Triple Threats

LUCKY MORE LIKELY FOR PREAKNESS

Lookin At Lucky (Smart Strike) returned to the track yesterday for the first time since his sixth-place effort in Saturday's GI Kentucky Derby. After the juvenile champion galloped 1 1/2 miles at Churchill, trainer Bob Baffert upgraded the colt's chances for running in the May 15 GI Preakness S. "He looks good," Baffert said of Lookin At Lucky. "He's got a swagger to him."

Baffert had originally listed Lookin At Lucky and stable-mate **Conveyance** (Indian Charlie), 15th in the Derby, as 50-50 for the Preakness. After both galloped yesterday, the trainer said, "Lookin At Lucky is 51. Conveyance is 50." Also returning to the track yesterday was **Dublin** (Afleet Alex), seventh in the Derby. "He's doing excellent, sharp as a tack," said trainer D. Wayne Lukas. "You'd never know he ran." Dublin is expected to van to Pimlico Tuesday.

Bullet for Schoolyard Dreams...

Schoolyard Dreams (Stephen Got Even), second in the Mar. 13 GIII Tampa Bay Derby, worked a bullet five furlongs at Monmouth Park yesterday in :59.60 with jockey Eibar Coa in the irons. "The work went perfect," said trainer Derek Ryan, who was third with **Musket Man** (Yonaguska) in last year's Preakness. "Finally got something to go right. If we could only get a race to go like this. I'm coming there to win it. I don't want to be second or third again." Schoolyard Dreams is coming off a fourth-place effort in the Apr. 3 GI Wood Memorial.

'Saver' Has Something Left in Tank for Preakness...

All is well for GI Kentucky Derby winner **Super Saver** (Maria's Mon) following his 2 1/2-length score in Saturday's "Run for the Roses," trainer Todd Pletcher said Thursday during an NTRA teleconference. While wheeling back in 14 days for the GI Preakness is always a concern, he's not worried. Pletcher explained, "[Super Saver's] energy has been good, his appetite has been good, he's moving well, he seems happy and enthusiastic. Obviously, the Derby is a taxing race, but if you're just looking at him, he seems to have come out of it so well that we're just really pleased with the way he handled the race." There are no concrete plans for 10th-place finisher **Devil May Care** (Malibu Moon) at this point, but Pletcher said that the GI Belmont S. June 5 has not yet been ruled out. A more likely spot is the GI Mother Goose S. June 26, where GI Kentucky Oaks winner **Blind Luck** (Pollard's Vision) is expected to show up next. An announcement regarding the future of the horse Pletcher was originally expected to win the Derby with, **Eskendereya** (Giant's Causeway), is anticipated to come in the next few days. Pletcher also lauded the efforts of seemingly annual Derby-winning jockey Calvin Borel and Super Saver's owner/breeder, WinStar Farm. Of WinStar's approach, he said, "It's a fairly simple game plan. You try to put together the best people and then try to accumulate the best horses and the best bloodlines, and the rest will fall into place. The one thing they do is that everything is first class, everything is done with the horses' best interests in mind."

Romans Likes His Preakness Chances...

Dale Romans is confident that his Preakness duo, **Paddy O'Prado** (El Prado {Ire}) and **First Dude** (Stephen Got Even), will make an impact. He doesn't expect fast dirt to be a problem for the former, who finished third with some traffic trouble in the Derby. "I know that the slop doesn't bother him, so that wasn't a concern going into the race, but we've got a horse that has won a Grade III on grass, he's Grade I-placed on Poly, and he's Classic-placed on dirt. So, he has proven he can do anything. I don't know why a fast track wouldn't be the same." Romans is equally high on First Dude. "I would have liked to run First Dude in the Derby," he said. "He has really come into himself and he ran a nice race in the [GI Bluegrass S.]. [Rider] Ramon [Dominguez] really likes him, and I think the farther he goes, the better."

Hurricane Ike Rolling Into Maryland...

