GOLDEN CHILD

She wasn't much of a secret. When [hip 69](#), a Medaglia d'Oro filly, recorded a smooth drill in :10.1 last week, it keyed her in as *the* horse to watch at the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Sale of Two-Year-Olds in Training. Yesterday, she became the highest-priced filly in the sale's history when Stonestreet Stables rep John Moynihan went to \$650,000 to land the Mar. 19-foaled bay. Rain forced many of the onlookers to seek shelter indoors, so announcer Terence Collier played to a full house when the desirable filly stepped

into the ring. After asking for \$500,000 to start, the action got going when Buzz Chace, bidding on behalf of Lewis Lakin and West Point Thoroughbreds, offered \$300,000. "That's the oldest trick in the book," Collier quipped, "to start things off with a big bid." But the salvo deterred all but one other party. Fasig-Tipton President Boyd Browning, Jr., standing across from the auctioneers' stand while on the phone with Moynihan, answered. Chace and Browning continued to go back and forth, with Browning taking his time for each responding bid before finally getting the girl for \$650,000. "Stonestreet Stables," he confirmed when approached with the ticket. "[Moynihan] was telling me every bid--I had no idea when he was going to stop." Though Moynihan wasn't on hand, Browning summed up the filly's charms. "From the sales company's perspective, she had everything you'd want: she's by great young stallion, breezed really well and showed herself to advantage," he said. "As you know, [Stonestreet] has had a lot of success with another Medaglia d'Oro filly." Stonestreet co-owns reigning Horse of the Year Rachel Alexandra, a daughter of the Darley stallion. **Cont. p2**

The Buzz Horse...

Bloodstock agent Buzz Chace admitted he stretched it a bit in an attempt to land hip 69 for Lewis Lakin and West Point. "I opened it and was the underbidder," he confirmed. "I thought she'd bring between \$300-500,000. She was a good physical and moved well, and she's by a sire that gets pretty good fillies. But you can't get them all." That statement might not actually apply to Stonestreet, at least at this year's two-year-old in training sales. Yesterday's transaction marked the third time this spring that Jess Jackson's operation walked away with a sale topper. In early March, Moynihan went to \$2.3 million to land a Distorted Humor--Tomisue's Delight colt; a month later, at Keeneland April, he paid \$625,000 for a Bernardini--Moonlight Sonata colt.

Knocking on Tapit's Door...

A year ago, agent Steve Young paid a sale-record \$850,000 for a Tapit colt from the Hobeau Farm dispersal. That youngster, now doing business as Trappe Shot for Mill House and trainer Kieran McLaughlin, was tabbed as a ☆ "TDN Rising Star" ☆ in February. Young didn't have to go as high yesterday for [hip 282](#), a son of Tapit--Prall Street (Cherokee Run), but still had to fork over \$450,000 for the grey colt from the Eddie Woods draft. "That played some role, but he stands on his own merit," Young said about Trappe Shot's promise. "I definitely think he's a two-turn horse; his dam was very quick."

Though Young said his client asked not to be disclosed, he indicated that the new acquisition would join McLaughlin's string.

Though several bids came from the main pavilion, it got serious between Donato Lanni, who was behind the auctioneers' stand, and Young, who looked ready to make a quick exit by the side door. When asked how high he would have gone for the colt, Young smiled and said, "We weren't done yet. I think this is a very strong sale and, as the day went on, I figured this was about what he would bring."

Eddie Woods prepared the top-priced colt for his breeders, Bill Graves and Dennis Lynch, and this presented a solid score for those gentlemen. The colt's dam, Prall Street, was acquired by them as a yearling for \$29,000 as a yearling at FTKOCT in 2002. She failed to make her reserve at OBSMAR at \$27,000 and was put into training with McLaughlin. After airing by 5 3/4 lengths in her debut at Aqueduct, the bay landed a Big A allowance in her third appearance, but was then out of action for 14 months. She made four more starts without winning for trainer Dale Romans, and was retired at the end of her four-year-old season.

"Billy and I raced that mare," Lynch said soon after selling the colt. "She had a lot of talent. We almost had her sold to Mark Reid, but she had a setback--a chip."

