MINE THAT BIRD TO LUKAS

Last year's GI Kentucky Derby winner **Mine That Bird** (Birdstone) is being shipped to Hall of Famer D. Wayne Lukas' barn at Churchill Downs. The four-year-old gelding, who hasn't faced the starter since finishing ninth in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Santa Anita Nov. 7, had been training at Double Eagle Ranch in New Mexico. Previous conditioner Chip Woolley was philosophical about losing

the horse that put him on the map. "It's pretty tough to have one like that taken away," Woolley told *Daily Racing Form*. "I guess if I'd have won the Triple Crown, I'd have gotten to keep him. I'll always wish the best for the horse. I guess I should be grateful for the opportunity to train him and win the Derby. Personally, I can't understand it. But I guess it's not for me to understand. I hope I represented myself and the owners well throughout. I hope the horse goes on and wins lots of big races." In addition to winning the Run for the Roses, Woolley saddled the bay to second- and third-place finishes in the GI Preakness S. and GI Belmont S., respectively. "We just thought it was time to make a change for the horse," co-owner Leonard Blach told *DRF*. 

Godolphin Consider Options...

Godolphin will keep three colts engaged in the June 5 G1 Epsom Derby at the latest forfeit stage today, racing manager Simon Crisford confirmed yesterday. While the operation have a live contender to supplement in yesterday's Listed Cockeyed Hat S. winner **Rewilding (GB)** (Tiger Hill {Ire}) (see *ATW*, p4), the trio of **Al Zir** (Medaglia d'Oro), **Chabal (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) and **Ameer (Ire)** (Monsun {Ger}) are also in the mix.  **"TDN Rising Star"**  Al Zir was last seen finishing ninth in the G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket May 1. "He wants a trip, and the slow pace meant he was not suited by the run of the race at Newmarket," Crisford said. "He wants a mile and a quarter plus, and either the G1 Prix du Jockey-Club [at Chantilly June 6] or Epsom Derby will be next for him." Chabal, who took the Apr. 23 G3 Sandown Classic Trial, was beaten 20 lengths when fourth in last Thursday's G2 Dante S. at York. "He's a clever horse, and after three furlongs he wasn't liking the very quick ground at York and didn't put his best foot forward," Crisford explained.

"He ran too badly to be true, but ate up afterwards and was very fresh and sound with cold, clean limbs. There was absolutely nothing wrong with the horse, but we won't be running him on quick ground again. If the ground is good or softer, we'll keep him in the picture." Crisford also revealed that the G3 Prix La Force winner **Simon de Montfort (Ire)** (King's Best) is likely to run in the Prix du Jockey-Club.

OASIS DANCES INTO GUINEAS PICTURE

Trainer Ralph Beckett is looking forward to throwing **Oasis Dancer (GB)** (Oasis Dream {GB}) into the deep end in Saturday's G1 Abu Dhabi Irish 2000 Guineas. An impressive two-length winner of a one-mile handicap at Newmarket May 1, last year's Tattersalls Timeform Million hero will be making his black-type bow at The Curragh. "I think we're going to run," Beckett told *PA Sport* yesterday. "He has worked well and I've been pretty happy with him since his last race. We think the Curragh and the likely fast ground will suit him." The Curragh's Manager Paul Hensey is expecting no surprises in the weather ahead of the weekend. "The forecast is good for the next few days and the three millimetres of rain we had last night was just what the doctor ordered," he said yesterday. "It's perfect good ground on the straight course and good-to-firm on the round course, so we should be on good ground or better for the weekend."

Caracortado to Affirmed?...

Caracortado (Cat Dreams) has returned to the Southern California barn of trainer Mike Machowsky and could make his next appearance in the GIII Affirmed H. at Hollywood Park June 19. Sent off at odds of 18-1 in the GI Preakness S. last Saturday, the Cal-bred was forwardly placed and in striking position to the quarter pole, but emptied out soon after and checked in seventh, nearly 11 lengths behind the victorious Lookin At Lucky (Smart Strike). "He might have gotten a little tired on me," Machowsky told *Daily Racing Form*. Winner of his first five trips to the post, including the GII Robert B. Lewis S. in February, Caracortado was third to Sidney's Candy (Candy Ride {Arg}) in the GII San Felipe S. and a troubled fourth to that foe in the GI Santa Anita Derby prior to his Preakness try. He did not have enough graded earnings to make the Kentucky Derby field. Caracortado has a record of 8-5-0-1 and earnings of \$262,200.

EYE on the ELITE

In an ongoing series, the TDN will take a look at Monmouth Park's inaugural 50-day, \$50 million Elite Summer Meet

Opening Day Card Drawn...

One card drawn, 49 to go. Yesterday, Monmouth Park took entries for the opening-day card of its unprecedented, 50-day, \$50-million Elite Summer Meet, which kicks off Saturday at the Oceanport oval. A total of 13 races were used--one more than scheduled--with 134 horses in the box. Six of the 13 races were oversubscribed.

"I think it's a solid card," said Monmouth Vice President and General Manager Bob Kulina. "We went with 13 races, and we're pretty pleased with that. In terms of field size, nine of the 13 races went with 10 or more betting interests. Overall, I think there are over 130 horses on the card. That's what we're trying to do, and hopefully we'll only get stronger."

