MAKE HISTORY FOR ME?

Only eight women trainers have ever even saddled a runner in the GI Belmont S., and only one has hit the board--that was Dianne Carpenter, who sent out 17-1 Kingpost to run a distant second behind Risen Star back

in 1988. Alexis Barba will try to go one better in the 142nd edition of the "Test of the Champion" at Belmont Park this afternoon. Barba sends out Ellen and Peter Johnson's **Make Music For Me** (Bernstein) in the 12-deep Belmont S. field, and she likes what she has seen from the bay this week. "Everything is good," said Barba. "He's jumping around--a little time bomb. But that's what I want to see." Make Music For Me has only one win

from his nine career starts, going 0-for-six as a juvenile before breaking his maiden in the grassy Pasadena S. at Santa Anita Mar. 6. Sixth after an eventful trip in the Apr. 10 GI Blue Grass S., he snuck into the gate for the May 1 GI Kentucky Derby at the 11th hour. The 30-1 shot trailed the field early, but showed some gas down the lane to be fourth, beaten less than five lengths. How will he handle the 12 panels of the Belmont? "He's always had a lot of stamina in his training," Barba told TDN. "You just never know til you're in the race, and it's a new surface, but he sure acts like he'll run all day." **Belmont Coverage cont. p3**

"[Snow Fairy] was not entered in anything because I didn't know

how good she was, so it is a fairytale. We knew she could quicken, but we had doubts about her staying. We were virtually last coming down the hill, but she is a very tough filly. When she hit the front, she almost thought she'd done enough."

Snow Fairy, who was bought back at what seems a ludicrous €1,800 at Tattersalls Ireland as a yearling, took a while to find her stride at two. She followed a fourth in the G3 Sweet Solera S. at Newmarket in early August with a closing third in Goodwood's G3 Prestige S. later that month. Untried beyond seven furlongs, the homebred signed off with an unplaced effort on soft ground in Newbury's Listed Radley S. in October. She showed dramatic improvement over nearly 10 furlongs when reappearing in the Height of Fashion S. at Goodwood May 19, scoring by three lengths despite stumbling at the start, and the decision to supplement her for the Epsom Classic was made. Settled with only two behind early as the tail-swishing Akdarena (GB)

(Hernando {Fr}) set the fractions, the bay was left in last starting the downhill descent to Tattenham Corner, and still languished Remember When was sent up to take on Meeznah. She switched to the inner to tackle that duo and showed electric acceleration to swamp them at the eighth pole, then dug in to hold the game rally of the runner-up. "There was an awful lot of bumping, and it probably suited her that the pace slackened off in the middle part of the race, as it allowed her to stay the trip," said jockey Ryan Moore, registering his first domestic Classic victory. Trainer Ed Dunlop pondered his options for the winner, whose lack of big-race entries will mean some expensive decisions. "The natural thing is the G1 Irish Oaks [July 13], but we'll take her home and see how she is," Dunlop said. Aviate (GB) (Dansili {GB}), sent off the 7-2 favorite, traveled strongly in fifth early, but faded into seventh.

Pace Makes the Race...

GI Preakness S. runner-up **First Dude** (Stephen Got Even) may be the only speed in the race, but the lack of pace isn't going to change a thing about the game plan for the Nick Zito duo of GII Dwyer S. hero **Fly Down** (Mineshaft) and GI Kentucky Derby second **Ice Box** (Pulpit). Of the latter, the 3-1 morning-line choice, Zito said, "I don't want to do anything to compromise his style of running. I've seen that before, changing styles, and it never works. Never, never, never. I hope he gets in position where he can run his race; that's all we can hope for. And, basically, he and Fly Down are the same type of horse."

The Hall of Famer, going for his third Belmont S. victory, continued, "I guess everyone is going to pay attention to First Dude. He's got a good post [11], because he'll probably try and gallop out there. But I wouldn't change my horses' styles. I just hope my horses run the same way they have been."

Trainer Dale Romans wasn't committing his First Dude to the front end. "If someone wants to get out of their game and set down inside of us, we'll let him go and sit right off," Romans said. "This horse doesn't have to be on the lead." But, he added, "If they let him get three-quarters in 1:14 like Seattle Slew, he'll be tough to catch. I don't think there's anyone in there that wants to sacrifice themselves and go chase him."

