I WANT REVENGE POINTING TOWARD ISELIN

IEAH Stables's and partners **I Want Revenge** (Stephen Got Even), who returned from a 15-month layoff to place third in Belmont's GII Suburban H. July 3, is targeting Monmouth Park's GIII Philip H. Iselin S. Aug. 21. "He came out of his race the right way and we are happy with him right now," trainer Rick Dutrow Jr. said on *IEAH.com*. "We think the Iselin will be the next nice spot for him to get a mile and an eighth around two turns and some good timing to get over this big race off a long layoff." I Want Revenge posted eye-catching victories in the 2009 GIII Gotham S. and GI Wood Memorial S. before being sidelined with an ankle injury.

ZAYAT REORGANIZATION APPROVED

Zayat Stables announced yesterday that its Chapter 11 reorganization plan has been approved by the U.S. Bankruptcy Court for the District of New Jersey. "I feel as though we've reached the light at the end of the tunnel," Ahmed Zayat said in a statement. "While Chapter 11 was a necessary step to take, Zayat Stables has emerged stronger and we are excited about building on our many recent successes in the racing industry. I look forward to carrying out our reorganization plan, and continuing to develop some of the best horses in the country." Fifth Third filed suit late last year, claiming that Zayat Stables had defaulted on \$34 million in loans. The two agreed to a settlement in June.



TOGETHER IN A FLASH

Derrick Smith, Susan Magnier and Michael Tabor's **Together (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) held on to a one-length victory over **Laughing Lashes** (Mr. Greeley) to take yesterday's G3 Silver Flash S. at Leopardstown. Third at Naas on debut May 12, Together shed maiden status over the same course and seven-furlong distance last time June 10 and justified odds-on favoritism with a first pattern-race score here. Positioned behind **Gemstone (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) in second until easing by that stablemate with 1 1/2 furlongs remaining, she was ridden out in the latter stages to comfortably hold the vain bid of Laughing Lashes to register a personal best. MARKET HOLD

Nobody was doing cartwheels at Fasig-Tipton for the opening sale of the yearling season during Tuesday and Wednesday's July Yearling Sale, but the consensus was that it could have been a lot worse. With 18 percent fewer horses catalogued, the gross dropped by 12 percent from \$20.8 million to \$18,414,500, while the average dropped by just 2.5 percent from \$77,716 to \$75,780. The further consensus went something like "if this is the floor, we can live with it. There were still \$18 million worth of horses sold." There were plenty of buys by two-year-old pinhookers, which was an encouraging sign.

As you know, the first third of the sale, which was the first two-thirds of Tuesday's session, was reserved for first-crop yearling sires. The remainder of Tuesday and all of Wednesday's session were open to all sires (two by first-crop yearling sire **Latent Heat** brought \$70,000 and \$80,000 on Wednesday, otherwise all the

yearlings from their sires' first crops were among the first 144 catalogued). The expectation was that Wednesday would average higher than Tuesday, just as the second session had averaged (considerably) more than the first last year. That proved not to be the

case. The average hovered around \$75,000 for the entire sale, finishing up, as noted, at \$75,780. But there was a massive difference in clearance rate between the first 144 head and the rest of the sale. Only 58 percent of the 120 yearlings sent through the ring of the first 144 were listed as sold, whereas 78 percent of the remaining 221 sent through the ring were sold. A difference of 20 percent is absolutely massive in this kind of calculation, though one veteran sales observer predicted beforehand the clearance rate would be quite high because "bank liens abound." That might explain why the clearance rate was so good for the rest of the sale, but it doesn't explain why it was so low for the first-crop yearling sires. **Cont. p5**