West Coast-based conditioner John Sadler will look for redemption with GII Derby Trial S. winner **Hurricane Ike** (Graeme Hall) in the Preakness after his two Derby entrants, **Sidney's Candy** (Candy Ride {Arg}) and **Line of David** (Lion Heart), finished 17th and 18th, respectively. Both Derby starters exited the race in relatively good order despite their disappointing performances, said Sadler. "I think Line of David didn't appreciate the off track, and I think Sidney's Candy might have displaced or pulled too hard. He was rank and never settled." Sadler acknowledged that the added distance of the Preakness will be Hurricane Ike's biggest hurdle, and he plans to work the colt a stamina-building seven furlongs at Churchill Downs Monday. "That's the biggest question: 'Will he run that far?' Calvin [Borel] thinks so, and he has been right a lot lately," Sadler said. Borel rode Hurricane Ike last out, but will stick with Super Saver in the second leg of the Triple Crown, freeing up the mount for 2007 Preakness-winning jockey Robby Albarado.

Uptowncharlybrown to McLaughlin...

Fantasy Lane Stable's **Uptowncharlybrown** (Limehouse), third in the Apr. 17 GII Coolmore Lexington S., has joined the barn of trainer Kiaran McLaughlin and will be aimed at the June 5 GI Belmont S., according to *Daily Racing Form*. The colt began his career with Alan Seewald, who died in early April. It was announced he would be trained by Tim Ice, but Fantasy Lane's managing partner Bob Hutt cited a "lack of communication," in ending that partnership even before it had begun. Uptowncharlybrown shipped to Belmont from Monmouth Park Wednesday and is expected to work Saturday. The rest of the Fantasy Lane horses are in training with longtime Seewald assistant Linda White.

Allied Powers stepped up from four handicap wins to bag last May's Listed Braveheart S. at Hamilton and closed last term with a seventh in the Oct. 17 GI Canadian International at Woodbine. He returned to finish 12th in the G3 John Porter at Newbury last time Apr. 17, and found a dream rail in the latter stages of this to register a career high. Positioned in fifth for most of the contest, he came under pressure with three furlongs to run and seized his opportunity once a gap appeared on the inside at the eighth pole to deny Mores Wells in a bobbing finish. 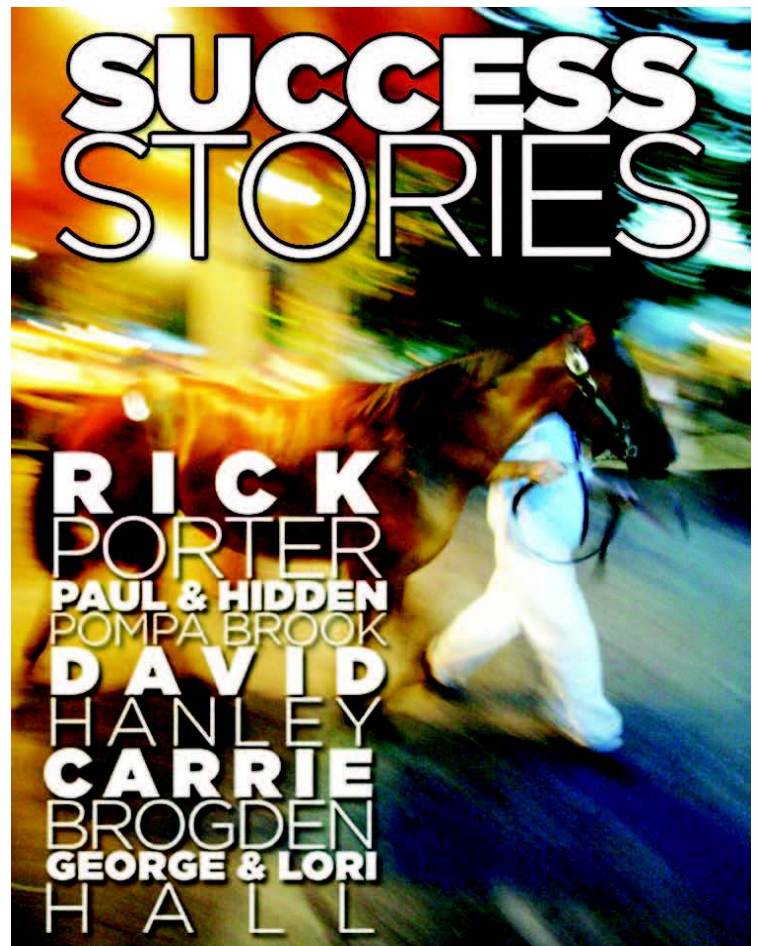

