FLYING THE FLAG

In a renewal of the G1 Darley July Cup stacked with quality, it will take another herculean performance from Michael Tabor's colorbearer **Starspangledbanner (Aus)** (Choisir {Aus}) on Newmarket's July Course today to provide Ballydoyle with their next pinnacle in a season of highs and lows so far. His dominant performance in the June 19 G1 Golden Jubilee S. had more than a

shade of his sire about it, but that Australian maverauder was brought back down to earth by Oasis Dream (GB) in this prize seven years ago and it is always difficult to stay on top of this fast-moving division. With 10 of his 13 rivals re-opposing here, he

will have to replicate the pillar-to-post surge which carried him to glory at the Royal meeting. "I think Aidan and Johnny [Murtagh] are of the genuinely held belief that Starspangledbanner has the ability to achieve great things," Coolmore's Australian Business and Racing Manager Tom Magnier told *PA Sport*. "The next step is, of course, the July Cup, a race that Aidan has won in the past with Stravinsky and Mozart (Ire). Obviously he will need to be at his very best again on Friday, but Aidan is still learning about the horse and feels that he may well have improved again since Ascot, which is a very exciting proposition, indeed. It takes a unique sort of horse to be able to perform at the highest level in two hemispheres, with many having tried and ultimately failed. Starspangledbanner was identified as a top-class colt with the scope to improve further on what he had achieved in Australia, hence our desire to acquire the horse. As things have materialized to date, he has certainly rewarded our faith in him." **Cont. p2**

BUSINESS AS USUAL SETS TATJUL RECORD

Three-year-old Business As Usual (GB) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) smashed the record price for Tattersalls' July Sale in Newmarket last night when selling for 460,000gns (*US\$732,140*) to Alastair Donald of the Kern Lillingston Association.

The colt had run just four times and scored twice for owner/breeder Paul Makin and Newmarket trainer Michael Jarvis. He had shown bags of potential, including a defeat of subsequent Royal Ascot handicap winner Ransom Note on his last start in May at Newmarket. Tom Pritchard-Gordon of Badgers Bloodstock kicked the bidding off at 50,000gns and agents Gordian Troeller and Anthony Stroud soon joined in proceedings. David Redvers also joined the fray as the price rocketed past the 400,000gns mark. Donald had come in at 360,000gns, and he faced one final rival, Qatar-based trainer Ibrahim Al-Malki, before landing the sale-topper and beating the previous July Sale record of 380,000gns set by Mastermind (Ire) (Dolphin Street {Fr}) in 2001. "He's been bought to join trainer John Moore in Hong Kong and he's had a lot of winners from Britain, including Viva Pataca (GB) (Marju {Ire}) and Collection (Ire) (Peintre Celebre)," said Donald. **Cont p8**

Due to the attritional nature of sprinting, dual winners of top-level features are extremely rare, and the Searchers Syndicate's **Fleeting Spirit** will be bidding for a piece of history as she attempts to win back-to-back renewals. Of all the vanquished in the Golden Jubilee, her case may be the strongest as she was the first home on the far side when fourth there. Trainer Jeremy Nosedá has made no secret of the fact that he expects her to improve off that effort. "Hopefully, she moves forward from her first racecourse start [of the year], and I hope there is no draw bias and we are drawn near the principal competition," he said. Stepping up from five furlongs is James Acheson's revitalised **Equiano**, one of the precious few to have managed to duplicate a Group 1 victory in this category when adding this year's G1 King's Stand S. to his 2008 renewal. His sole defeat this term came at the hands of Cheveley Park Stud's **Kingsgate Native** in Haydock's G2 Temple S. May 22, and that rival faltered when only sixth behind him in the June 15 King's Stand. "I don't think the draw helped at Ascot, and we are not particularly well drawn here, either--we are well away from the pace," Cheveley Park's Managing Director Chris Richardson told *PA Sport*. "There were some excuses last time--he'd had a sinus infection and needed a course of antibiotics--and hopefully that is the reason Ryan Moore said he ran so flat."

