CHASING FRANNY

A field of 10 sophomore fillies was drawn Wednesday for the GI Test S. at Saratoga Race Course, and if things go as planned, it's **Franny Freud** (Freud) they'll be chasing to the wire. Winner of eight of her 11 career trips to the post and outside the top three just once in that stretch, the New York-bred has won four straight, and showed a bit of a new dimension in her latest. Previously on or near the pace, she was taken back to fourth, then drove clear to take the GI Prioress S. by 1 3/4 lengths from GI Acorn S. upsetter **Champagne d'Oro** (Medaglia d'Oro), with **Bonnie Blue Flag** (Mineshaft) another half-length back in third.

QUALITY TRUMPS QUANTITY IN WHITNEY

Edward P. Evans's **Quality Road** (Elusive Quality) was pegged as the prohibitive 2-5 chalk for Saturday's GI Whitney H. at the Spa, a Breeders' Cup "Win and You're In" event. The heavy favoritism is well-deserved, despite the presence of two other Grade I winners in the form of Stephen Foster hero **Blame** (Arch)--at 4-1 the race's second choice--and last year's Kentucky Derby victor **Mine That Bird** (Birdstone), who has been set for this race ever since joining the Wayne Lukas barn a few months back. Throw in **Musket Man** (Yonaguska), third in the 2009 Derby and Preakness at three who went agonizingly close to taking down the GI Carter H. in April, and the progressive **Haynesfield** (Speighstown) and you'd otherwise have the makings of a Classic. But it's likely to be the **Quality Road** show, as he seeks a fourth career Grade I and third in succession.

RACING Round-Up

Trappe Shot to Race Next at Spa...

Mill House's ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ Trappe Shot (Tapit), an outstanding second to Lookin at Lucky (Smart Strike) in last weekend's GI Haskell S. will make his next start at Saratoga Aug. 28 in either the GI Travers S. over a mile and a quarter or the GI King's Bishop S. going seven panels. "I was very happy with his race against Lookin at Lucky, who was the champion two-year-old colt and probably will be the champion three-year-old colt," said trainer Kieran McLaughlin. "Now we have a choice between facing Discreetly Mine (Mineshaft) in the King's Bishop, or running 1 1/4 miles." He continued, "It's a jump ball--both are Grade 1 races and very important races as a stallion. Fortunately we are in a position to be able to make that kind of choice, and we don't have to make it right away." Horses that have raced in the Haskell have done well in both Grade I events. Coronado's Quest (1997), Point Given (2001) and Summer Bird (2009) used the Haskell as a steppingstone to Travers success, while horses like Tale of the Cat (1997), Forestry (1999), More Than Ready (2000) and Hard Spun (2007) successfully cut back in distance to take the King's Bishop.

Stotsfold Dies...

Walter Swinburn's stable was in mourning yesterday after its star performer **Stotsfold (GB)** (Barathea {Ire}--Eliza Acton {GB}, by Shirley Heights {GB}) died following a colic attack Tuesday night. Third in last year's GI Arlington Million, the gelded seven-year-old won his last two starts in Sandown's G3 Brigadier Gerard S. in May and Listed Gala S. last month, and was being prepared for another trip to Chicago. In recovery after his initial bout of colic, the P W Harris homebred suffered a relapse and died after being taken to the Newmarket Equine Hospital. "In the midst of a really good year for the stable, we were dealt a hammer blow this morning with the news that Stotsfold had died on the operating table during the night," Swinburn explained on his website. "Almost three weeks after his career-best effort in winning the Gala S. at Sandown, he was found to be suffering with colic and following several days of intense treatment and observation, he seemed to be over it. Sadly, the problem recurred late last night and he was immediately taken to the Newmarket Equine Hospital, but they were unable to save him. The homebred seven-year-old will be greatly missed around the yard, but the memories will definitely linger long." In total, Stotsfold won nine of 30 starts and nearly £340,000 in prize money, with Longchamp's G3 La Coupe last year, Windsor's G3 Winter Hill S. in 2008 and Goodwood's G3 Select S. three years ago among his other successes.

SOME POSITIVES

One of the real positives is: there are still people prepared to spend \$300,000 or more on a yearling. There were 46 yearlings sold for \$300,000 or more at Saratoga by 31 different stallions. It is very good news for their breeders and consignors that probably a big majority of the 46 actually made somebody money. As breeders are selling off record 2008 stud fees into the lowest demand since 1992, nobody's expecting to make money this year; to get the horses sold and come out of the year with some money will be a win, because at least when breeders go to sign up for their 2011 stud fees, those will have really crashed too.