Ted Spread got off the mark in a nine-furlong maiden at Goodwood in early October and was doing his best work at the finish when third in Newmarket's 10-furlong Zetland Conditions S. on his final two-year-old start 20 days later. Keen early racing in a pocket in fourth, the bay battled between rivals to gain a slim advantage on the final turn before being headed by Icon Dream at the eighth pole. Changing leads and rallying grittily against the fence, he thrust his head back in front and held on as the pair pulled away from the remainder. "He's a very nice horse and has always been a big horse, so we didn't want to rush him," his trainer and breeder Mark Tompkins explained. "He pulled very hard in the Zetland and was unbalanced, but ran on up the hill and didn't know anything at all about life--he still doesn't know much, but he will have learnt a lot there today. If he isn't a Derby horse, he'll certainly get the St Leger trip, and we'll find out about this form in the next few weeks. The owners will want to go to Epsom, and that's probably where we'll go, but I don't want to jar him up on fast ground. He was fit enough today and won't need to do much between now and the [June 5] Derby. He's a hard horse, like his mother who we bought out of a claimer at Carlisle and who kept breaking her pelvis despite winning a lot of races for me. Debussy has proved something of an in-and-out performer since beating the subsequent Breeders' Cup heroine Middy (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}) in Epsom's Blue Riband Trial S. last April and finishing third in this card's G3 Chester Vase. In six subsequent starts, the bay was successful in the G2 Prix Eugene Adam at Maisons-Laffitte in July and off the board in the remainder, most recently in the Mar. 4 G2 Al Maktoum Challenge Round 3 on Meydan's Tapeta surface. Back in his pomp here, the homebred raced in the slipstream of the leader Les Fazzani throughout and, after rolling past the mare with 150 yards remaining, asserted for a snug success. "He's really a front-runner, but it suited him to track one," jockey William Buick commented. "There wasn't another horse around us apart from the leader and he's better like that on his own with a bit of daylight. He likes it round a turning track and he's got quite a lot of speed." Pimpernel Is Chantilly-Bound...

Windflower Overseas Holdings' Elusive Pimpernel (Elusive Quality) is set to run in the G1 Prix du Jockey-Club at Chantilly June 6, trainer John Dunlop revealed yesterday. Fifth behind Makfi (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) in Saturday's G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket, last year's G1 Racing Post Trophy runner-up is set for a step up to 1 5/16 miles. "He will probably have his next start in the Prix du Jockey-Club," Dunlop told the *Racing Post*. "He ran well at Newmarket, it was just unfortunate that the race was not run to suit him. They didn't go fast enough. The better two-year-olds of last year mostly all finished well, and we were one of them. He was still not beaten far, and he has come out of the race well."

HOLDING OUT FOR A HERO

The 8-5 morning-line choice for this Saturday's GIII Lone Star Derby at Lone Star Park, Cheyenne Stable's **Henshin Hero** (Dance Master), while deserving of the early support, will try and stretch his speed beyond a mile for the first time in the 1 1/16-mile test for three-year-olds.

"I'm a little apprehensive about stretching him out for the first time," admitted trainer Bret Calhoun. "I think he's a very talented horse, that is not in question. The question remains whether he can go two turns or not, and whether we can get him to settle."

Bred by Padua Stables in Florida, the gelding was purchased privately by Calhoun on behalf of Cheyenne's Everett Dobson a month after the sophomore recorded a 3 1/4-length debut score at Remington Park Aug. 31.

"I knew the people that had him and I knew a little history about the horse going into the race," explained Calhoun. "He was impressive first time out. He was hooked, settled very nicely, wasn't bothered at all and just drew off. After that, the horse that ran second to him [Banner Cat (Wildcat Heir)] came back and won by seven lengths with a big number [at Remington Park Oct. 5], so it gave some legitimacy to that race. That's when I made the decision to move forward with the purchase."

Pleased with the purchase, Calhoun knew his newest addition would require some patience and time to realize his true potential on the track.

"He had some mild shins when we bought him, so we rested and freshened him a little bit, so he got over that," recalled Calhoun. "When we got him ready, he was very aggressive in the mornings and he's moved on from that."

"He still works fast, but he has a high-cruising speed and has just come to relax and settle more and more. You might look at his works and see how fast they were, but they were really pretty effortless. In the mornings he's not rank or anything, he's just very fast and just does things very easily."

In his debut for his new connections Jan. 23, the \$4,000 KEESEP yearling purchase unseated his rider, who lost his irons at the break of the six-furlong, \$40,000 optional claiming event at Oaklawn Park. A 7 1/4-length winner over that track and trip Feb. 20, the bay made it three straight with an allowance score at the Hot Springs oval Mar. 19. Most recently, the Florida-bred tired late to finish runner-up as the 9-5 favorite in a 5 1/2-panel turf allowance at Keeneland Apr. 16.

