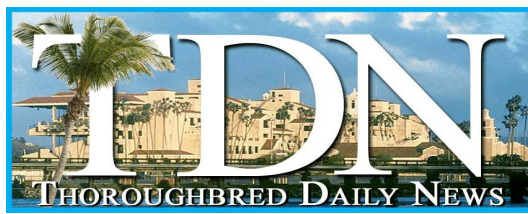

Summer officially began a month ago, but if you needed another excuse to don the flip flops and order up a margarita, enter Del Mar Rack Track, which kicks off its 71st race meet today in Southern California. Per usual, the opening-day feature will be the Oceanside S.

for three-year-olds on the grass. This year's Oceanside, which, unlike in past years will not be split into two divisions, features the black-type debut of "TDN Rising Star" Twirling Candy (Candy Ride {Arg}). The Craig Family Trust homebred opened his account with a first-out victory at Hollywood last November, then dazzled in a 7 3/4-length romp in an optional claimer on return there May 29. It will be the colt's stakes debut. His trainer, John Sadler, is in search of his third straight training title at Del Mar. "We're hoping

for a good start here," he said. "But every year is different." Sadler registered 31 wins at Del Mar in both 2008 and 2009.

Jockey Joel Rosario dominated last year's jockey standings, wracking up 56 victories, compared to runner-up Tyler Baze's 32 wins. Rosario won the riding title at the recently completed Hollywood Park meet.

Officials at the San Diego-area track are hoping that Jerry and Ann Moss's **Zenyatta** (Street Cry {Ire}) returns yet again to defend her title in the GI Clement L. Hirsch S. Aug. 7. The undefeated champ beat Model (Giant's Causeway) by a length in the 2008 renewal, then got her head down to best Anabaa's Creation (Anabaa) last season. H AISFIELD ENTITIES ENTER CHAPTER 11

A total of five entities associated with Richard and Audrey Haisfield's Stonewall Farm have entered Chapter 11 bankruptcy protection, and the farm is in the process of relocating its stallions from its nursery in Kentucky to Ocala, Florida. The Haisfields are reportedly working with JPMorgan Chase bank, which sued the couple last week for \$7 million in defaulted loans. The bank was seeking to seize two of the farm's stallions--Leroidesanimaux (Brz) and A. P. Warrior--in order to sell them, but the bankruptcy proceeding temporarily blocks that move. Stonewall's Kentucky farm, the former Gaillardia Farm, is likely to be sold, according to reports. The Chase action is the second undertaken by a bank against the Haisfields. In May, Fifth Third Bank sued Stonewall, Audrey Haisfield and other associated entities for \$14.8 million in loans. Bluewater Sales was appointed the receiver in that case and has begun the process of selling off some of those horses. *Daily Racing Form* also reports that a group of shareholders have been given a temporary injunction preventing the farm and the Haisfields from retaining 2009 stud-fee income from the shareholders' six lifetime breeding rights to former Stonewall stallion Medaglia d'Oro. The group, MDO, and Stonewall sold Medaglia d'Oro to Darley last summer.

RACETRACK Round-Up

Karelian Injured, Retired...

Green Lantern Stables' Grade I winner **Karelian** (Bertrando--Leaning Tower, by Theatrical {Ire}) sustained a fractured sesamoid during a workout July 17 at Keeneland, *Daily Racing Form* reported. The eight-year-old gelding had surgery Monday at Rood and Riddle Equine Clinic. Dr. Larry Bramlage used a combination of screws, wires and a brace during the procedure. "It was a really, really bad fracture," Arnold said.

