MCLAUGHLIN'S HASKELL HOPEFULS WORK

Trappe Shot (Tapit) and Uptowncharlybrown

(Limehouse) tuned up for Sunday's GI Haskell Invitational S. with workouts for trainer Kieran McLaughlin yesterday. Trappe Shot, winner of the July 10 Long Branch S. at Monmouth, went four furlongs in :48 over Saratoga's main track. Stablemate Uptowncharlybrown went five furlongs at Belmont Park in :59 4/5. The colt, winner of the Pasco S. earlier in the year, will be making his first

start since a fifth-place finish (disqualified to 12th) in the June 5 GI Belmont S. "We're not sure when they will be shipping down," McLaughlin said. "We're going to keep an eye on the temperature, but it will most likely be Saturday."

Lucky Fires Bullet

Juvenile champion Lookin At Lucky (Smart Strike) turned in a bullet five-furlong drill at Del Mar in advance of Sunday's Haskell. The bay colt, off since winning the May 15 GI Preakness S., covered the distance in :58.60--fastest of 47 at the distance yesterday. The work was a little faster than trainer Bob Baffert was expecting. "I slowed him up in the stretch," Baffert told *Daily Racing Form*. "He was going too fast. He was going to go in :57. I didn't want him to go too fast." Lookin at Lucky galloped out six furlongs in 1:11.60, and is expected to ship to New Jersey Thursday.

QUALITY ROAD IMPRESSES IN SPA WORK

Quality Road (Elusive Quality) tuned up for the Aug. 7 GI Whitney H. with a bullet five-furlong work in company with stabelmate GSW Exhi (Maria's Mon) in :58.97 at Saratoga yesterday. "I thought it was spectacular," trainer Todd Pletcher said of the drill. "The horse is in unbelievable form right now. It's amazing to see how effortlessly he can do things like he did this morning."

3 GIII Hal's Hope, Feb. 6 GI Donn H. and May 31 GI Metropolitan H. "So far, he has maintained the same level," Pletcher said. "Trying to keep a horse at top level over a long period is hard to do, but with the way we've spaced his races, we've been able to do so."

JIM DANDY RUNNERS TUNE UP

GII Dwyer S. winner Fly Down (Mineshaft) turned in a bullet half-mile move Monday morning at Saratoga in preparation for Saturday's GII Jim Dandy S. The Nick Zito trainee covered the distance in :47.30 (video), fastest of 73 at the distance over the Oklahoma training track. "It was exactly what I wanted," Zito reported afterwards. "He's coming off a 1 1/2-mile race, and you have to do things like that. Obviously, we know his fitness level. We're hoping he's a little sharp for the race. He's a very good horse and he looks good." Fly Down is coming off a runner-up effort in the June 5 GI Belmont S. Also working for the Jim Dandy, A Little Warm (Stormin Fever) went five furlongs in 1:00.05. "I don't think I could be any happier with him," trainer Tony Dutrow said of the GII Louisiana Derby runner-up. Aikenite (Yes It's True) worked a half-mile in :48.66, and unbeaten Friend or Foe (Friends Lake) went the same distance in :47.33--both over the main track at Saratoga. "It looked like he was just galloping, which freaks me out a little," trainer John Kimmel said of Friend or Foe, who is three-for-three and coming off a win versus state-bred foes in the June 20 Mike Lee S. "His fitness level is good; he's just lacking two-turn experience. I'm excited about running him, but we are asking him to do something he hasn't done before against quality horses."

RACETRACK Round-Up

MAYBE FINE AFTER SANFORD WIN

Maybesomaybenot (Sunday Break {Jpn}) exited Sunday's GII Sanford S. victory in fine shape, but his next start remains up in the air. "Anything is possible," trainer Mike Maker said yesterday. The juvenile is the only horse of racing age for owners Arthellor and Carolyn Scisney and their daughter-in-law Karen.

