## RACHEL ALEXANDRA TO FLEUR DE LIS

Co-owner Jess Jackson announced yesterday that Horse of the Year **Rachel Alexandra** (Medaglia d'Oro) will make her next start in the GII Fleur de Lis S. Saturday at Churchill Downs. "As long as she continues to progress, we intend to race her with the expectation that she will obtain her fitness level of last year," Jackson said in a statement. "Our ultimate goal and hope is to enter the Breeders' Cup in November." Perfect in eight starts with three Grade I wins against the boys during her championship campaign, four-year-old Rachel Alexandra has been second in both starts this season, the Mar. 13 New Orleans Ladies S. and the Apr. 30 GII La Troienne S. The bay has been first or second in 15 of 16 appearances, earning \$3,074,050. Field, p3

## Peslier on Makfi...

Olivier Peslier has been booked to partner the G1 2000 Guineas winner **Makfi (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}) in Tuesday's G1 St James's Palace S., for which 15 were declared yesterday. With Christophe-Patrice Lemaire retained by His Highness The Aga Khan for **"TDN Rising Star"** **Siyouni (Fr)** (Pivotal {GB}), the Newmarket Classic winner's owners Mathieu Offenstadt, Alain Louis-Dreyfus, Sylvain Fargeon and Mikel Delzangles, who also trains the colt, have been forced to seek a new rider in the mile contest. "[Peslier] might come and sit on him before the race, but everything is fine with the horse," Delzangles told *PA Sport*. Richard Hannon could be represented by both The Heffer Syndicate, Susan Roy and Mrs Instance's G1 Irish 2000 Guineas hero **Canford Cliffs (Ire)** (Tagula {Ire}) and John Manley's 2000 Guineas and G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains runner-up **Dick Turpin (Ire)** (Arakan), although the latter has the alternative option of Wednesday's G3 Jersey S. Aidan O'Brien had five entries remaining yesterday, headed by the **"TDN Rising Star"** **and Irish Guineas fourth Steinbeck (Ire)** (Footstepsinthesand {GB}) and last year's G1 Dewhurst S. winner **Beethoven (Ire)** (Oratorio {Ire}). Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's G1 Prix Morony winner **Arcano (Ire)** (Oasis Dream {GB}) and Chasing Dreams Racing's G1 Breeders' Futurity hero **Noble's Promise** (Cuvee) are other notables in the list. Trainer Alain de Royer-Dupre, on hand to supervise the gallop on the straight Les Reservoirs, told the *Racing Post*, "She covered seven furlongs with a lead horse and did just what I wanted." De Royer-Dupre yesterday scratched **Dariyana (Fr)** (Medicean {GB}), leaving the Aga Khan with three homebreds in the race. In addition to Rosanara, he will have **"TDN Rising Star"** **Sarafina (Fr)** (Refuse to Bend {Ire}) and **Valasyra (Fr)** (Sinndar {Ire}). The expected withdrawal of Fitri Hay's **Pink Symphony (GB)** (Montjeu {Ire}) and Freddy Head's **Galixidi (GB)** (High Chaparral {Ire}) slims the field down to 10 ahead of today's supplementary stage.

**Rip Van Winkle Set for Queen Anne Clash...**

Rip Van Winkle (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) is on course to make his seasonal return in Tuesday's G1 Queen Anne S., Aidan O'Brien announced yesterday. Not seen since finishing down the field in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Santa Anita in November, Susan Magnier's G1 Sussex S. and G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. hero continues to please connections ahead of the mile contest, for which 12 declarations were revealed yesterday. "It's a case of so far, so good with him, and the plan is to start him off in the Queen Anne," the Ballydoyle conditioner told *Racing Post*. The Wertheimers' eight-time Group 1 heroine Goldikova (Ire) (Anabaa) and The Calvera Partnership's 2009 hero Paco Boy (Ire) (Desert Style {Ire}) are both reported to be set to contest a vintage renewal of the race, which also at this stage features His Highness The Aga Khan's G3 Prix du Palais-Royal winner Dalghar (Fr) (Anabaa) and Khalid Abdullah's QEII runner-up Zacinto (GB) (Dansili {GB}).

