## SHOW ME THE MONEY... MONMOUTH 2010

### STELLAR HOLIDAY WEEKEND AT THE SHORE

The Elite Summer Meet at Monmouth Park got off to a fast start, and the brisk business continued through Memorial Day weekend. Over the three days of racing offered over the holiday weekend in 2010, the attendance was 38,543, an increase of 15.5 percent for the three comparable days in 2009 (there were four days of racing over Memorial Day weekend last year). The on-track handle totaled \$2,925,073, up 44

percent from last year, and the total handle was \$24,912,191, an eye-catching 122-percent jump from 2009. "The numbers speak for themselves," Monmouth Vice President and General Manager Bob Kulina remarked, adding with a chuckle, "Five days in, 45 more to go. We were lucky with the weather, and I thought the racing was very strong. I think there was a lot of energy and excitement in the building, and the reaction from across the country in the world of simulcasting was pretty positive." On-track, the crowd showed a newfound loyalty to the local product. "What we've seen are the guys who might normally come [to Monmouth], but maybe look to bet more on tracks other than us, are now looking at us first and at a second signal less," Kulina explained. "Our field size had made it more attractive, as has the size of the pools. Players want to be able to bet into a large pool and not really change it, and I think that's what happening. A guy can go out there and make a fairly large wager and not worry about changing the board so much." *Cont. p2*

### DERBY RULED OUT FOR ST NICK

Derrick Smith's **St Nicholas Abbey (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}) will miss Saturday's G1 Epsom Derby after being found to have suffered a muscle injury. Weak in the ante-post markets since a substandard workout at Ballydoyle on Friday, last year's impressive G1 Racing Post Trophy winner and champion juvenile was reported to be sore by trainer Aidan O'Brien, who explained in a statement on the Coolmore website, "St Nicholas Abbey was due to work first thing this morning.

However, when he came out of his box, we noticed he was stiff behind. He had looked slightly stiff yesterday evening. His work on Friday last was a little lacklustre for him, and that was the first time we had seen anything different, but he was fine afterwards. He was immediately examined and scanned by our vets this morning. They found a slight muscle injury high up in his hindquarter. This meant he could not work today, and we were advised to give him an easy few days. Obviously, this will preclude him from running in the Investec Derby on Saturday. We always thought St Nicholas Abbey could walk on water, and it is very unfortunate for all concerned to have a setback like this so close to the big race."

**Memorial Day Weekend at Monmouth cont.**

***More for the Money...***

Bob Kulina cited an example of the value being offered on-track in Oceanport--Whoopi Kitten (Fusaichi Pegasus), owned by Kona Stable, trained by Patrick Biancone and ridden by local hero Joe Bravo, was let go at 11-1 in the sixth race Saturday. "We had a maiden special weight race over the weekend with a 12-horse field, and the pool [for all wagers] was \$1 million. The winner was a horse that Bravo rode, was well-intended, and it paid \$25.20. That wouldn't have been the case in a six or seven-horse field. We have some big-name trainers and owners in these races that making for very competitive and tough racing, and right now it's reflecting in the handle."

***Pick 5 Gets Big Boost...***

Handle across the board has skyrocketed at Monmouth this summer, but there is one type of wager that has surprised track officials with its robust turnover. "Of all the things that have happened for us at Monmouth, the 50-cent Pick 5 has just been phenomenal," Kulina offered. "That is hard for me to comprehend. We have never had any success in New Jersey having a Pick 5, a Pick 6, get to these big pool sizes. I think this was the third year [for the 50-cent Pick 5], and it was a nice bet--I think we had a carryover once where the pool was up to \$70,000. Well, every day for the five days [of 2010], the pool has been more than \$200,000 [averaging \$275,000 a day, according to *Daily Racing Form*]. And we got very lucky opening day--we had a carryover into the second day of the meet, and the pool was \$800,000." What has caused the upsurge in popularity? "I think it's the field size, and the energy at the track," said Kulina. "And we're doing a lot of different marketing from the gaming side of it--we have TVG on site, we're doing something with the [*Daily Racing Form*] where they're focusing on the Pick 5, and, so far, the racing has been really good. People are looking at it, and when you can get players to look at these Pick bets, that means they're also looking at the races, and so they're saving and covering and doing all the stuff that the big players do. That, to me, the most incredible thing."