"We tried to run him in the Northern Spur S. at Oaklawn going a mile [Apr. 10], but the race didn't fill, so we were kind of left without a race," said Calhoun, explaining the decision to go to Keeneland. "We had the choice of going to Keeneland on the turf or going to Charles Town for the seven-furlong [Blue and Gold S. Apr. 17]. I opted for the 5 1/2-furlong race on the grass, because I thought he had some grass pedigree."

As for his runner-up effort that day, Calhoun added, "I won't say that he didn't like it, but I think he's better on the dirt. [At Keeneland] he switched leads a bunch, seemed confused and didn't know what he was running on. It's not like he ran a bad race, but he just didn't run up to his prior races."

Calhoun indicated that, despite his charge's defeat in his sole attempt on the sod, the midwest-based trainer hasn't ruled out another crack at the surface down the line.

"I wouldn't rule out ever running him on the turf again," he said. "Obviously, off that effort, I would prefer to keep him on the dirt. I think it was just because it was his first outing on the grass and he was just a little surprised more than just not handling or disliking the surface."

While Calhoun has found it necessary to remain fluid in regard to the sophomore's racing schedule since Keeneland, the conditioner has made very few additional adjustments in his pupil's preparatory regime.

"We haven't really done anything really different with him since that effort," said Calhoun. "To tell you the truth, we were actually pointing him toward the six-furlong GIII Chick Lang S. [for three-year-olds] at Pimlico or the Matt Winn S. at Churchill Downs going 7/8ths May 15. This was kind of a last minute change, because when the Lone Star Derby looked like it was coming up light, we opted to send him up there and try that instead."

Despite his obvious ability over shorter distances, Henshin Hero--who is three for four going six furlongs on the dirt--will have a significant hurdle to overcome this weekend as he tries a route of ground for the first time. **(Cont. p7)**



“When we entered him in the Northern Spur, I felt very comfortable and confident going into that race, but that was at a mile and a short [run to the] wire,” explained Calhoun. “Now we’re going to one mile and a sixteenth, it’s a little bit more distance, and I think the quality of the field kind of lured us in. I don’t know whether he will get the distance, but I figured it was worth taking a shot.”

According to Calhoun, jockey Bobby Walker Jr.--who gets the call on Henshin Hero for the first time Saturday--is expected to send the bay to his customary front-running position in the early going.

“He has been up front sprinting [in his previous starts], so I am assuming he will be up front routing,” Calhoun confirmed. “There are some other horses in there with speed, but there is nobody as fast as him in there. I just hope he doesn’t get hooked up in some suicide speed duel, because if [his opposition is] up there with him, they will be going plenty fast and it will probably be too fast [for him]. He’s fast and sets hot fractions--I just hope he can come back some, relax and set reasonable fractions.”--C Bossinakis

DEE S.-G3 preview cont.

With connections of the Newmarket maiden winner Desert Myth deciding to run in tomorrow’s G3 Lingfield Derby Trial due to the rain-softened ground here, this Derby trial has lost an intriguing contender. Those bidding to book their ticket to the June Classic include last year’s G3 Autumn S. runner-up **Prompter**, who could be sharper for his return second in Epsom’s Derby Trial last time Apr. 21 and Newmarket handicap third **Tamaathul**, who bids to provide trainer Barry Hills with an eighth renewal. The latter’s owner-breeder Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum’s Racing manager Angus Gold told *PA Sport*, “We were pleased enough with Tamaathul’s first run back at Newmarket. We thought and still hope that he’s going to be a good horse.”

Harbinger, who broke his maiden at this meeting 12 months ago, comes here off an impressive winning return in the G3 John Porter S. at Newbury Apr. 17, and connections are hoping he can continue his upward progression. “He acted on the course when he won his maiden there last year, but it’s one step at a time,” owners Highclere Thoroughbred Racing’s Harry Herbert told *PA Sport*. “These races are never easy, and he’s got a three-pound penalty.” **Age of Aquarius** has not been seen since splitting the subsequent Arc third Cavalryman (GB) (Halling) and St Leger hero Mastery (GB) (Sulamani {Ire}) when runner-up in Longchamp’s G1 Grand Prix de Paris in July. Trainer Aidan O’Brien said, “Age of Aquarius is well, but he will improve a lot from his run, we are hoping that they do not get too much rain in Chester and that the ground stays nice for him, as he is a very good-moving horse that handles fast ground very well.”

