SUPER SAVER TO RETURN TO TRACK TODAY

WinStar Farm homebred **Super Saver** (Maria's Mon) walked the shedrow yesterday morning at trainer Todd Pletcher's barn at Churchill and is scheduled to return to the track this morning to jog,

four days after winning the GI Kentucky Derby. Pletcher is currently in New York attending to affairs, but will return to Louisville later in the week and decide then whether Super Saver will work before the GI Preakness S. at Pimlico May 15, or just gallop up to the race. Calvin Borel, who was winning his third Derby in four years, checked in on Super Saver yesterday. "He looks awesome," Borel reported. "I saw him this morning and he was on his toes. He is peaking at the right time." Super Saver is

scheduled to leave for Pimlico next Wednesday, along with another Pletcher runner targeting the Preakness, Dogwood Stable's **Aikenite** (Yes It's True), who is coming off a runner-up effort in the Apr. 24 The Cliff's Edge GIII Derby Trial S. In other news, Derby third **Paddy O'Prado** (El Prado {Ire}) jogged two miles yesterday for trainer Dale Romans, who said no decision has been made on the Preakness.

AWESOME ACT INJURED IN DERBY

Susan Roy and Vinery's **Awesome Act** (Awesome Again), a disappointing 19th as the fourth betting choice in Saturday's GI Kentucky Derby, exited the race with an apparent injury, connections said yesterday. Vinery General Manager Tom Ludt said the chestnut was slightly lame and was back at Vinery's Lexington farm, and would undergo a full checkout by Dr. Larry Bramlage in the next few days. "His legs and feet and everything are cold, but he's lame," Ludt told the *Daily Racing Form* Tuesday. "He's going to have nuclear scintigraphy done. The problem is that there's a shortage of the dye for the procedure, because of all the flight problems they had in Europe. He'll go over to Rood and Riddle to have the work done, hopefully on Thursday. There's no obvious injury. Hopefully he's just body sore, or has bone bruises. That's probably the reason he ran so poorly. We brought him back to the farm in Lexington. We don't know the answers yet. But he will get some time." The GIII Gotham S. winner will stay in the States to continue his three-year-old campaign and, once he resumes training, will be moved to Steve Asmussen's barn.

PREAKNESS-BOUND 'IKE' WORKS

Ike and Dawn Thrash's GIII The Cliff's Edge Derby Trial winner **Hurricane Ike** (Graeme Hall) breezed five furlongs at Churchill yesterday in preparation for a tilt in the GI Preakness S. May 15. Working under Calvin Borel, who was aboard for the Derby Trial, the three-year-old stopped the clock in 1:00 2/5 just after the renovation break. Working in blinkers as is his norm, Hurricane Ike broke off at the half-mile pole and clicked off splits of :12.20, :24.40, :36.40 and :48. He galloped out six furlongs in 1:15. It was the fourth fastest of 39 moves at the distance and came over a track labeled fast. "It was very good and he galloped out well," Borel said. "He was a very happy horse the last time I rode him, and I thought he was about the same today." Robby Albarado inherits the mount on Hurricane Ike for the Preakness, as Borel is booked to ride Derby hero Super Saver. Hurricane Ike is trained by John Sadler, whose two Derby runners, **Sidney's Candy** (Candy Ride {Arg}) (17th) and **Line of David** (Lion Heart) (18th), were scheduled to fly back to California yesterday. In other Preakness news, trainer D. Wayne Lukas is considering GII Lane's End S. runner-up **Northern Giant** (Giant's Causeway), last of nine in the GI Arkansas Derby in his latest, in addition to Derby seventh **Dublin** (Afleet Alex).

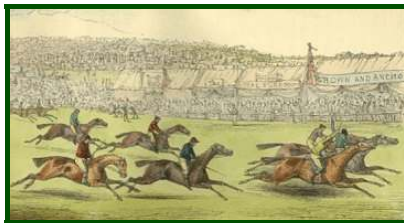

Steinbeck on Track for Return...

