables during the Dubai International Racing Carnival; he will then return to the United States, where he has served as stakes coordinator for Presque Isle Downs:

"My favorite place is the gold souk in Deira. The sheer amount of gold hanging in the windows of small shops along narrow alleyways is amazing--I didn't know there was that much gold in the whole world. You also get a little feel for the old culture here and the old ways. It's one of those 'wow' places because of the volume of the gold, but you can get involved in bargaining and trading, just like in the old days when trading was why Dubai became Dubai. The gold is sold by weight and quality, and there are many options. Plus the craftsmanship [of jewelry and decorative items] is unbelievable, and represents many different countries of the world, like some of the other Middle Eastern countries and India. Everyone has to see the gold souk--it's a jaw dropper."

The entrance to the gold souk is on Sikkat Al-Khali Street, Dubai. Dozens, if not hundreds, of stores line the souk area.

Majestic first foals

Alastair Donald, managing director of the International Racing Bureau in Newmarket, England, who has been coming to Dubai for more than a decade while assisting both horsemen and media:

"I would go to the Souk Al Bahar ['Market of the Sailor'] near the Burj Khalifa [world's tallest building] and the Dubai Mall, and have dinner at The Meat Company. You can dine there and get a good American-style steak. Every time I go to Dubai, I eat there. You can eat outside on the edge of the Dubai Fountain and see the fountains, which are on display about every 20 minutes. If you sit near the water's edge, you might get a bit wet, but visually it's a great thing, and the food is very good."

A South African-based restaurant operation, The Meat Company features a wait staff from that country. Souk Al Bahar is described on its website as a "vibrant waterside dining, shopping and entertainment experience for Dubai's socialites, and a must-see destination for tourists."

The Dubai Fountain is part of the 30-acre Burj Khalifa Lake and shoots water jets as high as 500 feet, equivalent to a 50-story building. It was designed by California-based WET, the creators of the Fountains of Bellagio in Las Vegas. Some of the shoots of water are coordinated with music and are lighted. According to visitor information, "the beam of light shining upward from the fountain can be seen from over 20 miles away and will be visible from space, making it the brightest spot in the Middle East and quite possibly in the entire world."

The Beijing duck is also a classic--the meat tender and not too dry...[For dessert], we highly recommend the coconut ice cream and plum crumble, which--like almost everything else on the menu--will not only end your meal with a bang, but have you vowing to come back soon."

**Looks for her first graded victory in Sunday's
GIII Santa Paula S. at Santa Anita**

Bob Hutton, who operates under the banner of Tommy Hutton's Dream Stable, hasn't been to California to watch one of his horse's run since December of 2007. That's when the Mike Mitchell-trained Sindy With an S (Broken Vow) finished fourth as the 5-2 chalk in the GI La Brea S. Hutton, who is based in Scottsdale, Arizona, has good reason to return to the Golden State Sunday should his promising sophomore Tanda line up for the GIII Santa Paula S. at Santa Anita, as the filly would be among the favorites.

"I usually only go for the stakes races," said Hutton. "It's been a while, but I think I'll make the trip if she runs."

Tanda was entered in the 6 1/2-furlong feature on the main track and drew post two, but Hutton and trainer Dan Hendricks indicated the filly might be scratched in favor of a two-turn allowance race later next week.

"There really hasn't been anything else for her, and I think maybe it's time to see if she likes the main track here," said Hendricks. "We still have the option to scratch if we don't like what we see, because it's a graded race and you can scratch before post time. But looking at the past performances, I think she fits."

Purchased by bloodstock agent David Ingordo for \$145,000 at last year's OBS April Sale--the same sale that, incidently, produced juvenile filly champion She Be Wild (Offlee Wild)--Tanda made her debut in a six-furlong MSW over Hollywood's Cushion Track Dec. 11. She ran fifth at 9-2 odds that day, and was moved to the lawn for her next, a 6 1/2-furlong dash down Santa Anita's hillside course Jan. 3. She won by an impressive 3 1/2 lengths, then came right back to be runner-up to Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf second Rose Catherine (Speightstown) in the Sweet Life S. over the same course and distance Jan. 24.

"[Rose Catherine] is as good a sprint turf filly as you're going to see," Hendricks said of the effort.

Tanda was kept on the sod in her latest and came away with another good win on the downhill, this time in an \$80,000 optional claimer Mar. 5. Despite her initial success as a turf sprinter, Hutton believes her future may well lie around two turns.

"We think she can go long," said Hutton. "That's why we're considering the allowance race. Still, looking at the other horses [in the Santa Paula] and the fact that we're short in the morning line, it might be tough to pass this spot."

Hutton, who has a handful of horses in training, as well as a single broodmare, typically buys just a horse or two a year. He has, in recent years, employed Ingordo as his bloodstock agent, and has nothing but good things to say about him.

"I was actually talking with John Shirreffs, and asked him if he could recommend an agent," Hutton explained. "He mentioned David, and we've had a great relationship since. I pretty much run every decision I make in the industry past him."

A friendly sort who's wont to end phone conversations with a "hang loose," Hutton operates a collection agency ("Business is good," he quips). He first got into racing through his late brother Tommy, and when it came time to name his operation, he did so in honor of Tommy.

"My brother was a big fan of the game, but never really had the resources to get involved," Hutton explained.

Bob Hutton's first forays into ownership involved cheap claimers at nearby Turf Paradise, but as his love of racing grew, so did his will to buy a better horse. He began focusing on the two-year-old in training sales, and in particular the OBS April Sale.

"For a guy like me that doesn't have unlimited income and doesn't have the money of some of the partnerships, it's a great sale," he said. "I feel like you can go there and get a nice horse for reasonable money."

