CAN YOU FEEL THE FORCE?

This year's G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth S. may be low on quantity, but it is bristling with quality, and promises to be a stellar renewal of Britain's midsummer showpiece. The chief contender of the six-horse field is G1 Epsom Derby hero **Workforce (GB)** (King's Best). The sophomore suffered his first defeat behind **Cape Blanco (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire})

when blighted by equipment failure in the May 13 G2 Dante S. at York, but sealed his place in history with a record-breaking run in the Blue Riband June 5. He benefits from the arguably generous weight concession against the older horses at this time of year. The first Epsom hero to line up since Kris Kin (Kris S.) ran third in 2003, he will attempt to become the first to win since Galileo (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) in 2001. "It's going to be a really exciting day," racing manager Lord Grimthorpe told *PA Sport*. "He's had a straightforward preparation, he has worked nicely and, most importantly, without any interruptions." **Cont. p3**

HANDLE WITH CARE

After a four-decade stint at Belmont Park, the GI Betfair/TVG CCC Oaks will make its Saratoga debut this afternoon with an eight-filly field that features **Devil May Care** (Malibu Moon). That Glencrest Farm colorbearer, a first-out winner at the Spa last summer, comes here off a solid score over **Connie and Michael** (Roman Ruler) and **Biofuel** (Stormin Fever) in the GI Mother Goose S. at Belmont June 26. "She came out of the race very well, and has trained well since, as she always does,"

trainer Todd Pletcher noted. "We've kept her on our maintenance program, and she's fit and happy, and we hope she's ready to run another good race." **Cont. p5**

THE SITUATION ON THE JERSEY SHORE

Reigning Horse of the Year **Rachel Alexandra** (Medaglia d'Oro) schooled in the Monmouth paddock Friday ahead of her start this afternoon in the Lady's Secret S. Her connections are using this non-graded event as a tightener for races to come. "I hope that it is a bridge or a building block to more substantial races toward the end of the year," trainer Steve Asmussen told *Daily Racing Form*. "I love where she's at right now. She's a high-octane, run-'em-off-their-feet horse." **Cont. p5-6**

WATCH HER GEAUX

Le Mi Geaux (First Samurai) was coming off a 7 1/4-length graduation at Churchill Downs, but was let go at 9-1 for Saratoga's opening day feature, the Gill Schuylerville S. That proved to be a mistake. Benefitting from a costly speed duel up front between **Stopspendingmaria** (Montbrook) and **Let's Get Fiscal** (Bandini), the chestnut filly took to the center of the track to deliver her challenge, and forged clear in the final strides.

Le Mi Geaux is a homebred for Lansdon B. Robbins III, who made the call to put the filly in this spot. "That was a pleasant surprise," said winning trainer Rick Dutrow Jr. "We're very happy. I have to give all the credit to the owner, because he was the one who wanted to run her here--I thought she was in too tough. I thought the wet track might help us, but that was only a hope. I'm sure Mr. Robbins will want to go to the [GI] Spinaway [Sept. 5]." Robbins campaigned the winner's dam, Message Red (Cryptoclearance), and sent her to First Samurai (Giant's Causeway), who captured the 2005 GI Hopeful S. for the partnership of Robbins and Bruce Lunsford. **Cont. p2**

Campaigned by Robbins, Message Red produced two foals before visiting First Samurai in his first year at stud. The resulting filly was Le Mi Geaux, who was consigned by Vinery at Fasig-Tipton Calder Sale, but RNA'd for \$80,000. After making up ground to finish third in her career debut at Churchill May 14, the chestnut was in the thick of things from the start under the Twin Spires June 20 ([video](#)), and drew off to score by 7 1/4 lengths with Freddy Lenclud in the saddle. Lenclud had the same game plan in mind here, but called an audible when the gates opened. "We were supposed to be really close to the lead, like she did last time, but she didn't break as sharp and there was a lot of speed, so we had to sit behind the leaders," Lenclud explained. "I thought she really did something good today, because it's hard to come back on the mud, and she really finished strong down the lane." Stopspendingmaria had Let's Get Fiscal at her throatlatch through splits of :21.81 and :45.87 before shaking loose from her rival turning for home. Le Mi Geaux, in fifth down the backstretch, rallied in tandem with Show Me the Bling, who ducked in and raced greenly in the final furlong. The winner continued on determinedly and edged the favorite in the final strides. Message Red produced a First Samurai colt in April 2009, and was sold for \$10,000 at Keeneland November while in foal to Flower Alley.

