

MAKFI HOLDS BACK THE GOLD RUSH

While much of the build-up to yesterday's G1 Prix Jacques le Marois at Deauville concentrated on the match between **Goldikova (Ire)** (Anabaa) and **Paco Boy (Ire)** (Desert Style {Ire}), it was **Makfi (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}) who tore up the script with a decisive victory to emulate his sire's success in this race five years ago. Disappointing when only seventh in the G1 St James's Palace S. at Royal Ascot last time June 15, Mathieu Offenstadt's G1 2000 Guineas hero had returned sick from that outing, but after being brought back to a peak by trainer Mikel Delzangles, rebounded with this career-high. Sent off at 22-5, Christophe Soumillon was content to settle the bay off the even pace set by Goldikova's pacemakers and proved the more effective over the testing ground in the final 150 meters to deny the favorite by 2 1/2 lengths. "Running him in the St James's Palace was a mistake, but we only found out afterwards that he had a bad throat infection," Delzangles said. "He's a very gifted horse and, of course, we couldn't be more delighted." **Cont. p2**

Makfi's story from Shadwell cast-off to Guineas hero is well-documented, but after his Royal Ascot debacle there were question marks over his ability to regain his position at the top of the miling tree. What was not under scrutiny was the obvious merit of his decisive beating of the star-studded Richard Hannon pair of Dick Turpin (Ire) (Arakan) and Canford Cliffs (Ire) (Tagula {Ire}) in that May 1 Newmarket Classic. He had also shown a marked ability to handle soft ground when putting over-matched rivals to the sword in the G3 Prix Djebel at Maisons-Laffitte Apr. 8 and that was certain to help as the downpour continued to grace Normandy. The weather had turned expectation into apprehension as far as Goldikova's legions of fans were concerned, with the memory of her one true below-par effort coming when Longchamp's ground had turned testing in last year's G1 Prix d'Isipahan. That lack of the usual supreme confidence in the Wertheimers' queen was reflected in her starting price drifting to 13-10 before the off, and the smart money was following Makfi, whose sire had a tendency to excel with give under-foot. Christophe Soumillon always had plenty of horse under him while buried in mid-pack, and when Goldikova was left in front with over two furlongs to run, he was happy to sit a bit longer. As she began to flounder on the surface, Makfi delivered a telling burst of acceleration to cut between her and Paco Boy and draw away for an authoritative success. "One can never be confident of beating Goldikova, but we were confident he was back in great form and that he would go on the ground," trainer Mikel Delzangles added. "He has also proved in the past that he handles a straight course. The plan is to now go for the G1 Prix du Moulin [at Longchamp Sept. 5] or the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. [at Ascot Sept. 25], but we could very well do both. Later on, we may also think about the G1 Breeders' Cup Mile."

