GIO PONTI BATTLES TO WIN IN 'WAR

Set the near-hopeless task of rallying into a sequence of 26-second quarter-miles, **Gio Ponti** (Tale of the Cat) called upon the class which landed him dual Eclipse Awards in 2009 and outfinished would-be bomber, the pacesetter **Mission Approved** (With Approval) for a neck victory in the GI Man O'War S. Saturday at Belmont Park, successfully defending his title. It was the first victory in four starts this term for Gio Ponti and came on heels of a runner-up effort in the GI Manhattan H. June 5. "Everyone made a big deal of him getting beaten the last time, [but] I never had a doubt that the horse was the leader of his division, and I'm delighted with the way he ran today," commented trainer Christophe Clement. "The race was completely against him; they walked in front, he was last, but he's good enough to be versatile and win the race." Runner-up to Zenyatta (Street Cry {Ire}) in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic last November, Gio Ponti missed narrowly in the Tampa Bay Breeders' Cup Feb. 20, then picked up a cool \$600,000 when fourth, beaten 1 1/2 lengths in the G1 Dubai World Cup Mar. 27. Cutting Back...

Sixth in this event last year, Jessica Is Back had made her nine most recent appearances going a route of ground. An allowance winner going an extended mile over this track last December, the chestnut opened her six-year-old campaign with a runner-up effort in the Sunshine Millions Distaff at Gulfstream Jan. 30 before walking home by nine lengths in the restricted Ocala S. at Gulfstream Mar. 13. She gave way grudgingly when second as the favorite in Hawthorne's GIII Sixty Sails H. Apr. 17 and was most recently no match for Horse of the Year Rachel Alexandra (Medaglia d'Oro) in the GII Fleur de Lis H. at Churchill Downs June 12, finishing 12 1/2 adrift in third. She was dropping back by fully three-eighths of a mile and picked a heck of a spot for her first graded-stakes success.

Dr. Zic (Milwaukee Brew), victorious earlier this year in the GI Vinery Madison S. at Keeneland, showed the way early on while chased by favored Warbling (Unbridled's Song) and a close-up Mother Ruth (Speightstown). Jessica Is Back was content to lay fourth and would rely on a late kick.

Dr. Zic called it a day as the field approached the quarter pole, and Warbling assumed command,

promptly opened up and looked on her way to an easy victory. But, just as soon as the race looked to be over, Jessica Is Back was finding her best stride, overhauled Warbling inside the final sixteenth of a mile and went further in front.

"I was confident she'd run good today turning back, but she had run some good races sprinting as a four-year-old and, in this race last year, she just about got pushed over the fence," explained trainer Marty Wolfson, who saddled Miss Gibson County and Chaposas Springs to back-to-back Princess Rooney wins in 1995 and 1996. "You have to see the replay to see how bad it was. She can't run with 'Rachel' (2009 Horse of the Year Rachel Alexandra) although she did for a little while in that last race. I'll keep her here and look around for the right spot. She's very versatile, so there are plenty of options." Hollywood Gold Cup cont.