***Keeping Up the Good Work...***

While the first five days of the meet have been everything those involved in the experiment could have hoped for, officials aren't ready to rest on their laurels.


"We're looking at [the financials], obviously, every week, but I think you need to run a meaningful number of days before you can make a judgement," Kulina said. "I don't think you have to go to the end of the season, but you want to get through a couple months--at least to the Fourth of July. We haven't run any Fridays--what are they going to look like? Are those days going to get the Wednesday/Thursday regulars?"

"The big thing will be, at the end of the year, how successful from a financial point of view was it?" he continued. "Is it going to work for us, as well as for the horsemen? But I do believe it was the only option out there. And I think it would be great if other tracks were able to do this at various times of the year. At the end of the day, we're all simulcasting, we're all selling bets, and we all have involvement in phone and internet wagering and OTWs. We need to figure out, as an industry, how to produce a better product. We're trying to do it, and we're cautiously optimistic that it's going to work for us. Right now we're extremely pleased."

Kulina is also thrilled that the local horsemen, who signed off on the Elite Summer Meet, have fared.

While Rick Dutrow Jr. and Todd Pletcher, two trainers who have had successful strings at Monmouth for some years now, are on top of the standings, Jersey conditioners such as Bruce Alexander, Sharon Huston, Terri Pompay, Tim Hills, Joe Orseno, Patricia Farro and Amy Tarrant have been reaping the rewards as well.

"When we were getting this accomplished, I kept telling the Jersey guys, you're going to be fine, you guys are going to do really well, you're better than you think," Kulina said. "And I think the Jersey guys have been holding up well, the Jersey jocks have been winning their fair share, and I'm pretty proud of how all of our horsemen are doing the first five days. I think that's the neatest thing that's happened."

**WHERE'S RACHEL?** It has not yet been decided where, but Horse of the Year **Rachel Alexandra** (Medaglia d'Oro) will make her next start June 12, according to a statement sent out by owner Jess Jackson yesterday. "Rachel Alexandra's condition continues to improve," Jackson said. "We were impressed with Rachel's Memorial Day work...[and] her next work is Monday, June 7. Assuming she continues to progress, we are considering one of the following June 12 races for Rachel's next preparation: the [GI] Stephen Foster H. [at Churchill], the [GII] Fleur de Lis H. [Churchill], the [GI] Ogden Phipps H. [Belmont] or the [GIII] Obeah S. [Delaware Park]. Our ultimate goal has not changed in scheduling Rachel Alexandra's campaign this year. We are getting her back to her fitness level of last year, with the long term hope to race her in the Breeders' Cup this fall."



## INVESTEC DERBY Epsom, June 5



### Fallon Rides Al Zir...

Kieren Fallon will partner 🌟 **"TDN Rising Star"** 🌟 **Al Zir** (Medaglia d'Oro) in Saturday's G1 Investec Derby at Epsom, it was announced yesterday. Godolphin revealed the booking after jockey Ahmed Ajtebi was required to partner the Mahmood Al Zarooni-trained supplementary entry **Buzzword (GB)** (Pivotal {GB}) for the operation in the Classic. "Kieren Fallon's record in the Derby is excellent," Racing Manager Simon Crisford commented. "He was available, and has ridden for Godolphin before."

### Cooper in a Quandary...

Epsom's Clerk of the Course Andrew Cooper is mulling over his options as to whether to water the ground ahead of the weekend meeting. "It is just drizzling, and we have had nowhere near the amount we were forecast or hoping for," Cooper explained yesterday. "It is good ground at the moment, and we have three days that look very settled, so we are asking what do we do with the course. We need to know how much it will dry with no prospect of rain; we could water up to Thursday, just to freshen it up and maintain it. I can't see us ever watering on the hill on Friday night, but we could possibly water the home straight--it's shaping up to be on the fast side of good for the Derby."

