FIRST TEST OF MARKET AT F-T JULY

The Fasig-Tipton July Selected Yearling Sale kicks off the North American yearling sales season today with a two-day stand at Fasig's Newtown Paddocks in Lexington, Kentucky. A total of 407 yearlings have

been catalogued, down 18 percent from the 494 catalogued last term, and down 28 percent from the 568 catalogued in 2008. Officials at the sales company hope the slimmed-down catalogue can help the sale recover from a 2009 renewal that saw the average (\$77,716) slip 15.8 percent and the median (\$55,000) drop 26.7 percent.

Last year's opening session, featuring a New Sire Showcase comprised of first- and second-crop sires, was particularly hard hit. Average on the opening day was down 23.8 percent, while the median was down 33.3 percent. By contrast, the second

day of selling, with more established sires represented, was down only 4.3 percent in average and 15.3 percent in median. This year, the New Sire Showcase has been replaced by the Freshman Sire Showcase, which boasts offspring by one of the deeper sire classes in recent memory.

Whether that sire power, combined with a more stringent selection process by Fasig-Tipton, will help buoy a struggling market is anyone's guess, but both buyers and sellers have been complimentary of the auction house's efforts.

"I think Fasig-Tipton has done a great job of putting together a group of strong, athletic horses, and I think the pedigrees here are getting stronger," said Adena Springs General Manager Eric Hamelback. "Obviously, they've always gone after the athletes, but it seems there is more substance to those pedigrees, where maybe a few years back there wasn't. From what I see, barring any radiograph issues or anything, there will be buyers for the horses. It's seems like a real racehorse catalogue." *Fasig-Tipton July report Cont. p7*

DEEP IMPACT COLT DOMINATES JRHA OPENER

Buyers new to racing swarmed the opening session of the Japan Racing Horse Association Select Sale on Monday at the Northern Horse Park on the island of Hokkaido, delighting consignors with a flurry of bidding, but keeping a fairly tight grip on their wallets.

By the time the last yearling had trotted out of the sale ring, results were mixed and there had been no fireworks, particularly when compared to the sale's halcyon days when \$1-million horses were sprinkled throughout the catalog.

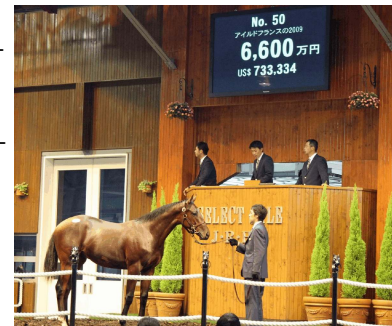
Yet the consensus reaction was that the sale held up as well as could be hoped in the prevailing economic conditions. Of 214 yearlings offered, 173 were sold for a total of ¥3.157-billion (\$35,078,889) and an average of ¥18.250-million (\$202,768).

A robust bay colt by two-time Japanese Horse of the Year Deep Impact (Jpn) out of French and American Group/Grade 3 winner Isle de France (Nureyev), topped the yearling session at ¥66-million (\$733,333). In contrast, last year's top yearling, a colt by Rock of Gibraltar (Ire), sold for ¥145-million (\$1,526,315).

Makoto Kaneko, who raced Deep Impact, purchased the Isle de France colt from the Northern Farm consignment of Katsumi Yoshida. The top five yearlings sold on Monday all came from Northern Farm.

Kaneko typically shies away from talking to the media at sales and declined to comment on the colt.

Yutaka Uda, a savvy Tokyo-based investment manager who obtained an owner's license last year, bought the co-second highest-priced yearling, a Deep Impact colt out of group stakes-placed Kiss Pasion (Jpn) (Jade Robbery), for ¥60-million (\$666,666). The colt is a three-quarter brother to multiple group winner Admire Kiss (Jpn) (Sunday Silence), runner-up in the 2006 Oka Sho. *Cont. p2*

The colt marks the first time that Uda has invested in a major racing prospect. "I liked this one," he said simply when asked about his purchase.

Among other relatively new buyers was Masami Aramaki, who operates the Papas clothing manufacturing and retail business and who bought two yearlings by Deep Impact for a total of ¥77-million (\$855,554).

With more horses offered and sold than in the same session in 2009, when 122 of 156 sent through the ring changed hands, overall gross increased by 14.5 percent

as the clearance rate reached 80.8 percent. Yet the average price represented a decline of 17.5 percent and the median fell by 6.3 percent to ¥15-million (\$166,667), a sign that many breeders are pinched between the need for revenue and market dynamics.

