NINE NEW FACES ON BC BOARD

Officials at Breeders' Cup Limited yesterday announced the election of 13 well-credentialed horsemen to its Board of Members and Trustees. Voting concluded June 22 at 5 p.m. ET, and the results are expected to be ratified by the current Board of Members and Trustees at its July 16 meeting. Each of the 13 elected members will serve a three-year term, beginning in July. The top 13 votegetters, in alphabetical order, were: Antony Beck, Gainesway Farm; Niall Brennan, Niall Brennan Stables; Case Clay, Three Chimneys Farm; Jerry Crawford, Donegal Rac-



ing/Derby Dreams Partnership; Bobby Flay, Thoroughbred owner and restaurateur; G. Watts Humphrey Jr., Shawnee Farm; Roy Jackson, Lael Stables; Bret Jones, Airdrie Bloodstock Services; Michael T. Levy, Bluewater Farm; Garrett O'Rourke, Juddmonte Farms; Satish K. Sanan, Padua Stables; Robert Trussell Jr., Walmac Farm; and David Willmot; Kinghaven Farms Ltd. Willmot received the highest number of votes. Beck, Humphrey, Jackson and Sanan were reelected to the Board. For the first time, this year's election allowed nominating entities to assign proxies to their shareholders. Voting began June 8 with 28 candidates and was conducted online. A record 62 percent of the available votes were cast. "Our nominators have chosen a knowledgeable, talented and experienced cross-section of breeders and owners representing the best of the Thoroughbred industry for service as Members and Trustees," said Breeders' Cup Chairman William S. Farish, Jr. "I am especially pleased with the record level of voter participation, which demonstrates how much our core constituents care about our organization."

OAK TREE LOOKING TO DEL MAR FOR 2011

One day after Santa Anita Park owner Frank Stronach agreed to a one-year extension of the lease for the organization to conduct its 2010 race meeting at the Arcadia oval, Oak Tree Racing Association board member John Barr told *Daily Racing Form* that the group will seek to hold its 2011 stand at Del Mar. "Mr. Stronach does not want us there in the future," Barr told *DRF*. "We don't have any hope we will be there beyond 2010. We can concentrate on going to Del Mar and working out an agreement with them." And Del Mar seems agreeable to the idea, said its president Craig Fravel. "Both the [nearby] fair grounds and us have said we're interested in doing this," he told the trade daily. Barr was one of five Oak Tree board members who participated in an impromptu meeting with Stronach Tuesday afternoon, and somewhat surprisingly found themselves agreeing to the one-year lease extension at Santa Anita. The Oak Tree meet is expected to take place from Sept. 29 to Oct. 31. Barr admitted that Oak Tree was close to a lease agreement with Hollywood Park. "[Hollywood President] Jack Liebaw really helped us out," Barr told the *Form*. "We'd gone pretty far down the road with them and the lease practically in hand. We felt bad about that." Should the 2011 dates be allotted at Del Mar, it would create 13 weeks of racing at the seaside oval.

UPTOWNCHARLYBROWN DQ CHALLENGED

Fantasy Lane Stables has appealed the disqualification of its GI Belmont S. fifth-place finisher **Uptowncharlybrown** (Limehouse), according to *Daily Racing Form*. The colt was disqualified for failing to carry the proper weight throughout the race after he lost an eight-pound weighted pad five furlongs into the 1 1/2-mile Classic. In the appeal to the New York State Racing and Wagering Board, Fantasy Lane is seeking restitution of the \$30,000 in purse money. Bob Hutt, president of Fantasy Lane, claims that the New York Racing Association is responsible for the mishap because a valet employed by the association helped make up the saddle and helped saddle the Kiaran McLaughlin-trained colt before the race.

