

**SWITCH TURNS IT ON IN HOLLYWOOD OAKS**

In Hollywood Park's paddock prior to yesterday's GII Hollywood Oaks, trainer John Sadler offered Martin Garcia a very detailed explanation of exactly how he wanted the jockey to ride the sophomore filly **Switch** (Quiet American), thus giving her the best chance to dethrone GI Kentucky Oaks heroine **Blind Luck** (Pollard's Vision). In the end, there was no need for verbosity, as Garcia, who was replacing the absent Joel Rosario, provided her with

a perfectly-timed ride to hand the four-time Grade I winner her first defeat since March. Content to track pedestrian opening splits of :25.30, :50.11 and 1:14.50, the bay swung three wide turning for home, powered clear and had enough left to stave off the oncoming favorite. "It's a good thing that my filly decided to relax," admitted Garcia. "Earlier in the race, she was a little bit rank. As soon as she relaxed, I knew I wouldn't have any problems. She was in a great position to get the jump on [Blind Luck]. When I asked her to go she just took off." **Cont. p3**

**VEGA BABY!**

Gestut Ammerland's **"TDN Rising Star"** **Lope de Vega (Ire)** (Shamardal) made a mockery of yesterday's G1 Prix du Jockey-Club at Chantilly. Emulating his sire, he completed a momentous Classic double, having annexed the May 16 G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains at Longchamp. The homebred was last to load into his wide stall in 20,

then was quickly out and had only the rabbit **Vivre Libre (GB)** (Sadler's Wells) in front until taking control traveling with ease at the top of the stretch. Putting lengths between him and his closest pursuer **Planteur (Ire)** (Daneshill Dancer {Ire}) soon after, the 10-1 shot was mainly

hand-ridden by Maxime Guyon from there to record a facile three-length success. "That was an amazing performance from that draw," owner Dietrich von Boetticher said. "Hurricane Run (Ire) lost out by very little to Shamardal in this race in 2005, so Shamardal has paid us back today. Lope de Vega looked to have the world at his feet when registering easy wins at Deauville in August and at Longchamp the following month, but his reputation was somewhat deflated after he finished fourth in the G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere back on the Bois de Boulogne on Arc day.

On his return in the course-and-distance Poulains trial, the Apr. 25 G3 Prix de Fontainebleau, he was a half-length third, and entered the mile Classic with the disadvantage of a high post position. Despite that drawback, he swooped impressively from rear to relegate G1 2000 Guineas runner-up **Dick Turpin (Ire) (Arakan)** in that spot again without being fully stressed. The chestnut was again the victim of cruel fate regarding the draw here, but he was forwardly placed this time by **Maxime Guyon** and settled into a fluent rhythm on the tail of **Planteur's** pacemaker. Left in front more than three furlongs from home, **Lope de Vega** was never in any danger as he turned his stretch-run into a procession. "He was a little bit nervous before the race, but is very strong in his mind and has a lot of speed," **Maxime Guyon** said. "I always felt comfortable during the race and, when I quickened turning into the straight, he kept running on strongly--he is an amazing horse." **Cape Blanco**, who had beaten Saturday's G1 Epsom Derby hero **Workforce (GB) (King's Best)** in the May 13 G2 **Dante S.**, was sent off the 3-1 favorite on the strength of that performance, but never looked likely to figure and trailed in a disappointing 10th. **Click for the [Racing Post chart](#) or the [free brisnet.com catalogue-style pedigree](#).**

### *Back to a Mile for Lope?*

**Lope de Vega** may be dropping back in trip rather than going on to the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, according to trainer **Andre Fabre**. "I had a doubt about him staying--he is from a Machiavellian family, so there was a question mark there," **Fabre** said. "I am tempted to drop him back to a mile for the G1 Prix Jacques le Marois [at Deauville Aug. 15]. Horses are bred for a certain distance and they get wiser as they get older, as we do--sometimes--so they don't acquire stamina; the distance is in their genes. He is an excitable kind of horse, so I don't want to travel him too far, but if he stays in training as a four-year-old--and there is a strong possibility that he will--he could then possibly have a race in England."