Op/ed feedback

As I've long come to expect, Rob Whiteley (*TDN Op-Ed*, 5-4-2010) is being innovative in his proposal. It is obvious he has the best interests of the industry at heart.

I am in broad agreement with his proposal, but am concerned about the make-up of the 21-person board.

(1) In comparison to how much each side has invested, there is too much representation from the racetracks and not enough from owners.

(2) I believe that any member of The Jockey Club or Breeders' Cup who owns a significant interest in a racetrack, or has served or currently serves on the Board of Directors of a racetrack should be ineligible to be the designated representative of The Jockey Club or the Breeders' Cup.

(3) I think there is too much East Coast bias in the four tracks selected. I believe Del Mar has as much right to be included as Keeneland or Magna.

I believe Rob's proposal would be strengthened if the seven at-large selections made by the journalists had to be owner/breeders WITHOUT connections to the racetracks.

I have been a member of the claiming ranks of society, with a fluctuating price on my head, for 65 years, and would like to continue a meaningful life. The way I see it, Thoroughbred racehorses have contributed to the very meaning of life, so they too deserve to retire with dignity and not be sent to the slaughterhouse just because they now do six furlongs in 1:16 instead of 1:12.

In this age where speed is king, going slowly is looked down upon. Multi-tasking has replaced doing things with pleasure. I would like to prove that a slow Tour de France can be victorious, in its own way, against the fast one. So our racetrack Tour de France is taking place during the exact 21 days as the one that everyone knows.

Tour de France riders, great athletes, pass by magnificent castles without taking a look. By wheeling by so fast, the Lance Armstrongs and Greg Lemonds never have the time to stop off...at a glorious French race-track, for example. Contrary to the big Tour, our two-man senior Tour de France will have to weave through traffic, brake at red lights, and stop to consult maps when we get lost. We are two formerly fast cyclers who will be raising money for the retirement of formerly fast Thoroughbreds, attempting to pay for some of our trip at the pari-mutuel windows along the way.

While we are at it, we will try to outdo the Tour de France in quality, by stopping off to appreciate beautiful things (my art-specialist partner Alan can eye an old fortress and tell you that it comes from 1480 or 1690), by consuming good wine and cheese along the way, and by taking it slowly, in the spirit of the Slow Bicycle Movement. Yes, taking it slowly, but getting there! In this case: mainly getting to magnificent French Thoroughbred race courses, none of them alike, all of them colorful works of art so appreciated by painters like Degas, Manet and Dufy.

What would inspire two men to take on 11 racetracks in 21 stages and 25 days over 1,000 kilometers ...on their bicycles?

