Triple Threats

Ice Box to Await Belmont...

Robert LaPenta's **Ice Box** (Pulpit), who came flying late to grab second in last Saturday's GI Kentucky Derby, will pass the GI Preakness S. May 15 in favor of

a run in the GI Belmont S. June 5. "After talking to Mr. LaPenta, we concurred that Ice Box's race was tremendous, but we also knew it was a tough race," trainer Nick Zito said in a release. "We feel that we are better-suited to wait and pass the Preakness and possibly go on to the Belmont and, hopefully, things work out." Zito added that a determination on the Preakness status of his other Derby runner **Jackson Bend** (Hear No Evil) would be

made early next week. Ice Box is nicely bred for the 12-furlong distance of the Belmont. The chestnut is the second foal from Spice Island (Tabasco Cat), a one-time \$40,000 claimer who excelled at marathon distances on the grass in the U.S., highlighted by a win in the 2003 GI Long Island H. Prior to that, she scored in the 1 1/2-mile Dowager S. at Keeneland. Zito is no stranger to the Belmont S. winner's circle, having derailed a pair of Triple Crown bids with Birdstone (Grindstone) in 2004 and LaPenta's Da' Tara (Tiznow) in 2008. Winner of the GI Florida Derby, Ice Box has a record of 8-3-1-0 and earnings of \$906,534.

Super Saver Returns to the Track...

WinStar Farm's **Super Saver** (Maria's Mon) returned to the Churchill main track yesterday for the first time since his victorious Derby effort last Saturday afternoon. The homebred colt galloped a carefree lap be-

neath the Twin Spires with exercise rider Kevin Willey in the irons. "He jogged like a Derby winner," assistant trainer Mike McCarthy joked, adding, "and I've seen plenty of those horses here. His energy, attitude and appetite are all good. He might gallop [today]. It depends on

what Todd wants to do." Right after talking to McCarthy, Pletcher said, "Everything is going very well. The horse is doing great, moving very well. Energy level and appetite have been a very good indication that he's come out of his race as well as we could hope for." Pletcher is due back in Louisville tomorrow and is slated to remain there until Monday.

Why Send One When Two Will Do?...

The Dale Romans barn is poised to be represented by a pair of runners in the Preakness. In addition to Derby third **Paddy O'Prado** (El Prado {Ire}), Romans is planning on entering **First Dude** (Stephen Got Even) for owner and breeder Don Dizney. Fifth, beaten just over six lengths, in Ice Box's Florida Derby, the bay will enter the Preakness off a third-place effort to Stately Victor (Ghostzapper) in the GI Toyota Blue Grass S. at Keeneland Apr. 10. "I have reserved a spot on the plane for him and if he is doing good, I'd say it's 90 percent we'd run if he can get in," said Romans. "I would have liked to have run him in the Derby." In other developments, trainer Jonathan Sheppard has officially removed **Bushwhacked** (Posse) from Preakness consideration after spiking a fever earlier in the week. "We're disappointed, but we're going to look for something further down the road," the Hall of Famer commented.

RACING Round-Up

General Quarters to Target Million...

General Quarters (Sky Mesa), who outgamed Court Vision (Gulch) in last Saturday's GI Woodford Reserve Turf Classic at Churchill Downs, has a long-range goal of the GI Arlington Million in Chicago Aug. 21. "I'd like to keep him on the grass if it's possible," said Tom McCarthy, who owns and trains the four-year-old colt. "He just seems to be better on grass. I will just wait and see." McCarthy, the former Louisville-area high school principal, indicated that the grey could use the GIII Arlington H. July 17 as a prep for the Million. The Woodford was General Quarters's first victory since taking the 2009 GI Toyota Blue Grass S. Unplaced in the Derby and Preakness subsequent to that start, he was sidelined seven

