CHURCHILL TO HOST 2011 BREEDERS' CUP

According to published reports, Churchill Downs, site of the 2010 Breeders' Cup, will be hosting the event again in 2011. Breeders' Cup and Churchill Downs issued a release Thursday afternoon that there would be an announcement made during a press conference this morning. But, scooping the official announcement, *Daily Racing Form* reported that the decision was made to keep the Breeders' Cup in Louisville because of the current problems between the Oak Tree Racing Association and MID Developments, which owns Santa Anita; and the financial turmoil surrounding the New York Racing Association and New York City OTB. *DRF* cited an official with "knowledge of the organization's plans," as their source. Today's press conference, set for 10 a.m. at Churchill, will include Breeders' Cup Chairman Bill Farish, Breeders' Cup President and CEO Greg Avioli, Churchill Downs Inc. President and CEO Bob Evans and Churchill Downs racetrack President and CDI Senior Vice President Kevin Flanery.

Stalking the pace from the onset, she was eased forward effortlessly to pass the long-time leader Miss Gorica (Ire) (Mull of Kintyre) at the two-furlong marker, and was always holding the favored runner-up in the closing stages.

one of four to have won the Vanity twice; the others are Annie-Lu-San (1957-58), Convenience (1972-73), It's In The Air (1979-80) and Azeri (2002-03). Her stable-mate **Zardana**, who was originally scheduled to be shipped to Belmont for Saturday's GI Ogden Phipps H., will remain west to contest

the Vanity instead. "She worked too fast here Sunday--five furlongs is :58 4/5--to ship across the country," said trainer John Shirreffs, explaining the change in plans. "Then the plane that was supposed to take her was delayed a day until Wednesday. All things added up to 'don't go.' It was in the horse's best interests to stay here." Zardana, winner of the GII Bayakoa H. in December, defeated Horse of the Year Rachel Alexandra (Medaglia d'Oro) in the New Orleans Ladies S. in March. The Brazilian-bred mare was fifth in her latest start in the Apr. 30 GII La Troienne S. at Churchill Downs.

DAM OF SUMMER BIRD DEAD Hong Kong Squall (Summer Squall), the dam of GI Belmont S. hero **Summer Bird** (Birdstone), was euthanized at the Hagyard Equine Medical Institute three weeks ago, reports *Daily Racing Form* yesterday. "She fell down at the farm, and she had some kind of malignancy," Kalarikkal Jayaraman told *DRF*. "We spent her last two days with her." Hong Kong Squall, who produced a full-sister to the champion three-year-old colt of 2009, was boarded at Normandy Farm near Lexington, Kentucky. "It came very quickly," Devi Jayaraman told *DRF*. "She wasn't sick, and we had seen her two weeks before. Then they called to tell us she had fallen and was sick, and they were taking her to the hospital." Summer Bird arrived at Ben Walden's Pauls Mill, where he will begin stud duty next year, while the 14-year-old mare's latest foal is reportedly doing well on a nurse mare.

WRITERS UP

SAVING A RACEHORSE FROM SLAUGHTER: THE STORY OF LOT 614

(In 2009, the non-profit charity Final Furlong Race Horse Retirement program was started by the Niall Brennan Stables for graduates of their program and for their clients' horses. Their goal is to find a caring home suitable to each horse's ability: show, pleasure or simple retirement. Stephanie, wife of Niall, is the administrator of Final Furlong)

First, let me say that the story that follows is not meant to cast blame, admonish or point fingers at anyone. It is to point out why we need a central, organized agency that can help those who are trying to locate horses--to offer a better alternative to owners and trainers other than slaughter. It should offer guidance and support to all the groups that operate to help these horses.

The story begins with More Than Capable, a Kentucky-bred son of More Than Ready who was sold privately as a two-year-old in 2007. He had an unimpressive racing career, never burning up the tracks of Louisiana as his owners desired. He did, however, start 28 times, winning three races and earning \$49,473, better than many. His last race was May 29, when he was seventh for a tag of \$4,000. He had also run for the same price nine days earlier.

At Final Furlong, we put all our horses into a virtual stable and track their racing careers. As they get older and drop down in class, we keep a closer eye on them. When the horses start running poorly for the cheaper tags, we contact the trainers, send them a brochure explaining the program and let them know that our program is available to those horses.

This horse's trainer was contacted by Final Furlong on Tuesday, June 1.

We were unable to get in touch with him, but left a message with the secretary at the training center where he was located. On Thursday, June 3, the trainer called us early in the morning to let us know he had just received the message. Sadly, he informed us, the owner had picked up the horse Wednesday and taken him to the auction. The trainer provided us with the necessary details and we were able to find out that the horse was sold to a "broker" for \$100.

The auction company was very accommodating. They gave us the new owner's name and a contact number for the horse now known as 'lot 614.' Unfortunately, it was a disconnected cell number. After calling a good friend who had a winter string in Louisiana, progress was made--her assistant happily went to the stockyards to see if the horse was still there. The horse had left one hour prior to his arrival. The next day was spent trying to locate the broker. Every option was explored. Numerous calls were made to the Louisiana HBPA, Horse Rescue Organizations, police departments, and local vets--all without success. We had four people calling every conceivable lead non stop throughout the day, all to no avail.

