'RACHEL' RETURNS TO TRACK

Stonestreet Farm and Harold McCormick's **Rachel Alexandra** (Medaglia d'Oro) returned to the worktab for the first time since her powerful 10 1/2-length victory in the GII Fleur de Lis H. at Churchill Downs June 12.

On a hot, humid morning at the Louisville oval yesterday, the reigning Horse of the Year took it easy, breezing four furlongs in :51 1/5. Jockey Shaun Bridgmohan guided the four-year-old through fractional splits of :12 2/5 and :25 1/5; the pair galloped out five furlongs in 1:05 1/5. "She went

fine," said trainer Steve Asmussen. "It's a ridiculously hot morning, you know? That's a big concern. It's time to get out and go north." Asmussen's original plan called for Rachel to ship to Saratoga Race Course July 5, but unusually hot weather may move those plans up a few days. "I think we've got to get out of this weather," Asmussen said. "The flag's stuck to the pole today." According to Churchill barn notes, it was 81 degrees when Rachel breezed around 6:30 a.m., and "conditions were so humid that camera lenses immediately fogged up when lens caps were removed by photographers hoping to record the champion's work." Despite the mercury, Asmussen said the champ seems to have emerged from her Fleur de Lis exertions no worse for wear. "She acts like the rest of us do right now--it's hot," he said. "[But] her weight's good and she's very sound, and her strength is good. But it's hot. We'd all feel better if it was about 20 degrees cooler."

GRADE I WINNER LINE OF DAVID RETIRED

The three-year-old colt **Line of David** (Lion Heart--Emma's Dilemma, by Capote), winner of this year's \$1 million GI Arkansas Derby, has been retired from racing and will stand next season at B. Wayne Hughes' Spendthrift Farm in Kentucky, it was announced yesterday. Racing for owners Ike and Dawn Thrash, Line of David won consecutive one-mile races over Santa Anita's lawn in February and March, then announced himself on the Triple Crown scene with an upset victory in the Arkansas Derby. Put on the front that day, the John Sadler-

trained chestnut cut out honest splits and held off subsequent GI Kentucky Derby hero Super Saver (Maria's Mon) by a long neck ([video](#)). He finished unplaced in the Derby May 1 in his career finale. Line of David compiled a record of 7-3-0-1 and amassed \$662,000 in earnings. Bred in Florida by Sabine Stable, the colt hails from the female family of Mr. Prospector.

I'm sitting on a plane somewhere over Minnesota, coming back from Montana. All the week's happenings have been lost in the flash of reading Craig [Bandoroff's] letter to *TDN*. He is always right on. With an industry filled with so many brilliant minds, why are we in so much trouble? Maybe we need to be more right-brained.

While in Montana, I had a chance to catch up with a friend, a man of high intellect and well-respected within his profession of architecture. He spoke of his passion for Yellowstone Park, now being expressed during a series of charettes. A charrette is an intensive planning session where pertinent people collaborate on a vision for development. It allows everyone who participates to be a mutual author of the plan. Through brainstorming and design activity, many goals are met. They are held on four consecutive days. In Yellowstone's situation, geologists, geo-thermal people, forestry biologists and botanists, to name a few, met. In the last year or two, they have had three charettes to discuss three locations in Yellowstone. A master plan was drawn up.

Would this format work for the good of the equine industry, particularly racing? We all agree that we are going in the wrong direction. Can't we take one step further together to form a national alliance that has the best for the industry, by consent of the majority, as its goal?

We have heard both Craig and Rob [Whiteley] offer good suggestions. Why can't they continue to create a national plan or head a group that gives us a plan? It is interesting that two very active in the horse breeding and sales business have offered up ideas publicly pushing for racing reforms.

I suggest the obvious--they're both capable, and both able to put personal agendas aside for the sake of the industry. If they do not want to continue, let's find someone who will. Let's get together, at a charrette, and come up with at least one plan for racing.

