SOLID START AT INGLIS EASTER

While still a buyers' market, the first day of the Inglis Easter Yearling Sale closed on par with the 2009 renewal, based on an average of A\$233,182 and median of A\$160,000, compared with A\$226,978 and

A\$150,000 for the corresponding session a year ago. While the RNA rate of 28 percent is cause for consternation, vendors are overwhelmingly reporting healthy trade privately afterwards, and the clearance rate is confidently expected to improve.

Inglis Managing Director Mark Webster said the opening session was sufficiently solid. "Any horse sale that averages A\$230,000 is a very good result," Webster said. "It's hard to expect this sale to make the same gains as some others have this year, because Easter is coming off a much higher base, so it's hard to get the same kind of lift. Obviously, we would like to see the clearance rate improve, and history says that is likely to be the case as we go on this week. It will just take vendors a little time to adjust. The main message is that these are the best yearlings in the Southern Hemisphere, and buyers are in pole position to take advantage of what our vendors have to offer over the remaining two days."

Simply Stunning...

Boutique Upper Hunter Valley stud Kitchwin Hills outstayed some serious opposition to secure a stand-out Redoute's Choice (Aus)--Regrowth (Aus) colt that topped yesterday's opening session. The hammer fell at A\$1.875 million midway through the afternoon.

Widely regarded to be the most outstanding individual at the sale complex, bidding on the bay colt--who is reminiscent in many ways to his grandsire Danehill--began at A\$500,000. Caulfield trainer Peter Moody, who puts the polish on multiple G1SW Typhoon Tracy (Aus), was underbidder, along with John Messara's Arrowfield Stud. Shadwell's Angus Gold was in a prominent ringside position on his cell phone, and was believed to have a A\$1.2-million budget, while trainer David Hayes was similarly glued to a mobile and shadowed by agent Mark Pilkington, positioned near an aisle. Farther back in that aisle was Kitchwin Hills stud manager Mick Malone, flanked property businessman John McGrath, and Graeme Brown, whose family owns Kitchwin Hills, steadfastly returning the fire. **Cont. p2**

ZENYATTA SEEKS SWEET 16

Well, Friday's GI Apple Blossom Invitational H. is no longer the 'Race for the Ages' as hoped for by Oaklawn Park officials with the absence of Horse of the Year Rachel Alexandra (Medaglia d'Oro), but it's still quite a treat whenever unbeaten champion **Zenyatta** (Street Cry {Ire}) steps foot in the starting gate. A dominating victress of this race two years ago in her only other start on dirt, last term's GI Breeders' Cup Classic heroine has been assigned post four with regular pilot Mike Smith aboard. The Jerry and Ann Moss colorbearer extended her unbeaten streak to 15 with a heart-stopping win in the GI Santa Margarita Invitational H. Mar. 13. She arrived at Oaklawn yesterday. "The last time a crowd like this turned out, it was for Air Force One," said Oaklawn's assistant general manager David Longinotti. "Bill Clinton came home one time and landed here. This crowd is about the same." Only four over-matched fillies or mares stand in the way of perfection, including last season's GIII Monmouth Oaks victress **Just Jenda** (Menifee) and GIII Silverbulletday S. heroine **War Echo** (Tapit). **Field, p7**

The rich bay colt with a neat off-white hind sock and dainty star on his forehead simply exuded presence and walked around unfused by the attention. Offered as

lot 125, he has Easy Date (Aus) as his third dam; she was among Australasia's blue-hen matrons and sired the immensely influential sire Snippets (Aus). The colt is closely related to G1 Golden Slipper winner Forensics (Aus) (Flying Spur {Aus}), and to Group 1 winner Rewaaya (Aus) (Singspiel {Ire}).

Malone said that

Kitchwin had assembled a group of buyers to secure the colt. "We have put a syndicate together, but there are still shares available in him. We are not sure what trainer he will go to--we are still throwing it around a bit--but he has big support from the syndicate."

Malone added, "I have a close association with Segenhoe Stud. I saw this colt not long after he was born, and watched him develop throughout his life. For months now, I have been really keen to put a team together and get him. If you want that type of colt and that type of pedigree, you have got to pay for it--but we were very close to our limit."

Talking about the colt's physical, Malone said, "He is a star type, a beautiful mover with lovely bone, a lovely Danehill head on him, and any stallion prospect with Snippets in him will do me."