**No Excuses...**

Connections of the vanquished were quick to accept they had been put in their place by the impressive winner, but a few were left with minor regrets. Planteur's trainer Elie Lellouche said of the runner-up, "He has run his race, but was beaten by a better horse on the day. My jockey said he was a little too fresh, and I know it was my plan, but he hadn't run since early April and maybe he would have been better off with a second run in between." Pascal Bary said of seventh-placed Ice Blue (GB) (Dansili {GB}), "He got all worked up beforehand and was very nervous. Ryan [Moore] said he never relaxed going down to the start and was always doing too much in the race, so he didn't run his race." Cape Blanco and Viscount Nelson (Giant's Causeway) failed to make the frame for Ballydoyle. Aidan O'Brien told *PA Sport*, "I didn't really see what happened during the race, but Johnny [Murtagh] said he and Colm [O'Donoghue, on Viscount Nelson] were matching strides early on and, when they turned in, Colm went to the inner and Johnny to the outer. Cape Blanco loves fast ground, but Johnny said he didn't pick up on the ground out there, so I don't really know what happened."

Switch kicked off her career with a two-length victory sprinting over Hollywood's Cushion Track last December. Third behind Amen Hallelujah (Montbrook) in her 2010 debut in Santa Anita's GII Santa Ynez S. Jan. 16, the filly filled that same position behind Blind Luck after setting the early pace in the one-mile GI Las Virgenes S. Feb. 13. Fourth when stretching to nine panels in Gulfstream's GII Bonnie Miss S. Mar. 20, Switch came from off the pace to finish only a half length behind winner Tanda (Sweetsouthernstain) in the seven-furlong GIII Railbird S. May 9. "We've always wanted to get her off [the pace] and that's why we dropped her back for the Railbird," said John Sadler, explaining the change in tactics for her latest start. "She found herself a couple of times at Santa Anita on easy leads, but I really wanted to get her off the pace a little bit." In regard to his filly tracking a very slow early pace this time, Sadler added, "This filly is tactical, so we knew she could get a really good position. I looked up at the board and saw :25 and :50, and thought, that's really strange. I didn't expect that slow of fractions. 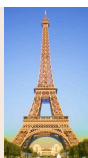

## AN AMERICAN IN PARIS

If anyone asked Runnymede Farm Chairman Catesby W. Clay and his family what they felt after their homebred **Dancing David** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) finished ninth in

ing together as a family--with seven Clay children accompanying their father and mother, Elizabeth 'Biz' Clay--was an experience like nothing they had ever previously shared.

After going to the winner's circle to applaud impressive winner Lope de Vega (Shamardal) and sipping champagne in an exclusive club room overlooking the racecourse, the Clays had no thoughts of disappointment. They were too busy celebrating how their colt had taken them all the way to the top of the European classic season--and beaten most of the 22-horse field, including Ballydoyle's favored Cape Blanco (Galileo {Ire}).

The chart revealed Dancing David finished about 6 3/4 lengths behind Lope de Vega, the only Group 1 winner in the race who had earlier captured the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains.

"It's a beautiful moment," said the Clays' son, Roman Catholic priest Father Chris Clay, before praising his father for persevering over 60 years as the master of Runnymede, Kentucky's oldest Thoroughbred nursery that has taken bold steps as a relatively modest commercial breeder to compete in the international arenas of breeding and racing.

"To come to the French Derby is sort of a capstone, to have a horse in the race is a celebration," Father Chris continued during a festive post-race dinner for 17 that featured champagne toasts and suggestions for news headlines about their quest.

Sunday's G1 Prix du Jockey-Club following their whirlwind weekend in Chantilly, France, they would have a quick and heartfelt answer.

Competing in the French Derby with a horse they raised while com-

"C'est la vie in Chantilly," offered David Blee, Runnymede vice president and husband of the Clays' daughter Mary Biz Clay, drawing applause and laughter from the crowd that included trainer Ken McPeek, who was visiting Chantilly, and three France Galop media and public relations officials.

