All the drama came late in yesterday's G1 Juddmonte International, with **Rip Van Winkle (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) swooping on the sponsor's pair **Twice Over (GB)** (Ob-

servatory) and **Byword (GB)** (Peintre Celebre) in the shade of the post in a pulsating renewal of the York feature. Sent off the 7-4 favorite on the back of a second in Goodwood's G1 Sussex S. last time July 28, Susan Magnier's four-year-old was game in the chase as Twice Over finally got the better of Byword in the final furlong, with Johnny Murtagh delivering the

knock-out blow in the final two strides. A half-length separated the first two, with 3/4 of a length back to Byword. "I love this horse," Murtagh said. "He didn't show his true worth in last year's Guineas and Derby, but he showed when he won his two Group 1s last year what a champion he was. He didn't run his race in America, but I think he's a great horse, and he comes through anything and always seems to pull it out when it matters." Cont. p2

TEAM VALOR PURCHASES LION HEART FILLY

Valiant Passion (Lion Heart--Bold American, by Quiet American), a runaway 9 1/4-length debut winner at the Spa Aug. 12 ([video](#)), has been purchased privately by Team Valor International. Co-owned by Barry Berkelhammer and trainer Ralph Nicks, the \$11,000 KEESep yearling lit up the Saratoga tote board at 30-1.

The juvenile filly has been transferred to Todd Pletcher and will be pointed toward the G1 Spinaway S. Sept. 5. Steve Castagnola of Kempton Bloodstock represented

the sellers in the transaction. "I like how easy a mover she is and how long she is in her body and neck," Team Valor head Barry Irwin told TDN. "She is not the tallest of fillies, but she has a good length of rein. Todd Pletcher liked the way she galloped out. We think she has a good shot to run long. I think this filly could be in the same league as [G1 Santa Anita Oaks heroine] Golden Ballet (Moscow Ballet) and [G1 Spinaway S. winner] Cashier's Dream (Service Stripe), the two best American-based fillies we've raced."

Rip Van Winkle was always held in the highest esteem at Ballydoyle, and the natural speed and ability he displayed from his early days on the gallops helped him garner Leopardstown's G3 Tyros S. and run an eye-catching race just out of the placings in the G1 Dewhurst S. during his juvenile campaign. As Sea the Stars (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}) was flashing his boundless talent at Newmarket and Epsom, Rip Van Winkle was lurking behind, and it was the Tsui goliath who was again in control in their first major face-off in Sandown's Eclipse in July. Despite fine efforts in defeat, Rip Van Winkle's well-documented foot problems cast a lengthy shadow and arose again at the 11th hour prior to his first top-level success in the Sussex last July. He backed up that imperious performance with another Group 1 in Ascot's Queen Elizabeth II S. in September, but was notably below-par when trailing behind Zenyatta in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Santa Anita in November. All reports prior to his comeback in Royal Ascot's G1 Queen Anne S. suggested a lack of fireworks, and that was the case as he faded out of contention to be sixth there June 15, but in making Canford Cliffs (Ire) (Tagula {Ire}) stretch in the latest renewal of the Sussex, he had signaled a return to the big league.

Keen here early off the steady-building tempo, the bay eventually settled in a wide sixth and was on the heels of Byword as his rider Maxime Guyon tried to steal a march in early stretch. Rip Van Winkle seemed flat-footed as Tom Queally and Twice Over appeared a bigger threat to Byword, but all he needed was time to find his stride, and, when the surge came, it was enough to deny the gallant runner-up a hard-earned victory. "Aidan had a plan to take it a bit slower with him this year and there are a lot of big races coming up at the end of the year, so we want to have him fresh and well," Murtagh explained. "I probably went too fast on him at Ascot and I was very happy with him last time, but today my one worry was the pace of the race, and he overcame it. He's such a brilliant mover and covers so much ground that over a mile you can use that to kill horses, but no horse can keep running that hard and fast all season, so it was nice to give him a little chance today. He only had to run for a furlong and a half, so I think he'll improve again, as he was still a bit rusty today. When they kick, he doesn't have instant acceleration, but when he gets into top gear he hits the line really well and was always going to get there. I was trying to give him as easy a race as possible to win and not punish him, but he stuck his head down and battled really well." O'Brien added, "They didn't go very fast and we were just getting him to relax and switched off today--that was the important thing. He seems in a real good place now and on an upward curve." Connections are looking at a return to a mile for a repeat bid in Ascot's G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. Sept. 25, followed by a tilt at either the BC Mile or Classic, both at Churchill Nov. 6.

Rewilding, out of action since finishing a creditable third in the G1 Epsom Derby June 5, put his stamp on this leading trial for the G1 St Leger at Doncaster Sept. 11. Under the auspices of Andre Fabre in his formative career, he was sent to Mahmood Al Zarooni after chasing home Planteur (Ire) (Daneshill Dancer {Ire}) when runner-up in the G2 Prix Noailles at Longchamp Apr. 11.

