HARBINGER RETIRED

Highclere Thoroughbred Racing's **Harbinger (GB)** (Dansili {GB}--Penang Pearl {Fr}, by Bering {GB}) has been retired, it was announced Monday. Despite successful surgery on his fractured near-fore cannon bone over the weekend, connections of the 11-length G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth S. winner have called time on his career. In a statement issued on behalf of the Admiral Rous Syndicate, Racing Manager Harry Herbert said, "It is

with regret that it has been decided to retire Harbinger from racing. Thanks to the professionalism of the veterinary surgeons Bruce Bladon of O'Gorman Slater and Main, Andrew Bathe of Rossdale and Partners and Antony Clements of Baker and McVeigh, the operation which was undertaken at Rosdales Hospital in Newmarket has been very successful. We are pleased to report that, thankfully, the horse is recovering well. The decision to retire Harbinger is based on the welfare of the horse, which is paramount to all concerned. The owners, for whom this is very sad, are naturally sorry that their great horse has had his racing career cut short. However, Harbinger has given all concerned the ultimate thrill at the very highest level." Prior to his emphatic success at Ascot, which places him at the top of the world rankings at present, Harbinger had recorded four wins at group level. They came in the 2009 G3 Gordon S. at Goodwood and this term's G3 John Porter S., G3 Ormonde S. and G2 Hardwicke S. The latter performance, which signaled the four-year-old's arrival in the major league, set him up for a tilt at the King George, and Herbert singled the latter two runs out yesterday. "The highest-rated horse in the world, Harbinger won six of his nine starts and is undefeated this year," Herbert added. "In winning the Hardwicke S. at Royal Ascot so impressively and then producing one of the greatest performances of all time to win the King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S. by 11 lengths in record time, Harbinger has confirmed himself as one of the all time greats." In total, he was the winner of six of his nine starts and over £770,000 in prize money.

PACO BOY TO HIGHCLERE STUD

Paco Boy (Ire) (Desert Style {Ire}--Tappen Zee {Ire}, by Sandhurst Prince {Ire}) will retire to John and Lady Carolyn Warren's Highclere Stud next season, it was announced yesterday. Breaking the news ahead of the five-year-old's tilt at Sunday's G1 Prix Jacques le Marois at Deauville, John Warren said, "There was fierce competition for him from a number of well-established studs and, as a grandson of the amazing sire of sires Green Desert, we

count ourselves extremely lucky to be in the position to stand what is one of the toughest, most prolific milers to retire to stud in living memory." Owned by the Calvera Partnership, Paco Boy is the winner of three Group 1s and eight group races in total, with his finest hours so far coming in the 2008 G1 Prix de la Foret, 2009 G1 Queen Anne S. and the G1 Lockinge S. at Newbury in May. "When a trainer or agent goes to the sales, they love buying yearlings by a sire that their owners have heard of, and Paco Boy is now a household name," Warren added. "I read an article recently setting out where successful stallions came from; Cadeaux Genereux (GB) (Young Generation {Ire}), Royal Applause (GB) (Waajib {Ire}) and Pivotal (GB) (Polar Falcon) are extremely successful sires, and it struck me that Paco Boy has won as many Group 1 and [Group] 2 races as those three put together!" A fee will be set at a later date.

RACHEL PREPS FOR PERSONAL ENSIGN

Horse of the Year **Rachel Alexandra** (Medaglia d'Oro) worked six furlongs in 1:12.96 on the Saratoga's Oklahoma training track yesterday in preparation for the Aug. 29 GI Personal Ensign S. Shaun Bridgmohan was aboard. "I thought it was very good," trainer Steve Asmussen said. "Shaun did a great job with her. She came home the last quarter in :23 and change, which is what we were looking for, and galloped out strong."

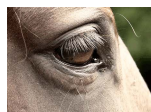

Dick Turpin to Deauville...

Trainer Richard Hannon yesterday revealed that Dick Turpin (Ire) (Arakan) will step up to 10 furlongs for Sunday's G2 Prix Guillaume d'Ornano at Deauville. John Manley's G1 Prix Jean Prat winner could then return to a mile in either the Sept. 25 G1 Queen Elizabeth S. at Ascot or Sept. 5 G1 Prix du Moulin at Longchamp. "Richard Hughes is adamant that Dick Turpin will have the stamina for 10 furlongs, and France suits him, as there is always the strong possibility that he will get a bit of dig in the ground out there," Hannon explained. "Even with his seven-pound penalty, Dick Turpin stands head and shoulders above the likely opposition, and he will hopefully be very hard to beat Sunday."