# RACING Round-Up

**WIN WILLY DQ'D FROM RAZORBACK** Jer-Mar Stable 's **Win Willy** (Monarchos) has been disqualified from his victory in the GIII Razorback H. at Oaklawn Mar. 6 due to the presence of two non-steroidal anti-inflammatories in his post-race test, *Daily Racing Form* reported. The medications were phenylbutazone and flunixin. According to *DRF*, racehorses in Arkansas are not allowed to have more than one such medication in their systems. Trainer Mac Robertson, who was fined \$1,000, will not appeal the ruling of the Arkansas Racing Commission. "The levels--to me, they were trace levels," he told *DRF*. "If that's what they feel is necessary, that's what I'll abide by. They gave their ruling based on their rules, and I don't see the point in appealing." Four-year-old Win Willy, who captured the 2009 GII Rebel S., most recently finished second in the GII Oaklawn H. Apr. 3. The Razorback's purse money has been redistributed, and the one-two-three finishers are now **Spotsgone** (Bright Launch), **Gone Astray** (Dixie Union) and **Prom Shoes** (Include).

Wales's S. at Royal Ascot, but O'Brien ruled that out. "We've decided to stick with the original plan we had before he won the Coronation Cup," O'Brien told *Racing Post*. "He's had four races already this season and, while he is fine, he won't be going to Ascot for the Prince of Wales's S. He will have a midsummer break instead before coming back for an autumn campaign."

Botti announced yesterday. Last year's G1 Goodwood H. winner was last seen finishing sixth in the G1 Dubai World Cup at Meydan Mar. 27, and connections are targeting the July 3 10-furlong contest for his return to turf. "He was probably a bit unlucky in the World

Cup, as he got stuck in a pocket, but we'll never find out whether he would have won or not," Botti explained. "Maybe he could have finished closer, but it proved he is capable of running at that level, and the Eclipse is our plan, followed by the G1 Arlington Million. We are confident he will handle turf as well as the all-weather. The horse has been training well, and I hope Kieren [Fallon] will be available to ride again."

**UAE Derby Winner Musir to Target Cox Plate...**

G2 UAE Derby winner **Musir (Aus)** (Redoute's Choice {Aus}) has returned to the country of his birth for a tilt at the A\$3-million G1 Cox Plate at Moonee Valley in October. The Southern Hemisphere four-year-old, a A\$900,000 Inglis graduate, has been transferred from leading South African trainer Mike de Kock to Sydney trainer David Payne by owner Sheikh Mohamed Bin Khalifa Al Maktoum. Musir took all three of his starts in Dubai this term, winning an allowance Feb. 4, the G3 UAE 2000 Guineas Feb. 18 and UAE Derby on Dubai World Cup night Mar. 27. He has suffered just one defeat in six career starts.

"The Cox Plate is the target for Musir, and we'll kick off his campaign here in Sydney and probably look at a race like the [Group 1] George Main S," said Payne.

Joining him on the trip is stablemate **Raihana (Aus)** (Elusive Quality), who posted an impressive second in the UAE Derby, and boasts three wins and two minors from six starts. Payne said Raihana would be set for the fillies and mares' features over the Spring Racing Carnival with a race such as the G1 Myer Classic S. a possible option.



**VENTA Copa Bullrich June 6, 7, 8, 10, 15**

**KING'S BEST COLT TOPS COPA DAY TRES**

Colts by King's Best and Not for Sale (Arg) from the draft of Haras El Mallin shared top billing Tuesday during the third day of trade at the Copa Bullrich Yearling Sale at San Isidro in Buenos Aires, Argentina. The horses, selling six lots apart, each elicited bids of \$48,513 (P190,000) from Las Canarias. First up was **Lot 167**, an August-foaled colt named **Le Chacal (Arg)**. By King's Best, sire of Saturday's G1 Investec Derby hero Workforce (GB), the

colt was produced by La Piaff (Arg) (Southern Halo). The six-year-old La Piaff is a full-sister to a pair of black-type winners, including MGSW Sa Torreta (Arg).