FOREVER TOGETHER FIRES BULLET

Champion **Forever Together** (Belong to Me), who will be seeking her third straight win in the GI Diana H. Saturday at Saratoga, worked a bullet five furlongs in :59.60 ([video](#)) around the dogs on the Oklahoma Turf Course Monday morning. "I'll say it was a successful operation," said trainer Jonathan Sheppard. Forever Together is winless in five starts since taking last year's Diana, and comes into this renewal off runner-up efforts in the Apr. 10 GIII Jenny Wiley S. and May 29 GI Gamely S. Also working five furlongs over the Oklahoma turf course yesterday in preparation for the Diana: June 5 GI Just a Game S. winner **Proviso (GB)** (Dansili {GB}) covered the distance in 1:03.40; and **My Princess Jess** (Stormy Atlantic), third in the Just a Game, who went in 1:03.00. Just a Game runner-up **Phola** (Johannesburg) worked four furlongs in :48.35.

MAKFI SET FOR MAROIS TEST

Mathieu Offenstadt's **Makfi (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}), who lost his unbeaten record in the June 15 G1 St James's Palace S., will point to the Aug. 15 G1 Prix Jacques Le Marois at Deauville for his next start. The G1 2000 Guineas winner was found to be suffering from a throat condition after his seventh at the Royal meet, but is well on the road to a full recovery, according to trainer Mikel Delzangles. "Makfi came out of the St James's Palace with a bad throat infection," Delzangles told *Racing Post*. "He has completely recovered from that and is now back in serious work. If he continues to progress, he will run in the Jacques Le Marois, or we may wait until the [G1 Prix du] Moulin [Sept. 5]."

HARBINGER RATED WORLD'S BEST

Following his devastating record-breaking performance in last Saturday's G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth S. at Ascot, **Harbinger (GB)** (Dansili {GB}) has jumped from a rating of 123 to one of 135 to become the world's highest-rated Thoroughbred, according to the British Horseracing Authority's senior handicapper Phil Smith. "You've got to be very impressed [with Harbinger's King George performance], and he looked an improving colt before the race," commented Smith. "All his performances this year have been progressive, and I expected him to a run a big race, but I didn't think he'd win and I certainly didn't think he'd win like that. We looked at the second horse [G1 Irish Derby winner Cape Blanco (Ire) (Galileo {Ire})] and imagined what if Harbinger had not been in the race. Cape Blanco was [rated] 119 going into the King George, and so we took the view that he had replicated that [rating]. We therefore had to decide what we called the 11 lengths. We took the view it was worth 16 pounds, which would be pretty much the norm, and that brings Harbinger out on 135. It is quite a big jump--we had him on 123 before that--but I'm pretty confident he's that [rating], and could probably be better. It was very impressive. Harbinger is the best horse in the world today, but he's not the best horse ever and he has a lot to prove. We would want him to do it again before we can get him into the late 130s or early 140s, and he's got to do something similar in the future. We've got plenty to look forward to before the end of the year. It was a 'wow' race." Highclere Thoroughbred Racing's four-year-old will point to the Oct. 3 G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe at Longchamp, a race which has thus far eluded trainer Sir Michael Stoute, but connections have yet to pick a prep race for the strapping bay. "We will sit down with Michael and work out whether he goes straight to the Arc or takes in a prep race along the way," Highclere's Harry Herbert told *Racing Post*. "The King George and Arc are the two best middle-distance races in the world, and it's a great path to be on. For all the owners, the thought of having the favorite for the Arc, having won the King George by 11 lengths, is absolutely fantastic."

This open renewal marks the return to European action for last year's hero **Finjaan**, who followed up his career best here with an eighth, on unsuitable ground, in the G1 Sprint Cup at Haydock last September. He was eighth again in his only other subsequent start, when tackling the G3 Al Quoz Sprint at Meydan, and will need to be on his mettle to successfully defend his title. "Finjaan is on course and is in good form at the moment," said trainer Marcus Tregoning. "It's the race that we have had in mind for him for some time and, hopefully, he will be in as good form as last year. It was a long journey out to Dubai and, while he came out the race fine, I didn't want to run him very quickly afterwards, and it seemed obvious to bring him back for this. He escapes a penalty and he won the race after a break last year, so we don't have too many concerns. I am likely to consider stepping him up to a mile at some point, but we will see how he gets on here before making any further decisions." **Lord Shanakill** has been transferred to the care of Henry Cecil since lifting last term's G1 Prix Jean Prat at Chantilly, and carries on back up the ladder coming off a confidence-boosting score in the Listed City Plate at Chester July 10. **Cont. p4**

Air Chief Marshal, in the money in last season's G1 Phoenix S. and G1 National S., has found a new lease on life since demolishing a July 12 Dundalk conditions event by 15 lengths. He can make a mark for the sophomores attempting to follow up on a victory in the G3 Minstrel S. at The Curragh five days later.