King George VI & Queen Elizabeth S. cont.

G2 Dante S. winner **Cape Blanco** is the only horse to have lowered the colors of **TDN Rising Star** **Workforce**. He rebounded off a disappointing 10th in the June 6 G1 Prix du Jockey Club at Chantilly to claim the June 27 G1 Irish Derby at The Curragh last time. Trainer Aidan O'Brien, seeking a fourth renewal following the exploits of Galileo (Ire) in 2001, Dylan Thomas (Ire) in 2007 and Duke of Marmalade (Ire) in 2008, is looking for a repeat of his sophomore's latest success. "Cape Blanco is in good form, we've been very happy with him since The Curragh, and everything has gone well in the build up so far," O'Brien said. "We've always thought very highly of him, and the only blot on his copybook was his run in France, but we're just putting that down to him having an off day." O'Brien added, "He caught the back of his heel and was very sore after the Dante, but he was perfect again a few days after the race. The Irish Derby was the first time he ran over a mile and a half, and he showed there that he had all the courage and class that we always thought he had. It's going to be an exciting race, and we're looking forward to it."

Sir Michael Stoute, who registered a fourth success in the contest when Conduit (Ire) (Dalakhani {Ire}) led home a stable trifecta last year, also is represented by **Harbinger**, a more-than-able understudy to Workforce. Highclere Thoroughbred Racing's bay is undefeated in three starts after wins in the Apr. 17 G3 John Porter S. at Newbury, the May 7 G3 Ormonde S. at Chester and the June 19 G2 Hardwicke S. at Royal Ascot.

"Harbinger will be Highclere's first runner in this prestigious race, and Sir Michael reports the big horse to be in great form, so the stage is now set for a thrilling encounter," read a statement on highclereracing.co.uk. Stoute saddles last term's G3 Joel S. winner **Confront** as well; he will act as a pacemaker for Workforce.

With the enforced absence of **Dar Re Mi (GB)** (Sing-spiel {Ire}) (see below), **Daryakana** will attempt to become the first of her sex to win since Time Charter (Ire) (Saritamer) in 1983. His Highness The Aga Khan's homebred chestnut enjoyed a banner sophomore campaign, closing an undefeated 2009 with a victory in the G1 Hong Kong Vase at Sha Tin last December. She has finished third in both starts this semester, the May 24 G2 Prix Corrida and the June 27 G1 Grand Prix de Saint Cloud, but her usual run style of arriving late--allied to her preferred track conditions--will be advantageous in this small field. The line-up is completed by three-time G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe runner-up **Youmzain**, who hit the board in the 2007 and 2008 editions. He comes here off a fourth in the June 4 G1 Coronation Cup at Epsom and a second in the June 27 G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud. Dar Re Mi was taken out of consideration Friday morning. Winner of the Mar. 27 G1 Dubai Sheema Classic at Meydan, the five-year-old ran fourth in the July 3 G1 Coral-Eclipse S. at Sandown. "Dar Re Mi will not run in the King George because she has a stone bruise in her foot," said trainer John Gosden.

Enriched turned in a startling performance last out in a Hollywood allowance May 22. The five-year-old former claimer trounced GSW Oil Man (Ire) (Pyrus) by 9 1/4 lengths, earning the year's best turf Beyer Speed Figure of 111. That performance may have taken something out of the Doug O'Neill trainee, however, as he has not been seen since. **Victor's Cry** pulled off a 21-1 shocker last time in the G1 Shoemaker Mile May 31. The late-blooming five-year-old received a nice set-up and saved ground for most of the race, but he figures to enjoy similar conditions here behind GI Charles Whittingham Memorial H.-winning speedball **Acclamation** and **Enriched**. European import **Crowded House** was an ultra-impressive winner of the G1 Racing Post Trophy in 2008, but made only two unsuccessful starts the next season. He ran well to be second in a pair of Group 3 events in Dubai before running ninth, but only beaten three lengths, in the G1 Dubai World Cup in March. Three subsequent tries in Britain have been disappointing and, while the addition of Lasix might prove beneficial, another intercontinental voyage probably won't.