Minutes later, **Lot 173**, by Not for Sale, stepped into the ring. Named **Guiness Lad (Arg)** and produced by the stakes-placed Shy Tom mare Shy Brama (Arg), Guiness Lad is a half-brother to the good handicap horse Fer Halo (Arg) (Southern Halo).

Of the 59 horses to go through the ring, 48 found buyers, an RNA rate of 18.6 percent. They grossed \$607,088 (P2,398,000), for an average of \$12,648 (P49,958).

"I am delighted with the success of the first three days of the sale," said Copa Bullrich Director General Antonio Bullrich. "The first two were selected, and the horses sold extremely well. Records were smashed

from 2009, and the results have so far surpassed all my expectations. I hope it will remain in the same vein today and the following Tuesday."

Yesterday was a dark day at Copa Bullrich, but action resumes today with the presentation of lots 235 through 292. Results from today's session will

**NTRA REPORT FROM CAPITOL HILL**



**SUMMARY OF KEY PRIMARY RESULTS**

On the busiest primary election date of 2010, voters from 12 states went to the polls Tuesday. Several of the states have ties to the Thoroughbred industry.

**California** - Former eBay CEO [Meg Whitman](#) defeated state Insurance Commissioner Steve Poizner for the GOP nomination to succeed Gov. Arnold Schwarzenegger. In the general election, Whitman will meet state Attorney General [Jerry Brown](#), who twice was elected as California's governor in the 1970s.

**Carly Fiorina**, the former Hewlett-Packard chief executive, defeated former U.S. Rep. Tom Campbell to win the Republican nomination for senator. Fiorina will take on incumbent Democratic Sen. [Barbara Boxer](#) this fall.

**Nevada** - Former legislator and teacher [Sharron Angle](#) won the Republican nomination to oppose Senate Majority Leader [Harry Reid](#) (D) in November. Angle defeated Nevada GOP Chairwoman Sue Lowden and Danny Tarkanian, a Las Vegas businessman.

Governor Jim Gibbons lost the Republican gubernatorial nomination to federal judge and former Nevada Attorney General [Brian Sandoval](#).

**Arkansas** - Two-term incumbent U.S. Senator and Agriculture Committee Chairwoman [Blanche Lincoln](#) (D) defeated Lt. Governor Bill Halter in a runoff election. Lincoln's victory was viewed by many as an upset given the anti-incumbent sentiment among the nation's voters. She will face U.S. Rep. [John Boozman](#) (R) in November's general election.

**RINGSIDE... with Jessica Martini**

**FINDING THE PRICE IS RIGHT IN ARGENTINA**

While most of the world's Thoroughbred markets struggle through economic downturns and uncertainty, the industry is thriving in Argentina, and the reason is all in the numbers, according to bloodstock agent John Fulton.

Fulton has been an active buyer at the Copa Bullrich Yearling Sale this week, purchasing a record-priced colt by Tiznow for \$162,025 and a son of Distorted Humor for \$129,113 during Sunday's opening session of the auction in Buenos Aires.

"Argentina is a place where the industry works quite well," Fulton said from Buenos Aires Tuesday. "We're able to breed here for a fraction of what it costs in the States. The stud fees here are about 20 to 25 percent of what they would be in the States. Then you are able to raise a horse on the best farms for \$350 a month. A breeder has a chance to raise a horse and get him to the sale and make a profit." **Cont. p7**

That profitability trickles down to buyers. "The end-user is getting in at a level where he's got a chance [to make money], so it works all the way through," Fulton continued. "Once you get them to the racetrack, you pay about \$1,000 a month to the trainer, the vet and the blacksmith. And the purses are good enough that, if you win a two-year-old maiden race, you've nearly paid for a year's training. The numbers work very well. If you want to race in the good markets in the U.S., by the time you get done paying the trainer his day rate, and the veterinarian and the blacksmith and shipping, it's \$4,000 or \$5,000 a month."

