## RACHEL ALEXANDRA FIRES BULLET

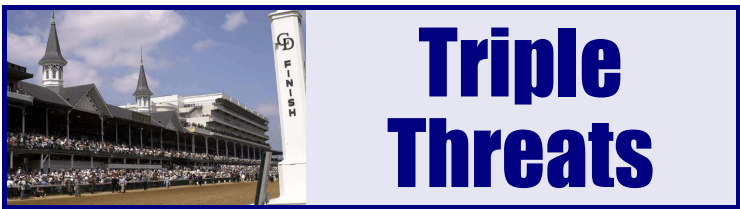
Stonestreet Stables' Horse of the Year **Rachel Alexandra** (Medaglia d'Oro) is looking like her old self again. The four-year-old worked six furlongs in a rapid

1:11.40 at Churchill Downs yesterday morning, her third straight bullet breeze over the track. "She worked crazy good," said trainer Steve Asmussen. "She's had three works since she's been here, and they have been extremely 'Rachelesque.' I'm

happy to see her putting in work like she did last year." A perfect eight-for-eight last season, Rachel Alexandra had a nine-race winning streak snapped when she was upset by Zardana (Brz) (Crimson Tide {Ire}) in the Mar. 13 New Orleans Ladies S. at Fair Grounds. It has not yet been decided where the filly will start next, but she is nominated for the Apr. 30 GII La Troienne S. going 1 1/16 miles on the GI Kentucky Oaks undercard.



## Dublin Sharp in Derby Prep...

GII Arkansas Derby third **Dublin** (Afleet Alex) worked five furlongs in :59.20 at Churchill Monday morning, fastest of 44 at the trip. The chestnut broke off behind a stablemate, but was on even terms as they negotiated the turn and left his company in the dust down the lane. The splits for the move were :11.80, :23.20, :35.20 and :47.20, and he galloped out six furlongs in 1:13.20. "I thought it was an excellent work," trainer D. Wayne Lukas said. "I

liked the way he did it. It is hard to say it was in company; it was almost a solo work." Lukas added, "The first work here, it is the energy that you want to see, and I saw that today. I think he really fits. I like him as well as any of them I've had." The Hall of Famer has had a record 43 Kentucky Derby starters, with four winners: Charismatic (1999), Grindstone (1996), Thunder Gulch (1995) and Winning Colors (1988). Dublin has been on the board in five of his eight career starts, with a win in the GI Three Chimneys Hopeful S., but two of his three off-the-board efforts have been in his two tries over the Churchill surface. The colt was fourth in his career opener at the track last June, and seventh in the GIII Iroquois S. in November. Jockey Terry Thompson, aboard for the work, will be having his first Derby mount this year. "I think Terry is riding as well as anybody in the nation right now and he has great chemistry with the horse," Lukas said. "We had made a change of riders, but it didn't work and we had the sense to switch back. If it wasn't broken, it shouldn't have been fixed."