A glimmer of hope appeared on the horizon when we were given the name and number of a veterinarian at Eagle Pass, Texas. We learned that would be the next and last stop for the horse before he headed to the kill pens in Mexico. The vet was contacted and was more than happy to help. He located the potential Mexican buyer and informed him that the horse was ineligible for slaughter due to the administration of Phenylbutazone, a medication that is banned for use in animals intended for human consumption. We were told that if the horse arrived at Eagle Pass, he would be stopped at the border. At that point, it appeared to be smooth sailing.

When the truck arrived from Louisiana at Eagle Pass Friday night, the horses were put into holding pens, where they were looked after until Monday morning. We still did not have confidence that the horse was actually at Eagle Pass. Monday morning arrived, and the broker offered to return the horse to his facility in Louisiana, but I declined, having more confidence with my connections in Texas.

Monday at 10 a.m., the set-up time for confirmation of the horse's presence, came and went; the horse could not be found. At 1 p.m., the horse still could not be found. Another phone call to the veterinarian as well as the Louisiana broker resulted in the horse finally being located.

Tuesday morning, the horse was picked up. Again, not a simple task--evidently, Eagle Pass is not a place many people visit. Luckily, a friend who recently relocated to Texas was contacted and was able to organize the horse's safe transportation. Although he is exhausted, he is resting comfortably at her father's farm awaiting a trip to Florida, where he will receive a well-earned rehabilitation period and then placement with a loving home--a happy ending for him and a huge thank you to all who were involved.

Although we tend not to let ourselves think of the fate of many of these animals or assume that many just don't care, all of those I contacted were more than cooperative and happy to locate and return this horse. My calls to the brokers involved were never unanswered and were handled professionally.

Had we not had the time, a great support group (over 17 people helped to locate this horse Friday), and a tenacious nature, the reality is this horse would now be in a Mexican slaughterhouse. Most people wanting to help don't have the resources. At present, there is no system or database of contacts set up to help people with the task. Why is there not a simple system in place that would identify these ex-racehorses at the final border crossing where they are tagged for their final destination? As breeders, owners, buyers and sellers, we need to be responsible for these horses that we all profit from in so many ways.

Another lesson learned was: know your horse. Keep copies of papers or photos to identify them. Lot 614 was culled from a holding pen, where he was one of eight bay geldings, because of photos we had of him as a two-year-old showing a small white sock on his right front. This was then confirmed by his tattoo.

Lot 614 is actually sound and in pretty good condition which, in some ways, breaks my heart even more.

When trainers hear about our program, they are happy to send the horses home to us. In fact, we have another one coming to us this weekend. We contacted the trainer and, after a poor performance in his last start this week, the owner and trainer are sending him home!

It is encouraging to see Gov. Beshear launch the Kentucky Equine Health and Welfare Council. This could be used to create an important database for all groups involved in equine rescue and rehabilitation and their relevant contact information.

The first open two-year-old maiden race in New York this year yielded a result unsurprising to anyone who has followed the circuit over the past several years. **Bail Out the Cat** (Tale of the Cat), a 4-5 firster from trainer Rick Violette, took the lead early and kicked clear late to win by 2 1/4 lengths. Violette has been on a roll with juvenile debuters in the Empire State, sporting a 32-percent win rate with those types over the past three seasons.

CrossRoads, the enterprise of Greg and Beth Burchell, offered Bail Out the Cat at KEENOV 2008. The colt RNA'd at \$45,000, but did better in a return to the ring at FTKJUL eight months later.

"[Bail Out the Cat] actually went through the November sale as a weanling" Burchell recalled. "He wasn't big enough, and we didn't get what we felt was a fair price for him, so the Littles decided to keep him until he was a yearling."

Patience paid off, and the \$45,000 RNA weanling returned \$70,000 at Fasig-Tipton Kentucky the following July.

"He was an easy horse to sell. He had a big walk on him and generated a lot of interest. At the time, the mare didn't have a whole lot going on. Her produce record was just alright. Otherwise, that colt would have brought more money," Burchell said. "But, Tale of the Cat was doing really well at the time, so that was the reason he sold as well as he did."

"I started in the Thoroughbred business as a kid," explained Greg Burchell, who left the backstretch to work as a yearling manager for bloodstock power-

houses Taylor Made, Frank Stronach's Adena Springs South and the late Sheikh Maktoum bin Rashid al Maktoum's Gainsborough Farm. "I grew up here in Lexington and my dad trained horses. [Trainer] Kiaran McLaughlin and I were best friends growing up and we both went to work for my

dad at the same time. I spent 13 or 14 years on the racetrack. I've done everything that you could do on the track. I still work the starting gate at the Derby and Breeders' Cup when it's at Churchill Downs," he added.

After a long stint at Adena Springs, Burchell decided to go out on his own in 2005 with encouragement and financial support from Taylor Made and McLaughlin. Ironically, it was McLaughlin who sent out the horse that Bail Out the Cat battled into submission yesterday.

