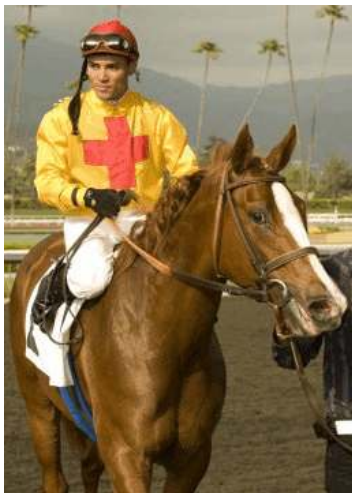

LUCKY SEVEN SET FOR OAKS

A field of seven will line up for today's GI American Oaks at Hollywood Park, following the late defection of likely favorite Cozi Rosie (Pleasantly Perfect). **City to City** (City Zip), the lone graded winner in the group, enters off a pair of good third-place finishes in the GIII Seniorita S. May 2 and the GII Honeymoon H. May 31. The GII Providencia S. heroine, beaten only a length by Evening Jewel (Northern Afleet) in the Honeymoon, worked an easy seven furlongs in 1:27 4/5 at Hollywood June 25.

Andina (Ire) (Singspiel {Ire}) has run well in defeat in her last four attempts, including second-place finishes to City to City in the Providencia

and Cozi Rosie in the GIII Seniorita S. May 2. She dead-heated for fourth in the Honeymoon most recently.

Harmonious (Dynaformer) gets tested for class after a maiden and first-level allowance tally over the Hollywood lawn May 16 and June 12, respectively. She is unbeaten on grass. "I think she'll handle the distance all right," trainer John Shirreffs told *Daily Racing Form*, but added, "What has she had, three races? This is an ambitious spot." **Antares World** (Decarchy) returns to the spinach following a fourth-place finish in the GII Hollywood Oaks June 6. She annexed Golden Gate's Golden Poppy S. in her most recent attempt on the green stuff Apr. 17.

TWICE AS NICE

Juddmonte's runners are flying high in Europe at present, and there are grounds for optimism that today's G1 Coral-Eclipse could provide another one-two for the operation. Last year's G1 Champion S. winner **Twice Over** (GB) (Observatory) and **"TDN Rising Star"** **Zacinto** (GB) (Dansili {GB}) will carry the Juddmonte colors up for today's Coral-Eclipse. Trained in turn by the three-time winning trainer Henry Cecil and Sir Michael Stoute, whose tally stands at five, the duo advertised their claims in separate engagements at Royal Ascot, with Twice Over finishing runner-up in the June 16 G1 Prince of Wales's S. and Zacinto a fair fourth in the previous day's G1 Queen Anne S. "If you've got a top-class horse, there are only so many races for them," Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe commented. "It was a cracking run in the Prince of Wales's, as Twice Over likes to be ridden relatively prominently and he got shuffled back. When he got out, it was too late, and he looks in good shape now, bucking and kicking." Grimthorpe added, "After the Queen Anne, Zacinto signaled that he was back on track again and, in the back of Sir Michael's mind, has been that the horse wants to step up to a mile and a quarter. We've got to give him that chance, and there is plenty of stamina in his pedigree." Cont. p3