1966 Saratoga Yearling Grad OBEAH, sold by her breeder, Bertram Linder, to Mrs. Jane Dupont Lunger's Christiana Stables. A two-time Delaware H. winner, a prestigious stakes which for many years was a G1 race, OBEAH produced 3 GSWs. But it was her Champion two and three-year-old filly—**GO FOR WAND**— which insured her immortality.

Acting Happy makes her first appearance since taking a spill-marred renewal of the GII Black-Eyed Susan S. at Pimlico May 14. The Jay Em Ess runner has five straight works going six furlongs at Aqueduct, and fitness shouldn't be an issue. One of the fillies who fell at Pimlico, **Seeking the Title**, is back in the mix here. After finishing sixth in the GI Acorn S. at Belmont June 5, the dark bay put in a determined rally to land the GIII Iowa Oaks at Prairie Meadows June 26. "After something like the Black-Eyed Susan, sometimes they lose focus, but she really didn't," said trainer Dallas Stewart. "She's trained right on, and we were very happy with her race in the Iowa Oaks. She had to steady at the quarter pole and then got out and up in time. She's been here for about 10 days, and had a good work over the training track [five-eighths in 1:00.60] July 16."

Grand Adventure stretches out an additional panel in search of his third straight graded stakes victory at Woodbine. After coming up a neck short in the 5 1/2-furlong GIII Shakertown S. at Keeneland Apr. 10, the Sam-Son flagbearer landed the GIII Connaught Cup going seven-eighths over this course May 30, and fended off Rahy's Attorney to add the GII King Edward S. at a mile June 27. "We've always had a lot of faith in this horse," co-owner Rick Balaz said after the King Edward. "He just seems to be getting better every start now. We're hoping that's going to continue. He looked great and finished up so nicely [in the King Edward]." **Spice Route** hasn't been over this short a trip since December 2008, when he got up to win the GIII Tropical Turf H. at Calder. In his first appearance this season, the six-year-old captured the GIII Singspiel S. over 12 furlongs on this course July 4.

As expected, **Rachel Alexandra** towers over her six rivals in this heat. If anything--and that's a big "if"--can cause the overwhelming chalk to falter, it's an ex-

tremely hot pace. Every runner in the field has been on or within one length of the lead early in one of their last two starts, so Calvin Borel will most likely need to rate behind horses. This shouldn't be a problem for the recent GII Fleur de Lis H. winner--in the GI Mother Goose S. last term, she tracked dueling foes in the three-horse field before

leaving them 19 1/4 lengths back in her wake at the line. The champ also likes the track. She took the 2009 GI Haskell Invitational S. here by six lengths over champion Summer Bird (Birdstone), earning her top Beyer Speed Figure of 116. **Queen Martha**, who was second in an Oceanport turf allowance in her May 30 stateside debut for Patrick Biancone, appears the most likely to run second. The lightly raced four-year-old has some upside, but must transfer it to the main track. The Lady's Secret will be streamed live on www.ntra.com.

Allybar was a solid performer for trainer Carlos Laffon-Parias last year, but outstripped all previous form when narrowly beaten into third in the G1 Dubai World Cup at Meydan Mar. 27. He is on a retrieval mission here, coming back off an unplaced effort in the G1 Prince of Wales's S. at Royal Ascot June 16. **Balius** is another former Laffon-Parias trainee now racing for Godolphin. He makes his seasonal debut, returning from a fifth in the Nov. 8 G1 Premio Roma at the Capannelle. **Debussy**, winner of last term's G2 Prix Eugene Adam at Maisons-Laffitte, regained winning ways in the G3 Huxley S. at Chester May 6, and was a last-out seventh, ahead of Allybar, in the Prince of Wales's. **Monitor Closely** bagged last year's G2 Great Voltigeur S. when in the care of Peter Chapple-Hyam, and made his final start for the St Gatien stable when third in the Sept. 12 G1 St Leger at Doncaster. He is making his seasonal debut for new trainer Michael Bell.

