WAKE AT NOON EUTHANIZED AT WOODBINE

Thirteen-year-old **Wake At Noon** (Cure the Blues--Sermon Time, by Silver Deputy), named the champion sprinter, champion older horse and Horse of the Year in Canada in 2002, was euthanized Tuesday at Woodbine after breaking down during a morning workout. The chestnut, who had not raced since 2007, had been retired to stud, but sired just 19 foals from three crops and had returned to training at owner Bruno Schickedanz's farm. He shipped to Woodbine Tuesday to breeze. Woodbine Entertainment's Executive Vice President of racing Jamie Martin told the Toronto *Star* that there would be an investigation. "We're looking into it," Martin said. "I have the same concerns as everyone else. We will make some decisions as soon as we talk to all of the parties." Wake At Noon was not eligible to race at Woodbine, which does not take entries on horses over 10 that have not won in the past year. Schickedanz told the Toronto daily that the catastrophic injury was the result of tragic accident. "It was a freak thing I am told," Schickedanz said in a telephone interview with the *Star*. "He spooked from another horse and took a bad step. I feel terrible about it." Explaining why the champion was back in training, he added, "He was not getting many mares in foal. This spring he was shooting blanks, so he has been training at my farm for a few months. I wanted to send him to Woodbine and see what he would do in a workout. He's been acting like a three-year-old at the farm. I had plans to send him to race at Mountaineer Park." Wake At Noon's body was sent to Guelph University, and the results of the necropsy will be sent to the Ontario Racing Commission. Bred and raced by Schickedanz, he was retired to stud in 2004. Back at the track in 2005, 2006 and 2007, he made 16 starts over the three seasons and winning twice, but failing to hit the board in five stakes appearances. Overall, he compiled a record of 67-21-8-7, with four Grade III victories, and earned \$1,681,386.

Surgery for Lady Shakespeare...

Charles Fipke's homebred **Lady Shakespeare** (Theatrical {Ire}), who captured the Apr. 22 Gill Bewitch S. at Keeneland and June 19 GII New York S. at Belmont, suffered a condylar fracture of the right hind leg and will undergo surgery this week, *Daily Racing Form* reports. The injury was discovered after a routine gallop at Woodbine. "It was after just an easy canter, her first day back to the track, that we knew there was a problem," trainer Roger Attfield told *DRF*. A winner of four in a row last season, including the Ontario Colleen S. in August, the four-year-old was fifth in the GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup in Lexington in her 2009 finale. She opened 2010 with a pair of photo-finish losses, running second in the Jan. 16 Marshua's River S. and Mar. 28 Gill Orchid S. at Gulfstream before getting back on top in the Bewitch. To date, she has a record of 12-7-2-1 and a bankroll of \$495,608. As for her prognosis, Attfield added. "She'll be fine. It just messes us up, for the Breeders' Cup and everything."

Rachel Alexandra Arrives at Spa...