Hutton's breakout horse, Sindy With an S, was, like Tanda, an OBS April graduate. Knocked down for a modest \$55,000 at the 2006 renewal, Sindy With an S was entered for an \$80,000 tag at first asking back in March of 2007. Luckily, she went unclaimed while winning by three lengths in 1:09 flat for the six furlongs. Two starts later she ran third in the GIII Railbird S., then took down her first black-type event in the Manhattan Beach S. at Hollywood. Sent on the road, she finished second in Calder's GIII Azalea Breeders' Cup S., won the GIII Safely Kept Breeders' Cup S. at Laurel, then went unplaced over a terrifically sloppy Monmouth course in the Ms. Woodford S. on Breeders' Cup weekend, 2007. Back to California for the La Brea, she finished five lengths adrift of Dearest Trickski in what would be her career finale. She later sold for \$250,000 as a broodmare prospect.

Hutton said that the filly, like many of his runners, was named after a family friend.

"My son wrote a letter to one of my wife's friends, Cindy, but he spelled her name with an S," Hutton said. "It was pretty funny, and also turned out to be a great name for a horse."

So does Tanda's name have any significance?

"You know, it does," said Hutton. "My wife named her. She doesn't care really too much about the handicapping side of things or anything like that, but she likes naming the horses. But we're going to keep Tanda to ourselves right now. Maybe if she does real well, my wife will decide to explain the name." -LM

How did you first get involved in horse racing? After achieving some success in my primary business, which is trucking, I needed an outlet. I thought owning race horses might be exciting and relaxing. Boy, was I wrong about the relaxing part. Being a sports fan, I thought it would be cool to run some horses and see where it brought me.

How many horses do you have now? At present I own 37 horses, most individually and some with partners.

How did you acquire D'Funnybone? Nick Sallutso, a bloodstock agent I became acquainted with in 2007, called me shortly after "Funnybone" got beat a nose to Jackson Bend at Calder, and advised me to pursue him. I did, and after I obtained him we transferred him to Rick [Dutrow Jr.]. The original owner named him very cleverly [D'wildcat--Elbow].

Do you use the same method to name your horses? I name the horses that I purchase as yearlings or two-year olds in training in no specific fashion. Sometimes I combine the name of the horse's parents, and others are named after people who have affected my life in some way.

You branched out into pinhooking--are you happy with your results? Pinhooking was a part of my program early on. I use very good people at Hidden Brook Farm in Paris, KY, to short list my potential purchases. After acquiring them, I send them to David Scanlon, and we enter them in the major sales. The last two years have been a little tough, but prior to that I sold Desert Party [\$2.1-million FTFEB topper in 2008] and other high priced two-year olds at both Fasig-Tipton and Keeneland.

What is your biggest accomplishment since you've been involved in racing? I would have to say that winning the Kentucky Derby in 2008 with Big Brown, a Keeneland two-year old graduate, has been my biggest thrill in racing so far. I also have campaigned many other graded stakes-winning horses that are similarly gratifying.

What's your favorite racetrack, and what's your favorite restaurant to stop at after the races there? My favorite racetrack is Belmont Park. It is peaceful and beautiful--a great place to take the family and enjoy the day. After the races, on a good day we like Peter Luger's or Bamonte's in Brooklyn, NY. On a not so good day, we do Chinese or Burger King.

If you could change one thing about our sport, what would it be? I think if I had a say...taking care of the bettors would be the right thing to do. Our sport is handle-driven, and not enough is done for the bettors. Some clever marketing could certainly reward the people who drive our sport.

Who did you most admire growing up? My father, Paul Sr., was the best. He passed in 2000, but he had it figured out--down-to-earth, a real man's man, a very generous and caring person. I still think of him on a daily basis and try to emulate his traits when figuring out a situation.

What is the best gift you've ever received? The best gift I received was for my 50th birthday--my wife Elisa held a surprise party down at the Hard Rock in Hollywood, FL. She flew 15 family members down for a long weekend and got us to see Paul Rodgers in concert with front-row seats. I was overwhelmed.

What's the best place for a weekend getaway? For business and recreation, I enjoy going to Acqualina [Resort and Spa] for a long weekend in Sunny Isles, FL. You can enjoy the weather, unwind in comfort and see some horses run at Gulfstream.

Where would you like to visit that you haven't already been? I would like to take a trip to Italy. We have made the plans, but it never seemed to work out for one reason or another.

What's the last book you read? "Shutter Island," by Dennis Lehane.

How do you like to unwind after a long day? I work a lot of hours. I like to unwind at home with my wife and boys watching movies and eating pizza.

NY HORSEMEN RESPOND TO SLOTS DELAY

After New York state officials scrapped the plan that would have put the Aqueduct Entertainment Group (AEG) in charge of installing 4,500 slot machines at Aqueduct, Gov. David Paterson proposed that the bidding process for a casino operator be re-opened for another eight months. That proposal has been met with stiff opposition from New York horsemen, and yesterday, two local groups, the New York Thoroughbred Breeders and the New York Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association, issued a joint statement condemning the governor's decision. The statement read:

"Governor David Paterson has reinstated the death penalty in New York State, at least when it comes to the horse racing industry. The governor's shocking plan to re-bid the Aqueduct casino project, a process that his own staff says could end up delaying a decision until Dec. 31, is disastrous. It is incomprehensible that, at a time that New York State is drowning in red ink, this governor would not seek the fastest, most intelligent solution, one which would infuse a million dollars a day into the state treasury. Instead of hiding behind a needless pointless process, which will only cost taxpayers money, jeopardize education and put the final nail in the horse racing industry's coffin, the governor needs to decide which of the remaining casino bidders will be awarded this project. Any delay will surely kill horse racing and cost 35,000 hard-working New Yorkers their jobs."