♣ **"TDN Rising Star"** ♣ Steinbeck (Ire) (Footstepsinthesand {GB}) is set to contest the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas after pleasing Aidan O'Brien in a race-course spin on Monday. Ruled out of the Newmarket equivalent due to a setback, the Michael Tabor colorbearer--fourth in the G1 Dewhurst S. in October--enjoyed an away day at The Curragh ahead of his date in the May 22 mile Classic. Also on the track were last year's G1 Criterium International winner **Jan Vermeer (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}), G2 Debutante S. heroine **Lillie Langtry (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) and **Rip Van Winkle (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}). "We were very pleased with the horses that cantered up after racing," O'Brien said on his website. "Hopefully, Rip Van Winkle will now head to the G1 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot [June 16], Lillie Langtry could have her first start in the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas [at The Curragh May 23] and we will aim Steinbeck for the Irish 2000 Guineas. We have not decided where to start Jan Vermeer yet--we will see how he is in the next few days."

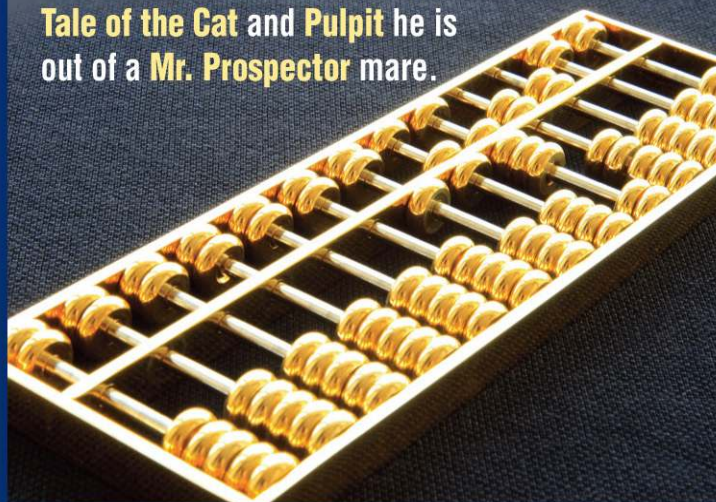

ANOTHER WILD WEEKEND

We have to start with the GI Kentucky Derby, of course, as it's "America's greatest race," a claim not made for the G1 English 2000 Guineas. There were some really satisfying aspects to Super Saver's win: WinStar has been a big contributor to the business the last 10 years; Todd Pletcher, arguably the leading trainer in America and certainly one of the best-dressed and coolest, got a Kentucky Derby win; and what else is there to say about Calvin Bo-Rail's third Derby win in the last four years? He owns that racetrack, or

at least the rail. Plenty of commentators thought his ride made the difference between defeat and victory. The colt has a pedigree, too, as Andrew Caulfield detailed yesterday. So that's all good.

But let's not kid ourselves: it wasn't the greatest Derby ever run. The winner returned a Beyer figure of 104, only Giacomo (100 in the 2005 Derby) has run a lower number to win the race since Andy Beyer and his team started publishing their numbers in the *Daily Racing Form* nearly 20 years ago. After Conveyance (Indian Charlie) led through the first three-quarters in a shade under 1:10:3/5, Super Saver (Maria's Mon) was in fourth, 6 1/2 lengths back; so he had run 1:11.4/5 for the first six furlongs. The final time of 2:04.2/5 tells us that Super Saver ran the last half mile in :52.3/5 seconds, with a final quarter in :26.2/5. Those are slow times, that's all there is to it. It looked like a moderate field going into the race, which as everybody could see was contested in appalling slop, and it looks like a moderate field coming out of it, though, as I say, no one begrudges WinStar and Todd Pletcher their Derby wins.

Plenty of horses couldn't handle the conditions: seven horses were beaten between 30-60 lengths, though three of those (Conveyance, Sidney's Candy, and Line of David), were the first three after the first half-mile. British hope Awesome Act may have worked great in the mud earlier in the week, but he eventually struggled home, beating one, eased up and covered in mud. Don't think he fancied it, and came out of the race lame, according to connections.