"It's largely like treading water," said Irish native Harry Sweeney, who operates Paca Paca Farm near Shizunai on Hokkaido, one of the top consignors outside of the Yoshida family's Shadai Group. "But in this environment, treading water is not too bad because the alternative is drowning."

Teruya Yoshida, owner of Shadai Farm and vice chairman of the JRHA, was upbeat following the session as he laughed and chatted with Japanese media covering the sale.

"There were not many high-priced horses, but the medium-priced horses sold very well," Yoshida said. "I'm very satisfied with these results and I'm very happy with the number of buyers coming here."

"The quality of the catalog is not quite as strong as in previous years, but the range of buyers has grown and that is good considering this economic situation," he added.

Meanwhile, Riichi Kondo, who has been a big buyer at the JRHA sale for years, acquired the other ¥60-million yearling, a stout gray son of Kurofune out of Be Positive (Jpn) (Sunday Silence), a group stakes-winning full sister to champion To the Victory (Jpn).

"As usual, I went to Northern Farm to inspect as many yearlings as I could and this was one of my favorites," said Kondo, who bought six yearlings with his wife, Hideko, signing the ticket on another. "This is a very buyer-friendly market; I can buy very nice horses for reasonable prices, so I am very happy as a buyer. But I'm a bit worried about the industry."

Sellers generally were stoic. Alan Cooper, manager of the Niarchos family's international bloodstock holdings, said he was pleased that three well-bred yearlings consigned on behalf of the family by the Yoshidas' Shiraoi Farm were all sold, although each brought less than the sale average.

A colt and a filly by European champion Bago (Fr) sold for ¥6-million (\$66,666) and ¥9.5-million (\$105,555), respectively. Another colt, by Agnes Tachyon (Jpn) out of Second Happiness (Storm Cat), a daughter of international champion Miesque (Nureyev), drew a bid of ¥18-million (\$200,000) from Kaneko, who purchased a total of six yearlings including three by Deep Impact.

The JRHA sale concludes today with a session of foals, and while some have predicted that the organization will move more toward yearlings to meet global standards on the sale of young stock, Teruya Yoshida said he believes foals will retain a significant place in the sale.

"I'm looking forward to seeing the foal session because the quality of the foals is as good as in previous years and there has been lots of interest in them," Yoshida said. "My hope is for higher prices."

Although not usually highly preferred in Japanese sale arenas, yearlings by American-based stallions sold well during Monday's opening session of the Japan Racing

Horse Association auction with a son of A.P. Indy leading the way. The first foal produced by Grade I winner Ermine (Exchange Rate), a strapping chestnut, ranked as the fourth highest-priced horse of the session after drawing a final bid of ¥56-million (\$622,222) from prominent owner Takaya Shimakawa. Consigned by

Katsumi Yoshida's Northern Farm, the A.P. Indy colt was foaled in Japan after Ermine was acquired by Yoshida for \$1.3 million at the 2008 Keeneland November sale.

The JRHA sale also generated news for another U.S.-based stallion who had earned the Horse of the Year title. Shadwell Farm's Invasor (Arg), America's champion runner of 2006 and winner of the G1 Dubai World Cup the following year, was represented by his first yearling reported to sell at auction anywhere.

Invasor's chestnut son out of Concern Nacca (Concern), a half-sister to Grade I winner Hystericalady (Distorted Humor) and a daughter of Chilean champion Sacramentada (Chi) (Northair), was sold for ¥20-million (\$222,222) to Nakatsuji Akira. One of the new owners in Japanese racing, the Kyoto-based Akira, who is in the construction and property leasing business, was making his first purchase at a JRHA sale. The Invasor colt was sold by Tsuji Bokujo, which bought Concern Nacca for \$450,000 at the 2008 Keeneland November sale. Darley Japan, Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid al Maktoum's growing racing and breeding enterprise, stepped in to endorse one of the global operation's top stallions when it bought a colt by Medaglia d'Oro out of multiple Japanese group winner Preeminence (Jpn) (Afleet). Consigned by Grand Stud, the colt sold for ¥40-million (\$444,444). A Mineshaft filly, the first foal of stakes winner Moonee Ponds (Mizzen Mast), was the final yearling by an American-based stallion to sell in Japan on Monday, going for ¥15.5-million (\$172,222). Consigned by Okada Stud, which bought Moonee Ponds carrying the filly, for \$300,000 at the 2008 Keeneland November sale, the yearling's second dam is Grade I winner Lotka (Danzig).