If your runner is successful in Argentina, the rewards can get even greater.

"You have people from other countries--people from the States, from Australia, from South Africa, from Dubai and Saudi Arabia--who want to buy the proven horses," Fulton explained. "So if you happen to come up with a good horse, you've got a chance to sell at a pretty attractive number."

It's a system that is in stark contrast to the struggling industry in the U.S., where it seems fewer and fewer people on either end of the equation are making a profit.

"Your entry level as an end-user has got to be a third of what it would in the States," Fulton calculated. "I've bought Distorted Humors and Tiznows in this sale that I know would have sold for three times as much in the States. You can go to a sale here and buy both pedigree and conformation and not be paying crazy numbers. In the States, even in today's market, if you see a yearling that has got tremendous conformation, you're going to pay a lot of money. If he's got tremendous breeding, you're going to pay a lot of money. If he has both, then it's either Coolmore or Sheikh Mohammed. Here, you can buy both reasonably. This Tiznow colt that I just bought, he's absolutely spectacular. I've had people here from the States who looked at him and said he would be a \$400-500,000 yearling in the States, and I paid \$162,000 for him. So you can get in at the top of the market at a reasonable number and have a chance to prove your horse very inexpensively."

Racing in South America can be an attractive alternative to fans forced out of the game in the U.S., and Fulton is putting together partnerships of people interested in racing on a more level playing field.

"There are people that have found they can't really afford to maintain horses in the U.S.," Fulton said. "I was up in the States, working out in the gym, and I was talking to a guy who is in the racehorse business--

he's got 10 horses in training. He was complaining about the expense of it--you win a race, you only pay for a couple of month's training--he was fed up with it.

"With the economy the way it is around the world, and in the States in particular, you have people who used to be able to maintain two or three horses in training. Now, times are tough, but they'd still like to participate in the game. They can come to South America, get in inexpensively and maintain the horses inexpensively. I bring in these people and we put some training expenses into the package. They don't get a bill, and they get into a piece of several horses."

The plan worked to perfection for Fulton and partners with a filly named **So Shiny (Arg)** (Indygo Shiner). The filly was Group 1-placed in Argentina before being sold. She went on to win last year's UAE 1000 Guineas.

"We bought her very reasonably down here," Fulton said. "We ran her three times and then sold her for quite a lot of money; she went to Dubai and won the 1000 Guineas and everybody was happy."

Fulton has found his partners often enjoy the experience of racing in Argentina.

"Once they come here, they want to come back," Fulton said. "A lot of these people are watching their races [in the U.S.] on television anyway, and

now you can watch them live on the computer. And with what you save in a month's training, you can take several trips down here during the year. When people come here or to Chile or Brazil, they see this is the First World. It's classy and there is a tremendous passion for the game. It's good racing at beautiful racetracks and beautiful cities. The experience is wonderful and, a lot of times, they want to get involved, they want to come back."

The Copa Bullrich sale, introduced five years ago, has solidified the sale scene in Argentina and attracted an international buying bench. Previously, farms would conduct individual auctions, and the calendar was littered with up to 60 sales throughout the year.

"Antonio [Bullrich] started this concept, which follows after the Goffs Millions sale, and he got international people to come in," Fulton explained. "The breeders see that this is a place where we're expanding our clientele, and, over the years, they've been putting in better and better horses and the quality has gone up considerably. We have people at this sale from Australia, England, the U.S., Scotland. There are people here from Libya--I don't know how they found out about it. Now you can come and you know you are going to have high-quality yearlings from the top breeders in Argentina all in one sale." **Cont. p8**

All graduates of the sale are eligible for next year's Copa Bullrich race series, making them even more attractive to prospective buyers.

"You have the opportunity to run next spring for the richest two-year-old races in South America," Fulton remarked. "We had a filly this year that I have a piece of with Gary Biszantz and a couple of other people--we bought her out of this sale. We ran in the qualifying, she won very easily by seven lengths. Then she ran second in the final and got \$30,000. Down here, that pays training for three horses for a year, and the winner's share next year is even bigger. It's a great concept, and it brings in more people."