"We're hoping for the best to have him as a pasture horse. Dr. Bramlage is optimistic that'll happen after surgery, but the first week or two is of the utmost importance. He was part of the family, we had him that long." The blaze-faced bay captured the GIII River City H. at six, and was runner-up last year in the GI Shadwell Turf Mile. He kicked off 2010 by upending champion Gio Ponti (Tale of the Cat) in the Tampa Bay Breeders' Cup S. Feb. 20, then prevailed in the GI Maker's Mark Mile at Keeneland Apr. 9. In his most recent trip postward, Karelian was runner-up in the GI Shoemaker BC Mile S. at Hollywood on Memorial Day. He had been training for the GII Fourstardave H. at Saratoga Aug. 1 at the time of his injury. Karelian's record stands at 22-10-4-1 with earnings of \$788,675.

Harty Is Full Of Optimism...

Trainer Eoin Harty reported **Victor's Cry** (Street Cry {Ire}) to be in fine form leading up to the GI Eddie Read S. over 1 1/8 miles at Del Mar July 24. "I have always thought this horse had a lot of potential, and I am really optimistic going into Saturday's race," explained Harty during yesterday's NTRA Communications National Media Teleconference. The five-year-old was most impressive last time out, capturing the GI Shoemaker Mile at Hollywood Park June 1. Victor's Cry will face stiff competition Saturday, with last year's GI Hollywood Derby winner **The Usual Q.T.** (Unusual Heat) in opposition. "The Usual Q.T. is certainly the horse to beat, as I have enormous respect for him," stressed Harty. The Irish-born trainer stated that Victor's Cry will, most likely, be brought back to a mile after Saturday's race.

Clovelly to Disperse Stock...

Robin Scully's Clovelly Farm, which has bred the likes of Pleasantly Perfect and Silver Hawk, is slated to disperse its bloodstock holdings, staff at the farm confirmed yesterday. The Lexington nursery will offer a roughly 35-strong draft at the Keeneland November Sale. Pleasantly Perfect, sold as a Keeneland September yearling by Clovelly for \$725,000 to Diamond A Racing Corporation, went on to become one of racing's richest Thoroughbreds. He won the 2003 GI Breeders' Cup Classic and 2004 G1 Dubai World Cup and earned \$7,789,880. Silver Hawk, meanwhile, was a \$77,000 Fasig-Tipton July yearling back in 1980. Racing for Mahmoud Fustok, Silver Hawk was a Group 3 winner who ran third in the G1 Epsom Derby and second in the G1 Irish Derby. He later went on to a successful stud career. Clovelly also bred the Group 1 winners Oui Mon Capitaine (Majestic Prince) and Alkaased (Kingmambo), as well as the group/graded winners Pay the Butler (Val de l'Orne {Fr}), Summer Trip (L'Emigrant), Rami (Riverman), and Crack Regiment (El Gran Senor). Clovelly also bred the six-year-old Tazeez (Silver Hawk), a group winner who finished third in this year's G1 Prince of Wales's S. in Great Britain. Tazeez's dam Soiree Russe (Nureyev) is among those scheduled to go under the hammer at the November sale; she is currently in foal to Lemon Drop Kid. Scully purchased Clovelly Farm in 1950. In June, Lars la Cour, former manager of Clovelly, passed away on his 85th birthday.



Bio All Set For Rematch...

Trainer Reade Baker was bullish about the chances of **Biofuel** (Stormin Fever) ahead of the GI Coaching Club American Oaks at Saratoga July 24. The filly finished third last time out, in her dirt debut, to **Devil May Care**

(Malibu Moon) in the GI Mother Goose, at Belmont Park June 26. However, Baker remains optimistic, and firmly believes that his filly can reverse the form with the Todd Pletcher-trained Devil May Care, who re-opposes. "She did not draw away the last day

as expected," stated Baker of Devil May Care's performance at Belmont. Biofuel, an unlucky fourth in last year's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies at Santa Anita, has no such concerns. "The farther she goes, the better," said an upbeat Baker.

THIS DATE IN HISTORY...

July 21, 1989...Jockey **Chris McCarron** notched his 5,000th career win aboard I Sure Hope So in the fifth race at Hollywood Park.

July 22, 1994...Full card simulcasting began in **Kentucky**, allowing bettors to wager on races throughout the United States.