## Prix du Jockey-Club Chantilly, June 6

### Planteur Heads Jockey-Club Contenders

Ecurie Wildenstein's G2 Prix Noailles winner **Planteur (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) yesterday was among the 29 remaining in Sunday's G1 Prix du Jockey-Club at Chantilly. Trainer Elie Lellouche revealed to *Racing Post* that the homebred will be aided by a pacemaker in the 1 5/16-mile Classic. "He had a gallop on Les Aigles last Friday and he really is in great shape," Lellouche told the trade daily. "He will have a pipe-opener on either Thursday or Friday. I am also likely to run the pacemaker **Vivre Libre (GB)** (Sadler's Wells), and another of my owners will be represented in the race by **Handsome Devil (GB)** (Footstepsinthesand {GB})." Gestut Ammerland's G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains hero and ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ **Lope de Vega (Ire)** (Shamardal), Windflower Overseas Holdings' G3 Craven S. winner **Elusive Pimpernel** (Elusive Quality) and Godolphin's G3 Prix La Force victor **Simon de Montfort (Ire)** (King's Best) are other notables in the list; Khalid Abdullah's G2 Prix Greffulhe winner **Ice Blue (GB)** (Dansili {GB}) will be piloted by Ryan Moore, replacing Stephane Pasquier, who suffered a fracture recently.

### Blanco Set for Chantilly...

Derrick Smith's **Cape Blanco (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) looks likely to run in Sunday's G1 Prix du Jockey-Club at Chantilly after trainer Aidan O'Brien appeared to rule out Epsom. Despite the news that St Nicholas Abbey (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) would miss the mile-and-a-half Classic, the Ballydoyle conditioner is keen to target the G2 Dante S. winner at the French equivalent. "It is looking increasingly likely that Cape Blanco will be going for the Prix du Jockey Club along with Viscount Nelson (Giant's Causeway)," O'Brien stated.

On a hot and humid June morning at Belmont Park yesterday, all was fairly quiet on the GI Belmont S. front as Nick Zito's powerhouse duo of **Ice Box** (Pulpit) and **Fly Down** (Mineshaft) continued to prep for Saturday's Classic in Upstate New York. **Uptowncharlybrown** (Limehouse) opted to beat the heat and galloped shortly after 6 a.m. Preakness runner-up **First Dude** (Stephen Got Even) waited for the renovation break before heading out for an easy gallop around the 1 1/2-mile oval. With training hours winding down as the mercury continued to soar into the 80s, the action shifted to New York City.

After watching GI Kentucky Derby fourth-place finisher **Make Music for Me** (Bernstein) walk the shedrow at 8 a.m., trainer Alexis Barba made a special trip to the Empire State Building. Along with the popular long-time NYRA bugler Sam Grossman, the duo were the focus of a photo-op on the world famous 86th floor observatory deck. For the second straight year, the Empire State Building will be lit in green and white over the weekend in honor of the third leg of the Triple Crown.

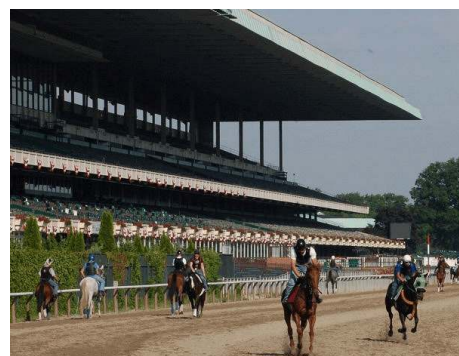

Billy Turner, legendary trainer of Triple Crown hero Seattle Slew, received a warm applause from the crowd before taking the podium to recall the Slew's popular run in 1977. Broadcaster Joe Tessitore got a few laughs from the crowd as he joked with Silver about him becoming his agent to help negotiate his next contract after receiving a gracious introduction. Zito appeared via satellite for a taped recording from Saratoga to discuss his two big guns and apologized for his absence. John Velazquez, rider of Fly Down, trainer Dale Romans (First Dude) and Barba also briefly took the mike to answer questions regarding their respective charges. Fantasy Lane Stable's Bob Hutt held his composure quite well while retelling stories of his former long-time friend and trainer Alan Seewald, who died unexpectedly earlier this spring. It's another huge Classic weekend coming up, with the G1 Epsom Oaks Friday, the G1 Epsom Derby and G1 Belmont S. Saturday, and the G1 Prix du Jockey-Club (2100 meters) Sunday. It may be until declaration time tomorrow before we know which horses Aidan O'Brien will be running in which Derby, but with St Nicholas Abbey (Montjeu) now out, G3 Gallinule S. winner Jan Vermeer (Montjeu) and G2 Derrinstown Derby Trial winner Midas Touch (Galileo) could lead their Epsom team. G2 Dante S. winner Cape Blanco (Galileo) is going either to England or France, and G1 Irish 2000 Guineas third Viscount Nelson (Giant's Causeway) will be heading to Paris.