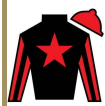

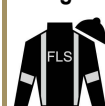

Accomplishment: Kulina, the vice president and general manager of Monmouth Park, worked with Dennis Drazin to create Monmouth Park's experimental 50-day, \$50-million Elite Summer Meet.

How did you first get involved in horseracing? I was a trainer's son--I never considered a career in anything else.

If you could change one thing about our sport, what would it be? I would say less days and a stronger product.

What was the biggest obstacle to making the Elite Meet at Monmouth a reality? Trying to convince people it would work--trying to sell the idea to everyone involved, not only the horsemen, but the people on my side, the track side, as well.

With the meet off to a strong start, have there been people who might have been against the idea who have come to you to congratulate you on its early success? A lot of the horsemen were leery, even some of the players were leery. But the people who had reservations have all been pretty pleased. I've had a couple of players call me to tell me they're happy we're doing this. Everyone has been pretty enthusiastic.

Who do you admire most in Thoroughbred racing? I admire the people on the backside--they have such a hard life. Most people in this game, unless they are really in touch with the backside, don't see how hard people work and how dedicated they are. They work 24-7--they are the heroes of the game.

Who is the best horse you've ever watched run in person? Kelso--period. There'll never be another horse like him.

What is your favorite meal? Any meal with family and friends, but I do usually have fish.

What is the best advice you've received? Tony Bardaro told me, "It only depends what side of the desk you're sitting on." He was a big-time trainer, and he still owns horses. He taught me that you have to understand the other guy's position before you can solve a problem.

What's the best restaurant around Monmouth Park? Buena Sera, in Red Bank.

What is your favorite vacation spot? Do racetrackers take vacations? Any place warmer with great golf courses. And my son is living in London, so we really enjoy going over there.

What's the best movie you've ever seen? "Butch Cassidy and the Sundance Kid."

What was the last concert you attended? Richard Thompson, but I'm a big Bruce fan.

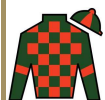

Trainer Aidan O'Brien added, "Jan Vermeer has loads of class, and he did not look like he was stopping over a mile and quarter last time. Johnny Murtagh has always liked this horse; he won very easily at the Curragh, and that is important. Midas Touch won the Derrinstown Stud Trial well on his first start of the season, and I am looking forward to seeing him run for the first time over a mile and a half. He stays well and won't mind going further than a mile and half in time. They have been travelling the world since they were babies, so I don't think that the atmosphere at Epsom will get to them, either. We all know that there is only one Epsom Derby a year, and it is all about the piece of timber."

Wild Times...

Godolphin's sole Derby winner came courtesy of Lammtarra in 1995, but the operation has a stronger hand than in recent times, headed by **Rewilding (GB)** (Tiger Hill {Ire}). Now with Mahmood Al Zarooni after his formative period under the auspices of Andre Fabre, the half-brother to Dar Re Mi (GB) (Singspiel {Ire}) has been progressive with a closing second in the Apr. 11 G2 Prix Noailles at Longchamp and smooth success in Goodwood's Listed Cockeyed Hat S. last time May 19. Troy (GB) was the last to follow up here after taking that prep--formerly known as the Predominate S.--but the team are confident of a bold show. "Rewilding was very impressive when he won at Goodwood and we think he ticks all the boxes," Racing Manager Simon Crisford said. "He has got a great temperament--he appears to be bomb-proof--and he definitely stays the mile and a half, and has plenty of class as well. The big thing with him is that he seems to be improving. He took his race at Goodwood really well. He handled the track and the undulations, so we are going to Epsom full of hope for a nice run." Also making up the royal blue train are 🏆 **"TDN Rising Star"** 🏆 **Al Zir** (Medaglia d'Oro) and **Buzzword (GB)** (Pivotal {GB}). While the latter is no back-number after an encouraging fourth in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains over Longchamp's mile May 16, Al Zir has the bonus of being partnered by three-time Derby-winning jockey Kieren Fallon. Third in the G1 Racing Post Trophy at Doncaster in September, he was reportedly compromised by the lack of a strong tempo when only ninth in the May 1 G1 2000 Guineas on his return at Newmarket. "Al Zir was a bit disappointing in the 2000 Guineas," Crisford added. "We went there thinking he had a chance, and Frankie felt that slow pace did not help him at all. Al Zir went okay, but it was not as good as we were hoping for. We did learn from the race that he definitely wants a longer trip. A mile and half might be too far, but a mile and quarter would definitely be his optimum trip right now, and he might stay a bit further."