Malone foresees a future for the glamour colt in the stallion barn at Kitchwin Hills, which has foundation sire Dane Shadow (Aus) (Danehill) and newcomer Duporth (Aus) (Red Ransom) this season.

"We have got Dane Shadow at the farm; we are not trying to take on the big boys in the stallion game, but these are the sort of horses you have to have if you are going to go forward in this game," Malone asserted.

But having owned the blue-hen Easy Date (Aus) and bred and sold four generations, including the illustrious Regrowth colt, today was a particularly satisfying day.

"Seriously, from the moment he was born, we have regarded him as a sale-topper," Sissian said. "I think I have put over 1,000 yearlings through the ring in the last 20 years, and I have to say that he was the best colt we have ever offered. He has a magnificent presence, a wonderful temperament, and terrific action. A lot of the good judges on the ground tell me he is as close to the faultless yearling as they have seen for many years."

Sissian added that, "Regrowth is in foal to a little horse called Redoute's Choice--she is carrying a full sister to this bloke--and she has a colt by Exceed and Excel at foot. I bred Regrowth, [second dam] True Blonde and owned her grandmother Easy Date, so this is the fourth generation I have bred out of that family, and it is terrific; that has been my major family for 20 years. This is the family of Snippets, so it is a real stallion's pedigree. I have had good results out of this family right through the years, but this is fabulous. We have had a very nice day."

The first foal from Regrowth fetched A\$1.6 million when knocked down to Darley here in 2008. Named Colour (Aus) (More Than Ready), she has notched wins that include the G3 SAJC Breeders S.

The historic 800-acre Segenhoe Stud runs 40 mares permanently and takes in another 150 each breeding season, including Makybe Diva (GB).

Diva Dominates...

Melbourne trainer Mark Kavanagh secured the first daughter of triple G1 Melbourne Cup victor Makybe Diva (GB) for A\$1.2 million early in the day. Kavanagh said he was acting on behalf of several existing stable clients to snare the elegant chestnut filly by GI Kentucky Derby winner Fusaichi Pegasus.

"I have purchased her for a couple of stable clients, but there is a piece of her still swinging," Kavanagh said. "I

believe she will only appreciate in value; I have every faith in that family and that filly. She is a beautifully balanced, good natured filly."

Tony Santic's champion mare Makybe Diva was booked to Encosta de Lago (Aus) in 2007, but the Equine Influenza outbreak and that stallion's prolonged stay in the Eastern Creek Quarantine Centre stymied those plans. Fusaichi Pegasus stepped in to do the job with an immensely attractive outcome. Offered by Makybe Diva's owner Tony Santic's eponymous Makybe Stud, the filly is the second to go through this sale ring. Her first foal, a colt by Galileo (Ire), fetched A\$1.5 million when knocked down to trainer Danny O'Brien at Easter last year.

Makybe Diva, who earned more than A\$14 million on the track, has an Encosta de Lago colt foaled last August and was covered last spring by Vinery sire More Than Ready. Her Galileo colt is yet to be named.

Inglis Managing Director Mark Webster said it was an honour to sell the first filly from the great mare. "The filly was an outstanding type with a world-class pedigree," Webster said.

WHAT THEY'RE SAYING ...AT THE SALES

Antony Thompson, Widden Stud:

"The sale is healthy enough, it is very similar to last year. There are a lot of good judges here looking to buy and the clearance rate will increase as the sale progresses; we have sold eight of nine, and we will get the other one away."

Michael Sissian, Segenhoe Stud:

"It is difficult to assess, running at about a 30 percent pass-in rate, but that has been constant at every sale this year. The first day at Magic Millions was the same. We have passed in one horse out of five, and we ended up with three people on it and sold it for what we expected. It's a sign of a market where people lack a little bit of confidence because they keep reading the financial press. The pattern for the whole year has been that the clearance rate improves as the sale continues, to about 80 percent."