Apologies if I am repeating myself, but I have to repeat my past warnings about the dangers of judging young stallions on insufficient evidence. Even those closest to the horse can be misled.

Back in February 2004, Seth Hancock commented in a *Blood-Horse* Q & A that:

"Arch is not doing what we hoped he might do, but you can't say he's that big a disappointment because no son of Kris S. made it. I thought, with his female family, he would overcome that, but so far he hasn't, and it doesn't look like he will."

Well, none of us like to be proven wrong, but I'm sure the master of Claiborne is more than happy that the subsequent six years have seen Arch transformed from zero to comparative hero. Although his fee had sunk to a mere \$5,000 in 2004, Arch has since built up such a solid record that it has been constant at \$25,000 over the last four years. Cont. p3

Hancock's words were spoken when his young stallion had two crops of runners on the track. In typical Claiborne fashion, neither crop was especially large--there were only 40 foals in his first crop, which had raced as three-year-olds in 2003. Many of the 60-strong second crop hadn't raced at two, so the adverse assessment of Arch was based on only 55 runners to the end of 2003. Hancock's disappointment no doubt centered on the fact that only one of the 55--Chilly Rooster--had even been placed at graded level, let alone won a stakes race.

The current position is that Arch--now 15 years old--has six Grade I winners to his credit, the latest of which is Blame, conqueror of Quality Road in the GI Whitney H. While we mustn't forget that Blame was in receipt of five pounds from the beaten favourite, this progressive May 2 foal is edging closer and closer to the top of his division, to the extent that the Claiborne team must be looking forward to adding this very well-connected colt to its stallion roster.

The comment that "no son of Kris S. made it" possibly also requires some qualification. I don't need to remind you that this son of Roberto started out in Florida and had to prove himself the hard way. Consequently, some of his older stallion sons didn't have the depth of pedigree one hopes to find in a potential stallion.

Take a look at the stallions who sired the first two dams of some of Kris S.'s best sons from his early crops. The sires of Prized's first two dams were My Dad George and Petare, while for Evening Kris it was Double Hitch and Iamarellic, for Brocco it was Aurelius and Anyoldtime, and for You and I it was the Peruvian stallion Ups and Nyangal. The Haskell Invitational winner Kissin Kris had a dam by Your Alibhai. Although their names won't prompt warm memories for many breeders, Prized, Brocco and You and I did at least sire a Grade I winner apiece, in Brass Hat, Jostle and You.

I think it is fair to have different expectations of the stallion sons sired after Kris S. moved to Kentucky, where his fee climbed as high as \$150,000 in 2001. Kris S.'s early record as a disappointing sire of sires didn't help his Derby-winning son Kris Kin in Ireland, but another of his English Group 1 winners, Dr Fong, sired a couple of Group 1 winners in what has otherwise been an unexceptional career. It might have been a different story with Dr Fong's brother Lucky Story, who died young after giving signs that he was capable of moving up through the ranks.

However, there are two possible rays of hope on the horizon. Rock Hard Ten, winner of the GI Malibu S. and GI Santa Anita H., is out of a champion daughter of Mr. Prospector, so it is hardly surprising that he has made a bright start to his stallion career. From a first crop numbering around 80 named foals, he has already been represented by four graded/group winners.

Then there's the Japanese star Symboli Kris S. This dual winner of Horse of the Year honors ranked a close third on the leading sires' table in Japan in 2009, when his representatives included the Group 1 dirt winner Success Brocken. Symboli Kris S. currently holds fifth place on the 2010 table.

From an American viewpoint, there is one problem-- much of this success has come on turf. All four of Rock Hard Ten's graded winners are turf performers, and Symboli Kris S. is based in Japan, where the emphasis is still very much on turf. Arch, too, owes plenty of his success to his turf runners, such as Arravale, Prince Arch, Lattice, and the European group winners Les Arcs, Montgomery's Arch and Arch Swing.