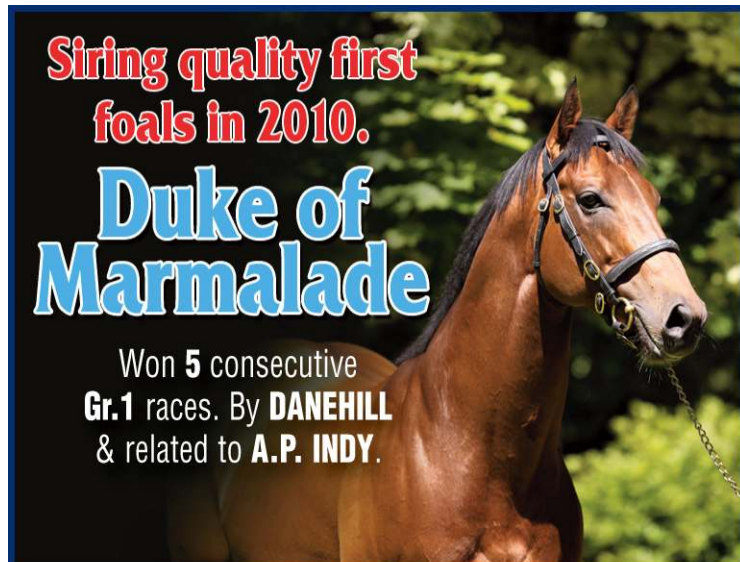

Dar Re Mi (GB), who earned **TDN Rising Star** status here when breaking her maiden back in April 2008, reverts to 10 furlongs following a latest triumph in the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic at Meydan Mar. 27. The Lloyd-Webbers' five-year-old was third in the G1 Breeders' Cup Turf at Santa Anita in November after winning the G1 Yorkshire Oaks in August and being demoted from first in Longchamp's G1 Prix Vermeille in Sep-

tember, all over a mile and a half. "She seems in great form, and we're really looking forward to it," the owner-breeders' Racing Manager Simon Marsh told *PA Sport*. "It's a very good race, as it always is, but we're hoping she will run well." Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's **Mawathee** is on a recovery mission following a tame return when 10th in the G1 Prince of Wales's S., but on the form of his second in the G1 Champion S., he enters the equation. Trainer Marcus Tregoning is expecting improvement from the Royal meeting, and told *PA Sport*, "We just have to hope he's come on as much as we think he has. Tadhg O'Shea rides him in his works, and he thinks he's come on quite a bit since Ascot. If the ground stays dry and we don't get all this rain which is possibly forecast, he should run well. There are only six in the race, but that doesn't really concern me. I'm sure the pace will be fine for him, as he's won over 12 furlongs before, so we don't have any worries about him staying." Aidan O'Brien, who sent Giant's Causeway (Storm Cat), Hawk Wing (Woodman) and Oratorio (Ire) (Danehill) forward to glory as three-year-olds in 2000, 2002 and 2005 respectively, saddles the sole member of that generation in **Viscount Nelson**. While the form of his third in the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas at The Curragh May 22 and fifth in Chantilly's G1 Prix de la Jockey-Club last time June 6 does not make him a headline act, the considerable weight-for-age break and first-time visor makes him a fascinating contender.

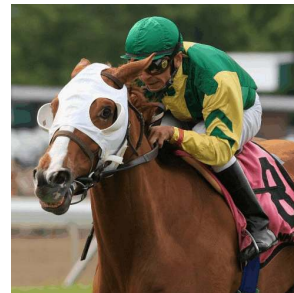

I Want Revenge makes his much-anticipated return to the races. The dark bay, scratched on the morning of the 2009 GI Kentucky Derby due to a damaged ligament in his right front ankle, has been training lights out since joining the Rick Dutrow Jr. barn. "Talent-wise, he stacks right up there as far as his training goes," Dutrow said of last year's GI Wood Memorial hero. "It seems like he's ready to run. He's a good one, and he's supposed to be with these kind of horses. He's been developing the way you want a four-year-old to develop. Every day has been a good day with him." Regular pilot Joe Talamo flies in from California to ride. **Regal Ransom** also makes his seasonal debut. The G2 UAE Derby and GII Super Derby winner makes his first start since finishing eighth in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic Nov. 7. "It's not the easiest spot, going nine furlongs coming back off a layoff, but if you had to run one off the bench, he's the one," said Rick Mettee, who oversees Godolphin's New York string. "We know he likes this track as well." New York-bred **Haynesfield** closed out his sophomore campaign with wins in the restricted Empire Classic S. Oct. 24 and the GIII Discovery H. Nov. 21. The chestnut kept the streak intact with a wire-to-wire \$100,000 optional-claiming tally at Belmont June 13.

Gotta Have Her looks to bounce back after running sixth in the May 29 GI Gamely S. going nine furlongs at Hollywood. Third in this event last year against the tough Tuscan Evening (Ire) (Oasis Dream {GB}), the bay was second in the GI John C. Mabee S. at Del Mar in her next outing. She followed up with wins in the GII Palomar H. at 1 1/16 miles and GIII Sen. Ken Maddy H. going down the hill at Santa Anita, and came from out of the clouds to get second in the Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint. The six-year-old started 2010 with a third in the GIII Las Cienagas H. at 6 1/2 panels, and may have been trying a trip too far in the Gamely. She should appreciate the turn back in distance here. **U R All That I Am** steps up off back-to-back victories over fellow Cal-bred at Hollywood. The four-year-old filly took the Apr. 24 B Thoughtful S. going 7 1/2 furlongs on the Hollywood Cushion and the May 23 Fran's Valentine S. over the local turf.