Az Good As Any?

On the outskirts this year is Mohammed Al-Qatami and Khalid Al-Mudhaf's **Azmeel (GB)** (Azamour {Ire}), who has gone about his business in less flashy manner than some of his rivals here, but with a commendable attitude nonetheless. Runner-up to Chabal (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) when reportedly short in the Apr. 23 G3 Sandown Classic Trial, the John Gosden trainee went one better in Chester's G3 Dee S. last time May 7. "He's progressive and, on his first run, he blew up with a furlong to run and needed it," Gosden reflected. "I was very happy with his last run, as he got interfered with and was shuffled back before coming through and splitting horses. That kind of experience around Chester helps a horse to grow up and, mentally, he has come on since." Also booking his blue riband ticket at Chester's May Festival was **Ted Spread (GB)** (Beat Hollow {GB}), who fought hard to garner the May 6 G3 Chester Vase. Trainer Mark Tompkins said, "We went to Chester because of the ground and, once he won that, the Derby became a target. Hopefully, he won't disgrace himself. Ted Spread has plenty of ability and will come on four or five lengths for Chester."

One Bullet to Fire...

Henry Cecil has four renewals in the bag and though the longstanding patriarch of Newmarket has had plentiful representatives here, the latter part of his career has been marked by a more selective approach. His lone contender this time is **Bullet Train (GB)** (Sadler's Wells), who cut a dash when making virtually all the running in the May 8 G3 Lingfield Derby Trial. "Bullet Train is a horse who is improving," Cecil said of the Khalid Abdullah homebred. "He is very tough, gets the trip and I think he will act on the course. He does not do much at home, being laid-back and lazy. He is coming on race by race. I think he will definitely get a mile and half and, hopefully, with a bit of speed left at the end. He has been trained with the Derby in mind ever since he won at Lingfield. He will improve for that race and do himself justice. I would like him to have a handy position in the race--he does not mind being up there--and then he can work his way into it in the straight."

His Highness The Aga Khan's May 10 G3 Prix de Guiche winner Behkabad (Fr) (Cape Cross {Ire}) is in post 13. The owner/breeder's Racing Manager Georges Rimauld told *PA Sport*, "He was very good when he won at Chantilly last month, and he has been aimed at this race for quite some time now. He is stepping up in trip and we will have to see how that works out on the day. I'm not sure if it will help, but I don't think it will be a problem. It all depends how the race pans out and whether he's up near the front or whether we wait a little longer. There are quite a few horses in the race, so we'll just have to figure out what to do, but he should have a good chance. We are in stall 13 and I am happy with that. If we had been out wide in stall 23 that would have been a bit tricky, but he should be fine."

Windflower Overseas Holdings' **Elusive Pimpernel** (Elusive Quality) will miss Sunday's Classic due to an unspecified issue, connections announced yesterday. Owned by Cristina Patino, who was represented by G1 Oaks heroine Snow Fairy (Ire) (Intikhab), the G3 Craven S. winner and G1 2000 Guineas fifth was due to be ridden by Olivier Peslier. "All I can say right now is that he has suffered a minor setback," said Marcus Hosgood, trainer John Dunlop's racing secretary.

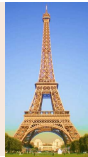

AN AMERICAN IN PARIS

A half moon still hung in the sky above the mist-shrouded Eiffel Tower as an Air France flight carrying seven members of the Runnymede Farm contingent swooped to land at Paris's Charles de Gaulle Airport moments after dawn on Friday.