As impromptu music and dancing broke out, one of the France Galop representatives, Capucine Houel, exclaimed while twirling with the Clays' eldest son Joe: "La famille Clay is the crème de Chantilly!"

"Horses bring people together," trainer Brian Meehan had observed before the race while joining the Clays for lunch in one of the two racecourse dining rooms that featured such splendid fare as king crab with passion fruit, avocados and mangoes, roasted lamb with wild asparagus and, in true French style, more champagne.

The Clays began their day with a special Mass led by Father Chris at the Notre Dame church in the village of Chantilly, which lies within walking distance of the racecourse.

"It was very special," said Mary Biz Clay, relating that Father Chris's homily drew a parallel between horses, and how they give their all in racing as inspirations for people in everyday life.

Gathering at the racecourse shortly afterward, the family made visiting Dancing David in the stable area their first priority.

"You're a bold rascal," Catesby Clay said with affection as the colt nipped playfully at him through the bars of his stall.

With everyone pumped up by the euphoria, the Clays said they regretted that two members of the immediate family could not be with them. Son Johnson Camden Clay "is a very recent papa," Clay said and thus stayed with his wife, Britteni, and the newborn Johnson Camden Clay II even while "following our every footstep in Paris."

Runnymede President Brutus Clay could not help but miss his wife, Sarah, with whom he had very recently celebrated a 10th anniversary in Paris, which cut the sting somewhat but not entirely. "It's just killing me that my wife can't be here to enjoy how wonderful this trip has turned out to be," Brutus Clay said.

As the French Derby, which carried a purse of €1,500,000 approached, the Clays went back to the barn area to observe Dancing David as he was tacked up and sent out to meet jockey Martin Dwyer. The

remarkable gravity of the occasion became clear as none other than Dubai Ruler Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum stood within 10 yards of their colt's stall, accompanied by some close associates. John Magnier of Coolmore also stood nearby.

"You are a part of history," bloodstock agent Robert Nataf of *Horse France* told Runnymede Vice President and General Manager Martin O'Dowd as they passed in the churning crowd on the way to the paddock. The

size of the French Derby field--22 runners after the scratch of Godolphin's Simon de Montfort (Ire) (King's Best)--was the largest since 1942.

Dancing David's jockey Martin Dwyer got held up among the mass of people on the way to the paddock, but told the Runnymede team that "we are blessed" to have such a colt to race in such an event. Meehan boosted him aboard Dancing David and the colt jiggled with energy as he headed to the course.

After handling most of the post parade calmly, Dancing David exploded in a half-rear, lunging into an enthusiastic gallop for the pre-race warm-up. Anything seemed possible.

Then, in what seemed to be only seconds, the entire race was over. Dwyer masterfully got Dancing David out of post 21, and like Lope de Vega from post 20, cut over to the inside, gaining a great position--and also a six-day suspension slapped on him by the stewards for interference.

"From where I was, I had no choice," Dwyer told Clay after joining the party after the race.

Dancing David stalked the pacesetter Vivre Libre (Sadler's Wells), ranging up to fifth and within clear striking distance as the field rounded the far turn with the Chateau de Chantilly behind them. But the colt could make no further progress and eventually dropped back four places.

Meehan and the Clays were undaunted, with the trainer declaring "He's definitely a Group 1 horse."

"Brian has made this a great ride for us," said O'Dowd. "He's done a wonderful job with the horse and he is a great communicator--he's made racing fun. This is what it's all about. We have truly enjoyed to the maximum our European experience.

"He ran a good, honest race, and what more can you hope for?" asked O'Dowd. "And we had a blast."

With the race in the history books and Meehan and Dancing David on their way back to Manton training center in England, the Clays packed their bags, with some heading back to the United States and others to Lourdes, France, to visit the site known for healing and miracles.

