DROSSELMAYER SIDELINED

GI Belmont S. hero **Drosselmeyer** (Distorted Humor) has been sidelined by a sore ankle and could miss the remainder of the season, according to *Daily Racing Form*. The colt is expected to ship from the Saratoga barn of trainer Bill Mott to WinStar Farm today and will undergo a bone scan. In his only work since winning the June 5 Belmont, Drosselmeyer went four furlongs in :49.46, but exited the drill "moving a little stiff," according to Mott. "His ankles were pinching him a little, but the radiographs were negative," Mott said. "It looks like he's just a little jammed up. If we can't go into a race like the Travers being 100 percent, then it's good to give him time now and have him back for late fall or early spring; whenever he's ready." In addition to his Belmont victory, Drosselmeyer was second in the GII Dwyer S. and third in the GII Louisiana Derby.

GOLD CUP 1-2 OK SUNDAY

Awesome Gem (Awesome Again) and **Rail Trip** (Jump Start), one-two in Saturday's GI Hollywood Gold Cup, came out of the race in fine shape. "He came back well, but he was tired," trainer Craig Dollase said of Awesome Gem. "He laid his body down." Trainer Ron Ellis admitted he was, "a little disappointed," with Rail Trip's runner-up effort as the Gold Cup's 2-5 favorite. The two may meet up again in the Aug. 28 GI Pacific Classic at Del Mar.

SWAPS HOPEFULS WORK

Sidney's Candy (Candy Ride {Arg}) and **Golden Itiz** (Tiznow) tuned up for Saturday's GII Swaps S. with workouts at Hollywood Park yesterday. GI Santa Anita Derby winner Sidney's Candy went seven furlongs in 1:25.60 under regular jockey Joe Talamo. The chestnut has been off since running 17th in the May 1 GI Kentucky Derby. "He went really smooth all the way," trainer John Sadler reported. Golden Itiz, coming off a win in the June 19 GIII Affirmed H., worked five furlongs in 1:02.40 under exercise rider Jose Dominguez. Jockey Tyler Baze has the call on Golden Itiz for trainer Ron Ellis. Ellis is also expected to enter **Pinal** (Rocky Bar), a multiple stakes winner at Turf Paradise, to assure an honest pace in the Swaps. Jay Em Ess Stable, which also owns Golden Itiz, claimed Pinal for \$50,000 out of a turf victory on July 4. Also possible for the Swaps are **Skipshot** (Skip Away) and **Alphie's Bet** (Tribal Rule).

JRHA SALE STARTS TODAY

While throngs of potential buyers turned out on a sunny Sunday to inspect yearlings and later sip party champagne prior to the Japan Racing Horse Association select sale of yearlings and foals at the Northern Horse Park on the island of Hokkaido, a sense of uncertainty hung in the air like sticky humidity.

Consignors looked for positive signs and found some as Monday's opening session of 220 yearlings drew closer.

"The numbers of people we have coming to look at horses is increasing," said Teruya Yoshida, JRHA vice chairman and owner of Shadai Farm, which has 89 horses in the 515-strong catalog. Representatives from Katsumi Yoshida's Northern Farm, which is the leading consignor by numbers with 130

horses in the catalog, said they had never seen so many potential buyers looking at horses in the past.

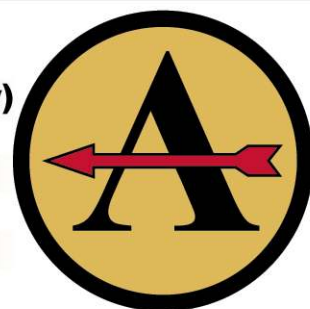

Three years into consigning horse under her Heaven Trees banner, Dede McGehee DVM has enjoyed plenty of success. Offering almost exclusively horses she bred or co-bred, she topped last year's 12th session of the

Keeneland September Sale when a Powerscourt (GB)--Momentary Hope colt she co-bred was purchased by Tony Lacy, agent for Malih Al Basti, for \$180,000. A few weeks after that, another Heaven Trees grad, House of Grace

(Limehouse), stamped herself as one to watch with a game victory in the Listed J.P. Morgan Chase Jessamine S. at Keeneland. In her next start, House of Grace finished third behind Tapitsfly (Tapit) in the \$1 million Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf. **Cont. p4**

House of Grace underscores McGehee's good fortune at July. The filly launched her career at this sale two years ago, when, after a brief power outage kept the pavilion in the dark for several minutes, trainer Ken McPeck saw off all challengers to land the filly for \$100,000.

