‘LUCKY,’ CONVEYANCE SHARP IN CD WORKS

It was a good morning for trainer Bob Baffert's GI Kentucky Derby duo, comprised of Karl Watson, Mike Pegram and Paul Weitman's **Lookin At Lucky** (Smart Strike) and Zabeel Racing International's **Conveyance** (Indian Charlie). The **"TDN Rising Stars"** both earned bullets while working during the special 15-minute training session for Derby and GI Kentucky Oaks contenders. Juvenile champ Lookin at Lucky, a troubled third in the GI Santa Anita Derby Apr. 3, was sent out to a six-furlong drill under regular exercise rider Dana Barnes and completed the distance in 1:12. He galloped out seven furlongs in 1:24.80 and a mile in 1:39.20. The only other horse to work six panels, fellow Derby hopeful **Homeboykris** (Roman Ruler), went nearly three seconds slower, in 1:14.80. The Churchill strip was labeled fast. "He went really nice over the track...and was really reaching," Baffert said of Lookin At Lucky. "He looked comfortable on it, and we got a good work out of him." The Hall of Famer said the colt seems to have improved each day he's been at Churchill. "When he first got here, I gave him a little five-eighths [work], but we didn't let him do much," Baffert sad. "He could have done more, but we just let him cruise through because, coming off a synthetic track, he really has trouble with his hind end. But he's really gotten stronger and stronger since he's gotten here."

RAVEN'S PASS HAS COLIC SURGERY

Raven's Pass (Elusive Quality--Ascutney, by Lord At War {Arg}) will be rested for at least six weeks after undergoing colic surgery Wednesday night, it was announced. Darley's 2008 GI Breeders' Cup Classic hero, who resides at Kildangan Stud, had recently suffered from a back problem. Kildangan's Stud Director Jimmy Hyland said, "Unfortunately, Raven's Pass underwent colic surgery yesterday. The operation went well, and we are relieved he is showing positive signs of recovery." The chestnut's first foals are on the ground this spring. He had been standing for a €30,000 in 2010.

Dual Grade III winner Conveyance flaunted his speed in a five-furlong work. The gray, who lost his unbeaten record when runner-up in the nine-furlong GIII Sunland Derby Mar. 28, gassed the distance in :58.60, the best of 22 and the only work to shade the minute mark.

Jockey Calvin Borel, who is booked on **Super Saver** (Maria's Mon) in the Derby, was aboard. Conveyance was caught through internal splits of :11.60, :23.20, :34:80 and :46.20. His six-furlong gallop-

out time of 1:12 would have been good enough to share the bullet with Lookin at Lucky. "He went off a little fast, but he needed that," said Baffert. "He's the kind of horse that a work like that will sharpen him up. He's a fast horse--he wants to get out there and get it on."

Homeboykris Breezes Six Panels; Torre On Hand...

Los Angeles Dodgers manager and co-owner Joe Torre was part of the crew who watched **Homeboykris**

(Roman Ruler) put in his penultimate work before the Derby. Trained by Rick Dutrow Jr., the GI Champagne S. winner breezed six furlongs in 1:14.80, with internal splits of :12.80, :25.40, :38, :50.20 and 1:02.40. He galloped out seven panels in 1:28 flat. Julien Leparoux was in the irons. "I liked the work," Dutrow said. "I'm very happy with him. I have been high on this horse since the beginning. Julien worked him a couple of times in Florida, and he was happy with the work and said

he got over the track very well." Leparoux is slated to ride **Awesome Act** (Awesome Again) in the Derby.

Torre drove down from Cincinnati, where his club is having a three-game series against the Reds. The popular skipper said he puts his trust in Dutrow, and isn't worried that Homeboykris hasn't run since finishing second to Radiohead (GB) (Johannesburg) in a Gulfstream allowance Feb. 27. "The layoffs have worked both ways in recent years," Torre said. "I have a lot of confidence in Rick, and everything with this horse is positive. He is gradually getting him ready for this race." Torre, whose Dodgers host the Pittsburgh Pirates Derby Day and thus will miss the Run for the Roses, said of his trip yesterday, "It's great to come down here and see all of this." **Cont. p3**

Dutrow is looking for his second Derby victory in three years, after taking the 2008 renewal with Big Brown (Boundary). The trainer said he's in a much different position this time around, armed with a longshot against the race favorite

Escondereya. "I wish I had him," Dutrow said of the Zayat colorbearer. "He is far and away the horse to beat. With Big Brown, I was on cloud nine because I knew he was the horse to beat. All

the owners with this horse are on cloud nine to be here, and 'Homeboy,' if he runs his race and gets a good trip, he can beat a lot of these horses." Dutrow added that Homeboykris would have a three-eighths or half-mile work next week to complete his serious training for the Derby.