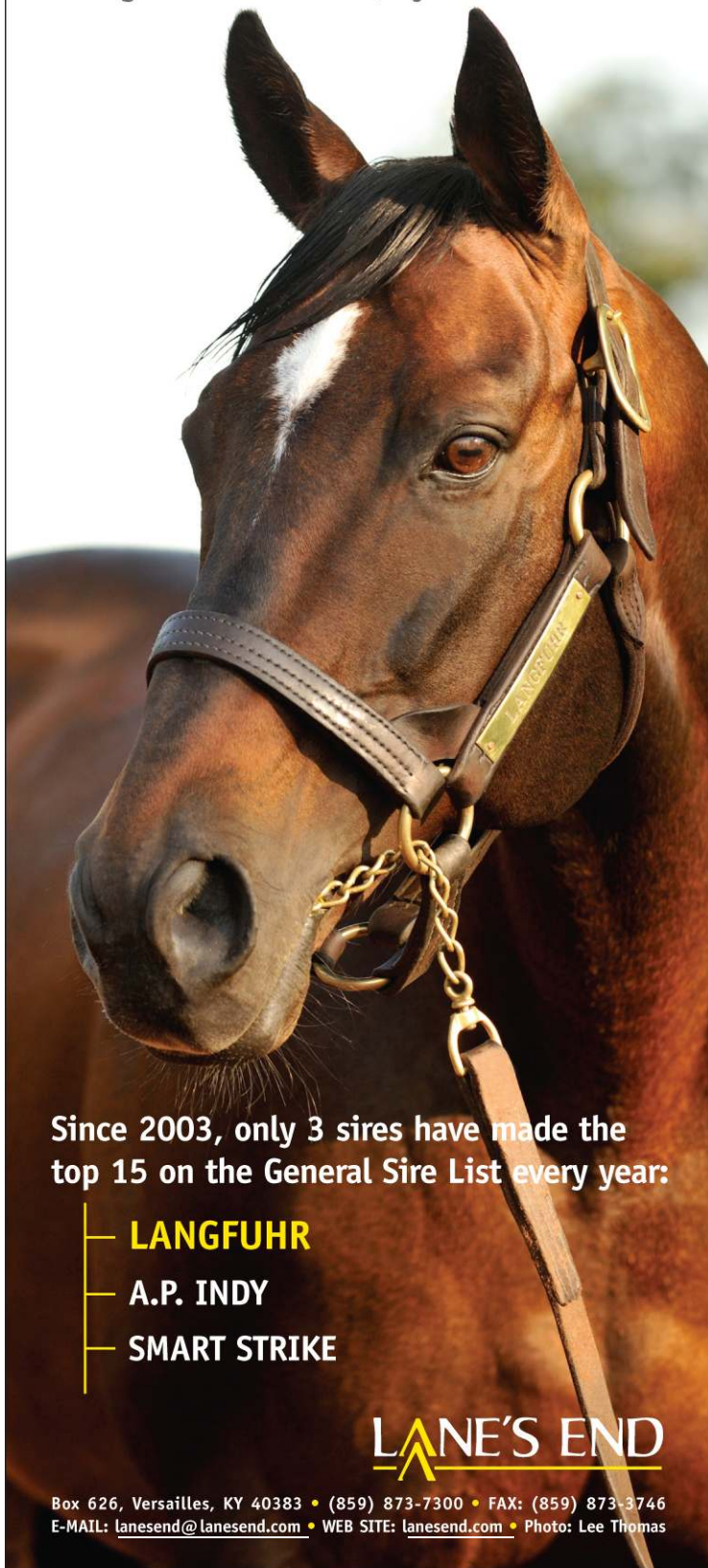
Reigning Horse of the Year **Rachel Alexandra** (Medaglia d'Oro) arrived at Saratoga yesterday after a four-hour trip from Churchill Downs. "She's at Saratoga and everything is good," confirmed Scott Blasi, assistant to trainer Steve Asmussen. "The air is good; the water tastes good. It's all positive. She looks fabulous right now. I am looking forward to getting her back to the track tomorrow." Rachel Alexandra, coming off a 10 1/2-length victory in the June 12 GII Fleur de Lis H., is expected to work at Saratoga Monday. Her next start has not yet been determined.

Berg Bahn, who like her owner/breeder's Epsom Oaks heroine Snow Fairy (Ire) (Intikhab) was bought back as a yearling for under €2,000 at Tattersalls Ireland, made a splash at Meydan during the Carnival when a closing third in the Feb. 11 Listed UAE 1000 Guineas on Tapeta. She may have found the 9 1/2 furlongs of the Listed UAE Oaks too far when fourth a fortnight later, and her only subsequent effort when weakening late in Royal Ascot's Listed Sandringham H. June 16 convinced connections to shorten her up. Restrained early in fifth racing against the fence, the bay was angled out as the long-time leader Miss Gorica attempted to give her rivals the slip inside the final quarter. 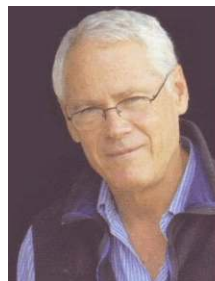

Op/Ed

As Tim Capps wrote in his recent Op/Ed ([Finding a Way Forward for Horse Racing](#), TDN, June 25, 2010) "people who love racing in America ... are more concerned about its health, well-being and, above all future, than at any time in the writer's increasingly lengthy memory." Concern, however, is not enough. We need active love.

This is clearly a time for people who love racing to speak up, to find a way to make their voice heard, and to get involved. In this time of current crisis, it is not OK for those who love the sport to go about business as usual, while passively watching (or conveniently ignoring) our steady qualitative and quantitative decline. It is not OK to do nothing, any more than it is OK to stand by on the sidewalk and look on while someone is being mugged or beaten. (In this instance, hands-on horsemen, racehorse owners, bettors, and our equine athletes are the ones being mugged and beaten).