Prince Khalid Abdullah is to be represented at Epsom by G3 Lingfield Derby Trial winner Bullet Train (Sadler's Wells) and Workforce (King's Best), and in France, his G2 Prix Greffulhe winner Ice Blue (Dansili), along with the Wildensteins' G2 Prix Noailles winner Planteur (Danehill Dancer), will lead the home defense, along with G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains (see below) winner Lope de Vega (Shamardal). Godolphin's top Epsom hope is Rewilding, from the first British crop by Tiger Hill and out of the remarkable broodmare Darara (Top Ville). Rewilding, then trained by Fabre, was second to Planteur in the G2 Noailles before being transferred to Godolphin and scorching the opposition in the Listed Cocked Hat S. at Goodwood. The only other horse quoted under 20-1 for Epsom is Azmeel, from the first crop by the promising middle-distance sire Azamour. He was second to Godolphin's G2 Dante S. flop Chabal (Galileo) in the G3 Sandown Classic Trial before winning the G3 Dee S. at Chester.

European sires with first three-year-olds (F2007 sires) were very prominent in May's three one-mile "2000 Guineas" races in England, France and Ireland, though the favorite for Royal Ascot's G1 St. James's Palace S. in two weeks' time is likely to be Europe's top three-year-old miler that is NOT by a first-crop sire. This is Canford Cliffs, by the veteran sire Tagula, a grandson of Stop the Music. Though beaten by stablemate Dick Turpin (Arakan) in both the G3 Greenham S. and the G1 English 2000 Guineas (Dick Turpin second, Canford Cliffs third), Canford Cliffs rebounded with an impressive win in the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas, running an RPR (Racing Post Rating) of 126, highest of any three-year-old in Europe so far this year. As he's trained in England by the venerable Richard Hannon and won last year's G2 Coventry S. at Royal Ascot, Canford Cliffs is likely to be favored there again over G1 English 2000 Guineas winner Makfi (Dubawi), who is trained in France by Mikel Dezangles.

Makfi, of course, is from the first crop by the all-conquering Dubawi, and Dick Turpin is from the first crop by Arakan, a Group 3-winning son of Nureyev. The G1 Poule d'Esaii des Poulains was won by Lope de Vega, from Shamardal's first crop. They have all run RPR's of 120+ this year, signifying that this looks like a good crop of three-year old milers, and once again setting up the G1 St. James's Palace S. as the decider; essentially, once again, a European 2000 Guineas. The fly in the ointment could yet be Coolmore's Steinbeck, from the first crop by Giant's Causeway's son Footstepsinthesand. Fourth in last year's G1 Dewhurst S. when making only his second start, he was again fourth (RPR 112)--after another interrupted--in the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas. Steinbeck has five lengths to make up on Canford Cliffs, so it's a tall order, but it's never out of the question when it's an Aidan O'Brien three-year-old making his second start of the year. The St. James's Palace S. is nearly always a very good race, and it looks like it will be again this year.

Whereas Europe's top three-year-old colt milers look a good bunch, the pecking order for Europe's three-year-old fillies is very murky, much like the pecking order for America's three-year-old colts, and for much the same reason: relatively low speed figures by Classic standards. The three "1000 Guineas" races have yielded either races with an extreme track bias (G1 English 1000 Guineas, in which overnight rain resulted in probably a five-length bias for stands-side runners at Newmarket); or blanket finishes (France and Ireland). Moreover, the nominal crop leader, Special Duty (Hennessy), won both the English and French races via disqualification--she finished second in both races, yet is the crop's most accomplished runner so far. No fewer than 16 three-year-old fillies have run RPR's between 109-115 in the three 1000 Guineas races (see attached table). Two of them, G1 English 1000 Guineas seventh (wrong side) Rumoush (Rahy) and G1 Irish 1000 Guineas fourth Remember When (Daneshill Dancer), are prominently quoted in the betting for Friday's G1 Epsom Oaks.

