Aidan O'Brien brings **Lillie Langtry (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) back to Britain for today's G1 Etihad Airways Falmouth S. at Newmarket. The filly looks to

follow up on her success in the G1 Coronation S. at Royal Ascot June 18, where she confirmed what connections had long felt about her ability when besting **Gile Na Greine (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) by 1 1/4 lengths.

The Ballydoyle runner heads a strong sophomore challenge in the Falmouth that also includes **Special Duty (GB)** (Hennessy). The chestnut holds the unusual status of being a dual Classic winner, despite not having her head in front in either race. Beaten a nose by Jacqueline Quest (Ire) (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}) before the stewards intervened in the G1 1000 Guineas on the Rowley Mile May 2, the Juddmonte homebred was then promoted past Liliside (Fr) (American Post {GB}) in the May 16 G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches at Longchamp. Khalid Abdullah's Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe said, "She seems to be in cracking form and, whatever the whys and the wherefores, she is a very talented filly, to say the least." **Strawberrydaiquiri (GB)** (Dansili {GB}) beat **Spacious (GB)** (Nayef) in the G2 Windsor Forest S. at Royal Ascot June 16.

Renata Jacobs' Racing Manager Gary Coffey said of the former, "Strawberrydaiquiri gave us a great thrill at Royal Ascot and has come out of it in good shape. She has been brought along nicely to progress through the ranks and, hopefully, she can make it to the top bracket. She is honest and has guts--more importantly, she has class. Every time we raise the bar, she responds, but, as we all know only too well, there are no easy Group 1s."

**Memory (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) bids to add to her G3 Albany S. success at Royal Ascot June 18 in today's G1 Irish Thoroughbred Marketing Cherry Hinton S. at Newmarket. Trainer Richard Hannon can do no wrong at present, and he said yesterday, "We won this race with both Lemon Souffle (GB) (Salse) and Jewel In the Sand (Ire) (Bluebird), and Memory would be right up there with those two. Like so many of the good ones, she has a bit of character about her in the mornings, but she certainly has an engine, and she has done everything right since Ascot. She gets no penalty, so hopefully she'll win again." Godolphin rely on the impressive June 25 Doncaster maiden winner **Tanfeer (GB)** (Dansili {GB}), and trainer Saeed bin Suroor commented, "I was very pleased with the way Tanfeer won at Doncaster, and she has come out of that race in good order. Her last piece of work went well, and racing over a stiff six furlongs at Newmarket should suit her. She is a taking a step up in class, but she is improving all of the time and I am hopeful that she can run a big race." ### FLAG DAY TOPS TATTERSALLS OPENER

Darley supplied the two leading lights at yesterday's opening installment of the Tattersalls July Sale in Newmarket, with the unraced three-year-old **Flag Day (GB)** (Pivotal {GB}) ([lot 96](#)) leading the way with a final price tag of 115,000gns. Amanda Skiffington fought off another local agent, Mags O'Toole, to buy the filly, who is out of G1 Cheveley Park S. winner Blue Duster

(Danzig). She is destined to join the broodmare band at John Deer's Oakgrove Stud in Wales, which hit the headlines last autumn when selling the 700,000gns sale top-per Rudolf Valentino (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}) at the October Yearling Sale.

"We've got 24 mares at the moment, but the idea is to cut that down to under 20

and upgrade to be really commercial and build on last year," said Tim Lane, who manages Oakgrove Stud. Skiffington also paid 75,000gns for three-year-old **Zarkavean (GB)** (Medicean {GB}), who was covered by Aqlaam (GB) in February, and offered through the Castlebridge Consignment as [lot 128](#). The mare comes from a great Aga Khan family, and boasts champion Petite Etoile (GB) (Petition {GB}) as her fourth dam. "We'll get the two of them back and then decide what to do with them," Lane continued. "Flag Day is a neat mare and would suit something like Oasis Dream (GB). The boss loves the pedigree of Zarkavean; with Petite Etoile in there, it is just a great family." For the session, 147 lots sold for a total of 1,818,900gns. The average, 12,373gns, fell two percent from the 2009 opening session, while the median remained unchanged at 5,000gns. The buy-back rate was 25.4 percent, up from 19 percent. The sale continues today at 10 a.m.

