KANTHAROS DOMINATES AGAIN

Kantharos (Lion Heart) continued his dominating march through the juvenile division with an effortless 7 1/4-length victory in Monday's GII Saratoga Special S.

at Saratoga. The chestnut colt, already with a pair of decisive victories just two starts into his young career, settled in third as **Blue Right By** (Bluegrass Cat) cut out the early fractions. He shadowed **Bail Out the Cat** (Tale of the Cat) as that rival moved to the fore midway on the bend and loomed an ominous presence into the stretch. Bail Out the Cat tried to make a race of it under a vigorous Alan Garcia drive, but Kantharos forged to the front under a Garrett Gomez hand ride.

He quickly opened up a clear advantage and was under wraps to the wire, completing the 6 1/2 furlongs over a muddy track in 1:18 3/5. "You like a horse a lot, and like how he's doing, but it's the variables you have no control over," admitted winning trainer Steve Asmussen. "Garrett said it took him awhile to get into it--he thought he was cautious going over the track when he was warming up. He said that during first 50 yards he wasn't on the bridle much at all, but after he went a little ways he got into himself. I thought that he came into the stretch well. He hesitated a little bit when he first left [Bail Out the Cat], but late he really looked good and smooth and like he'll go further, which is what everybody wants to know right now." Gomez, who inherited the mount from the injured Robby Albarado, added, "If you watch his first two races, this is probably an identical re-run of both. I just tried to sit up there, be the best passenger and stay out of his way to let him do his job. He seemed like he handled the mud OK, and he ran fast enough. He's a nice colt, and I'd like to get on him again." **Cont. p2**

A WAKE-UP CALL

Aidan O'Brien has made no secret of the fact that he has taken the gently-gently approach with **Rip Van Winkle (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) so far this year, but the gloves will be off today as Susan Magnier's star turn takes to York's Knavesmire for the G1 Juddmonte International S. Reportedly not fully wound up when sixth in the G1 Queen Anne S. June 15, last year's G1 Sussex S. and G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. winner fared better last time when runner-up to Canford

Cliffs (Ire) (Tagula {Ire}) in the latest renewal of the Sussex July 28. "We were delighted with his last run, and he has taken a bit longer to get fit, as he did well over the winter," the Ballydoyle conditioner explained yesterday. "He's a horse that has always shown loads of speed, but we felt as the year went on he would progress, and this race comes up nicely. He's a big cruiser who quickens up very well, so is very versatile." Khalid Abdullah has yet to win this race he has sponsored since 1989, but in **Byword** and **Twice Over** he has two formidable shots at this year's title. Trained in turn by the established masters Andre Fabre and Henry Cecil, they were first and second, respectively, in the G1 Prince of Wales's S. June 16. A half length separated them on that occasion, with Byword getting a clear run and the subsequent July 3 G1 Eclipse hero Twice Over arriving late from a compromising position. **Cont. p2**

Kantharos was tabbed a ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ with an impressive 11 3/4-length debut win over five furlongs at Churchill May 13 and added a 9 1/2-length tally in the six-furlong GIII Bashford Manor S. last time out July 3. Asmussen is already looking ahead. "What he's done at these sprint distances is very impressive and brilliant, but we want to be greedy and get a little bit more," he said.

Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe has a hunch that Byword has something up his sleeve. "We've always had a great opinion of him, and this year he has done nothing but come on and improve," said Grimthorpe. "At Ascot, he traveled so well and put that race to bed, and although you could say that Twice Over was a bit unlucky, I think Byword has a little bit more." Cecil, whose Royal Anthem was the last to fly the flag for Warren Place 11 years ago, is making the right noises about his beloved Twice Over. "I've been really pleased with him, and he's working very well," said Cecil. "He didn't get a very good run at Royal Ascot, and we'll learn a lot more [here]. But Byword is a formidable horse and he'll take a lot of beating. He did well at Sandown [in the Eclipse], because it's a stiff track and he killed off the opposition two furlongs out, and it was a long way up that hill. He does like a bit of give in the ground, and there is no reason why he shouldn't run well at York." Richard Hannon bids to continue a rich streak with John Manley's supplemented **Dick Turpin (Ire)** (Arakan). The colt offers little hope on pedigree that he will stay this trip, but he has an abundance of talent, as he showed when handing Siyouni (Fr) (Pivotal {GB}) a four-length beating in Chantilly's G1 Prix Jean Prat over a mile last time July 4. "He enjoys a bit of cut, and they have had 12.4 millimetres of rain at the Knavesmire since Thursday, which has removed any firm bits from the going report," Hannon said. "Obviously, there are doubts about him staying on pedigree, but Hughesie [jockey Richard Hughes] reckons that they were beaten for speed in the French 2000 Guineas, and he will be ridden more conservatively here." Godolphin saddle two outsiders in **Cavalryman** and **Cutlass Bay**, and although both have disappointed against high-class rivals recently, they have made an impact at this level before, with the former taking last year's G1 Grand Prix de Paris and the latter the G1 Prix Ganay at Longchamp May 2.