No Snow Chief for Caracortado...

GII Robert B. Lewis S. winner **Caracortado** (Cat Dreams), fourth last out in the GI Santa Anita Derby Apr. 3, will skip Saturday's \$200,000 Snow Chief S. at Hollywood Park. The Cal-bred chestnut is expected to head east for his next appearance. "He'd be running back in three weeks and would have to carry 124 pounds," explained trainer Mike Machowsky. "We're considering the [GI] Preakness [S. at Pimlico May 15] or a race at Monmouth."

Barba Ready to Bet...

Alexis Barba trains the likely favorite in the aforementioned Snow Chief, GIII Sham S. winner **Alphie's Bet** (Tribal Rule), but she'll be in the air heading to Kentucky come post time. **Make Music for Me** (Bernstein), on the brink for the GI Kentucky Derby with \$218,000 in graded earnings, is slated to breeze at Churchill. "I have to catch a plane Saturday noon in order to see Make Music For Me work Sunday morning," said Barba. "Patty Johnson will saddle Alphie's Bet." She added, "He's two away from getting in [to the Derby]. If he doesn't get in, he will run in the \$175,000 [GIII] American Turf the day before. Either way, Joel Rosario will ride."

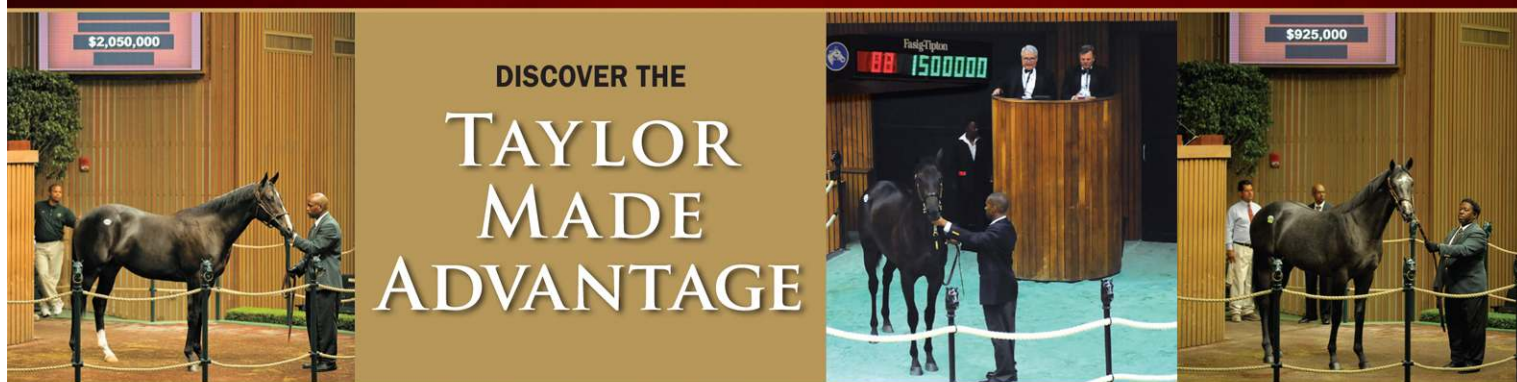

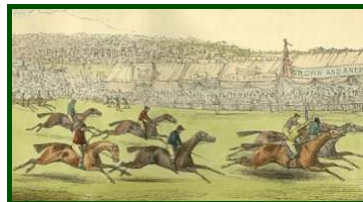

Fallon Sticks With Seta...