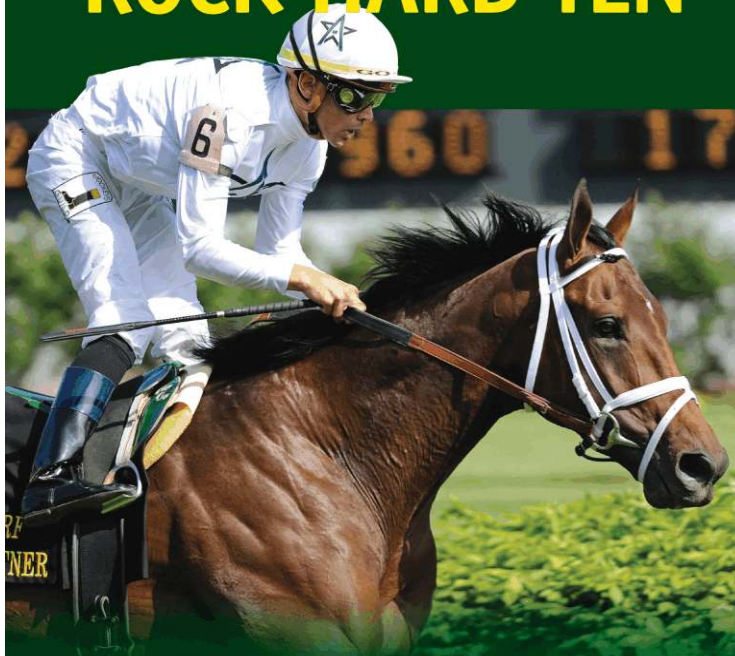
months with an ankle chip and had finished runner-up in four starts in New Orleans prior to his win over a soft Churchill turf last weekend.

Evening Jewel to Try Turf...

Evening Jewel (Northern Afleet), who went down to defeat at the hands of Blind Luck (Pollard's Vision) by the narrowest of margins in the GI Kentucky Oaks Apr. 30, will make her next appearance on turf in the GII Honeymoon H. at Hollywood May 31. Should all go well in that nine-furlong event, she would be pointed for a start in the GI American Oaks over 10 grassy panels July 3. "She'll run on anything," trainer Jim Cassidy told *Daily Racing Form*. "She acts like she's superior on the grass, but I don't know how she could run any better." Cassidy won the 2004 American Oaks with Ticker Tape (GB) (Royal Applause {GB}), who was fourth as the favorite in the Honeymoon. Though still smarting from his Oaks defeat, Cassidy was over the moon with Evening Jewel's performance. "You've got to be proud of her," Cassidy told *DRF*. "I saw her on Saturday morning, and she acted like she hadn't run. She didn't act like she was knocked out. After the Ashland, she was pretty knocked out."

The Quest Continues...

Connections of Sunday's demoted G1 1000 Guineas winner **Jacqueline Quest (Ire)** (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}) will bid to atone for that result in the June 18 G1 Coronation S. at Royal Ascot, it was confirmed yesterday. Noel Martin's 66-1 shot denied Special Duty (GB) (Hennessy) by a nose before the stewards' verdict came though and trainer Henry Cecil reflected, "It was very sad for owner Noel Martin, as he had dreamt of winning the race for so long. After a long delay, for them to announce that his filly had been demoted to second place was very hard to take--but he took it like the gentleman he is. I was very pleased with the filly. She has still not really come to herself and is hopefully still improving. I have been very easy on her. She will be aimed at the Coronation S. at Royal Ascot where, with luck, she'll have another chance at a Group 1."

Marchand on Road Back...

Carla Giral's **Marchand d'Or (Fr)** (Marchand de Sable) is due to make his comeback in the G3 Prix de Saint-Georges at Longchamp May 16, trainer Mikel Delzangles announced yesterday. Out of sorts since recording his fifth Group 1 success in the 2008 G1 Prix de l'Abbaye at that venue, the seven-year-old has yet to race for his new conditioner, who said, "Marchand D'Or is fine at the moment and we are planning to give him a comeback run in the Prix de Saint-Georges at Longchamp. If he comes out of that race in good order, then the G1 Darley July Cup [at Newmarket July 9] would be on his agenda. We have the option of the two races at Royal Ascot and he could go there beforehand or alternatively, there is the G2 Prix du Gros-Chene at Chantilly for him on 6th June. I couldn't honestly say that he can return to his best. I think he was a bit sick last season, but he seems fine now and we will have a better idea whether his talent remains after his return at Longchamp."