This year's auction was delayed by an EVA outbreak, but even that may have worked out for the best, according to Fulton.

"I was telling Antonio, 'Every cloud has a silver lining,'" Fulton chuckled. "The day before the sale started here, a King's Best colt won the G1 Epsom Derby and set a track record and a Distorted Humor won the G1 Belmont S. We had [yearlings by] both to sell."

It seems like silver linings abound in Argentina these days.

total of 816 horses, including G3 Ballysax S. winner **Punch Clynych (Ire)** (Azamour {Ire}), have been catalogued for the Tattersalls July Sale, to be held July 6-9. The catalogue, which can be viewed online at [www.tattersalls.com](http://www.tattersalls.com), boasts 84 more lots than last year and is comprised of broodmares, and horses and fillies in training. The Jim Bolger-trained Puncher Clynych defeated subsequent G1 Epsom Derby runner-up First Sight (Ire) in the Ballysax, and has an entry to the G1 Irish Derby June 27. "The Tattersalls July Sale is a truly international fixture, and the 2010 catalogue has all the ingredients to attract buyers from throughout the world," said Tattersalls Chairman Edmond Mahony.

**PIERCE, MILLERICK TO HALL OF FAME** Jockey Don Pierce and trainer Michael 'Buster' Millerick have been elected to the National Museum of Racing's Hall of Fame by the Historic Review Committee, the organization announced yesterday. In the equine division, the committee--chaired by Edward Bowen--also named Harry Bassett, a champion in 1870 and 1871, to the Hall of Fame. This year's inductees--who join jockey Randy Romero and equine stars Azeri, Best Pal and Point Given--will be honored in a ceremony at the Hall of Fame museum in Saratoga Springs Aug. 13.



Harry Bassett, named champion juvenile in 1870 after winning three of four starts, took all nine starts the following season, including the 1871 Belmont S. Harry Bassett eventually retired with 23 victories and five runner-up finishes from career 36 starts.

West Coast-based trainer Millerick took training titles at Santa Anita, Hollywood Park and Del Mar in a career that spanned five decades. The conditioner is probably best remembered for conditioning Hall of Famer Native Diver. A winner of 34 stakes events, including three consecutive editions of the Hollywood Gold Cup, the California-bred Native Diver retired in 1967 with 37 wins and \$1,026,500 in earnings.

Don Pierce, who launched his riding career at Longacres Racecourse in Seattle, Washington, developed into one of the West Coast's leading riders, and rode a long list of racing stalwarts, including Silky Sullivan, Kelso, Princessnesian, the high-strung Kennedy Road and Quack.

"I rode Silky Sullivan after the [1958] Kentucky Derby, when he came down to California, he brought the fans out by the thousands, and all the publicity he got, I got," explained Pierce. "That horse kind of put me on the [map], so I have a fond memory of him."

The Oklahoma native is responsible for winning the Santa Anita Derby twice, including with Hill Rise, who Pierce says is the best horse he ever rode. During his career, the California-bred also won the Santa Anita H., Man O' War S. and San Antonio H., but is probably best known for his narrow defeat by Northern Dancer in the 1964 Kentucky Derby.

"He probably should never have lost that race," Pierce said. "After the Triple Crown, he got a break when he came back [to California] and I won the Santa Anita H. on him. He was a really good horse to me." **Cont. p9**

Competing along the ultra-competitive California circuit from a very young age, Pierce was forced to face some of racing's greatest riders, including Bill Shoemaker and Eddie Arcaro, who is the only rider in history to partner two Triple Crown champions: Whirlaway (1941) and Citation (1948).

"I was just dumbfounded by the quality of riders out there at the time," said Pierce regarding the Southern California jockey colony. "I got to be buds with Arcaro and Shoe. We got to socializing, and they kind of took me under their wings when I was just a young kid, and probably just to make fun of me. But we all had a good time, and they were great guys to be around and great riders. I learned a lot from those guys."