O'Dowd headed to England, where he will devote today to evaluating Dancing David's yearling half-brother by Oasis Dream (GB) (Green Desert), who is boarded at Watership Down Stud after being raised previously at the stud's Irish satellite, Kiltinan Castle.

"I'm meeting with (Watership Down General Manager) Simon Marsh and a decision will be made on where he will sell, but it will be somewhere in Europe," O'Dowd said.

Thus, the cycle of dreams that Dancing David has epitomized in his saga with the Clays will start all over again, with the promise of the future always fueling the fire that keeps racing alive.

With trainer Bruno Grizzetti last term, Joanna was precocious enough to win the Listed Premio Vittorio Crespi over six furlongs of the San Siro circuit in June before going on to annex the G3 Prix du Calvados over an extra panel at Deauville in August. Third behind Rosanara (Fr) (Sinndar {Ire}) in Longchamp's G1 Prix Marcel Boussac over a mile on Arc day, the bay was sent to Jean-Claude Rouget, and returned to best the subsequent G3 Premio Regina Elena (Italian 1000 Guineas) winner Evading Tempete (GB) (Dubai Destination) and Special Duty (GB) (Hennessy) in the G3 Prix Imprudence over Maisons-Laffitte's flat seven Apr. 8. After a bold show in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches at Longchamp last time May 16, she faded in the dying strides to finish fourth--before being promoted to third--but connections decided to stick to that trip here. The filly raced with enthusiasm in the hands of Christophe Soumillon in third early, and her rider had time to check over both shoulders inside the final quarter mile. Allowing G2 German 1000 Guineas winner Kali first run, she quickly inhaled that rival passing the furlong marker and had the race wrapped up in a matter of strides. "She won very well and deserved that," the owner's Racing Manager Angus Gold said. "Although she obviously stayed the mile...[Soumillon] said he feels she has a lot of speed, and so maybe we will run her over a shorter trip. We might consider the G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest [at Deauville Aug. 8] over six-and-a-half furlongs rather than the [Aug. 1] G1 Prix Rothschild over a mile, but the decision will be made after consultation with Sheikh Hamdan." Stepping up from handicap company to garner last term's Listed Braveheart S. at Hamilton, Allied Powers brought the curtain down on last season with a seventh in the Oct. 17 G1 Canadian International S. at Woodbine, and came back this semester with a 12th in the G3 John Porter S. at Newbury Apr. 17. He earned a personal best in the May 6 G3 Prix d'Hedouville at Longchamp last time, and surpassed that effort with another landmark performance in this presti-

gious event. Settled last of the five runners after a swift exit, he came under pressure rounding the home turn and stayed on strongly under stretch-long coaxing to claim an ultimately cozy success nearing the line. "Allied Powers is a good, genuine horse who knows how to quicken and stays very well," confirmed rider Ioritz Mendizabal. "This win confirmed his quality following his win in the Hedouville." **SHARP OPENER TO MM YEARLING SALE** The opening session of the Magic Millions National Yearling Sale, held at the Gold Coast Sunday, showed impressive gains over 2009, with the average of A\$32,167 up 42.3 percent, and the gross of A\$5,111,000 million doubling from last year (A\$1 = US\$0.823350). The clearance rate was 73.3 percent, a slight improvement on the '09 opener. Officials were understandably pleased with the results. "It is great to see the figures rise so much for the gross and average, and it is pleasing to see the clearance rate higher than day one last year," said Magic Millions Managing Director David Chester. "Last year, our second session was extremely strong as buyers realised the value that was on offer, so hopefully we can continue the momentum." Chester credited robust international interest with the gains. "We have got a record international buying bench on hand-- dozens of trainers from Hong Kong and Singapore, for example, and buyers from New Zealand, Ireland, Korea, Libya, Iran and the Philippines," he said. The top six lots went to overseas interests, and there were 12 lots over A\$100,000 Sunday, a record for a single session at the National Sale. The session was topped by a son of Fastnet Rock (Aus), who went to Hong Kong based Richard Hui for A\$400,000. The bay, consigned by Henry Field's Newgate Farm, agent, is a half to recent listed winner The Mikado (Aus) (Daneshill Dancer {Ire}) and to Brilliant Chapter (Aus) (Commands {Aus}), multiple stakes placed in Hong Kong. This marked the debut consignment for Newgate Farm, located in Scone. Chris McAnulty, son of bloodstock agent Rob McAnulty, signed the ticket on behalf of Hui. McAnulty indicated the colt would remain in Australia for his racing career. "He'll head down to [trainer] Mark Kavanagh," he remarked, adding, "He's a big, strong sprinting type who hopefully might be able to come up here to Queensland at this time next year." The second session of the sale starts at 11a.m. today, with the final session set to begin the same time Tuesday.