July 24, 1994...Popular gelding **Fourstardave** won for the 21st and final time in his career when he took a Saratoga allowance race by five lengths. He'd retire a year later with a final record of 99-21-18-16 and over \$1.6 million in earnings.

July 23, 1985...A bay colt, **Seattle Dancer**, by Nijinsky II out of the mare My Charmer, sold to Robert Sangster for \$13.1 million at the Keeneland July Yearling Sale. It was the record price for a Thoroughbred at public auction.

July 26, 1962...Jockey **Angel Cordero Jr.** rode his first winner in the U.S., Counterate, at Aqueduct Racetrack.

July 27, 1973...**Secretariat**, getting ready for the Aug. 4 Whitney S., worked a mile in 1:34 over a muddy track at Saratoga. The time was 4/5 of a second lower than the 55-year-old track record. Secretariat galloped out 1 1/8 miles in 1:47 4/5, 2/5 of a second lower than the track standard.

Mission Impazible Doing Well After Knee Surgery...

Twin Creek Farm's GI Louisiana Derby hero **Mission Impazible** (Unbridled's Song), who hasn't raced since finishing unplaced in the GI Kentucky Derby for trainer Todd Pletcher, is recuperating nicely at the operation's farm near Lexington after undergoing surgery to remove a chip in his right front knee. Rood & Riddle Equine Hospital's Dr. Larry Bramlage performed the surgery in June. "Fingers crossed, the prognosis is good," Randy Gullat, Twin Creek's racing and farm manager and a partner in the stable, told the *TDN* yesterday. "The surgery went excellent and the horse couldn't look any better right now. I'm super pleased with him. I just wish he wasn't here; I wish he was on the racetrack." Gullat said Mission Impazible would likely be given the remainder of the year off before returning to action in Florida early next year. "He'll definitely go back with Todd, so there's a good chance he'll do that," said Gullat. "Who knows what we'll point toward, but there is the GI Donn H. down there. Everything will be in play, and we'll let the horse tell us what to do. We know he has the talent; we just have to get lucky, is all." Mission Impazible worked twice after the Derby, breezing three panels May 10 and four panels May 23. While the injury wasn't detected until after that second work, Gullat suspects the colt might have sustained the chip in the Derby, contested over a muddy track.

"He never was sore," said Gullat. "We did some routine checks on him and did some x-rays on him, and wow, there it was. We didn't catch it until about four weeks after the Derby, but more than likely, that's where it occurred. He's never been unsound, so that's a very big plus going forward. And he looks fabulous right now."

'Cliffs, 'Turpin to Race in 2011...

Trainer Richard Hannon hosted a media day at his main yard at Herridge in Wiltshire yesterday and, as well as looking forward to the upcoming Glorious Goodwood meet, revealed his two star sophomores, **Canford Cliffs (Ire)** (Tagula {Ire}) and **Dick Turpin (Ire)** (Arakan), will remain in training for 2011. He also said there was a chance the two could cross swords in the G1 Sussex

S. July 28, although a final decision on such a clash is out of his hands. Canford Cliffs has annexed the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas and G1 St James's Palace S. in his last two starts, while Dick