Few in the group headed by farm patriarch Catesby W. Clay, whose green silks will be carried by **Dancing David (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) in Sunday's G1 Prix du Jockey-Club, got any sleep on the three-movie sky voyage from Cincinnati. But they quickly found themselves fueled by the rush that only a major race can produce in owners' veins, a

sensation further stoked as they engaged two drivers who had room for the Clay clan and its seemingly unending luggage in their vehicles.

"Are you here for the big race, the Jockey-Club?" one of the drivers asked before telling them he knew the winner.

"It's Planteur (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire})," the man insisted. It took him a moment or two to figure out that, while the only other colt by Dancing David's sire in the field is fancied in France since he defeated Godolphin's G1 Epsom Derby contender Rewilding (GB) (Tiger Hill {Ire}) in the G2 Prix Noailles in April, the tout was perhaps not the right one for this group.

"Who is your horse?" the driver asked in unwavering English while trying to spark a dialogue. He delighted the Clay contingent with a hearty, "Well then, I'll bet on both," when they informed him they were in France to witness the Runnymede-bred Dancing David's assault on Chantilly.

"We'll just cross our fingers and pray," the driver added, sparking a chorus of affirmations and laughter.

It would be hard to imagine European owners arriving for the G1 Belmont S. getting a greeting like that from a New York driver familiar with the form of the Classic entrants. But Parisians apparently are not too busy to keep up with one of their homeland's richest and most prestigious racing events, widely known as the French Derby, and which France Galop maintains, "is currently Europe's premier event for three-year-olds."

An easy half-hour drive north took the Clays to their hotel, a picturesque chateau nestled atop a hill in the Chantilly forest, and their pace quickened as news developments in the French Derby reached them via cell phone and the Internet.

First, they learned that France Galop had opted not to enforce its safety limit on field size to 20 and would allow 23 runners to compete in the storied Classic--first run in 1836 when a colt known simply as Frank won the trophy. The decision caused ripples of controversy, with trainer Pascal Bary, who has saddled the winners of five editions of the race, as well as this year's \$10 million G1 Dubai World Cup, saying he was "not happy," since he had had a runner excluded from the French Derby two years ago under the safety rule.

The less-than-ideal pre-race news continued with the fact that Dancing David, while No. 8 for betting purposes with the Pari-Mutuel Urbain, would be starting from "corde" 21.

"He's a quick and agile horse, so he can break and get a good position early," said Joe Clay, the eldest of the eight Clay children, as he searched for a positive twist in that scenario.

"We'll see. Big Brown won from post 20," noted his younger brother Brutus, while drawing comparisons with the G1 Kentucky Derby, which is comparable in distance to the French Derby's 2,100 meters (about 1 5/16 miles).

"But Sidney's Candy didn't," he added on a more somber note.

However, the prevailing mood changed when word came that Elusive Pimpernel (Elusive Quality), one of the leading candidates for the race, was withdrawn after suffering a minor setback.

"He was the main horse we were worried about," said Runnymede Vice President and General Manager Martin O'Dowd. Trained by John Dunlop, Elusive Pimpernel had twice finished ahead of Dancing David, once in the G1 Racing Post Trophy won by St Nicholas Abbey (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) last fall, where Elusive Pimpernel was second and Dancing David fourth, and again in G3 Craven S. in April when Elusive Pimpernel won and Dancing David was second.

Despite jet lag, some in the burgeoning group--twin sisters Kitty and Amelia, the youngest of the Clays' children, arrived on flights from New York and San Francisco, and their sister Mary Biz and her husband David Blee jetted in from Washington, D.C.--boldly struck out to find their own adventures on the perfect spring day in France.

Since most hotel rooms were not ready until after noon, passionate bicyclists Brutus and Chris (Catesby Jr.), mustered enough energy to pedal off across the countryside. Brutus headed to Chantilly Racecourse for a view of where Dancing David will be running for glory, the nearby Chateau de Chantilly and the Grand Stables of the Princes of Conde that now house the Living Museum of the Horse.

