GALILEO FILLY TOPS SOFT ARQANA OPENER

Trouble--of the economic variety so pervasive around the globe--has arrived even in paradise. Arqana, the French sale company that bills its Deauville yearling

auction as the "sales paradise," partly due to the colorful culture and sun of the Normandy beachside, recorded larger-than-anticipated declines across the board when the select portion of the sale began, fittingly, on Friday the 13th. Turnover tumbled by 40 percent compared

to 2009 figures, reaching only €11.5 million (including two private sales after horses had been listed as not sold in the ring) versus €19.3 million, while average price dropped by 26 percent to €175,403. Median price fell by 16 percent, from €180,000 to €150,000. Arqana President Eric Hoyeau said the trends from the first day seem to be comparable to those experienced recently at Fasig-Tipton's Saratoga select sale, the Inglis Easter yearling sale in Australia and the Japan Racine Horse Association select sale of yearlings in July. At the end of the day, intense inspection and vetting of horses did not necessarily result in big prices or even, in some cases, sales of the best prospects to enter the ring. The highest-priced horse of the day, a filly by Galileo (Ire) consigned by Haras d'Etream, was first reported as not sold on a bid of €650,000 but later was recorded as a private sale at €600,000 to British agent Charlie Gordon-Watson, who was buying on behalf of a new client he said he could not disclose.

Maktoum Participation, Or Lack Thereof, Impacts...

A sharp decrease in spending by buyers at the top of the market, particularly Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid al Maktoum and his brother, Sheikh Hamdan, was pointed out by Arqana officials. Together, the Maktoums spent €4.82 million less than they did in 2009, with Sheikh Hamdan not buying any horses compared to the €2.6 million he spent last year.

"It's quite huge," said Arqana Managing Director Olivier Delloye of the difference just the Maktoums made in the results.

Those limits also were reflected by the fact that only two yearlings were reported sold for €500,000 or more, compared with nine during the same session last year.

Gordon-Watson hustled to scoop up horses that did not get sold in the spending pinch, including the Galileo filly, a full sister to Group 3 winner and Group 1-placed Age of Aquarius, who topped

the Deauville sale in 2007 on a bid of €1.4 million.

"She's got a lot of class and a lot of quality," Gordon-Watson said, describing the filly as a "long-term" investment for the client, who values her potential as a broodmare. The elegant bay filly also is a half sister to French Group 1 winner Turtle Bowl (Fr) (Dyhim Diamond {Ire}) and Group 2 winner Turtle Bow (Fr) (Turtle Island {Ire}).

"She's a late foal [Apr. 29], so she's only going to improve," Gordon-Watson observed.

Gordon-Watson also negotiated with Watership Down Stud General Manager Simon Marsh and reached an agreement to acquire a colt by Oasis Dream (GB) consigned by Watership Down on behalf of breeder Runnymede Farm of Paris, Kentucky, through Arqana after the sale session ended. While the figure was not reported by the sale company as of the close of business on Friday, it was described as "more than the final reported bid" of €240,000.

"That's horse sales for you," said Runnymede Vice President and General Manager Martin O'Dowd, calling the opening Deauville session "a very selective market." The Runnymede colt also had been very popular with lookers and had been vetted multiple times with no issues reported.

Another strikingly handsome son of Oasis Dream topped all horses sold in the ring on a bid of €500,000 by Demi O'Byrne of Coolmore, who was sitting in the top level of seats near the rafters at the back of the pavilion with John Magnier and other Coolmore associates. Produced by the Indian Ridge (Ire) mare Cap Coz, a daughter of French classic-placed filly Pont-Aven (Try My Best), the colt led in as hip 27 is a half-brother to black-type winner Biniou (Mozart {Ire}).

"We just liked him," Magnier said of the colt from The Castlebridge Consignment Ltd. who was described by one admirer as a "rock star."

O'Byrne signed tickets on three other yearlings--a Galileo filly near the end of the session who is a half-sister to GI Del Mar Oaks winner Amorama (Fr) (Sri Pekan) for €340,000; a Danehill Dancer (Ire) filly from the family of champion Wandesta (GB) (Nashwan) for €240,000, and a Galileo colt out of a full sister to champion Spain (Thunder Gulch) for €150,000.

Coolmore's Galileo proved to be the most popular sire at the top of the marketplace.