Beaten into fourth behind **Les Fazzani**, **Polly's Mark** and **Rosika** in that course-and-distance contest May 29, the one-eyed talent has a host of potentially progressive rivals to deal with this time, including the three-year-old **Champagnelifestyle**, who may find this easier than when trailing in the June 4 G1 Epsom Oaks.

Kantharos earned himself ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ honors when he romped home an 11 3/4-length winner over **Gold for Cash** in a Churchill maiden test in the slop May 13. SCHICKEDANZ BANNED BY OJC Owner/breeder Bruno Schickedanz has been banned from entering or stabling horses at Woodbine, the *Daily Racing Form* reports. The decision was reached after an investigation into the death of Canada's 2002 Horse of the Year Wake At Noon (Cure the Blues), who had to be euthanized after suffering catastrophic injuries during a workout at Woodbine Tuesday. The 13-year-old, who had not raced since 2007, proved subfertile at stud, and had been put back into training at Schickedanz's farm. He was shipped to trainer Tom Marino for the breeze; according to *DRF*, Marino has also been banned indefinitely. "We have completed our investigation and, as far as the discussions I've had with the various people involved, I think this is the right approach," Woodbine's Executive Vice President Jamie Martin told *DRF*. "The horses he has racing [Friday and Saturday] will be allowed to run, but we are no longer accepting entries for any of his horses, and he's going to have to move his horses off the backstretch." Schickedanz declined to comment on the situation. The 63-year-old Ontario native, owner of a construction and real estate company, is the nephew of Gustav Schickedanz, who campaigned Canadian champions Langfuhr (Danzig), Glanmire (Briartic) and Wando (Langfuhr). Bruno Schickedanz bought his first racehorse in the early '80s and, in addition to Wake At Noon, owned Sovereign Award winners Scotzanna (Silver Deputy) and One Way Love (Regal Classic), whom he raced in partnership. Through July 1, he had 22 wins from 193 starts for earnings of \$334,222.

SINGSPIEL EUTHANIZED International racing star and prolific sire **Singspiel (Ire)** (In The Wings {GB}--Glorious Song, by Halo) was euthanized yesterday after developing laminitis following a long illness. The 18-year-old Sheikh Mohammed homebred had also experienced fertility problems this season related to the illness, and did not cover any mares successfully in 2010. Singspiel, a son of the Canadian Horse of the Year and American champion older mare Glorious Song, making him a half-brother to prominent sire Rahy (Blushing Groom), was a Group/Grade 1 winner in Dubai, Canada, Japan, and Europe. The Sir Michael Stoute trainee boasted a race record of 20-9-8-0 with earnings of \$5,952,825 over a career that spanned from 1994-1997. He was named champion turf horse with wins in the G1 Canadian International S. and G1 Japan Cup and a second in the G1 Breeders' Cup Turf S. in 1996, and took the G1 Dubai World Cup the following season to cap off his impressive career. Singspiel enjoyed much success as a stallion, siring 12 Group 1 winners including fellow World Cup hero Moon Ballad (Ire) and, more recently, G1 Dubai Sheema Classic victress Dar Re Mi (GB) and G1 Fillies' Mile winner Hibaayeb (GB). He has been represented by 73 black-type winners, and his progeny have earned over £40 million (\$60.8 million). Sheikh Mohammed's bloodstock advisor John Ferguson said, "Singspiel has been a huge part of Sheikh Mohammed and Darley's breeding and racing operation for many years...He was an outstandingly tough racehorse who was able to pass it on to many of his progeny, who performed around the world. He has been admired and supported industry-wide in Australia, Europe, Japan and the U.S. where he has produced racehorses of the highest calibre." Ferguson added, "Sheikh Mohammed would like to thank all of those at Dalham Hall and the veterinarians in Newmarket for doing everything they could for him. He will be sadly missed."