Craig and Rob, thanks. You offer oxygen to all of us. Many don't realize that we are racing on thin air.

McPeek Returns After Ascot Sojourn...

Trainer Ken McPeek was back in Kentucky yesterday after a trip to England for the Royal Ascot meet. McPeek sent three horses across the pond for the prestigious meeting. **Noble's Promise** (Cuvee), fifth in the G1 Kentucky Derby, filled the same spot against Canford Cliffs (Ire) (Tagula {Ire}) in the G1 St. James's Palace S. last Tuesday. McPeek's other runners, both juveniles, finished third: the filly **Tiz My Time** (Sharp Humor) in Friday's six-furlong G3 Albany S., and the colt **Casper's Touch** (Touch Gold) in Saturday's seven-furlong Listed Chesham S. "It was in the 60s over there and it was great for the horses," McPeek said after returning to a sweltering Louisville. "All three horses are doing well and will fly to New York on

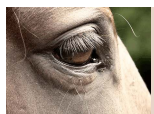

I'm rather ashamed to admit it, but, on a recent holiday to a beautiful part of Barbados, I found myself whiling away some idle moments watching vintage racing footage on YouTube. Perhaps you'll forgive me, though, when I tell you the footage was entitled "Danzig--What Might Have Been" ([YouTube video](#)). The Northern Dancer colt is shown trouncing the opposition on his three appearances on the track, with the commentary rightly drawing attention to his powerful stride and hard-driving action, which were to result in career-ending knee problems.

My fascination with this film stems from the fact that, 30 years after his retirement, Danzig is arguably the most dominant force in European breeding. This was highlighted in more ways than one at last week's Royal Ascot meeting, with the Norfolk S. providing a telling example of the ubiquity of Danzig blood (especially in the sprint/juvenile sector). Of the 12 juvenile colts in this Group 2 contest, no fewer than 10 are members of the Danzig male line, with four descending from Green Desert and the other six from Danehill.

On this occasion, the Green Desert branch came out on top, with Approve giving the remarkable Oasis Dream his second group success of the meeting (and his third stakes success of the week). Green Desert himself got into the act, taking the G2 Queen Mary S. with the exciting Maqaasid, a filly conceived when her veteran sire was 24.

Even so, the Green Desert branch was overshadowed at the Royal Meeting by the Danehill clan. Considering that none of his progeny aged three or over was sired at a fee higher than £12,500, Danehill's son Dansili covered himself in glory by siring Strawberrydaiquiri and Harbinger, both winners at Group 2 level, plus Dandino, a progressive winner of a very competitive handicap.

Even so, Dansili faced fierce competition from another son of Danehill, Danehill Dancer, who went very close to matching Dansili's stakes treble. Although his son Quadrille failed by a short head to carry the Queen's colours to victory in the Hampton Court S., Danehill Dancer scored a notable group-race double the following day, when Memory won the G3 Albany S. and Lillie Langtry took the G1 Coronation S. Lillie Langtry's win means that Danehill, Danehill Dancer and another son in Rock of Gibraltar have all sired Group 1 winners from daughters of Darshaan.

Danehill Dancer then completed a notable week on the final day, when both the highly competitive six-furlong sprints fell to the progeny of his very fast Australian son Choisir. Choisir's imported son Starspangledbanner shone in the G1 Golden Jubilee, and then his Irish-bred daughter Laddies Poker Two landed a huge gamble in the Wokingham H. Choisir also went quite close to a treble, as it was his son Reckless Reward who finished second to Approve in the G2 Norfolk S.

Danehill Dancer, of course, started his stallion career even further down the pecking order than Dansili, yet both have done so well that they rank among the highest-priced stallions in their respective countries. Danehill Dancer's fee was only A\$7,500 when he sired Choisir in his second season in Australia, but Choisir's outstanding sprint double at the 2003 Royal Ascot meeting was one of the factors that helped send his sire's fee soaring in Ireland.