Turpin rebounded from a second in the Royal Ascot race to take the G1 Prix Jean Prat. "Both Canford Cliffs and Dick Turpin will stay in training as four-year-olds," Hannon remarked. "I think Canford Cliffs will handle Goodwood well--he didn't like the dip at Newmarket, but would not settle that day. The Sussex S. is going to be one of the highlights of the week and, if we happen to get rain, then Dick Turpin could run as well. I don't want to really run Canford Cliffs and Dick Turpin against each other in the Sussex. They are two very good horses, and I don't want to keep knocking their heads together. They are owned by different people, so there is not a lot I can do about it. Dick Turpin could run in the Sussex if there is rain, as he needs the ground on the easy side of good. [Owner] John [Manley] will probably run him if those conditions come up. He has improved, too. He is always on the move and is a grand horse. He is very good, and I think he could go a mile and a quarter." Hannon continued, "Canford Cliffs has really matured and put on a lot of weight. We took him to Kempton on Monday and he worked around there with Quadrille. He has improved beyond recognition, and I am sure he is getting better. He is certainly going the way to be being the best horse I have ever trained. We have now got him to settle; he settles nicely in his races and shows a good turn of foot. Now he drops his head and relaxes in races, which he was not doing earlier in the season. I thought he would win the Guineas, but he did not settle." Looking forward to unleashing his juvenile band at the Glorious meet next week, Hannon added, "We will certainly have runners in the nurseries and the maidens. There are a couple of very nice colts who will probably run in the maidens. One is by Dubawi (Ire) and is a lovely horse his owner Malih Al Basti gave £140,000 for at the Doncaster breeze-ups called **Big Issue (Ire)**.

Pausanias, one of Sir Alex [Ferguson]'s, is very nice, too, and this Kyllachy (GB) colt will go to Goodwood."

Ice Box Haskell Bound...

GI Florida Derby winner **Ice Box** (Pulpit) has joined the list of contenders for the Aug. 1 GI Haskell Invitational S. at Monmouth Park, according to *Daily Racing Form*. Fellow Nick Zito-trained sophomore **Fly Down** (Mineshaft) will start in the July 31 GII Jim Dandy S. at Saratoga. "I feel that's the best way to go," Zito told the *Form*. "Monmouth's track is playing [toward] closers, and Ice Box comes from behind. The turns are pretty sharp there, and Fly Down would be better off [at Saratoga]; he's a longer horse, a bigger horse." Ice Box, a troubled second behind Haskell hopeful Super Saver (Maria's Mon) in the GI Kentucky Derby, was ninth as the favorite in the June 5 GI Belmont S. Ice Box worked a half-mile over Saratoga's Oklahoma training track Monday in :48.60. Fly Down, winner of the GII Dwyer S. and second in the Belmont, also worked four furlongs Monday at Saratoga, covering the distance in :48.50. Jose Lezcano has the mount on both colts.

MIDDLE MARKET HINTS

The season's inaugural yearling auction, last week's Fasig-Tipton July sale, was always designed to be a middle-market, as opposed to high-end, yearling sale, and remains so after more than 35 years. Saratoga, held Aug. 2-3, is a boutique, high-end sale.

Arqana's August sale in Deauville the middle of the month will start with the high end on Friday, Aug. 13, and drop down a notch each day for four days. Then Keeneland's new Book 1 in September (two nights of 100 or so each, followed by four days of what previously have been Book 2 and Book 3 horses) will tell us the whole truth and nothing but the truth. We'll be a lot wiser on Friday night, Sept. 17--the end of the first week of Keeneland September--than we

could possibly be after one sale of yearlings produced by stud fees, in the final boom year of 2008, of \$50,000 and below--mostly below.

There were just 14 stallions that had three or more yearlings sell at Fasig July with averages of \$60,000 or higher. The worm turned with the credit collapse, and suddenly unproven sires, which could do no wrong, can do no right: "they're unproven," say the breeders and buyers disapprovingly, when just the year before last they would say "they're unproven," with a whole different emphasis: *they've done nothing wrong yet*. Counting the two Latent Heats on Wednesday, the first-crop sires at Fasig had 59 percent sell from those sent through the ring; sires with runners (everybody else) had 78 percent sell. That is a huge discrepancy, showing a significant bias (for whatever reasons) for getting yearlings by sires with runners actually sold. So it seems significant that the five first-year sires of yearlings on this list of 14 collectively had 77 percent sold, of those sent through the ring. **Oppenheim cont. p8**

This is definitely something we'll want to be watching over the next few sales. Yes, there are a few sires like **Street Sense** and **Any Given Saturday** who may join these five with 75 percent-plus selling of those sent through the ring. But, when you take out the five

first-crop yearling sires that had three or more sold at Fasig, the other first-year sires of yearlings, collectively, sold only 38 of 78 sent through the ring--49 percent. If Fasig is anything to go by--and we'll see--the percentage sold of those offered could be a critical figure to use in analyzing

the market acceptance of the 2010 first-year sires. These five all had six or more, in fact, sell at Fasig: **Hard Spun** (67 percent); **Discreet Cat** (75 percent); **Corinthian** (70 percent); **Latent Heat** (80 percent); and **Scat Daddy** (100 percent, seven-for-seven).

