FEELING LUCKY?

Mark DeDomenico, John Carver, Peter Abruzzo and Jerry Hollendorfer's **Blind Luck** (Pollard's Vision) returns to action in today's GII Fantasy S. at Oaklawn Park following an eventful third in the GI Santa Anita Oaks. Last year's Eclipse finalist for champion juvenile filly makes her first start on dirt since a runaway maiden claiming win in her Calder debut last June.

"This was the best race on the dirt to try her at," co-owner and trainer Jerry Hollendorfer told

Daily Racing Form. "I want to get on the dirt now and see how we do there." Only a trio of fillies stand in the three-time Grade I heroine's way, including **Tidal Pool** (Yankee Gentleman). The Westrock Stables colorbearer stepped up with a career-best over the Oaklawn main strip most recently, scoring by eight lengths in an allowance Feb. 18. She earned a gaudy 103 Beyer Speed Figure that day. "That dimension of kicking in and really finishing like she did stamped her as one of the ones," Hall of Fame trainer D. Wayne Lukas told *DRF*. "The way that she finished up against older fillies--the fractions were very realistic, and yet she opens up on them." Al and Sandra Kirkwood's **All Due Respect** (Value Plus), second, beaten only a neck in the Santa Anita Oaks, is the one to catch exiting from the one stall. "She got a little intimidated," trainer Kathy Walsh revealed to *DRF* of her charge's latest effort. "She got down in tight and they bumped her a couple of times. This filly, I think she'll run a real good race." Brereton C. Jones's homebred **No Such Word** (Canadian Frontier) rides a two-race winning streak after her heroics in the GIII Honeybee S. Mar. 13.

Six Late Triple Crown Nominees...

Six more sophomores have been made eligible for the Triple Crown series; the required \$6,000 late nomination fee was due by Mar. 27. Steel Your Face Stable's **Yawanna Twist** (Yonaguska), second in the GIII Gotham S., leads the way of the newcomers. He is entered in Saturday's GIII Illinois Derby at Hawthorne. **Raise the Bridle** (Spanish Steps), DQ'd from first and placed second in the Borderland Derby at Sunland Feb. 27, has been nominated by Double Eagle Ranch and Buena Suerte Equine, who also campaigned last year's GI Kentucky Derby winner Mine That Bird (Birdstone). The remaining four are James McIngvale's Mar. 10 runaway Laurel maiden winner and GI Wood Memorial S. entrant **Carnivore** (Giant's Causeway); John Oxley's homebred **Game Ball** (Sky Mesa), who has won his last two starts at Tampa and is entered in the Illinois Derby; Claire Lein's GIII El Camino Real Derby third-place finisher and GI Santa Anita Derby entrant **Posse Power** (Posse); and AJL Productions LLC's **Thomas Baines** (Johannesburg), a Mar. 30 optional claiming winner at Santa Anita who starts next in the Santa Anita Derby.

Careless Jewel Pointing Toward La Troienne...

Donver Stable's **Careless Jewel** (Tapit) continues to prepare for her four-year-old debut, drilling six furlongs in 1:12.40 at Keeneland yesterday. A disappointing eighth as the 9-5 favorite in GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic last time, the speedy gray has also posted six workouts at Palm Meadows--including a pair of bullets--since returning to training. "She will stay here most of the meet and have at least one more work here," trainer Josie Carroll offered. "She has always trained well on Polytrack." Carroll added that the GI Alabama S. heroine will return in Churchill's GI La Troienne S. Apr. 30.

MINING JEWELS AT KEENELAND APRIL

The quality of stock offered at Keeneland April has consistently drawn the who's who of racing. Among those from the very first edition of the sale were Bob and Beverly Lewis, who proved successful in unearthing some of the most successful April sale graduates. Armed with the experience of a number of top trainers and advisors, the couple purchased a chestnut filly for \$130,000 from the inaugural sale in 1993. Named Twice the Vice, the filly collected seven graded stakes wins over five seasons on the racetrack. A five-time Grade I winner, she gave the dynamic duo their first victory at that elite level when she galloped in the 1994 Del Mar Oaks Invitational.

The Classics Via Keeneland April...