Father Chris, still wearing his priestly attire of black pants and shirt with clerical collar, wheeled out to find the nearest Catholic churches. It seemed not so long ago, the brothers recalled, that they had biked together on a trek across the stunning chateau

country of France's Loire River valley and also across parts of Ireland.

After completing about 15 miles to and from Chantilly and taking photos on his iPhone of the incomparable grounds and brilliant orange wildflowers he saw along the way, Brutus seemed more revitalized than fatigued.

"It's beautiful, and all the sweeter when you have anticipation of getting there on the bike," he said. "The racecourse is the most breathtaking thing, with the chateau sitting beside it."

With Dancing David still traveling on the long journey by lorry and ferry from his stable at Manton training center in England, the Clays prepared to whisk into the heart of Paris for dinner at a bistro founded in 1923, the year Catesby Clay was born.

The whole experience, no matter the outcome of the race, is "the pinnacle" of Runnymede's evolution over the past quarter century under the direction of Clay and O'Dowd, said Joe Clay, who has an interest in several broodmares and who maintains many connections in Europe following his stint at the Irish National Stud's educational program.

"This is a once in a lifetime occasion," he said.

Fame and Glory, fresh off the back of a seven-length success in The Curragh's G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup just 12 days ago, returned to the Downs to win this illustrious prize 12 months after losing out only to Sea the Stars (Ire) in the Derby. That tartar was in the way again in the G1 Irish Champion S. at Leopardstown in September after the Ballydoyle runner had annexed the G1 Irish Derby in his absence at The Curragh in late June. Now that the Tsuis' giant is tucked away at Gilttown Stud, Fame and Glory has come to the fore, and his commanding wins at The Curragh in the May 3 G3 Mooresbridge S. and in the Tattersalls last time indicate that he is ready to enjoy star billing. "I like the way he knuckled down in the last furlong and did it the hard way. When Sariska came to me, she put up a good battle, but there was only going to be one winner--he's a real champion." A multiple group winner in his native Brazil, Alcomo came to the U.S. last season. Amen Hallelujah faltered in the nine-furlong Apr. 30 GI Kentucky Oaks most recently after finishing second in the Mar. 20 GII Bonnie Miss at the same distance, but could not have been much more impressive last time at this trip in the GII Davona Dale S. at Gulfstream Feb. 27. The Rick Dutrow Jr.-trained filly pressed Bickersons (Silver Deputy), who was coming off an ultra-impressive seven length romp in the GII Forward Gal S., disposed of that rival at the quarter pole and opened up to score by 6 1/4. Michael Iavarone, president and director of majority owner IEAH Stables, said, "I think the mile and an eighth is just a little beyond her reach. All things considered, I thought she ran well in the Bonnie Miss, and we thought she deserved another shot at the distance. In the Oaks, we changed strategy on her a little bit and tried to get her to rate more off the pace, which kind of backfired. She was rank early and took a lot of dirt in her face."

Runner-up and fellow Acorn foe **Buckleupbuttercup** took the GIII Eight Belles S. in the slop by 6 1/4 emphatic lengths on the Kentucky Derby undercard, third place finisher Dynazaper (Ghostzapper) won the Edgewood S. in Louisville Apr. 29, seventh-place Funny Feeling (Distorted Humor) took an optional claimer en route to a stakes score at Monmouth, and last-place Hilda's Passion (Canadian Frontier) was the comfortable victress of an Arlington Park allowance race in her subsequent start. "She's a very athletic, quality filly--inexperienced, but sometimes quality overcomes that," said conditioner Jimmy Toner of Much Rejoicing. **Seeking the Title's** last can be ignored; she lost rider Kent Desormeaux after another horse went down in front of her in the May 14 GII Black-Eyed Susan S. The promise she showed prior to that makes her intriguing from off the pace. After a late-closing fifth in a sprint on debut at Fair Grounds in January, the Charles Fipke homebred won by 6 1/2 lengths when stretched out to a mile and 40 yards for her next try. She then moved right into stakes company, and dead-heated for third behind **Quiet Temper** and **Champagne d'Oro** in the GII Fair Grounds Oaks May 14.