Op/Ed feedback

In response to the Op/Eds by Rob Whiteley (click [here](#)) and Tim Capps (click [here](#)), I would like to share some ideas of my own. Consider these two basic concepts:

- 1) We need a bigger "pie," as the one we have is steadily shrinking.
- 2) We also need to think "outside the box;" in other words, we need to think that the way we do things in the future will not look like how we do things today. Monmouth's success is a prime example.

Let's start with the pie. Right now, what runs our organization is a mixed bag of everybody that services (i.e., eats from) the pie. But what creates the pie? The answer: truly committed end users/owners, bettors and SPECTATORS. (Why can't we be more of a spectator sport?) And, of course, ultimate respect goes to the horse.

So how do we entice owners, bettors and spectators to participate? Becoming passionate about anything or anybody takes a process that begins with knowledge, followed by understanding, relationships and connectivity.

So, we take those interests that truly create the pie (the owners, bettors and general public) and you give them the information and knowledge that they need. The problem is that knowledge implies transparency.

Herein lies a multitude of problems for our business. Let's consider some examples:

As a potential owner, what does it truly cost to participate? Why can't we do it more economically?

Knowledge of these parameters will not only help one decide if they can afford the game, but also teach us how to make it more sustainable economically.

As a bettor, how can we create a level playing field? A key is transparency related to all medications a horse runs on, and consistent rules for different jurisdictions that are in step with international rules.

As a potential spectator, why would I want to watch horses race? Obviously, it needs to be fun and exciting (with quality horses and big purses, not cheap horses, small fields and small purses). We also need to portray a sense of honesty and integrity, with respect to all of our business transactions and our treatment of the horse. (Corruption, lack of transparency or any view of treating the horse as nothing more than a commodity are counter-productive). With transparency, and consistent fair rules, perhaps racing could truly be an international sport, with countless spectators.

We are in a predicament because when you put all of the various industry entities in the same room, they

seek solutions that will primarily benefit themselves, rather than the overall industry. This is only natural: their bread and butter comes from the industry. Yet, if they worked together and collaborated toward the good of the "creators" (the owners, bettors and spectators), they could devise strategies to bring in more spectators, create more handle, better purses and a better economic situation for the owner.

In addition, if we create a transparent playing field with regards to medication and track surfaces, we create a level playing field for the bettors, and have a basis for enticing new fans.

Finally, if we cannot find a way to make horse racing truly caring and useful towards the horse and towards

mankind, it will not sustain itself, except as a past-time for the very wealthy.

BLACK TIE AFFAIR EUTHANIZED Black Tie Affair

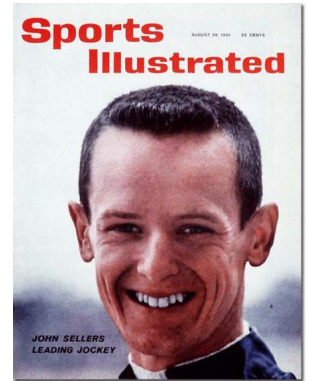

(Ire) (Miswaki--Hat Tab Girl, by Al Hattab), the 1991 Horse of the Year and GI Breeders' Cup Classic winner, was euthanized at Old Friends Thoroughbred Retirement Facility in Georgetown, Kentucky, Thursday. The 24-year-old, pensioned at Old Friends since July 2009, was suffering from laminitis. "It was an honor to be associated with such an amazing

athlete," Old Friends founder and President Michael Blowen said. "The Old Friends team, headed by Dr. Byars, did everything we could to help this old warrior. In the end, he exhibited the same class as he did when he won the Breeders' Cup Classic. He was the best in every way." The gray, campaigned by owner Jeffrey Sullivan and trainer Ernie Poulos, won 18 of 45 career starts and bankrolled \$3,370,694. In addition to his memorable score in the Classic, Black Tie Affair also recorded a win in the 1991 GI Philip H. Iselin H. at Monmouth and was third in the prior year's GI Breeders' Cup Sprint. He sired no fewer than 33 black-type winners, including Grade I winners Formal Gold and Evening Attire. Black Tie Affair entered stud at Vinery in 1992 and later stood in Japan. "He was just life-changing for us," said Dee Poulos, wife of late trainer Ernie Poulos. "It was such a wonderful experience with him. He was, and will still be, an inspiration for me. When things got tough, I would think about Black Tie. He was my motivator."