Lane and Skiffington were underbidders on the mare, who was offered with a Dubawi (Ire) covering. The McAlpins

have horses in training with Luca Cuman in Newmarket, and also keep mares in Britain at Watership Down Stud and New England Stud. "Bill both races and sells, so I'm sure he'll decide in due course what to do with the Dubawi foal," said Gordon-Watson. "He was going to buy two mares, but we decided to get one good one and paid more than we intended. But she's a lovely mare from a decent family with an excellent cover."

Early on, O'Toole--acting for an undisclosed client--paid 65,000gns for **Moving Diamonds (GB)** (Lomitas {GB}), a mare whose first foal, Dinkum Diamond (Ire) (Aussie Rules), won this season's Listed National S. before being beaten as favourite in the G2 Norfolk S. at Goodwood. Although not covered, the mare ([lot 25](#)) was offered with a March-born Excellent Art (GB) filly foal at foot.

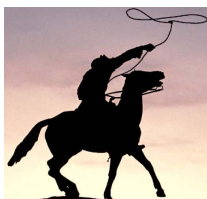

## RACECOURSE Round-Up

### Moore on Workforce in King George...

Sir Michael Stoute yesterday confirmed that Ryan Moore would ride ♀ **"TDN Rising Star"** ♀ **Workforce (GB)** (King's Best) in preference to stable

companion **Harbinger (GB)** (Dansili {GB}) in the July 24 G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S. Moore was widely expected to stay with Khalid Abdullah's G1 Epsom Derby hero, leaving connections of Highclere's G2 Hardwicke S. winner on the look-

out for a rider for the four-year-old. "Ryan will ride Workforce, but we haven't finalised plans for Harbinger yet and need to discuss it with Harry [Herbert]," Stoute told *PA Sport*. Herbert added, "There are no shortage of jockeys, and Sir Michael said he would get back to me in the week with his suggestions. It is no surprise Ryan will ride Workforce, as what jockey would want to get off a Derby winner? We will see what is left in the race after the next forfeit stage and make a decision after that. Frankie [Dettori] and Richard Hughes are options, and Olivier Peslier has put his hat in the ring."

### Summer Cup Option for Paco...

Richard Hannon is watching the weather ahead of a possible tilt at Ascot's G2 Summer Mile with **Paco Boy (Ire)** (Desert Style {Ire}) Saturday. Last seen finishing runner-up there in the June 15 G1 Queen Anne S., the five-year-old could be set for a drop in class. "I am keener to run than the owners, as it is a £100,000 race and looks very winnable, but I would definitely not risk him on fast ground and, with no sign of rain through the week, the omens are not looking good," Hannon said. "The timing of the race is perfect, and it is the ideal stepping stone to the [Aug. 15] G1 Prix Jacques Le Marois at Deauville, his next major objective. But, besides the worry about the ground, the other downside is the fact that Richard Hughes is suspended, while Ryan Moore, who also knows the horse well, looks like being claimed by Sir Michael Stoute for Main Aim (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}). Summing up, everything is up in the air at the moment, but I suspect that our minds will be made up by the weather, which is looking very dry, so we'll just sit and wait and see what the next couple of days bring."

## RIDING FOR THEIR LIVES

**STAGE 3: COMPIEGNE**

Compiegne, where you can't tell where the forest ends and the racetrack begins, is an idyllic setting for



small homespun grandstand, classic wood and stone architecture, a festive small town atmosphere and a feast of racing, even though a notch in class below the Parisian tracks. The

World War I armistice was signed in the Compiegne forest and, when France fell to the Nazis, Hitler had the armistice revoked in the same forest. Compiegne is an elegant city with vintage styles of architecture, a living testimony of France's sense of historic preservation.