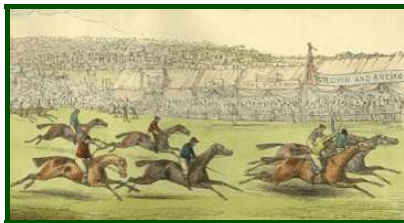

# Classic Corner

## Lady Darshaan Straight to Guineas...

Last semester's G1 Ascot Fillies' Mile runner-up **Lady Darshaan (Ire)** (High Chaparral {Ire}) will point straight to the May 2 G1 1000 Guineas without the benefit of a prep run, trainer Stan Moore has revealed. Moore is confident Coleman Bloodstock's sophomore, who is a half-sister to last year's G1 Prix de l'Abbaye hero Total Gallery (Ire) (Namid {GB}), will be fully primed for a tilt at Newmarket's one-mile Classic. "Lady Darshaan has come on well and did a nice piece of work over at Richard Hannon's place on Saturday morning," said the Lambourn conditioner. "It is great that Richard lets us do that and she might go back over there one more time--maybe on Sunday--and then it will be straight to the 1000 Guineas from there. We have been a little bit behind because of the weather, but the way she worked, I think there is every chance she will be in good form come the Guineas. She has done fantastic and, although she is not 100 percent at this moment, she is not far off it. She will be there with a fighting chance and I think she is the forgotten filly. I have another filly, **Kinky Afro (Ire)** (Modigliani), who was just beaten a short-head in the German 1000 Guineas trial [Apr. 11 Listed Henkel-Stutenrennen at Dusseldorf] behind the best filly in Germany [Ronja]. Now, the German Guineas itself is not going to be much different to the trial, so that in itself gives me a bit of reason for optimism because Lady Darshaan is a different gear to Kinky Afro. They are chalk and cheese, Kinky Afro could not work with Lady Darshaan. She will run in the 1000 Guineas and hopefully then the Irish 1000 Guineas. She is entered in the Irish Oaks, but I think a mile and a half might be pushing her, and 10 furlongs could prove to be her ideal trip. I would say she would be better on fast ground, more so than if it was soft."

## Arcano to Bypass 2000 Guineas...

Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's **Arcano (Ire)** (Oasis Dream {GB}), winner of last term's G1 Prix Morny, will sidestep the May 1 G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket following his defeat in last Saturday's G3 Greenham S. at Newbury. "Arcano won't run in the English Guineas and we'll give him a bit longer," Sheikh Hamdan's racing manager Angus Gold told *PA Sport*. "The Greenham came a bit quick for him and also he had a rushed preparation. He'll either go for the [May 22 G1] Irish [2000 Guineas at The Curragh] or the [May 16 G1] French Guineas [at Longchamp], or we may even wait until [Royal] Ascot in June. He didn't run much of a race and Sheikh Hamdan said to give him more time."

## Puff Magic Earns Guineas Date...

Mr. and Mrs. David Aykroyd's **Puff (Ire)** (Camacho {GB}) has earned a berth in the May 2 G1 1000 Guineas following Saturday's success in the G3 Fred Darling S. at Newbury, according to trainer Ralph Beckett. "I felt there was none keener through the early part of the race and Puff looked like she outstayed them," Beckett told *PA Sport*. "That was something I was not expecting, that's for certain. There was nothing in her pedigree that said she would get seven [furlongs], never mind a mile, but she clearly outstayed them on Saturday. We look like we are going to Newmarket and, if the ground's fast, that would be on our side." Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's **Habaayib (GB)** (Royal Applause {GB}), beaten a neck by Puff, remains on target to renew rivalry at Newmarket. "I thought she ran a great race, and we are going to leave her in the [1000] Guineas," said the Sheikh's Racing Manager Angus Gold. "We've also got **Tabassum (Ire)** (Nayef) and **Rumoush (Rahy)**, but we've always thought Habaayib was a nice filly. She slightly lost her way last year, but it's great to have her back. She has trained on and she stayed the trip well."

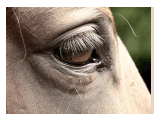

It was only last July that I reported on a remarkable run of success for Oasis Dream ([click here for Caulfield's column of July 14, 2009](#)), who was represented by four Group 2 winners in the space of four days. Well, the 10-year-old stallion has been in dominant form again, as has Dansili, his neighbour at Banstead Manor Stud. Between them, they have been represented by seven stakes winners over the last five days

Oasis Dream's contribution was three group victories, thanks to Sri Putra, Tuscan Evening and Alta Fedelta, and these successes came only a few days after he had boosted his total of stakes winners from his first three crops to 28, thanks to Keredari's encouraging success in the Loughbrown S.

Oasis Dream might even have made it four group victories in four days had his son Address Unknown not had a luckless run in the G3 Ballysax S. The *Racing Post* reported that Address Unknown, "can be considered unlucky not to have gone close, as he found himself trapped with no room to manoeuvre from over a furlong out."

As Oasis Dream was a champion two-year-old who went on to become champion sprinter, anyone could be forgiven for expecting speed and precocity to be his progeny's main assets. While he has certainly proved highly effective in passing on these qualities, with as many as 38 individual juvenile winners in a single crop, he has proved to be much more than just a very effective sire of two-year-olds.