RACETRACK ROUND-UP

Rachel Works Well at Spa...

Reigning Horse of the Year **Rachel Alexandra** (Medaglia d'Oro) turned in a strong six-furlong work Monday morning over the Saratoga main track, stopping the clock in 1:13 1/5 and galloping out in 1:25 4/5 for seven furlongs and 1:39 flat for a mile under Shaun Bridgmohan. "I thought she did really well," said conditioner Steve Asmussen. "Shaun did a great job with her away from the pole. She settled in nicely. It was a nice, solid, strong work, with a very big gallop-out, ideal for the mile and a quarter that she is pointed towards." The four-year-old is scheduled to make her next afternoon appearance in the GI Personal Ensign S. at the Spa on Aug. 29. It will be her first try at the Classic distance of 10 furlongs. Asmussen added, "She was off [the first furlong] in :13, then she came off the bridle for him, very relaxed, her ears forward, stuck in a bunch of :12 and changes, came home just a tad better the last quarter, and her gallop-out was strong. That rhythm, because of the 1 1/4 miles, is what we were looking for. That's where she is... I feel she is more relaxed in the middle of her works than she was last year." Rachel Alexandra is coming off strong wins in the June 12 GII Fleur de Lis H. and July 24 Lady's Secret S. after kicking off her 2010 campaign with back-to-back disappointing seconds in the New Orleans Ladies S. and GII La Troienne S. Alabama Hopefuls Work

G1 Kentucky Oaks winner **Blind Luck** (Pollard's Vision) led a trio of fillies tuning up yesterday for Saturday's G1 Alabama S. at Saratoga. Working over Del Mar's Polytrack surface, Blind Luck went four furlongs in :49.00--22nd of 46 works at the distance. "She went just fine," reported trainer Jerry Hollendorfer. "We were very pleased with the workout." The sophomore filly is expected to ship to Saratoga today. Also working for the Alabama, **Acting Happy** (Empire Maker) went five furlongs at Saratoga yesterday in 1:02.64 under jockey Jose Lezcano. "I was very happy with her work," said trainer Rick Dutrow, Jr. Winner of the May 14 GII Black-Eyed Susan S., Jay Em Ess Stable's Acting Happy is coming off a third-place effort behind fellow Alabama contender **Devil May Care** (Malibu Moon) in the July 24 GI Coaching Club American Oaks. **Connie and Michael** (Roman Ruler), second behind Devil May Care in the July 26 GI Mother Goose S., went five furlongs over the Oklahoma training track yesterday in 1:01.05. "It was a spur of the moment work," reported Anthony Bonomo, Jr., assistant to trainer Dominick Schettino. "We felt coming into the race, we wanted to see where she was at with her fitness. We were proud of the way she went. She came back to the barn with no problems." The Alabama will be Connie and Michael's first start for Schettino. The filly was previously trained by Ken McPeck.