We entered this stage with 140 km (87.5 miles) and added 68 km (42.5 miles) for an accumulated total of 208 km (130 miles). But more than the miles today, it was "contre la montre" (against the clock, as they say in the Tour de France). We had to bike at sustained speed to make it from the train station at Pont-Sainte-Maxence on the Oise River to get to the first race and featured race on time, and then we had to reverse the process to catch the train to Paris from Pont-Sainte-Maxence.

The whole route was along the Oise River, and half of it was bike path, so it was a case of "scenic doping." If any doping happens on our alternative Tour de France, it will be performance dis-enhancing substances, such as red wine.

**THE YEARLING SALES: AIM LOW**

It's yearling sale season at last, though consignors are entitled to feel trepidation at what the next four months will bring, especially in the U.S., where the industry has shrunk to between 50-60 percent of its previous size from just three years ago. Breeders paid record or near-record stud fees in 2008, as they had in 2007, so much of their collective effort this year will not be about profitability, but about shifting their stock. Moreover, off near-record production costs, they are selling into a North American market where stakes purses at many major tracks have fallen precipitously, making paying even hundreds of thousands of dollars for yearlings a dodgy proposition.

Fortunately for the season-opening Fasig-Tipton July sale, it doesn't try to operate at the exalted 'select' levels, but is aimed at the high middle market. In 2006,

as you can see from the table in this week's Sales Ticker, the sale grossed \$35.6 million and averaged \$115,954. The gross peaked at \$36.4 million in 2007, but the average dropped, as they had catalogued 105 more yearlings. They dropped the cata-

logue back to under 500 last year, which only held the clearance rate from the catalogue steady with 2008 at 54 percent. Last year's sale grossed \$20.8 million, 43 percent below its 2007 peak, and averaged \$77,716, a drop of 25 percent from 2007 and 33 percent from 2006.

Nonetheless, the mood is not really so much one of doom and gloom going into the sales. Breeders and consignors have had two years to adjust to what many now regard as the new reality, 40-50 percent below the old reality. The mood is more, 'well, this is where we're at, let's go get it done.' So what should we expect?

The first thing we have to take into account is that the Fasig July catalogue has shrunk significantly. There are 407 yearlings catalogued this year, 18 percent fewer than in 2009. So if the clearance rate (54 percent) and the average (\$77,716) remained the same in 2010, the gross would fall by 18 percent, to a little over \$17 mil-

lion. What's more likely is that the clearance rate (from the catalogue) will rise, maybe back to 60 percent, and the average will fall by another 10 percent, to around \$70,000.

That would still result in a gross of around \$17 million. If things go well, the sale could gross around \$19 million (a 10-percent drop from 2009); if they don't, the gross could be as low as \$15 million, which would be a drop of 28 percent. Wednesday's second day is liable to end up considerably higher than Tuesday's opening session. Two-thirds of those catalogued for Tuesday comprise the Freshman Sire session; first-year sires aren't exactly the height of fashion these days, and are liable to average considerably less than the proven commodities like Giant's Causeway and the new top 10 sire Malibu Moon. Around three-quarters of the yearlings by proven sires are due to sell on Wednesday.

Thirty stallions with their first yearlings have the first 144 catalogued during the Freshman Sire session Tuesday. Once sires have runners, it's all about what their runners have accomplished, though this early in the year, freshman sires like Bernardini (four at Saratoga) get a free pass until September. Remember, Dalakhani didn't have a winner until after Aug. 1 the year his first two-year-olds ran, and he's turned out just fine.