"It's an extremely tough race, but the horse is in good form," Richardson added. "After Haydock, Ryan told us not to be worried about going six furlongs with him, and it shouldn't be a problem. But sprinters run one good race and then disappoint, so it's hard to know what to expect." Patrick Sheehy's **Kinsale King**, who was third in the Golden Jubilee, is back for more and the Mar. 27 G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen winner is another expected to step up off that display. Carl O'Callaghan's pioneering spirit has been infectious since landing in Britain, and he is confident an improvement is on the cards. "He come out of the race in good form and we opted to stay here and give it another shot," the affable Irishman told *PA Sport*. "Because he ran so well, it sort of forced our hand. It was his first time on the grass and his first time in a straight line, and he'd travelled halfway across the world. He's perked up a lot. He hadn't run in 10 weeks going into Ascot, but he's had three weeks between these races, his weight has stayed pretty even and he's been eating well. He had a good blow-out the other day on the Al Bahathri gallop. He's in great form, he's jumping out of his skin. All the horses behind Starspangledbanner are probably going to move up, and I think it will be more of a horse race this time around. We'll be the underdog, but we don't mind that."

Formosina stages a quick return just 12 days after inflicting a short-head defeat on Samuel Morse (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) in the G2 Railway S. over six furlongs at The Curragh. He carries a subsequent penalty here, but the fact that connections have opted for the hasty turnaround suggests he can build on that effort. "We feel that as he has taken his last race so well, and hopefully the move up to seven furlongs will suit, as will the quick ground," trainer Jeremy Nosed

Godolphin try their hand with **Ecliptic**. He was runner-up on debut to yesterday's G2 July S. hero Libranno (GB) (Librettist) on the Rowley Mile here May 29 before being gifted a seven-furlong Sandown maiden last time June 11, when the likely winner Toolain (Ire) (Diktat {GB}) unseated his rider in the closing stages. "Ecliptic was a little lucky at Sandown, but he won nicely in the end and he saw out the stiff seven furlongs of Sandown well," trainer Mahmood Al Zarooni commented. "He is in good form at the moment and I am happy with his preparation. He is an improving colt and deserves to take his chance in Group 2 company--I think that he goes to Newmarket with a good chance." Richard Hannon, who is winning every major juvenile prize at present, relies on the June 19 Listed Chesham S. fourth **King Torus**.

The **"TDN Rising Star"** has drilled a pair of bullets at Churchill in preparation for her return to action, including a five-furlong drill in 1:00 1/5 under the Twin Spires July 3.

"Last out in the Humana, she broke from the one post going seven-eighths on a 'sloppy' track, and had to use her speed a little more than we might have liked," trainer Eddie Kenneally explained. "A combination of the post, the track and the way the race developed all may have conspired against her, but we've given her a break since then and are looking forward to this race." She is 7-2 on the Princess Rooney morning line.

Sans Frontieres started out on the right note with an eye-catching win in a Lingfield maiden in September 2008 and was the closest rival to Delegator (GB) (Dansili {GB}) at the end of the G3 Craven S. on his sophomore bow on the Rowley Mile here last April. Third in the G2 Dante S. at York the following month, the chestnut was sidelined with an injury thereafter. He was off the board on all three starts this term: the Apr. 15 G3 Earl of Sefton S. back on the Rowley Mile; the May 6 G3 Huxley S. at Chester; and Royal Ascot's G2 Hardwicke S. June 19. On the latter occasion, he showed that he had retained ability when fourth despite a troubled trip, and was fitted with sheepskin cheekpieces for the first time here. It was soon clear that the headgear was working, as Sans Frontieres traveled with enthusiasm despite being held up in rear by Tom Queally. Making smooth progress between rivals to take on the front-running Tazeez inside the final quarter, he assumed command before the furlong pole and lengthened up the rising ground to comfortably assert from Redwood. "I can't say I honestly expected this, and I was beginning to be a bit unsure as to whether we were going to reach the level I had hoped when he was a three-year-old," winning trainer Jeremy Noseda commented.