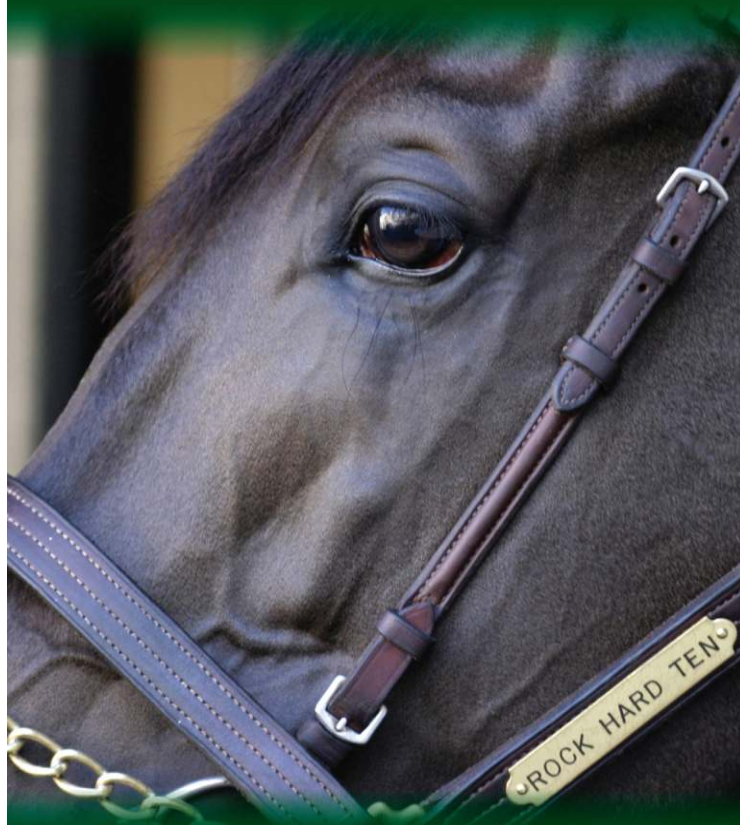
Moreover, there are new faces, as well as some of the great established players. Sheikh Mohammed, of course; he flew into town and bought 14 at the sale, though the 'good' news is he accounted for less than 20 percent of the gross. Brother Sheikh Hamdan brought three, including a \$350,000 filly from the first crop by his superstar Invasor. But most of the buyers were American. Charlotte Weber's Live Oak Stud bought five; agent Donato Lanni signed for three, evidently all for trainer Bob Baffert (whose Lookin at Lucky stamped himself America's best three-year-old colt in last weekend's GI Haskell S.); veteran owners Robert and Lawana Low bought a couple, including a high-priced Distorted Humor filly; and a number of newer players like Bobby Flay, Benjamin Leon's Besilu Farm (bought the saletopping \$1.2-million A.P. Indy colt through trainer Todd Pletcher), and back-in-business Ahmed Zayat were also there to buy. The syndicates (IEAH bought five; West Point, Dogwood, and Centennial were also buyers) and pinhookers were active, too. So, it's really not as if there is no interest. Definitely, there is not enough interest; there are definitely some massive problems in North America's horse racing industry, which ultimately may or may not be sorted out. But there is a measurable level of business, and to some extent, it wouldn't be bad business, either, except for the massive production costs, via the record 2008 stud fees, in this year's yearlings.

Elsewhere in this issue we publish the *TDN Instatistics* sire tables for the first two yearling sales, Fasig-Tipton July and Saratoga. It's quite limited data; most of these sires will have a lot more on offer next month, but it is nonetheless informative to look at where the stallions rate after the first two sales. The top four stallions on average actually had just 60 percent of their yearlings sold among them (14 of 23) of those offered in the first two sales, reinforcing the view that it doesn't matter how high up the scale you go, there's no forgiveness any more: it had better be a good one of whatever it's by, or there's nobody there to buy it, certainly for not what the breeder might have in it.

The top five spots by sire average for these first two sales were filled by sires with WinStar, Lane's End, and Darley connections: WinStar's **Distorted Humor** (two, averaged \$762,500) edged out Lane's End's **A.P. Indy** (three, averaged \$705,000) for the top spot so far, ahead of Darley's **Street Cry** (five, averaged \$570,000). Lane's End's two-time leading sire **Smart Strike** had four average \$462,500; and WinStar's **Tiznow** ranked fifth, with four averaging \$352,500. I thought it was also interesting that two sons of A.P. Indy, **Bernardini** (three, averaged \$275,000) and **Pulpit** (six, averaged \$260,000) ranked among the top 10. With **Malibu Moon** (nine averaged \$169,444), Pulpit's son **Tapit** (four, averaged \$105,250, off a \$12,500 stud fee), and--hey, have you heard the news?--**Mineshaft** (two, averaged \$152,500), A.P. Indy continues to rank as North America's single most powerful sire line (excluding Mr. Prospector, which got going 20 years earlier).

