### TATTERSALLS JULY SALE PREVIEW

Tattersalls' summer highlight, the July Sale, gets underway in Newmarket this morning with the traditional mixed offering. There are 818 lots catalogued this year, compared to 732 in 2009, and the sale goes back to four days, after being held over three sessions 12 months ago. "It's a larger catalogue than last year, and the July Sale has always been a source of high-class horses-in-training and breeding stock, not least the dams of 2009 G1

### GOING FOR THE GUSTO

J P's Gusto (Successful Appeal), who broke his maiden with an eye-catching 4 1/2-length tally in the May 31 Willard Proctor Memorial S. at Hollywood, made it two in a row in Monday's GIII Hollywood Juvenile Championship S. Content to let longshot River's Chapel (Chapel Royal) cut out the pace on a daylight lead, the crowd's 3-5 choice moved in tandem with second favorite Western Mood (West Acre) as they came out of the bend. The duo drove past River's Chapel approaching the three-sixteenths pole, and it was anyone's race, but J P's Gusto responded to the vigorous left-handed encouragement of jockey Joe Talamo to prevail by a neck. ### GETTING IT RIGHT IN BED O' ROSES

Heading down the stretch in yesterday's GIII Bed O' Roses H. at Belmont, it appeared that the fiery opening splits--not to mention the infernal ambient temperature--might have compromised Zayat Stables' Rightly So (Read the Footnotes). However, the game New York-bred mustered every ounce of energy to eke out a head victory over even-money choice Qualia (Saarland). Off to a good start, the four-year-old maintained a solid cushion over her rival through early fractions of :22.21 and :44.99. Rightly So's pilot--Cornelio Velasquez--urged his filly as the favorite loomed in the stretch, and the dark bay managed to get her head down on the line just in time. "She always runs big, but today she wanted to go fast," said Velasquez. "The track is fast, too, but I had a lot of horse at the top of the stretch and she finished well. The other filly [Qualia] is a nice filly, too." *Cont. p2*

### BATTLE PLAN TO JAPAN

Overbrook Farm's homebred Battle Plan (Empire Maker--Flanders, by Seeking the Gold) has been sold to a group of Japanese breeders represented by J.S. Company and will stand at Arrow Stud on Hokkaido Island in 2011. "As much as we wanted him to be sold to interests in Kentucky, the Japanese breeders simply were willing to pay quite a bit more than the American stud farms," remarked Overbrook advisor Ric Waldman. Five-year-old Battle Plan, second in the June 12 GI Stephen Foster H., came out of the race with a torn suspensory in his right front leg and was retired. A son of champion Flanders, he is a half-brother to Eclipse winner Surfside (Seattle Slew). Overbrook dispersed the majority of its Thoroughbred holdings at Keeneland last November, but Battle Plan was one of a handful of horses retained by the operation. He had won four in a row prior to the Stephen Foster, capping the streak with a 1 1/2-length score in the GII New Orleans H. in March. Overall, the bay compiled a record of 6-4-1-0, earning \$373,143.

Third in the Broadway S. against Empire-breds Feb. 28, Rightly So was nosed out of the win next time in the 7 1/2-furlong Indistinctly S. Mar. 31. Most recently, she was beaten a half length in the 6 1/2-panel Gil Vagrancy H. May 29.

In regard to the runner-up, trainer Bobby Ribaud offered, "She ran well, just got beat by a nice horse. She showed she belonged." As for future plans for the beaten favorite, Ribaud added, "We'll see what this takes out of her and if everything is well, look forward to the [GI] Ballerina [S.] at Saratoga [Aug. 28]."

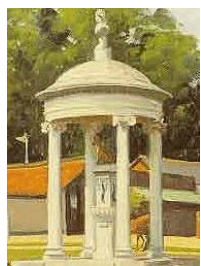

**New at Tatts...**

Tattersalls' auctioneering team will be embellished this week with a visitor from Australia. Jonathan D'Arcy, bloodstock director with Inglis in Sydney, will be on the rostrum through the July Sale. Tattersalls bought a significant shareholding in William Inglis & Son two years ago. In addition, Tattersalls, following the lead of rival British auction houses DBS and Brightwells, will for the first time include the basic race records and official ratings of form horses in their catalogues at this year's July Sale. Selling begins ahead of an all-day session at 10 a.m. today. Trading tomorrow and Thursday takes place in pre- and post-racing sessions slated to start at 10 a.m. and 5 p.m., while Friday has a single morning session starting at 10 a.m.