"I am a big fan of Corinthian as a stallion prospect. A son of Pulpit, like Tapit and Sky Mesa, Corinthian has the royally-bred Easy Goer as his broodmare sire and hails from one of the strongest female lines in the stud book."

"Unfortunately, he got injured when he was just coming to himself last year ahead of the G2 King Edward VII S., and that stopped him for the season," Noseda added. "He's taken a bit of time to get there, but I didn't have him fit enough first time and I shouldn't have run him on soft ground at Chester, where he also choked. That led to us using a tongue-tie, and he'd been happier in his work with it, but at



Ascot he was never traveling with any rhythm to make himself competitive. There is no doubt that he applies himself and tries hard, but we just needed to go with something to make him show tactical speed, and he seemed sharper in the cheekpieces at home. There is no issue with his wind, but he just gets tight at the races and hasn't relaxed. We could go for something like the G3 Geoffrey Freer S. [at Newbury Aug. 14] or [Aug. 29] G2 Grand Prix de Deauville if the ground is fast, but we'll try and stay away from the big boys in the English Group 1s. Libranno, who was 25-1 when he defeated today's G2 Superlative S. contender Ecliptic (Kingmambo) by a neck in a six-furlong maiden on debut over the Rowley Mile here last time May 29, was offered at generous odds again this time. Ripping up the script again with a virtuoso performance, the latest top-class juvenile off the Richard Hannon conveyor belt overcame early keenness on the front end to see off the ultimately disap-

pointing Elzaam and late charger Nebraas. "He's a tough horse, saw it out very well and I couldn't pull him up afterwards either," jockey Ryan Moore commented. Owned and bred by former locksmith Ollie McDowell,

Libranno was fulfilling a personal ambition for that journeyman who added, "This was what I expected from his mother, but she didn't get the chance to show it, as she got injured, which cut her career very short. I nursed her back to health and decided to breed from her, but I never expected to be here as the owner and breeder of a Group 2 winner. It is a lifetime's dream, and we'll take things as they come." A Group 2 winner and multiple Group 1-placed in his native land, the bay captured the 2009 GI Eddie Read H. at Del

Mar, and also ran third in the GI Bing Crosby H. at that meeting. A son of Group 1 winner Griffé de Paris (Brz) (Telescopico {Arg}), Global Hunter is a half-brother to Group 1 winners Lady de Paris (Brz) (Nugget Point {Ire}) and Genereux (Arg) (French Deputy), and another sibling, Open Secrets (West by West), is the dam of dual G1 Estrellas Distaff heroine Ollagua (Arg) (Pure Prize).

Well Monied Retired...

C.T. Grether's graded-stakes winner **Well Monied** (Maria's Mon--Queen of America, by Quiet American) has been retired after sustaining a minor injury. "She

tweaked herself a couple weeks ago galloping," trainer Howard Zucker revealed. "It was a shame. She was a really sound filly. She will go to the November Keeneland sale." A half-sister to Jimmy Simms (Lost Soldier), a stakes winner and third in the 2008 GIII Commonwealth Turf S., the grey filly was purchased by Grether for \$100,000 as a yearling at KEESEP. She graduated in her second turf start in March 2009 and, two starts later, added the GII Honeymoon H. to her trophy case. Well Monied then ran second in the GI American Oaks and third in the GI Del Mar Oaks. She returned to action this season with a

win in a Santa Anita allowance Apr. 4, and most recently ran a close fourth in the GI Gamely S. at Hollywood May 29. Well Monied heads to the breeding shed with a record of 10-4-1-1 and earnings of \$386,300.

Plan X for Gozzip Girl...