Yearlings by deceased Lawyer Ron and by Hat Trick, who stands in Kentucky, were reported as not sold.

Hip 344, c, Meisho Samson (Jpn)--Must Be Loved (Jpn), by Sunday Silence

Consigned by Northern Farm

From the first crop of Tokyo Yushun (Japanese Derby) and Satsuki Sho (2000 Guineas) winner Meisho Samson (Opera House {GB}), this colt is a half brother to



the Classic-winning filly Rhein Kraft (Jpn) (End Sweep), who won two races at Group 1 level and placed in four others. His dam, a full-sister to Japanese Group 1 winner Admire Max (Jpn), has proved she can produce handsome

foals that can win anywhere; her son Florentino (Jpn) (Swept Overboard) fetched a bid of ¥140 million (\$1,217,391) from Darley as a foal in 2006 before going on to win two graded stakes in America. Foaled Feb. 13, this strong and handsome colt is billed as the best representative of his sire in the sale.

Hip 355, c, Neo Universe (Jpn)--Acoustics (Jpn), by Cape Cross (Ire)

Consigned by Northern Farm

A flashy bay with a blaze and three white socks, this bay born Mar. 21 also sizzles on the catalog page since he is a full-brother to 2009 Japanese champion three-year-old male and Japanese Derby winner Logi Universe (Jpn). The match



between Sunday Silence's son Neo Universe, who swept two-thirds of Japan's Triple Crown in 2003, with the unraced Acoustics is a formula Northern Farm owner Katsumi Yoshida believes in--the mare's last three foals have

been by the stallion. "This could be the star of the sale," said Tomakazu Okazaki, a Northern broodmare manager. "This is one of the nicest individuals in our consignment." The colt will step into the ring with the highest reserve of the 60 foals Northern has in the catalog at ¥60-million (about \$677,890). The granddam of Acoustics is European champion Sonic Lady (Nureyev).

Hip 358, c, Oasis Dream (GB)--Jazz Princess (Ire), by Bahhare
Consigned by Shadai Farm

The only offspring of leading European stallion Oasis Dream in the catalog, this bay colt foaled on Apr. 8 is his Group 3-winning dam's third foal, with the oldest



being an unraced juvenile filly by Cape Cross (Ire). Shadai owner Teruya Yoshida purchased Jazz Princess while she was carrying this colt, who has a frame built for speed, at the Tattersalls December sale for 260,000 guineas. The female family already has worked in Japan, producing group winner Grass Bomber

(Jpn) (Machiavellian). This is also the family of European champion juvenile filly Blue Duster (Danzig) and English Group 1 winner and sire Zieten (Danzig).

Hip 377, c, Zenno Rob Roy (Jpn)--Festa delle Donna (Jpn), by Hector Protector
Consigned by Shadai Farm

Although there are no bright stars yet under the female family of this colt, his dam has routinely produced winners and her three-year-old son by Agnes Tachyon (Jpn), already a multiple winner, recently finished second in a Group 3 stakes. Regardless, this colt by last year's leading freshman sire is such a fine physical specimen that Shadai Farm's Teruya Yoshida said he is the standout in his consignment and has drawn the most interest from buyers. "He is total class," added Yoshida's son, Tetsuya, who is Shadai's sales manager. The colt will enter the ring with a reserve price of 40-million yen (about \$451,926).

Hip 415, c, Heart's Cry (Jpn)--Moteck (Fr), by Last Tycoon (Ire)
Consigned by Shadai Farm

A Valentine's Day foal, this elegant dark bay colt is a three-quarter brother to Saint Emilion (Jpn) (Zenno Rob Roy), dead heat winner of this year's G1 Yushun Himba (Japanese Oaks). His sire, a fiery dark horse very much in the mold of his sire, Sunday Silence, won the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic in 2006 and made history by being the only Japanese-bred to defeat Triple Crown winner Deep Impact (Jpn). This colt was described by Tetsuya Yoshida of Shadai as one of the most outstanding individuals seen to date by Heart's Cry, who will have his first runners this season. The colt's quality is reflected in his 40-million yen reserve. This colt's dam and second dam both were Group 3 winners in France and the female family also has yielded stakes winners in North America and the United Arab Emirates.