SHOW ME THE MONEY... MONMOUTH 2010

In an ongoing series, the TDN will take a look at Monmouth Park's inaugural 50-day, \$50 million Elite Summer Meet

BREEN THERE, DONE THAT

Heading into last weekend, Kelly Breen, who over the last few years could be counted on to rank among the top trainers at Monmouth Park, had accounted for only one victory from 19 starters since the 2010 Elite meeting had begun May 22. Breen, who can be easily picked out of a crowd by his sharp suits and trademark fedora, returned to the leaderboard in style over the weekend, winning with three of four starters, including a runaway score by two-year-old **Sweet Ducky** (Pulpit) and the well-bred sophomore **They Call Me Giant** (Giant's Causeway).

And to what did Breen attribute the sluggish start to the season?

"It was just racing luck," Breen offered. "We were happy that the horses were running well. We were 50 percent in the money, with one win. Sooner or later, getting the photo finishes or the right trip, we knew the tide was going to change."

Born in Perth Amboy, New Jersey, Breen--who served as an assistant to trainer Ben Perkins Sr. before going out on his own at the start of this decade--took the reins as George and Lori Hall's private trainer in 2007. Included among Breen's past winners for the Hall's is Bickersons (Silver Deputy), victorious in the GII Forward Gal S. at Gulfstream in January.

"Going into last weekend, we had high hopes for our horses," said Breen, who currently has a full draft of 36 horses stabled at the Oceanport oval.

Breen's faith was well warranted with **Wild About Sonny** (Officer), who kicked off the stable's winning skein when edging the highly-regarded Overseas Market (Stormy Atlantic) in a five-furlong test for juvenile fillies last Saturday ([video](#)).

"I like her and she ran a great race," said Breen. "She broke with the field and we know she can close--everything kind of worked out our way. She was very professional."

Obviously pleased with the result, Breen was admittedly a little surprised by the victory, although not

by his filly's level of performance.

NTRA REPORT FROM CAPITOL HILL



BONUS DEPRECIATION LEGISLATION INTRODUCED

Senate Finance Committee Chairman [Max Baucus](#) (D-MT) and Ranking Member [Charles Grassley](#) (R-IA) introduced legislation this week to continue 50 percent bonus depreciation, a measure that was first enacted as part of the 2008 economic stimulus effort and was renewed in 2009.

The "Bonus Depreciation Extension to Create Jobs Act" ([S. 3513](#)) allows businesses to recover the cost of certain depreciable property more quickly than ordinary tax treatment permits. Broadly, this tax benefit is designed to create jobs by encouraging business investment in equipment and other property often manufactured by small businesses.

Bonus depreciation expired at the end of last year and was not included in the "Hiring Incentives to Restore Employment (HIRE) Act of 2010" ([H.R. 2847](#)) that reinstated an increase in the small business expensing allowance at \$250,000.

Horse racing industry members who purchase equipment and/or horses in 2010 are poised to enjoy another year of tax incentives with the combination of an increase in the small business expensing allowance and the potential for bonus depreciation.

"I'm not going to say she shocked me, but she hasn't shown that much speed in the morning, and I was a little concerned about it going into the race," admitted Breen. "[Jockey] Elvis [Trujillo] had known that going into the race. She had been working against some of our better colts, but just not having the speed--and going five furlongs at this point in time of the year--it was a pleasant surprise at how well she ran."

Breen said that he has yet to decide where the chestnut would make her next start.

Getting Sunday's card off to a rocking start was the Hall's **Sweet Ducky**, purchased for \$135,000 at Keeneland last September. Showing plenty of gas out of the gate, the bay drew off to graduate by five widening lengths ([video](#)).

"He showed a lot of class and we're hoping we can go forward with him," said Breen, confirming, "His next race, more likely than not, I would assume is going to be a stakes."

Breen, whose juvenile team also collected a trio of runner-up finishes at Monmouth earlier in the meet, indicated those horses were expected to return to action over the upcoming Fourth of July weekend.

“They should be coming back soon and we have high hopes for them,” he said.

Chief among the returning two-year-olds is **Sleepless Dixie** (Dixie Union), who was 3/4 of a length behind Show Me the Bling (Too Much Bling) June 5 ([video](#)).