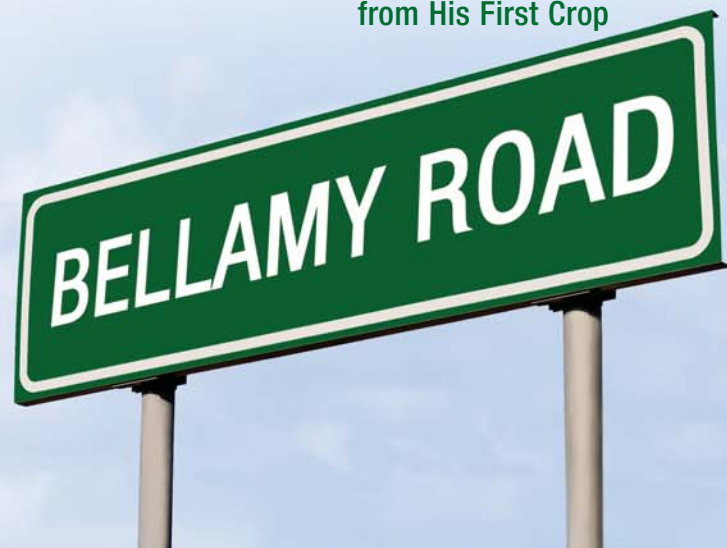

The challenge for yearling sellers this year is survival, because they are selling yearlings off 2008 stud fees. The market peaked in 2007, and it wasn't until after the mares had all been bred in 2008 that the market (all markets, really, horse and otherwise) crashed. In fact, the crash really came at the beginning of the Keeneland September Sale in 2008, and prices literally fell by 40-50 percent over exactly the next 12 months. By September 2009, the floor had been reached. Since then the horse market has more or less 'stabilized.' In North America, the cumulative price fall was near enough 50 percent from the 2007 peak (early 2008 for two-year-old sellers).

The crash in stud fees didn't follow until 2009, so that's good news for 2010 weanling sellers come November, as the major production cost of stud fees had fallen in corresponding fashion. But November is a long time away. For the next 3 1/2 months yearling sellers are contending with record or near-record 2008 stud fees as part of their production costs. Even if prices remain relatively stable (or down in the region of another 10 percent), there's no question of breeders making money, except in the relatively few cases where the yearling 'hits the bar.'

A few always do, of course, especially in this market if they're by **Medaglia d'Oro**. During this week's sale, there were 37 yearlings which sold for \$150,000 or more, and it would be fair

to say almost all of those showed a profit. That is just under 11 percent of the 341 yearlings which were actually sent through the ring. Those 37 yearlings had a 100 percent clearance rate (by definition, since they all sold), and averaged \$200,054. So you had a slightly

better than one-in-10 chance if you sent a yearling through the ring at Fasig that it would sell for \$200,000. For the other 89 percent of yearlings sent through the ring, it wasn't pretty. Of the 304 yearlings offered which did not sell for \$150,000 plus, 206 were listed as sold (per final end-of-sale published figures), which was just under 68 percent of those offered; these 206 averaged \$53,459. If you were getting that from a \$15,000 stud fee, you just about broke even or made a few pennies. But if you were getting that for your yearling off \$30,000-\$50,000 stud fees, it's not a very pretty picture. The vultures at the banks (oh, excuse me, I meant 'the bank managers') aren't going to be suddenly loosening the credit strings. **Cont. p6**

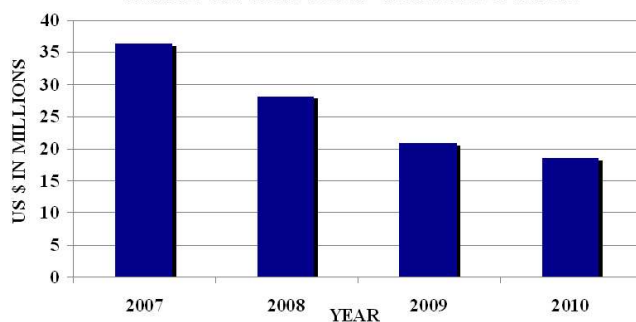
Weekly Sales Ticker

"It's still a 50 percent drop in gross from 2007, but with 18 percent fewer catalogued than in 2009, this week's sale produced satisfactory results: gross down 12 percent from a catalogue down 18 percent in numbers, and the average down a marginal 2.5 percent from last year, though still above the \$75,000 mark. After only 58 percent of the first 144 through the ring (first-crop yearling sires) were listed as sold, the rest of the sale saw 78 percent sold, so the overall sale was 71 percent sold of those offered (up eight percent from last year). Perhaps the yearling market has at least stabilized."