Dean Fleming, Tyreel Stud:

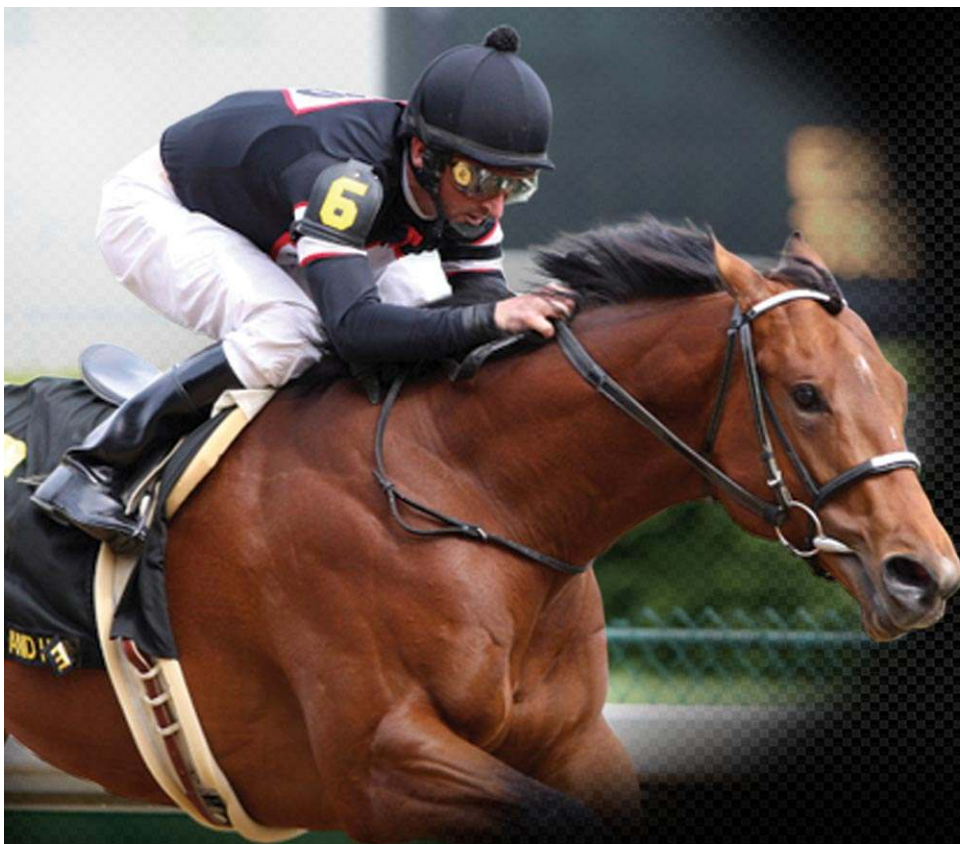
"If it is a nice quality horse, rated well, then they are selling well and the middle market is going quite well, if they are nice types. But the ones that aren't 100 percent right are struggling. I think there were quite a few pass-ins early on, but I think if you have got a nice horse, you will get the right money."

Mick Malone, Kitchwin Hills Stud:

"It has been sort of hit-and-miss a little, but that is often the case early in these sales, as people try to get a true gauge on where we are going. There have been a few horses passed in, but there is really nothing new about what has happened; people will review their expectations later today or tomorrow, and the clearance rate will improve."

by Last Tycoon (Ire)**

Consigned by Arrowfield Stud, agent

This full sibling to Group 1-placed Estee (Aus) and stakes-placed Empress Lily (Aus) out of a champion mare has many admirers. Agent John Ferguson gave A\$2.1 million on behalf of Sheikh Mohammed here for Estee in 2007. Arrowfield Stud manager Sam Fairgray pointed out that Shaaheq (Aus) was also out of a Last Tycoon (Ire) mare, and had proven herself as a two year old. "He is a very strong colt, a relaxed type, a really nice walker who moves exceptionally well, and he's very typical of Redoute's Choice," said Fairgray. "Estee has proven her ability, and the mare herself was a great race mare." Tycoon Lil (Aus) was covered last spring by Hussonet.

**236, c, Redoute's Choice (Aus)--Valkyrie Diva (Aus),
by Jade Robbery**

Consigned by Makybe

This is the first foal from Valkyrie Diva (Aus), a half-sister to Makybe Diva (GB) (Desert King {Ire}) and Musket (Aus) (Redoute's Choice {Aus}), and is expected to attract plenty of interest when he steps into the ring. In 2005, the Ingham family gave A\$2.5 million for Musket, another by Redoute's Choice who has won at Group 2 level. Valkyrie Diva was covered last spring by Exceed and Excel (Aus), while Tugela was covered by Street Cry (Ire).