“She’s just a class act,” stated Breen. “I was a little disappointed that she didn’t win first time out, but a couple of things happened during the race. She drew the rail and didn’t break as well as she normally does in the morning.”

The filly, who was entered but later scratched out of the race won by stablemate Wild About Sonny last weekend, is expected to return to action July 3.

“I think next time out she should have a little more seasoning that will put her over the top,” Breen affirmed.

Rounding out the luckless trio are a pair of colts by Yes It’s True--**Brother in Arms** and **Nacho Saint**--who may mark their reappearance July 5.

“Behind that bunch, I have another wave of horses that are just getting OK’d out of the gate,” confirmed Breen. “They just came up from Ocala and just started breezing.”

Meet the Elite...

The influx of money, horses and horsemen on the scene for Monmouth’s Elite meet has sent wagering figures soaring, while giving a much-welcome boost to on-track attendance. In the meantime, local horsemen, including Breen, have tried to strike a happy medium throughout the process.

“We’ve taken things pretty much in stride,” commented Breen. “The races are definitely tougher. Some of the guys who have been at Monmouth Park, their stats might not be as good as they have been in the past, but if you win five percent less than you did last year, you could actually still be earning more money now. So you have to take that into consideration as to where you are at in terms of purse money in relation to what it looks like on paper, since your percentages might not look as good in the past.”

Breen, who patronizes Monmouth exclusively during the Jersey Shore oval’s live meet, admitted that his operation has felt the impact from some of the most significant changes to the program this year, including the decision to cap the number of stalls from 44 to 34 per trainer.

“The first thing that hurt us was the inability to bring as many horses as we’d like,” admitted Breen. “They cut everybody back in stalls. So some of my less expensive or claiming horses, I couldn’t bring them in as early as I would have liked to because I was worried about having enough room for my two-year-olds that were going to be running for higher purses. So I have a few older maidens still sitting on the farm in Ocala waiting to come up. So unless I sell something or move something, I don’t have the room for them.”

And I didn’t want to open up a different division in different state or on a farm. That’s costly and you’re not on top of everything.”

Over the past few years, the Hall’s have been active in expanding their racing operation, while acquiring higher-class stock intended on developing a Classic contender. Breen acknowledges, should a similar scenario present itself at Monmouth next season, he would probably have to sit down and reevaluate, and possibly restructure, his stable’s game plan.

“I really don’t know if we would revamp our stable and maybe try and get rid of some of the cheaper horses earlier in the meet, make room for the better horses,” offered Breen. “Maybe I would try and figure out if we are going to bring in some of the older horses as opposed to maybe taking our time [on the farm] with some of the babies and maybe not even breaking them as early as we had to.”

According to Breen, the Halls have expanded their Thoroughbred holdings to approximately 75 horses--mostly racing stock--and 20 head made up of broodmares, yearlings and weanlings, at the Hall’s Annestes Farm in Versailles, Kentucky. Reflecting the expansion of the Hall’s racing operation, Breen indicated that in 2009, he managed 17 juveniles for the couple, while his current team of babies is up to 25.

“We have some well-bred distance horses that are two-year-olds that I’m waiting on [one] mile races for, and we’re lucky to make the five or six furlong races go,” explained Breen. “I’m sitting on some horses that maybe I could manage them a little bit different and say ‘Hey, they don’t need to be here right now.’ So the

bottom line is that our numbers are up and the stall space is limited, so it kind of hurt me a little bit.”

Despite some of the inconveniences, Breen’s desire to bolster the Hall’s racing program--and his drive to support New Jersey racing--is unwavering.

“This is our third year of having a lot of babies coming up here, so we’re kind of in the building process of trying to get more

horses, and the right horses for Monmouth,” he said. “If this were to continue next year, we have a little bit better quality juveniles this year, which means we will have better quality three-year-olds for next year. So it will all carry over to next year, and hopefully, those will go one to make better older horses for our operation.”