One disappointing aspect of the card is that two \$100,000 black-type events--the six-furlong Decathlon S. on the main track and the 8 1/2-furlong Elkwood S. on the grass--drew only seven and eight horses, respectively, and one of the Elkwood entrants is main-track only.

"The two stakes were small, but this was a busy time to open," explained Kulina. "Pimlico is coming off Preakness weekend, and I think that used a lot of the high-end horses. Plus everyone has their Memorial Day weekend coming up. Being sandwiched between those two things, I think we're very happy with the response we got."

In addition to the two stakes races, the card is comprised of a pair of allowance races, a maiden special weight, two New Jersey-bred races, a maiden claiming race, and five claiming races. Both allowance races are worth \$80,000. A NW1X going 1 1/16 miles on the main track attracted 10 runners, while a one-mile NW1X on the grass drew an overflow field of 14. Only two races from the condition book weren't used: a \$15,000 claimer, and a NW4X/optional claimer.

"We brought that race back for Sunday," said Kulina. But a four-other-than is a four-other-than--they don't go at many places."

Kulina said he was encouraged by the prominent jockeys and trainers taking part in Saturday's opener.

"You see a guy like Garrett Gomez's name on 12 horses in 13 races, that's great," he said. "Johnny Velazquez has been named on [10]. Billy Mott's on there, [Todd] Pletcher's got a bunch in, [Kiaran] McLaughlin, guys like [Michael Trombetta] from Maryland and Peter Miller from California. Those are the names you want to see, and it's a good start."

OPEN LETTER TO THE INDUSTRY

PROGRESS

You may have read recently where, on the day before the Preakness, the [NTRA replied](#) to a lengthy letter sent to us on April 29 by United States Senator Tom Udall (D-NM) and Representative Ed Whitfield (R-KY). [Their letter](#) sought information on the industry's progress in areas such as model rules, participation in the NTRA Safety & Integrity Alliance, uniform medication guidelines and penalties, and injury reporting. Senator Udall is a member of the Senate Commerce, Science & Transportation Committee. Rep. Whitfield is a member of the House Energy & Commerce Committee. These two committees have joint jurisdiction over the Interstate Horseracing Act (IHA), which is the law on the books that essentially allows our industry to conduct simulcasting on races across state lines. Obviously interstate simulcasting is an important part of our business these days.

As you know, Mr. Whitfield has conducted several hearings on horse racing over the years. The issues that have been raised during those hearings, which are substantially repeated in the letter of inquiry, have largely been addressed through collective industry action, including the formation of the [Safety & Integrity Alliance](#), the [Drug Testing Initiative](#) and the deployment of the [Equine Injury Database](#).

Collectively, the industry has made these and other improvements because it's the right thing to do and because our fans and customers have indicated clearly to us that these are matters of great importance to them. Whether you are a Thoroughbred breeder, owner, trainer or jockey, a Thoroughbred lover, a handicapper, or all of these, you want to be confident that all races are conducted in the fairest, safest manner possible. You are to be commended for these stances, and it is up to the industry to give you all those things and more. It's what led us, and virtually every major race-track and horsemen's association, to establish the Safety & Integrity Alliance and the Barbaro Fund for Equine Health and Safety Research. So, thanks in large part to you, we now have better scientific research, more comprehensive injury reporting requirements, much-improved regulatory uniformity and broader cooperation among jurisdictions and racing participants than ever before.

The Udall/Whitfield letter and our response are linked to this blog. [The Jockey Club](#) and [Association of Racing Commissioners International](#) received similar letters and submitted their responses as well.

I will keep you posted when we receive a response from Sen. Udall's or Rep. Whitfield's offices. NTRA REPORT FROM CAPITOL HILL



PRIMARY RESULTS FOR RACING STATES

Voters in this week's primaries produced noteworthy results in three major horse racing states: Arkansas, Kentucky and Pennsylvania.

Two-term Arkansas incumbent U.S. Senator [Blanche Lincoln](#) (D) faces a runoff election, following Tuesday's primary. Lincoln took 45 percent of the vote compared to Lt. Governor [Bill Halter](#)'s 43 percent, but lacked Arkansas' required more-than-50-percent majority for the outright win. A third candidate, D.C. Morrison, received the balance. Lincoln and Halter will face off on June 8 for the right to take on U.S. Rep. [John Boozman](#) (R) this fall.

Eye surgeon [Rand Paul](#) captured 59 percent of the vote and the Senate GOP nomination in Kentucky by defeating Secretary of State [Trey Grayson](#). Paul will face Democratic candidate state Attorney General [Jack Conway](#) this fall. Conway narrowly defeated Lt. Governor [Daniel Mongiardo](#) 44 to 43 percent.

Incumbent U.S. Senator [Arlen Specter](#) (D) is out in Pennsylvania as U.S. Rep. [Joe Sestak](#) (D) defeated the longest-serving Senator in that state's history. Specter changed his registration last year from Republican to Democrat and was a 30-year incumbent. Former U.S. Rep. [Pat Toomey](#) won the Republican Senate nomination and will face Sestak.
