HARBINGER OF ZOOM

Highclere Thoroughbred Racing's **Harbinger (GB)** (Dansili {GB}) dented some lofty reputations and lowered the track record--by 0.46 seconds--with a blistering display in Saturday's G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth S. at Ascot. Ridden with patience in fourth as **Confront (GB)** (Nayef) set testing fractions, the 4-1 chance swooped for control just inside the final quarter mile and surged ever clear

Saturday's G1 Betfair TVG Coaching Club American Oaks at Saratoga lost a bit of its luster, and its main antagonist in the form of **Connie and Michael** (Roman Ruler), who has been temporarily sidelined (*see related story p13*). That withdrawal made life just a little bit easier on Glencrest Farm's **Devil May Care** (Malibu Moon), but it may not have mattered, as the lanky bay filly spurted away from her rivals when asked by an ever-confident John Velazquez and reported home a four-length winner of the second leg of the Triple Tiara. The stage is now set for a potentially championship-deciding meeting between Devil May Care and pro-tem divisional leader Blind Luck (Pollard's Vision), who is expected to raid the Spa for the G1 Betfair TVG Alabama S. Going Places...

Harbinger looked to be going places when registering a smooth win in last July's G3 Gordon S. at Goodwood, but trailed in last of seven when favorite for the following month's G2 Great Voltigeur S. at York. He completed his sophomore education with a third in October's G3 St Simon S. at Newbury. Revisiting the Berkshire venue for his seasonal comeback, he garnered the Apr. 17 G3 John Porter S., beating subsequent G2 Yorkshire Cup winner Manifest (GB) (Rainbow Quest), before lifting the G3 Ormonde S. at Chester May 7. His return to Group 2 company was marked with an impressive score in the June 19 Hardwicke S. at Royal Ascot, and he saved a career best for this Group 1 debut, exhibiting the optimum mix of speed and stamina with a simply blistering display in track-record time. Ridden with patience by Olivier Peslier, Harbinger was positioned off the pace--set by stablemate Confront (Nayef)--in fourth until making ominous headway on the bridle rounding the home turn. Looming large on the outside at the quarter-mile marker, he eased to the front soon after and surged clear of a stellar cast to carve his niche in turfdom with a victory by daylight. "He was comfortable throughout, and all I needed was to give him just one flick of the whip," said Peslier. "When I saw the big screen I could see the others were so far behind, and I knew the race was won before the furlong marker. I knew he was very good beforehand, but he is a truly wonderful horse and today he is 'the king.' He is not a difficult ride, and he won so well." Trainer Sir Michael Stoute added, "He was a decent three-year-old, and he was impressive when he won the Gordon. He had a blip in the Voltigeur, but he bounced back well in the John Porter. Olivier was cantering today, he just travelled so well, and it was looking good from a long way out. Harbinger's progressed with each race this year, and the [G1 Prix de l'] Arc [de Triomphe at Longchamp Oct. 3] will certainly be considered." Offering an insight into the eclipse of G1 Epsom Derby winner Workforce (King's Best), who was beaten 16 3/4 lengths into fifth, Stoute added, "[Jockey] Ryan [Moore] said Workforce just didn't switch off like he normally does, and the ground was plenty quick enough for him. "It's just such an ambition for everybody," said Highclere's tearful Harry Herbert. "Whether it's the stable team--[trainer] Sir Michael [Stoute] and all of his group--or whether it's us at Highclere and all my team, who work so hard, and the owners, who put so much money into it--it comes down to suddenly being dealt the card that you've dreamt of all your life, and this is it. Right now it's happened and, for everyone out there, get into racehorse ownership because, I promise you, it brings grown men down to their knees with tears."

Holding the Throne...

Fresh on the heels of a historic Royal Ascot meeting, the dream continued for Harry Herbert's Highclere Thoroughbred Racing with **Harbinger (GB)** (Dansili {GB})'s record-breaking tally in the G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth S. Saturday.