Special Duty is on holiday until Deauville, but presumably many of the remainder will be tempted to line up for Royal Ascot's June 18 G1 Coronation S., which could also be called the European 1000 Guineas. The four favorites there will likely be disqualified G1 English 1000 Guineas winner Jacqueline Quest (Rock of Gibraltar) and the first three home in the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas--Bethrah (Marju), Anna Salai (Dubawi), and Music Note (Noverre).

The first of this weekend's Classics is Friday's G1 Epsom Oaks, for which Prince Khalid Abdullah's G3 Musidora S. winner Aviate (Dansili) is a tepid 4-1 favorite over Rumoush (see above), who, before running second to Music Show on the 'wrong' side at Newmarket, had defeated colts over nine furlongs in a Listed race.

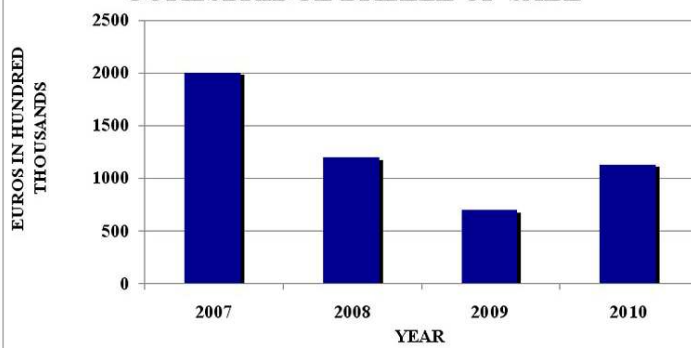
# Weekly Sales Ticker

"Goresbridge's two-year-old sale, though at a lower level, continued the recent theme of improvement in the two-year-old market: a remarkable 85 percent of those catalogued were listed as sold. Overall, the European two-year-old sales (one to go, at Baden-Baden) saw a six percent rise in the number sold, with a two percent increase in gross from the corresponding sales in 2009, and a five percent dip in average. Still, this has been a big growth segment of the market in recent years: an average of over 48,000 euros for 462 sold looks pretty respectable"

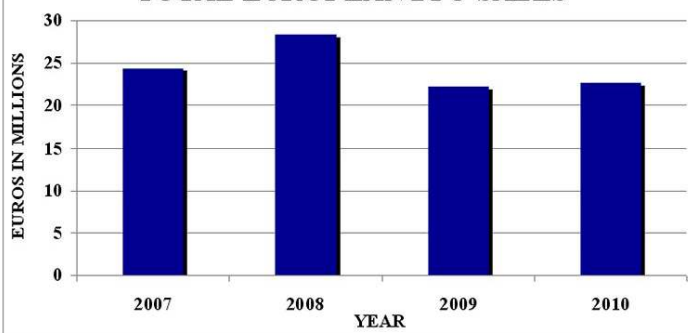

Aviate's trainer, Henry Cecil, who was won the G1 Epsom Oaks, let's see, eight times, doesn't seem to still quite believe Aviate is better than her stablemate Timepiece (Zamindar), also owned by Prince Khalid, and Timepiece is third favorite at 7-1, in spite of being beaten in both her starts this year. Aviate's sire Dansili, who was mentioned in this column a couple of weeks ago, could have a huge Classic weekend, as besides Aviate he has Ice Blue as a major contender in Sunday's G1 Prix du Jockey-Club; Dansili already has 10 black-type winners this year. Also around 7-1 for Friday's Oaks is the one-raced impressive maiden winner, Sajjhaa (King's Best). Remember When (above) is around 9-1 (these all from Betfair, Monday).

Around 10-1 is Kirsten Rausing's homebred Hernando filly, Akdarena, trained by Jim Bolger. She led all the way and blitzed older fillies and mares by six lengths in the G3 Blue Wind S. at Naas. That will be her out in front Friday.