One of these days **Gozzip Girl** (Dynaformer) may actually get a chance to run in a race. Farnsworth's Grade I winner stumbled at the start of her intended comeback, the June 19 GII New York S., and lost rider Ramon Dominguez. Trainer Tom Albertrani scratched out of the Miss Liberty S. at Monmouth last Saturday in favor of running her out of her stall in an allowance at Belmont Wednesday, but that card wound up being scrapped due to extremely hot weather. The allowance did not fill when brought back again this weekend. "The racing office did its best to get the race to go; you can't control the weather," Albertrani told *Daily Racing Form*. "You can't expect a cancellation due to heat. It was not in the cards, I guess." The four-year-old filly had been pointing for the GI Diana S. at Saratoga July 31, but Albertrani indicated that won't happen. The conditioner intends to get Gozzip Girl to the \$200,000 GIII Robert G. Dick Memorial H. over 11 furlongs at Delaware next Saturday, prior to the \$750,000 GI Beverly D. S. going a mile and three-sixteenths at Arlington Aug. 21.

RISK AND REWARD

Fasig-Tipton sales grounds were particularly fertile ground for the Firestone family in the 1970s. At Saratoga in 1974, the husband-and-wife team of Bertram and Diana Firestone purchased not one but two

future stars. Honest Pleasure, a \$45,000 yearling buy, was named the following year's champion juvenile colt after a season that included three Grade I wins. At three, he added four more--the Flamingo S., Florida Derby, Blue Grass S. and Travers, finished second in the GI Kentucky Derby, and later ran Forego to a head in a memorable renewal of the GI Marlboro Cup.

That '74 sale also produced the fine Firestone colorbearer Optimistic Gal, acquired for \$55,000. The daughter of Sir Ivor, who like Honest Pleasure was trained by LeRoy Jolley, collected six Grade I wins, plus a tally in the Kentucky Oaks (then a Grade II).

But despite the achievements of those runners, and later others like Theatrical (Ire), it is another Fasig graduate who will be forever tied to the Firestone name. Genuine Risk, unearthed four years later at the 1978 Fasig-Tipton July Selected Yearlings Sale, would go down in racing lore as just the second filly in history to win the Kentucky Derby. She was the first filly to run and place in all three legs of the Triple Crown, and by the time she was retired as a four-year-old in 1981, she was, in many eyes, one of the best fillies of all time.

And it all might not have happened but for the Firestones' son Matthew, who at the tender age of 14 was directly responsible for the selection of Genuine Risk.

Matt Firestone, now an accomplished equestrian and bloodstock agent, was years away from buying a drink legally, placing a bet or even driving when he accompanied his parents to the July Sale in 1978. As was his habit, his father had gone through the catalogue with farm manager Marvin Greene, and picked out their choices on pedigree before examining them in person. Once they arrived at the sale, Matt looked at the catalogue himself, and a filly by Affirmed's sire Exclusive Native, from the immediate family of Kentucky Derby winner Tomy Lee, jumped off the page.

"It was the day of the sale--the sale was at night then, I think--and this filly wasn't on our list," Firestone remembered earlier this week.

"With her pedigree, she would normally been the type of filly we would have looked at, and I remember thinking that it was strange that she wasn't on there. So I hiked up to the barn and took a look at her. I liked her. She was a fairly feminine filly, was put together very well and had a great walk. So I went down and was able to convince my dad to go up and look at her, too. He liked her, and put a price on her--\$35,000."

Since he had picked her out, Matt was tasked with the bidding duties, as well. As the price on the board edged past the \$30,000 mark, it looked as if she might exceed that \$35,000 limit. But Matt's \$32,000 offer went unanswered, and the flashy chestnut, named Genuine Risk, would race in the Firestones' green-and-white silks.

"Obviously, when you are looking at yearlings, you never really know which ones are going to go on and become stars," Matt Firestone said when asked if he thought Genuine Risk was special from the start. "But you go after the ones you like, and hope it works out."