"You never know how far a horse is going to improve, obviously, but we knew he was coming into this race in fantastic form from the way he worked last weekend with Olivier Peslier on

board for the first time," Herbert revealed to *TDN*. "I was just talking to [trainer] Sir Michael Stoute, and he was saying, when you have horses like this that are such gems, the improvement catches your eye. What we saw today was a truly awesome performance from a horse who we probably haven't seen the best of yet." **Cont. p3**

Harbinger's 11-length tour-de-force joins a long list of memorable renewals of the King George, including Grundy (Ire) (Great Nephew {GB})'s epic win over Bustino (GB) (Busted {GB}) in 1975, Dancing Brave (Lyphard)'s late heroics in 1986 and Montjeu (Ire) (Sadler's Wells)'s dominating tally in 2000.

"There have been so many great winners of the King George, and I'd say he'd certainly be up there as one of the most visually impressive winners ever," Herbert offered. "Every year is different, and the quality of the field differs. Who knows if [this was the most impressive of] all time, but I'd say there would be few more impressive winners of the King George in its history, and it's a great privilege to be involved with such a performance."

Herbert, who began his career in the Thoroughbred industry in the United States in the early 1980s before forming Highclere in 1992, is still considering a trip to the Breeders' Cup for the son of stakes-winning mare Penang Pearl (Fr) (Bering {GB}).

"We certainly wouldn't rule it out in any way; we'd love to come to the Breeders' Cup," Herbert commented. "I lived and worked in America for four years, and it was a special time. I'd love to go to America [for the Breeders' Cup], but, obviously, we have to let the dust settle and let Sir Michael see how the horse is doing tomorrow and the next few weeks. We will almost certainly plan for the Arc, and take one step at a time. I'd love to think we might go the States with him."

How do you celebrate a course-record breaking performance in one of Britain's most prestigious races?

"We have a wonderful little local pub near us called The Fox Inn Tangle; it's run by friends, and lots of local friends will be there," Herbert said. "Racing people will be there celebrating with us, too--Richard Hannon Sr and Jr, leading jockey Richard Hughes, etc..."

It was an emotional victory for Herbert and his Highclere team.

"I've been in the game long enough to know that you really must enjoy every second of these kind of wins if you're dealt a card this special," he continued. "I really wish my late father was around to see it. We'll raise a glass to him, Harbinger, Sir Michael and my brother-in-law John Warren, who bought the horse." -SS

An unknown commodity this time last year, The Usual Q. T. went on a six-race tear over the Southern California turf courses, breaking his maiden and clearing his first state-bred allowance condition at this venue before defeating older rivals in the Cal Cup Mile H. at Santa Anita Oct. 3. From there, it was on to open company and the winning continued with scores in the GII Oak Tree Derby Nov. 7, the GI Hollywood Derby Nov. 29 and the GIII Sir Beaufort S. Dec. 26. Things came to a crashing halt when connections took a stab at the Sunshine Millions Classic Jan. 30 on the Pro-Ride, but the gelding faltered to ninth as the even-money chalk. Given a chance to prove himself against some of the world's best turfers in the G1 Dubai Duty Free S. at Meydan Mar. 27, he was fourth, beaten five lengths and was given three months to recover. He took advantage of a fairly soft return spot and got back to his winning ways with a half-length success in a mile allowance at Hollywood June 27. Acclamation (Unusual Heat) and Enriched set off at a good gallop, allowing Victor Espinoza to slide up into the garden spot in third. That is where he stayed, neatly covered up, until the head of the stretch, when he was cut loose three wide and put the race to bed in a matter of strides. His final 3/8 of a mile was covered in a sensational :34. "He's learned to relax; it's made all the difference for him," Espinoza commented. "I was just sitting back there behind [Acclamation and Enriched], and they were going in and out. I thought for a second I was going to go down inside, but then I decided I didn't have to. I went wide and he just drew out. I took a pretty good hold of him at the end. He was a winner. I didn't need to do anything more with him." A debut winner at this track last Aug. 29, Devil May Care overcame a stumble at the break to add the GI Frizette S. Oct. 10, but never got hold of the synthetic track in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies and tailed off to finish second last. A dismal and disappointing fifth in the GIII Silverbulletday S. in her seasonal bow Feb. 20, the bay was green when taking the GII Bonnie Miss S. Mar. 20. After weighing the pros and cons of running in the GI Kentucky Oaks versus the GI Kentucky Derby, connections decided they had little to lose by trying the males and, while she made a middle move into the heat of the pace, she weakened to 10th in an effort far from disgraceful. Returned to the site of her Frizette triumph for her latest, Devil May Care raced reasonably close to quick fractions in the GI Mother Goose S. June 26 and was able to seal the deal late, edging away for a 1 1/4-length win over Connie and Michael (Roman Ruler), with Biofuel third in an effort more workmanlike than brilliant. Sent off at odds-on with the early scratch of the Mother Goose runner-up, Devil May Care was kept in the clear as longshot Absinthe Minded (Quiet American) set a comfortable pace from GII Black-Eyed Susan S. winner Acting Happy, who was having her first run since that May 14 test. The heavy chalk, three wide throughout, began to lengthen her stride on the turn and, with a confident John Velazquez glancing underneath his right arm to assess any potential competition, unleashed a finishing kick unlike any she'd previously conjured up to win smartly. "You can see by the way that she won today why we tried the Derby," said Todd Pletcher. "The thing that I think gets lost in the shuffle a little bit is how much there is left in the tank. We tried to do the right thing after the Derby and give her plenty of time to the Mother Goose, and she rewarded us with a big effort and did the same today. I've felt all along that this filly is the best of her generation and, if she continues to run like today, I think she'll prove it." That chance comes in the GI Alabama S. Aug. 21. She appeared to lug in a bit when going for home at the eighth pole, but leveled out and proved easily best. "I'm very pleased with how she went today," said winning trainer Steve Asmussen. "I was happy with how she looked. She was very relaxed. I love where her mind is at right now. She's more mature and she's carrying a little more weight."