He got off the mark in style in the royal blue in Goodwood's Listed Cocked Hat S. May 19, and was the one colt to make late inroads at Epsom after Workforce (GB) (King's Best) surged away in the Blue Riband. Left alone in rear early off the sound tempo here, the bay made stealthy progress wide out in the straight and, after rolling by Midas Touch with a furlong remaining, stretched clear under hand riding to score with plenty to spare. "It was a tremendous race and they went a very strong gallop and, as usual, he took a bit of time to warm up," jockey Frankie Dettori commented. "From four out, there was only one winner, and I just tried to keep it smooth and win with a nice margin. He's the perfect Leger horse and this is the best trial, so we'll go there with plenty of confidence. He's calm now and will get the trip no problem, so we just have to get him there in one piece." Racing Manager Simon Crisford added, "He was left a little bit undercooked today, as he had a hard race in the Derby and Epsom didn't really suit him, but he's won doing handsprings. The Leger is the race for him and we love the race and have been very lucky in it. He's tailor-made for it, and next year we can drop him back to a mile and a half or mile and a quarter in a true-run race, as he has enough speed and loads of talent. Andre [Fabre] felt he was a genuine class act, which is why we made the transfer that early in the season, but he'll be a much better four-year-old than three-year-old. He is very raw and immature and, looking at him in the paddock, he doesn't hold condition as well as you'd like because he is a baby. What is important is that he is a horse for the next two years who we can campaign internationally." Aidan O'Brien is also looking at the Doncaster Classic with the second- and third-place finishers, who made an encouraging return from an 11-month layoff. "We're delighted with them both," O'Brien told *PA Sport*. "You'd love to be thinking about the Leger next time with them." This often informative staging post on the juvenile journey lost much intrigue when the exciting maiden winners Biondetti (Bernardini) and Dream Ahead (Diktat {GB}) were scratched, but was handed a boost by the authoritative win of Waiter's Dream. Slow to reach his full potential, he followed a debut sixth in a seven-furlong Newbury maiden June 10 with a runner-up effort at Salisbury June 27. The penny dropped with a clear-cut success back at Newbury last time July 16, and he showed he had not stopped progressing here. Prominent early, the bay was traveling strongly in midstretch as Johnny Murtagh was already sending out distress signals on the favorite Lake Ontario (Johannesburg).

Hollendorfer: Alabama More Than Two-Horse Show...

Trainer Jerry Hollendorfer is looking forward to watching **Blind Luck** (Pollard's

Vision) square off with **Devil May Care** (Malibu Moon) in Saturday's GI Betfair TVG Alabama S. at Saratoga, but he does not

necessarily view the 10-furlong event as a match race. The chestnut filly has won four of

her six outings this season, including the GI Kentucky Oaks Apr. 30 and a narrow defeat of **Havre de Grace** (Saint

Liam) in the GII Delaware Oaks July 10.

"I think this is a race the fans want to see, but I am not looking at it as a two-horse race," Hollendorfer told media assembled for a national teleconference Tuesday afternoon. "Todd Pletcher has said the same thing and I've already run against Havre de Grace and barely beat her. I don't really look at it as a showdown. Everyone that's going in there thinks they have a chance, so we have to beat everyone and not just one horse." Cont. p5

While both Blind Luck and Devil May Care own a pair of wins at the highest level in 2010, Hollendorfer is hesitant to say that Saturday's race boils down to a divisional championship.

"I'm not sure about that and I'm not even going to worry about that," he commented. "We're just coming to Saratoga to try to win the Alabama. Other people are going to decide [the Eclipse] any-ways."

To be a fan of Blind Luck is not for the feint of heart. Three of her four scores this season have come by a flared nostril, and her off-pace running style sometimes leaves her hostage to a slow tempo.

Hollendorfer admits that, depending on the shape of the race Saturday, Blind Luck could be handier than is her custom.

"We do have a tendency to lay back a bit, which I don't like, but that's the way the races have been turning out," the conditioner admitted. "I think we could lay a little bit closer if we asked our filly to do that. I think she could produce the same sort of finish she normally does."

The unfortunate passing of leading turf distaffer Tuscan Evening (Ire) left open the possibility that Rafael Bejarano, who rode Blind Luck in six consecutive races dating back to last year's GI Hollywood Starlet S., could be back in the saddle this weekend. Instead, Joel Rosario, who committed to ride Blind Luck in Delaware and in the Alabama, will retain the mount.

"I'm sure [Bejarano] would have liked to get back on the horse, but we had already committed to Joel to ride at Saratoga and that's why he took the ride in the first place."

The Alabama presents the first opportunity for a stretchout to 10 furlongs. Is Hollendorfer concerned about the added real estate?