And, as members of an intertwined Thoroughbred community, it is also not OK to mind our own business while the business of others goes down the drain along with the sport as we know it or wish it to be.

Although much damage has already been done, we still have a tiny window of opportunity to create the kinds of changes that can make a difference, but we need people across all strata to join hands and work actively together...or get out of the way. Dylan's great American ballad still has sway after nearly 50 years, "get out of the way if you can't lend a hand, the times they are a'changin'."

A few recent events reflect a growing awareness that change must occur: several racing commissioners continue to talk about a partial compact; a large number of internet blogs have been spawned that target important issues; Bobby Kulina and his team at Monmouth designed a risky but innovative new paradigm for their race meet; an unusually large number of individuals (28) ran for the Breeders' Cup board, presumably to help it become more than a two-day event that is largely unknown to the general public, etc. But we need many more initiatives that target the lack of cohesion and innovation that defines our industry.

In particular, we need our younger, technology-driven generation of horsemen (those who will inherit this sorry complex of fractionated interests and general dysfunction), to mobilize their IT acumen and social networking platforms in order to shake up the "status quo," create virtual horseracing games and experiences, laser the moss off the Trustees Room at Belmont Park and other rooms like it, breathe down the necks of racing commissioners, and sculpt a future for themselves and the sport they love. The bar has been set low by their elders, and they can do much better if they organize effectively and develop imaginative strategies. Toward that end, a recently formed organization called Vision 20/20 (a group of young horse professionals under the age of 40) gives a glimmer of hope for a better tomorrow.

Unless our young people can figure a way out through the maze of fiefdoms and disparate rules and regulations, we will soon have status similar to boxing. Tim Capps, on the other hand, takes an historian's perspective and believes that "a turn-around WILL come and perhaps is already underway." I don't see it and I don't believe it. Our fundamentals were in serious decline before the recession and financial crisis hit the general economy, and the notion that our horse business will "come back" with the overall economy (when and if that happens) appears to be nothing more than wishful thinking.

In my opinion, an historical view does not apply to our current circumstance. We have never been here before. Our problems in combination are severe and unique within the history of American racing: intense competition for the gambling dollar from superior marketers in other wagering venues; a loss of fans and TV exposure to major sports (we are now a minor sport and slipping); a broken simulcast and racing model that deprives bettors, owners, and tracks of a fair return on investment, and pits them against each other; a 20-year drain of our top quality bloodstock to foreign shores; widespread substitution of veterinary intervention for true horsemanship; a drug problem that persists because of multiple sets of regulations and inadequate testing and enforcement; a shrinking fan and owner base; a dual disconnect between stud fees and breeder profitability on the front end of the production chain, and between training and vet expenses and purses for owners at the back end; constant scrutiny from animal rights activists; and, in many instances, the devastation of having the same people making decisions year after year.

For sure, historical or academic perspectives have their uses. Analyzing what has gone on before may yield useful insights that can inspire or guide new or reformulated strategies. And the timeless observation that "those who do not learn from history are doomed to repeat it," is a truism that applies to any era. However, thinking that things will somehow get better because we have had other downturns and have always "come back" is a highly speculative use of history, especially given today's kaleidoscopic set of vexing variables within a fast-paced and rapidly changing world.

Squinting through an historical lens reveals the harsh reality of all: we humans have squandered the most exquisite advantage in all of sport, the equine athlete and the intrinsic fascination that many humans have for horses. We have been given a magical gift; but we have brought no magic of our own.

Of course, there will always be horse racing. As Tim Capps wrote, "people are not going to stop liking horses, or enjoying seeing them run, or wanting to bet on the outcome." However, the landscape for the next Tim Capps to write about 20 years from now will be greatly changed, and many hands-on horsemen (who generally love horses more profoundly and intimately than those who watch them or write about them) will be gone from the scene, unnecessarily.

Inevitable contraction will recast the sport to resemble earlier eras when it became known as the Sport of Kings and was almost exclusively a playground for the powerful and privileged. The only thing different will be the size of the crowds. We will have a few boutique meets like that of Keeneland, Del Mar, Saratoga and Monmouth, and a few big events. Our once thriving industry that employed tens of thousands of individuals and accounted for billions of dollars in GDP will be little more than a club sport for the wealthy, and a national afterthought that will occasionally catch the public's eye around a big event or special horse.