Awesome Gem has now banked over \$2 million and has done it the Smith Barney way--he's eaaaarned it. Winner of the 2009 GII Hawthorne Gold Cup, the chestnut was subsequently seventh in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic--a race in which he was third in 2007--and went to the sidelines. Eighth in the GI Kilroe Mile H. going a grassy mile Mar. 6, he was third in the GII New Orleans H. Mar. 27 and completed the exacta in his last two outings, the Apr. 17 Charles Town Classic and behind the progressive Redding Colliery (Mineshaft) in the GIII Lone Star Park H. May 31. Thrilled to be able to walk out of his barn and run at his home track for just the seventh time in his career, he was given at least some respect at the mutuel windows and was able to pull the upset. The complexion of the race changed markedly right at the break when Tres Borrachos (Ecton Park), an expected pace presence, hopped and was ultimately held up by Victor Espinoza. That allowed Compari (Redattore {Brz}) to take up the running, and he slowed the pace down to a near crawl, covering the opening quarter in :25.82 and the half in :50.95. Rail Trip and Rafael Bejarano were wide into the clubhouse turn, and the rider had the opportunity to send his heavily favored mount forward to hound Compari, but instead took back. That decision allowed both Cigar Man (Drewman) and Richard's Kid (Lemon Drop Kid) to advance inside and committed Rail Trip to a nightmarish four-wide trip. That would prove his undoing, as he gained in the middle of the track and loomed a late threat, but Awesome Gem, who saved all the ground and enjoyed a much softer trip, was steered to the fence off Compari's heels inside the final furlong and outfinished Rail Trip for the win. "Everybody went at the half-mile, and I tried not to lose my position and wait for that pocket to come at the end," said winning rider David Flores. "[Jockey] Mike Smith [on Compari] was about ready to shut off the hole but he looked like he ran out of horse so it was very nice of him to leave me that spot. Gio Ponti is headed out of town for his next appearance, said Clement. Options include a defense of his title in the GI Arlington Million Aug. 21, or a trip to Del Mar for the GI Pacific Classic Sept. 5. For the connections of Mission Approved, a Grade III winner at three and four, the narrow defeat was considered a victory. "I thought he was a really nice horse, and he showed it today," said trainer Naipaul Chatterpaul. "We ran him long where he could have an easy lead. I thought we had him, but Gio Ponti is a great horse. I couldn't ask for anything else." The nose of leading sophomore filly Blind Luck vanquished Evening Jewel (Northern Afleet) in the GI Las Virgenes S. and in the GI Kentucky Oaks. Yesterday it was Havre de Grace who was victimized by the late run of the chestnut filly, who managed to snatch victory from the jaws of defeat yet again. Coming off a runner-up effort in a pacesetter renewal of the GII Hollywood Oaks June 6, Blind Luck was a bit slow to begin here, as Derwin's Star set a decent pace from Havre de Grace. Joel Rosario, ostensibly pinch-hitting for Rafael Bejarano, had the penalized Blind Luck positioned in last and asked her to accelerate rounding the far turn. Kept in the clear, the odds-on favorite was five wide into the lane, and looked for a few strides like she would run right by. But, as has become something of her custom, she matched strides with Havre de Grace in deep stretch before getting a very favorable bob. Current plans call for Blind Luck to return to the East Coast in an attempt to become the third straight winner of the Delaware Oaks to add victory in the GI Alabama S.

Premio Loco scored twice at this level at the end of last season, winning the G2 Oettingen-Rennen at Baden-Baden Sept. 1 and the G2 Grosse Europa Meile at Cologne Sept. 27. He dropped to fifth in Round 1 of the G3 Al Maktoum Challenge Jan. 28 and was seventh in the G2 Al Fahidi Fort Feb. 19 in his two outings at Meydan over the winter, but came back to form with a bang, taking the G3 Criterion S. at Newmarket on his return to European action June 26. Held up towards the rear initially, he was caught in something of a pocket at the top of the stretch, but jockey George Baker elected to take the brave man's route up the fence. His willing partner responded to a couple of backhanders to hit the front 75 yards from home. "Premio Loco has obviously improved again from last year, which is fantastic at the age of six," trainer Chris Wall told *PA Sport*. "He is tough and had to go through a narrow gap to win at Goodwood last year, so I had no worries about the horse or jockey being brave." Looking ahead, Wall added, "He is not in the [G1] Sussex S. [at Goodwood July 28], but deserves a shot at a Group 1 now having won a Group 2. There is the [G1] Prix Jacques le Marios [at Deauville Aug. 15] and the [G1] Prix du Moulin [at Longchamp Sept. 5] and, if we can avoid Goldikova and Paco Boy, then who knows."

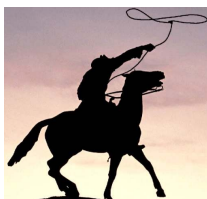

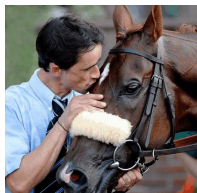
Sidney's Candy to Return in Swaps...

Allied Powers Up to Inaugural Sale...

In May, Bert Welker and Clark Shepherd announced they were launching Allied Bloodstock, a full-service bloodstock operation based in Lexington. On Tuesday, Allied will celebrate its inaugural consignment at the Fasig-Tipton July Selected Yearlings Sale. The consignment features just three youngsters, but don't mistake lack of quantity for lack of quality, say Welker and Shepherd.