St. Nick Back Soon

Derrick Smith's **St Nicholas Abbey (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}) could be back on the track next month, Aidan O'Brien revealed yesterday. Off since sustaining a muscle injury on the eve of the G1 Epsom Derby, last year's G1 Racing Post Trophy winner and champion two-year-old is back in light work, according to the Ballydoyle conditioner. "He's in good form and has been cantering for a couple of weeks now," O'Brien said. "He's always been very natural and didn't take a lot of work, so in the next week or two, we'll be looking for a race for him and see when we are going to start him back. He could be out in a month to six weeks, but until his work steps up, we won't know." O'Brien also had news of his G1 Irish Champion S. hopefuls **Fame and Glory (GB)** (Montjeu {Ire}) and **Cape Blanco (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}). "We are taking it one race at a time with Fame and Glory, but it will be either the Irish Champion [at Leopardstown Sept. 4] or the G2 Prix Niel [at Longchamp Sept. 12] and, at the moment, our eyes are on the Irish Champion," O'Brien added. "That can change if we need it to nearer the time, but that race works in nicely with the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe [at Longchamp Oct. 3]. Cape Blanco seemed to come out of the King George well, and it is possible it will be the Irish Champion for him as well. That's what we are looking at at the moment--it won't be an easy decision for Johnny [Murtagh] to make."

O'Brien also confirmed that last Sunday's G1 Phoenix S. scorer **Zoffany (Ire)** (Dansili {GB}) is heading for the G1 Vincent O'Brien National S. at The Curragh Sept. 11. "He's getting heavier all the time, so at the moment we are looking at going to the National S. with him," he remarked.

Midas Touch returns after a break since his second in the G1 Irish Derby at The Curragh June 27, but carries a penalty for his prior success in Leopardstown's G2 Derrinstown Stud Derby Trial S. May 9. He had the other penalized runner **Monterosso** back in fourth in the mile-and-a-half Curragh Classic, and should be able to confirm that form. He has ground to make up on **Rewilding**, as he was two places behind that rival when fifth in the June 5 G1 Epsom Derby. "He's a straightforward, honest horse, and he's had a little rest and is ready to start back," commented trainer Aidan O'Brien, who also saddles **Joshua Tree** on his first start since winning Ascot's G2 Royal Lodge S. 11 months ago. "Joshua Tree just had a few little things in the spring which held him up, and he's just ready to start back," O'Brien continued. "He's a lovely horse, and he could be anything, but even though he's been doing everything easily at home, he will step up a good bit on this, as he's carrying a bit of condition. Midas Touch is the more forward horse."

Before Epsom, Rewilding had finished runner-up to Planteur (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) in the Apr. 11 G2 Prix Noailles at Longchamp, and scored with authority in Goodwood's Listed Cocked Hat S. May 19, and he remains a colt of serious potential. "Rewilding is in good form at the moment, and I think that he has improved since the Investec Derby," conditioner Mahmood Al Zarooni commented. "He didn't quite cope with the course at Epsom, and he also didn't look too comfortable when he won at Goodwood, so I am hopeful that a course like York will play to his strengths. It is going to be a tough race to win, and it looks like a very strong renewal, but I am looking to see Rewilding run a big race." **Total Command**, who was third in the G3 Queen's Vase at Royal Ascot when last seen June 18, is a full-brother to Quiff (GB), who was so impressive when taking the G1 Yorkshire Oaks here six years ago. "Total Command probably didn't quite stay in the Queen's Vase at Royal Ascot, and this hopefully will be a good prep race for him," Khalid Abdullah's Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe told *PA Sport*. "The [Sept. 11] St Leger is his aim, and this is as good a trial as any for the Classic."

Dream Ahead could hardly have been more impressive when winning a six-furlong Nottingham maiden by nine lengths on debut July 16, and carries great expectations into this race from trainer David Simcock. "The run has done him the world of good and, mentally, he's grown up an awful lot," Simcock said. "He'll have no problem getting seven furlongs. I've had some decent horses, but nothing like him." Aidan O'Brien puts forward **Lake Ontario**, who also looked a colt going places when recording a five-length success over this trip at Naas last time Aug. 2. "He won very easily at Naas, and he had improved a lot from his first run to his second," the Ballydoyle conditioner said. "He's a lovely moving horse with a good temperament, and we think and hope that he has progressed since. We hope the ground stays nice, and if it got soft it would be a worry."

A filly by Elusive City topped the fourth and final day of selling at the Arqana August Yearling Sale in Deauville. Sir Robert Ogden secured the French-bred

full-sister to the SP sophomore Mister Hughie (Ire) for €190,000. Haras de Grandcamp consigned the filly, produced by the SP Bonne Nere (Fr) (Stepneyev {Ire}), as Lot 339.