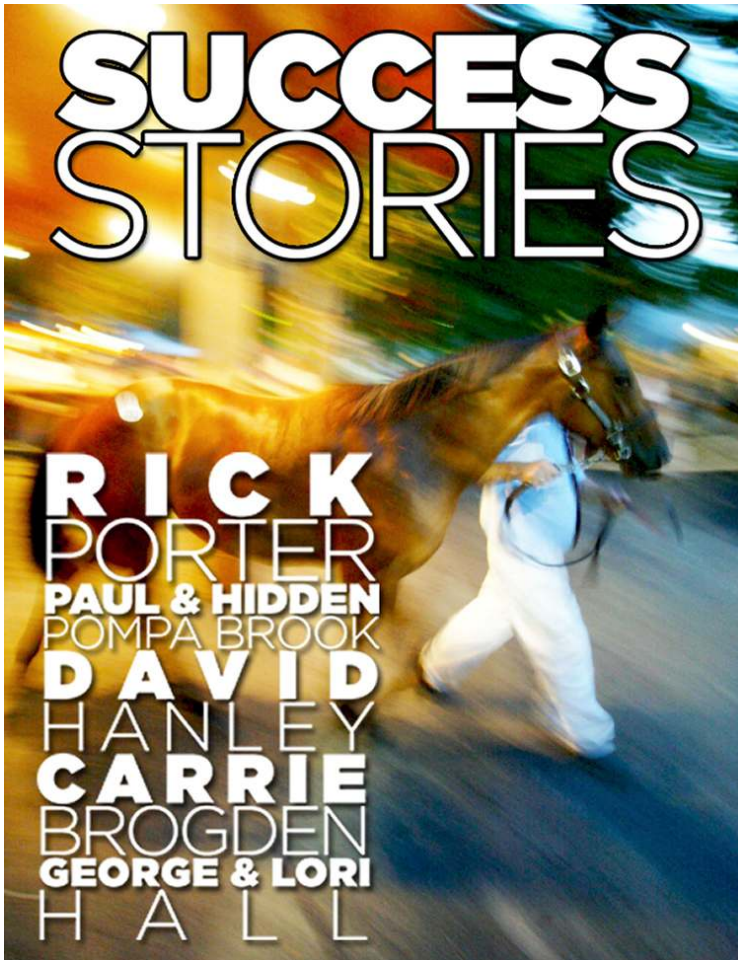

NEW JERSEY LEGISLATION RELEASED BY COMMITTEE


The bill that would authorize the \$1 million a day in purses for the shortened Thoroughbred season in New Jersey was released by the state Assembly Regulatory Oversight and Gaming Committee yesterday by a vote of 5-0. Provisions also included in the bill are:

- Authorizes the Standardbred Breeders' and Owners' Association of New Jersey to grant \$3 million to the New Jersey Sports and Exposition Authority (NJSEA) to promote the Meadowlands and Monmouth racetracks.
- Authorizes the New Jersey Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association (NJTHA) to lend up to \$2 million to the NJSEA or use as purse money at Monmouth in 2010.
- Directs the NJSEA to distribute any unused purse money available on Nov. 21, 2010 for programs to aid New Jersey Thoroughbred horsemen during 2011.
- Authorizes the NJSEA to use \$2.27 million from 2009 purse underpay for the meet at Monmouth from Sept. 11 to Nov. 21 this year.
- Allows the NJSEA to use \$2.25 million to increase purses payable to New Jersey-bred foals finishing first, second or third in open races by 20 percent, but not more than \$20,000 per horse per race.
- Authorizes the New Jersey Horse Racing Injury Compensation Board to use \$2 million in surplus funds to make a loan this year to the NJTHA, with \$1.5 million used to pay breeders' awards from 2008 and 2009 that remain unpaid and \$500,000 used to pay awards to breeders and owners of New Jersey-bred horses who earn purses at out-of-state tracks after the end of New Jersey's 2010 season and before the start of the 2011 season.

The legislation now moves to the full Assembly, with a vote expected May 20, just two days before Monmouth Park's boutique 71-day meet is scheduled to start. "The bill has to clear both houses, but we anticipate that will happen concurrently in the Assembly and the Senate," said Assemblyman John Burzichelli, who co-sponsored the legislation with Assemblywoman Caroline Casagrande and Assemblyman Ronald Dancer. "It is a bipartisan bill, there are no issues with it. Everybody is on board, and we expect that everything will be ready for the meet to begin." Burzichelli added, "We are very excited about this. The horsemen were creative and came together, and I applaud them for it. Horse racing across America is struggling to reinvent itself, and this is a significant step. I think Monmouth will have a good run."

NYRA Seeks Video Streaming Approval:

The New York Racing Association is seeking legislation which would allow it to video stream its races online, according to the *Harness Tracks of America* newsletter. Under current law, NYRA can accept wagers on its website, but cannot provide video of the races. The New York Senate racing commission approved a bill Tuesday which would allow video streaming for NYRA and OTBs. The video streaming could generate \$2 million for the cash-strapped organization and help it compete with out-of-state betting outlets, including Youbet.com, which does provide video of NYRA races. The bill has been sent for approval to the full Senate, but there is no matching bill in the State Assembly.

CUMMINGS ON THE MEND Trainer Bart Cummings is expected to be discharged from St Vincent's Private Hospital by the end of this week after recovering from a serious chest infection. The 82-year-old Cups King, who has some 260 Group 1 wins, including 12 Melbourne Cup trophies, has been in hospital since Apr. 19. His son, fellow trainer Anthony Cummings, told Sydney's *Daily Telegraph* that his father was regaining strength each day. Cummings has had a lifelong allergy to horses and to hay and has suffered from asthma. Sadly, seven-year-old Viewed (Aus) died recently from complications as a result of a twisted bowel.

The Lee Freedman trainee retired with a race record of 10-4-1-0 and earnings of A\$342,850. "We have been looking for a speed-influenced Danehill-line stallion to complement our roster, and Wilander fits the bill perfectly," Hayes said.