GILCHRIST CALLS IT A CAREER

In 2005, the racing world at large was introduced to the likeable trio of owner Harry Aleo, trainer Greg Gilchrist and **Lost in the Fog** (Lost Soldier). Aleo was a gruff World War II vet who didn't suffer fools gladly, and, when asked, scoffed at the idea of selling his star runner. "What the hell would I do that for?" he told a reporter brusquely. "I've been waiting my whole life for a horse like that."

Gilchrist, meanwhile, was an affable veteran conditioner who was little known outside of Northern California circles. He excelled at selecting bargains at two-year-old in training sales, and had developed a reputation on the backstretch and with his owners as an honest, straightforward horseman who had a knack for looking out for both the horse and the owners' best interests. **Writer's Up cont. p6**

And Lost in the Fog, a Florida-bred of modest origins, was the rocket ship that brought them to prominence. Selected and purchased privately by Gilchrist after

failing to meet his reserve for \$195,000 at the 2004 OBS March Sale, Lost in the Fog took Aleo and Gilchrist from one coast to another during a brilliant three-year-old campaign that saw him win eight of nine starts in 2005. His victories that year included the GI Carry Back S., GI Riva Ridge BC S., and GI King's Bishop

S. In his sophomore finale, the undefeated, muscle-bound bay was sent off the 3-5 pick in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint, but, after tearing through a half in :44 2/5, faded to finish sixth. Nonetheless, he was honored with an Eclipse as the nation's top sprinter.

Less than a year after the Breeders' Cup, Lost in the Fog would be dead, the victim of inoperable cancer, including a tumor the size of a football that abutted his spine. Just prior to Lost in the Fog being humanely put down at his stall at Golden Gate Fields, an emotional Gilchrist paid tribute to the colt. "This horse is like a brother to me," Gilchrist said. "I have more respect for this horse than 70 to 75 percent of the people I deal with on a daily basis."

Foggy & Friends..

The story of Lost in the Fog is inextricably linked to Gilchrist's, and is worth revisiting as Gilchrist calls it a career as a conditioner. Earlier this week, Gilchrist announced his intention to retire, and yesterday he saddled his final runner, Island of Zen, to a victory in the fifth race at Hollywood Park.

"I just think when it's time, it's time," Gilchrist said Wednesday morning before boarding a plane to Southern California. "My age has something to do with it. Not that I couldn't do this for another 15 or 20 years, but you have to enjoy the fruits of your labor somewhere along the line."

Indeed, Gilchrist's retirement is well-deserved. A native of California, Gilchrist is a third-generation horseman who served with the 82nd Airborne Division of the U.S. Army in Vietnam in 1968-'69 and saw heavy combat duty. He returned to racing upon his return, taking his trainer's licence in 1973. During a 37-year career, he conditioned the likes of **Soviet Problem** (Moscow Ballet), a hard-knocking Cal-bred who was just tagged on the line by Cherokee Run in the 1994 GI Breeders' Cup Sprint. More recently, his runners included MGSW **Smokey Stover** (Put It Back); Sunshine Millions Filly & Mare Sprint heroine **High Resolve** (Put It Back); and GSW **Victorina** (Delaware Township).

Those last three horses were, like Lost in the Fog, purchased as juveniles by Gilchrist on behalf of Aleo. The men enjoyed a 29-year relationship that some have said had a father-and-son quality to it and, when Aleo passed away at the age of 88 two years ago, Gilchrist told the *San Francisco Chronicle*, "I'll never replace that guy as a friend or as a client. They don't make people like Harry Aleo anymore, but why would you want to? He was one of a kind."