The top price for a colt Monday was the €100,000 Valerie Dissaux paid for Lot 473, a son of the red-hot Dubawi (Ire). Unsold in

the ring, but acquired by Dissaux privately soon after, the colt was offered by Haras du Petit Tellier (Patrick Chedeville). He was produced by the 15-year-old Summer Dance (Fr) (Machiavellian), who has also produced the SP Summer Princesse (Fr) (Desert Prince {Ire}).

The sale closed with a substantial drop in average, due mostly to reduced demand at the top of the market. A total of 289 lots sold for an average of €94,145, a 17.2 percent decline from a year ago. Cumulative median maintained well, however, with the median of €70,000 down just 2.8 percent. Arqana President Eric Hoyer commented on the results.

“The top tier of the market has suffered the most, through the combined effects of a drop in the amounts that buyers are willing to spend on top-class yearlings, and reduced competition at the highest level resulting from the absence of several leading players,” he said. “However, the core market has remained very solid, with genuine depth up to €400,000, as we saw on the second day of the sale. The lower end of the market did OK, but proved very selective, with buyers preferring to go home empty-handed rather than purchase a horse that didn’t tick all the boxes. I would like to thank all vendors and buyers for their support, especially in the current economy, and wish them the very best of luck with their purchases.”

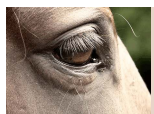

In his Vinery days, Ben Walden Jr. acquired an enviable reputation for being able to turn comparatively base metal into gold. This reputation largely reflected his success with Red Ransom, who arrived at Vinery to stand at only \$7,500, after injury had prevented him from fulfilling his enormous promise. Red Ransom's fee was to rise as high as \$75,000.

Could it be that Walden has worked his alchemy again with Bellamy Road, one of the three stallions based at Walden's latest venture, Pauls Mill near Versailles?

From his first 16 runners, Bellamy Road has been represented by Embellished, winner of the Princess Margaret S. at Northlands Park in July, and Position Limit, who kept her unbeaten record in fine style in the GII Adirondack S.

I hesitate to describe Bellamy Road as base metal, but he certainly wasn't born with the proverbial silver spoon in his mouth. Bred in Florida, he was the product of a \$3,500 season to Concerto, a stallion who lacked a Grade I performance during a very rewarding and consistent career. Concerto still commands the same fee at Ocala Stud, but has only three American graded winners among his total of well over 300 foals aged three or more, with much of his success having come in Puerto Rico and Jamaica.

Bellamy Road, though, has always been an exception to the rule. The yearlings from Concerto's 2002 crop achieved a median of only \$2,200, but they were more popular at the two-year-old sales, where the median rose to \$19,000. Bellamy Road became the highest-priced member of this crop when George Steinbrenner III's Kinsman Stud Farm paid \$87,000 for him at Ocala. It's such a shame that Steinbrenner, who bred and raced Concerto, died just before Bellamy Road's first runners started to make their mark at stakes level. **Cont. p9**

The story goes that Bellamy Road was purchased on the advice of Edward Sexton, who broke the youngster during the time he was employed at Ocala Stud, before being appointed farm manager at Kinsman.

“He was a big, gangly, rangy two-year-old,” Sexton once recalled, “but I had an advantage, having ridden him. When you sat on him, you knew right away the gears were there. From day one, he was hitting switches. He was so push-button and did everything so easily. Nothing was too much for him.”

Bellamy Road was to provide his owner with some of his biggest thrills, but also one of his biggest disappointments.

Entrusted to Michael Dickinson, Bellamy Road displayed his considerable potential in a six-furlong maiden special weight event at Delaware Park a few months after his purchase. He had more than seven lengths to spare on that occasion, and this easy victory earned him a place in the Miller Genuine Draft Cradle S. at River Downs in September. The Concerto colt again wasn't hard pressed to win this Grade III contest after leading throughout.

Unfortunately, Bellamy Road's two-year-old campaign ended with a disappointing effort as favorite for the GI Breeders' Futurity at Keeneland. He reportedly came out of the race with some minor physical problems. As Steinbrenner had told Sexton that the one thing he wanted to do before he died was win the Kentucky Derby, Bellamy Road was transferred to Nick Zito, winner of the race with Strike the Gold and Go for Gin.