Arch, though, won the Super Derby on dirt, and Blame is his second Grade I winner on dirt, following the very talented Pine Island. This Phipps homebred established herself as one of the leaders of her generation by achieving consecutive Grade I victories in the Alabama S. and Gazelle S., but she then suffered a fatal break down in the Breeders' Cup Distaff.

Significantly, Blame and Pine Island are both out of daughters of Seeking the Gold, another dirt specialist. The similarities between their pedigrees don't end there, as Pine Island's third dam, Maplejinsky, was by Nijinsky II, and so is Blame's second dam, Bound.

The mere mention of Bound's name brings memories of Claiborne's glory days flooding back. Her third dam is Rough Shod, the celebrated mare bought by the late Bull Hancock for 3,500gns at Newmarket back in 1951.

Bound was one of six daughters produced by Rough Shod's aptly named granddaughter Special, which made her a three-parts sister to Special's brilliant son Nureyev. As many as four of the six daughters produced a group/graded winner, with Fairy Bridge leading the way as the dam of Sadler's Wells and Tate Gallery. Bound's Grade II-winning sister Number also did very well, with the Group 1 winner Jade Robbery among her three graded winners by Mr. Prospector, and Bound certainly hasn't let the side down.

At the age of 20, Bound produced a Kingmambo colt that shook off a May 30 birthday to become a group winner in four different countries--Ireland, Dubai, Hong Kong and Britain. Named Archipenko, this colt also went close to becoming a graded winner in the U.S., where he was beaten less than a length in the 2008 Arlington Million. Archipenko is now a stallion at Lanwades Stud.

As a daughter of Seeking the Gold, Blame's dam Liable is a three-parts sister to Archipenko, and Liable is also bred along similar lines to Jade Robbery.

It must be a source of considerable satisfaction to Blame's owner/breeders, Claiborne Farm and Adele Dilschneider, that his four great-grandfathers include Danzig, Mr. Prospector and Nijinsky, while his grandfathers include another Claiborne stalwart in Seeking the Gold. The colt's sire, Arch, also raced for the Claiborne/Dilschneider partnership, while Blame's first four dams were all bred at Claiborne. Perhaps Blame's two-year-old sister Might will prove another great advertisement for her Claiborne heritage.

Blame is now the winner of eight of his 11 starts, with two of his wins coming on all-weather tracks and the rest on dirt. His pedigree suggests he should also be at home on turf, and this versatility should prove an asset when Blame eventually retires to stud.

NYRA TO HOST T-BRED RETIREMENT DAY
(Edited Press Release) The New York Racing Association will host a Thoroughbred Retirement Awareness Day next Wednesday, Aug. 18, at Saratoga Race Course. The event will include an on-track dressage show by ABC/ESPN personality Jeannine Edwards and her horse, Ashkal Way. The eight-year-old gelding took the Gil Bernard Baruch H. for Godolphin at The Spa in 2006 and won the GI Citation H. at Hollywood later in the year. Ashkal Way has had a successful second career as well, teaming up with Edwards for dressage competition wins. The pair's performance will take place at 12:35 p.m. NYRA will also present checks of \$5,000 to the Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation (TRF), Old Friends and Exceller, three charities committed to racehorse retirement, after the second race. A booth will be set up near the jockeys' room for the TRF, Exceller Fund, Old Friends, Peaceful Acres, Pure Thoughts and ReRun to pass out informational flyers and collect donations. "We are thrilled to bring these groups on track and help raise awareness for a very important cause," said NYRA president and CEO Charles Hayward. "I would encourage the Saratoga fans to come out and learn more about their initiatives."

Changing Skies started off her career solidly in Europe for Brian Meehan, highlighted by a second in the G3 Prix de Psyche in 2008 at Deauville. Future MGISW and fellow current Mott trainee Proviso (GB) (Dansili {GB}) was third in that event. Changing Skies experienced stateside success immediately last year, taking a Belmont allowance Sept. 30 over yielding ground and winning the GIII Very One S. two starts later at Gulfstream Feb. 27. 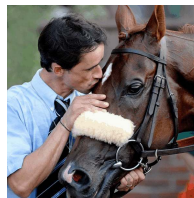

He retires as the winner of 1,542 races and, alongside his domestic titles in 2002, 2004 and 2006, are big-race wins on the likes of Silvano (Ger) (Lomitas {GB}), Paolini (Ger) (Lando