Three years before that, at the 2005 July Sale, McGehee sold an Include filly to Mike Ryan for \$110,000. Pinhooked the following spring and bought by Glencrest Farm for \$225,000, Panty Raid became a two-time Grade I-winning millionaire.

McGehee has also bred and/or raised the likes of GISW Imperial Gesture (Langfuhr), whom she co-bred with John R. Gaines; GSW Ravalo (Mutakddim); and GSW and 18-time winner Monashee (Wolf Power {SAf}).

McGehee's most famous pupil, however, is one that she neither bred nor sold. Reigning Horse of the Year Rachel Alexandra (Medaglia d'Oro) was foaled and grew up at McGehee's farm near Lexington, also called Heaven Trees, and the Classic winner's dam, Lotta Kim (Roar), is still a resident at the farm, as is the majority of Dolphus Morrison's bloodstock. Morrison bred and formerly owned Rachel Alexandra.

"She was a big, good-looking filly," McGehee recalled of Rachel Alexandra.

Asked how it's been watching Rachel wrack up achievement after achievement, McGehee laughed and said, "It's been great! We'd like to do it again."

McGehee indeed hopes racing's next superstar is currently residing at Barn 9 on the Newtown Paddock sales grounds. A Langfuhr half-sister to House of Grace was catalogued here as [hip 240](#) before being an 11th-hour defection, joining another Heaven Trees out in [hip 360](#), but McGehee still has a strong pair heading into July. On Tuesday, [hip 149](#), a colt by Langfuhr goes under the hammer. The Apr. 23-foaled bay was produced by Alcea (Honour and Glory), a half-sister to Canadian champion Wilderness Song (Wild Again) and to Rhythm of Life (Deputy Minister), dam of Classic winner Sarava (Wild Again).

"He is pretty," said McGehee. "I had the full-brother to him in July a few years ago [the now three-year-old Fandino, a maiden special weight winner at Santa Anita in March who brought \$100,000 on Mike Ryan's bid]. He was a bigger, stouter, courser colt. This is a more refined colt. He looks more like the mare."

McGehee added of the sire, "Langfuhr's been good to me. Imperial Gesture was from his first crop, and I like him a lot. I think he's a bargain. They're not the most beautiful yearlings at the sale, but you know they're going to run."

McGehee's other offering, [hip 244](#), is actually a half-sister to another McGehee-bred daughter of Langfuhr, GSP Call the Kitty. From the second crop of the Unbridled's Song stallion Rockport Harbor, hip 244 is a daughter of Hello Kitty Kitty (Tale of the Cat).

"She's a great, big January foal," said McGehee. "She's a masculine kind of filly."

Born and raised in Jacksonville, Florida, McGehee said she was led to the Thoroughbred business by a love of animals.

"I was one of *those* girls---bringing home animals all the time," she explained. "And I had a pony. I was just horse crazy."

After high school, she attended Auburn University, and it was while interning for a veterinarian one summer that she decided to pursue that line of work. She went to Florida University ("The Fighting Gators!"), and another internship, at Castleton Farm in Kentucky (then a Standardbred operation, now Castleton Lyons) introduced her to Kentucky.

McGehee officially made the move to the Bluegrass in 1984. In the late '80s, she opened her own veterinary practice, but a decade later, she was doing much more than just practicing medicine. Heaven Trees Farm had developed into a commercial operation, with some 135 boarders. McGehee was foaling some 85 mares each spring while somehow still maintaining clients as a vet.