**296, c, Redoute's Choice (Aus)--Asian Reef (GB),
by Manila**

Consigned by Kitchwin Hills, agent

A colt that has spent a considerable amount of time out of his box being inspected is this strongly made son of Redoute's Choice (Aus). Kitchwin's Mick Malone said, "He is a big, strong beautiful horse; he is correct, and it is hard to come across a mare that has produced a Group 1 winner, a Group 2 winner and a listed winner. He has been very well received here, and we are excited about his prospects." Dam Asian Reef (GB) has had seven foals to race, all winners, including Group 1 winner Bon Hoffa (Aus) (Belong to Me), Group 2 winner Before Too Long (Aus) (Belong to Me), and listed winner Okanui (Aus) (Barathea {Ire}).

A (C) will be used for maiden-claiming races and an (R) will be used for other restricted races. Purses for Canadian races are in Canadian dollars.

Look for the (K) throughout the TDN entries, denoting Keeneland sales graduates.

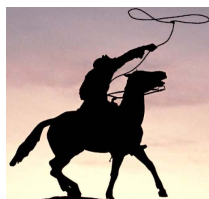

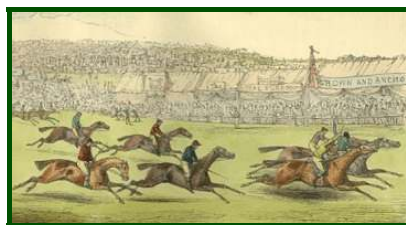

RACING Round-Up

She Be Wild's Oaks Status Still Undetermined...

Trainer Wayne Catalano called **She Be Wild** (Offlee Wild)'s third-place effort in last Saturday's GI Central Bank Ashland S. a "big race for us" and was "the come-back race we wanted to see." The reigning Eclipse Award-winning two-year-old filly was four-for-five on synthetic tracks during her championship season last year, but was only fifth to Bickersons (Silver Deputy) in the GII Forward Gal S. at Gulfstream Park in her dirt debut Jan. 31. Catalano attributed that try to his filly's total disdain for the Hallandale oval. "It was clear that she was not taking to that surface, that she wasn't getting a hold of it," he offered. As to whether connections will press on to a start in the GI Kentucky Oaks Apr. 30, Catalano remains noncommittal. "I am certainly not going to rule out the dirt," he explained. "She two-minute licked at Churchill when we were thinking about [the GIII Delta Princess S. last December] and seemed to handle it OK. We'll get her over there, see how she does and make the call from there."



Classic Corner

Eddery Happy with Fire...

Pat Eddery yesterday issued an upbeat bulletin regarding his leading G1 2000 Guineas hopeful **Hearts of Fire (GB)** (Firebreak {GB}). Not seen since besting the subsequent GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile scorer Vale of York (Ire) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) by a neck in the G1 Gran Criterium at the San Siro in early October, the colt will be reunited with Olivier Peslier for the May 1 Newmarket Classic. "He's done really well through the winter and I'm very pleased with him," his trainer commented. "His form is solid, and he'll definitely go there with a real sporting chance. He's very clear-winded, so we'll take him straight there. Olivier Peslier is very confident about the horse. I'm not too bothered what the ground is like, as he can go on firm and he's won on very soft. He's not a 25-1 shot for the Guineas in my view."

LAST TRIPLE CROWN WINNER: 32 YEARS AGO

It was just two years and one week ago last weekend that Big Brown (Boundary) announced himself on the big stage, when he won the GI Florida Derby, run in 2008 on March 29, by five lengths, running a Beyer 106--at the time, a standout figure in an otherwise ordinary-looking crop of three-year-olds. History records that he improved for the extra furlong to win the GI Kentucky Derby, as the 2.40-1 favorite, over the ill-fated filly Eight Belles in a Beyer 109. He only needed to run a Beyer 100 to win the GI Preakness by 5 1/4 lengths, but his Triple Crown bid foundered when he literally walked across the finish line at 1-5 in the GI Belmont S. Whatever went wrong that day--he wouldn't have won at any distance--Big Brown arguably didn't have the pedigree to be a 12-furlong winner, being by Boundary, a sprinting son of Danzig, out of a Nureyev mare.

Eskendereya (Giant's Causeway), the Egyptian name for the city of Alexandria, announced himself on the big stage with a runaway 8 1/2-length win in the GII Fasig-Tipton Fountain of Youth S at Gulfstream Feb. 20, and he confirmed his position with a similarly impressive win in the Saturday's GI Wood Memorial S. Old rival Jackson Bend (Hear No Evil) just got back up to nip GIII Gotham S. winner Awesome Act (Awesome Again) for second, nearly 10 lengths in arrears. Eskendereya laid close to a slow pace (:24.1, :49.1, 1:13.2), then ran his last three-eighths in :36 1/5 while easing away from a couple of reasonable yardsticks. His finishing time equated to a Beyer 109. With really just the GI Toyota Blue Grass and GI Arkansas Derby yet to come, Eskendereya is eight points clear as the best three-year-old colt in America, which means--on the form book, as things now stand--he should win the GI Kentucky Derby by six lengths.