Balthazar's Gift finished second in the latest renewal of this, but faces a much stiffer task in his attempt to go one better this time around. **Dalghar**, France's sole entry, was a creditable fifth in the June 15 G1 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot, and holds solid place credentials.

Of those with pattern-race form, **Arctic Cosmos**, who was a last-out runner-up in the June 18 G2 King Edward VII S. at Royal Ascot, and **Corsica**, winner of the July 8 G3 Bahrain Trophy at Newmarket, both hold solid claims to feature here.

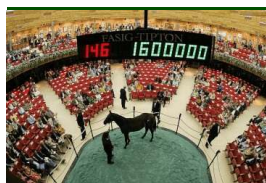

A TASTE FOR INTERNATIONAL FLAVOR

Nearing the conclusion of the second and final session of last year's Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Selected Yearlings sale, a handsome colt by Encosta de Lago (Aus) out of Nicole and Krista (Ire) (Machiavellian)--later named Lagoon of Diamonds--was led out of the ring

with his connections a half-million dollars richer than when the colt had entered it. And who should be holding the pen that signed for the bay with the heavily international page? It wasn't John Ferguson representing Shiekh Mohammed, British conditioner John Gosden or Coolmore's M. V. Magnier. Instead, it was none other than California-based trainer

Bob Baffert. It was that moment, and that horse, that would prove to be the inspiration to an international recruitment program that would give American buyers access to some of the world's most sought after and prolific pedigrees.

"It certainly caused quite a stir," Terence Collier, Fasig-Tipton's director of marketing, said in regard to the sale of the Encosta de Lago colt. "The regular buyers, who generally buy at that level at Saratoga, were all in on the horse. Several of them came back to us and told us they enjoyed seeing a bit of diversity in the pedigree, and it was something they thought we should try and bring them. Quite simply, it was an expression by North American buyers that they would like to see some diversity of sire power in the catalog. You have a group of people who go to Saratoga on a regular basis and will lay out the sort of money to buy these international pedigrees."

Additionally, Collier pointed out that another factor played a role in Fasig-Tipton's decision to branch out beyond the domestic market for future sale's stock.

"The way racing is going in North America, with all those synthetic tracks, and with synthetic horses being equally suitable to the turf, we thought perhaps this is a new dimension we should explore," he explained.

Heading the reconnaissance and recruitment mission, Collier and Fasig-Tipton's Vice President of Sales Bayne Welker headed to England and Ireland last fall to find yearlings by Europe's top sires Oasis Dream (GB), Pivotal (GB), Dubawi (Ire) and Cape Cross (Ire), stallions that offer appeal in the U.S.

"Our objective was to get stallions that were successful over in Europe, but have had some exposure in America through some of the exploits of their runners domestically," explained Collier. "We got one of each of them. Unfortunately, the Pivotal yearling was injured and had to be withdrawn. We ended up getting five of the horses we were looking for, which ultimately dropped to four, but picked up a few more with top international pedigrees along the way. That part of the exercise was a huge success."

According to Collier, successfully recruiting yearlings with an international background represented only half of Fasig-Tipton's Saratoga initiative. The other half was to try and change the perception that American pedigrees are predominantly dirt oriented and, as such, might have little appeal to the international buyer.

"I felt buyers weren't really looking at the right criteria to say that [North American stallions] were all basically dirt sires," said Collier. "The other point is that some buyers feel that the sires over there are so dominant, which they are. However, it's more by virtue of the fact that so few American yearlings these days are going over to race in Europe, so our sires have little chance of making a mark. European sires are dominant and have done well, but they have so little competition from North American stallions, in terms of individuals as well as numbers."

While the first major yearling sale of the season--Fasig-Tipton's July sale--is already in the books, Collier explained that the company's marquee event provides a whole new market place.