Indeed, he is proving wonderfully versatile, siring winners over a wide range of distances in a wide range of countries on a wide range of ground conditions. He is even currently leading the Anglo-Irish list of sires of all-weather performers for the 2009/2010 season.

One aspect of his record that I find especially pleasing is the way that many of Oasis Dream's progeny

maintain their form. As many as seven members of his first crop scored at stakes level last year as four-year-olds, and at least eight members of this crop have already won this year, with Tuscan Evening leading the way.

When this admirable mare took the GII Santa Barbara H. three days

ago, she became Oasis Dream's sixth individual group/graded winner over a distance of a mile and a quarter or more. Tuscan Evening has now scored six graded successes over 6 1/2, eight, nine and 10 furlongs, but even without her help Oasis Dream would have sired a mature group winner (i.e. above the age of two) over every distance from five furlongs to a mile and a half.

It isn't too hard to identify why Oasis Dream is able to sire such a variety of stakes winners. Although his racing career mirrored that of his sire, the fast and precocious Green Desert, the bottom half of his pedigree is packed with stamina. His dam Hope was a sister to Wemyss Bight, winner of the Irish Oaks, and his first three dams were by Dancing Brave, Mill Reef and Busted, three exceptional racehorses who numbered the mile-and-a-half King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S. among their triumphs. Oasis Dream's second dam Bahamian and third dam Sorbus both possessed enough stamina to shine over 1 3/4 miles or more.

I thought it likely that Oasis Dream would normally need to be mated to a mare with plenty of stamina in her make-up for this stamina in his pedigree to dominate his speed. Sure enough, the broodmare sires of four of his group winners over a mile and a quarter or more are Niniski (Irish and French St Legers), Acatenango (Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud), In the Wings (Breeders' Cup Turf, Coronation Cup, etc.) and Suave Dancer (Prix du Jockey-Club and Arc).

However, there are a couple of notable exceptions among these winners. The Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare

Turf winner Middy and the G2 Great Voltigeur S. winner Monitor Closely are, respectively, out of mares by the top milers Kingmambo and Selkirk. The fact that Monitor Closely's next two dams are daughters of Forty Niner and Green Desert suggests that the stamina in the bottom half of Oasis Dream's pedigree can occa-

sionally be the dominant force.

It is Tuscan Evening who is out of a mare by Suave Dancer. This outstanding son of Green Dancer was only 10 when he was killed by lightning in Australia on Christmas Eve, 1998. He had already fallen out of favor with European breeders, but later salvaged his reputation to some extent through the Group 1 victories of Compton Admiral, Execute and Volvoretta.

Tuscan Evening's dam The Faraway Tree didn't have a great deal to show for the level of form she showed as a three-year-old, when Timeform rated her 113. Although she failed to become a stakes winner, The Faraway Tree was beaten only a neck in the G3 Park Hill S. over a distance in excess of 1 3/4 miles.

Oasis Dream seems to be well suited by staying mares from the Nijinsky sire line. He also sired Visit, who twice went close to winning at Grade I level in California, from a good stayer by Kahyasi and his Group 3 winner Lady Jane Digby is out of a Niniski mare. One of his latest stakes winners, the three-year-old French mile-and-a-quarter winner Sandbar, is out of a mare by Niniski's son Hernando, while the useful Oasis Knight, who stays two miles, is out of a mare by Nijinsky's grandson Generous.

The idea of sending The Faraway Tree to Oasis Dream probably owed something to the 2001 Classic success of Rose Gypsy, who was sired by Green Desert from The Faraway Tree's half-sister Krisalya. Rose Gypsy's French 1000 Guineas success probably also encouraged the idea of sending Rose Gypsy's relative Crystal Star to the miler Cape Cross, another son of Green Desert. This mating resulted in Crystal Capella, who stayed well enough to become a group winner over a mile and a half.