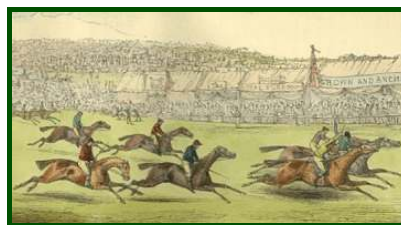

### Eclipsing the Stars...

**Workforce (GB)** (King's Best) was yesterday given a higher rating by the British Horseracing Authority's official handicappers than Sea the Stars (Ire) achieved when winning his Epsom Derby 12 months ago. His seven-length success has been transmitted into a mark of 128 pounds, four clear of the Tsui Family's star performer at the same stage of his career. "I have discussed the race with my colleague Chris Nash and, independently, we have come up the same figure, so we are pretty pleased with that," the BHA's Senior Handicapper Phil Smith explained. "We have used Rewilding (GB) (Tiger Hill {Ire}) as our marker. We've got him running to 115, and At First Sight (Ire) (Galileo (Ire) therefore is 116. We thought the winner won easily enough, but instead of calling it seven lengths, we have called it eight. We work on 1 1/2 pounds per length over a mile and a half, so he comes out a 12 pounds better horse than At First Sight, which puts him on 128. That's very high for a Derby-winning performance. We've had Derby winners eventually get higher than that, obviously Sea the Stars last year--we put him on 124, and it was his Eclipse and Irish Champion S. performances that saw him go higher. We had Authorized (Ire) on 127 after he won it, and [Workforce] was a lot more impressive than Authorized. My only little consideration is I suspect he will always be at his best when coming off a fast pace. I think the way the race was run was perfectly set up for him to show how good he was."

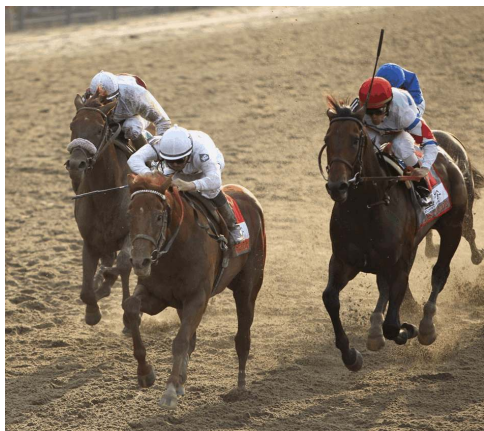

come out of the race in good order and could face-off again later this summer in the GI Travers S. at Saratoga Aug. 28.

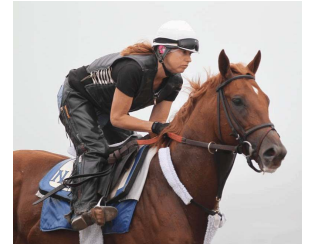
Hall of Fame trainer Bill Mott was still beaming Sunday morning after collecting his first win in a Triple Crown event. According to Mott, the chestnut was equally luminescent. "He's still shiny," said Mott.

"We'd like to think, come Saratoga time, at the end of the meet, they run the Travers, and that maybe he'd have an opportunity to run in there. That's what I'm hoping."