Ironically, Choisir's double as a sire at the 2010 Royal Meeting came in the year when Coolmore decided not

to send him to Ireland for the Northern Hemisphere season. He had shuttled for the previous six years, but he is credited with covering no more than 75 mares in 2009. With nothing better than a pair of Group 3 winners to his credit from his Irish crops in 2009, he would probably have

faced a hard task in these difficult times in 2010. The bare facts are that--with his eldest progeny now five--Choisir has only three group winners from his Irish foals and none has won a Group 1 so far.

Keeneland's lineup is in a league of its own.

World-class athletes from Keeneland Sales continue to dominate graded stakes races with super sophomore *Paddy O'Prado* and two new players – *Afleet Express* and *Golden Itiz*.

At Royal Ascot, a fabulous freshman crop shows the start of things to come with *Strong Suit* and *Zaidan* scoring two wins.

Admittedly, Choisir faced an uphill struggle to win support from European breeders, who wouldn't have been too familiar with the bottom half of his pedigree (even though his broodmare sire, Lunchtime, had won the Dewhurst S. back in 1972). That said, he started out at €15,000 in 2004, which is considerably more than the type of fee Danehill Dancer originally commanded.

Fortunately, Choisir has enjoyed much more success in his native Australia, to the extent that he covered 194 mares at a fee of A\$33,000 in 2008 and 227 mares at A\$35,750 in 2009. His Southern Hemisphere crops have produced nine group winners in Australia, with Starspangledbanner being the only Group 1 winner (though there are six Group 2 winners).

Choisir's fee remains at A\$35,750 this year, which places him above the likes of Henrythenavigator, Rock of Gibraltar, Duke of Marmalade, Holy Roman Emperor and Dylan Thomas on the Coolmore Australia roster. That roster also contains Haradasun, who is priced at A\$24,750.

This son of Fusaichi Pegasus had set a precedent for Starspangledbanner by becoming a Group 1 winner for Aidan O'Brien at Royal Ascot, after his Australian exploits had encouraged Coolmore to buy into him for a considerable sum. For Haradasun, the reported figure was A\$22.5 million for a half share, but the worldwide economic downturn meant that Coolmore had to pay no more than A\$10.25 million for a 95-percent interest in Starspangledbanner.

Coincidentally, both these Australian Royal Ascot winners come from the same family. Starspangledbanner's second dam National Song, by the champion sire Vain, is a half-sister to Circles of Gold, the dam of Haradasun.

Haradasun was the second major winner produced by Starspangledbanner's pedigree. Circles of Gold, his predecessor being the top-class Danehill colt Elvstroem, who scored at Group 1 level from seven furlongs to a mile and a half in Australia, as well as winning the G1 Dubai Duty Free S. over nine furlongs.

There is a lot of stamina in this section of Starspangledbanner's pedigree. Circles of Gold won the AJC Australian Oaks over a mile and a half, and also contested the two-mile Melbourne Cup. It is fair to assume that Circles of Gold inherited her stamina from her broodmare sire Zamazaan rather than her sire Marscay. Whereas Marscay gained his eight successes (including the Golden Slipper S.) at up to seven furlongs, Zamazaan excelled over long distances in France.

Despite being a Group 1 winner at up to a mile in Australia, Starspangledbanner is a speedier type than his close relative Elvstroem. No doubt, this is partly thanks to his broodmare sire Made of Gold, a smart British juvenile of 1991 by Green Forest, an outstanding French juvenile who later took the Prix du Moulin.

You have worked with the internationally respected Jim Bolger.

What's the best piece of advice he gave you? Ride the horses you train; it is the only way to truly know how good they are and how they are progressing. **What else did you take away from him?** Meticulous attention to detail. Don't stress: "pressure" is for footballs and tires.