The Firestones got an inkling it might work out early in Genuine Risk's juvenile year, in 1979, after favorable reports from the breaking-and-training crew. Moved to Jolley's care in New York, Genuine Risk opened her account with an easy win in a 6 1/2-furlong maiden in the slop at Belmont in late September. She added an allowance victory 18 days later, then completed her season with a pair of black-type victories at Aqueduct. She won the one-mile Tempted S. by three lengths, then battled back along the rail to best Smart Angle by a nose in the nine-furlong GII Demoiselle S. in mid-November. **Cont. p11**



At that point in time, the Firestones had two Derby runners-up to the credit. In addition to Honest Pleasure, Firestone homebred General Assembly, a son of Secretariat, ran second to Spectacular Bid that very year, 1979. General Assembly got a measure of redemption with a track-record-setting performance in the GI Travers S. at Saratoga, but the Midsummer Derby isn't quite the Kentucky Derby, and the Firestones were still in search of the roses. With their undefeated Genuine Risk in the barn heading into 1980, they thought they might have a chance in the first Derby of the new decade.

"I think anytime you have a good two-year-old, you are thinking about the Derby," said Matt Firestone. "We thought she was the type of filly that had what it took. We had a lot of horses in Europe, as well, and it just wasn't uncommon to run fillies against colts there. We thought that, if she was the right kind, there was no reason she couldn't run against the boys."

Genuine Risk began her three-year-old campaign with a win in a seven-furlong allowance at Gulfstream in March, and, after a one-mile handicap victory at Aqueduct in April, she was ready for her first big test against males: the GI Wood Memorial at the Big A.

Dismissed at 8-1 despite her unblemished record, she ran a strong third to Plugged Nickle, finishing 1 3/4 lengths back, while just losing the bob to Colonel Moran for second.

"It was her first time against colts, and I think she may have gotten bounced around a little that race," Firestone said of the effort.

Still, to some, including trainer LeRoy Jolley, it was evidence that she perhaps didn't belong with the colts on the first Saturday in May. But the Firestones didn't see it that way.

"If she'd been a colt and finished third in the Wood, no one would give it a second thought to go to the Derby," said Firestone. "She didn't get beat by much, and we still thought she was at the top of the class."

Though reluctant at first, Jolley agreed that Genuine Risk would take on the boys in the big one.

"There were some conversations," said Firestone. "We'd been to the Derby a couple of times, with Honest Pleasure and with General Assembly, and my father really thought she deserved a shot at it, and that's what we were going to do."

Asked if they were criticized for sending the filly to the Derby, Firestone said, "I don't recall any criticism, though she may have been discounted a little bit. I think it had been 20-something years since a filly had run in the Derby, so she went off a bigger price than she would have if she'd not been a filly. I thought she had a better chance than that the media was giving her."

Matt Firestone didn't get much sleep the night before the Derby, but he admits that having a longshot did have its advantages.

"It wasn't the same kind of pressure as if you were going in with the favorite," he explained.

"We said, 'Hey, we're going to have a good day and hope it turns out well.' We went over to the backstretch that morning and saw her, then went over and watched the races."

Breaking from post 10 as a 13-1 shot, Genuine Risk raced wide with cover off a trio of dueling rivals. Still well wide up the backstretch, she began to make her move going into the far turn under Jacinto Vasquez, who had begun to ride in earnest. The pair ranged up on the outside powerfully, and as they hit the quarter pole, Genuine Risk took a narrow advantage. She edged clear to a two-length lead at the three-sixteenths pole, and dug in gamely to defeat Rumbo by a length.

"That was a lot of fun--that's about as much fun as you can have in racing," Firestone smiled.

The doubters silenced, Genuine Risk became the first filly since Regret, 65 years earlier, to wear the roses, and gave the Firestones their Derby hero. Prestige in racing circles aside, it was a victory that meant a lot to the tight-knit family.

"I had been involved with my parents' racing operation for as long as I can remember," said Matt Firestone. "We spent a lot of time at the track, going up to Saratoga together, going to the barn every morning, things like that. I felt like I spent more time and learned more on the backstretch with my dad than I ever did at school." **Cont. p12**





Genuine Risk would go on to finish second in the GI Preakness S. and GI Belmont S., the former in a controversial running that would take the stewards at Pimlico and, ultimately, a local court, to sort out. But Genuine Risk had already earned her place in history. Since then, only one other filly, Winning Colors, has defeated males in the Derby.