After their \$200-million 2007 stallion prospect spending spree, this year's first-crop yearling sire statistics are certain to be dominated by Darley's really impressive collection of new recruits, on both sides of the Atlantic. Four Kentucky stallions had eight or more sell in the first two sales and averaged over \$100,000: Darley stallions **Street Sense** (eight, averaged \$220,625), **Hard Spun** (nine, averaged \$178,888), and **Discreet Cat** (eight, averaged \$125,625); and Gainesway's **Corinthian** (13, averaged \$128,461). In an environment where 'clearance rate' is a very important statistic to breeders, Street Sense and Discreet Cat have each had 80 percent sold of those offered (eight of 10), Corinthian was 65 percent (13 of 20), and Hard Spun, harder work, just 53 percent (nine of 17).

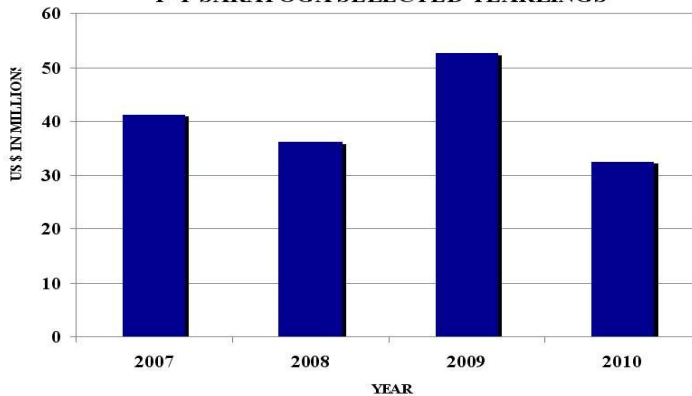

Weekly Sales Ticker

"The Saratoga sale makes more sense if you take out the 2009 spike in number catalogued and sold, and the big jump in gross in the Dubai company's first year of ownership. The other three years in the table and graph – 2007, 2008, and 2010 – actually show numbers which compare (favorably) to the rest of the yearling market. Compared to the peak year of 2007, the number catalogued was down just six percent; the number sold, though, by 18 percent; the gross by 21 percent; and the average by just four percent. It's worth noting that 46 of the 117 sold brought \$300,000-plus." - Bill Oppenheim

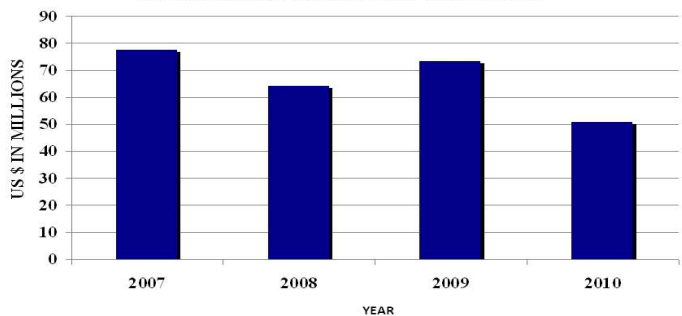
F-T SARATOGA SELECTED YEARLINGS

Fasig's first two yearling sales combined saw 360 yearlings sold for \$50,829,500 (see Weekly Sales Ticker, bottom table), an average of \$141,493. When you think of the 50-percent drop in value for many American horses, especially of the breeding stock variety, you'd say to some extent Fasig's two select sales have held up not too badly: the number of horses catalogued in the two sales dropped by 23 percent (796 to 609) between 2007 and 2010. The number of horses sold dropped 27 percent, from 496 to 360, while the 'clearance rate' from the catalogue dipped from 62 to 59 percent--meaning 59 percent of those catalogued were listed as sold in 2010, versus 62 percent in 2007. The two sales' combined gross dropped by a little over a third--34 percent--from \$77.5 million in 2007 to \$50.8 million this year. The average has only dropped by 10 percent, but when a quarter fewer horses sell for a third less money, the fact that the average is only off by 10 percent provides only limited consolation--particularly when production costs, in terms of stud fees, probably rose by a third between 2005, when 2007 yearlings were created, and 2008, which stud fees resulted in this year's yearlings.

So it will be a testing yearling season, no doubt everywhere, as there is limited discretionary capital and not much if any credit available (at least from banks) to buy horses. But there is the promise, for those who weather the storm, that this year will be the worst, at least because stud fees have now fallen to the level where the current market can more or less justify them. In other words, if you breed horses on what are going to be 2011 stud fees, if the yearling market just remains where it is, breeders will have a reasonable chance to make money, albeit at significantly lower levels than was the case three years ago. If you can survive this year, at least your stud fee expenses next year shouldn't be exorbitant in comparison to what the yearling you would breed might bring.