"No, not at all," he explained. "All of these fillies need to show that they can run the mile and a quarter. And I am going to throw out Devil May Care's Kentucky Derby. The track was very bad that day, and I am going to ignore it."

Trickmeister, Boys at Toscanova Work in Company...

IEAH Stables' recently acquired **TDN Rising Star** **Trickmeister** (Proud Citizen) and Jay Em Ess Stables' smashing maiden winner and fellow **TDN Rising Star** **Boys at Toscanova** (Officer) breezed six furlongs in company Tuesday morning over the Saratoga main track. Scheduled to make his next appearance in the GI Travers S. Aug. 28, Trickmeister, last-out winner of the Barbaro S. at Delaware Park July 10, was given a final time of 1:12.76, but it was the two-year-old Boys at Toscanova, pointing for the GI Three Chimneys Hopeful S. Sept. 6, who did the better of the two, stopping the clock in 1:12.54.

"It seemed like 'Boys' had him in his pocket the whole way around there," Dutrow commented. "They both worked 'good,' but we're under the impression that Boys at Toscanova is a really, really good one. Trickmeister worked good, but he just couldn't seem to hang with Boys at Toscanova. It was a very good breeze for both of them, but we really think that Boys has something special in his pocket."

Despite his inability to outwork his less-experienced stablemate, Trickmeister remains on track for the "Mid-summer Derby."

"Like I said, he worked good and he's doing good and that's the plan right now," Dutrow said.

In other news from the Dutrow stable, Jay Em Ess's **TDN Rising Star** **Rail Trip** (Jump Start) is close to being where Dutrow wants him, but may have injured himself slightly Tuesday morning.

"I think we're dealing with a foot issue or two," Dutrow explained. "I think he may have stepped on a rock this morning behind. He kind of came back favoring his right hind and he had kind of a pounding pulse on his back foot. He cooled out fine, but something is irritating him back there. We'll see how he is tomorrow, but he's not real smooth yet, and I need to have him really smooth to run against the kind of horses he's going to have to face in these races. He's very close to being very good and then I'll be able to pick a spot and point him through it."



Evening Jewel Doubtful for Breeders' Cup...

The Braly Family Trust's **Evening Jewel** (Northern Afleet) will use Saturday's GI Del Mar Oaks as a steppingstone to the GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup at Keeneland in October, but is unlikely to press on to any Breeders' Cup event, trainer Jim Cassidy said yesterday.

"I don't like running three-year-olds against older until I absolutely have to," Cassidy admitted. "After this, we want to run at Keeneland, and what happens after that I really don't know. I might take her back to Hollywood to run in the [GI] Matriarch. I'd rather do that than run in the Breeders' Cup [in late November] against older."

Winner of the GI Ashland S. over the Keeneland Poly in April and a heartbreaking runner-up in the GI Kentucky Oaks Apr. 30, Evening Jewel is perfect in two tries on the grass, having taken the GII Honeymoon H. May 31 and the GII San Clemente H. at Del Mar July 25.

Moulin Looks Likely for Paco...

Highclere Stud's recent acquisition **Paco Boy (Ire)** (Desert Style {Ire}) will likely contest the G1 Prix du Moulin at Longchamp Sept. 5, it was announced yesterday.

Heavy ground was blamed for the five-year-old's reversal when third in Sunday's G1 Prix Jacques le Marois at Deauville, and the Richard Hannon trainee has emerged from that race in top order. "He ran his race, but he died in the last 100 yards and, on that heavy ground, I'm not sure he stays as well as he does on quick ground," the trainer's son and assistant Richard Hannon Jr said.

"I think we're going to take in the Moulin before he is retired at the end of the year--he's come out of the race okay and is in great form, but it will all be discussed with Highclere and John Warren. As long as we're all happy, another Group 1 will do a little bit more for his stallion career. America is also a real possibility at the moment."

This is another with a notable withdrawal after the G2 Railway S. scorer Formosina fell by the wayside yesterday, but still has plenty of interest in the line-up. Unbeaten after a five-furlong maiden at Newmarket May 2 and Newbury's Super Sprint July 17, **Temple Meads** represents the Ed McMahon stable. "This is a no-excuse race, everything has gone right," McMahon told *PA Sport*. "We've had no stoppages, so everything is fine. This is his hardest task, but we've had no hold-ups since Newbury, whereas we did before the Super Sprint. I think the step up to six furlongs will suit, but I'm just hoping the ground stays good." Richard Hannon's juveniles are carrying all before them, and the East Everleigh stable will be looking to add further festival success after the domination of Newmarket's July and Glorious Goodwood with **Casual Glimpse**. EVEN PARADISE IS NOT IMMUNE

They call it "The Sales Paradise," and the new formula that has been the Arqana Sales Company since 2006 managed to buck the international trend last year, but even the fantastic ambience of Deauville proved not to be immune this year, as the gross at Arqana's Deauville August yearling sale dropped below €30 million for the first time since 2006. The gross (excluding private sales), which totaled €27,208,000, was down 30 percent from last year. The average dropped 17 percent, to €94,145, though, interestingly, the median was down by less than three percent, from €72,000 to €70,000.