Prall Street's first foal, a Value Plus filly, sold for \$12,000 as a yearling at KEESEP in 2008, and the decision was made to send her to Gainesway stallion Tapit.

"I wish I could tell you it was some Tesio theory, but it's not," said Lynch. "Bill had a share in Tapit, and we used two seasons to him." Prall Street also has a Tapit yearling. "She was bred back to Afleet Alex last week, but I'm not sure yet if she's in foal or not," Lynch added. "[This colt] was a bit immature as a yearling, so we didn't try to sell him, and we sent him to Eddie Woods." Hip 282 breezed a quarter in [:22.1](#).

No Reservations on the Numbers...

Fasig-Tipton officials were understandably pleased by Monday's buoyant trade. Despite a trimmed-down catalogue, the gross of \$13,099,500 easily surpassed

the \$10,651,000 from 2009, while the \$47,984 average was 14 percent higher than the \$42,099 achieved over the course of two days 12 months ago. The median rose to \$27,000 from \$25,000. The RNA percentage was an almost unheard-of 12.5 percent. "It's a phenomenal rate for any sale, let alone a two-year-old-in-training sale," said Fasig-Tipton President Boyd Browning. "Generally, you'd be happy with 25 per-

cent at a two-year-old sale. It was indicative of the depth of buyers at all levels, not just the top. There were people here with just \$10,000, \$20,000 and \$50,000 to spend. We've seen some momentum building at the two-year-old sales this year and, like in the general economy, confidence has been restored to an extent." He added, "This location feeds more racing jurisdictions than any other place that has a sale. You see good things happening in Pennsylvania, and purses are still decent in Delaware. Some of the Maryland people we've talked to think we're going to see some improvement in Maryland. So it's a combination of factors. Buyers and consignors have become more realistic. I think that consignors see that you can bring a legitimate quality horse to this sale, and I think you'll see a lot more of that in 2011. The depth of buyers was pretty impressive."

LLC, the nom de course of Ellen MacNeille Charles. The bidding was spirited between Charles, Debbie Easter and Donato Lanni, all of whom were seated on the right side of the pavilion. Lanni dropped out at \$360,000 and Easter gave the next offer, but Charles, sitting with her trainer Rodney Jenkins, had the winning number. "She's just such a beautiful-moving filly, and was glorious just standing there," said Charles. "There's really a grace to her." Charles resides in the nation's capitol, and confirmed that her new acquisition

would remain in Maryland with Jenkins. "Washington D.C. is not really a good place to keep a horse," she joked. Charles is a granddaughter of Hillwood Museum founder Marjorie Merriweather Post, and her mother was Adelaide Close Riggs, a philanthropist and noted supporter of Maryland racing. Having gotten into the racing business herself about a decade ago, Charles has about 20 horses in training with Jenkins, including GSP Malibu Kid (Malibu Moon). Hillwood acquired a pair of six-figure youngsters at this venue last year, a \$160,000 son of Stephen Got Even and a \$150,000 colt by Songandaprayer.

Hip 185 sold for \$30,000 as a yearling at FTKJUL, where she was consigned by Legacy Bloodstock. Al Pike's Pike Racing offered the filly here on behalf of a partnership consisting of Legacy's Mark Toothaker and J.R. and Rita Young. "When I put her on the trailer, I thought she'd bring \$150,000 or so, because she was a good, quality filly," said Pike, who confirmed that this was his biggest success at a two-year-old sale. "But then she worked so well, and everyone seemed to like her. We did put a \$74,000 reserve on her, but, I have to say, this was a lot of fun. Mark Toothaker is an old friend of mine, and it's great to have this kind of success."

Miller Time...

EQB Inc.'s Patti Miller was busy signing tickets throughout yesterday's session, winding up with SIX new acquisitions. Three years ago, Miller acquired eventual champion Informed Decision (Monarchos) for

\$320,000 at this venue for George Strawbridge's Augustin Stable. Miller bought three six-figure horses at Timonium, topped by [hip 87](#), a \$200,000 son of Indian Charlie; and [hip 27](#), a \$180,000 Stormy Atlantic filly. "They're for different clients, said Miller, while declining to disclose the names. She offered Jonathan Sheppard and Tom Amoss as possible trainers for the new recruits. "I do think I got the best filly and best colt [Indian Charlie] in the sale," she said. "This is one of the last sales of the season, so vetting can be an issue. We did get the ones we wanted. If it's a good individual

that breezes well and jumps through all of the hoops-- you do have to pay a premium for that." Miller added, "There's certainly opportunity here. It's not always the perfect horse that ends up in the winner's circle. There are a lot of good horses here selling for \$20-30,000 that are going to win a lot of races." Throughout the rainy day, the buyback rate appeared very low, especially for a two-year-old sale. "That's understandable," Miller offered. "This is the end of the line, and a lot of people are having trouble getting financing."