Kieren Fallon will partner ☆ **"TDN Rising Star" ☆ Seta (GB)** (Pivotal {GB}) over **Music Show (Ire)** (Noverre) in next Sunday's G1 1000 Guineas at Newmarket, it was revealed Wednesday. Days of speculation over which of the two fillies he would ride ended as connections of the G3 Nell Gwyn S. winner Music Show learned that the six-time champion would stay with Sarah Leigh's G2 May Hill S. third-place finisher. "Kieren had to make a decision this morning and he told me that he was going to ride Seta," Music Show's trainer Mick Channon told *PA Sport*. "Ryan Moore will ride Music Show. I'm happy to have any champion on my horse." Fallon later told *Racing Post* that Seta had impressed him in a gallop over Newmarket's Rowley Mile yesterday morning. "Seta gave me a real nice feel and I couldn't have been happier with her with the Guineas coming along," he explained. "It was a really good piece of work on beautiful ground."

Connections Wait On Pipette Decision...

George Strawbridge's **Pipette (GB)** (Pivotal {GB}) has yet to be confirmed as a definite runner in next Sunday's G1 1000 Guineas at Newmarket, for which a list of 30 remained after the latest forfeit stage. Trainer Andrew Balding had earmarked the mile Classic for the homebred following her smooth success in a conditions event over that trip on Kempton's Polytrack Apr. 3, but is watching the forecast closely. "We have left Pipette in the 1000 Guineas, but a lot will depend on the weather--she won't take her chance if the ground is too fast," he said. "She also has the possibility of running in the Listed Pretty Polly S., and we will make a call nearer the time. I was very pleased with her win at Kempton and there is no question that she is a nice filly."

'Pimpernel' On Track...

Windflower Overseas Holdings' **Elusive Pimpernel** (Elusive Quality) is on course for next Saturday's G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket, for which 27 colts remained after the latest forfeit stage. Following the homebred's four-length success in the G3 Craven S. over the same course and distance last Thursday, he currently trades as the second favorite behind his G1 Racing Post Trophy conqueror **St Nicholas Abbey (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}). "Elusive Pimpernel has come out of his Newmarket run in good order and we have been pleased by his progress since," trainer John Dunlop's Racing Secretary Marcus Hosgood commented. There were no surprises among the latest withdrawals, which as expected included the G1 Dewhurst S. winner **Beeethoven (Ire)** (Oratorio {Ire}), leaving Aidan O'Brien with a total of four entries headed by Derrick Smith's long-time ante-post favorite.

Mushka captured the 2007 GII Demoiselle S. in the Zayat colors, and wound up selling for \$2.4 million at KEENOV in 2008 to Brushwood. The dark bay captured the GIII Glens Falls H. on the Saratoga spinach the following season, then was put up to first in the G1 Juddmonte Spinster S. on Keeneland's Polytrack before capping 2009 with a runner-up effort in the GI Breeders' Cup Ladies Classic at Santa Anita in November. Fifth in the GII Santa Maria H. Feb. 13, Mushka missed by just a length when fourth in what would be her career finale, the GIII Orchid H. at Gulfstream Mar. 28. She heads to the breeding shed with a record of 19-6-3-3 and earnings of \$1,096,125.



RACING Round-Up

MUSHKA RETIRED Brushwood Stable's Grade I winner **Mushka** (Empire Maker--Sluice, by Seeking the Gold) has been retired. The five-year-old will be bred to Distorted Humor. "She's had a little bit of an ankle issue, and at her age it might be a little bit of time before she could come back to racing," said Brushwood's Elizabeth Moran. "I thought the time was right to retire her." Bred by Diane Snowden, the granddaughter of MGISW Lakeway (Seattle Slew) was acquired for \$1.6 million as a yearling at FTSAUG by Zayat Stables, and was sent to trainer Bill Mott.

Kinsale King Readied For Challenge...

Kinsale King (Yankee Victor) is being primed for a trip to Royal Ascot for the June 19 G1 Golden Jubilee S., trainer Carl O'Callaghan announced yesterday. One of a clutch of international sprinters entered, the G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen hero is about to start his lengthy preparation for the six-furlong prize. "The places a trainer

dreams about winning at are Dubai, Royal Ascot and the Breeders' Cup," O'Callaghan said. "I've got one of the three. Hopefully, I can get them all. Kinsale King couldn't be doing any better. He is back on the track and we'll leave for Maryland on May 17, where we will be staying at Michael Dickinson's Tapeta Farm so we can train up a straight. I have already arranged for our rider, Garrett Gomez, to come down and get a feel for what we need to do changing leads on a straight. We'll spend a few weeks there and ship to Newmarket on June 2."