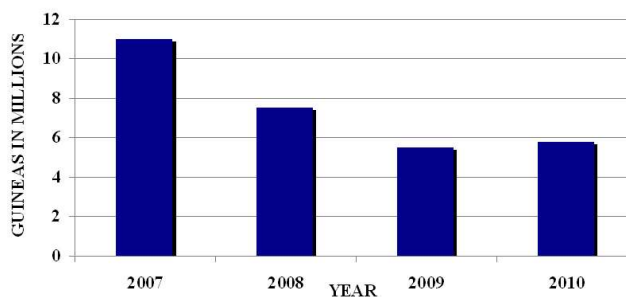

The 37 yearlings which sold for what we sometimes colloquially call 'a buck and a half' (\$150,000) or more were sired by 26 different stallions, but only six of the 26 sired more than one. That suggests it wasn't so

much due to being by a hot sire as that the individual in question hit all the right buttons. Medaglia d'Oro, predictably, led the list, with four of the \$150,000 plus yearlings. Another third-crop sire (first four-year-olds 2010), **Speightstown**, had three make \$150,000 plus, as did two of the first-year

Darley sires, **Hard Spun** and **Discreet Cat**. Two older proven sires, **Unbridled's Song** and **Malibu Moon**, had two yearlings each 'clear the bar.'

Spendthrift's Malibu Moon is now emerging as a top 10 commercial star, with his oldest Kentucky crop now five-year-olds. This son of A.P. Indy went one-for-two as a two-year-old, but never made it back to the races. He initially went to the Pons' Brothers Country Life Farm in Maryland for a \$3,000 fee in 2000; his first crop was foaled in 2001. After Declan Moon--from his second crop--was named champion two-year-old in 2004, Malibu Moon earned a transfer to Kentucky, where he now stands for \$40,000. He had eight graded/group winners last year, and ranked 11th on the General Sire List (per *Bloodhorse.com*). This year he has four graded winners, all from his Kentucky crops, including Grade I winners Life At Ten and Devil May Care. He ranks fifth on the General Sire List. Of the nine yearlings by Malibu Moon catalogued at Fasig-Tipton July, seven went through the ring and five sold for an average of \$115,000. Confident prediction here that he's one \$40,000 stallion breeders will make money on this year.



FRANK ROMEO

Accomplishment: Frank and his father Dom Romeo collected their first Canadian Classic--the Queen's Plate--with homebred Big Red Mike at Woodbine July 4.

Birthdate: December 11, 1956

Birthplace: Toronto, Canada

Education: Ryerson University (Business Administration) in Toronto, Canada

How did you get involved in the business? My father used to go to

the races when I was just a kid. In the mid-70s, Ed Seedhouse--who worked with my father--had a brother who trained horses. On behalf of my dad, that trainer claimed a horse named Two Time Henry, who won a race for us. That was the start of his involvement in the horse business. As for myself, I've worked in the car business with my father for 32 years, so for almost as long as he's been involved in horse racing, I've been exposed to it as well.

First Queen's Plate you witnessed? My first Queen's Plate (Royal Chocolate) was in 1973. And to tell you the truth, since that time I can honestly tell you that I haven't missed too many in between.

How did it feel to win your first Queen's Plate? You always dream about this kind of thing. If you relate the accomplishment to hockey, it's like winning the Stanley Cup. This is Canada's race--like the Kentucky Derby in the U.S.

What was it like to meet The Queen? Winning the Queen's Plate is a dream come true, but to do it in a year that The Queen is there is just over the top. It's so hard to imagine since she's only been here a handful of times. It's a day we will just never forget. I was a little surprised that she had such a keen interest in the horses. We had a chance to meet her before the race, she seemed genuinely to be intrigued how the whole family was involved.

How did you celebrate after your Queen's Plate victory?

On the fifth floor at Woodbine, they hold a reception for the stakes winners that day, so we started out up there. It was such an interesting crowd, including some political figures who made it out because The Queen was there. After that, I went back to see the horse and took a few pictures with him. Then a bunch of us went to a restaurant for a bite to eat and continued to celebrate.

Are you heading to the Prince of Wales S. with Big Red Mike?

Yes, we are definitely hoping to go there. He seemed to have come out of the Queen's Plate well, and if everything goes well, that's where we're heading. We'll see what happens after that. The last leg of the Canadian Triple Crown is the Breeders' S. which is 1 1/2 miles on the turf. We think his Smart Strike line will allow him to handle the Polytrack, dirt and the turf, so we may give that a try.