RACECOURSE Round-Up

Cape Blanco International Bound?

Cape Blanco (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), winner of the G1 Irish Derby at The Curragh last time June 27, fared best of the Classic generation, but was no match for Harbinger's sizzling final-quarter burst while finishing a clear-cut second in the King George. Trainer Aidan O'Brien indicated the chestnut may now drop in distance for his next start, possibly the Aug. 17 G1 Juddmonte International S. at York. "We were delighted with him," the trainer told *Racing Post*. "He ran a great race and showed great heart, running all the way to the line. People wanted to see the two Derby winners here, and they went together stride by stride. I wouldn't know yet where he would go next, but this horse wouldn't mind being stepped back in trip, so he might go back to York for the International."

Youmzain to Target a Fourth 'Arc' Attempt...

Youmzain (Ire) (Sinndar {Ire}) ran his usual gallant race as he contested a staggering 22nd straight Group 1 event in the King George. Reserved in rear from the bell, he ran on strongly in the straight to register a 15th placing at the highest level. The veteran may now point to the Oct. 3 G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe at Longchamp, a race in which he has finished second for the last three renewals. Connections were understandably happy with the effort, and trainer Mick Channon told *Racing Post*, "Youmzain has run his race again and we're delighted. On that ground, he has run a cracker, and we'll probably go straight to the Arc now. The winner was very impressive; no crystal ball could see that coming." Alain de Royer-Dupre, trainer of fourth-placed **Daryakana (Fr)** (Selkirk) added, "She ran a good race, and there are no excuses."

Connie and Michael Scratched From CCA Oaks...

Connie and Michael (Roman Ruler), the co-second choice at 5-1 on the morning line, was scratched from Saturday's GI Betfair TVG Coaching Club American Oaks due to an abscess in her right front foot. "It started [Friday], and we've been working on it," said trainer Dominick Schettino. "We'll need a couple of days before we can put her back into training. The plan right now is to make the [Aug. 21 GI Betfair TVG] Alabama." The three-year-old filly was runner-up behind CCA Oaks favorite **Devil May Care** (Malibu Moon) in the GI Mother Goose S. last time out.


Vineyard Haven to Target Forego...