Gilchrist admits the loss of Aleo contributed to his decision to retire. "I had always told Harry, 'If you quit on Wednesday, I'm outta here on Thursday,'" said Gilchrist. "Obviously, it took a few years. But, if Harry was still in the business, I never would have quit him. I would have stayed in until he said he'd had enough." Not surprisingly, it was their time with Lost in the Fog that Gilchrist remembers most fondly. "It was a great time," he said. "We went all over the country, and what a great run we had with him. You don't get too many Eclipse Award winners in your career." Asked if there was one effort that stuck out, Gilchrist said, "I think probably the King's Bishop up at Saratoga. It's a Grade I, and he beat some very nice horses going seven-eighths of a mile. He was quite a warrior, that horse. When he won his last race, the Aristides at Churchill, he was full of cancer. And 120 days later, he died. I don't think we ever got to the bottom of him, and I don't think we'll every know how good he was. But he was damn sure good enough, the way it turned out."

**What the Future Holds...**

With a fine record as a judge of young horses, Gilchrist said he might take on clients as a bloodstock agent, but has no formal plans to launch an agency. "I'd be willing to help anyone out, and I'm always here for that," he said. "I've let that be known to some people, and we'll see where that leads to. The two-year-old sales have always been good to us. But for right now, I plan on staying home and hanging around Northern California. We've got a few vacations planned." In July, he and his longtime girlfriend, Patricia, will head to Barbados for some R & R. After that, who knows? But Gilchrist is confident about his decision to call it a career. "I just felt the time was right to step back," Gilchrist said. "I didn't want to go out like some stumblebums. I thought the quicker you do it, the better. I suppose people choose all different ways to do things, and this is the way I wanted to go."

**ENDORSEMENTS MAY IMPACT KENTUCKY PRIMARY; INDIANA AND OHIO RESULTS ARE IN**

A rare contested primary endorsement from United States Senate Republican Leader [Mitch McConnell](#) (R-KY) and one from U.S. Rep. [Hal Rogers](#) (R-KY5) this week may provide Kentucky Secretary of State [Trey Grayson's](#) senate primary campaign a boost. [Rand Paul](#) holds a double digit lead over Grayson with less than two weeks before the May 18 primary, according to [Public Policy Polling](#).

Kentucky Lieutenant Governor [Daniel Mongiardo](#) and state Attorney General [Jack Conway](#) face off in the Democratic Senate primary.

Indiana's May 4 Republican Senate primary results show a win for former Sen. [Dan Coats](#), who once held the seat currently occupied by Sen. [Evan Bayh](#) (D-IN). Coats defeated state Sen. [Marlin Stutzman](#) and former Republican Rep. [John Hostetler](#). Coats will face two-term U.S. Rep. [Brad Ellsworth](#) (D-IN8) this fall.

Ohio voters chose Lieutenant Governor [Lee Fisher](#) Tuesday over Ohio Secretary of State [Jennifer Brunner](#) for the Democratic Senate nod. Fisher was backed by state and national Democrats, while Brunner had the support of liberals. Fisher will face former Rep. [Rob Portman](#) (R) in November.

### CDI Reports Record Q1 Net Revenues:

Churchill Downs Incorporated (CDI) released its financials for the quarter that ended Mar. 31, with net revenues from continuing operations totaling a record \$75.1 million, an increase of two percent over the corresponding quarter a year ago. Revenues, according to a release, were helped by the newly opened Calder Casino and growth at the company's advance-deposit wagering platform TwinSpires.com. "We are generally pleased with the performance of our core business in the first quarter of 2010," stated Robert L. Evans, president and chief executive officer of CDI. "Operations at the Calder Casino, which opened Jan. 22, continue to progress. Of the five pari-mutuel slot operators in Florida, month-to-date as of the Apr. 18 reporting period, we are now second in the market with approximately 20 percent of net gaming revenue and approximately 22 percent of the total number of Florida gaming machines offered for play. We continue to believe the Calder Casino will operate at between \$80 million and \$100 million in gross gaming revenue on an ongoing, annualized basis." He continued, "On Apr. 28, 2010, the Florida governor signed into law legislation that, effective July 1, 2010, reduces the tax rate on Calder Casino slots revenue by 15 percentage points, 10 percentage points of which accrue to CDI, with the balance going to purses at Calder Race Course. Additionally, this legislation reduces the Calder Casino's annual license fee by \$500,000 effective July 1, 2010, and by an additional \$500,000 effective July 1, 2011." The 136<sup>th</sup> runnings of the GI Kentucky Oaks and Kentucky Derby saw improved business performance. The combined attendance was up by over five percent despite inclement Derby Day weather, and all-sources handle was ahead by by seven percent.