Goldikova's trainer Freddy Head was not too down-cast after her first defeat at Deauville and said, "We can't make any excuses. She has confirmed form with Paco Boy, and when she moved on 1 1/2 furlongs out, I thought she'd win, but there is no doubt Makfi was a better horse on the day. Of course, we'll still target the G1 Breeders' Cup Mile, but we'll decide in time what her next race will be. Maybe she'll go for the G1 Prix du Moulin [at Longchamp Sept 5.] or the G1 Prix de la Foret [also at Longchamp Oct. 3]. We'll see." Paco Boy's jockey Richard Hughes said of the third-place finisher, "When I moved out I thought he'd win the race, but on that testing ground he didn't quite stay the mile." Godolphin have been supporters of Germany's best contests in recent years and were rewarded with more success here in a race weakened by the withdrawal of Weiner Walzer (Ger) (Dynaformer) due to ground conditions. Mostly a nearly horse in Britain's top contests, Campanologist had joined the stable's past stalwarts Cherry Mix (Fr) (Linamix {Fr}), Mutafaweq (Silver Hawk), Marienbard (Ire) (Caerleon), Kutub (Ire) (In the Wings {GB}) and Mamool (Ire) (In the Wings {GB}) in plundering a top-level race in this land when annexing the G1 Deutschland-Preis at Hamburg last time July 17. With unrelenting heavy rain preceding this edition and Adrie de Vries stepping in late for the ride on the eventual winner after Frankie Dettori got stuck in traffic, the portents were not strong. But in the end, it was plain sailing as he brought up the double. Left alone early to race away from the other four, the bay joined them before the first turn and settled into a swinging rhythm in fourth before winding up his challenge on the last bend. Sweeping past Zazou and into the lead approaching the quarter pole, he had shaken off that rival by the final furlong and was in control late on as Appel Au Maitre rallied to gain the silver medal. "We were a bit worried about the heavy going and how he would be able to handle it, but the jockey really gave him an excellent ride and all went well," Saeed bin Suroor commented. "He will now run in the G1 Grosser Preis von Baden [at Baden-Baden Sept. 5]." De Vries added, "I was very disappointed, as four of my rides for the day were scratched, but then things took a turn for the better. Campanologist was very relaxed and responded well. When I took him to the outside and asked for more, he quickly accelerated beautifully. He is a better stayer than Zazou." The five-year-old Wasted Tears, who won the 1 1/16-mile GII Jenny Wiley S. over Forever Together (Belong to Me) at Keeneland in April, hadn't raced since taking down the one-mile GIII Ouija Board H. at Lone Star May 31. Breaking alertly from post one, the dark bay was up to set sensible :23 3/5, :48 and 1:12 splits. Second choice Gotta Have Her made an inside bid as Lilly Fa Pootz challenged on the outside, but Wasted Tears kept on finding more and won the bob on the line over the latter. "You never know how things are going to work out," said owner/breeder/trainer Bart Evans. "That's why they run the races. I wasn't sure I was the winner until I saw the photo. We weren't sure about the distance and she had never raced beyond a mile and a sixteenth. So you don't know what the last sixteenth is going to be like." Evan said that he'd likely resist the urge to send her to the GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf. "That's a European-style race--a mile and three-eighths," he said. "That time of the year in Kentucky, you can't tell what you're going to get. Maybe some rain and then it comes up soft. That's a long race." Starlight Partner's Position Limit became the first graded stakes winner for her Grade I-winning freshman sire with this popular score. The dark bay was a 4-1 shot when she aired by 6 3/4 lengths in her debut over a muddy Belmont track July 14. Backed down to 3-2 favoritism this time, she settled in the second flight through opening splits of 21:72 and :45.07. She colored Alienation at the head of the stretch and sailed

home well in advance of a strung out field. "I thought it went very well," said trainer Todd Pletcher. "She was able to secure a good position and delivered a kick when needed. It was what we had hoped for. At the top of the stretch, I thought we had the momentum, and I would have been disappointed had she not

finished it off. We'll see how she comes out of this; right now she is likely for the GI Frizette S. [at Belmont Oct. 9]." Trainer Bob Baffert's Alienation, a first-out winner sprinting on the grass at Hollywood July 5, pressed the pace in her dirt debut. "She was a little late switching leads," said Baffert. "She's still learning how to run, but I think she handled the dirt all right. The winner is a good filly. It was a pretty fast pace, but [jockey Martin Garcia] didn't have a choice. We want to win, but I'm happy with her effort. She was the second choice and she came in second." Scalo hinted at a bright future when annexing Frankfurt's G3 Fruhjahrspreis des Bankhauses Metzler May 2 and Munich's G3 Bavarian Classic 22 days later over this trip and was an unlucky fifth when denied a run as the 4-5 favorite in the G2 Oppenheim-Union-Rennen here Cologne June 13. He looked to be given too much to do when a closing ninth from rear in the G1 Deutsches Derby at Hamburg last time July 18 and the homebred entered this contest still relatively unexposed. Settled in fifth early, the bay was under the shove on the home turn, but when angled wide responded with a surge to take him past Wealthy with a furlong remaining and onto a commanding success. "He had a nightmare trip in the German Derby last time and today we had the choice of this race or the G1 Rheinland-Pokal at Cologne, but we chose to come here so he could run against three-year-olds only," trainer Andreas Wohler commented. "I didn't really know how he'd handle the ground as progeny of Lando don't like it much, but his dam loved it so I figure he takes after his mother. I don't know where we'll go next, we just want to take our time and see how he comes out of this one first." Breaking from the two hole here, the dark bay tracked near the back of the pack as the filly Silent Wisper (Wando) opened a big lead. The field began to close in on the far turn, and it looked to be down to the two favorites, Stormy Lord and Cognashene, in upper stretch. But the latter began racing very greenly once put to Eurico da Silva's whip, veering out and then in again, while Stormy Lord began to get leg weary. Devil May Care Breezes for 'Bama Showdown...