"Saratoga presents a different group of buyers," Collier offered. "Right now, Saratoga appears to be the sale that this concept would work at. We haven't gotten to the stage where this type of pedigree is going to be sought out at a two-year-old in training sale, for instance. It's not that it wouldn't work there, it's just a different group of people. We offer 200 yearlings of the highest level of pedigree and conformation that you can find, and these five yearlings, specifically, fit all of those criteria. We have about a dozen buyers at Saratoga like the Farishes, G. Watts Humphrey, John Fort, Satish Sanan, Charlotte Weber and B. Wayne Hughes, all of these people that regularly go to Saratoga and know these [international] names, know these types of pedigrees, but don't get exposed to them, because they fail to find them at a yearling sale in the States. It's not designed to bring European buyers here to buy them, because that's coal to Newcastle; they can find these horses in their own sales in Europe. It's designed to accommodate and allow American buyers to be exposed to these top European sires."

The only French-bred in the catalog, this Feb. 4 foal is by Horse of the Year Street Cry (Machiavellian), who is responsible for a pair of champions--GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile and GI Kentucky Derby hero Street Sense and Zenyatta, who became the first female conqueror of the GI Breeders' Cup Classic in 2009. On the bottom side, the bay is out of graded stakes winner group placed Attima (GB) (Zafonic), a three-quarters sister to Group 3 placed San Domenico (GB) (Zamindar). This yearling also is from the extended family of group winner Tenuous (GB) (Generous {Ire}).

Hip 35, colt, **Giant's Causeway**--Crazy Volume (Ire), by Machiavellian

European champion Giant's Causeway (Storm Cat) is well known for his turf runners and he sired this year's early Derby favorite Eskendereya, but he also boasts solid impressive numbers with his offspring on the synthetics. This Irish-bred youngster, who is a Mar. 2 foal, hails from the family of Irish champion Easy to Copy (Affirmed), a full-sister to Group 1 heroine Trusted Partner.

Hip 43, filly, **Oasis Dream (GB)**--Devout (Aus), by Dehere

Property of Siena Farm LLC, Taylor Made Sales Agency, Agent

This very highly regarded Kentucky-bred packs a lot of international appeal as a daughter of the young, hot Juddmonte sire Oasis Dream (Green Desert) and out of the Australian-bred stakes-placed mare Devout. While her dam hails from the land of Oz, the Feb. 10 foal is deep in European black-type. Under the second dam--Park Heiress (Ire) (Sadler's Wells)--is another offspring by Oasis Dream in Young Pretender (Fr), while the third dam, Irish champion and Group 1 winner Park Express (Ire) (Ahoonora {GB})--has produced multiple champion New Approach (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}); Group 1 winner and divisional highweight Dazzling Park (Ire) (Warning {GB}); and top Japanese performer Shinko Forest (Ire) (Green Desert).

Hip 56, filly, **Dubawi (Ire)**--Fawaayid, by *Vaguely Noble
Consigned by Paramount Sales, Agent VI

This Jan. 30 filly rounds out Paramount's European-bred triumvirate. By G1 Irish 2000 Guineas winner Dubawi (Dubai Millenium {GB}), the Irish-bred filly is out of the stakes-winning mare Fawaayid, who has already produced SW and MGSP Green Lady (Ire) (Green Desert); SP Entisar (GB) (Nashwan); and Thats Your Opinion (GB) (Last Tycoon {Ire}), dam of MGSW and English highweight sprinter Balthazaar's Gift (Ire) (Xaar {GB}).

Hip 195, colt, **Cape Cross (Ire)**--Two of Clubs (GB), by First Trump (GB)

Property of Highfield Farm, Lantern Farm LLC, agent

This Irish-bred colt is by Cape Cross (Green Desert), who is a resident at Darley's Kildangan Stud in Ireland. Having produced 2004 and 2006 European Horse of the Year Ouija Board (GB) and her 2009 counterpart Sea the Stars (Ire), the 16-year-old stallion has been represented so far in 2010 by Group 1 winners Able One (NZ) (Champions Mile) and Behkabad (Fr) (Juddmonte Grand Prix de Paris).

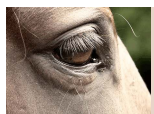

In America, Dansili is probably best known as a son of that extraordinary mare Hasili and as a brother to the Breeders' Cup winners Banks Hill and Intercontinental (as well as to the Grade I winners Cacique and Champs Elysees). But in Europe, he has made a name for himself, to such an extent that he has become firmly established as one of Britain's highest-priced stallions. And now Dansili has achieved international stardom as the sire of Harbinger, the incredibly easy King George winner who is being hailed as the best horse in the world.