Hip 426, f, Deep Impact (Jpn)--Venenciador (Jpn), by King Kamehameha (Jpn)
Consigned by Northern Farm

Although fillies traditionally do not sell as well in Japan as in other markets, this strapping, white-splashed Jan. 31 foal will seek to follow in the hoofprints of her dam's close relative, Daoine Sith (Jpn) (King Kamehameha {Jpn}), who drew a world-record bid of ¥600 million (\$5,217,391) from Globe Equine Management Co. at the 2006 JRHA sale. Daoine Sith was produced by champion To the Victory (Jpn) (Sunday Silence), a half-sister to the dam of this filly and a remarkable racemare who left an international mark when second in the 2001 G1 Dubai World Cup. This is the first foal from unraced Venenciador.

Hip 440, c, Agnes Tachyon (Jpn)--Sparkle Jewel, by Unbridled's Song
Consigned by Chiyoda Farm

A gray foaled Feb. 9, this colt is from the last crop of 2008 Japanese leading sire Agnes Tachyon and has a huge update since the JRHA sale catalog was printed. His unraced dam, Sparkle Jewel, is a half-sister to MGISW winner Golden Ballet (Moscow Ballet), who produced GI Belmont S. winner Drosselmeyer (Distorted Humor). Sparkle Jewel's first foal is a juvenile colt named Clean Ecology (King Kamehameha {Jpn}), who currently is in training in Japan, and she also has a yearling filly by Agnes Tachyon (Jpn).

Onward and Forward...

Legacy Bloodstock's Tommy Eastham says he's optimistic that a still-shaky market can rebound.

"Overall, I think there's some positive momentum going forward," said Eastham. "I think that we're going to see a five- or 10-percent increase in average and median. I think we'll see some added buyers from the business community, the guys that own a couple of businesses and have a little discretionary cash they didn't in '09."

Eastham added that he believes breeders and consignors are getting smarter as to the make-up of a 'commercial' horse. "It's definitely gotten to be a tighter bullseye than before, and people are being more selective as far as what they put in a sale," he explained. "Not every horse is a sale horse now. Which doesn't mean they won't be a good racehorse--they come in all shapes and sizes--but good sale horses come in one. And I think consignors and people in the bloodstock industry have done a better job going out and recruiting people into the game. I know we put a big effort out, and some other farms have, as well. Things like getting people to the Derby, getting them to the track and having fun. Listen, does anybody like a recession? No. Do we all like living with less money? No. But it has been kind of fun and challenging to recreate ourselves and find new avenues to market ourselves and marketing our products. There have been some positives to the whole thing."

Said Denali Stud's Craig Bendoroff, "The showing's been fine. It's been pretty normal. The pinhookers are here and people are ready to trade. How much trading we'll get done, well, we'll find out."--LM

25, f, Corinthian--Dance Special, by Theatrical (Ire)
Consigned by Gainesway, Agent I

A Florida-bred, hip 25 was hammered down to BG Ranch for \$50,000 at last fall's OBS October Mixed Sale. "This is the first crop by Corinthian [Pulpit], who of course was a top, top horse: a Grade I winner of the Met Mile who retired sound off a smashing six-length win in the Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile," said Gainesway's Michael Heron. "He's been very well-received, and has been very well-supported in his first three years at stud. This year, in his third year, he received 150 quality mares, and he is very well-positioned going forward. The yearling seems to be very much like him. She's a smooth filly, a good mover, well made and correct. And she's got a good strong pedigree behind her. She's becoming quite popular here at the barn."

52, c, Street Sense--Hishikatsu Ballado, by Saint Ballado

Consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency, Agent L

The colt hails from the first crop of GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner and GI Kentucky Derby hero Street Sense (Street Cry {Ire}). He was produced by the eight-year-old Hishikatsu Ballado, herself a daughter of the top racemare and MGISW Twice the Vice (Vice Regent). "He's out of a young Saint Ballado mare, and he's a real nice horse," said Taylor Made's Frank Taylor. "He's big and strong and has a lot of bone. He's got a real good walk on him."

68, f, After Market--Kentucky Whisper, by Southern Halo

Consigned by Paramount Sales, agent for Sierra Farm

Hailing from a good Canadian family, this Jan. 31-foaled dark bay is from After Market's first crop. The Storm Cat stallion was a top runner for owner/breeder Pam and Marty Wygod, winning a pair of Grade I events. "He's a 10," is how consignor Carrie Brogden described the colt. "I really don't know where you could fault him. Maybe he's a little light on the page, but we've had great luck bringing great physicals to this sale who have gone on to be runners. I'm just delighted with him, and he's got zero vet issues."