Following a successful comeback by Godolphin's **Vineyard Haven** (Lido Palace {Chi}) in Friday's James Marvin S. at Saratoga, trainer Rick Mettee stated that a run in the GI Woodward S. would be a "bold" option. However, given some time to let the dust settle, connections yesterday announced that the four-year-old would be pointed instead for the GI Forego H. "He had a lot of long works but he wasn't working really as sharp as he was last year," Mettee told *Daily Racing Form*. "He had a pretty good foundation, but 45.03 for the half-mile, they can back up off that. [Jockey] Alan [Garcia] said he was never concerned."

It might be a first...one consignor, two **"TDN Rising Stars"** in the space of 10 days. But that's just what John and Martha Jane Mulholland's Mulholland

Springs can boast after their homebred Wine Police romped to an easy win in his career opener at Saratoga Saturday. It was the second Mulholland Springs graduate to be so honored this month. On July 15, Klaravich Stables's Sovereign Default (Northern Afleet), who sold for \$77,000 as a KEENOV weanling in 2008, was tabbed a "Rising Star" off an impressive debut victory at Belmont Park.

"We're excited that our foals are going on and running, which is what you hope for," Martha Jane Mulholland said.

"This has made the month for all of us. We've had three of our babies start this year--that's unusual, just to get two-year-olds to start--and they all won first out. We're having a very good year."

In addition to the two colts, the filly Unbridled Praise (Songandaprayer) galloped home a 3 1/2-length winner in her first start at Churchill Downs June 27, and came back to be second in the Prairie Gold Lassie S. July 17. Also bred by the Mulhollands, she was a \$60,000 KEENOV weanling in 2008.

The Mulhollands have kept in touch with Wine Police's owners, J. Kirk and Judy Robison, so they were tuned in when the colt went to the gate.

"We've spoken with them and they always were talking very highly of him," Mulholland remarked. "He was laying down some fabulous works, and we were very excited. Everyone was here--all the people on the farm, our family--everybody was watching the race today. It was wonderful!"

The Mulhollands purchased Wine Police's dam, Deputy Cures Blues (War Deputy), for \$130,000 at Keeneland November in 2005.

"She's a big, beautiful, balanced mare, and she comes from a very active stakes-winning black-type family--just the kind of mare we try to find every year," the horsewoman offered. "We sold her again this year--we like to get a foal or two out the mare, and then take some good mares over to sell at Keeneland."

"We have a small family farm, and we're just trying to keep our name out there," Mulholland noted.

In foal to Malibu Moon, she went back through the ring at Keeneland January and was hammered down to Marshall Silverman for \$125,000.

"He bought the mare for a client, and he is obviously very thrilled," she added.

Wine Police went through the ring last fall, bringing \$190,000 as a KESEEP yearling.

"He was very well mannered and a typical Speightstown-looking colt," Mulholland recalled. "He had a whole lot of body--very correct, easy to be around. It looked like he was going to be quick and early, which is what he obviously is.

"He was very well-received," she continued. "We had a lot of activity, with people vetting him and scoping him, and people coming back and re-checking him, so we knew he would sell well. It's hard to know what they're going to bring any more, but we were very pleased with what he sold for."

The Mulhollands keep about 20 mares of their own on the farm, and also have about 15 for clients.

"We try and sell nice horses; we don't try and keep our best horses," Martha Jane Mulholland said. "We want to bring good horses to the sales and run as boutique and high-ended operation as we possibly can. We want people to have confidence in buying these mares we take over there."

The Lexington-based operation aims to sell all of the foals it produces, but if the deal doesn't get done, they will keep a few to race themselves.

"The reason we are running this farm is because we love rac-

ing, and everything we get from the mares and the babies we just put right back into paying training bills and racing ourselves," she emphasized. "This is what we live for."

The Mulhollands currently have a trio of juveniles they will send to the track. Jonathan Sheppard has a colt by Tale of the Cat named High Plains; the two fillies, Sarah Melissa (A.P. Warrior) and Fu Cat (Fusaichi Pegasus), will be sent from the farm in the next couple of weeks, but it has not yet been decided who will train them.

It remains to be seen if the three will make headlines of their own, but the Mulhollands have high hopes for Wine Police.

"I'd like to know the story of how he got named--I haven't asked [the Robisons]," Martha Jane Mulholland said. "It's an unusual name, but hopefully everyone's going to come to know it soon."