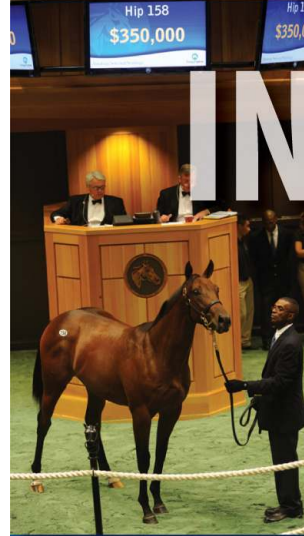

Table Games Having Positive Impact at Charles Town:

One month after the introduction of table gaming at Hollywood Casino at Charles Town Races, there has been a noticeable and quantifiable uptick in interest in the local horse racing product. Despite racing three fewer days during the month of July this year versus last, the gross live handle is ahead by two percent, while average daily live handle jumped by 17.5 percent. Gross import handle and average daily export handle have also shown double-digit increases since table gaming began. "The increase in traffic on the racing side has created an increase in the energy of the building," said Al Britton, general manager at the racino. "Like we've said all along, the addition of table games would have a positive impact on all aspects of our business and all the parties who benefit from it." Future plans call for "walkabout" mutuel tellers, who are equipped with mobile devices to receive wagers.

CDI Revenues Increase 11 Percent:

Officials at Churchill Downs Incorporated announced that second-quarter revenues totaled \$200.5 million, an increase of 11 percent versus net revenues of \$180 million for the corresponding period in 2009. The gain was attributed to the performance of CDI's gaming segment, its online segment and the growth of Kentucky Oaks and Derby week, according to a release from the company. Net revenues from the company's racing segment, excluding Oaks and Derby week, declined by six percent. Though earnings per share dropped to \$1.85 from \$2.20 a year ago, CDI's EBITDA (earnings before interest, taxes, depreciation and amortization) increased by one percent, despite \$4 million in costs related to the acquisition of Youbet.com. "This was an important quarter for us on four fronts," said Robert L. Evans, CDI president and chief executive officer. "First, we set a new record in terms of the EBITDA performance of our most important asset, the Kentucky Oaks and Kentucky Derby week, up \$3.4 million from last year. Second, we continued on pace to meet our expected \$80-\$100 million in annual gross gaming revenue ("GGR") for the Calder Casino, with \$21.1 million in GGR for the quarter. Third, we realized 11 percent handle growth in our Online Business excluding Youbet.com, despite a decline in overall U.S. Thoroughbred industry handle of 6 percent. Finally, we completed the acquisition of Youbet.com and United Tote and are pleased to report that, based upon our integration efforts to date, we should achieve annualized cost synergies of \$12 million, rather than the \$10 million we previously anticipated." Churchill also played host to the HullabaLOU music festival which attracted some 78,000 fans, however the company's EBITDA loss was \$5 million, more than double what was expected.

Case of Potomac Horse Fever Did Not Originate at Keeneland (from edited press release)

Kentucky Department of Agriculture officials have concluded a recent case of Potomac Horse Fever--diagnosed in a horse at Keeneland's training center on Rice Road--was not contracted or introduced to the horse while he was stabled on the grounds.

State veterinary officials were alerted on Friday when a horse that had been stabled at the facility tested positive for the disease, said Rusty Ford, equine programs manager in the Office of State Veterinarian Robert Stout.

"Our investigation found the horse developed a fever in the days following his arrival at the training facility from an area farm," Ford said. "With the fever not easily resolved the colt was moved to an equine hospital for veterinary care and diagnostics. In consultation with the horse's attending veterinarian and the internist caring for the horse at the hospital, we are confident that there is no evidence that leads us to believe that the horse contracted the disease causing agent in the less than five days he was at the training center." **Cont. p6**



Potomac Horse Fever cont.

Potomac Horse Fever is caused by a type of bacteria--*Neorickettsia risticii*--and is associated with hot weather and aquatic insects. It is a condition found in Kentucky during the hot summer months. Agriculture and veterinary officials have recently noted an increase in the number of PHF cases diagnosed in several eastern states, Ford said.

Against that backdrop, equine health officials have been monitoring potential cases in Kentucky, although at this juncture there does not appear to be an increased occurrence rate of the disease, Ford said.

Horses contract the disease after inadvertently consuming infected insects while grazing or eating feedstuffs. The disease is not transmitted from horse to horse, Ford said. Symptoms associated with the disease include fever, diarrhea and laminitis.

Regretfully, Ford said, in this case the horse's condition failed to improve and resulted in the decision to eliminate suffering through euthanasia.