Legacy's Tommy Eastham said that this fellow is a prime representation of the former Taylor Made sire. "I tell you, he looks *exactly* like the stallion," said Eastham. "He's a good mover--he's very agile for a big horse. He's not gangly. And he's got some A.P. Indy popping out in him."

**WHAT THEY'RE SAYING
...AT THE SALES**

Allied Bloodstock's Bert Welker, on when to start prepping yearlings for sales:

"Usually, the rule of thumb is 90 days, but the July Sale can come up pretty quick. If you can start by late April up through now, you're doing okay. For July, we try to do as much hand-walking as possible starting in April. You might add in some lunging or an exerciser maybe every other day in May or June, and you can tighten them down a little bit with roundpen work in June, if you have one who's a little heavier. It all depends on the individual. But mentally, there's probably nothing better than hand-walking for them once they get over to the sales.

If they have a good foundation under them, they're used to having somebody walking beside them. So it gives them confidence at the sales."

Eric Hamelback, Adena General Manager:

“The poor owners are getting killed out there. Obviously our owner [Frank Stronach] has the ability to breed and race his own, but these guys who are breeding only to breed a sales horse are only hurting themselves in the long run. And the owners are the ones suffering for it. They’re paying premium prices, and their horses aren’t running. If we can get back to breeding soundness and horses that have longevity, that’s what’s going to help owners, and ultimately racing.”

Frank Taylor, Taylor Made Farm, on his expectations for the July Sale:

“I’m hoping for the best, but not expecting it to be great. I’m hoping things stay stable, and if that happens I think we’ll be all right. We tracked our traffic for the first two days to the corresponding days last year, and we’re down about 10 percent. But nothing too significant.”



Legacy Bloodstock's Tommy Eastham on the market's move toward established sires:

“I think buyers are definitely going with proven sires more. If they spend \$100,000 on a horse, they want it to be by a proven sire and out of a mare who ran. The



female family is becoming more important than it ever has. No longer do you see horses selling real well that are out of unraced fillies from big families. They want the immediate black-type under the first dam. We’ve gotten back to business--we’ve gotten back to making better-educated decisions on our horses. I think, overall, that it’s good for the breed.

For instance, we’ll see 12-year-old mares come in that haven’t produced anything, but who were really good racehorses. And people ask why we think that is. Then you look, and she’s been bred to nothing but freshman sires, and she never had a shot, because the sire never did have a runner. The mares were commercialized, is what we call it.

You want the stallion market to be healthy, but you want these owners who are investing their money--the guys who are so important to my lifestyle and your lifestyle--to be as successful as possible. And they’re going to have more success with a Malibu Moon, or a More Than Ready--horses like that. It’s just facts and figures. You’ll have freshman sires pop up and you’ll say, ‘Man, I wish I bred to Storm Cat when he was \$7,500,’ but 97 percent of them won’t turn out like that.”

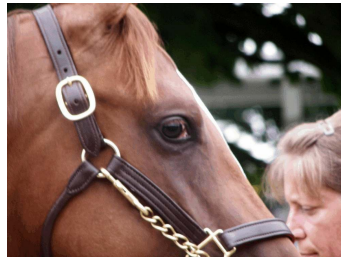

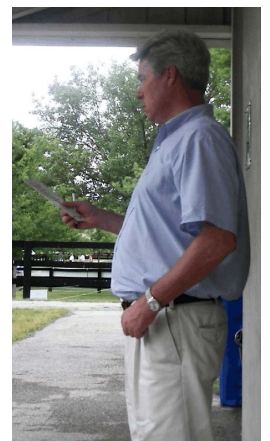

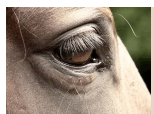

As it is now nearly 20 years since the magnificent Alydar met his horrific death at Calumet, we cannot expect to see him cropping up as the broodmare sire of many more Grade I winners of the calibre of Gio Ponti. This champion turf horse recently repeated his 2009 victory in the Man O' War S. and this welcome return to the winner's circle has pushed the Tale of the Cat horse's earnings past the \$4-million mark.

With his youngest daughters already 19 years old, the number of active producers among Alydar's 320 broodmare daughters must be dwindling fast, so we are nearing the end of a very productive era. Alydar is the broodmare sire of 156 stakes winners, from a total of 2,371 named foals out of his daughters, with nearly 70 of them scoring at group/graded level. The celebrity-packed list of Grade I winners out of Alydar mares features the likes of Lure (two editions of the Breeders' Cup Mile), Cat Thief (Breeders' Cup Classic), Ajina (Breeders' Cup Distaff), Anees (Breeders' Cup Juvenile), Peintre Celebre (Prix du Jockey-Club and Arc), Lakeway, A.P. Valentine, November Snow and Amilynx.