What made you choose Tenpins for your mare, Regent n' Flashy, dam of Big Red Mike? A few years ago, we had a horse named Classic Mike (Smart Strike), a 3/4-brother to Big Red Mike. He was talented, but was a bit of a mess from the knees down. He actually ran in the 2002 Queen's Plate, but coming out of that race like he came out of a battle. We knew he was a horse with a lot more talent than what he had shown, but that cross is what led us to Tenpins. We liked his conformation and felt comfortable with breeding to him.

How many mares/horses/etc. do you own now? We have 12 in training, and 6-8 broodmares, which are boarded at Huntington Stud Farm, just north of Woodbine. We've had more in the past, but with the economy being the way it is, everything was downsized. So we have about 30-35 in total.

Most memorable horse previously campaigned by the Romeos?

My answer is Bold N' Flashy (Bold Ruckus), who was the first horse we ever bred. His dam was Flashy Chestnut, who has kind of been the foundation of our whole breeding operation. Her first foal was Bold N' Flashy, who was a crack sprinter who raced all over the place for us and was a stakes winner for us. So he was our traveler and was just a grand horse for us. Flashy Chestnut also produced a horse by Smarten named Flashy N Smart who was a multiple stakes winner and won a graded stakes in the U.S. The third foal is Regent N Flashy (Vice Regent), who is the dam of Big Red Mike and Classic Mike. *(Editor's Note: a half-sister (by Stephen Got Even) to Big Red Mike and Classic Mike won Woodbine's 7th race yesterday).*

What is your favorite racetrack? Woodbine Racetrack.

Who do you think is the most underrated stallion out there? I bred one of my mares to City Zip this year. It seems like every time you turn around, there is a City Zip that is running well on the turf, the Polytrack or the dirt. I went to him, because I thought he is a really nice stallion who is very reasonably priced.

Who was your biggest racing idol growing up? Ed Seedhouse.

He had some good horses and he was involved in breeding and racing. Over the years, he had a number of horses who would run in the Queen's Plate. He left a real impression on me.

Where would you like to go that you haven't already been?

I'd love to go to the Greek Islands. I also would like to take a cruise in Scandinavia.

Favorite food or meal? Pasta!

Fast horses or fast cars? Fast horses. Cars are my everyday livelihood, but horses are the thing away from the day-to-day routine.

Favorite pastime? I really enjoy gardening.

Childhood ambition? I always loved the car industry and always wanted to work in the business.

First job? When I was 16 or 17, I spent a summer working on a farm. That was my first taste of real hard work.

Favorite sport besides racing? Growing up I loved hockey. In fact, when I became a parent I coached hockey for a while.

If you could have any job in the world, which one would you want? I wouldn't want to change anything. I love what I do.

STAGE 11: HALFTIME REFLECTIONS

Today at beautiful Longchamp, I lost a few dollars, but it was a fair game with everyone in the stands was getting exactly the same odds. Compared to most other industries or governments, racing is remarkably clean. There was moving poetry flying down the stretch. There were owners and trainers willing to live a very precarious existence because they have a passion for this great spectacle. There were courageous riders who form an amazing partnership with the horse and trust their partner at 40 miles an hour in "traffic."

For me this is a passion. I feel sorry for people who do not have a passion, any one, whether it be chess, or bridge, or travel, or collecting, or cooking, or even sitting on a mountain and contemplating the surroundings.

I don't want my passion to be based on a throw-away economy. The horse gives me this aesthetic pleasure, and in return, I owe something to the horse. Yes, I've worked on other causes, often lost causes, but this cause happens to provide a positive outcome. The Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation has developed a winning exacta, by saving

unwanted horses and also providing vocational training in the form of horse care and stable management for inmates: saving unwanted human beings.

This is about horses and it's about people, in so many ways.

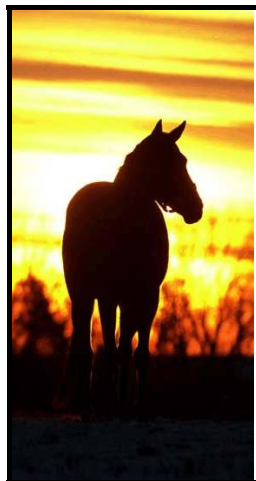