It had already been a remarkable year for Dansili, whose total of eight individual group/graded winners has been bettered only by his Banstead Manor Stud companion Oasis Dream. In addition to his Group 1 winners Harbinger and Proviso, Dansili has enjoyed 2010 group success with Aviate, Famous Name, Ice Blue, Illustrious Blue, Strawberrydaiquiri and Zoffany. His total of group/graded winners now stands at 26, with no fewer than 25 of them coming from Dansili's first six crops, all sired at fees of £12,500 or less (he started out at £8,000).

The 2006 Group 1 triumphs by Rail Link in the Arc, by Passage of Time in the Criterium de Saint-Cloud and by Price Tag in the Matriarch S. could be said to have acted as harbingers of even greater success for Dansili. Consequently, his fee was raised to £30,000 in 2007, and this crop has already produced its first group winner in Zoffany, who was scoring for the fourth time in five starts when he took the G3 Tyros S. last week.

Since then, Dansili has added to his reputation with the likes of Zambezi Sun (G1 Grand Prix de Paris), Delegator (second to Sea The Stars in the 2000 Guineas) and Famous Name (a multiple group winner who was a close second from a poor draw in the 2008 Prix du Jockey-Club).

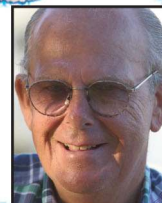

This consistent success has earned him some stellar books of mares over the last three seasons. His current yearling crop shows that Dansili is now receiving pow-

erful support not just from Juddmonte (the breeder of five of his six Group 1 winners), but also from a wide range of other breeders.

His yearlings are out of such accomplished mares as Islington, Light Shift, Maryinsky, Montare, Pride and Virginia Waters--Virginia Waters being just one of five winners of the English or French 1000 Guineas with a Dansili yearling.

The fact that Dansili's 42 stakes winners have 34 different broodmare sires underlines his versatility. However, he has enjoyed particularly encouraging results with mares from several branches of the Native Dancer male line, which is interesting because his sire, Danehill, was inbred 3x3 to Native Dancer's famous daughter Natalma.

The Atan/Sharpen Up branch has supplied five stakes winners, headed by the Group 2 winner Strategic Price and the Group 3 winner Silver Touch. Mares from the Raise a Native branch have also worked well, largely from the Mr. Prospector sector. Mr. Prospector's granddaughters have produced the group winners Proviso, Zacinto and Zoffany and a great-granddaughter, by Zafonic, produced Zambezi Sun. The Exclusive Native branch also produced a Group 1 winner, with Price Tag being out of an Affirmed mare. Harbinger's dam Penang Pearl is by Bering, whose male line traces to Native Dancer via Arctic Tern, Sea-Bird II and Dan Cupid. This means that four of Dansili's Group 1 winners are out of Native Dancer-line mares. It is worth adding that Dansili's first eight foals out of Bering mares also include Handsome Maestro, a group-placed colt with a Timeform rating of 115.

Dansili's success with this line mirrors that enjoyed by Danehill. The former Coolmore champion sired numerous Group 1 winners from the Mr. Prospector branch, including Duke of Marmalade, Landseer and Flying Spur. Other branches of the Raise a Native line supplied Danehill with George Washington and Dress To Thrill, while the Atan/Sharpen Up branch gave him Danehill Dancer and Dylan Thomas.

Mention of Duke of Marmalade and Dylan Thomas reminds me that Harbinger follows them as the third member of the Danehill-male line to win the King George in the last four years. The race has almost become the preserve of the Northern Dancer male line, and Harbinger has four lines to this great stallion (4x6x5x4), plus extra lines to Northern Dancer's dam Natalma and second dam Almahmoud, through

Danehill and Arctic Tern.

As a winner at up to 13.4 furlongs, Harbinger clearly stays much better than Dansili, who only once ventured beyond a mile. The fact that Harbinger's first two dams are daughters of mile-and-a-half Derby winners has clearly helped him, but there is no shortage of speed in his female line.

His sixth dam, Blackberry, was described in Racehorses of 1954 as "a very speedy filly and a quick beginner, and she is one of the best sprinters in training." Timeform suggested that five furlongs was probably her best distance.