Korean Quantity...

Korean buyers, who accounted for 92 purchases at the four-day OBS April Sale, according *ocala.com*, were very active at yesterday's session. Three-quarters of the way through the action at Timonium, no fewer than 30 head had been picked up by Korean interests. Most of the purchases were at the \$20,000 level, with a top price of \$45,000 for [hip 110](#), a Saarland--Dusty's Legacy filly from the On the Run (Moses Longoria) consignment. Their presence here was no accident. "Over the last few years, they have been very active in other regions, but we were able to get the stars in line," explained Fasig-Tipton's Terence Collier.

"Timewise, this sale suited them. It was part of a promotion with the KRA [Korean Racing Association], and we entertained them in Kentucky. They have special and unique requirements." The chief of those requirements is the price constraint set by the Korean government. "They just had to hope the market wouldn't go by them."

James K. Chapman's Breaking Point Farm only had to go to \$5,000 to get the Giant's Causeway colt at Keeneland September 2009. The chestnut is a 1/2 to Council Member (Seattle Slew), who brought \$800,000 as a KEENOV weanling and went on to win a pair of listed stakes and place in group/graded company four times, earning \$347,306. It is also the family of GSW and British highweight Half A Year (Riverman), millionaire Event of the Year (Seattle Slew) and GII Del Mar Futurity hero Winning Pact (Alydar). The juvenile worked a quarter in a solid :22.10 (video), and attracted a lot more action his second time through the ring. The Henny Hughes colt, from the first crop by the multiple Grade I-winning sprinter, was bit a more pricey, with Carolyn Chapman signing the ticket at \$40,000 at FTKOCT. A half to GSW and solid sire Put It Back (Honour and Glory), he went an eighth in :10.20 (video).