Today, Genuine Risk seems curiously adrift between two eras, not quite belonging to the super '70s of Secretariat, Affirmed and Seattle Slew, but not really part of Breeders' Cup-ruled '80s, either. Her status can be viewed from different angles: whether she was a hard-knocking throwback of old, or a forerunner, a trailblazer for the likes of Rags to Riches, Rachel Alexandra and Zenyatta, probably depends on who you ask. But nearly all would agree: Genuine Risk was one for the ages.

"I think it's so hard to compare horses from different eras," said Firestone "But I think when Genuine Risk was on top of her game, she was as good as any filly ever." -Lucas Marquardt

MONMOUTH 2010

HALFWAY HOME

Monmouth Park's Elite Summer Meet is fast approaching the midway point, with 21 of the 50 days already in the record books. Has it been a success? The numbers speak for themselves. Through the July 4th weekend in 2009, the meet had generated total handle of \$106,474,870 over 36 days of racing. This year, Monmouth's total handle to date is a whopping \$157,042,169--an increase of 47.5 percent despite the fact that there have been 15 fewer cards.

On-track handle has made more modest gains. Wag-ering at the track through July 4th weekend last year was \$14,287,368; this year, it is at \$15,899,476, a gain of 11.3 percent. But the crowd appears to include significantly more serious players--per capita betting on track has risen 32 percent, from \$53.60 in 2009 to \$70.65 in 2010.

It's not surprising that Monmouth officials get giddy looking at the numbers.

"Is this really even real? It's beyond our wildest expectations," Monmouth Vice President and General Manager Bob Kulina said. "If I would have gone in and given these projections when we were starting this, they would've said, 'He's lost his mind,' and locked me up. There's no way you're going to predict, with everything that's going on in our industry and with the economy, that you're going to be up these kinds of numbers. It's staggering, it's hard to believe, and hopefully it continues."

With all the hype that preceded opening day, it was expected the season would break sharply, but, while there are still nine weekends to go, it appears it has stamina as well as early speed.

"I think the enthusiasm is still there," Kulina remarked. "Our business has been up pretty strongly. Our [simul-cast] transmissions are really doing well."

Mother Nature has mostly been kind to the meet. The prevailing drought-like conditions are having an adverse effect on the local flora, and mandatory water restrictions have been issued for Monmouth County. But until scorching heat hit the area last weekend, the weather had been perfect for a day at the races.

“This was the first weekend we experienced some weather issues in the form of the extreme heat, so that obviously takes a toll,” Kulina said. “But it was still a good weekend. We wrestle with how can we keep the energy up, but so far, other than this heat, it’s been pretty good.”

There had been some concern that business on Fridays would not hold up, but the wagering and the crowds have been healthy. Attendance over the five Fridays to date has averaged 6,136, with on-track handle averaging \$539,357 and total handle averaging \$6,309,602.

“Fridays have gone really well,” Kulina said. “They have been probably a bigger surprise than some of the other things that have happened.”

Even more encouraging is that the number of horses per race has risen a solid 20 percent over 2009, a factor that Monmouth’s VP considers of tantamount importance.

“Our field size is almost right where we were hoping it would be,” Kulina offered. “When we were putting this together, I was hoping we could get between 8.5 and nine starters per race on average. We’re right at nine, and last week we were a tick over nine per race. Last year, we were at 7.4, 7.5 [runners per race].

“In my mind, that’s the single biggest reason our handle is so strong,” he added. “Increased field size makes for more competitive races and fewer really short-priced horses winning, which is what the players want to see. There is much more value in our product than there has been in the past.”

The meet now builds to its annual highlight, the \$1-million GI Haskell Invitational S., set for Sunday, Aug. 1. The weeks leading to Monmouth’s showpiece also have promise.