Mating Blackberry to Grey Sovereign, a notoriously temperamental sprinter, resulted in an even faster filly in Harbinger's fifth dam, Queensberry. This big, muscular filly reeled off wide-margin victories in the Molecomb, Lowther and Cheveley Park S. to earn second place among the fillies on the 1959 Free Handicap. Although Queensberry stayed well enough to take the 1000 Guineas Trial on her reappearance at three, her performance in the Classic suggested that a mile was beyond her, and she never raced again.

Queensberry's owner Colonel Hornung decided to try to inject some stamina into her offspring by sending her mainly to stallions that had shone over a mile and a half or more. One of her first mates was the versatile Crepello, who won the 2000 Guineas and Derby in 1957 to help his legendary trainer Sir Noel Murless record the first of his eight trainers' championships.

Queensberry's Crepello filly Cranberry Sauce went into training with Murless and helped him to another trainers' championship in 1967. She proved to have inherited a measure of her dam's speed, as she showed when she comfortably won the Nell Gwyn S. over seven furlongs, but she also possessed some of Crepello's stamina, as she demonstrated with mile-and-a-quarter victories at Newmarket in the Pretty Polly and Sun Chariot S. and in France in the Prix Fille de l'Air. Timeform insisted that Cranberry Sauce didn't get the trip when narrowly beaten in the Yorkshire Oaks over a mile and a half.

Cranberry Sauce in turn was mated to Connaught, a big, burly horse whose difficult temperament tested Murless's skills to the limit. Although Connaught had looked to be on his way to victory in the Derby until Sir Ivor swept past, he was probably at his most effective when galloping his rivals into submission over a mile and a quarter. Consequently, it was no surprise that Sauceboat, his daughter out of Cranberry Sauce, also found a mile and a quarter her limit. Indeed, she did most of her winning over a mile, and was good enough over that distance to defeat the males in the Lockinge S., only to be disqualified.

Sauceboat produced winners of two races that nowadays carry Group 1 status, with her Welsh Pageant colt Kind of Hush taking the 1982 Prince of Wales's S. and her Kris filly Dusty Dollar winning the 1986 Sun Chariot S. Both were suited by a mile and a quarter.

It was a visit by Sauceboat to Shareef Dancer that resulted in Harbinger's second dam Guapa, who was trained by Michael Stoute before he received his knighthood. She wasn't one of the leading lights in the Stoute yard and had to be dispatched to Hamilton and Wolverhampton to gain her victories. Although her sire won the Irish Derby, Guapa did all her racing at around a mile, which suggests she inherited a measure of her female line's speed.

It was a similar story with Harbinger's dam, Penang Pearl. She, too, was sired by a mile-and-a-half Classic winner in Bering, winner of the Prix du Jockey-Club, but her finest moment came when she won the October S. on her return to a mile, having raced at up to 1 5/16 miles.

NYRA FALL STAKES WORTH \$9 MILLION The New York Racing Association has unveiled the stakes program for its Belmont Fall Championship Meet and Aqueduct Fall Meet. The schedule for the two meets features 30 graded stakes races worth nearly \$9 million. The highlight of the Belmont meeting, which begins Sept. 11 and runs through Oct. 31, is a super Saturday of five Grade I races--the \$750,000 Jockey Club Gold Cup, \$500,000 Joe Hirsch Turf Classic, \$500,000 Flower Bowl, \$350,000 Beldame and \$350,000 Vosburgh, which will all be run Oct. 2. Belmont will offer three Grade I events on Oct. 9: the \$300,000 Champagne S., \$300,000 Frizette and \$250,000 Jamaica Breeders' Cup H. The GI Matron, GII Futurity, GII Jerome, Lonesome Glory, Joseph Gimma and Bertram Bongard have all been put on hiatus for 2010, while 10 stakes--the Beldame, Joe Hirsch, Flower Bowl, Empire Classic, Vosburgh, Champagne, Frizette, Mohawk, Ticonderoga and Garden City--underwent purse reductions. The highlight of the Aqueduct Fall Meet is the Nov. 27 card, which features the \$250,000 GI Hill 'n' Dale Cigar Mile, \$250,000 GI Gazelle, \$200,000 GII Remsen and \$200,000 GII Demoiselle. The Cormorant and Perfect Arc divisions of the New York Stallion Series and the Stuyvesant were put on hiatus this year, while the Cigar Mile and Gazelle had their purses reduced. The Aqueduct meet runs from Nov. 5 through Dec. 31. "Our fall stakes programs rank among the top in the industry, and we are looking forward to great racing at Belmont Park and Aqueduct," NYRA President and CEO Charles Hayward said. "The changes that we made to the meets are a reflection of the current economic climate and the nationwide reductions in the horse population."