Thus, if you are an industry participant who loves horses and wants more than this scenario (whether you are a vet, bloodstock agent, owner, trainer, van driver, breeder, stallion manager, sales company executive, farrier, feed man, fence builder, groom, hotwalker, or alphabet Board member, etc.), you have a responsibility to yourself and a shared responsibility to others. WIRE ACT CLARIFICATION BILL INTRODUCED

Reps. [Scott Murphy](#) (D-NY) and [Brett Guthrie](#) (R-KY) recently introduced the "Wire Clarification Act of 2010" (H.R. 5599), a bill that calls for a Wire Act amendment to affirm the legality of pari-mutuel wagering over the Internet.

The Wire Act is a 1961 federal law that prohibits the use of wire communications to transmit bets on sporting events and contests. In contrast, the 1978 Interstate Horseracing Act (IHA) helped expand the horseracing industry by permitting interstate pari-mutuel wagering.

Other related legislation is the Unlawful Internet Gambling Enforcement Act (UIGEA) of 2006 that effectively banned the use of credit for any type of Internet gaming but protected pari-mutuel wagering on horseracing, as authorized by an amendment to the IHA in 2000.

UIGEA regulations went into effect on June 1, 2010. Although the regulations permit banks and credit institutions to process transactions associated with pari-mutuel wagering, some have exercised their right to decline such transactions to avoid being penalized for mistakenly processing those not permitted under UIGEA. This development is of particular concern for advance deposit wagering companies and H.R. 5599 is tailored to provide relief.

COURT APPROVES ZAYAT STABLES

SETTLEMENT The U.S. Bankruptcy Court for the District of New Jersey has approved a reorganization plan submitted last week by Zayat Stables, which will settle its financial responsibilities to Fifth Third Bank. In a statement, Zayat Stables' owner Ahmed Zayat said, "I am thrilled that the judge has approved the global settlement that was proposed to the court between us and Fifth Third. This is a huge step forward, not only for Zayat Stables, but for the entire equine industry. With all outstanding matters finally resolved, we can keep our focus where it needs to be--on breeding and racing some of the top horses in America." A confirmation hearing in front of the Bankruptcy Court is set for July 15, and Fifth Third has indicated it will vote in favor of the settlement at that time.

TRIO OF BIDS SUBMITTED FOR AQUEDUCT

CASINO Three entities--Penn National Gaming, the Malaysian-based Genting New York and the partnership of SL Green, Hard Rock Entertainment and the Clairvest Group--Tuesday submitted bids to become the licensed operator of the Aqueduct casino. Six groups took part in the early stages of the process, but two, Delaware North Gaming and Yonkers Raceway's Empire State Casino, opted out. Clairvest, a publicly traded merchant bank that invests in mid-market companies, had initially been listed as a sixth potential operator, but changed gears and joined forces with Penn National and SL Green prior to Tuesday's 4 p.m. deadline for submissions. The New York State Lottery, which was put in charge of finding an operator in May, is scheduled to make its recommendation to Gov. David Paterson Aug. 3. If the Governor, State Assembly Speaker Sheldon Silver and temporary State Senate President Malcolm Smith grant approval, the casino is expected to open some time next year. It will offer 4,500 video lottery terminals, and is predicted to generate as much as \$600 million in net revenue annually, with seven percent going to the New York Racing Association and 6 1/2 percent to purses.

TRF ANNOUNCES RESTRUCTURING The board of the Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation, the oldest and largest non-profit association devoted to the after-care of racehorses, has announced a restructuring of its internal operations. The new structure comes in response to the growth of the organization and the increasing demand from the racing industry and fans for humane treatment of ex-racehorses. Two new positions have been created, and the organization will now maintain offices in Saratoga, New York, and Lexington, Kentucky. Diana Pikulski, who has served as TRF Executive Director for 15 years and was named one of the industry's "25 Most Influential Women," will fill the new position of Executive Director for External Affairs, and will continue to work from the foundation's office in Saratoga Springs. Longtime Thoroughbred owner and breeder and retired tobacco industry executive Larry Taylor has been appointed Chief Executive Officer of the TRF.