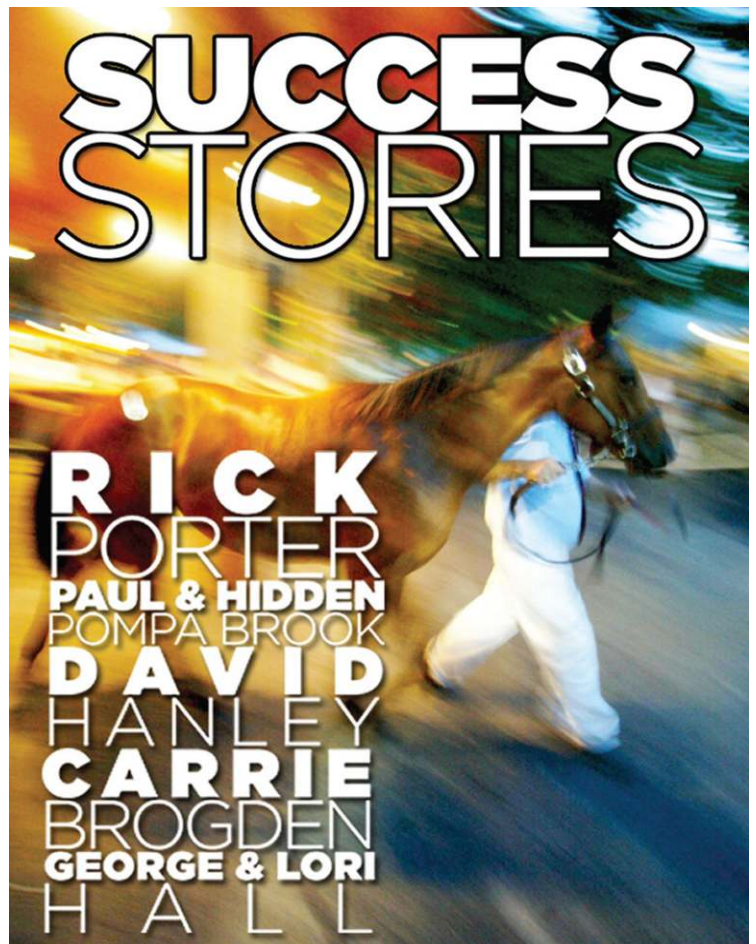

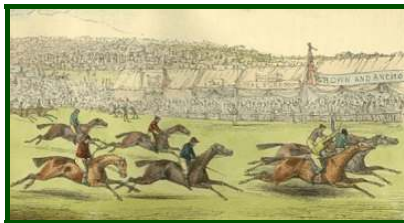
Canford Cliffs Set for Curragh Test...

Trainer Richard Hannon yesterday gave the green light for **Canford Cliffs (Ire)** (Tagula {Ire}) to contest Saturday's G1 Abu Dhabi Irish 2000 Guineas at The Curragh, for which 20 remained at yesterday's five-day stage. Runner-up in the G3 Greenham S. at Newbury Apr. 17 and third in the G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket May 1, last year's G2 Coventry S. winner came through his serious prep work with flying colors. "Canford Cliffs has been fine since Newmarket, and we hope that he will show everyone in Ireland what a good horse he is really is," Hannon said. "We know what he can do on the gallops, and Royal Ascot racegoers saw for themselves in last year's Coventry. But you want them to do it again in their Classic season and, though things did not go to script at Newbury or Newmarket, he is in great nick and we can't wait for the race."

Aidan O'Brien is responsible for nine of the 20 left in the mile Classic, with ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ **Steinbeck (Ire)** (Footstepsinthesand {GB}), G1 Dewhurst S. runner-up **Fencing Master (GB)** (Oratorio {Ire}) and G1 Criterium International scorer **Jan Vermeer (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}) the most notable. Brighthelm Racing's 2000 Guineas fourth **Xtension (Ire)** (Xaar {GB}) is also on course for Kildare. Conditioner Clive Cox said yesterday, "The ground in Ireland looks like it's going to be good, with a warmer forecast, so we're looking forward to traveling over." June Judd, Jackie Bolger and Ennistown Stud's G3 Tetrarch S. winner **Free Judgment** (Vindication) and His Highness The Aga Khan's Listed Loughbrown S. scorer **Keredari (Ire)** (Oasis Dream {GB}) are also among the home team. The ground is currently good on the straight course and good-to-firm on the round course.

Royal Option for Duty...

Khalid Abdullah's **Special Duty (GB)** (Hennessy) could take in the G1 Coronation S. at Royal Ascot, trainer Crique Head-Maarek revealed yesterday. Connections will monitor the condition of the homebred ahead of the June 18 contest, having taken in the G1 1000 Guineas and G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches in the space of a fortnight. "Special Duty is fine this morning and she looks well," the trainer told *Racing Post*. "She did lose a little weight, but ate up well since returning to her stable. The filly is very strong mentally, but she didn't really enjoy coming down the Longchamp descent before the straight. There are no plans for the moment, and we must see how she comes out of the Pouliches before deciding her future. The Coronation S. at Ascot could become a future target. It will be Prince Khalid who will make the final decision."

Music Show Readied...

Jaber Abdullah's **Music Show (Ire)** (Noverre) is being prepared for a tilt at Sunday's G1 Irish 1000 Guineas at The Curragh. Trainer Mick Channon will work the G2 Rockfel S. and G3 Nell Gwyn S. winner, who was first home on the far side in the May 2 G1 1000 Guineas at Newmarket but out of the money overall, over the Summer Ground Gallop at West Ilsley this morning and said, "Music Show hasn't done too much, she came out of the Guineas in good heart and has certainly improved since Newmarket. She's only galloped once and tomorrow's pipe opener is all she needs. We feel she stands a great chance, although we are at the mercy of the weather, as I wouldn't want the ground to be too soft for her."

Coronation for Lady of the Desert...