JOHN SELLERS DEAD AT 72 Hall of Fame jockey John Sellers, who guided Carry Back to victories in the Kentucky Derby and Preakness S., died Friday morning in a Arkansas nursing home, according to published reports. He was 72. Sellers, born in Los Angeles, California, and raised in Oklahoma, began riding in 1955. He retired in 1977 with 2,787 victories. Sellers, who appeared on the cover of *Sports Illustrated* in 1961, also won the 1965 Belmont S. aboard Hail to All. Following his retirement, Sellers worked as a bloodstock agent in Florida. Sellers is survived by his two sons, Mark and John Michael. Funeral arrangements are pending.

It's only by chance that **Boys of Tosconova (Officer)**, the latest "TDN Rising Star", is carrying the colors of Jay Em Ess Stable. Trainer Bob Hess Jr. signed the ticket on the colt when he brought \$35,000 as a KESEEP yearling in 2009, and Hess tightened the girth when he was second in the GIII Kentucky Juvenile S. in his career opener.

But one of the minority members of the partnership that owned Boys of Tosconova that afternoon was buddies with Mace Siegel, and the wheels started turning.

"Somebody who had just a little piece of the horse happened to be a friend of my dad's," Samantha Siegel explained. "They got to talking, and the next thing I knew we were buying the horse."

But it wasn't just word of mouth that got the deal done.

"The race at Churchill got our attention," Samantha Siegel remarked. "He hadn't run before, and he was a good second. We had [trainer Rick Dutrow Jr.] go over and look at him, and he liked the way he looked, so we took a shot."

While Siegel declined to reveal the purchase price, she was feeling good about the transaction after the dark bay's romp at Belmont Park.

"It looks right now like we made a good purchase," she said. "You pay a bigger premium for a proven product, but he might be worth what we paid. Now we need him to come out of the race well and go on to bigger things."

Samantha Siegel is often seen ringside at the yearling sales, but a private purchase was a bit of a departure from the Jay Em Ess business plan.

"We usually don't [buy privately]," she offered. "We used to buy yearlings privately, but when the market got too high, we stopped doing that."

"But if the right situation presents itself, we will take advantage of it," she added. "We are always open to it if the right opportunity comes along."

With his 12-length graduation now in the books, it appears the gamble on Boys of Tosconova will pay dividends. The final time was just three ticks off the track record.

"I thought he was very impressive," Siegel said. "The jockey said he was very professional, and it looked like he eased up on him the last part. I just hope he didn't go too fast--even when they do it easily, it can take something out of them when they run that fast."

As for the future, she commented, "Hopefully, he'll come back well and his shins will be good, and then we'll aim him at something at Saratoga. The [GI Three Chimneys] Hopeful is on the menu and then, if it looks like he'll go two turns, we'll work out a plan to get to the Breeders' Cup."

"We'll see how it goes, but we're dreaming...we're dreaming!"

Jockey Larry Melancon has announced he will retire after riding the first-time starter War Clan (War Front) for trainer Bill Mott in the sixth race at Churchill Downs Sunday. The 54-year-old Louisiana native started out riding Quarter Horses when he was just nine years old. He was licensed in 1971 at age 16, picking up his first victory at Jefferson Downs Race Track in Kenner, Louisiana, that September. Melancon was the leading apprentice in North America in 1972 with 182 winners, and has since racked up more than 2,800 victories and purses of more than \$60 million. He is the third-leading rider of all time at Churchill, behind Pat Day (2,482) and Calvin Borel (1,019) in races won, scoring 941 times under the Twin Spires. "I had no idea that this would last this long," Melancon said. "I got to ride some good horses, and those were the ones that kept you going and getting up in the mornings." As for how he plans to spend his retirement, Melancon said, "I don't know yet. I'm going to take a little time off and visit my grandson."

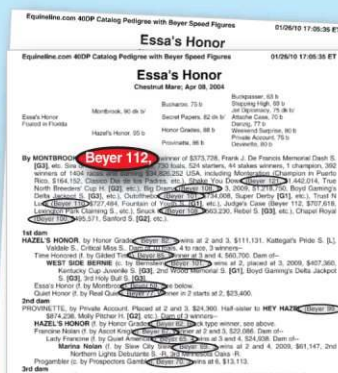