This is a highly successful family, and Tuscan Evening's second dam, Sassalya, proved an outstanding servant to the Oppenheimer family's Hascombe and Valiant Studs. She produced no fewer than eight foals that earned Timeform ratings in excess of 100, with five rated higher than 110. The best of them were Sasuru (G1 Prix d'Ispahan) and Sally Rous (G2 Challenge S.).

Tuscan Evening has now raced 25 times. She doesn't owe her toughness just to Oasis Dream. Her second dam Sassalya was a half-sister to Lafontaine, a horse who proved his toughness time and again in the early 1980s. As a four-year-old Lafontaine was asked to race no fewer than 20 times and kept his form so well that he recorded his fourth win of the season in the William Hill November H. on his final start. It was a similar story the following year, when Lafontaine raced 13 times and scored his best win in the last of them, the G3 Cumberland Lodge S. Lafontaine retired as a veteran of 54 races, and his toughness helped him sire the Grand National winner Papillon.

Tuscan Evening's third dam, Valya, won the Prix de Minerve while the next dam, Lilya, was one of the best three-year-old fillies in France in 1958, when she won the Prix du Moulin de Longchamp over a mile. Lilya's Group 1-winning descendants include the Derby winner Kris Kin and the big-earning international performers Luso and Warrsan.

All of which makes one wonder how Tuscan Evening was ignored to such an extent at the 2006 yearling sales that she made only 4,500gns.

**YOU WILL BE MISSED**, by Hunter T. Houlihan

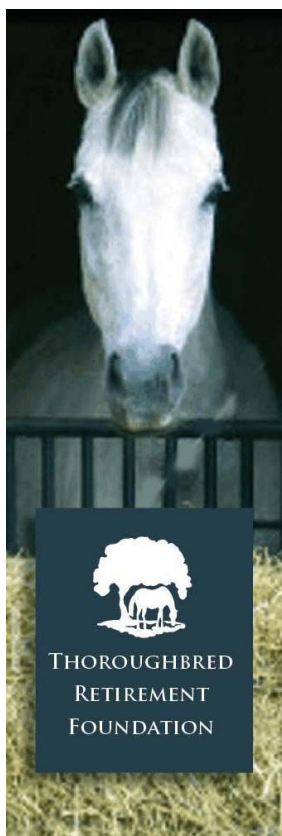
The untimely death of Master Command on Apr. 13 was just another news story to most, even in the Thoroughbred industry: an unfortunate part of our business is losing horses to a number of ailments, accidents and the unknown, sometimes daily. But here at Taylor Made, our flashy chestnut's passing was far more than another news story--it was the loss of a team member.

When a horse (or anything for that matter) dies, the human heart, brain and soul react in one of two ways: either they chalk it up to, "Everything happens for a reason"... "Dying is a part of life," etc., or they really, really hurt. Having learned in one of the hardest ways possible how fragile these beautiful animals are, this author was of the former persuasion rather than the latter in an attempt to prevent further heartbreak. That is, at least, until last Tuesday.

Here in the office, the usual mood of hard work mixed with a little light-hearted fun was replaced with one of gloom and loss. Had someone unaware of the situation walked in, they could have easily assumed we had lost a human team member as opposed to an equine member. This speaks multitudes about the environment and general outlook of Taylor Made Sales Agency and Taylor Made Stallions, as every person and every horse matter just as much as the next, instead of the traditional "What Have You Done For Me Lately?" mentality.

The mood of the office was not because of the money involved when we lost Master Command. Sure, that part stung a little; it would be a lie to say otherwise. But the reason everyone here at the farm was so upset was because we had lost such a promising young horse that had already done so much for everyone involved, even before his first sons and daughters stepped on to a racetrack.

Upon his retirement from racing, Master Command arrived to us at Taylor Made in September of 2007. The Aaron and Marie Jones color bearer amassed over \$1.1 million in earnings while tallying five graded stakes wins in his three-year career, and entered stud as a very exciting prospect, being by sire of sires A.P. Indy. He was well received by breeders--covering 127 mares in 2008 and another 134 mares in 2009--and was off to a great start in the auction ring as well, with his first weanlings commanding six-figure prices at the 2009 Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale. That first crop will sell as yearlings this year, and one can only wonder, as they hit the track in 2011, what place this promising young stallion will have in the Stud Book.