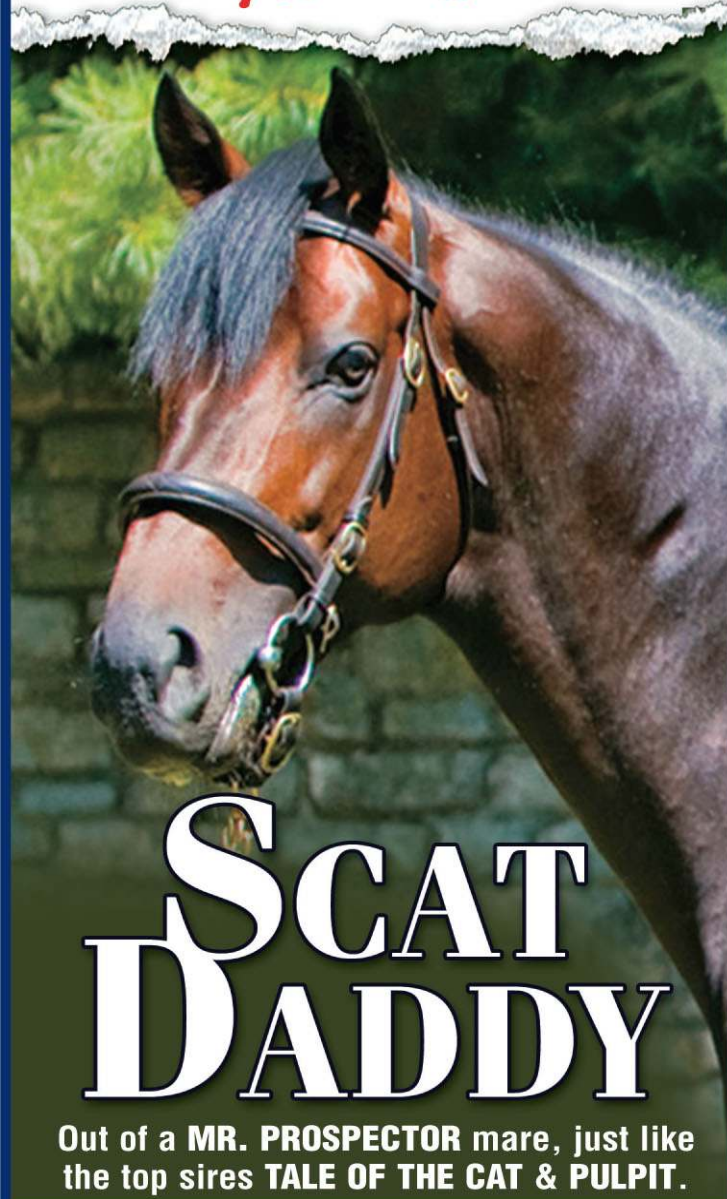
Success on this scale in the role of broodmare sire certainly wasn't unexpected. Alydar, after all, had always been renowned as an outstanding sire of fillies, almost from the word go. His first crop (which incidentally numbered only 35 named foals) was headed by Miss Oceana and Althea. While Miss Oceana was given the honor of topping the fillies' section of the Experimental Free Handicap, it was Althea who took the Eclipse Award. Two of the fillies in his second crop, Alydar's Best and Endear, also became Grade I winners and it was a similar story with Alydar's third crop, which produced I'm Sweets and Clabber Girl.

By the end of his career, the number of Grade I-winning daughters by Alydar had risen to 11--a total which tended to confirm Alydar's reputation for being a "filly sire." However, such a description was more than a little unfair, ignoring the fact that Alydar was also responsible for two sons--Alysheba and Criminal Type--who achieved Horse of the Year honors, for another son--Easy Goer--who took the title of champion two-year-old male and for yet another son--Turkoman--who was voted champion older horse.

These champions also had a strong male supporting cast, which included Strike the Gold, who followed Alysheba as Alydar's second Kentucky Derby winner, Saratoga Six, Dare And Go and the top European colt Cacoethes.

At this stage it is worth reminding you that Alydar's pedigree bore some distinct similarities to that of Mr. Prospector. Both these sons of Raise a Native were out of talented granddaughters of Nasrullah and both had some Bull Dog blood. Mr. Prospector, of course, has proved a phenomenal sire of sires, while simultaneously establishing himself as an extraordinary broodmare sire.