Fast Start for Single-Horse Syndicate...

Start a syndicate, buy a single horse for a modest sum, win impressively on debut at Belmont Park, and jump directly into graded stakes competition at North America's most prestigious race meet. This game's a snap, isn't it?



Not exactly, but that's just how things have worked out so far for Bluegrass Legacy Equine, an upstart

racing syndicate that purchased its first and only horse, **Commonwealth Rush** (Afleet Alex), this spring. A debut winner June 18, Commonwealth Rush makes his stakes unveiling in tomorrow's Gil Sanford S. at Saratoga. The colt is trained by Tim Ice, who saddled Summer Bird (Birdstone) to victory in the 2009 GI Belmont S.

"Being such a minuscule operation, it's exciting, and it's a helluva way for us to get started," said Dan Kanabroski, co-owner and the manager partner of Bluegrass Legacy.

From the second crop of his Classic-winning sire, Commonwealth Rush was knocked down to Bluegrass Legacy for \$90,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Calder Juveniles in Training Sale. BC3 Thoroughbreds, which had acquired the colt for \$25,000 as an FTKOCT yearling, consigned him to the Calder Sale, where he worked an eighth in :10 2/5 ([video](#)). "Tim picked this horse out," Kanabroski said.

The word was out on Commonwealth Rush when he made his bow as the 8-5 choice in a five-furlong maiden at Belmont, and he lived up to those odds with a gritty effort. He dueled through fast :21 2/5 and :45 splits while pinned to the inside, lost the lead in upper stretch, then battled back to win by a half-length ([video](#)). Brother in Arms (Yes It's True) came flying for second, with the pressing Sunday Splitsville (Grand Slam) tiring to third.

The partners in Bluegrass Legacy were impressed enough by the effort to give the Sanford at shot.

“How many two-year-olds can get trapped down inside and get bounced around like he did--the Pletcher horse [Sunday Splitsville] bounced off of him four times--then lose the lead, and have the guts and heart to fight back and win?” asked Kanabroski. “I’m more impressed that he had the heart to do that than I would be if he won by 11 lengths and wasn’t pressed. He’s got the fight in him. There

were more impressive maiden times at Belmont this year and more impressive performances visually, but we know we’re going into the Sanford with a fighter.”

While he was born and raised in Kentucky, Kanabroski didn’t really learn to love the sport of horse racing until he attended the University of Kentucky in Lexington. Now 36, Kanabroski, who has worked in the technology and IT fields, currently calls Louisville home.

“As you know, it’s part of the culture down there,” Kanabroski said. “Certainly in Lexington, and in Louisville, as well. I was introduced to the industry as a college student, and once it gets in your blood, it’s tough to get out.”

Bluegrass Legacy was conceived in 2008, but it wasn’t until this spring that the operation went in for its first horse. Kanabroski says the idea was to start small and build from the successes. But though he hopes to grow to some degree, he doesn’t foresee the day when Bluegrass Legacy rivals a West Point Thoroughbreds or Dogwood Stable in size.

“I don’t think we’ll ever get that big, but that’s tough to say once you get into it,” he said. “It’s obviously very small at this point, but we’re planning on looking at more yearlings later on this season. I’d love to see us pick up six yearlings this year, on the high end, and expand the portfolio.”

Kanabroski says he knows how fortunate Bluegrass Legacy is to be competing in graded stakes so shortly after its launch.

“We feel very blessed to start with such a promising colt,” Kanabroski said. “I give all the credit in the world to Tim Ice and his staff. Like Tim said the other day, we think we’ve got a colt that has some talent. But he’s going to have to show it Sunday. If he takes that next step forward, we’ll certainly be excited about what his future is, and let him take us down that road.”

Kanabroski was standing in front of the colt’s stall at Saratoga Thursday when he talked to the *TDN* via cell phone, and said he thought the colt had improved physically since his debut.