I've always heard that if someone has already said it best, it is best to let them say it. William Shakespeare wrote in *Henry V*, "He's of the colour of the nutmeg. And of the heat of the ginger....he is pure air and fire; and the dull elements of earth and water never appear in him, but only in patient stillness while his rider mounts him; he is indeed a horse, and all other jades you may call beasts." This is how I remember our fallen stallion.

Everything happens for a reason, and dying is a part of life. While this may be true, it is hard to lose a horse, and much harder to lose a member of your team. May the roads rise to meet you and the wind be always at your back, Master Command. You will be missed.

*Edited FTBOA Press Release...* The pari-mutuel legislation featuring components of the Florida Thoroughbred Breeders' and Owners' Association's economic stimulus package approved by the legislature is on its way to Gov. Charlie Crist and will become effective upon his signature. The House passed SB 622 by a vote of 74-39 Monday, making the law effective upon the governor's signature. Components of the economic stimulus package included in the legislation proposed by the FTBOA are:

- A reduction in the tax rate from 50 percent to 35 percent on slot machines at Gulfstream Park, Calder and other pari-mutuels. Revenue for purses generated from slots should increase by about 60 percent.
- A breeders' flexibility bill allowing more freedom in structuring the state's incentive awards program.
- A not-for-profit Thoroughbred racing permit for Ocala/Marion County. **Florida Bill cont. p2**

### WATERHOUSE ENTERS JUVENILE DEBATE

Trainer Gai Waterhouse dismissed suggestions aired at the Asian Racing Conference last week that avoiding racing horses at two years of age produced more sound horses in the longer term as "balderdash." Participating on a panel at the Sydney conference, RSPCA Chief Executive Heather Neil reiterated her organisation's opposition to racing "immature horses." The RSPCA stated that research on the racing of two-year-olds has yielded mixed results on the effects on the longevity of a horse's racing career and its musculoskeletal and cardiovascular health. "The evidence indicates that low-grade injuries and disease occur at a high rate during the training and racing of two-year olds in Australia, with 85 percent of horses suffering at least an incident of injury or disease. This can result in the disruption of training schedules and a delay in starting until the subsequent season, although on average, horses starting as two-year-olds that remain racing will retire from the industry at a similar age to those that started as three year olds," the RSPCA stated. "Currently, decisions on the maturity of individual horses to commence training and racing are in the hands of owners and trainers. Given that there is considerable financial pressure to start horses earning at an early age, RSPCA Australia believes that this decision requires independent veterinary advice. The RSPCA therefore supports the requirement for veterinary certification to indicate that a horse has matured satisfactorily before training for racing can commence." Waterhouse, however, dismissed the argument. "Horses are natural, competitive creatures of flight. The precocious ones show themselves as early yearlings in June and July. Our racing is famous for its speed and the precociousness of our horses. By not providing such races, we are not giving the grounding for our speed horses," she said on her website, adding, "What should happen, and what trainers and owners prefer, is that all provincial meetings have maidens and open class two-year-old racing on Saturday--either separating the boys and the girls or mixed together."

**VIEWED DIES** G1 Melbourne Cup and G1 Caulfield Cup winner **Viewed (Aus)** (Scenic {Ire}--Liver's Knot {NZ}, by Khozaam) died on Saturday at owner Dato Tan Chin Nam's Think Big Stud following complications from a twisted bowel. Trained by Bart Cummings, the six-year-old won the 2008 Melbourne Cup and 2009 Caulfield Cup. He had a record of 36-9-4-3 and earnings of A\$6,006,530. Dato Tan's Bloodstock Manager Duncan Ramag, who purchased Viewed privately for a very modest sum, said it was extremely sad news, and connections had planned another spring Cups campaign. He said Viewed had been buried at the property.