Taylor will oversee the TRF's multi-state operations from the TRF's new headquarters at Maker's Mark Secretariat Center at the Kentucky Horse Park in Lexington. The moves come in response to the board's recently concluded study of the TRF's operation and mission, according to TRF Chairman Tom Ludt, President of Vinery Ltd. "We are excited to have someone with Larry's executive experience to manage what has become a large, complex operation," Ludt said. "Handing the operation's reins over to Larry will free up Diana to focus on vital development and public relations issues. The restructuring of these two new positions will also provide for a more robust marketing and development effort, one that reaches beyond the racing world and sends a message of compassion for equine athletes that reflects well on the racing industry." Said Pikulski, "I am pleased to be able to concentrate fully on funding the important mission of the TRF. The industry's growing acknowledgement of retirement as a component of equine welfare has put an increasing financial burden on all retirement and rescue operations, but we happily accept this responsibility in partnership with the many individuals and organizations who share this vision." A Lexington native, Taylor has actively been involved in the Thoroughbred industry for more than 20 years. He is the founder of Taylor Hall LLC, a commercial breeding and racing operation in Midway, Kentucky, and has been involved in the development of Hurricane Hall and Pauls Mill Farm.

Discount For Breeders' Cup Early Foal Nominators:

The Breeders' Cup will once again offer a \$100 discount off the \$500 fee for breeders who nominate their foals of 2010 to the Breeders' Cup program electronically by the end of the business day Aug. 1. The discount program, unveiled in 2009, saved breeders around the world more than \$1 million last year, when a record 10,241 foals were nominated. That marked an increase in Breeders' Cup foal nominations of nearly 200 percent. The previous high was 3,500 in 2008. "We welcome nominators at all levels to again take advantage of the discount opportunities for foal nominations, and reward those who commit their foals to the program earlier in the year," said Greg Avioli, president and CEO of Breeders' Cup Ltd. "As part of this program, we want to encourage electronic nominations, which are far more efficient and economical for both the nominators and the organization." For breeders who do not take advantage of the Aug. 1 discount, the deadline for nominating foals to the Breeders' Cup is midnight, Oct. 15. Late nominations, for a fee of \$1,500, can be made until midnight, Dec. 15.

TCA Awards \$860,672 in Grants:

Thoroughbred Charities of America has distributed \$860,672 in grants to 81 non-profit organizations connected to the Thoroughbred industry. NO FIREWORKS AT SAINT-CLOUD Yesterday's renewal of the Arqana Summer Sale returned an average of €18,959, down 13 percent from 2009, and a median of €10,000, off 17 percent. Speaking at the end of the auction--which is a mixed bag of two-year-old breezers, flat horses in training and jumps prospects and stores--the sales company's Chairman Eric Hoyeau was not too downcast. "This sale is a bit tricky to assess, at it comprises different categories," explained Hoyeau. "My analysis is that the two-year-old section has consolidated its level, the horses-in-training section has played its role by ensuring the turnover of the large stables, and the store market remains difficult despite a relative improvement from last year." Four-year-old colt **Amico Mio (Fr)** (Best of the Bests {Ire}) was the star turn of the flat horses in training, selling to Paul Nataf for €150,000 on behalf of Al Naif Stud. From the Jean-Marie Beguigne stable, hip **135** won last year's Listed Coupe des Trois Ans, and placed in the Listed Prix Rene et Jacques Bedel and Listed Grand Prix de Lyon this term. Later in the day, hip **203**, the three-year-old **Kazzene** (Cozzene), fetched €88,000 when knocked down to Hubert Barbe Bloodstock. Consigned by Fabrice Chappet, the useful colt is a half to the triple stakes winner Poni Colada (Volponi), and has been just off the board in two listed events. The stallion opportunity of the sale, six-year-old Niarchos-bred **Holocene** (Lemon Drop Kid), was a disappointment, selling for only €16,000. Pascal Bary's hip **136**, who was runner-up in the 2007 G1 Prix Jacques le Marois, was another purchase of Paul Nataf. That buyer also picked up the top-priced two-year-old breeder. From the draft of Willie Browne's Mocklershill Stud, hip **87** is by Pivotal (GB) out of the listed-winning and dual Group 1-placed Musicanna (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}), and was snapped up for €55,000. Earlier, Marc-Antoine Berghgracht's MAB Agency paid €34,000 for Yeomanstown Stud's hip **72**, a son of Speightstown out of listed winner Dynamous (Dynaformer).