“He’s progressed day by day,” said Kanabroski. “He looks to me like he’s put on some weight and put on some more muscle. He really has the look of a Classic horse. He’s got a great hind end, he carries his weight very evenly. He relaxes so well. He’s such a calm horse; he’ll eat up his food, then lie down and take a nap. He doesn’t get riled up by things that shouldn’t bother him. He’s got a great, gentle demeanor. But when you put him out there in the afternoons, the racehorse in him comes out.” -L Marquardt

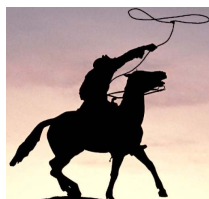

She has since added scores in Pimlico's The Very One S. May 14 and the Candy Eclair S. at Monmouth Park June 13. She would become the first American-trained runner to race at Goodwood and would mark Todd Pletcher's first-ever British entrant.

Afleet Express Works for Jim Dandy...

Gainesway Stable's **Afleet Express** (Afleet Alex) breezed seven panels in 1:25.62 yesterday at Saratoga in preparation for the GII Jim Dandy S. July 31. Exercise rider Kelvin Pahal was aboard for the move ([video](#)). "I didn't pick him up right at the beginning from where I was standing, but when I did, I thought he was going at the right pace, and finished up well," said trainer Jimmy Jerkens. "I thought it was perfect." An impressive allowance winner at Belmont May 22 ([video](#)), the sophomore captured the GIII Pegasus S. at Monmouth June 19 ([video](#)) in his most recent appearance. Robsham homebred **Discreetly Mine** (Mineshaft), coming off a win in the GIII Jersey Shore S. at Monmouth July 4, will continue his one-turn ways in the GII Amsterdam S. at Saratoga Aug. 2. Winner of the GII Risen Star S. in February, the half-brother to GI Cigar Mile hero Discreet Cat (Forestry) was fourth in the GII Louisiana Derby Mar. 26, then was 13th in the GI Kentucky Derby May 1. "I was encouraged by his workouts at Palm Meadows over the winter and I really thought distance wouldn't be an issue, but his family does seem to be more on the miler side," trainer Todd Pletcher noted. A good performance in the Amsterdam will likely punch Discreetly Mine's ticket to the GI King's Bishop S. at Saratoga Aug. 28. "That'd be the logical progression," said Pletcher. "The King's Bishop would be a big mark on his resume." Dogwood Stable's **Aikenite** (Yes It's True), winner of hot Belmont allowance heat June 19, is set to make his next start in the GII Jim Dandy S. next Saturday. "How he does in the Jim Dandy could clarify where we might go next, either the [GI] Travers or the King's Bishop," said Pletcher. MI DEVELOPMENTS AND OAK TREE SIGN AGREEMENT

Oak Tree Executive Vice President Sherwood Chillingworth advised the California Horse Racing Board late Friday that Oak Tree had signed an agreement with MI Developments to hold its 2010 meeting at Santa Anita. "We have a lease," Chillingworth told CHRB. The CHRB voted Thursday that they would extend a waiver allowing MI Developments to operate the meets at Santa Anita and Golden Gate, and its XpressBet Advance Deposit Wagering entity, through Dec. 26, 2010, if such an agreement was reached. California law prohibits an individual company from holding a financial stake in more than one racing entity in the state without such a waiver. The CHRB has mandated that MI Developments present a comprehensive outline for the future by Sept. 1. Santa Anita President George Haines announced Thursday, "We start Monday morning [July 26] with track renovations," but details of MID's plan have not yet been divulged. "It's beyond frustrating at this stage," CHRB Chairman Keith Brackpool said, adding, "This has to be resolved. I don't know if I can make myself any clearer."