Sir Robert Ogden took home hip 11 from the Haras de Fresnay-le-Buffard consignment, a Galileo colt out of the unraced Anabaa mare Alta Anna, for €420,000. The colt's dam is a half-sister to French Oaks runner-up Abbatiale (Kaldoun {Fr}) and to listed winner Aubergade (Kaldoun).

Perched high up in the seats not too far from the Coolmore contingent, Ogden proclaimed that his Galileo colt is "as near as possible to perfection that you can find," citing his excellent conformation and the athletic way he moves.

Two other Galileo colts also brought bids of €420,000, both from Agence FIPS and reportedly for the account of the Marquise de Moratalla. The first through the ring, hip 33, was produced by Irish champion juvenile Danaskaya (Ire) (Danehill) and was consigned by Ballylinch Stud. The second, hip 65, a chestnut out of Group 3 winner Maroussie (Saumarez {GB}) from Newsells Park Stud, is a three-quarter brother to Group 3 winner Maroussies Wings (In the Wings {GB}).

Gilles Forien, the agent who works with the Marquise de Moratalla, declined comment.

But it was Gordon-Watson who proved to be at least one of the busiest men of the day. He also signed tickets for a Dansili colt out of the Sadler's Wells mare Lady Elgar (Ire) at €400,000 and for a Street Cry (Ire) colt out of multiple American Grade II winner Naissance Royale (Ire) (Giant's Causeway) at €320,000.

The Dansili colt is a half-brother to American multiple Grade I winner Grand Couturier (GB) (Grand Lodge) while the Street Cry colt is from the family of champion Revidere (Reviewer). Gordon-Watson said the purchases were for new clients and that both would be sent to trainer Ed Dunlop.

"It was a surprise to be able to get him," Gordon-Watson said of the Street Cry colt, which he added to his purchases just before acquiring an Oasis Dream colt for €300,000 from the consignment of Yeomanstown Stud.

Overall, Gordon-Watson described the market as "pretty good," at least from a buyer's perspective.

"I think they are a very lovely bunch of horses here, but the results will show there will be no standouts," he added.

For those who closely watch and indeed depend on the spending of the Maktoum family, the Deauville sale could be a portent of things to come at the Keeneland September sale and the Tattersalls October sale.

Sheikh Mohammed's bloodstock advisor John Ferguson signed tickets on only three yearlings, all colts and all at relatively modest prices: a son of star young Darley stallion Dubawi (Ire) out of a half sister to Group 1 winner Seazun (Ire) (Zieten) for €160,000; a son of Darley first-crop stallion Teofilo (Ire) out of multiple listed winner Zeiting (Ire) (Zieten) for €200,000, and a son of Dansili out of a half-sister to Broodmare of the Year Better Than Honour (Deputy Minister), dam of GI Belmont S. winners Rags to Riches and Jazil, for €220,000.

Simon Marsh, general manager of Watership Down Stud, which sold only one of four offerings through the ring on Friday, said the market is "very difficult at the moment--and it's not going to get any better for the rest of the year."

With bloodstock markets often taking three years to work through cycles, as production costs and market forces change, this is the third year and thus the end, Marsh hopes, of the down cycle.

Looking on the positive side, Arqana officials pointed out there was a diversity of buyers at the level of more than €200,000, with 13 different buyers reaching that level, although the number was down from 19 in 2009.

"The diversity of buyers...is a positive sign that there is still a lot of appetite for quality yearlings, but the budgets are no longer the same as buyers seem to be setting strict limitations," Hoyeau said. "However, we remain hopeful for [Saturday's] session, as we have some good individuals catalogued and several buyers still have some money to spend."

As the evening progressed, Luraschi and his team led magnificent gray stallions among the tables set up outside for diners, where the horses reared and bowed on command. Other riders dressed as knights gave a demonstration of jousting, and they closed out their show with a series of gymnastic maneuvers on horseback.

Georges Rimaud, who oversees Bonneval and the Aga Khan's racing stock, welcomed guests from Ireland, Britain, Russia, Turkey, Japan, Australia and South America, in addition to the United States and France. Rimaud also was influential in the creation of Arqana several years ago; the Aga Khan is the majority shareholder in the sale company.