During the second Keeneland April sale, New York-based trainer John Kimmel went to \$120,000 for a son of Gulch. Named Thunder Gulch, the chestnut had sold previously for \$40,000 at the 1993 Keeneland July sale, providing pinhooker Jerry Bailey with a solid profit. Kimmel saddled the colt to a second-place finish in the GIII Nashua S. for Mutual Shar Stable, but, ultimately, it was Michael Tabor and trainer D. Wayne Lukas who reaped the greatest rewards. Tabor purchased Thunder Gulch privately just before his victory in the 1994 GII Remsen S. Under the tutelage of Lukas, the neatly made chestnut became a Kentucky Derby champion. He also won the GI Belmont S., GI Travers S. and GI Florida Derby and capped off the 1995 season with a three-year-old championship before retiring to stud with \$2,915,086 in earnings.

In more recent times, Keeneland April received an other big boost with Big Brown (Boundary). Secured by Paul Pompa Jr. for \$190,000, the bay went on to triumph in the 2008 GI Florida Derby before adding victories in the GI Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness S. Denied the Triple Crown after being eased in the GI Belmont S. the colt took down that year's GI Haskell Invitational S., and concluded the season by garnering the sophomore colt title.

Representing the fairer set, Gal in a Ruckus (Bold Ruckus) was purchased by Kip Elser's Kirkwood Stables for \$27,000 at Keeneland September in 1993 before reselling to John Oxley for \$90,000 the following April. That proved a monumental steal when the Ontario-bred chestnut bagged the big one the following season, taking the GI Kentucky Oaks. Keeper Hill (Deputy Minister), who also exited the April sale, subsequently went on to earn the garland of lilies in 1998. Sold to John Chandler for \$250,000 in 1997, the Bobby Frankel trainee also secured victories in the 1998 GI Las Virgenes S. and the 1999 GI Spinster S.

Bring in the Champions...

The April sale provided yet another champion in 1997 when a stout bay filly by Maudlin was led through the sales ring. Beautiful Pleasure, consigned by Farnsworth Farm, agent, was sold for healthy sum of \$480,000, but that figure would later prove to be a bargain for owner John Oxley and trainer John Ward. Both regulars on the April scene since the venue's maiden voyage in 1993, the two would enjoy great success with this purchase. A winner of two of four starts at two, including the GI Matron S., Beautiful Pleasure spent most of 1998 on the sidelines, making only three starts and scoring just once in allowance company at Keeneland, but she returned better than ever in 1999. She collected four victories, including the GI Personal Ensign H., GI Beldame H. and GI Breeders' Cup Distaff, and ended the year on a high note, bringing home the champion older mare title.

Still basking in the glow of selling the previous season's Eclipse champion Big Brown, the 2009 renewal did it again, this time in the form of Lookin at Lucky (Smart Strike). After failing to sell for \$35,000 at Keeneland in September in 2008, the bay--consigned by Jerry Bailey Sales Agency the following April--blossomed into a \$475,000 juvenile purchase for Mike Pegram. The handsome colt won a trio of Grade I races last year--the Del Mar Futurity, Norfolk S. and CashCall Futurity--and rounded out the campaign with a divisional championship. In his only start this term, the Bob Baffert-trained pupil scored in the Mar. 13 Gil Rebel S., and he is among the early favorites for this year's "Run for the Roses." -C Bossinakis

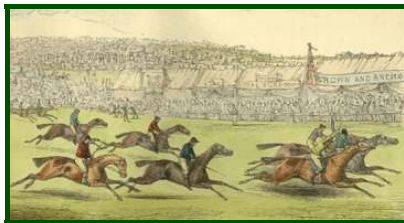

Awzaan Set for Racecourse Gallop...

Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ Awzaan (GB) (Alhaarth {Ire}) will head for a Newmarket racecourse gallop on route to his seasonal bow in the May 1 G1 2000 Guineas, with trainer Mark Johnston issuing an upbeat bulletin regarding his chance in the first British Classic of the season. "I've not had many horses in with a chance in the Guineas, but the ones I have had have gone there first time up, so he'll go to the Craven meeting for a gallop," Johnston said of the G1 Middle Park S. and G2 Mill Reef S. winner. "We're guaranteed good ground, and Sheikh Hamdan and Richard Hills will be there. He is a very exciting horse and very easy to train. He's quite aggressive in terms of his racing and very mature--that probably sums him up. I think some people forget he's a Group 1 winner, and maybe we're a little bit guilty of taking him for granted, too, as he doesn't give us any difficulty at home."