Nothing works better at Fasig July than a young sire who's made good; their stud fees are invariably increasing (or at worst holding steady, like Speightstown's, in a crashing market). Going into the sale, **Medaglia D'Oro**, who stood for \$100,000 this year, looked a good bet to top the charts, and so it proved: bred off of \$40,000 stud fees in 2008, he had six through the ring, six sold for an average of \$225,000, and a median of \$215,000--the only sire with three or more sold to break the \$200,000 mark in both cases. Two other young

sires from the 2006 sire crop (first foals 2006, four-year-olds of 2010) also, not surprisingly, made this list: **Speightstown** had five of seven through the ring sell, averaging \$139,000, with a median of \$170,000; and **Tapit** (now \$50,000, was \$12,500), had three of four sell, averaging \$63,666, with a \$70,000 median.

As Fasig found last year, sires with their first two-year-olds can be a tough sell, ditto sires with first three-year-olds (F2007 sires) unless they've jumped out with a top horse or two right off the bat. There weren't a lot of representatives from these two groups, but, of the F2008 sires (first two-year-olds), Claiborne's **War Front** had three (of four offered) average \$63,333, while Darley's **Rockport Harbor** had four sell, of four offered, for an average of \$60,000 (also his median).

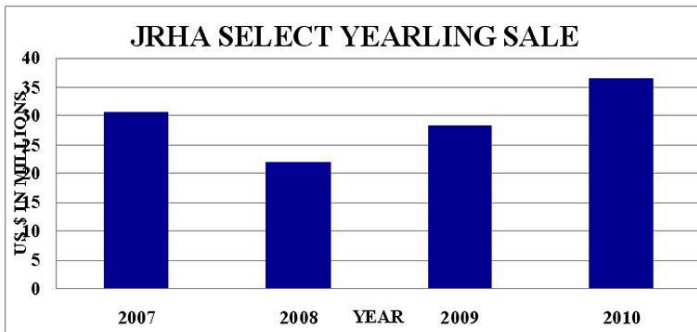

"The Japanese sale, held by the JRHA on July 12-13, has been about two-thirds foals, one-third yearlings the last few years; this year, it was about 50-50 as the Japanese authorities continue their efforts to create more of a yearling market in Japan. International buyers aren't used to buying foals in July, but they are used to buying yearlings. The gross for the foal market has declined 50% in the last three years, but over 40% of that decline is in the number offered; the average is only down 16 percent. The yearling average is off 29 percent but the gross up 14 percent, with 40 percent more yearlings catalogued." - Bill Oppenheim

more sold: **El Corredor** (F2003) was just beaten out by Tiznow on the 2005 Freshman Sire List (followed by City Zip, Songandaprayer, and Broken Vow); he had three (of four offered) average \$125,666, with a \$130,000 colt and a \$190,000 filly. Veteran

Rahy, now retired, had three average \$115,666. **Malibu Moon**, as highlighted last week, had five sell (of seven offered) for an average of \$115,000 and a median of \$100,000, off a \$40,000 stud fee; expect him to continue to be one of this year's sale stars. **Lemon Drop Kid**, who first foals were born in 2002, had three fillies average \$83,333. So we're not working with a huge sample size here, but I think this list gives us some names to watch as the sales progress.

Who's Not by Danzig?