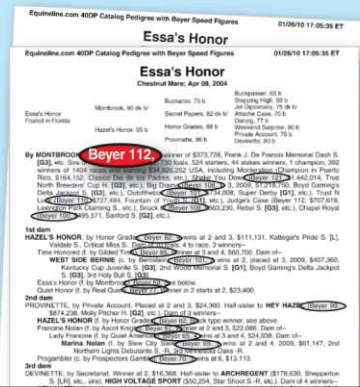

Hall of Fame conditioner Neil Drysdale shows his confidence in **Scintillo** by running him right back. The globe-trotting five-year-old was vanned off after finishing fourth as the 2-1 favorite in his stateside debut in the Jim Murray. He is a Group 1 winner in Italy, Group 2 winner in France and Group 3 winner in Great Britain.

Paul Pompa Jr.'s colorbearer seeks to rebound from a disappointing fourth as the heavy chalk in the GIII Withers S. Apr. 24. "He's coming into this race good, and I don't know how to explain his last race," trainer Rick Dutrow Jr commented. "I didn't change anything with his training--he's been training good."

Discreetly Mine, most recently 13th in the Derby, was second to D' Funnybone over track and trip in last September's GII Futurity S.

Bribon was a disappointing fifth last out in the GIII Westchester S. Apr. 30 in his second start for trainer Todd Pletcher and owner Derrick Smith. A runner-up in the Barbados Gold Cup at nine furlongs on turf in March, the 2009 GI Met Mile winner was not allowed to defend his title this past Memorial Day, but any speculation that the decision was made in an effort to avoid the Pletcher barn's star, Quality Road (Elusive Quality), was quelled by assistant trainer Jonathan Thomas. "Quality Road running had nothing to do with the decision not to run in the Met," said Thomas. "It was basically based on the Westchester. He trained very well for the Westchester, but the performance was disappointing. But the horse never showed any hint of going off form. The horse is training great." This will be Bribon's first start in the U.S. at any distance other than a mile since October 2008.

Custom for Carlos could prove extremely tough on or near the pace. The four-year-old Eddie Kenneally trainee is only a neck and a nose from being a perfect five-for-five--all in six furlong stakes races--in his last five starts. The three-time Grade III winner is 7-5-2-0 overall at this distance. He was last seen taking the Apr. 9 GIII Count Fleet H. at Oaklawn after losing ground on the turn and being forced to turn it on late to get up over speedy Chief of Affairs (Yonaguska) by a neck. A pair of California invaders, **Fantasy Free** and **Gato Go Win**, will try to transfer their sharp form to the conventional dirt. Fantasy Free was claimed for \$22,500 by conditioner A.C. Avila in December, and has certainly flattered his trainer's acumen. He took the \$150,000 Tiznow S. for Cal-breds Apr. 24 in his sixth start for his new connections. While Avila is winless in two New York tries in the past five seasons and the gelding has never tried dirt, co-owner Roddy Valente has enjoyed East Coast success. His Bustin Stones (City Zip) won the 2008 GI Carter H. at Aqueduct. Gato Go Win was off the board following slow starts in dirt tries last year, but trainer Robert Troeger has not abandoned the hope that his charge, who was only a nose short in second in the GII Portrero Grande H. Apr. 3, will take to a traditional main track. "We want to see if he'll handle dirt," said Troeger. "He's run two big races this year. He ran a big second to Ventana (Toccet). We always wanted to try him back there in New York."

OAK TREE MEET ON THE MOVE? According to *Thoroughbred Times*, MI Developments CEO Dennis Mills has informed Sherwood Chillingworth that he should start making alternate plans for the site of the 2010 Oak Tree meeting. Mills explained that a decision on whether or not to try and come to terms on a new lease with Oak Tree would not be made until MID Chairman Frank Stronach spoke to the California Horse Racing Board at their June 22 meeting. "I told Chilly he could start working on Plan B or Plan C," Mills told *Thoroughbred Times*. "I guess Plan B would be doing to Hollywood Park, and Plan C would be going to Del Mar." Chillingworth confirmed the conversation with Mills. He reported that Oak Tree officials have not made any firm plans as to where to hold their meet, but told the publication, "Dennis told us to go ahead with our other plans, and that's what we are doing. We're singing the same song." Both Hollywood Park and Del Mar have offered their facilities as possible alternatives. The Oak Tree meet is set for Sept. 29-Oct. 31.