Glencrest Farm's **Devil May Care** (Malibu Moon) turned in her final serious work in advance of Saturday's showdown with **Blind Luck** (Pollard's Vision) in the GI Betfair TVG Alabama S. at Saratoga. Breezing in company over the main track at Saratoga yesterday morning, the Todd Pletcher-trained filly went four furlongs in :48.34, the sixth-fastest of 55 moves at the distance. "She had an easy breeze last week, and we wanted to do a little more with her today, so we put her in company," explained Pletcher. "She was full of run throughout." Saturday's race is rife with championship implications, as Devil May Care has established herself as the best sophomore filly on the East Coast with consecutive wins in the GI Mother Goose S. at Belmont June 26 and in the GI Coaching Club American Oaks at the Spa July 24. The California-based Blind Luck, heroine of the GI Kentucky Oaks, got her nose down in the GII Delaware Oaks in her most recent July 10. "We're looking forward to the match-up," said Pletcher. "It's not a two-horse race, but you are putting the two most accomplished fillies on the racetrack, and ultimately, that's what everyone wants to see--the two best meeting each other. There's no better barometer than a head-to-head match-up." He added, "I have a tremendous amount of respect for Blind Luck. She's got that extra something special you like to see in a racehorse--that desire to win. She keeps finding a way to get there." Pletcher said he thought Devil May Care showed more maturity in the Coaching Club, where she drew off authoritatively, and admitted his charge has little room for error in the Alabama. "I do feel she is getting more professional and she's learning to polish her races off a little bit," he said. "She's had that tendency to make the lead and wait. That's why you have to be careful in a situation like [the Alabama], where you have a horse like Blind Luck that's relentless and keeps coming. You can't make mistakes; you can't get there and idle and let them catch you by surprise."

'Grace' Under Radar; Works for Alabama...

In other Alabama news, Fox Hill Farm's **Havre de Grace** (Saint Liam), who was nosed out at the wire by Blind Luck in the GII Delaware Oaks, worked six furlongs in 1:15 3/5 at Delaware. Trainer Tony Dutrow said the filly will ship to Saratoga today. "We're anxious to get her on the racetrack [Saturday] and see what happens," said Dutrow. "We'll see what the 1 1/4 miles and those two fillies up there have in store for her." Beaten by Saturday's GIII Monmouth Oaks heroine No Such Word (Canadian Frontier) by a long neck in the Go For Wand S. at Delaware June 5, Havre de Grace came back to run a back-up race in the Delaware Oaks, for which she was awarded a 114 BRIS figure. "We're hoping for the best," said Dutrow. "She's a lightly raced filly that's improving, and we can't help believing we have a top filly."

Trainer Dominick Schettino said Sunday that he will likely gallop GI Mother Goose runner-up **Connie and Michael** (Roman Ruler) into Saturday's Betfair TVG Alabama. "I'm probably not going to work her," said Schettino, "She's a little light. She doesn't keep a lot of weight. She gallops two to 2 1/2 miles a day over the Oklahoma track; that keeps her fit."

Trainer George Weaver knows he's asking a lot of **Tizahit** (Tiznow), but believes his filly is training well enough to take a shot. "It's a very tough race," Weaver said of the Jim and Susan Hill colorbearer, who is looking to recapture the form that saw her win the GII Demoiselle S. at Aqueduct last November. The dark bay is coming off a runner-up try in a nine-furlong allowance at Saratoga July 30 in her second start of the year. "I think she'll appreciate a mile and an eighth and longer distances," said Weaver. "She's a big, scopey filly, and the Alabama is one of the few races at a mile and a quarter." Weaver added, "She won the Demoiselle, so winning an allowance wouldn't do much for her. A two-other-than race is always available to us, whenever we want it."

Sidney's Candy Unlikely for Del Mar Derby...