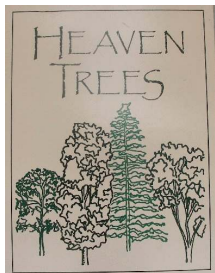

Eventually, a change was in order.

"Three or four years ago, I decided that I'd like to have a *life*," she explained, and so drastically cut the number of mares on the farm. Morrison is now her only outside client. There are currently 23 mares on the farm that are active, but there are also a number of older mares and retirees that are living out their days on the property, a handsome estate that bears the signs of McGehee's love of gardening.



A strong work ethic isn't something that just goes, however, and the industrious McGehee has kept busy with the Heaven Trees consignment.

Heading into the 2010 sales season, she admits to being a tad nervous, much like many other consignors.

"I'll just be waiting and watching, I guess," she said. "I don't know what's going to happen. I want to be optimistic, but I don't know. We're smaller, we're tighter, and we're breeding less. We're hunkering down, and we'll see what happens." -L Marquardt

Yet such expressions of enthusiasm were accompanied by palpable trepidation in other quarters, where the overall shaky condition of the economy worldwide and within Japan was a primary source of concern.

"It feels a bit like being on death row," said Harry Sweeney of Paca Paca Farm when asked about his view of the market for the four yearlings and 10 foals he has in the catalog. "That's the honest answer."

"The catalog seems somewhat light," said Martin O'Dowd, vice president and general manager of Runnymede Farm in Paris, Kentucky, which will offer two yearlings and two foals bred in Japan. "Everybody is talking about the depressed economy and some consignors don't seem optimistic, but I'm hoping it will be better than I anticipate."

Although the number of buyers may be growing in some segments of the market, the number who can acquire horses at the top end is declining, officials agreed, indicating they are not expecting major fire-works on either day of the reformatted two-session sale. The previous format that featured two foal sessions has been reduced to one day for foals to accompany the single yearling session. **Cont. p6**

Some big names of past sales, such as Fusao Sekiguchi, who previously set records on occasion when he would stride into the sales pavilion wearing flamboyant clothes and dazzling jewelry, followed by his own videographer, are no longer in the horse business.

But others could step in to take their place. As Teruya Yoshida said, savvy buyers realize that a depressed market and economy creates opportunities.

The sale's yearling sessions gets underway this morning at 10 a.m.

While there are many successful owners and breeders in Japan, there is no doubt that brothers Teruya and Katsumi Yoshida are the dominant forces. With broodmare bands that place them among the handful of breeders atop the world judging by both numbers and quality, they perennially are 1-2 on Japan's lists of leading owners and breeders and are resolutely competitive even with each other. Their horses have won premier international prizes--such as Teruya Yoshida's Heart's Cry (Jpn) (Sunday Silence), who won the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic, and Katsumi Yoshida's Delta Blues (Jpn) (Dance in the Dark {Jpn}), victor in Australia's G1 Melbourne Cup--and thus have elevated the reputation of Japanese-breds around the globe.

Joined by their younger brother, owner and breeder Haruya Yoshida, in running the powerhouse Shadai Stallion Station, the Yoshidas' influence stretches into

North America and Europe as they are frequent buyers at the top of elite bloodstock markets on both continents. Before the Japan Racing Horse Association's benchmark sale of yearlings and foals began on Monday, Teruya Yoshida, the master of Shadai Farm, discussed the state of Japan's market and other topics with Michele MacDonald. Katsumi Yoshida, owner of Northern Farm, plans to do a similar interview at the completion of the sale.

Q: How would you describe the state of the bloodstock market in Japan now after several years of general economic declines?

Teruya Yoshida: The general economy is very tough. We can't be so optimistic in this environment. We haven't experienced such a bad economy before, so we want to see what's going on with the horse market in the next few days. The prizemoney in this country is still very, very good, so that helps, and there are many horse lovers who are keen to own racehorses even in this economy. Some are looking forward to a weaker market because it is a good opportunity to buy, but the number of buyers at the very top of the market is reduced. **Cont. p9**

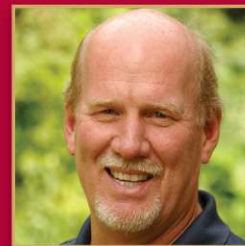

Q: What are your expectations regarding your own consignment of 89 horses (54 yearlings and 35 foals) considering the economic situation?