The G1 Belmont S., let's face it, lacks excitement this year, but in a funny way it's quite an interesting race. Often the Belmont is run 10 points slower, in Beyer terms, than the Derby and Preakness, reflecting how few American horses excel at 12 furlongs on the dirt. But this year, when the crop's leader, G1 Preakness winner Lookin at Lucky has a lifetime best Beyer of 102, at least the Belmont standard is likely to be closer to the other two Triple Crown races. Four horses, two of them trained by Nick Zito, look to have the edge in another closely matched Classic field, and, interestingly, three of them hail from the Seattle Slew sire line. The favorite in my book is the Zito-trained G1 Kentucky Derby second (Beyer 100) Ice Box, who had won the G1 Florida Derby (99) in his previous start. He's by Pulpit. Zito also trains the impressive six-length GII Dwyer S. winner (99) Fly Down, by Mineshaft. G1 Preakness second (101) First Dude, by yet another son of A.P. Indy, Stephen Got Even, is likely to be the pacesetter.

A possible upsetter not from the Seattle Slew sire line is GI Kentucky Derby fourth Make Music for Me, from the second Castleton Lyons crop by Bernstein, I believe. He is one of two 2010 graded stakes winners in the six-horse stable of former Eddie Gregson assistant Alexis Barba. As a Gregson disciple, of course, I'm rooting for a fairytale win for Alexis; but in these closely matched fields just about anything can happen, especially at 12 furlongs. Lookin at Lucky's trainer, Bob Baffert, runs GIII Lone Star Derby winner (95) Game on Dude, a gelding by Awesome Again who had previously been a well-beaten seventh behind Ice Box in the GI Florida Derby; and trainer Mike Maker runs Stately Victor, from the first crop by Awesome Again's son, Ghostzapper. Part-owned by Kentucky Attorney General and Democratic senatorial candidate Jack Conway, Stately Victor won the GI Blue Grass S. (A94) on the synthetic, then finished eighth in the GI Kentucky Derby. I'd be wheeling the field in the Pick 3 and Pick 4, for sure.

**Q & A WITH THE BREEDERS' CUP CANDIDATES**



On May 24, Breeders' Cup announced the 28 candidates who will stand for election to the Breeders' Cup Board of Members and Trustees. There are 13 openings on the Board. Voting begins June 8 and closes June 22 at 5 p.m. The bios of the 28 candidates are available in documents circulated to the voters--Breeders' Cup foal and stallion nominators--and the *TDN* once again will provide additional information on the candidates' viewpoints. To that end, we posed the following question to each of the candidates, and have given them 400 words or fewer in which to respond.

What do you think is the biggest issue facing the Breeders' Cup today and, if voted to the Breeders' Cup board, how would you propose this issue be solved?

**Bret Jones:**

The biggest issue facing the Breeders' Cup today is the same issue that is facing our industry as a whole:



**Bret Jones**

Our game is losing relevance in American sports culture. In these historically difficult times, there is little disagreement that the game needs to change--but without a true central governing body, meaningful change is overwhelmingly difficult to implement. However, in the regrettable absence of a true centralized leader, I fully believe that the Breeders' Cup provides our


strongest vehicle to bring about many of these critically important changes.

Having control of our nation's most important races provides the Breeders' Cup with the leverage to impose restrictions on their entrants that are long overdue in American racing. This precedent was set in 2008 when the Breeders' Cup implemented its ban on anabolic steroids for the event and outlined the penalties for a positive test--including a lifetime ban from the Breeders' Cup for three-time offenders and a mandate for states to adopt steroidal bans in order to make their tracks eligible to host Breeders' Cup Challenge races. This was a great step in the right direction and, I believe, signals the vast potential for the Breeders' Cup to shape policy.

It is no secret that the national perception of our game is that not everyone is competing on a level playing field. This discourages our much-needed would-be fans and stirs resentment in our horseplayers--the true backbone of our industry. The Breeders' Cup has the influence to fight this issue head on and, when successful, offer a blueprint that should extend to the Graded Stakes Committee and the independent state racing commissions. The dream of all racehorse owners is to have their horses compete in our year-end championship and, because of this, the Breeders' Cup has the leverage to ensure that these owners and trainers understand that all eligible horses must play by the same set of rules.

Medication regulation is just one example of the changes a forward-looking Breeders' Cup can make in striving to regain the national prominence our sport deserves. As a young person with a lifetime stake in this game, I feel an obligation to be a part of these changes. My generation has come of age in a very scary time for our industry, and I can promise you, no one is more motivated and willing to work than a young person whose entire future is endangered. The Breeders' Cup represents a great opportunity for our industry to truly improve our game and, if elected to the Board, I will bring a fresh and independent perspective to this critically important organization.