**High-Profile Consignments...**

Today's lots are dominated by proven and potential breeding stock, including consignments from major owner/breeders such as Cheveley Park Stud, Juddmonte, Darley, Shadwell and the Queen. Cheveley



Park's draft includes Polish Romance (Danzig), in foal to its flagship stallion Pivotal (GB). Offered as [lot 77](#), the 16-year-old is the dam of Group 3-placed Irresistible (GB) (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}) and the granddam of dual Group 1-placed Infallible (GB) (Pivotal {GB}). [Lot 25](#), offered by the Castlebridge Consignment for Lady

Heather McClay, is the dam of this season's Listed National S. winner Dinkum Diamond (Ire) (Aussie Rules). Although not covered this year, the seven-year-old is offered with an Excellent Art (GB) filly foal, born in March. Some of the better horses in training were withdrawn yesterday, including Jim Bolger's G1 Irish Derby runners Puncher Clynych (Ire) (Azamour {Ire}) and Carraiglawn (Ire) (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}), but his team still includes the progressive three-year-old **Mianach** (Elusive Quality), a \$240,000 Keeneland November foal catalogued as [lot 653](#). One of the standout form horses is Paul Makin's homebred three-year-old **Business As Usual (GB)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}), [lot 679](#), who beat subsequent Royal Ascot winner Ransom Note (GB) (Red Ransom) on his last start in a Newmarket handicap May 29. He has raced only four times and looks full of potential. [Lot 645](#), **Victory Ide Say (Ire)** (Fath), has run only three times for owner/trainer Peter Chapple-Hyam, but he has won both his starts this year, most recently a Haydock handicap June 10.

## DICK TURPIN MAY RETURN TO FRANCE

John Manley's G1 Prix Jean Prat winner **Dick Turpin (Ire)** (Arakan) could be back in France for his next start, trainer Richard Hannon revealed. Following the dual Guineas runner-up's four-length demolition of his field in Sunday's Chantilly contest, Longchamp's Sept. 5 G1 Prix du Moulin and Oct. 3 G1 Prix de la Foret are on his agenda if fast ground ensures he enjoys a summer rest. "We have always felt that Dick Turpin was a great horse, and he proved it to everyone in France," Hannon said. "It was some performance, but often you get good horses who are always unlucky and never manage to win a big one, so I am so pleased that this fellow has got his just rewards. The pressure is off now that he has won his Group 1, but, though he has had a busy season with five runs already, it seems that Dick Turpin might be still improving, as he has beaten Xtension (Ire) (Xaar {GB}) farther than he had done when second at Newmarket. We would not run him on firm ground, so, while he is entered in the [July 28] G1 Sussex S. at Goodwood, we will monitor the weather before making a decision and he could well go back to France later on for the Prix Moulin and Prix de la Foret."

### Wolfson Team Ready for Rooney

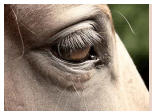
Trainer Marty Wolfson, who has four fillies slated to contest Saturday's GI Princess Rooney S., sent a trio of his entrants to the track Monday morning for a final preparatory move ahead of the Summit of Speed program. Chief among them is Grade III winner **First Passage** (Giant's Causeway), who completed a half mile in :48 4/5. The four-year-old scored in her most recent start in Calder's Ucanodit H. June 12. Also sent to the track was **Jessica is Back** (Put It Back), victorious in the Gulfstream's Ocala S. against state-breds Mar. 13, who covered the same distance in :50 4/5. Rounding out the group was stakes-placed **Saintly Rose** (Graeme Hall), who completed the task in :49 1/5. Wolfson also has six-year-old **Saratoga Tango** (Successful Appeal) earmarked for the six-furlong event. Wolfson won back-to-back editions of the race with Miss Gibson County (Winrightt) in 1995 and Chaposas Springs (Baldski) in 1996.

### Global Hunter Undergoes Surgery

**Global Hunter (Arg)** (Jade Hunter), who was injured immediately following his victory in Sunday's GII American H., underwent surgery at Alamo Pintado Equine Clinic in Los Olivos Monday, trainer A.C. Avila told *Daily Racing Form* yesterday. Avila confirmed the seven-year-old, who sustained injuries to his right front ankle, had a plate and 16 screws inserted into the leg, and according to Avila, the early prognosis appears to be positive. "So far, it's okay," Avila told *DRF* shortly after surgery. "He didn't have any leg infection or founder." The Argentine-bred, who was recording his first victory of the season, also scored in last July's GI Eddie Read S. at Del Mar.