Also among the now-customary overseas presence are the Hong Kong duo of the G3 Al Quoz Sprint winner **Joy and Fun (NZ)** (Cullen {Aus}) and the

G1 Queen's Silver Jubilee Cup hero **Happy Zero (Aus)** (Danzero {Aus}). Winfried Engelbrecht-Bresges, Chief Executive of the Hong Kong Jockey Club, commented, "I welcome the enterprise and initiative of the connections of both horses. I think it is fair to say that, by embarking on this mission, they are making yet another statement that Hong Kong racing has truly come of age as a major force on the international stage. I am confident that they have the ability to record another win at the Royal Meeting for Hong Kong following the victory of Cape of Good Hope (GB) (Inchiner {GB}) in 2005."

Trainer David Hayes is looking at shipping in the G1 Lightning S. winner **Nicconi (Aus)** (Bianconi) for the G1 King's Stand S. five days earlier. "Nicconi has the right form line, following the other Aussie horses to have completed the Lightning-King's Stand double," he said. "He is undefeated at five furlongs and he runs well fresh. The plan is to run him first up in the King's Stand. If he travels well I expect him to be very competitive."

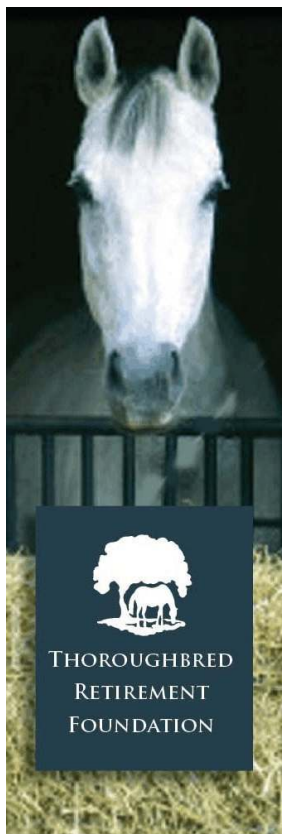

SALES NEWS

SOUTH AFRICAN SALE BEGINS FRIDAY South Africa's Emperor Palace National Yearling Sale begins Friday evening. A three-day event conducted by the Thoroughbred Breeders Association, the sale continues with a pair of sessions on Sunday and Monday. With the withdrawal of 31 lots, 572 yearlings are entered. Last year, the sale's aggregate of R152.12 million was down 24 percent from 2008, but that was a reasonable outcome given the economic situation. In 2009, 89 percent of the yearlings were sold; the average price was R310,449 (\$41,900). A year earlier, 80 percent of the yearlings sold for an average of R391,148 (\$53,700). The total aggregate of the 2008 sale was R201,050,000—an all-time high. Since 2000, the average price has increased from R90,929 to more than R300,000. The average number of yearlings catalogued for the sale over the last 10 years is 559. **Cont. p10**

The sale, regarded as South Africa's premier yearling auction, was first held in 1906, and, in its early days, formed part of the Witwatersrand Agricultural Society. Today, the TBA complex is found in Germiston, just 15 minutes away from Oliver Tambo International Airport. Since 2000, the sale has produced no fewer than 18 official champions, as well as international stakes winners Wolf Whistle (SAf) (Badger Land), Grand Emporium (SAf) (National Assembly), Lucky Find (SAf) (Rich Man's Gold), Surveyor (SAf) (Western Winter), Oracle West (SAf) (Western Winter) and Royal Vintage (SAf) (Rich Man's Gold). In 2005, the National Sale's graduates included River Jetez (SAf) (Jet Master {SAf}), winner of this year's G1 J& B Met Dynasty (SAf) (Fort Wood); and Winter Solstice (SAf) (Western Winter), both of whom would be named Horse of the Year.

In 2003, Battersea Park (SAf) became the first yearling to sell for over R1-million (\$135,000). The Jallad colt was knocked down at R1.2 million (\$162,000) to trainer Weiho Marwing. The most expensive horse ever sold at public auction in South Africa came up for sale

at the 2005 National Yearling Sale. The handsome colt, named Wonder Lawn (SAf), was a son of champion South African sire Fort Wood (Sadler's Wells) and Group 1 winner Velvet Green (Brz) (Roy). He was sold to Fieldspring Racing for R3.3 million (\$444,000). A Group 3 winner in South Af-

rica, Wonder Lawn was exported to Dubai where he won his last start. To date, the 2008 sale graduates include 18 stakes winners, including Classic winners Noordhoek Flier (SAf) (Pivotal {GB}), Field Flower (SAf) (Silvano {Ger}) and Bravura (SAf) (Silvano {Ger}).