Trainer John Sadler said that **Sidney's Candy** (Candy Ride {Arg}), who set a new course record at Del Mar with a smashing 5 1/2-length win in Saturday's GII La Jolla H., probably will not return for the GII Del Mar Derby Sept. 5. "That race was pretty fast, so I don't expect to bring him back again [this meet]," said Sadler while he watched the chestnut jog up and down the horse path near his barn. "He came back from the race in great shape, and he looks wonderful." Sidney's Candy covered the 1 1/16 miles of the La Jolla in 1:39.52. The previous course record was 1:39.67, set by Mea Domina (Dance Brightly) in the 2006 GII Palomar Breeders' Cup H. Sadler said he was nominating another

While Sidney's Candy will probably stay in the barn for the rest of the meet, the next three finishers behind him Saturday will be moving on to the Del Mar Derby. "Definitely, we're going on to the Derby," said Jim Cassidy of his runner-up, **Kid Edward (Ire)** (Singspiel {Ire}). "He ran a big race. He closed a lot of ground." Trainer Alexis Barba, whose **Alphie's Bet** (Tribal Rule) finished third; and Art Sherman's **Summer Movie** (Holy Bull), who ran fourth, are also expected to advance, according to the conditioners.

Workin for Hops Ready for Secretariat...

Workin for Hops (City Zip) turned in his final work for the Aug. 21 GI Secretariat S. with a five-furlong breeze in 1:01.40 over Arlington's synthetic main track Saturday. The track's head clocker Bobby Belpedio said of the drill, "It was a good, good work. He got the last quarter in :23 and then galloped out three-quarters in 1:14.40." The chestnut will seek to become the fourth horse to sweep Arlington's Mid-America Triple for three-year-olds over the sod, consisting of the Arlington Classic S. May 22, GII American Derby July 17 and the Secretariat. He was second behind expected Secretariat favorite Paddy O'Prado (El Prado {Ire}) in the GII Colonial Turf Cup S. June 19. Hilary Pridham, Michael Stidham's assistant trainer who rode Workin for Hops Saturday, said that the Colonial Turf Cup winner is the only rival standing in the way of Mid-America Triple glory. "Now, all we have to do is hold off that big gray monster that is coming to face us," she said.

Boosted by a timely update, Dubawi is also represented by Makfi (GB) took yesterday's G1 Prix Jacques le Marois at Deauville racecourse a few hours before the sale. Leading the ladies yesterday was another yearling by the Darley resident, **Lot 267**, who was the third highest priced lot of the evening. Out of MSW and MGSP Lucky Lune (Fr) (Priolo), the Mar. 3 foal, offered by Haras de la Louviere, was purchased for €140,000 by South-West based trainer Francois Rohaut. Also surpassing the €150,000 mark was **Lot 215**, a colt by freshman sire Dutch Art (GB) (Medicean {GB}). Consigned by Knocktoran Stud, the Feb. 8 foal fetched €180,000 from Sir Robert Ogden. He is the first foal out of Zut Alors (Ire) (Pivotal), who was third in the G3 Prix Miesque.

The average price on the third day of trade fell seven percent to €72,758 from 2009, while median increased from €60,000 to €65,000. The clearance rate was down from 73 percent in 2009 to 68 percent this year.

"We are satisfied about [Sunday]'s average, however, the market was very selective as reflected in the lower clearance rate," Eric Hoyeau commented. "Overall, we seem to be returning to the sort of figures that we saw in 2007, which is not so bad. The main issue though is that this year's yearlings were produced off high nominations' fees. It will be interesting to see how [today]'s session unfolds as the vast majority of yearlings on offer will be eligible for the French premiums, which seems to have been a key factor so far."

NEW ERA AT ARQANA

Sales company executives set the tone for how business is conducted in their own backyard, and it is significant for Thoroughbred buyers and sellers visiting Deauville this week that Arqana President Eric Hoyer believes that "buying horses should be a pleasure."

"We try to provide the maximum service to all buyers and vendors," Hoyer said.

Arqana, which completed the third day of its four-day Deauville yearling sale Sunday, is in the midst of renovating the Elie de Brignac sales complex, which lies within walking distance of the Deauville racecourse and is just a quick jaunt away from the Normandy beach side. When completed, the sale complex will be a new jewel in the crown of Arqana's Deauville "sales paradise."

The sale company began by refurbishing stables and other facilities, and now is extending the back of the pavilion and will open a new panoramic restaurant by the December breeding stock sale. Following the breeding stock sale, work will begin inside the pavilion, which currently has a dated look.