Untried beyond six furlongs in his juvenile campaign, there are some questions over the colt's ability to stay a strongly run race over the Rowley Mile, although Johnston is keen to refute those claims. "There shouldn't be any doubt about the distance," Johnston added. "I think a mile will turn out to be his optimum trip, as he doesn't have the style of a keen horse. My only concern would be his size--if he was one hand bigger, I would be brimming with confidence. You go into the winter dreaming of the Classics, and it's nice to have a horse in with a good chance. He's four-from-four, and when he won the Middle Park, every horse that lined up had won a group race, so what more can he do?"

Jockey Richard Hills, who partnered Awzaan to victory in three of his four two year-old races, was onboard during Thursday morning's six-furlong all-weather gallop. The pair worked with lead horse Cry of Freedom (Street Cry {Ire}), and Hills was full of praise for the unbeaten homebred. "He worked very well today, I was very happy with him," Hills said. "He showed a great attitude, but this morning wasn't about finding out how good he is. There's no issue with him getting the mile, as Alhaarth's progeny normally stay, but in any case it's important to have speed in order to win a Guineas."

Rosanara and Siyouni on the Classic Trail...

Chantilly trainer Alain de Royer-Dupre has revealed early season targets for his Highness The Aga Khan's homebred ☆ **"TDN Rising Stars"** ☆ Rosanara (Fr) (Sinndar {Ire}), last year's G1 Prix Marcel Boussac vic-tress, and Siyouni (Fr) (Pivotal {GB}), winner of the G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere. "Both horses were given some light work last Tuesday and I am pleased by the way they are going," de Royer-Dupre told *Racing Post*. "Rosanara will run in the [G3] Prix de la Grotte [at Longchamp Apr. 25], and the plan is then to go for the [G1 Poule d'Essai des] Pouliches [at Longchamp May 16], as she has plenty of speed." With regard to the latter, the trainer added, "We are aiming Siyouni at the G3 Prix de Fontainebleau [at Longchamp Apr. 25], and then hopefully he will be in the line-up for the [G1] Poule d'Essai des Poulains [at Longchamp May 16]."

Michael Harrison was just 23 years old when he witnessed the great Secretariat annihilate the field in the 1973 Belmont S. The event sparked a lifelong love of the "Sport of Kings."

"That's what really got me excited about horse racing," Harrison explained. "It was just a phenomenal experience. I followed his two-year-old and three-year-old seasons, and went to his [Kentucky Derby] prep races. I was at Belmont Park for the Belmont S., and it was probably the most incredible race I've ever seen. He won by 31 lengths, and I saw grown men, guys who were just gamblers, in tears and throwing their hats in the air. It was just a great day--there's nothing better than that."

better than that."

It wasn't long before Harrison found his way to the backstretch. "I worked with horses, starting in 1973," he remarked. "I was grooming and exercising, first at a training track in New Jersey and, when I was in law school, at a training track in Kentucky."

Harrison went from racing fan to stable worker to owner/breeder, and now serves as the president of the Thoroughbred Breeders' Association of New Jersey. Born in Newark, New Jersey, he earned a law degree from the University of Louisville, and returned to the Garden State to open a practice.

It was in the mid-'90s that the attorney made his first investment in the Thoroughbred business. He and a partner bought a daughter of Strike the Anvil named Alien Strike privately from a friend. The filly more than met expectations, winning a pair of stakes races while compiling a record of 40-5-7-11 and earnings of \$153,749.

"That's the worst thing that could've happened," Harrison chuckled. "I thought the game was really easy, and it is certainly not."

Eventually, the Jersey native branched out into breeding and buying at the sales. He currently has three broodmares, and also campaigned MGISP A to the Croft (Menifee), a \$55,000 KEESEP yearling that went on to win \$295,683.

It was at the 2009 OBS February sale that he acquired Orchestrator (Bernstein), who picked up her first black-type score in last Saturday's GIII Bourbonette Oaks on the synthetic at Turfway Park.