Alydar, on the other hand, has left a legacy based, to a considerable extent, on his broodmare daughters. If you take a look at page 1221 of the *Blood-Horse Stallion Register* for 2010, you will see that it takes five full columns of the Polynesian male line chart to summarise

Mr. Prospector's huge impact on the current stallion population. Alydar, in contrast, is shown with a mere four active male descendants, only one of which--Airdrie's Santa Anita Derby winner Brother Derek--is based in Kentucky.

When I reviewed Brother Derek's pedigree in this column following his victory in the 2005 Hollywood Futurity, I commented that "the unpalatable truth is that Alydar--for all his achievements and excellent bloodlines--was a fairly disastrous sire of sires."

I pointed out that in the early 1990s Alydar had more than 50 stallion sons scattered around the U.S. and there seemed every reason to think that he would establish a long-lasting dynasty. Sadly it wasn't to be. Turkoman proved much less effective as a stallion than as a racehorse, even though he sired Grade I winners in Man From Wicklow and Turk Passer. Criminal Type, who got caught up in Calumet's problems, was soon sold to Japan, leaving Grade II and Grade III winners behind; and Saratoga Six sired only one Grade I winner (Toga Toga Toga) during a long career. Alysheba--also the sire of only one Group 1 winner (Moonlight Dance)--was temporarily exiled in Saudi Arabia, while Strike the Gold headed for Turkey after failing to sire a single graded winner.

The most successful sons of Alydar in terms of Grade I winners, with three apiece, have been Easy Goer and Brother Derek's sire, the Grade II winner Benchmark. Of course, it is possible that Easy Goer could have been the one to restore Alydar's reputation as a sire of sires, but he died in 1994, at the age of eight, leaving only 133 named foals. Among them were the Grade I winners My Flag, Furlough and Will's Way, but it could be argued that he should have done even better with the exceptional support he received.

I don't have an accurate total of foals sired by Alydar's sons but it is safe to say that they have sired at least twice the number of foals--2,371--credited to his daughters. Despite having at least twice the numbers, their number of graded winners falls well short of the total achieved by Alydar's broodmare daughters.

It is hard to think of a logical reason for this difference between Alydar's sons and daughters, especially when there is no such divergence between the sons and daughters of the similarly bred Mr. Prospector.

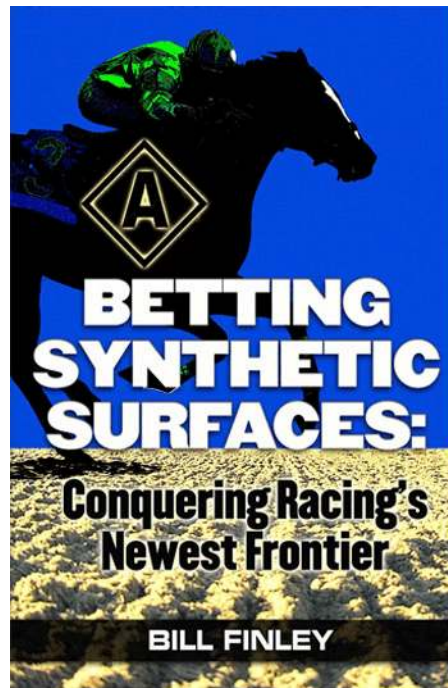
Could it be that Alydar's sons generally stayed a little too well to suit the American industry? Most of Alydar's best sons inherited a large measure of the stamina which so nearly enabled Alydar to beat his nemesis Affirmed in the 1978 Belmont S. Alysheba, Criminal Type, Strike the Gold, Easy Goer, Dare And Go and Cacoethes all gained at least one of their Grade I victories over a mile and a quarter or more. The rival Mr. Prospector clan generally possessed more of their sire's speed.

Disappointing though Alydar's sons have been as sires, several of them have flourished in the role of broodmare sire. Whereas they were directly responsible for only 10 Grade I winners, they have sired the dams of at least 24 Grade I winners in the Northern Hemisphere.

The biggest contributions to this total have come from Easy Goer (predictably, in view of the strength of his daughters' pedigrees) and Saratoga Six, with six each. Easy Goer's sextet include Storm Flag Flying, Corinthian, Astronomer Royal and Magical Fantasy. Alysheba is just one behind, with George Washington and Grandera among his five, and Turkoman is the broodmare sire of Point Given, Hard Spun and Colonel John. The main achievement by Strike the Gold's daughters has been Borrego, while Ten Most Wanted is the best winner out of a Criminal Type mare.