Teruya Yoshida: I am not so much worried about the economy. [Shadai] is receiving so many owners and trainers who want to see our horses. The prices might not be so great, but there should be plenty of buyers.

Q: Do you foresee a continuing shift in the preference of Japanese buyers toward yearlings and away from foals?

Teruya Yoshida: I don't know yet. There is only one foal session this year, so the number of foals on the market is small, but there are many people who want to see foals here [at Shadai Farm], so the interest remains strong."

Q: As the economy has tightened, have you diverted more of your young stock to racing rather than to sales?

Teruya Yoshida: Shadai Farm has clients who are still very active in racing and when they are happy to buy, I am happy to sell. There is no difficulty in finding clients, and when the cost of horses bred by Shadai is the same, the quality is much better [in this kind of market], so the benefit to clients is good. My business plan has not changed.

Q: How many racing syndicates or groups is Shadai involved with in racehorse ownership?

Teruya Yoshida: Most of the horses bought by clients have one owner, although there is one large partnership. With some expensive horses, like [G1 Tokyo Yushun (Japanese Derby) winner] Eishin Flash (Jpn) (King's Best), we kept a half interest."

Q: How many horses in training do you own?

Teruya Yoshida: Plenty (laughs). Including horses in which we keep 10-percent ownership, we have about 200 in training now. There are a few I have 100-percent ownership in, like [G1 Yushun Himba (Japanese Oaks) dead-heat winner] Saint Emilion (Jpn) (Zenno Rob Roy {Jpn}), and some others I have a 50-percent interest in. Horses I have bred have been doing well, so it doesn't matter so much how big my interest is. (smiles)

Q: Shadai is one of the world's most prolific and successful breeding farms. How much land does it encompass and how many mares are in your broodmare band?

Teruya Yoshida: "There are about 500 hectares [about 1,236 acres] total, with the main area about 300 hectares [741 acres] and another branch and a training center. There are 450 mares, and we have about 60 to 70 mares owned by clients that we board."

Q: Do you keep horses in other countries?

Teruya Yoshida: We have one mare in America now and I have three two-year-olds in France that are European-breds. Every summer we go to Deauville and it is fun to have horses there. My trainers are Andre Fabre, David Smaga and Pascal Bary because we see those people almost every morning at breakfast at our hotel and I can greet them with a big smile."

Q: You have acquired many outstanding mares in recent years in Europe and America. What selection criteria do you use and has there been any market that has been particularly productive for you?

Teruya Yoshida: Any group (or graded) stakes winner is OK, but from my economic status, I buy many Italian and German group winners. Sometimes I buy French mares because I have a good French agent [Patrick Barbe]. There have been many good mares I've bought in America and at Tattersalls. If they are good, they will be good anywhere. But we don't know what will happen until they produce foals, so I have to buy a number of mares. Sometimes the expensive ones aren't successful and the so-so ones are. Maybe one or two from 10 will be good ones. It's fun to see how they go. We are always looking if the price is OK."



Q: Which horses would you rate the best you have bred?

Teruya Yoshida: Heart's Cry (Jpn) (Sunday Silence), the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic winner [and the only Japanese-bred to defeat Triple Crown winner Deep Impact (Jpn) {Sunday Silence}], and Neo Universe (Jpn) (Sunday Silence), who won two Japanese Classic races and now is a successful sire. We've been doing very well. Our percentages of starters and winners are very high and that is a good characteristic of this farm.

Q: Which horse in your consignment do you feel has outstanding potential?

Teruya Yoshida: The Zenno Rob Roy colt foal ([Hip 377](#)) out of winner Festa Delle Donna (Jpn) (Hector Protector). Everybody likes him, so maybe he will be fairly expensive.