Ken McPeck picked out the filly, and the hammer price of \$75,000 was within the budget. The dark bay has now earned \$155,496.

Harrison echoed the sentiments of many when he outlined what attracts him to the breeze-up sales.

"There's always going to be a lot of risk in this business, but buying at the two-year-old sales takes some of the risk out of it," he said. "You know better what the horse's potential might be as a two-year-old. You've seen them work, you've seen the conformation. You have a better idea if the horse is going to be successful or not. That's not to say this is a science--it's not. But you are further along in the process of finding out if the horse is going to be successful down the road."

Harrison owns Orchestrator in partnership with a friend, Joe Trunfio, the CEO of Atlantic Health System. Their nom du course is Koolmen Racing Stable.

"We were just kidding around one day, and we decided we were two cool men, so that's what we named the stable," Harrison explained with a laugh.

Koolmen Racing also has horses at Philadelphia Park with trainer Freddy Velazquez, a track in close enough proximity to home to make

a day at the races possible. Harrison was unable to make the trip to Kentucky for the Bourbonette Oaks, but he is hoping to be in attendance for her next outing in the Apr. 15 GIII Appalachian S. at Keeneland.

If all goes well, he will also be spending time at Monmouth Park this summer. The owner is looking forward to the track's million-dollar-a-day meeting.

"It's the smartest thing they've ever done--they needed to shorten the season," Harrison said. "Historically, if you look at the meets that have been successful, like Keeneland and Saratoga, they've been short meets. For the racing fan, it's not the same boring product day in and day out.

"This is going to be a much better product and, if you don't come out, you might miss something," he added. "When you had 141 days of racing, it didn't matter when you came out--it was the same product every day and, actually, it wasn't a very good product. This is a very smart move. It will also move up field size, which the tracks need to get better pari-mutuel handle. Everything about it is really positive. It's going to be very exciting."

Harrison is also hoping to enjoy the benefits to the horse owners.

"Monmouth will have a purse of \$80,000 for a non-winners of two [allowance]," he said. "It's pretty exciting to race for that kind of money with that kind of horse.

"I hope the experiment succeeds, and I think it will. We are losing owners because, unless they are at the top of the game, they can't afford the expenses. It is a very tough business. With these purses, owners can afford to be in racing. There will be more opportunities to make some money."

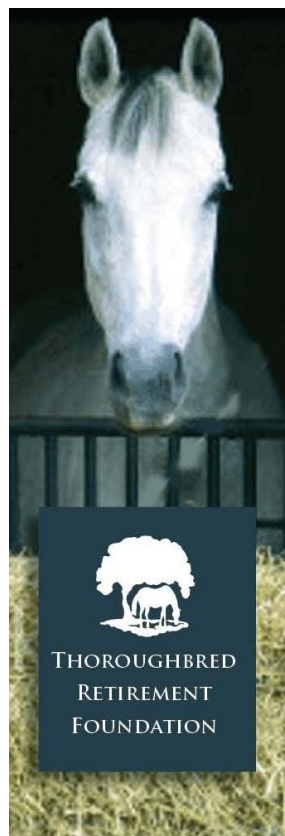

Equine Health & Welfare Bill Approved:

The Kentucky House of Representatives gave final approval to House Bill 398, which creates the Kentucky Equine Health and Welfare Council. The Council will assist, advise, and consult with the department on issues of equine health and welfare and will take action to help maintain the health, welfare, and safety of equines in the Commonwealth. The bill now goes to Governor Steve Beshear for his signature. "Kentucky becomes the first state in the Union to make this sort of commitment to the horse," said Dr. Frank Dwayne Marcum, DVM, an equine veterinarian from Versailles and president of the Kentucky-based Equine Health and Welfare Alliance Inc. "Already, our colleague veterinarians in Louisiana, Texas, and other states that support EHWA are taking this legislation to their state legislatures to address and support the needs of the horse." Bi-partisan legislation was sponsored by Rep. Tom McKee, D-Cynthiana. "From the pony in the backyard to the winner of the Kentucky Derby, the horse is special in this state," said McKee, a veteran legislator and Harrison County farmer. "This bill is a step in the right direction toward improving the health and welfare of the horse."