★ "TDN Rising Star" ★ **Lady of the Desert (Rahy)** was reported to have lost a shoe during Sunday's G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches at Longchamp. Denied a run in the final yards and promoted from sixth to fifth following the disqualification of the winner Liliside (Fr) (American Post {GB}), Jaber Abdullah's homebred was beaten just over a length there. The owner's Racing Manager Bruce Raymond told *PA Sport*, "It was a messy race all round, but it looked as though she got the trip all right. She was still a bit keen early, but there wasn't much pace until after two furlongs. She seems to have come out of the race and looks bright enough. She lost her near-fore shoe, which obviously didn't help her. Where she lost it we don't know, possibly in the final furlong, but the boys didn't notice it until she got back to her box. I guess the next start will be the G1 Coronation S. [at Royal Ascot June 18]."

Triple Threats

Super Saver to Get Break; DMC to Mother Goose?

Todd Pletcher told Daily Racing Form that GI Kentucky Derby hero Super Saver (Maria's Mon) will get a break following his eighth-place finish in Saturday's GI Preakness S. at Pimlico. "He won't breeze for a while," Pletcher told the publication. The conditioner said the WinStar homebred would continue to jog and gallop, however. He added the GII Jim Dandy S. at Saratoga July 31 or the GI Haskell Invitational at Monmouth a day later are possible targets. Pletcher added that, while he thought Super Saver has handled his sophomore campaign reasonably well, that he thought his recent exertions had begun to take their toll. "Like most horses that will run three races in five weeks, they're going to lose a little bit of weight, which is about what we expected," said Pletcher. "I think he's mentally held up really well, but as expected he's lost a few pounds."

Pletcher saddled four horses in the Derby, and outlined plans for the other three. He said that the filly Devil May Care (Malibu Moon) would likely bypass the GI Belmont S. in favor of the GI Mother Goose S. at Belmont June 26. Mission Impazible (Unbridled's Song), ninth in the Run for the Roses, could tackle the GIII Pegasus S. at Monmouth Park June 19, while Discreetly Mine (Mineshaft), 13th in the Derby, will shorten up to contest the GII Woody Stephens S. on the Belmont Stakes undercard June 5.

NYRA: BELMONT MEET REMAINS IN JEOPARDY

The New York Racing Association reiterated yesterday that, without a resolution with state officials over financial matters, it could run out of cash before the end of the current Belmont spring/summer meet. "NYRA's current cash position will not allow us to make it through the entire Belmont Park race meet," NYRA's President and CEO, Charles Hayward, said in a press release. "We are in discussions with the state regarding potential avenues for us to acquire funding." New York City Off-Track Betting owes NYRA \$17 million, but is bankrupt and currently unable to make payments, while an operator for the VLT machines long-approved at Aqueduct has yet to be selected. The state, meanwhile, is facing a crushing \$9 billion budget deficit, and lawmakers are in a stalemate over a budget that was supposed to be approved by Apr. 1.

OAK TREE EXPLORING OPTIONS

It is still possible that the Oak Tree Racing Association will be able to negotiate a new lease with Santa Anita owner MI Developments, but other avenues are being contemplated. Officials at Hollywood Park and Del Mar have stated publicly that they would make their facilities available for Oak Tree's meet, set to run Sept. 29-Oct. 31, if need be. Oak Tree Executive Vice President Sherwood Chillingworth said Monday that a decision on where the meet will take place needs to be made in a matter of weeks.

"We probably need to do it by the first of July, because obviously we have certain advertising to do, that you have to commit to reasonably soon," Chillingworth remarked. It may be more than a month before he has a chance to sit down with someone from MI Developments, however. "We tried to have a meeting with them, and they said they couldn't meet until June 19," Chillingworth said. "We're trying to be cooperative."

The bankruptcy reorganization plan submitted by Magna International at the end of April, which gave control of Santa Anita to parent company MID, also reaffirmed Oak Tree's lease for the track. But, as Chillingworth explained, "They had a period of 15 days where they could change their minds--then, I think 14 days later, they turned around and rejected the lease." He added, "They said they want to work with us, but I don't know what that is. I asked them to please give me some background, some parameters--it didn't have to be specific--but they said they wanted to discuss the whole thing at one time. That's fine--we will listen to them. We're prepared."