Q: With more than half the sale catalog formed by the offspring of Sunday Silence or out of daughters or granddaughters of Sunday Silence, has the influence of that blood exceeded a saturation point in Japan? Are new lines needed and are you seeking new stallions for the Shadai Stallion Station?

Teruya Yoshida: It's a matter of course. We've been [seeking new bloodlines and stallions] since my babyhood. They are not so easy to find, but we have to meet the challenge anyway.

Q: Which of the sires at the Shadai Stallion Station could be the next national leader following the 13-year reign of Sunday Silence and years following his death in 2002 of other horses vying for the top position?

Teruya Yoshida: There are some good ones and they are competing now. Sunday Silence's son Zenno Rob Roy [Japan's 2004 Horse of the Year and 2009 leading freshman sire who was produced by American Grade I winner Roamin Rachel (Mining)] has a good chance. His offspring look good and my feeling is he will be something special.

WAR EMBLEM SAGA CONTINUES

Just when War Emblem (Our Emblem) appeared to be on his way to a more normal life as a breeding stallion, he has suddenly reverted to the disdain for covering mares that has shadowed the years since he won the 2002 Kentucky Derby and Preakness S.

Officials with the Shadai Stallion Station on the island of Hokkaido in Japan said the now 11-year-old horse only covered five of the more than 300 mares presented to him during the recently completed breeding season.

His lack of interest follows the 2009 season during which the nearly black War Emblem impregnated more mares than at any other time, with a career-high 43

Tokutake and Naoki Sakuda, the groom who cares for War Emblem and previously worked with the legendary Sunday Silence, indicated that no one has a clear explanation for why War Emblem cannot seem to maintain interest in breeding.

“People cannot choose the mares for him; he selects his mares,” Tokutake said. “Probably he is a shy guy who is afraid of the mares,” Sakuda said. “He’s very difficult--shy but wild and selfish.”

While the Yoshida family, which operates the Shadai Stallion Station, has demonstrated infinite patience with the horse they paid an estimated \$17 million to obtain for stud duty when he was a three-year-old, it is not clear what options remain.

“We don’t know what he will do next year,” said Teruya Yoshida, owner of Shadai Farm and a partner with his brothers in the operation of the stallion station. “We’ve done everything we can do.”

Yoshida’s all-encompassing comment probably is nonetheless an understatement. War Emblem has been housed in a manner highly atypical for a breeding stallion, kept in the remote and tranquil Barn 9 at Katsumi Yoshida’s Northern Farm with only mares and fillies surrounding him. This housing situation was suggested by equine behavior specialists who have worked with the horse and suggested he might have been intimidated when stabled with older, dominant stallions.

This year, the Yoshidas committed virtually all of the mares they own at Shiraoi Farm, a family venture overseen by the umbrella Shadai Corp., to War Emblem. Vans would travel from the Shiraoi property to Barn 9, stop for however long it took War Emblem to reject (or, in a few cases, accept) the mares on board, and then continue on to the Shadai Stallion Station for the mares to be bred to more willing mates, Tokutake said.

“He tries to bite or kick or strike,” Sakuda said while describing how War Emblem reacted to most mares. When he did decide to breed, his coverings were normal.

Known as a tough horse to handle while racing, War Emblem lunges at Sakuda repeatedly when he is brought out for visitors, snapping at the groom and slapping at his lead shank.

“I’ve learned a lot from this horse--too many things,” said Sakuda, who undoubtedly also was taught much by the spirited Sunday Silence. “But still there is more I have to learn.”

After eight seasons at stud, War Emblem has sired only 102 foals, with none reported in 2007 and 2008. But his foals that have made it to the races have done well, including 2008 Classic-winning filly Black Emblem (Jpn).

“War Emblem has some good foals born this year, so we hope we can make one or two stallions out of them,” Yoshida said.

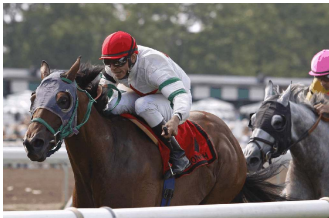