This year's party is part of an ongoing celebration of the Aga Khan's 50th anniversary in horse racing. The Aga Khan took over his family's bloodstock in 1960, upon the death of his father, Prince Aly Khan, and since then has raced 50 Classic winners.

"We're very proud to see the Aga Khan's bloodlines performing on all the continents," said Rimaud during brief remarks, in which he noted that 2010 is also special as the first year that the Aga Khan stood phenomenal European champion Sea the Stars (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}) at his Gilltown Stud in Ireland.

Racing trophies, photographs, paintings and video footage of many of the Aga Khan's outstanding runners, from Blushing Groom (Fr) and Shergar (Ire) to Sinndar (Ire) and Zarkava (Ire), were on display at the party.

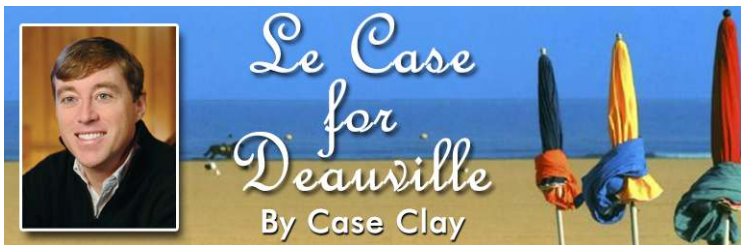

Three Chimneys President Case Clay is in France for the Arqana August Yearling Sale, and will be sending a daily report to the TDN about his experiences.

We spent most of the day today at the sales, with a brief visit to the Arqana party at Villa Strassburger, which was fantastic. Sunshine and a Foie Gras Bar-- what more could one want? Then lunch at The Yearling right before the sale started.

The sale: my friend Bill Oppenheim has proved over the last 30 years of studying sales figures that he would be way more of an expert analyzing sales than anyone, in my opinion, but he writes his piece on the sales next Wednesday and has promised to clean up any mess I make on the analysis of this sale. In fact, I'll let him do the analysis and offer a consignor's perspective: Way back in the old days, in 2007, the way to try and figure out how much your horse might make was to connect the vet who scoped or vetted your horse (if you're so lucky) with the potential buyer, by looking at recent history.

Then take each buyer and write down what they're willing to spend (by looking at recent history), and try and value it from there. For example, if you have six scopes in America, and all six buyers only have spent in the range of \$50,000 to \$100,000, your horse probably won't make that much more than \$100,000. Of course there are exceptions, but you get what I mean. The new way, I would imagine, is this: Take what they used to spend and take off 40 to 50 percent. Why? Because unless you're a lawyer, the vast majority of potential buyers have about 40 to 50 percent less than they used to. It's not doom and gloom, it's just different.

The good news is that there is trade, and that's what makes our world go around. People are trading horses, just for less than three years ago. On another consignor note, I spoke with a consignor today who has three-minute videos of their yearlings' scopes on their laptop. The video shows the scope going in, the horse breathing for about three minutes, then the scope coming out. To prevent a yearling from being scoped a ridiculous amount of times, I hope to goodness this catches on. I understand some potential buyers are going to want to have the horse physically scoped, but if the video can DECREASE the number of times the scope actually goes down the yearling's throat, I would think that would be a good thing.

Arqana provides bicycles to ride around town or back and forth to your hotel. Sunday: 6 a.m. horses working on the beach, followed by the Farmer's Market, another farm visit, then one of the best racing days of the year.

Monday: going to see our old friend (he's not really old, he's just an old friend) Alec Head at Haras du Quesnay, which will be a little bit like Superman showing you around the Hall of Justice, for you Superfriends fans.

## ARQANA AUGUST YEARLINGS

**Hip 112, c, Dansili {GB}--Alpha Lupi (Ire), by Rahy**  
*Consigned by Haras des Fresnay-le-Buffard*

Yet another representative of the Niarchos family's rich bloodlines descending from international champion Miesque (Nureyev), this colt is the first foal of an unraced mare who is daughter of champion East of the Moon (Private Account). Winner of the G1 Prix de Diane and G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulaches, East of the Moon has produced Group 3 winner Moon Driver (Mr. Prospector) and multiple graded stakes-placed sire Mojave Moon (Mr. Prospector). Tim Richardson, who manages Haras de Fresnay-le-Buffard, said the pedigree of the handsome bay suggests Classic potential. "He's got an excellent temperament and, hopefully, he has the motor," Richardson added.