Hollywood President Jack Liebaw told *Daily Racing Form* he would not charge Oak Tree a rent fee to hold the meet at his track. While Chillingworth admitted the offer was generous, he is still hopeful that a deal with MID can be reached. "I want to see what they're going to offer--the whole package," he said. "They can add something here and take something away to balance it out. I don't know what they're proposing, and they have not outlined any of the major issues that you would want to know--I'm not sure they have collected their ideas together themselves. But we're trying to be good guys and we'll look at what they have to offer." There are several reasons why Oak Tree officials would like to stay at Santa Anita. "We've been here for 41 years," Chillingworth said. "And it's obviously the preferred place for the Breeders' Cup. I've been talking to the Breeders' Cup people--I don't know how big a factor it's going to be, but I'm sure it will be a factor."

While the official meeting between Oak Tree and MID won't be held until next month, Chillingworth said there was a small chance he would get together with MID Chief Executive Officer Dennis Mills this week. "Dennis Mills will be in California for the California Horse Racing Board meeting in Berkeley Thursday," he offered. "He may come by and see me--I don't know. He hasn't said he's going to, so I'm not expecting him, but he has that opportunity."



CANADIAN HALL ANNOUNCES '10 INDUCTEES

The Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame yesterday announced its 2010 inductees, which includes six horses and four people. Classic winner **Victory Gallop** (Cryptoclearance) led the three Thoroughbred inductees, along with the important broodmare **Lady Angela** (Hyperion {GB}) and multiple stakes winner **Victorian Era** (Victoria Park),

who got in via the Veterans category. They join owner Mel Lawson and West Coast trainer/jockey Frank Barroby. An induction ceremony will be held Thursday, Aug. 19, 2010 at the Mississauga Convention Centre in Ontario.

Victory Gallop was bred by Toronto's Ivan Dalos of Tall Oaks Farm and foaled at Joanne Clayton's Darrowby Farm in Loretto, Ontario. The son of Victorious Lil (Vice Regent) never raced in Canada, but made a name for himself south of the border. Purchased for just \$25,000 as a yearling, he won a pair of minor stakes at Colonial at two before being acquired by Prestonwood and moved to Elliott Walden's barn. He won the 1998 renewals of the GIII Rebel S. and

GII Arkansas Derby in his first two starts for the new connections, then went on to run second in the GI Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness S. He then denied Real Quiet the Triple Crown with a last-gasp effort in the GI Belmont S. ([video](#)). He concluded his career with a victory in the GI Whitney H. a year later and earned an Eclipse Award as the nation's champion older male horse.

*Lady Angela's name will be in the stud books for a long time to come as the dam of Canadian Horse of the Year Nearctic, who himself would gain fame as the sire of one of the best stallions of the second half of the 20th century, Northern Dancer. Lady Angela is also the second dam of Northern Taste, by Northern Dancer, a prominent sire in Japan.

Victorian Era dominated stakes racing in Ontario in the 1960s for owner Allen Case and Hall of Fame trainer Louis Cavalaris, Jr. The son of Victoria Park won 18 stakes races, was Horse of the Year, and was a three-time champion. He was ineligible to run in the 1965 Queen's Plate when an eligibility payment was not made when he was two.

Lawson, 87, and Jim Dandy Stables were involved in breeding and racing for almost 50 years. His champions included three-time Sovereign Award winner Eternal Search, as well as Let's Go Blue and Ginger Gold. His horses have won 46 stakes races.

The 66-year-old Barroby was prominent on the prairie racing circuit as a jockey, winning titles in Manitoba, Saskatchewan, Alberta and British Columbia. Three times he was the leading trainer at Hastings Park in Vancouver. He is the first B.C.-based trainer to be elected to Canada's Hall of Fame. Barroby was elected to the B.C. Thoroughbred Hall of Fame in 2009.

The Standardbred inductees include Mister Big, the second richest pacer ever; the top broodmare Classic Wish; A Worthy Lad in the Veterans category; as well as trainer Robert McIntosh and builder Peter Heffering.

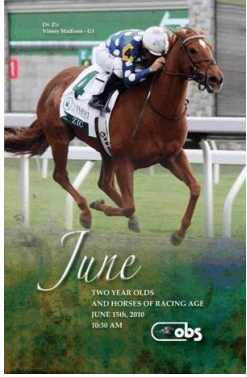