Coolmore's **Holy Roman Emperor** (Danehill) was always odds-on to be Europe's leading freshman sire of 2010 (first foals 2008, first two-year-olds 2010); pressed into service when George Washington proved infertile, he had been a top-class two-year-old, capping his 2006 season by giving Teofilo (Galileo) a scare in the G1 Dewhurst S. He comes from a top outfit, inherited a great book of mares, and had impeccable two-year-old form—all the credentials. Sure enough, he is the top freshman sire in Europe by progeny earnings, but, surprisingly, he is not the top freshman sire in Europe by number of runners or winners. That is Darley's **Iffraaj**, who had winner number 17 on Monday, after these figures were compiled. Cont. p10

Iffraaj is by Zafonic and won three Group 2 races at seven furlongs at four and five; having kicked off at €12,000 in 2007, his stud fee had dropped to just half that in 2010, when he stood for €6,000. It's a little early to know just what's going to happen in this group, but when the top two have 17 (Iffraaj) and 14 (Holy Roman Emperor) winners respectively, and the next horse on the list has seven, it's a pretty good

bet that we haven't heard the last of the top two.

One amazing fact about this list of the leading 2010 European freshman sires to date is that 10 of the top 12 hail from the Danzig sire line, including the only four to have sired black-type winners so far. Only Iffraaj (Mr. Prospector line, through Gone West and Zafonic) and fifth-ranked (by progeny earnings) **Layman** (Hail to Reason line, through Halo and Sunday Silence) are not. Danzig himself sired the current fourth-placed **Librettist** (Darley) and sixth-placed **Ad Valorem** (Coolmore). Danehill sired Holy Roman Emperor (Coolmore), third-placed **Aussie Rules** (Coolmore), **Kodiak**, and **Ivan Denisovich** (Coolmore), and his son Danehill Dancer is the sire of **Indesatchel** and **Silent Times**. Green Desert is the sire of **Diamond Green** and **Byron** (Darley). Incidentally, the top six all belong to Coolmore (Holy Roman Emperor, Aussie Rules, Ad Valorem) or Darley (Iffraaj, Librettist, Layman); in that respect, among this group, so far it's a draw. But, in terms of sire lines, it's a one-sided affair: Danzig rules.

INSTANT RACING APPROVED FOR KENTUCKY TRACKS

Fifteen months ago, Kentucky State Senator Damon Thayer proposed that the state Attorney General's office investigate the possibility of allowing Instant Racing machines at race-tracks in Kentucky. The Attorney General issued an opinion in favor of the new type of gaming, and the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission yesterday voted to change current regulations to legalize it in the state. Instant Racing, which was first installed at Oaklawn Park in Arkansas in 2000, utilizes a

self-service betting terminal that offers patrons the opportunity to wager on races that have already been run. The machine randomly chooses a race from the past, then supplies some handicapping information on the runners--but the date, track, name of runner, trainer and jockey are not revealed. After a wager is made, the video of the race is played and the results posted. Odds are determined by what other bettors have wagered on the race, just as in live parimutuel racing. Exotic wagering will also be available on Instant Racing events. The new regulations will now be sent to the Legislative Research Commission to be reviewed. The tracks and the horsemen also need to come to an agreement on a division of revenue. "The Commission staff, at our request, took into account the opinion of the Office of the Attorney General in recommending we adopt these regulations," said Bob Beck, chairman of the KHRC. "I believe the approval of these regulations will help our ailing racing industry by providing much needed revenue to increase purses and help keep owners, trainers and their horses in Kentucky." Nick Nicholson, president and CEO of Keeneland, issued a statement in support of the decision, but added a caveat. "We appreciate the commission's commitment to Kentucky's signature industry and Gov. [Steven] Beshear's continued leadership on these issues," Nicholson said. "The reason is simple: this new pari-mutuel wager would be another tool that we could use to help generate additional revenue to boost purses and assist our industry during an extremely challenging period. That's the sole reason for our support."

Not a Quick Fix...