When those freshman sires do have winners and stakes horses, all the better. Take Bluegrass Cat. He's the leading North American freshman sire by both progeny earnings and winners (seven) right now; and, by the way, he's by Storm Cat out of an A.P. Indy mare from the powerful Phipps branch of the La Troienne family, tracing to Numbered Account, dam of Private Account. He started out great commercially with his first weanlings in 2008, but his yearlings last year were hammered by the buyers. All is about to be forgiven now, though there are only three by him at Fasig and two at Saratoga. If he stays where he is in the charts, Bluegrass Cat will be an even hotter item come September.

Twenty 2010 freshman sires have yearlings catalogued at the two Fasig sales, of which 10 have three or more between the two sales. It's a lot of sires, but among the 20, there are 60 yearlings catalogued between the two sales (see Table that follows); 17 freshman sires have 47 catalogued at Fasig, and four (Bernardini, who has none in at Fasig; Bluegrass Cat, First Samurai and Henny Hughes) are represented at Saratoga. First Samurai and Henny Hughes each have seven between the two sales; Badge of Silver has six in at Fasig. Just counting what's been catalogued, which, of course, was done before there were any runners from this sire crop, you'd say the market is taking a wait-and-see attitude about this group.

There are 13 stallions whose first crops are now three-year-olds represented in the two sales, but only by a total of 31 yearlings among the 609 catalogued. That's a little more than five percent, which I would interpret as not a ringing endorsement of this group of sires.

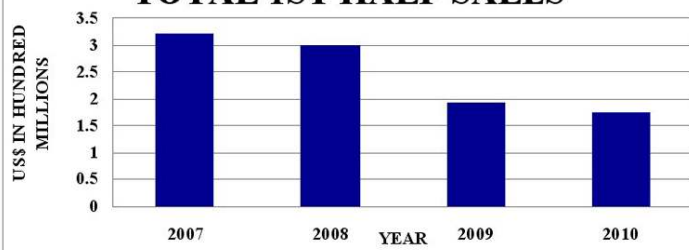
# Weekly Sales Ticker

"Combining 2010 North American and European Mixed and Two-Year-Old sales, there were 15 percent fewer catalogued than in 2009, and 11 percent fewer sold, meaning the percentage sold from the catalogues rose from 53.5 to 56.2 percent. The combined gross was down 10 percent, the average for the 4,682 horses sold dead even with last year. Since 2007 the numbers catalogued and sold have each declined by 35 percent; the first-half gross is down a whopping 47 percent, from \$323.6-million to \$172.6-million; and the average is down by 18 percent."

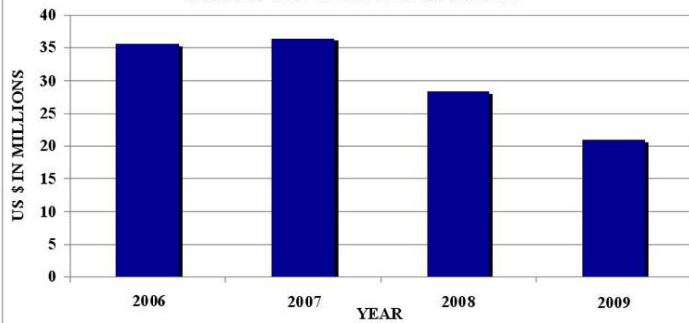
## TOTAL 1ST HALF SALES

On the other hand, this sire crop is something of a work in progress. Afleet Alex, who after all was the best American horse of his generation, has climbed to the top of the year-to-date second-crop sire list in North America, and is chasing Roman Ruler in cumulative earnings. Afleet Alex recently had the one-two in the GIII Pegasus S., Afleet Express and Afleet Again (previously winner of the GIII Withers S.); he has four in at Fasig, three at Saratoga. Rock Hard Ten, who isn't in the top 10 in either 2010 or cumulative earnings, nonetheless has four graded or group SW overall, including Grade II winner Doubles Partner and Grade III winner Krypton, both on the grass in North America this year; he has two at Fasig, but four more at Saratoga. No other sophomore sire has more than three between the two sales, but all should be much clearer among this group by September.