"Mr. Stronach was good to me, as was Sheikh Maktoum, but I always wanted to come back to Kentucky," said Burchell. "So, after seven years in Florida, my wife Beth and I decided to come on back home and open our own farm. After a year doing that--we're in the breeding business too and we raise a lot of babies--we decided to start a sales consignment, primarily to sell our own horses, but also for other clients."

Bail Out the Cat was one of the horses the Burchells sold for their clients, Dr. and Mrs. John Little. The Littles, who also bred multiple Grade III-placed and 2010 GI Preakness S. participant Schoolyard Dreams (Stephen Got Even).

Nick DeMeric, who bought the horse in 2008, resold him at the OBSFEB two-year-old sale for \$150,000.

CrossRoads has not been immune to the current market downturn despite sales graduates like those bred by the Littles and stakes winners such as **Fitz Just Right** (Seattle Fitz {Arg}), **Uno Mas** (Macho Uno) and **Red Lead** (Red Bullet).

The Burchells brought a 52-horse consignment to Keeneland September 2007, and had 62 at the sale in 2008. The operation was hit by the recession last year, however, and had just 28 yearlings at KESEPT 2009. Burchell anticipates having only 10 yearlings in the sale this fall.

"For whatever reason, the September sale at Keeneland has been hit particularly hard, but you'll see a drop-off across-the board," explained Burchell. "If you look at the number of registered foals this year, you will see much lower numbers. People haven't even bothered to breed to their mares, because they can't afford to pay the stud fees."

He added, "The biggest problem we have had is just with numbers in general. Last year we had about 80 mares run through our farm. We have a lot of people that send us mares from New York, Kentucky or Florida to breed here in Kentucky and then we send the mares back home. This year, we're down to about 45...A lot of people are just waiting to see which way things are going to go." -Brian DiDonato

AUSSIES LAUNCH SINGAPORE SALES SERIES
 Peak marketing body Aushorse, in conjunction with sale companies Inglis and Magic Millions, will launch a seven-race two-year-old series worth A\$800,000 in Singapore from next February to April. The series, to be run by the Singapore Turf Club, aims to encourage owners to purchase Australian-bred horses. Inglis, Magic Millions and Aushorse will each sponsor two of the six lead-up races. These races will be open to all juveniles trained in Singapore, but only Australian-sired horses offered for sale through Inglis or Magic Millions will be in contention for a bonus. If a non-Australian-sired or sold horse wins any of the six lead-up races, the bonus will then jackpot to the Aushorse Singapore Golden Horseshoe. Should a non-Australian-sired or -sold horse win the Aushorse Singapore Golden Horseshoe, the remaining bonus money will be paid to the connections of the Australian-sired and sold horse that won the greatest prize-money during the series.

NEW QUARANTINE CENTRE TO OPEN Up to 24 horses will be housed in five separate stable complexes when the A\$1.4-million International Horse Centre at Werribee is completed in early August ahead of international arrivals for the 150th Melbourne Cup. The new centre, located 32km from Melbourne city, will replace quarantine facilities at Sandown, and features a 1728-meter grass track with a 300-meter straight. All visiting horses must serve a minimum of 14 nights in post-arrival quarantine before they can leave for external training or racing purposes. Under vastly tightened new rules, all who leave the centre must shower first, all clothing must remain behind, and contact with other horses or animals is banned. The centre will have round-the-clock security, electronic security and CCTV surveillance.

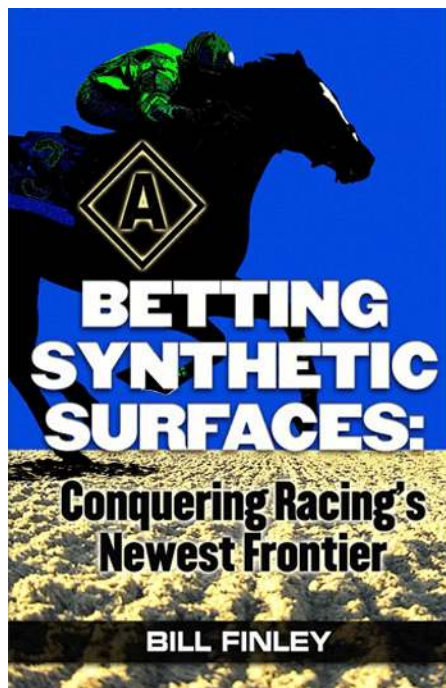

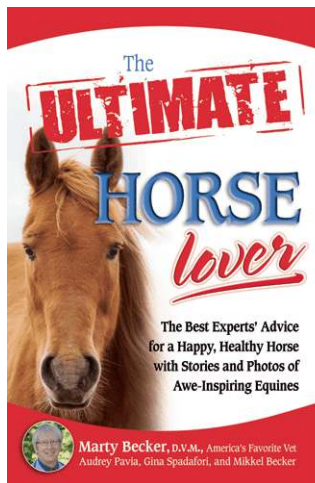