**Jerry Crawford:**

The most important issue facing the Breeders' Cup Board is how we use the bully pulpit to continue to move the Breeders' Cup forward and bring the Thoroughbred industry along with it.

The Breeders' Cup has taken two positive first steps:



**Jerry Crawford**

First, the long range planning process; second, the move to two days for the Breeders' Cup as the event continues to grow toward an international festival of racing. We need to be certain that the location of this event is fair to horses that race on all surfaces.

I believe the Breeders' Cup needs to move simultaneously down two tracks. The long-term goal should be an industry that is

fully integrated and learns to speak with one voice.

While we move in that direction, the Breeders' Cup should use its influence to make progress on numerous issues. Specifically, the Breeders' Cup should lead the way in advocating for new technology and marketing ideas. We should also advocate for uniform medication and licensing rules. And, importantly, we should advocate for lower takeouts. Making takeout dependent on field size would be a great start.

Currently, racing has the Triple Crown followed by a confusing five months leading up to our World Series event, the Breeders' Cup. We need to make racing from June to November the "regular season" of horse racing, where people can follow the equine athletes, the jockeys and the trainers so they don't have to start all over at Breeders' Cup time.

The Breeders' Cup also needs to be a major presence in Washington D.C. in protecting the Interstate Horse Racing Act while, at the same time, preserving the current depreciation rules that advance the breeding industry. I would welcome an opportunity to use the experience and relationships I have developed in six presidential campaigns and numerous congressional and governors' races to help advance our cause.

We also need to continue to do everything we can to expand the opportunity for fans to become owners. Partnerships are a great way for people to be introduced into the business. Following in the footsteps of many partnership pioneers like Dogwood, West Point and Team Valor, I started Donegal Racing's Derby Dreams in 2008. Keeneland is helping us by the creation of their Ambassadors program to seek out additional owners as well. I am pleased to be a part of that effort.

### STAR ATTRACTION AT MAGIC MILLIONS

Tuesday's session of the Magic Millions National Broodmare Sale was topped by **Star Mystic (Aus)** (Flying Spur {Aus}), a full-sister to Group 1 winner Alverta (Aus) in foal to Choisir (Aus), who sold for A\$290,000 to Sydney-based bloodstock agent Vin Cox. Offered by Yarraman Park Stud as lot 1284, the seven-year-old mare was Group 2-placed on the racetrack. The day's second-highest price was A\$280,000 for Group 1 winner Victory Vein (Aus) (Mr Henrysee). Patinack Farm secured the mare, in foal to More Than Ready, from the Strawberry Hill Stud draft. A pair of mares missed out on being the session highlights. **Nancy Eleanor (Aus)** (Blevic {Aus}), dam of G1 Golden Slipper hero Phelan Ready (Aus) (More Than Ready), was passed in at A\$800,000 off a reserve of A\$1,000,000. She was offered by Widden Stud as [lot 1234](#). **Munhro (Aus)** (Lonhro {Aus}), who went through the ring as [lot 1233](#) from Segenhoe Stud, failed to meet her A\$450,000 reserve when bidding stalled at A\$420,000.

Through the first three days of four broodmare sessions, a total of 709 lots exchanged hands. The A\$22,970,000 aggregate was up from the A\$19,442,000 achieved a year ago, but the average slipped a bit to A\$51,968 from A\$56,191.

"Selling was tough again today," acknowledged David Chester, the auction company's managing director. "The clearance rate slipped from the first session when it was 86 percent, but, all in all, to finish up with the figures we have, we're pretty happy. Similar sales have been very tough around the region in recent times, but thankfully we worked hard attracting clients who helped compete for those lots who were less commercial to locals." Chester added, "It was great to have clients from New Zealand, Hong Kong, South Africa and the Philippines back at the Gold Coast and also to have clients from Libya for the first time." 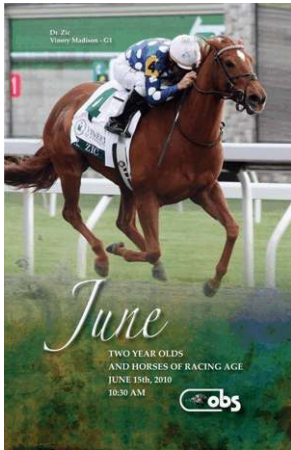