“We’re coming into a busy part of our schedule now,” Kulina said. “We have our ‘St. Paddy’s Day’ coming up [July 11], and then we have the car show and Rachel Alexandra the [July 24-25] weekend, then we have the Haskell. July is good for us as far as the marketing and entertainment portion of the program.”

A Real Ferrari...

The car show might not be a huge draw for racing fans, but the coup of landing Horse of the Year Rachel Alexandra for an overnight stakes race will certainly bring them through the turnstiles. The Lady’s Secret S., originally scheduled to be run at 1 1/16 miles for a purse of \$150,000 on the Haskell undercard, has been moved to July 24, lengthened to 1 1/8 miles and had its purse raised to \$400,000, all in order to lure the champ.

The event did not happen overnight.

“We started talking to [Rachel’s connections]--and we talked with [Zenyatta’s

connections]--in late February, early March,” Kulina said. “We’ve been talking all along about trying to do something for one or for both. We’ve been on this a long time.

“We just think it adds to what we’re trying to do here, and what we’ve always tried to do. Having the Horse of the Year come the week before the Haskell, which is kind of a slow week for us, energizes our fan base. It’s a big deal.” **Cont. p14**

The accommodations made to the Rachel Alexandra camp caused some grumbling, but there are no regrets on the Monmouth frontside.

“Whenever you [make major changes to a stakes], it’s a concern, but the way we set it up last winter was that this would be the race that we would play around with to try to fit it into the two fillies’ schedules,” Kulina explained. “It’s an overnight race, so it’s something that can be a little more flexible. We had the complete support of the New Jersey horsemen to go out and try to get one or both of the fillies.

“You can sit here and be a purist and be critical of the move, and that would be fair,” he continued. “But I’m likening it to last year when the Lakers came in to play the Nets. They sold out the Izod Center, because everybody wanted to come and see Kobe Bryant play. And I think that’s kind of what we’re doing for true racing fans this year. We’re going to give them another chance to see one of the truly great fillies of our time run.”

While overall field size has been impressive at Monmouth, it is likely the Lady’s Secret will be a tough race to fill.

“It’ll be hard--it’s not going to be the easiest thing we’re going to try to do,” Kulina said with a chuckle. “But people are coming to see her run--I have two family members that are coming just to see Rachel. They don’t really care who she’s running against.

“The reaction I’ve received since we announced it from the fans has been wonderful. Even some players have shocked me, telling me, ‘we’re so glad we’re getting to see her.’ They’re not going to say that this is going to be a great wagering experience, they just want to see a champion. Getting her here is one of those marketing promotions you do to reward your customers. This is a ‘thank you’ to all our customers who come to support us.”

Unknown Territory...

The month of July brings two new twists to the Elite Summer Meet. The first starts today, with the first of three twilight cards. Post time for the first race will be 2:10 p.m. July 9, 16 and 23.

“It will be interesting to see the next phase of the experiment--how this goes,” Kulina said. “We haven’t done it in 20 years--we can’t really remember when we did it last, the late ‘80s or early ‘90s, but it was a long time ago. But we’re going to try it, and we’ll see how it goes. This will be a good test to see if there are any legs to some of the theories we’re trying. We hope it goes well, but we just don’t know.”

The second date looming large on the calendar is the opening of the Saratoga meet, which kicks off July 23. Racing at the upstate New York track will offer serious competition for the betting dollar, and for the region’s runners.

“That’s another one of the ‘X’ factors,” Kulina remarked. “Saratoga, in my mind, is still the best racing in the country, period. Every year we go against them. It will be interesting to see how our transmission numbers stack up against Saratoga and Del Mar. But a lot of people across the country have noticed us, obviously, just by the sheer numbers of what they’re betting on us. If our field size holds up and we can continue to put on the same type of racing, I think we will remain strong.”

Accountability...

The Elite Summer Meet was billed as offering a million dollars a day in purses. On paper, it looks as though the track is paying out quite a bit less than that. The purses for Monday’s holiday card, for instance, which included a pair of \$100,000 stakes races, totaled just \$778,7000.

But it turns out that, while every dollar from the purse account goes to the horsemen, not all of it is listed on the overnight.