### Oaklawn Features Boost Local Economy:

Officials at the Hot Springs (Arkansas) Convention and Visitors Bureau (CVB) estimate that closing weekend at Oaklawn Park has an economic impact of roughly \$35 million. More than 100,000 people attended the races Apr. 9 and 10--nearly 45,000 to see Zenyatta (Street Cry {Ire}) extend her unbeaten streak in the GI Apple Blossom Invitational Friday, while over 61,000 were in attendance to watch Line of David (Lion Heart) score in wire-to-wire fashion in the GI Arkansas Derby the following afternoon. "The town was bursting," commented Steve Arrison, chief executive officer of the CVB. "I have seen tourism industry estimates that the economic impact of the Cotton Bowl in Dallas is about \$30 million, generated by a crowd of 90,000 people. The Liberty Bowl in Memphis, which attracts around 60,000 people, has an economic impact of \$30 million. I feel very comfortable in saying that the combined economic impact for Hot Springs National Park, Arkansas, and central Arkansas generated by the Apple Blossom and Derby easily topped \$35 million."

**NZB NATIONAL SALE CONCLUDES ON HIGH**

The momentum carried through to the final day of New Zealand Bloodstock's National Weanling & Broodmare Sale Wednesday at Karaka when [lot 844](#), an unnamed two-year-old colt by Encosta de Lago (Aus), was knocked down for NZ\$240,000. A trial winner in February, the son of the Bluebird mare Lake Alexandrina (Aus) was purchased by Tim Carter's Karapiro Bloodstock from Wellfield Lodge. "He's an outstandingly built, muscular colt with a lovely temperament and is an exciting sprinting prospect," commented Carter. "I've bought him for Michael Chang in Hong Kong, who wanted him for one of his clients, so the colt is headed to Michael's stable." Broodmares made up the bulk of Wednesday's session, which was highlighted by a 129-percent increase in average and 25-percent increase in median. Leading the broodmare offerings was [lot 613](#), a Sadler's Wells mare named Starrystarrynight, who brought NZ\$180,000 to the bid of Gillovic Bloodstock Ltd. The mare from Trelawney Stud was bought in foal to Darci Brahma (NZ). "This was the mare of the sale in my books and I'm very happy to have been able to get her for an overseas client," commented Brent Gillovic.