**Hip 130, f, Teofilo (Ire)--Delicieuse Lady (GB),  
 by Trempolino**

*Consigned by Ecurie des Monceaux*

From the first crop of European champion juvenile Teofilo (Galileo {Ire}), this big, but feminine, chestnut filly is a half-sister to G1 Prix du Jockey Club winner Blue Canari (Fr) (Acatenango {Ger}) as well as to multiple stakes winner Blue Ksar (Fr) (Anabaa) and group placed Crabapple (Fr) (Unfuwain). Her family also has produced champion and sire Mtoto (GB) (Busted {GB}) and Group 1 winner and sire Mutamam (GB) (Darshaan {GB}). The filly was bred in Britain by the Ecurie des Monceaux of Lucien Urano.

**Hip 148, c, Rock of Gibraltar (Ire)--Helsinki (Fr),  
 by Pennekamp**

*Consigned by La Motteraye (Haras du Jao Glaz)*

The fourth foal of his winning dam, this bay is from one of the hottest sire producing families on the globe. Helsinki is a half-sister to champion Shamardal (Giant's Causeway), one of the world's leading second-crop sires, and a daughter of G1 Irish Oaks winner Helen Street (GB) (Troy {GB}), who produced Street Cry (Ire) (Machiavellian). Bred in Ireland by Thierry Grandsir, the colt is one of eight yearlings in the first Deauville draft offered by the new La Motteraye operation of Lucie Lamotte and Gwenael Monneraye. "He's a lovely horse," said Monneraye, noting the yearling's robust frame, even though he is a May foal. "A lot of people have wanted to see him, as he has a stallion's pedigree. He is very straightforward and has good action; we love him." The colt's three-year-old half-sister Arte Viva (Giant's Causeway) won a maiden special weight race at Del Mar in late June.

**Hip 150, c, Excellent Art (GB)--Hidden Silver (GB),  
 by Anabaa**

*Consigned by Haras des Sablonnets*

A member of the first crop of Pivotal's Group 1-winning son Excellent Art, he is a half-brother to G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains winner Silver Frost (Ire) (Verglas {Ire}), who was the first foal of the dam. Hidden Silver is a half-sister to a pair of Group 3 winners in High Rock (Ire) (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}) and Homeland (Fr) (Highest Honor {Fr}), as well as to black-type winner Hideaway (Fr) (Cape Cross {Ire}). The colt descends from an American female family that includes Group 2 winners Star of Manila (Manila) and Mio Robertino (Roberto).

**Hip 203, c, Unbridled's Song--Tenderly (Ire),  
 by Danehill**

*Consigned by Gestut Fahrhof*

A half brother to GIII Baldwin S. winner Ten Meropa (Johannesburg), this rangy colt is the fourth foal of his French- and American-raced dam, who is a half-sister to European champion mare Pride (Fr) (Peintre Celebre), and to the dam of G1 1000 Guineas winner Speciosa (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}). Classic is written all over his catalogue page, with English and Irish St. Leger winner Touching Wood (Roberto) also in the immediate female family. The dam, Tenderly, was acquired for 525,000 guineas by Andreas Jacobs at the 2008 Tattersalls December sale, carrying this colt, who was bred in Britain by Jacobs' Gestut Fahrhof. "He has a nice walk and a good temperament," said Stefan Ullrich, Fahrhof's stud manager. "Many people have come by to see him, because it's interesting for them to see an Unbridled's Song in this market."