"The sale pavilion was built 40 years ago, and now we are building for the next 40 years," said Hoyer, who likened the sale to the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga select auction, a boutique marketplace for discerning shoppers who like to visit the resort city of Deauville during the peak racing season.

Entertainment & Accommodation, Deauville Style...

To further assist and cater to buyers and vendors, Arqana provides customers the use of bicycles to use around the busy streets of Deauville, which are packed with both domestic and foreign tourists during the summer's high season. Some of racing's most well known figures have been occasionally seen biking through Deauville on a quick errand, although others prefer to have a hired driver and car waiting.

Some guests have been entertained at a nearby older home owned by Arqana called the 'Villa Pegase' after the flying mythological horse Pegasus. The quaint house stands just across the street from the famous Villa Strassburger, which was owned by American breeder R. B. Strassburger, and which has become a Deauville symbol of the *Belle Epoque* (Beautiful Era). Strassburger purchased the villa from Baron Henri de Rothschild and also operated Haras de Monceaux about 18 miles away in Lisieux. Near to the villas are more colorful examples of everyday life in Deauville, including two restaurants clearly catering to the racing crowd-one named The Yearling and the other called Le Pur Sang (The Thoroughbred). **Cont. p11**

Special events also supply untold entertainment. Before the yearling sale began, jockeys, family members of trainers and riders, and racing journalists competed in a series of "races" aboard donkeys to raise money for charity. Sponsors pay to have their names associated with certain donkeys, and the riders have great fun trying to urge the sometimes bucking and sometimes obstinate equines through the sand on a racing strip set up near the sea. This year's competitors in the 13th annual Deauville 'Donkey Derby' included such major French racing stars as Olivier Peslier, Christophe Soumillon and Thierry Gillet. Soumillon won one of the races and thus probably is the only major international rider in the world who can claim Group 1 success this year, including his triumph aboard Makfi at Deauville on Sunday over Goldikova (Fr) in the Haras Fresnay-le-Buffard Jacques Le Marois, along with a steeplechase stakes win and a victory aboard a donkey.

Toast of the Town...

Another way French officials are attempting to make buying horses a pleasure at Deauville is with a Thank You gift of champagne for purchases in the upper echelon. The French Racing and Breeding Committee provides certificates for complimentary bottles of champagne to buyers who purchase yearlings for €150,000 during the first two days of the August sale, which feature international pedigrees. During the following two days, buyers of horses for at least €100,000 receive the certificates. Buyers then can proceed to the restaurant in the sale pavilion, obtain the champagne and toast their luck with their purchases.

Even when sales are not at their peak, the French believe in toasting life with champagne. Following the end of the two select days of the Deauville sale, the team that had presented the horses for Marc de Chambure's Haras d'Etreham--last year's top consignor at Deauville--gathered in the farm's yard on the sale grounds for a group photo and to pop the corks on multiple bottles. There was an air of celebration, even though one of the farm's best horses in this year's consignment--a filly by Green Desert--had gone unsold on a bid of €520,000. De Chambure invited a passerby to join in the celebration as the sun began to set. As much as buying horses in Deauville can be a pleasure, they showed how every moment of selling outstanding yearlings--even in a troubled economy--can also be savored.

Our final full day was just as wonderful as they all have been. The most memorable part of today was the show of bravery by Goldikova, in that she didn't like the bottomless ground, in my opinion, but she drove on anyway. GARY STEVENS INJURED WORKING HORSE

AT SPA Retired Hall of Fame rider Gary Stevens fractured his left collarbone Sunday morning when a two-year-old he was working for Todd Pletcher collapsed. The filly, Thatcatismine (Mineshaft), suffered from an apparent heart attack or ruptured aorta and died instantly. Stevens eventually got up under his own power, but was later examined at the Albany Medical Center where the fracture was discovered. "[It's a] clean break," Stevens told *Daily Racing Form*. "It doesn't need any surgery or anything; just hurts like a sun of a gun." Stevens had been working horses in the morning for Pletcher during the Churchill Downs spring meet and had also gotten on horses at Del Mar this summer. "I hate going to the gym, and I like staying fit," the winner of 4,888 races explained. He was scheduled to ride in a parimutuel race at Arlington Park on Friday where five retired riders were set to oppose five current Arlington jockeys, but Stevens will be forced to cancel.