After outlining the basics of Instant Racing, however, Nicholson added, "That's what pari-mutuel wagering on historic races is. What it is not is a panacea for the challenges confronting our industry. It would not, frankly, generate the revenues for our industry or our Commonwealth that would be created by other forms of expanded gaming--the types of games that are significantly boosting purses in other states and altering the competitive landscape in our industry." He concluded, "That said, what our industry has always wanted is the ability to help itself--with tools that will allow us to invest more in our businesses and, most importantly, boost the purses that keep our races compelling and competitive with tracks on our borders and across the country. A new pari-mutuel wager such as historic racing has the potential to be one such tool. I hope we will be allowed to move forward quickly in assessing its viability so that we can make the kinds of investments that will keep Kentucky's signature industry the world's capital for Thoroughbred horse racing--creating jobs and economic growth for our Commonwealth."

Turfway Park President and CEO Robert N. Elliston echoed Nicholson's reservations, but welcomed the potential for additional revenue. In a statement, Elliston said, "It's no secret that Turfway Park is under stress because we're unable to compete directly with our next-door neighbors, who use gaming to fortify their racing and breeders' programs. Our recent decision to cut the historic Kentucky Cup series from our fall schedule is only the latest blow and stands in stark contrast to the consistently positive news from our competitors. I therefore appreciate the good news from the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission and applaud their initiative in pursuing an option we are allowed to use in addressing our competition. I also thank Gov. Beshear for his continued understanding of the plight of Kentucky's signature industry and his leadership in trying to find workable solutions. While Instant Racing likely may not generate sufficient revenue to put us on equal footing with other states, it could give us a bit of breathing room in the near term."

was time. Great horses like him will always tell you when. It is a very sad day for me, Larry Mabee and the Golden Eagle farm staff. He was a special horse." The 21-year-old stallion will be buried at the Ramona, California, farm, near Best Pal and General Meeting. Campaigned by Overbrook Farm and trained by D. Book Review

SECRETARIAT'S MEADOW--THE LAND, THE FAMILY, THE LEGEND

By Kate Chenery Tweedy, with Leanne Meadows Ladin

Much has been written about Secretariat over recent decades, but certain gaps have remained--until now. "Secretariat's Meadow" reveals a complete picture of the legendary racehorse from the viewpoint of Kate Chenery Tweedy, granddaughter of Meadow Stable's founder Christopher T. Chenery.



Unquestionably, the overriding message is one of "hope triumphing over tragedy, determination over loss and success over defeat." Although bordering on hyperbole, this statement is an accurate representation of both the people and horses under discussion. Secretariat is almost personified throughout, with his development seen as a testimony to nature and nurture working in unison. A certain degree of luck, and the favorable outcome of a coin toss, are also acknowledged by the

author as contributing factors.

Tweedy also describes the careers of other remarkable Meadow Stables racehorses, most notably Sir Gaylord and Riva Ridge. Despite being supreme equine athletes in their own right, the above could be regarded as mere stepping stones to what unfolded in 1973. Secretariat's exploits that year transcended the sporting realm, and provided a ray of hope in an otherwise gloomy era. The author highlights the personal connection that the Chenery family had with the horse, stressing that Secretariat was "not only a champion racehorse, but a cherished friend."

Although the book begins a tad slowly, it comes to life over the ensuing chapters. "Secretariat's Meadow" is an informative rags-to-riches story, rooted in reality and historical fact. The author does a tremendous job in identifying each and every individual responsible for producing the legendary horse. This alone constitutes a welcome change, as the Thoroughbred industry is often characterized by glorifying certain individuals at the expense of others. Tweedy leaves no stone unturned in her pursuit to provide an accurate account of what happened at Meadow Stables, before and after Secretariat's birth.

Personally, I found "Secretariat's Meadow" to be an interesting read. The book benefits enormously by coming from a direct family source, with the series of illustrations and photographs enhancing the overall reading experience. It will ensure that the Chenery family, and their affiliation with Secretariat, will remain etched in the memory for years to come. -Gary King