What are some things you've observed overseas that you think might help racing in North America? European and Australian trained horses are conditioned without the use of medications. For example, fast work is not conducted with Lasix, and sedatives are rarely, if ever, used. Horses are trained by the trainer and interaction with a veterinarian is minimal. In this environment, you can clearly see the stress that the horse endures physically and mentally, and the trainer can make informed decisions on the individual training programs accordingly. Young horses are, as a result, not pushed as hard or as quickly in Europe. I believe horses that stand up to training in Europe are much more durable than their North American counterparts for the simple reason that weakness is not masked at the age of two with medicine.

What is your favorite racetrack and why? Rosehill Race Track in Sydney, Australia is a beautiful setting of picnic tables, white picket fences and rose bushes. Add sunny conditions and top-quality horse racing, and you have a wonderful day of racing!

Most fascinating racetrack character you've met? Australian racehorse trainer Gai Waterhouse has an endless supply of enthusiasm!

If you could have dinner with one historical figure, who would it be, and why? I would invite Ireland's Dr. Michael Vincent O'Brien, United States' Arthur B. "Bull" Hancock Jr., Canada's E.P. Taylor and Australia's Tommy J. Smith to dinner! (Sorry--is there room for five at the table?)

Favorite food or meal? Morton's Steakhouse filet mignon and chocolate souffle for dessert.

What's your favorite film? "The Man from Snowy River" versus "Let It Ride"--too close to call!

What's playing on your iPod right now? Dave Matthews Band's album "Crash."

What is your drink of choice? Soy Tazo Chai Tea Latte from Starbucks.

Favorite hobbies? Reading, shopping, soccer, Tae Kwon Do.

Where would you like to go that you haven't already been? Saratoga!

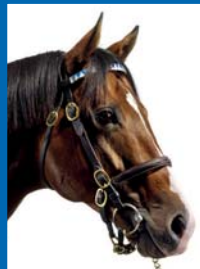
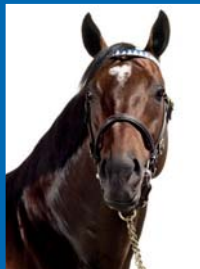

NJSEA UNDECIDED ON EXCHANGE WAGERING

New Jersey's exchange betting legislation, Bill A2926, which passed out of committee Thursday, June 17, was not posted for the state legislature's voting sessions Monday or Thursday this week. But officials at the New Jersey Sports and Exposition Authority are keeping a close eye on proceedings. If exchange wagering is approved in New Jersey, the NJSEA will have the opportunity to create and operate the exchange wagering platform, which would allow New Jersey residents to go head-to-head in placing bets on horse races. It has not yet been decided if they will take advantage of that opportunity. The NJSEA is in the process of studying all sides of the issue. "We are looking at all of our options," explained Dennis Robinson, president and CEO of the NJSEA. "Obviously, we made the strategic decision to experiment with Monmouth's 50-day meet, and we are looking at anything that can breathe new life into New Jersey racing. Exchange wagering is one of the things we are looking at, but we are just studying right now." Robinson added, "It's worth exploring, to evaluate whether it's an experiment worth trying or not. We've got to weigh the pros and cons. It's certainly intriguing, it's certainly creative." Exactly how revenue from exchange wagering would be divided has not yet been addressed, and there's no telling what tracks might be offered on the platform. "Just as with account wagering, tracks [outside of New Jersey] would have to decide whether they wanted to participate or not," Robinson confirmed. Once the bill goes through the legislative process, the NJSEA will have a better idea as to what direction they will take. "We have to look at the impact it would have on overall wagering, what the economic impact would be," Robinson said. "We have a lot to consider. If the bill is passed, then it will be up to the Authority to decide whether to apply for a license or not."

FORMER JOCKEY-TRAINER BUCALO DIES

John Bucalo, a veteran of over 55 years in the Thoroughbred industry, died Saturday after a lengthy illness. He was 93. A former jockey, Bucalo trained stakes winners Actor II, Brass II, Montmarte, Noble Bronze, Princess Toby and Tobin Rose. He also worked as agent for the late Hall of Fame rider Johnny Adams. Funeral services will be private.