There were plenty more hard-luck stories, but the sorriest sight of all was seeing Lookin at Lucky (Smart Strike) herded into the fence by Stately Victor (Ghostzapper) before they'd gone a quarter mile. He was completely out of the race from that moment, and I reckon ran almost a winning race to finish sixth, as did GI Florida Derby hero Ice Box (Pulpit), who rallied from next to last to run an eye-catching second. Paddy O'Prado ran on well to be third, and Make Music for Me came from dead last to finish fourth. Noble's Promise, in fifth, and Dublin, in seventh, also ran good races, though all but the winner ran Beyers in the 'nineties. I can see why Zito reckons he might wait on the GI Belmont S. with Ice Box, but the next five, at least, have every right to have another go at Super Saver in the GI Preakness. He may have Borel back, but that may or may not be quite the same as having Borel at Churchill.

Friday's GI Kentucky Oaks represented a triumph for cheap yearlings, as the \$11,000 yearling Blind Luck, from the first crop of the then-unconsidered, one-eyed Pollard's Vision (Carson City), just got up to beat the

\$8,000 yearling Evening Jewel and give trainer Jerry Hollendorfer his third GI Kentucky Oaks win; that's pretty impressive, considering he is based in Northern California. Neither filly was exactly a secret: Blind Luck was the 6-5 favorite after an impressive romp in Oaklawn's GII Fantasy S., in which she ran a Beyer 104, having also won her only previous start on dirt in her career

debut at Calder. Evening Jewel, trained in California by Jim Cassidy, was making her debut on conventional dirt, but had been beaten a nose by Blind Luck in the GI Las Virgenes at Santa Anita, then led all the way to win Keeneland's GI Ashland S. in her final start before the Oaks. The two fillies clocked 1:50 3/5 for the nine furlongs, which translated into a Beyer 94--again, not very fast.

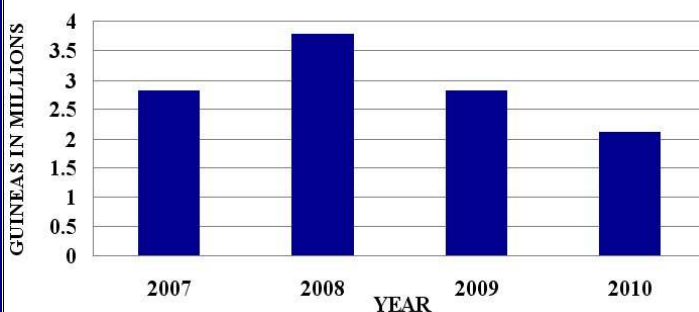
Weekly Sales Ticker

"The European two-year-old market peaked in size in 2007 (698 catalogued in sales to date) but in gross and average in 2008. Since then the gross is down by 34 percent, and the average by 31 percent; call it down a third. Tattersalls' newer second two-year-old sale last Friday was down more than that, 44 percent in gross and 46 percent in average (from 2008), reflecting the thinness of demand – there just isn't that much money for racehorses about. Here was another two-year-old sale where fewer than a hundred horses were sold."

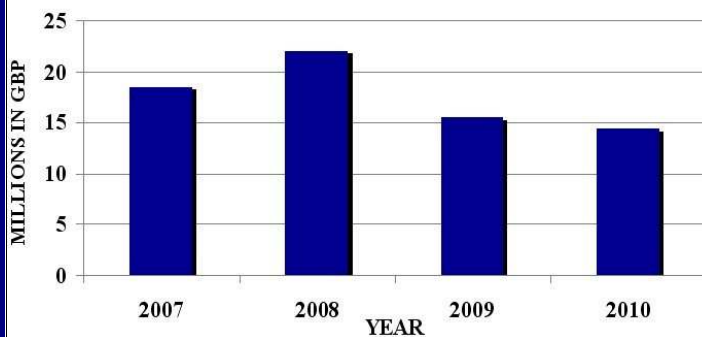
TATTERSALLS GUINEAS 2YO SALE

Across the Pond...