That's provided, of course, that he genuinely stays 10 furlongs. Many before him have gone off Derby favorites off impressive nine-furlong trial wins, and found that the gap between nine and 10 furlongs at Churchill Downs on the first Saturday in May can in fact be a yawning chasm, a bridge too far and they don't get the trip. This issue is raised with Eskendereya because his half-brother Balmont (Stravinsky)--the only other winner so far out of the mare from six of racing age, by the way--was a sprinter. However, Balmont's sire Stravinsky was a sprinter and is a sire of sprinters; nothing else about Eskendereya suggests he won't get that 10th furlong. Giant's Causeway got a mile and quarter himself and has sired plenty of good 10-furlong horses on his way to his 2009 sire championship.

In fact, he sired the winner of the 14-furlong Breeders' Cup Marathon last year in Man of Iron. Eskendereya himself doesn't run like the extra furlong is going to be an issue; in fact, I'd say the extra three furlongs of the GI Belmont won't be an issue, either. I'm surprised Betfair doesn't have a bet up yet for him to win the Triple Crown, because I think he could. It didn't diminish Seattle Slew's credentials as a Triple Crown winner that he towered above his opposition. Mind you, Barbaro looked a real possibility to sweep the Triple Crown, yet even had he not suffered that horrible breakdown in the GI Preakness, who's to say Bernardini wouldn't have beaten him anyway? So all sorts of things can still go wrong, especially including injury and traffic in the race itself; and some new contenders of close or equal stature could emerge. But on what we know now on paper--the GI Kentucky Derby is Eskendereya's to lose--and he's no bad bet to be the first Triple Crown winner in 32 years.

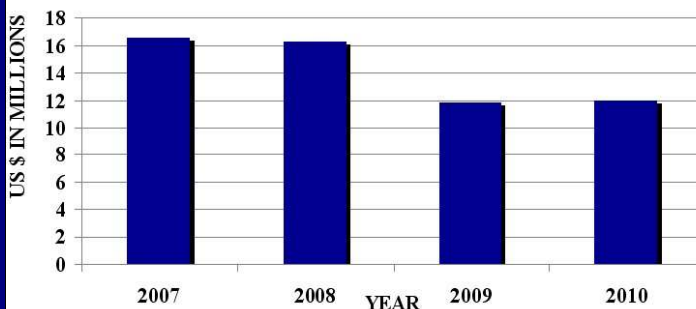
Mind you, it *all* looks good on paper, but races aren't run on paper, I have learned that over the years (not real races, anyway). But this is what the form book tells us right now. And still the second choice right now, in spite of coming only third in the GI Santa Anita Derby, is last year's two-year-old champion male Lookin at Lucky, by two-time champion sire Smart Strike. Here again, pace was a factor, as 2010 dual Grade II winner Sidney's Candy (Candy Ride) set a slow pace by California standards: 24, :48.1, 1:12.1, enabling him to run the last three-eighths in :35.4. You don't catch front-runners in two-turn races when they can finish like that, not unless you've got a seriously good horse. Lookin at Lucky was fixing to get into the race, too, moving menacingly on the stretch turn when Garrett Gomez was forced to check and take up, effectively knocking the horse out of the race. It's testimony to his grit that he was able to get back up for third, because he was checked at a crucial stage. Whether he'd have caught Sidney's Candy (whose winning figure was a Beyer 100) there's no way to tell, but the market hasn't dismissed him. On the Betfair betting exchange, yesterday morning in the U.K., Eskendereya is the favorite, at around 3-1; Lookin at Lucky is still the second favorite, though understandably out to 6-1, with Sidney's Candy now third favorite at 8-1. Lookin at Lucky may still never have run a Beyer higher than 97, but he sure could over 10 furlongs at Churchill Downs. Eskendereya looks the standout now, but Lookin at Lucky figures to get the trip, too, and he could end up making this crop look more like Affirmed and Alydar, or Secretariat and Sham (I'm being ambitious here, I know) than Seattle Slew, or Big Brown, and the rest. And one horse still not even mentioned is the Wertheimers' Setsuko (Pleasantly Perfect), a winner of one who has never been out of the first three in eight starts at one mile or more. He came from the clouds to finish second in the GI Santa Anita Derby and could be a longshot to keep an eye on in four weeks' time. He looks like he'll get the trip, too--always an important consideration, especially for the 'gimmicks.'