Q & A WITH THE BREEDERS' CUP CANDIDATES



On May 24, Breeders' Cup announced the 28 candidates who will stand for election to the Breeders' Cup Board of Members and Trustees. There are 13 openings on the Board. Voting begins June 8 and closes June 22 at 5 p.m. The bios of the 28 candidates are available in documents circulated to the voters--Breeders' Cup foal and stallion nominators--and the *TDN* once again will provide additional information on the candidates' viewpoints. To that end, we posed the following question to each of the candidates, and have given them 400 words or fewer in which to respond.

What do you think is the biggest issue facing the Breeders' Cup today and, if voted to the Breeders' Cup board, how would you propose this issue be solved?

Roy Jackson:

The biggest issue will be to find new ways to grow Breeders' Cup's fan base and to generate new revenue.

I was lucky to be involved in Minor League Professional Baseball as it grew its base. Many of today's promotions in the Major Leagues (cap day, etc) were developed in Minor League parks. The first mascot, the famous 'San Diego Chicken,' appeared while San Diego was still a AAA club. The designated hitter was first used in the Minor Leagues. Some things didn't work, but many are still with us today. The important thing is that innovative ideas were tried, which are largely responsible for the success of Minor League Baseball today. We must do the same!



Roy Jackson

What can we do?

- 1) Better promote the horses and personalities surrounding them.
- 2) Improve TV coverage. The public loves the horse--place more emphasis on the individual horses.
- 3) Fine tune in the U.S. and Europe a series of races leading to the Breeders' Cup that will keep up interest between the Triple Crown and the Breeders' Cup.
- 4) Creative use of the internet. My grandchildren and their friends, as well as children from around the world, take part in a website where they create their own stable, buying and selling horses. Certainly, creative minds can come up with a site or game to promote the Breeders' Cup.
- 5) Look at innovative ways to engage the betting public. Can there be novel bets offered that would include betting on the winner of races leading up to the Classic, plus the Classic itself?

6) Raise purses, if financially possible. We are kidding ourselves if we do not think there will not be challenges from other parts of the world to the Breeders' Cup World Championships. We must do everything we can to attract the world's best horses.

7) Explore creative ideas on race days, such as Friday 'Ladies Day' at the Breeders' Cup, including a fashion show throughout the grandstand and women presenting trophies. Look into perfume or cosmetic companies sponsoring a race. Offer a luncheon with organic foods, salads, fruits, seafood and artisan breads.

It has been an honor and privilege to serve on the Board and as a Director the past two years. I look forward to sharing my marketing and promotional experience, if I should be reelected, as the Breeders' Cup leads Thoroughbred racing to bigger and better times.

John T.L. Jones III:

Looking at the world in terms of opportunities instead of "issues," there are two areas of development that have already been much discussed at the Board level that I would like to see immediately implemented in some form. With fiscal prudence in mind, I would push forward on the following "issues:"

First, creation of a series of six to seven multi-divisional multi regional championship days between the Kentucky Derby and Breeders' Cup, using the current pattern race schedule with slight modification. Therefore Breeders' Cup could create a narrative of the "Road to the Breeders' Cup," implementing a point system with bonuses for the divisional leaders. I believe all of this could be paid for through control and participation in the tote on these championship days. I believe we have the resources to buy and market our way into this control and/or participation in these big day events.

John T.L. Jones III cont.

Second, I believe we need to change the nomination model for the Breeders' Cup World Championship Day, so that we are truly a World Championship. The objective is to end the large late nomination fee impediment. I believe we can do this by ending the foal nomination requirement and going to a stallions-only requirement world-wide, with a staggered system for non-U.S. stallions depending on country of origin. This may, in fact, result in increased total nomination fees. There are a number of large internationally located and internationally minded stallion owners in each country, some already heavily involved with Breeders' Cup, who could play pied piper in each local to make this work. They could also provide the initial non-U.S. stallion nomination fee participation, which might mitigate the financial risk of the no foal nomination model. This aspect is very important, for it could represent our opportunity to break in to large gambling markets such as Japan, Australia and Hong Kong (stallion participation equals racing participation), which could possibly double our take-out from the championship days in short order.