COMPTROLLER WARNS OF NYRA INSOLVENCY

An audit released yesterday by New York State Comptroller Thomas DiNapoli warns that the New York Racing Association will face financial insolvency in 2011 without either projected proceeds from an Aqueduct racino or budget cuts. The comptroller has assigned auditors to provide on-site monitoring of the organization's financial condition. "NYRA is still on very shaky financial ground," DiNapoli said in a statement. "After declaring bankruptcy and getting bailed out by taxpayers, NYRA continued business as usual for too long. There's too much at stake to let NYRA continue its fiscal mismanagement. My auditors will begin real-time auditing of NYRA's books." On May 24, the New York State Legislature approved a \$25-million loan for NYRA. DiNapoli's audit determined that NYRA would have been forced to cease operations in June without the loan, which will now allow it to operate through the end of the state fiscal year. Among factors contributing to the organization's continuing financial woes, the audit cited three factors: after emerging from bankruptcy in 2008, NYRA continued to spend more than it was making, operating at a deficit of \$8.9 million in 2009 and with a projected 2010 deficit of \$19 million; NYRA has not received projected revenue of \$30 million from the VLTs at Aqueduct and more than \$17 million from the bankrupt New York City Off-Track Betting Corporation; and handle declined by 13.2 percent between 2006 and 2009. DiNapoli also addressed the need for legislative support. "The state also has to live up to its end of the deal," the comptroller said. "But it looks like the selection of a VLT operator for Aqueduct is still an open question. When you start with six potential bidders and end up with only one, it begs the question of how the process was handled and whether the state can actually close the deal. The fact is NYRA can't make it long without significant restructuring and revenues from VLTs."

No Cuts for PA Development Fund:

The \$28-billion General Fund budget that Pennsylvania Governor Ed Rendell signed last week will allocate the same amount of money to the state's Race Horse Development Fund (RHDF) for the 2010-11 fiscal year as it did last year. "This is very good news for those involved in breeding and racing in the state," Pennsylvania Horse Breeders Association President Brian N. Sanfratello said. "Last year the legislature assessed RHDF for nearly \$50 million, and because the budget wasn't finalized until well after the July deadline, the assessment was then fully applied over the six-month period from January through June of 2010." Sanfratello added that the amount allocated to the RHDF, which is responsible for most of the purse money, Breeding Fund revenues, and benefits to horsemen in the state, will be reassessed annually "through the end of fiscal year 2012-13, but will be prorated to funds collected over the full 12 months each year."

AUCTIONEER DAVID PIM DIES Former Tattersalls auctioneer and senior Turf Club steward David Pim died Friday after a short illness. He was 79. Pim, who ran Anngrove Stud in County Laois, was twice senior steward of Ireland's Turf Club and was highly respected in his role as auctioneer at Ballsbridge Sales, which became Tattersalls Ireland, and at Tattersalls' Park Paddocks in Newmarket, and was renowned for his unique style on the rostrum. Pim stepped down from his post at Park Paddocks in 2004, but continued at Tattersalls Ireland for a further two years. Paying tribute, son Alastair, who followed in his father's footsteps at both Anngrove Stud and at Tattersalls, told *Racing Post*, "He brought theatre to the sale ring, and people who were not directly involved with the sale would come up to Park Paddocks just to hear him auctioneering. It is less well known that away from the rostrum, he was a very shy and private man. I'm told we were like two peas in a pod. I sound like him, look like him, and I try to emulate him in auctioneering. He was a fine example to follow." Tattersalls chairman Edmond Mahony added, "He was, first and foremost, the outstanding auctioneer of his generation. He was an amazing entertainer and certainly the only man I knew who would attract members of the public to Park Paddocks, just to sit in the gods and watch him sell. He had been an enthusiastic amateur dramatist and he certainly brought it with him. He formed an instant rapport with the bidder and picked up on little things in their behaviour, making witty off-the-cuff remarks." Further tribute was paid by trainer Ted Walsh, who said, "His witty one-liners and ability to keep a crowd enthralled during a sale made him a dream auctioneer for the vendor. David was unique. What made him even more brilliant was the fact that he was a self-made auctioneer. He moulded himself and was a brilliant man for the vendor. No better man ever stood on a podium at Tatterstalls. He had a wonderful turn of phrase and he had a great knowledge of the game as well, something which many auctioneers are missing.