All of South Africa's top sires will be strongly represented in the 2010 sale. Progeny by leading sires Silvano (Ger), Jet Master (SAf), Jallad, Western Winter, Al Mufti, National Assembly, Kahal (GB) and Captain Al (SAf) should be much sought after. Leading first crop sires include A. P. Indy's half-brother Tiger Ridge and Cataloochee (SAf). The first crop of Eclipse champion Miesque's Approval (Miesque's Son) come up for sale, whilst there is much excitement around the first local crop of Irish classic winner and proven Group 1 sire Black Minnaloushe. There are also a handful of yearlings on offer sired by outstanding international sires such as Elusive Quality, Rock of Gibraltar (Ire), Zamindar, Singpiel (Ire) and Oratorio (Ire). No fewer than 19 Group 1-winning mares have offspring entered, and there are 33 full- or half-siblings to Group 1 winners.

The one problem with this year's sale, however, is that due to flight restrictions, many overseas buyers are unable to reach South Africa. Eamonn Cullen, marketing manager for the TBA commented, "Unfortunately many European agents and buyers are trying to attend the sale, but due to the ongoing problems with the volcanic ash, many would be buyers are stranded. The likes of David Allan, Tom Goff, Angus Gold and Peter Doyle have all been trying to attend the sale, but, unfortunately, the current airline problems have made it all but impossible for them to do so." Letters TO THE EDITOR

Editor's Note: In the wake of the ruling in a Kentucky court that owner Mike Lauffer must pay Jerry Brown, the owner of Thoro-Graph, \$25,000 for his role in advising Lauffer to buy an interest in Rachel Alexandra Brown has sent the following Letter to the Editor to the TDN. The judgement was far short of the \$271,000 in fees Brown sought, and his claim that Lauffer should have to disgorge more than \$4 million in profits was also rejected.

The judge ruled that Lauffer '...received valuable services in the form of specific advice as to the merit of Rachel Alexandra, and a recommendation that the horse be purchased. This advice was rendered under circumstances such that (Brown) expected to be paid for giving that advice.'

Everyone who makes a living in the Thoroughbred industry should be alarmed at this ruling. For one thing, if it holds on appeal and becomes precedent, it would mean that industry professionals are not in a position to decide our own rates and fees, which the judge in this

case decided should be based on what he thought was the "industry standard" for "services relating to the sale of horses." But, more importantly, by ruling that Mr. Lauffer was obligated to pay me, but then not penalizing him for not doing so, the judge is ruling that there is no downside to refusing to pay--that all someone who does that should have to pay is what they should have paid to begin with, whatever that amount is eventually ruled to be in this case. Most of the time for all of us the amount in question is not the six figures I am owed under my usual rates because Rachel Alexandra went on to have such great success. It's usually a much smaller amount and, if this ruling were to stand, it would obviously create a situation where many of us would be forced to settle for less than we are owed simply to avoid the costs of litigation and recovery, which often would be greater than the actual fees we are owed.

Silverton Hills also purchased the topper at Sunday's Adena Springs juvenile sale, an Awesome Again--Pop Princess filly for \$150,000.

The top-priced colt on the day was hip 703, a chestnut by Put it Back who was hammered down to Patrice Miller, EQB Inc., agent, for \$140,000. Out of the Calder stakes winner Abuela Esther (Uru) (Crater), the colt worked an eighth in :09 4/5 ([video](#)), co-fastest at the distance last Thursday. Secure Investments consigned hip 703.