AQUEDUCT CASINO HEARING SET A hearing will take place next Thursday, July 29, to determine whether Aqueduct Entertainment Group was legally disqualified from its bid to operate the casino at New York's Aqueduct Racetrack, *Daily Racing Form* reports. Judge Barry Kramer listened to arguments Friday morning from attorneys representing AEG as well as the state attorney general, who was present on behalf of the New York Lottery, which earlier this year that certain members of AEG were not eligible for gambling licenses. The Lottery was charged with overseeing the bidding process, and two weeks ago excluded two of the three entities in the running for the casino, stating that they had failed to properly apply. The Malaysian company called Genting New York currently remains the lone qualifying organization. AEG filed their lawsuit two weeks ago, and soon after, Judge Kramer issued a temporary restraining order, forbidding the Lottery from issuing its final recommendation, but allowed for further evaluation of Genting's bid. According to *DRF*, members of the Saratoga Chamber of Commerce and eight New York breeding operations were present at the hearing. Together, they filed a "friend of the court" brief to say that attempts by AEG to further delay the process could cause irreparable damage to the state's racing industry and to the economy of Saratoga.

Wet weather plagued the opening-day card at Saratoga, but the numbers for the first program of the extended 40-day meet were still healthy. The Saratoga meeting kicked off on the last Wednesday of July last year, with on-track handle at \$3,651,222 and attendance at 25,444. Yesterday's totals showed some declines; on-track wagering was \$3,130,756, down 14.3 percent, while 23,178 came through the gates, a decrease of 8.9 percent. Total handle dipped just 6.1 percent, from \$14,216,134 on opening day in 2009 to \$13,349,050 this year. "Despite the deluge on-track, our all-sources handle confirms the popularity of Saratoga racing with our customers nationwide," said NYRA President and CEO Charles Hayward. "Our business today far surpassed last year's [on the corresponding Friday] at Belmont Park, and we're confident of an excellent Saratoga meet as soon as the weather cooperates."

CHRB Grants Valenzuela Conditional License:

Edited press release

The California Horse Racing Board voted in closed session Thursday to allow jockey Pat Valenzuela to resume riding in California under the terms of a continual stipulated agreement that, among other things, will require him to submit to hair follicle testing, which will be conducted under the auspices of the CHRB. The stipulated agreement will be in full force for as long as Valenzuela is licensed to ride in California. The agreement is unprecedented due to its continual nature and strict conditions. "We understand that Valenzuela has been given many chances here in California, and for that reason we have taken great care in reviewing this request for licensure, even to the point of contacting authorities in Louisiana, where he has been riding for the last two years, to learn about his status there," explained CHRB Chairman Keith Brackpool. "Roy Wood, the former executive director of the California Horse Racing Board and now the state steward in Louisiana, said Valenzuela has passed all drug and alcohol tests during that time. Wood attested to Valenzuela's good citizenship in Louisiana and said Valenzuela has greatly matured over the last few years. Wood's evaluation was one of our considerations. The Board decided all of this evidence and more before voting to give Valenzuela yet another chance to prove he is capable of good behavior and complying with all laws, rules, and licensing conditions here in California. We believe the conditions of the stipulated agreement will insure the protection of the public, other jockeys, the horses, and Valenzuela himself." Among the conditions of the stipulated agreement:

- Valenzuela must completely abstain from the possession, injection or consumption of all psychotropic (mood-altering) drugs, including alcohol, and be subject to random biological fluid and drug screening testing, including hair follicle testing, for the detection of alcohol, narcotics, hypnotics, dangerous drugs, or other controlled substances.
- Valenzuela must obey all federal, state, and local laws, and he must provide a full and detailed account of any and all violations of law to the Board in writing within 72 hours of occurrence.
- Before Valenzuela may apply for license, he must enter into a contract with the Winners Foundation, and must abide by the program offered by the Winners Foundation, which must require his attendance at three meetings a week of a twelve-step recovery program dealing with the treatment of alcoholism.
- If Valenzuela fails to participate in random, biological fluid and/or drug screening testing within the time frame specified by the Board or has any confirmed finding of the presence of alcohol, narcotics, hypnotics, dangerous drugs or other controlled substances in his body, the probationary license issued as a result of the stipulated agreement will be immediately suspended.

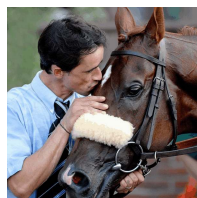