I believe these aspirations are attainable if we are focused. I believe Breeders' Cup has limited resources and can be the answer to a very small list of the industries problems. We will answer none of its problems if our list of objectives grows too large. By promoting the ideas I have described, I believe the Breeders' Cup can take back horse racing's former lofty position on the national and international sports scene.

The Copa Bullrich Yearling Sale, typically held in May, will get underway Sunday at San Isidro in Buenos Aires, Argentina. The premier auction was delayed due to an EVA outbreak in the region last month. Last year's

sale saw an Argentine record for a yearling at public auction when Noorvik (Arg) (Hennessy--Floridana, by Woodman) sold for 510,000 pesos (US\$137,134) to veterinarian Adam Driver, on behalf of Dubai interests. That chestnut colt was offered by Haras La

Mission, as agent. Among the recent graduates of the auction is **Interaction (Arg)** (Easing Along), who sold in 2008 before going on to become Argentina's Horse of the Year.

A total of 341 youngsters have been catalogued for this year's five-day sale, and all of them will be eligible for the Copa Bullrich race series as juveniles. Fillies will have the Copa Bullrich at 1400 meters, and there are two races open to all juveniles, the 1000-meter Copa Bullrich Sprint and the 1400-meter Copa Roberto J. Bullrich. Among the sires represented in the catalogue are Kentucky shuttlers Distorted Humor, King's Best, Malibu Moon, Mutakddim, Pure Prize and Tiznow, as well as local standouts Not for Sale (Arg) and Southern Halo. Sunday's opening session will feature lots 1-78. Lots 79-160 will be offered Monday, and Tuesday will see lots 161-234 go under the hammer. There will be no selling Wednesday, but the action will turn to lots 235-292 Thursday, June 10. The fifth and final session will be June 15 with lots 293-341. BOB GREENBAUM DIES AT 65 Bob Greenbaum, owner of the Thoroughbred Advisory Group, passed away Thursday night after a lengthy battle with Hepatitis C at Jackson Memorial Hospital in Miami, Florida. He was 65. Greenbaum received a blood transfusion tainted with Hepatitis C in his 20's while being treated for Crohn's Disease. He also received two subsequent liver transplants. Among Greenbaum's client roster was the prominent Ben Sangster. "Love him or hate him, he was one of those characters who make our Industry so colorful," said long-time friend and colleague Ted Burnett of Josham Farms Limited, breeder of Wonder Where S. heroine Tasty Temptation (Medaglia d'Oro). "I've known him since he first wandered into Keeneland in 1978, and was wondering what this horse business was all about." According to Burnett, Greenbaum ventured to Keeneland in the late 70s in pursuit of a more exciting career after leaving his position as a Pension Planner with Texas Instruments in Boston, Massachusetts. He had already owned a partial interest in a couple of horses, and was curious to get a closer look at the sale's scene. After one visit, he was hooked and began working in the bloodstock industry in Miami shortly thereafter. A Bronx native, burial will take place in his native New York. Arrangements are forthcoming. Greenbaum was single.

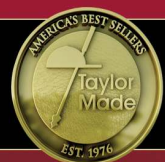

The action was based upon a judgment entered from the Superior Court of the State of California concerning acts of cruelty committed to a horse in December 2009. All three were fined and sentenced to six months in jail. Ogden Mills Phipps, the chairman of The Jockey Club, said, "The Jockey Club fully supports and assists law enforcement agencies, the courts and racing regulatory authorities in the investigation of matters involving cruelty to Thoroughbreds. When there is a final determination by a court, an official tribunal or an official racing body that a person has killed, abandoned, mistreated, neglected or abused, or otherwise committed an act of cruelty to a horse, The Jockey Club will not hesitate to take appropriate action under Rule 19."

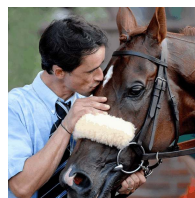