"We're taking three solid horses over there," Shepherd said earlier this week. "They vet great, have good physicals and good walks."

The Allied action kicks off almost immediately with [hip 3](#), a bay filly from the first crop of Lawyer Ron (Langfuhr) out of Amada (Unbridled), a half- or three-parts sister to four black-type winners.

"It's a big filly family," said Shepherd. "She is a great physical--that's how she made it here. She's got a super mind on her and an incredible eye."

Both Welker and Shepherd previously took turns managing Stonewall Farm in Kentucky, where Lawyer Ron stood, and so take a keen interest in offspring by the late sire, who was euthanized after colic surgery last summer.

"We were fortunate enough to be around Lawyer Ron from the time he walked into the breeding shed, and I think she's a great representation of him," added Welker. "She's a very forward-type filly, very strong, very correct, and has a great mind. We'll see how the market takes to Lawyer Ron. I'm actually anxious to see some of his progeny over there, just because we were around him."

Allied's second offering is another in the July Sale's Freshman Sire Showcase. [Hip 98](#) is a bay colt by Discreet Cat (Forestry) being sold as the property of Christina Welker and Lochlow Farm. The colt is a son of the stakes-placed Princess Birdeye (Indian Charlie), and is a half-sibling to 2008 juvenile stakes winner Navigator (Stormy Atlantic).

"He's out of an Indian Charlie mare, and you see a lot of Indian Charlie in this colt," Shepherd explained. "He's another great physical, and is a super walker. The Storm Cat/Indian Charlie cross is in its infancy, but so far it's done extremely well. Jay Em Ess bought his half-sister [Navigator], and she was supposed to be one of their Oaks fillies. Samantha Siegel [co-owner] put her right up with Rail Trip at that point in time. She won two of her three starts, but was injured."

The third of the Allied horses goes through the ring Wednesday. [Hip 242](#) is a dark bay colt from the second crop of Silver Train (Old Trieste), currently a Top 10 freshman sire.

"It's another big family and he's a neat colt," said Shepherd. "He's super athletic."

As for his sire, he continued, "It can be tricky with the commercial market. Silver Train has his first crop of two-year-olds right now, and doesn't have 20 winners yet, but I wouldn't expect him to. A.P. Indy [his grand-sire] can tend to be a little late, and Silver Train's out of a Cormorant mare. There's a lot of stamina there. But this is a good colt--he'll catch your eye."

Allied Bloodstock's next sales consignment will come at Keeneland September, where Welker and Shepherd expect to be represented by 10 yearlings. But consigning is just a part of what Allied will do, they explained.

"The sales are going to be where we're at, but we're going to try to be a full-service operation," said Shepherd. "We'd like to be able to take people from Point A to Point B--from start to finish, if that's what they choose. We have the ability to take someone from a breeding decision, all the way to on-track management. We'll also be buying at the breeding sales."

The initial response to Allied has been strong, according to Shepherd.

"We've been picking up new clients, and we're actively booking for October and for the November sales, as well," he commented. "When we announced the formation of Allied, the feedback was great. People said, 'Boy, you guys are a natural fit.'"

The men know that Allied is being launched in uncertain economic times, but believe good horsemanship and strong relationships with clients will lead to success.

"It's not exactly the way you'd draw up a business plan, but all you can do is prepare yourself the best you can, prepare your horses the best you can, and put realistic reserves on the horses," said Welker. "I think that's all any of us can do, whether you're a new venture or an established operation. We're all in the same boat, trying to make a living. We don't have to make it all at the same time, we just want to be in it for the long haul and represent our clients well."

Shepherd added that Allied hopes to separate itself by excelling at client relations.

"We're not just selling horses, we're selling somebody's horse," he remarked. "Everything's relative--there are horses that are not going to be as good as others. But we're going to give all your horses the same shot."

Shepherd said he hopes the launch of Allied can be part of an industry-wide refocusing on what's important; the Allied team is taking a back-to-basics approach to breeding and selling that keeps the focus on sound, competitive racehorses who can be profitable for owners.