On the other hand, the group of sires with their first four-year-olds now racing (first foals 2006) looks the best sire crop in North America in the last five years. Eight of them have yearlings catalogued in the two sales, and four of the eight have eight or more down to sell. Crop leader Medaglia d'Oro, sire of 33 black-type horses to date, including 2009 Horse of the Year Rachel Alexandra, has nine in at Fasig and another 11 at Saratoga, and is likely to be the overall number one commercial sire coming out of these sales. Tapit has five at Fasig and three at Saratoga; Speightstown, seven at Fasig and five at Saratoga; and Lion Heart, who Andrew Caulfield covered in yesterday's paper, has eight catalogued at Fasig.

These three rank second, third and fourth behind Medaglia d'Oro in cumulative earnings among third-crop sires (unlike the first-crop and second-crop list, where European sires are quite prominent, the first nine on the third-crop list are all American sires), with 15, 13 and 12 graded/group stakes horses respectively. Candy Ride (three at Fasig, one at Saratoga), fifth in third-crop sire cumulative progeny earnings, has six graded/group SW himself. Birdstone is sixth, and has just one at Fasig, but he was always due to go missing, as he is a two-turn sire and will have had comparatively small crops until next year, which will be the crop bred after his first crop included two 2009 Classic winners.

The horse market, and probably all markets, cherish stability, especially during downturns. It seems a long time ago now that in 2007 the market was, as it turned out, peaking after an unprecedented 12-year run when prices just kept going higher and higher. In the last 24 months, the value of horses in Europe has declined by between a quarter and a third, while in America, the values have declined by between 40-50 percent. Even if there are further 10-percent declines this year, people feel the market has at least stabilized. There will only be widespread depression if prices fall by, say, another 20 percent. There is still business to be done, the market seems to say, albeit at considerably lower levels than was the case just two or three years ago. So the mood going into Fasig July is serious, but not critical. Very soon, we'll get an update on the patient's condition.

**BETFAIR, LEVY BOARD AT LOGGERHEADS**

Leading betting exchange firm Betfair responded yesterday to the decision of the Levy Board's decision to start a consultation on the possibility of demanding payments from some of its customers. The British Horse-racing Authority's Chief Executive Nic Coward is one of a few high-profile voices calling for a change in the current status quo.

"For many years, racing has been vociferous on the significantly negative impact exchange betting has on the levy income into the sport and we are pleased that the Levy Board is now dealing with the specific issue of people acting as bookmakers on exchanges and not paying levy," Coward said.

Betfair's Legal Director Martin Cruddace responded by saying in a statement, "We're very surprised by the Levy Board's announcement. This issue of whether betting exchange customers are acting as bookmakers has been the subject of debate since Betfair started. After a thorough, independent review of this very issue throughout 2004 and 2005, which took into account full representation from all stakeholders and other Government departments, the Treasury came to the conclusion that the treatment of betting exchanges and their customers was fair. Since then, there has not been one scrap of evidence produced by anyone to suggest the situation has changed. We are extremely interested to see if the Levy Board is able to run a fair and impartial consultation process, bearing in mind that several of their directors have publicly stated positions that would seem to prejudge any outcome. We are also surprised that any consultation that singles out the customers of one class of operator could be considered fair or lawful where no such distinction is made in any part of the relevant legislation."

Cruddace also confirmed that Betfair is investing over £1 million that was previously paid as a voluntary levy into British racing. He added, "This was money we were not obliged to pay last year, but chose to pay because we want to support British Racing and it was part of the £7.5-million Levy the company paid in total in 2009, up seven percent from the previous year. Today's announcement by the Levy Board, together with the statement from Nic Coward of the BHA, illustrates exactly why we have redirected our voluntary levy payment."

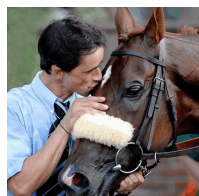