I have to admit to being a little surprised back in January when it was announced that Lion Heart was among the batch of stallions that had been acquired by the Turkish Jockey Club.

Still only nine years old, the son of Tale of The Cat had been a consistently busy member of the Ashford Stud stallion team.

He is credited with having covered books of 233, 158, 165, 215 and 180 mares in his first five years near Versailles. The Ashford team had achieved this consistency partly by reducing his fee, but not savagely, firstly to \$25,000 after two years at \$30,000 and then to \$20,000.

Lion Heart's popularity had therefore held up far better than that of numerous young stallions whose appeal dwindles rapidly until they prove themselves. Lion Heart could be said to have proved himself to some extent by the time he covered his 180-strong book in 2009. He had finished second to Tapit among the freshman sires of 2008, with a tally of 33 individual winners, of which four had become stakes winners. Indeed two of his sons, Azul Leon and Silent Valor, had become graded stakes winners.

Lion Heart added a third graded winner, Heart Ashley, before the 2009 breeding season was very far advanced, which must have helped stimulate support, and a fourth graded winner, Soul Warrior, came along before the end of 2009. Lion Heart finished the year ranked fifth by cumulative earnings among a very hot batch of second-crop sires.

This year has seen him climb back to fourth among the third-crop sires, behind Medaglia d'Oro, Tapit and Speightstown, with total earnings now in excess of \$10 million. In the process, he has boosted his total of first-crop graded winners to five, thanks to Pretty Prolific. He has also been represented by his first Gade I winner, in the shape of Line of David, who led through-out to defeat Super Saver in the Arkansas Derby. Pretty Prolific has also performed well at Grade I level, most recently when second in the Humana Distaff S.

Now Lion Heart has been represented by his first graded winner from his third crop, via the exciting Kantharos.

So why was Ashford prepared to sell Lion Heart before his ability had become fully established? I guess it was a case of the offer being too good to refuse at a time of great economic uncertainty, especially as he had already repaid his original cost many times over. Lion Heart's fee for 2010 had been published as \$12,500, down \$7,500 from last year, and he was due to face competition from Tale of Ekati, another of Tale of the Cat's Grade I-winning sons, in 2010. Then there was the prospect of Tale of the Cat's most accomplished son, Gio Ponti, retiring in 2011.

Remember too that he had had runners for two seasons and was still awaiting his first Grade I winner, so he would have been of little interest to the Coolmore partners for their own illustrious broodmares. Another possible factor could have been that his first Australian crop hadn't achieved a great deal.

To get back to Kantharos, this \$250,000 purchase at Ocala in March has raced only twice, yet his winning margins total more than 21 lengths. The style of his victory in the GIII Bashford Manor S. suggests he is likely to become another Grade I winner for his sire. Could he even prove as effective as Boston Harbor and Favorite Trick, both of whom ran slower times when they landed the Bashford Manor on their way to the juvenile championship?

That suggestion may not be too fanciful, as Lion Heart was a breeze-up sale graduate who developed into a leader of his generation at two and three.

Lion Heart came on the market at the Fasig-Tipton Florida sale in February 2003, where he was so impressive in working an eighth of a mile in :10. dead that Demi O'Byrne was happy to pay a sale-topping \$1.4 million for him.

Lion Heart went on to be unbeaten in three juvenile starts and ended the year ranked fifth among the colts on the Experimental Free Handicap, three pounds below the co-highweights Action This Day, Cuvee and Ruler's Court, and one pound below Birdstone. He showed plenty of speed on his debut over six furlongs at Santa Anita, covering the first half in :44. He then set a new stakes mark of 1:20.60 in the GIII Hollywood Prevue S., and at this stage, I was prepared to write him off as a sprinter-miler, rather than a possible Derby horse.

I had overlooked the fact that his broodmare sire Mr. Leader was a fairly reliable source of stamina, with all five of his Grade I winners-- Ruhlmann, Martial Law, Quiet Little Table, Hurry Up Blue and Wise Times--winning over a mile and a quarter.

Lion Heart also inherited a degree of this staying power, as he showed by rounding off his first season with a victory in the GI Hollywood Futurity over 1 1/16 miles. His sophomore year saw him finish second to Smarty Jones in the Kentucky Derby before he took the Haskell Invitational over a mile and an eighth.