"We have to get back to breeding racehorses again, and not just let the commercial market dictate what a good horse is," said Shepherd. "We all have to make money, and that's where the commercial market comes in, but the 'commercial' horse doesn't mean it's a real racehorse. There has to be a convergence of the two, because ultimately the sport is based on racing. Success is relative. It needs to be on both sides--the buyer and seller. I think if everybody's on the same page, good things can happen and we can get some good stories out of this." -Lucas Marquardt

Op/ed feedback

While Mr. Finley ([click here](#) to read Bill Finley's Op/Ed from Saturday's TDN) believes that there is too much racing, I would point out a few comparisons. Ireland is roughly the size of Kentucky and runs multiple meets at the same time. England, the size of New York? Does the same. France? Germany? Italy? They all do the same thing. At the end of the day, the USA is so large that it can easily run many meets at the same time.

What is not going to change is the amount bet at certain of these tracks. The smaller ones with horses of lesser ability will continue to have a problem. Missing here is the fact that States derive income from these tracks, and have not one reason to close them down.

On top of that, there are plenty of people making a living, paying their taxes and going about their business hoping for more at these smaller tracks. Would they like more? Sure. Will they get it? Not under the present set up. ADWs and the present way of selling one's signal to ITW systems continue to short change the owners who race their horses.

The comparison at Monmouth is a case in point. On-track handle is roughly \$1 million per day. Average takeout for that is roughly 20 percent. The other (roughly) \$7 million wagered is sold at something above 3 percent. So as good as the \$8 million per day looks, there is a hole in this picture. More of these monies MUST get into the hands of the people who own these horses!

I can appreciate the boutique meets that Mr. Finley refers to, but let's look at the economic side to this. Hawthorne is the track that he picked out so let's start there. A 20-day meet! Where will the horses come from? Where are they to go afterwards? There are not private training centers for all these horses to go to. Trainers have a hard time coming to Kentucky anymore. A short meet at Keeneland, high prices for their people to stay, moving to Churchill, where the meet ends in the middle of the summer! Where are these people to go now?

I appreciate everyone's input into these problems. Like the rest of the world, the pace seems so much faster today. Sport, business, life all seem to move faster, the problems faster and deeper and the answers not as simple as they once might have been.

We are told that VLTs are not the answer. In this case, they could buy the time to get this right. Time is something we desperately need. We also need business people who run REAL BUSINESSES and have good ideas about our future needs. These people exist today and they wait to be called upon.

All this is just one man's opinion.

Great Op/ed. Owners still have horses in their pipelines they are trying to work through that are left over from the good times. As these horses play out, the economics of racing will continue to cause owners to focus on Woodbine and Monmouth.

Despite all the talk about leadership, owners have more control over the sport than we give them credit for. Too much product is the result of inflated values at the sales. This is changing rapidly. Owners and breeders are folding the tent. Now that the discretionary dollars are gone, racing is forced to stand on its own feet. Owners will continue to leave the business or reduce numbers and focus on racing at venues that offer a chance to profit. Tracks that don't adjust purses upward will die due to a lack of horses. Owners and breeders who can't upgrade the quality of their stock will starve.

Bottom line: In this business, there is no leadership. Supply and demand do all the talking.

NYRA Horsemen Lobby To KO Detention Barn:

According to *Daily Racing Form*, the horsemen at New York Racing Association tracks are pressing for the elimination of the detention barn. A policy, designed to improve the integrity of the sport, adopted by NYRA five years ago mandated that every runner be stabled in a barn monitored by security a minimum of six hours before post time for its race. But some horses react badly to the procedure, and trainers have asked the Association to do away with the program. "At one point in time, it might have been justified," trainer Rick Violette Jr., president of the New York Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association, told *DRF*. "Now it's time to look at building a better mousetrap. We certainly don't want to take a step backward with respect to integrity." It has been rumored that horsemen are threatening a boycott for the end of the Belmont Park meet if their demand is not met, and Violette did not deny the possibility. "There has been some discussion of that," he told *DRF*, while adding, "But that is putting the cart before the horse. That is certainly the last thing that horsemen want to do." NYRA has its own motivation for the change--the policy costs \$1.2 million a year to maintain. NYRA officials declined to comment.