**The Honor Roll...**

Michael Paulson accepted on behalf of Azeri. After reminiscing about her racetrack highlights and acknowledging the accomplishments of his father, Allen Paulson, who bred two Hall of Famers [Horse of the Year Cigar is the other] during just 15 years in the business, he added, "Thank you for honoring and immortalizing Azeri." At the podium to accept the plaque for Best Pal, Larry Mabee, the son of the great gelding's owner/breeders Mr. and Mrs. John C. Mabee, was choked up as he said, "The only thing missing is my mom and dad--they would've been so proud to have this event happen, to be here. They loved their horses." As for Best Pal, Mabee recalled, "He was tough, mean, ornery--you didn't want to turn your back on him in the barn. But when he was on the track, he knew what his job was. He was there to run, he was there to win, every time he could." Fasig-Tipton's Terence Collier, a longtime associate of the late Prince Ahmed Salman, was first to talk about The Thoroughbred Corp.'s Point Given, recounting events after "The Big Red Train" lost the 2001 Kentucky Derby as the 9-5 favorite. After spending an hour rehashing the loss at a Louisville nightspot, the Prince had had enough, and left the table to go chat to some people standing at the bar. He asked the young crowd how they had fared at the track that day and, as it turned out, all had lost money on the Prince's Derby favorite. The Prince pulled out his bankroll and went about making up what the colt had cost them. Point Given's trainer, Bob Baffert, also had fond memories of the Prince. "That was a dream job for a trainer," Baffert said. "The Prince had a passion for horses and deep pockets." The two had a falling out that briefly cost Baffert that job, but he got a call in December of 1999 inviting back into the fold. A Hall of Famer himself, Baffert had his choice of the yearlings in The Thoroughbred Corp.'s string that winter, and Point Given was number two on the list. "My first choice never broke his maiden, but we're not going to talk about him today," Baffert quipped. As for Point Given, he said, "In my mind, he very well could be the best horse I've ever trained." Last to speak were the two new Hall of fame riders. Don Pierce was introduced by long-time friend and fellow Hall denizen John Rotz.

When it was his turn at the mic, Pierce took a moment to collect himself, then said with a grin, "When I called and asked John to do this, he told me, 'I can't think of anything good to say about you, Pierce.'" But I thought he did a pretty good job today." He continued, "I never imagined, when I was 12 years old and riding match races in Oregon and Northern California at the county fairs while wearing Levis and tennis shoes, that it would lead to something like this. I am very honored." Randy Romero was last on the dais. He thanked a long list of family, most especially his wife, Cricket, as well as friends, and all of the horsemen that had helped him along the way. He also gave a nod to the medical professionals. "I want to thank all my doctors--I probably had about 50 of them," he admitted with a laugh before adding, "They put me together so I could go out there and ride the next race." 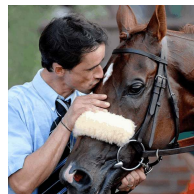

Interactif returned over \$33 when landing this track's GIII With Anticipation S. last summer before following up with an even-money tally in Keeneland's GIII Bourbon S. Oct. 11. Third, beaten under a length in the GII Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf Nov. 7, the homebred got the rest of the year off, returning to miss by a nose in Gulfstream's Hallandale Beach S. Feb. 7. Given a crack to establish Triple Crown credentials, the bay was second by a half-length to Sidney's Candy (Candy Ride {Arg}) in the GII San Felipe S. Mar. 13, but was no menace when fourth as the chalk in the GI Toyota Blue Grass S. Apr. 10 and was off the Derby trail. Interactif resurfaced in the GI Belmont S. June 5, finishing seventh-placed sixth through disqualification—and most recently made his return to the spinach, running divisional leader Paddy O'Prado (El Prado {Ire}) to 1 1/2 lengths when runner-up in the GII Virginia Derby July 17. Krypton took the early advantage here, having a look at the grandstand while racing on his right lead, but conceded the lead to a fired-up Paris Vegas (Maria's Mon), who took the field into the backstretch. Krypton took back in second, while Interactif was always in touch from third. The repatriated Paris Vegas began to give way entering the stretch, and it was Krypton who got first run and set sail for the wire. But Interactif came to that one three wide and dueled briefly with the Kieran McLaughlin trainee before staving off a flying finish from Grand Rapport for the victory. "It was about trying to find the right spot for him. He's been ambitiously placed all year," commented winning conditioner Todd Pletcher. "He won his first stakes here on the turf last year. We wanted to get back on track and in the winner's circle." Interactif is likely to make his next appearance in the GI Jamaica S. at Belmont Park Oct. 9. **Expansion** seemed to transform into a new horse when switched from Kieran McLaughlin to Chad Brown last fall. He stepped straight into the graded ranks in the Nov. 7 GII Red Smith H. at Aqueduct off a series of optional-claiming tries, posting a decisive 1 1/4-length upset to end his four-year-old campaign. Off the board in two subsequent Grade II runs, Expansion was third in both the GI Manhattan H. at Belmont June 5 and the GI Man o' War S. July 10 last time, and will not have to face the likes of Gio Ponti (Tale of the Cat) and Winchester (Theatrical {Ire}) here. **Telling** shocked the racing world when he took last year's renewal of this event as the 33-1 longest shot on the board. He tracked a three-horse speed duel from fourth and got the jump on the rest of the field when the pacesetters tired late, getting to the wire two lengths in front as the deep closers ran on to pick up the rest of the pieces. There looks to be an abundance of early speed signed on once again, with **Marlang**, **Al Khali** and multiple Grade I winner **Marsh Side** all doing their best work on or near the pole position.