Lion Heart has shown that he can sire a fairly wide range of good-class performers. Azul Leon matured quickly enough to take the GIII Hollywood Juvenile Championship in July and the GII Best Pal S. the following month, while Silent Valor took the GIII Sapling S. in August. The successes of Soul Warrior in the GII West Virginia Derby and of Line of David in the GI Arkansas Derby also show he can get good winners over a mile and an eighth.

So how far is Kantharos likely to stay? His dam Contessa Halo did all her winning over sprint distances, but it is encouraging that each of his first three dams was sired by a horse with form at around a mile and a quarter.

Kantharos' broodmare sire Southern Halo was runner-up in both the GI Super Derby and the GI Swaps S. over a mile and a quarter, beaten only a head in the latter. His second dam, Queen of Savoy, was by the versatile Conquistador Cielo, winner of the Belmont S. And his third dam, Jill of All Trades, is by Codex, winner of the Santa Anita Derby, Preakness S. and Hollywood Derby.

With a background like this, Kantharos should have little difficulty getting seven furlongs and a mile, which makes his efforts over five and six furlongs all the more exciting.

# WRITERS UP

## RIDING FOR THEIR LIVES

*(Editor's note: The TDN is following Mark Cramer and Alan Kennedy as they cycle their way across France--from racetrack to racetrack--to generate donations for the Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation and its French counterpart, La Ligue Pour La Protection Du Cheval. ### STAGE 1: LONGCHAMP

We entered into Stage 1 with 76 kilometers accumulated from our two prologue stages to Saint-Cloud and Auteuil. The main course of Stage 1 involved a round trip to Longchamp, plus an appetizer to the Arc de

Triomphe for a "photo opportunity." The two short trips add up to 28 kilometers. New total: 104 kilometers, or 65 miles.

The photo op may be the most danger-

ous moment in our whole tour, as the photographer insisted that we pose with our bikes in the middle of the Champs-Elysees Boulevard (inches away from insane traffic whizzing by on both sides). We risked our lives in order for him to have the full Arc de Triomphe. The Arc de Triomphe is the finish line for the real Tour de France, so chalk up a victory for Alan and Mark, since we got there 25 days before Lance Armstrong.

"There's less stress in betting 'em than owning 'em.'"-- Alan Kennedy

Alan should know. He was about to place a bet on the filly Turfani, racing in a 17 horse field of mostly boys. Alan once owned Turfani. Turfani has heart and loves to run, but keeping her healthy is a most complex art, mastered by her trainer Gina Rarick. Gina had Turfani ready to go the mile and a quarter on a fresh grey day that accentuated every imaginable shade of green, from the surrounding Boulogne forest, the track surface itself, softened from a morning shower, and the shimmering reflections in nearby lakes. Add to this the pastels of the jockey's silks and the rows of flowers lining the grandstand railings and you have a sensorial feast. Turfani got off a tad slow and rider Mathias Sautjeau urged her to hustle.

It's the slow-start/rush-up phenomenon. Turfani, used to pressing the pace, suddenly felt it was time to make the move, and became the pace setter: too late to tell her to hold off for awhile. The lead is not the place to be on a soft surface at Longchamp.

She led well into the long stretch, but finally the tsunami came at her from behind. The rider later told Gina, with remarkable frankness, that it was his fault for moving prematurely.

Months of Ghandian patience, health care worthy of a congressman, and even in Buckingham Palace they don't nurse the sore legs into shape as well as they do in Turfani's stable in Maisons-Laffitte...and then, poof, one split second mistake and you have to start the whole waiting process again.

So I lost my bet on Turfani at about 20-1 (the average odds of Gina's horses) but her 46-1 winner in the Spring meant that I can absorb 45 straight losses and still be on top. I can wait without fretting. But for both owner and trainer, the tank of optimism needs to be refilled on a regular basis from a mysterious and resilient inner source that few human beings possess.

### *Fashion Statement:*

Alan and I are unknown at the Parisian fashion shows and we would be scorned if we showed up, but today was our big chance to make a once-in-a-lifetime fashion statement. During the afternoon, we alternated between the Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation collection, t-shirts from the French League for the Protection of Horses, and the Gallop France polo shirts from the Gina Rarick stable. It took me 65 years to finally wear something with pride.

*Next Stage:* Chantilly, possibly the most beautiful race course in the world. We'll show you why tomorrow. Our plan is to take our bikes on the train to get out of the congested and polluted suburbs and cycle the rest through open country and forest.