According to Pierce, another rider of that era to leave a lasting impression on him was John Longden, who was the regular rider of 1943 Triple Crown hero and Horse of the Year Count Fleet.

"John was just phenomenal, you couldn't even believe it," he recalled. "He would do things that nobody else could do. He was a good rider, and a very good guy too. He looked out for you."

Despite his impressive resume, Pierce often found himself having to take a back seat to the King of the West Coast, Bill Shoemaker.

"I always found if you are on a horse Shoemaker wants to ride, you're doing really good," dead panned Pierce. "He was really tough to beat. If the Shoe wanted to ride a horse, he rode the horse. But I could never get mad at Shoe. Nobody in the world could get mad at Shoe. That's just the nature of the business. I learned you keep your head straight and you'll get along just fine. I was riding around here for 25 to 30 years and did pretty good."

Pierce, who retired from the saddle in the mid '80s, trained horses for 11 years before serving a brief stint as jockey's agent for David Flores. Now 73, Pierce lives near Del Mar and spends much of his time perfecting his golf game, which is his favorite pastime these days. And despite enjoying the tranquility of his golden years, Pierce, who enthusiastically recalls his days on the track, leaves little doubt as to where his induction into the Hall of Fame ranks in his list of accomplishments.

"I am very excited," said Pierce. "I had a lot of good things happen to me in my career, but this tops them all."-CB

**Q & A WITH THE BREEDERS' CUP CANDIDATES**



On May 24, Breeders' Cup announced the 28 candidates who will stand for election to the Breeders' Cup Board of Members and Trustees. There are 13 openings on the Board. Voting began June 8 and closes June 22 at 5 p.m. The bios of the 28 candidates are available in documents circulated to the voters--Breeders' Cup foal and stallion nominators--and the *TDN* once again will provide additional information on the candidates' viewpoints. To that end, we posed the following question to each of the candidates, and have given them 400 words or fewer in which to respond.

What do you think is the biggest issue facing the Breeders' Cup today and, if voted to the Breeders' Cup board, how would you propose this issue be solved?

**Christopher Young:**

The biggest issue facing the Breeders' Cup today is one of how to best utilize the full resources of the two boards--the larger Board of Trustees and the smaller Board of Directors. Currently, except for participating on three nominal committees, the 'big board' does not do much other than to elect the 'small executive board.' I do understand that the former board structure was unwieldy and did not lend itself to effectively managing a complex organization such as the Breeders' Cup. But, the pendulum has swung too far in the other direction and has created a disillusioned Board of Trustees who idly sit by and watch with the rest of the public what decisions have been made by the Board of Directors. Clearly, more effort has been made recently to keep the Board of Trustees abreast of what is going on, but this seems to consist of updates and press releases made available shortly before they are distributed to the public.

The Strategic Planning Committee, on which I actively participated, was a good example of involving the Board of Trustees, Board of Directors and management in helping to set the future direction of the Breeders' Cup, and the level of engagement, quality of discussion and agreeable disagreement on difficult issues was very encouraging. This committee, however, was disbanded as soon as the Strategic Plan was produced, and those bright minds went back to watching the action unfold from the sidelines.

I would propose that the Breeders' Cup re-invigorate the Board of Trustees to better utilize their varied talents and experiences. This would not only better harness the strengths of the Board of Trustees, but would also make for a better informed next generation of leaders, who may join the Board of Directors in the future. Bill Handleman, an award-winning columnist for New Jersey's *Asbury Park Press*, died yesterday morning in Philadelphia after a two-year battle with cancer. He was 62. "It is a sad loss," Hollis R. Towns, the paper's executive editor and vice president of news, said in the *APP*. "He was a valuable part of this newspaper as well as the community." Having grown up in Tokyo, Paris, San Francisco and Washington D.C., Handleman graduated from Occidental College with a history degree, then worked for *Star-Democrat* and *Guardian* in Maryland before joining the APP's sports department in 1979. He covered many major sporting events and was a fixture at Monmouth Park and, in 1995, won the \$100,000 Penn National World Series of Handicapping.