Bellamy Road got back onto the Kentucky Derby trail with a nearly 16-length victory in a Gulfstream Park allowance over a mile, and was then simply sensational in the Wood Memorial, over a mile and an eighth. He recorded a 119 Beyer figure as he shook off a strong headwind to score by 17 1/2 lengths, equalling the track record of 1:47.16.

This freewheeling effort made Bellamy Road favorite ahead of Afleet Alex and Bandini for the Derby. Drawn out in the 16 box, he didn't make it into the lead until they entered the stretch. Hardly had he done so, though, than he started to weaken, and he came home only seventh behind Giacomo.

A popped splint put Bellamy Road on the sidelines, and it was the Travers before he was seen again. In the circumstances, the colt ran well in finishing second to Flower Alley. The compilers of the 2005 World Rankings rated him 120, the joint-third-best dirt three-year-old behind Afleet Alex and Flower Alley.

Apparently, the colt was returned to Kinsman to be rested prior to a four-year-old campaign, but he never made it back to the races. Walden commented, “Few horses enter stud that were as athletically gifted as Bellamy Road. His New York track record was accomplished in a hand ride by over 17 lengths.”

Zito, for his part, said, “The two best horses I ever trained were Unbridled's Song and Bellamy Road.”

Although Bellamy Road's blank four-year-old season meant that it was nearly two years since his Wood Memorial display by the time he covered his first mares, recollections of his stunning effort remained strong enough for him to attract 137 mares, for a crop of 95.

However, as so often happens these days, demand fell in the next two years, with a book of 90 in 2008 being followed by 50 mares in 2009. Bellamy Road is therefore not going to find it easy to build on his bright start, but his first crop is big enough to give him every chance of showing what he can do.

The interesting aspect of Position Limit's pedigree is that Bellamy Road's fourth dam, the Damascus mare Arabian Dancer, also appears in the bottom half of her pedigree as the dam of Position Limit's broodmare sire, Out of Place. Arabian Dancer--runner-up in the GI Matron S.--was a very well-connected mare. Her dam was Buckpasser's daughter Ten Cents A Dance, which made Arabian Dancer a half-sister to that excellent racemare Versailles Treaty. This multiple Grade I winner was by the great Danzig, the great-grandsire of Bellamy Road.

Ten Cents A Dance was herself a half-sister to the top-class General Assembly, and her second dam was that outstanding broodmare Exclusive, dam of the dual champion sire Exclusive Native. This family has been the source of numerous good winners, including Chief Honcho, the GI Brooklyn H. winner who was sired by Bellamy Road's grandsire Chief's Crown. As there's no reason why Position Limit shouldn't appreciate longer routes, she should continue to draw attention to her interesting young sire.

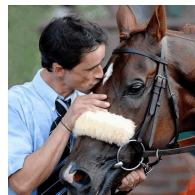

Suffolk Announces Purse Reductions:

Suffolk Downs has announced it will reduce average daily purses by 26 percent for the second half of its current meeting. The reduction will move purses from the current average of \$89,000 per day to an average of \$66,000 per day, saving the track \$1 million for the remainder of the 100-day meet. "Ownership has invested several million dollars over the last few years in an effort to support local horsemen and enhance our racing product," Suffolk Downs' chairman Bill Mulrow said in a statement. "As economic and business conditions worsen, we are faced with difficult decisions as we strive to preserve our current workforce. We understand that this reduction will cause difficulty for the horsemen and horsewomen who have supported our racing program and we appreciate their perseverance." In the same statement, Al Balestra, president of the New England Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association, said, "This reduction will have a significant negative impact on our more than 800 members as we strive to preserve the Thoroughbred racing and breeding industry in New England and all the related agri-business and economic benefits it provides. It will clearly cost jobs on the Suffolk Downs' backstretch and at Massachusetts farms and suppliers and my concern is that this will force more of our members to leave here to race in Pennsylvania, Delaware, New York, West Virginia and other states that have the benefit of expanded gaming at their racetracks." Suffolk officials are expecting to operate at a substantial deficit in 2010 despite the purse reduction and more cost-saving measures are expected.