Mott, who also teamed up with fellow Hall of Famer Mike Smith to take the G1 Just a Game S. with ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ Proviso (GB) (Dansili {GB}) earlier on the card, absolved his first-call rider, Kent Desormeaux--who lost the mount on Drosselmeyer prior to the race--of any blame for his previous rides on the WinStar colt. "I don't think Kent really did anything wrong on this horse," explained Mott. "Some things were not developing or opening up the way we'd like them to, or he wanted it to, but it was through no fault of his." Richard Pell's Fly Down, who beat Drosselmeyer by six lengths in the pair's Belmont prep--the May 8 GII Dwyer--will try to gain the advantage over his rival in the "Midsummer Derby." Nick Zito added, "Fly Down ran a great race. Obviously a lot of people give Mike Smith credit--rightfully so--because he kept him in. [Fly Down] couldn't get clear until the very end, and you saw what he did in the lane. It was remarkable how he got second. As soon as he got clear, he beat First Dude, again--Terrific horse."

Zito's other Belmont runner, 9-5 favorite Ice Box (Pulpit), who was coming off of a closing second in the May 1 GI Kentucky Derby, displaced his palette and finished ninth (moved up to eighth when Uptowncharly-brown was disqualified).

"I'd like to go straight to the [GI] Haskell [at Monmouth Park, Aug. 1] with Ice Box, because if he gets any kind of pace, he's a much better horse," said Zito. "We'll see what [owner, Bob] LaPenta, wants to do, but he's still one of the better three-year-olds around." First Dude, who followed up a front-running second in the May 15 GI Preakness S. with a third in Saturday's Belmont, also came back well. "He's fine," trainer Dale Romans confirmed. "It doesn't seem like the race took too much out of him, but we'll see when we get back [to Kentucky]. I think he ran hard and tried the whole way."

Khalid Abdullah's **Workforce (GB)** (King's Best) could attempt a Derby double in the Irish equivalent after connections reported he emerged from Saturday's Epsom Classic unscathed. The owner-breeder's Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe also pointed to the July 24 G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S. at Ascot as a possible target for the ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆, if the June 27 Curragh Classic comes too soon. "It was a very exciting performance and he's come out of the race absolutely fine," Grimthorpe told *PA Sport*. "It really was a remarkable performance for a horse so inexperienced, and for him to break the course record is something else. The Irish Derby would look the obvious next step, but we'll just see how the horse takes this race and sit down and make a plan for the rest of the season. Where he goes next will obviously have an impact on his following race, so we just want to make sure we take the correct route with him."

***St Nick Back Later...***

Aidan O'Brien yesterday gave an update on Derrick Smith's **St Nicholas Abbey (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}), who was scratched from the G1 Epsom Derby last week due to a minor muscle injury. Last year's G1 Racing Post Trophy winner had occupied favoritism for the Classic until working unsatisfactorily eight days beforehand, and connections are keen not to rush him back. "St Nicholas Abbey is going to have the whole month of June off--we were advised to give him two or three days, but we have decided to give him full month to recover," O'Brien told *PA Sport* yesterday. "It shouldn't take him long to get back to full fitness, as he is a very natural horse, but we won't rush him and we will look forward to an autumn campaign."

**Wagering at Belmont Down from 2009**

A crowd of 45,243 wagered \$7,598,840 on Saturday's Belmont S. day program, which represented a 15.6 percent decrease from \$8,998,630 in 2009. An additional \$630,479 was wagered at Belmont on incoming simulcasts, bringing the total on-track handle to \$8,229,318 compared to \$9,632,241 in 2009, the record Belmont S. day on-track handle for a non-Triple Crown year. All-sources handle, which includes all wagers made on Saturday's card--both on-track and from incoming simulcasts--was \$74,613,144, a 16.8 percent decline from last year's all-sources total of \$89,705,994, the record Belmont day all-sources handle for a non-Triple Crown year. Betting interests for Belmont day equaled 117, compared to 120 in 2009, 116 in 2008 and 106 in 2007. "Belmont S. day has provided some of history's great moments in Thoroughbred racing, and today was no exception," said NYRA President and CEO Charles Hayward. "We saw the best three-year-olds in the country in the Belmont S. and were treated to a superb racing card, thanks to Vice President and Director of Racing PJ Campo. Our Director of Racing Services Glen Kozak had the dirt track and turf courses in tremendous condition. I love walking around the track on Belmont day and seeing lots of smiling faces, and our thanks go out to all of our customers and racing participants."