The two English Guineas races, the G1 2000 Guineas for colts on Saturday and the G1 1000 Guineas for fillies on Sunday, weren't exactly straightforward either. Of course, if you were thinking Calvin Borel at Churchill Downs, you might have been thinking Dubawi for Europe. There was a Dubawi in the English 2000 and guess what, he won! This was Makfi, who had been bought off Sheikh Hamdan for 26,000gns. at last October's Horses in Training Sale in Newmarket, won a race at Fontainebleau for new trainer Mikel Delzangles in November, and came back to win the G3 Prix Djebel in April. He is now three-for-three lifetime after working his way through the pack for a 1 1/4-length victory over the Hannon-trained one-two from the G3 Greenham S., Dick Turpin (Arakan) and Canford Cliffs (Tagula). The first nine finished within four lengths of each other, and the winner posted a respectable Racing Post Rating (RPR) of 123. Being that he's undefeated, we don't know how much better Makfi might be, but one thing for sure, Dubawi is for real. That's his second Guineas win this spring, after Worthadd's win in the G3 Premio Paroli (Italian 2000 Guineas), and he has a very live contender for the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches in 10 days' time in Anna Salai, winner of the G3 Prix de la Grotte. Makfi may next appear in Royal Ascot's G1 St. James's Palace S. in June.

It was a pretty good weekend for Europe's second-crop sires: the Guineas second, Dick Turpin, is by F2007 sire Arakan, a son of Nureyev who stands at Joe Foley's Ballyhane Stud in Ireland. Shamardal had an impressive listed winner in Germany, Elle Shadow (out of champion Elle Danzig, by Roi Danzig), who is now one of the favorites for the G1 Preis der Diana (German Oaks), though that's not run until Aug. 1. The Oratorio filly Lolly for Dolly made it two for two in the seven-furlong G3 Athasi S. at the Curragh on Monday, and has a Classic engagement a little closer to hand - the G1 Irish One Thousand Guineas May 23.

The weekend's final Classic was Sunday's G1 English 1000 Guineas at Newmarket, and this, too, had a weird result, for three reasons. First, the winner, lukewarm favorite Special Duty (Hennessy), was awarded the race in the stewards' room after losing by a nose to the 66-1 shot Jacqueline Quest (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}). Special Duty's trainer, Criquette Head, had already congratulated Jacqueline Quest's trainer, Henry Cecil, when Henry said to her, hold on, you might get the race. Sure enough, when you saw the head-on, Jacqueline Quest had carried the winner halfway across the racetrack, bumped her, and definitely intimidated her. The stewards decided the second had lost more ground than she'd been beaten by through the interference, and rightly reversed the placings. The second odd thing about the English 1000 was that there appeared to be a definite track bias, in that the first five horses home had raced on the stands' side, and it looked about three lengths faster than the far side. **Oppenheim cont. p6**

It had rained Saturday night into Sunday, and it seemed there was an unused strip on the stands' rail that was much faster. Connections of the first two home on the far side, G3 Nell Gwyn winner Music Show and Newmarket S. winner Rumoush, were entitled to feel aggrieved, since, if the field had all raced together they might conceivably have finished one-two. And the third unsatisfactory aspect to the race was that the first two clocked a slow RPR rating, just 111. Special Duty had run 117 when she won last season's six-furlong G1 Cheveley Park S., so it looks as though some combination of the mile trip and the softer ground resulted in her running a good way below her best, even though she ultimately won. What was not impressive about the weekend results was that three of the four Classics came back with pretty slow speed figures for the winners: Beyers of 94 for the Kentucky Oaks and 104 for the Kentucky Derby, and an RPR of 111 for the 1000 Guineas. Only Makfi's RPR of 123 for the 2000 Guineas would qualify as even within the average range for Classic winners. The message from the speed boys would be crystal clear for the connections of anything aspiring to Classic standard this year: go for it. They're nice horses, no doubt about it; you'd be happy to have them in your barn. But no worldbeaters have shown their hands as yet after the first round of this year's three-year-old Classics.

op/ed feedback

This is not the first time that a clarion call for action has been issued by an industry leader, but Rob Whiteley's erudite message (*TDN*, 5/4/2010) must not be allowed to simply be dribbled out of bounds. His idea for an industry consortium must be implemented with alacrity. It would seem that an appropriate name for this body would be The Secretariat of Racing. One need look no further than our dismal situation here in New York to see the consequences of apathy, self-interest and lack of leadership. We individually can no longer afford to be Easy Goer Buckpassers, but instead must become Affirmed Man O Wars!

The refusal effectively ends Delaware's attempts to legalize betting on college football, basketball, NASCAR or baseball. The state currently offers parlay betting on NFL games, but does not allow gamblers to place bets on the outcome of individual games.