**Sidney's Candy** appeared to be California's main GI Kentucky Derby hope coming off impressive gate-to-wire wins in the GII San Vicente S., GII San Felipe S. and GI Santa Anita Derby, but the Craig homebred stopped badly to be 17th on the first Saturday in May after pressing the pace from the far-outside slot. The Derby took a lot out of the chestnut, and he did not return in the afternoon until the GII Swaps S. at Hollywood July 17, when he was upset by a head as the 1-5 choice in a four-horse field. Conditioner John Sadler will try the turf for the first time with his sophomore speedster, who shows a bullet six-furlong drill in 1:11.80 over the Del Mar sod six days ago in preparation. A pair of lightly raced sophomores with nice turf pedigrees could make some noise late if Sidney's Candy is softened up by **Macias**. **Leroy's Dynameaux** won the GIII Will Rogers S. as a 13-1 outsider by a neck last out at Hollywood June 20, and Irish-bred **Kid Edward** makes his stakes debut off of a 1 1/4-length course-and-distance allowance win here July 23.

He kind of looked like he was just in an open gallop pretty much from the 3/16ths pole, and then he squeezed him and he went out in :13 and out again in :14, and that's what we were looking for." In other Travers news, owner and trainer Leon Blusiewicz said that recent maiden winner **Admiral Alex** (Afleet Alex) remains on track for the 10-furlong event after working five furlongs in 1:02.67 Wednesday morning at the Spa. "It was just a maintenance work," Blusiewicz said. "He wanted to go. He went the last eighth in 11 and change. The further this horse goes, the better he will be. That's why I started racing him at two turns."

**Dar Re Mi Misses York...**

Lord Lloyd-Webber's **Dar Re Mi** (GB) (Singspiel {Ire}) was has been ruled out of Thursday's G1 Darley Yorkshire Oaks. Ten remained at yesterday's six-day stage. Forced to miss the G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth S. last month due to a foot problem, the triple Group 1-winning five-year-old has run out of time to defend her crown at York, and trainer John Gosden's Racing Secretary Peter Shoemark told *PA Sport*, "She lost a bit of time due to the foot abscess that caused her to miss the King George, and the Yorkshire Oaks has just come a bit too soon for her. She will now be aimed at the G1 Prix Vermeille at Longchamp [Sept. 12]." Last year's runner-up **Sariska** (GB) (Pivotal {GB}) is set to renew rivalry with arch-rival **Midday** (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}) in the 12-furlong contest, with the G1 English and Irish Oaks heroine **Snow Fairy** (Ire) (Intikhab) also engaged. Her trainer Ed Dunlop told *Racing Post* yesterday, "There is also the G1 St Leger [at Doncaster Sept. 11] and Vermeille under consideration. She came out of the race at The Curragh well, and is ready to go again after a bit of a break."

**Big Drama Getting a Break...**

With the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint the year-end objective, Harold Queen's **Big Drama** (Montbrook) will get 1 1/2 to two months off and is slated to make one additional start prior to racing's championship day at Churchill Downs Nov. 6. Aug. 8, where he found only Majesticperfection (Harlan's Holiday) too tough. Big Drama is back in the barn of David Fawkes after a carefree return from upstate New York. "He came back in good order," Fawkes told Daily Racing Form. "We were very pleased with his race on Sunday. He caught a monster--that winner is a very nice horse--and I thought he turned in a very gallant effort to be second." Explaining the rationale for a breather, Fawkes added, "It's a long, hot summer and he's had three hard races, so I think he deserves some time off right now," he said.

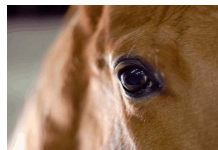