“We will spend all of the \$50 million,” Kulina assured. “But here’s the dilemma when you talk purses--that \$50 million includes a lot of things. Right off the top of the \$50 million, the New Jersey Thoroughbred Horsemen’s Association takes 7.5 percent--that’s for the workmen’s comp and for their organization. Secondly, included in that \$50 million is \$4.7 million in graded stakes, so you don’t see that on a daily basis. That’s \$9 million right there. The Jersey breeders get \$2.2 million for their awards program--that comes off the top as well. And then the \$1,500 that we pay back to last is projected to be somewhere around \$4 million. If you add those numbers up, then you see it--every dollar of that 50 million will be allocated at the end of the season. After Labor Day, the \$50 million will be gone.” **Cont. p15**

That means, of course, that the purse account is not sustained by brisk wagering alone. Without the casino subsidy--a \$30-million-a-season deal that expires this year--or some other type of supplement, the Elite Summer Meet could be one and done.

"It would be a different type of meet [without the subsidy]," Kulina admitted. "You need to have the money if you're going to attract the best equine and human athletes in our industry. Without it, it would be a different model. I'm not saying it wouldn't be a better model than the one [previous to the Elite Summer Meet], but I don't think it would be anyway near as strong without this purse level."

But, he added, the casinos are not the only potential source of supplemental monies.

"I look at it as purse funding--wherever it comes from," Kulina said. "There's a lot of ways to fund purses, and we just need to figure it out."

What the Future Holds...

Will the positive reception for Monmouth Park's Elite Summer Meet be enough to guarantee its future? Monmouth officials are not yet ready to make predictions.

"We made our original assumptions, and now we're saying, 'Let's just let it happen and then sit back and analyze it,'" Kulina said. "It gets to be too much to analyze it on a daily or weekly basis. I think we will learn a lot of things, but we have basically one month on the books. It will be interesting to see if we can keep the enthusiasm going, what does August look like after the Haskell, how do we need to tweak it down the road."

Officials will now focus on the day-to-day work of making the meet a success, rather than the stratospheric figures generated on a daily basis. After Labor Day, the number crunching will start in earnest.

"We're going to try to enjoy the meet, then see where we are with the bottom line--we think it's going to be very positive," Kulina said. "The numbers on the transmissions are higher, so we need to sit back and see how our receptions are doing on the dark days, and take a look at the bottom line."

And what is the current bottom line?

"We think this is working, and will turn out to be the right model for us," Kulina said. "Now we just have to figure out how much money is needed to do this again in the future."

SHAREHOLDERS FILE SUIT AGAINST MI DEVELOPMENTS Five United States-based investment firms have filed suit against MI Developments in the Ontario Superior Court of Justice, according to *Toronto Star*. The suit alleges that MID was involved in a "myriad of connector-related party loans and other transactions" with troubled subsidiary Magna Entertainment Corporation (MEC). The firms, which include Hotchkis and Wiley Capital Management and Farallon Capital Management, have a 26.1-percent share of MID's equity. MEC filed for bankruptcy in 2009. The filing also states, "the MEC bankruptcy transactions represented a continuation of the defendants' improper efforts to ensure that the Stronach group maintained control over MEC's principal horse racing assets regardless of the cost to MID." Dennis Mills, MID's vice chairman and chief executive officer, said in a statement, "We believe that this claim is entirely without merit. It appears that these shareholders filed their claim weeks ago, on May 21, 2010, but decided not to serve it upon MID or any of the other Defendants, to guard against the expiry of a limitation period. This is the second claim of this nature commenced against MID by dissident shareholders. The first claim was determined by the courts to be entirely without merit and was dismissed both at trial and on appeal. The shareholders were admonished by the courts for their conduct in pursuing those claims, and were required to pay the costs of MID on a substantial indemnity basis. If and when the shareholders who have commenced this new claim decide to pursue it, MID will defend the claim vigorously and will once again seek the highest cost award possible in the circumstances."