**Two Working Well Towards Stephen Foster...**

**Blame** (Arch) and **Giant Oak** (Giant's Causeway), two contenders for next Saturday's GI Stephen Foster H. at Churchill Downs, signaled their readiness with strong workouts yesterday morning. Adele Dilschneider and Claiborne Farm's Blame turned in his final tune-up for the 29th running of the prestigious nine-furlong contest over Keeneland's Polytrack. "He worked well," said trainer Al Stall Jr. "He went in 1:01 flat and worked in company with Apart [Flatter], who broke his maiden at Churchill last month [May 16 by 7 1/2 lengths in the slop]." Blame, who took the GII Clark H. in his 2009 finale by three-quarters of a length, stamped himself a major player in the handicap division this year with a victory in the GIII William Donald Schaefer S. on the Preakness undercard at Pimlico May 15.

Giant Oak fired a warning shot to other Foster contenders that he's ready for a big effort with a five-furlong bullet in :59.60 under Shaun Bridgmohan at Churchill shortly after the renovation break Sunday morning. The four-year-old, owned by the Virginia H. Tarra Trust, was joined by Gleam of Hope (City Zip), a three-year-old stakes winner trained by Tony Reinstedler. "He needs company sometimes in the mornings because he can be a bit on the lazy side and this gives him something to focus on," conditioner Chris Block said. Giant Oak, a stakes winner on turf last year, was fourth behind Blame in the Clark. Blame will carry 120 pounds and Giant Oak will carry 115 in Saturday's handicap.

**Bribon Will Stay Sprinting...**

**Bribon** (Fr) (Mark of Esteem {Ire}), winner of Saturday's GII True North H., will be kept in sprint races for the foreseeable future. The recent Derrick Smith purchase, who took the GI Metropolitan H. for his previous connections last season, had not run in a race shorter than one mile since October 2008. "He came back very well," trainer Todd Pletcher said. "We'll probably go to the [six-furlong G1 Alfred G. Vanderbilt H. at Saratoga Aug. 8] and see how that goes, and possibly the [seven-furlong GI Forego S. Sept. 4] after that. Right now, we are thinking about keeping him sprinting. We felt it was the right opportunity to experiment with him. If he performed well, it would open up more options for him. In the handicap division, the races are a mile and an eighth or a mile and a quarter. We thought he might be suited to sprinting."



**Clement: 'Gio' Still the Best**

**Gio Ponti** (Tale of the Cat), who was upset a half-length by stablemate **Winchester** (Theatrical {Ire}) in the GI Woodford Reserve Manhattan H., is still the best male turf horse in the country, according to trainer Christophe Clement. "It was a handicap and Gio Ponti gave [six pounds to the winner]," said Clement of last year's champion older male and turf horse. "Considering it was his first race [since finishing fourth in the G1 Dubai World Cup in March], how he was short a few works, the weight, and the trip, he ran a superb race."

**VENTA Copa Bullrich June 6, 7, 8, 10, 15**

**NEW RECORD FOR BULLRICH SALE** The 2010 Copa Bullrich Yearling Sale, which kicked off Sunday at San Isidro in Buenos Aires, Argentina, may have been delayed, but it was off to a strong start once the bidding got underway. Just 10 lots into the catalogue, the sale set a new record, with John Fulton Bloodstock going to 640,000 Argentine pesos (\$162,025) for a colt by top U.S. sire Tiznow. "I'm very happy," said Antonio Bullrich. "That was our first exam and I think it was great. To sell the record price horse was unbelievable. The most important thing was the international buyers who came from Ireland, the United States, Peru, Libya and England; every one of