The sale enjoyed another strong day yesterday, though not as strong as a Tuesday session that saw double-digit increases in median and average. The session three median was \$18,500; the average was \$27,305. Both numbers were up 8.8 percent from a year ago. 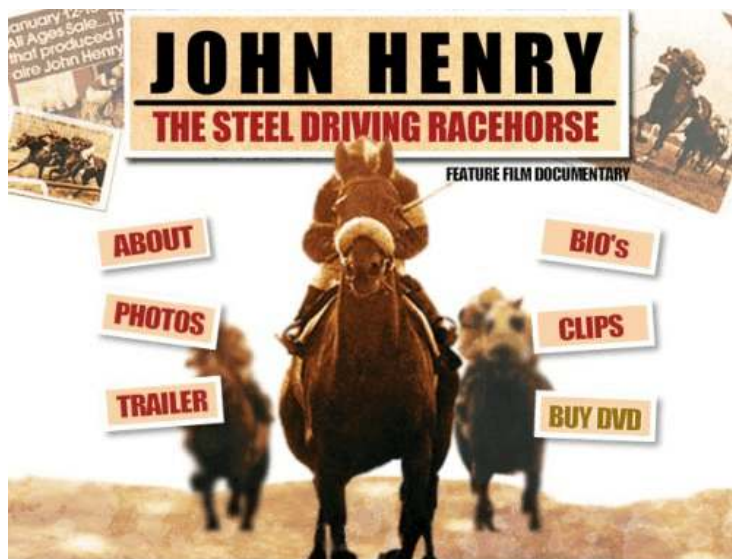

Dubawi (Ire) is a young sire going places and it was one of his sons who was at the fore when topping proceedings at £140,000 at Doncaster Bloodstock Sales' Breeze-Up yesterday. As in 2009, it was Con Marnane's Bانشa House Stud who were responsible for the day's chief draw and the sense of deja vu was heightened by Malih Al Basti being the name on the docket as it had been for a son of Pastoral Pursuits (GB) 12 months ago. The colt in question this time is a son of the listed-placed *Improvise* (GB) (*Lend a Hand {GB}*), whose family includes the talented mare *Jazz Princess* (Ire) (*Bahhare*) and, further back, the sire *Zieten* and champion *Blue Duster* (*Danzig*). Marnane had paid only £25,000 for the March-foaled bay at the St Leger Yearling Sale at this venue in August and that proved one of a select bunch of pinhooking successes during the session. Willie Browne's powerful *Mocklershill* operation had earlier landed a similar touch when selling an *Officer* colt they purchased for \$25,000 at Fasig-Tipton's Kentucky Fall Yearling Sale for £135,000. Consigned as hip 101, the May-foaled half-brother to two black-type performers hails from the extended family of *Step Nicely* and was snapped up by Dwayne Woods for owner Andrew Tinkler, who had made his presence felt at Tattersalls last week. Progeny of American-based sires were in demand and they also accounted for two of the next three lots to sell. *Speightstown's* reputation on these shores was boosted by last year's G1 *Prix Jean Prat* hero *Lord Shanakill* and his sole offering on the day sold to Peter Swann for £125,000. Bought by Jim McCartan's *Gaybrook Lodge Stud* for only \$18,000 at Keeneland September, hip 128 is a son of the stakes-placed *Crown You* (*Two Punch*), who is a half-sister to the 1999 GII *Peter Pan S.* scorer and sire *Best of Luck* (*Broad Brush*). *Henny Hughes* had just one representative yesterday and the well-connected hip 128 sold for £110,000. Another who slipped through the net as a yearling when failing to meet his reserve at \$27,000 at Keeneland, the April-foaled chestnut from the consignment of *Brendan Holland's Grove Stud* was snapped up by *Jill Lamb Bloodstock*. Out of a three-parts sister to the top-class *Dance Parade* (*Gone West*), his half-brother *Mr Irons* (*Mr. Greeley*) currently races in the *Betty Moran* colors for the *Sir Michael Stoute* stable and was a winner at two.

Marnane was celebrating another hit earlier when his daughter of *Oasis Dream* (GB)--that he had paid £15,000 for at the Leger Sale-- was sold for £110,000. Hip 67 is out of a half to the listed-winning and Classic-placed *Aria di Festa* (Ire) (*Orpen*) and was bought by *Charles Wentworth*. *Bانشa House* also sold hip 84, a daughter of *Invincible Spirit* (Ire) from the extended family of *Thunder Gulch*, to *Bobby O'Ryan* for £90,000 and hip 75, another filly by *Oasis Dream* (GB), whose pedigree includes the sires *Prince Sabo* (GB) and *Abou Zouz*, to *Jill Lamb* for £75,000.