"Keeneland didn't lose any more ground, meaning the five major US two-year-old sales, compared to last year (the bottom) saw 23 percent fewer catalogued but a ten percent improvement in the percentage sold from the catalogue (40 to 44 percent). The five-sale gross was down by ten percent, the average was even up, barely, by 1.3 percent. But, in gross terms, the major US two-year-old market has shrunk by nearly half (46 percent) since 2007, with 467 juveniles grossing \$66-million in the five sales this year, compared to 643 grossing almost \$119-million in 2007."

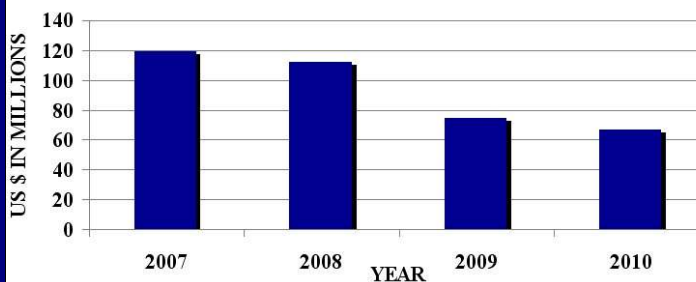
KEENELAND APRIL 2YO SALE

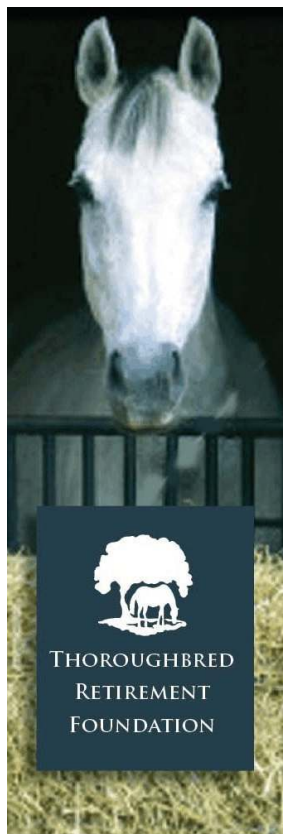
The U.S. Two-Year-Old Market...

Keeneland on Monday completed the five major two-year-old sales in North America; in chronological order--OBS February, Fasig-Tipton Calder, OBS March, Barretts, and Keeneland April. As you can see from the table in the Weekly Sales Ticker, the combined five-sale market has shrunk by 46 percent, from almost \$119 million three years ago to \$66 million this year. Calder is still the premier sale of the five, this year grossing \$23 million (down from \$43 million in 2007, the year after The Green Monkey). OBS March is the workhorse sale, accounting for 171 of the 467 horses sold; Calder sold 91, the other three sales sold 66, 68, and 71, respectively.

Really, the numbers are barely sustainable. Already there has been discussion that OBS, which saw its share of the two-year-old market increase after they installed the SafeTrack synthetic surface in 2008, should integrate its February sale into March. Two-year-old consignors may have hit a few grand slams in the golden years, but those days have gone, and the rules have changed. It's hard to envision there not being a two-year-old sale in California, and Keeneland's does coincide with the race meet (though they may re-position the date), so Ocala-based consignors may well find the sale that can be cut out is their February one. Also, though, they are likely to have to scale back the level of their investments. They can't even get half their horses sold. Kip Elser referred, in Monday's *TDN*, to buyers looking for less expensive, more serviceable 'Wednesday' horses as well as the 'Saturday afternoon' horses everybody wants. There are still plenty of us around who remember when pinhookers wouldn't dare pay more than \$100,000 for a yearling; a big score was when they bought one for \$50,000 and sold it for \$250,000. In a time when credit is hard to come by and people can't afford to be stretched out financially like they were just two or three years ago, pinhookers may find the old formulas still work, and can still make people money. It doesn't address the gigantic problem that the whole North American Thoroughbred industry has shrunk at an alarming rate, but buying more \$50,000 yearlings for resale is likely to be an avenue pinhookers find can keep them in the business. That could also help build the number of horses getting sold in the two-year-old sales back up to more sustainable numbers.