During the broodmare session, a total of 236 of the 342 catalogued lots sold for NZ\$2,906,950, up 112 percent from last year's aggregate of NZ\$1,369,450 for 15 fewer lots sold. Final average figures for the broodmares was up 126 percent from NZ\$5,456 to NZ\$12,318, the highest since 2006. Median increased 25 percent to NZ\$3,000 from NZ\$2,400, with the clearance rate holding steady at a healthy 82 percent. At the conclusion of the three-day sale, a total of 653 of the 908 catalogued lots changed hands for NZ\$7,454,900--up a huge 85 percent from NZ\$4,034,950 for 585 sold in 2009. The average was NZ\$11,416, up 66 percent from NZ\$6,897, with a median of NZ\$3,000, marking a nine-percent increase from NZ\$2,750 last year. According to co-Managing Director Petrea Vela, "After a bit of a slow start on Monday morning, trade picked up steadily to provide some pleasing results over the past three days. The market has been solid today for the mares and, after the tough market we faced here last year, it's satisfying to see the results return to 2008 levels." Heading the buyers during the broodmare session was Philip & Peter Vela's Pencarrow Stud, which sold 30 head for NZ\$843,500. Leading the consignment was [lot 760](#), an unraced Stravinsky mare named Forpierre who realized a NZ\$95,000 final bid from Trent Busuttin. She was bought carrying a positive test to Darci Brahma. Leading buyer of the sale was Bruce & Maureen Harvey's Ascot Farm with three weanling purchases for NZ\$290,000. **ASB ANNOUNCES INCREASE IN FEES** The Australian Stud Book (ASB) is increasing fees across the board, effective this week. "We delayed increasing fees in 2008, because of the Equine Influenza crisis of 2007 and in 2009 because of the global financial crisis, mindful of the effect these two crises especially had on the small breeder," the ASB said in a statement. "The last fees increase was in 2003, and not many businesses have kept their fees stable for seven years. During that time, we have continually improved our service to breeders to provide one of the most cost-effective and efficient stud book authorities in the world."

The new fees, excluding GST are:

- Live Foal Mare Returns for 2010 now A\$105 (A\$5 increase)
- Non-Live Foal Returns for 2011 now A\$45 (A\$5 increase)
- Stallion Returns for 2010 now A\$500 (A\$100 increase)

A five-percent discount is available if these returns are lodged through the Australia Stud Book's online system at [www.studbook.org.au](http://www.studbook.org.au).

In other ASB news, coverings in 2009 were down by 9.1 percent--a decline the ASB attributes to the global financial crisis. A total of 24,158 mares were covered, 9.1 percent less than the 26,573 mares covered in 2008. Of the 760 stallions that covered mares, 176 or 23 percent descend from Danehill as sons (101), grandsons (74) or great-grandson (1). Between them these stallions covered 8,558 mares, 35 percent of the total mares covered. Thirty percent of stallions covered five mares or less. Michael Ford, Keeper of the Australian Stud Book, said the figures indicated that the Australian industry had proven more resilient to the global financial crisis than initially anticipated. He said he had originally envisaged that coverings would be down by about 15 percent.


**FORMER DARLEY EMPLOYEE PLEADS**

**GUILTY** Former Darley accounts manager Donna Turner, of Scone, has pleaded guilty in Muswellbrook Local Court to stealing almost A\$800,000 from her employer. The 31-year-old has been committed to Maitland District Court in June for sentencing. At her initial appearance in court in January, Turner pleaded not guilty to the charges. Police told the court she deposited large amounts of money into her personal bank account over two years. Turner was charged with stealing A\$784,959 from the stud between January 2007 and March last year, with a total of 26 transactions of varying amounts ranging from A\$8800 to A\$110,000.



**MACHO UNO TO SHUTTLE TO BRAZIL**

Frank Stronach's Adena Springs Farm announced today that **Macho Uno** (Holy Bull-Primal Force, by Blushing Groom {Fr}) will shuttle to Brazil for the 2010 Southern Hemisphere breeding season. The son of Horse of the Year Holy Bull and Broodmare of the Year Primal Force will stand at Sao Jose da Serra farm in partnership with ACPCCP (Parana Breeders & Owners Association of Brazil). ACPCCP and Adena Springs have agreed to use part of the revenue generated to provide bonus purses to Brazilian breeders and to sponsor the 'Macho Uno Cup' to be run in 2014. Winner of the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile and GI Grey S., the grey collected an Eclipse Award at the conclusion of his two-year-old season. The \$1,851,803 earner has sired a pair of Grade I winners in Wicked Style and Harlem Rocker. According to Eduardo Buffara, director of TBS, "Macho Uno will be the most important stallion to ever stand in Parana state." Adena Springs President Andy Stronach added, "North American breeders have been very supportive of our first year Brazilian stallion Einstein, and we are sure that Macho Uno will find that same kind of support among Brazilian breeders."