NYRA Happy with Opening Weekend Figures:

New York Racing Association officials declared themselves satisfied with the opening weekend figures at the extended Saratoga meeting. During the first four days of the meet, which began last Friday, daily average attendance was 18,113, for a total of 72,452. Daily average on-track handle was \$2,520,715, totaling \$10,082,861. All-sources handle, which averaged \$12,834,190, realized an aggregate over the four cards of \$51,336,758. "These four days at Saratoga have been uncharted territory, with no relevant measure for comparison," said NYRA President and CEO Charles Hayward. "We're quite satisfied with the results, which serve as a springboard to kick off the first full week of the meet starting Wednesday." The betting interests per race averaged 8.5 for 39 races.

Breeders' Cup Foal Noms Discount Deadline Aug. 1:

The deadline for the \$100 discount for Breeders' Cup foal nominations is midnight EDT Aug. 1. The discount applies to foals from the 2010 crop nominated electronically. "Nominators have again responded enthusiastically by taking advantage of our stimulus program and 20-percent reduction for on-line users," said Breeders' Cup President and CEO Greg Avioli. "We very much appreciate their loyal support, and encourage all to take advantage of the discount this week." The standard nomination fee is \$500, and can be made through Oct. 15. The late foal nominations fee is \$1,500, and may be made through Dec. 15.

HBPA Supports Development of Racing Compact:

The National Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association announced yesterday that it would support conditionally the continuing development of an interstate racing and wagering compact. During its Board of Directors meeting, held Sunday in Minneapolis, the group voted to support the compact, provided five tenets were followed: the implementation of rules based on industry consensus; a structured process providing horsemen with opportunities to be heard on a national and local level; reasonable uniformity of rules; concrete protection against unilateral rule-making; and that commissioners be selected based on merit and experience. "As an organization, the National HBPA believes that an interstate racing and wagering compact could be important and beneficial to our industry as we continue efforts to better standardize rules across jurisdictions--as long as the process gives all affected parties fair representation and input," National HBPA President and Chairman Joe Santanna said in a statement. "The National HBPA will support and participate in the development of such an interstate compact as long as we have a comfort level that all participants in our industry--including horsemen--will be allowed fair and reasonable input into all decisions."

Also, after forums held during its summer convention held last week in Minneapolis, the National HBPA board officially announced it is against a proposed change to the RCI Model Rule regarding phenylbutazone levels. The proposed rule change would decrease the allowable level from five mcg/ml to two mcg/ml for Bute administered 24 hours prior to a race. "While a rule change like this might seem somewhat benign, it could lead to unfair burdens on horsemen and unnecessary negative media scrutiny of our industry and its participants," Santanna explained. "So the burden here--as it should be on any important rule change--was the science. Does a preponderance of scientific evidence in this case show a clear line between a lowered regulatory threshold and a decrease in the rate of musculoskeletal/catastrophic racing injuries to horses? 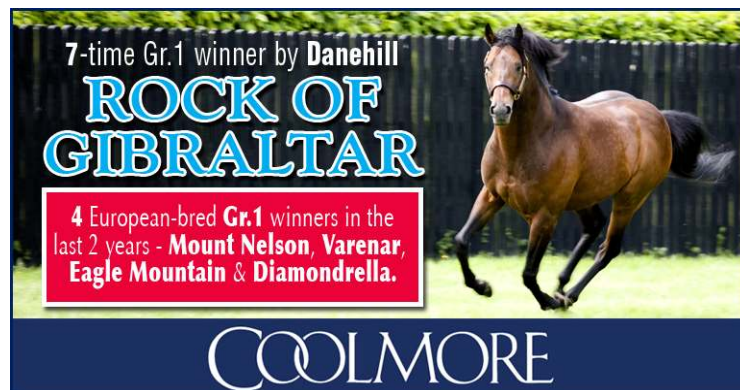