Besides the median, there are a couple of other statistics that mitigate the declines. First, though there was only a four-percent drop in the number catalogued (502 to 480), the number catalogued actually increased for Monday's fourth and final, primarily French-bred, session. The number catalogued was down 10 percent for the other three sessions. After withdrawals, the number sent through the ring was down eight percent for the entire sale, but, again, the number offered was slightly up in the final session, and down 14 percent for the first three. So the 30-percent drop in gross wasn't 'horse for horse'; the 17-percent drop in average is perhaps a more accurate gauge of the sale's actual decline.

Second, as Arqana president Eric Hoyeau observed, a good deal of the decrease was at the top of the market, and an €6.5-million drop in spending by Sheikh Mohammed and his brother, Sheikh Hamdan, from 2009 accounts for nearly 60 percent of the €11.5-million reduction in the gross. As *Racing Post's* Nancy Sexton speculated, this could herald a general cutback in the Maktoums' spending patterns, which obviously would have big implications for the Keeneland September sale and Tattersalls' October 1. On the other hand, there have been occasional cries from prominent breeders for years now that Maktoum and Coolmore dominance of the market's upper reaches discourages at least some potential big spenders, and their retreat from the marketplace could ultimately be a good thing. The two leading non-French buyers were agent Charlie Gordon-Watson, who bought seven yearlings for a total of €2.4 million (average €342,857); and Sir Robert Ogden, who bought eight for a total of €1.83 million (average €228,750). John Ferguson was only eighth on the buyer's list (five, for €980,000), while Sheikh Hamdan sat the sale out entirely. Could this be the shape of things to come?

I'm sure you got the message loud and clear from Case Clay's excellent blogging that Deauville is a pretty extra-special place, and you'll hear no disagreement from this quarter. There's a lot to be said for August on a coast or at a spa for racing and sales, and Deauville has accomplished both. On Sunday, the Niarchos family's Haras de Fresnay-le-Buffard put on a fantastic brunch/lunch, and Makfi (Dubawi) emulated both his sire and grandsire, Dubai Millennium, with an epic triumph in the Fresnay-sponsored G1 Prix Jacques le Marois when derailing Goldikova and Paco Boy. They called the ground very soft, but the winner broke 1:40 for the mile, so I don't know that it was really all that soft. Between the sales and the racing, if you're going to lose money selling yearlings, can there be a better place to do it than Deauville? I doubt it.

It was the first reversal, really, in the brief five-year history of the Arqana sales company. A group including the Aga Khan and other French breeders bought the Agence Francaise, which had been staging the sales in Deauville, in 2005, and merged it with Goffs France, whose main sales were the two-year-old Breeze-Up and the Arc Sale, both staged at Saint-Cloud racecourse in Paris. Ironically, in the last two years, Arqana's share of the European yearling market increased (to 27 percent) by exactly the same percentage that Goffs, hit doubly hard by the collapse of Ireland's Celtic Tiger economy, declined, so at least Goffs has the consolation that they're a significant shareholder in Arqana. Eric Hoyeau came over from Goffs France to head the new company, and Olivier Delloye moved from the 'outside world' and came in as managing director. The company's gross horse sales immediately leapt from the two sales companies' combined €50-million gross in 2005 to €77 million in 2006--a 54-percent increase--and shot up again, to €91 million in 2007, before settling down to record €79 million and change in sales in 2008 and 2009. What led to such dramatic increases--besides the ambience--we asked Hoyeau and Delloye in an interview during a break in the action? "Besides the ambience," laughed Hoyeau, "it is the participation of the breeders as shareholders. They are committed to the new company, and their commercial energy helps to create 'the buzz' and the confidence."

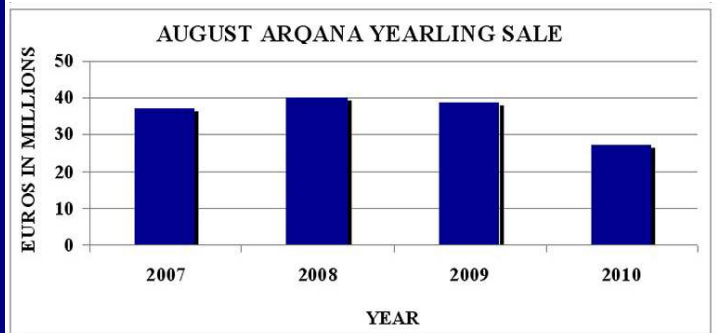

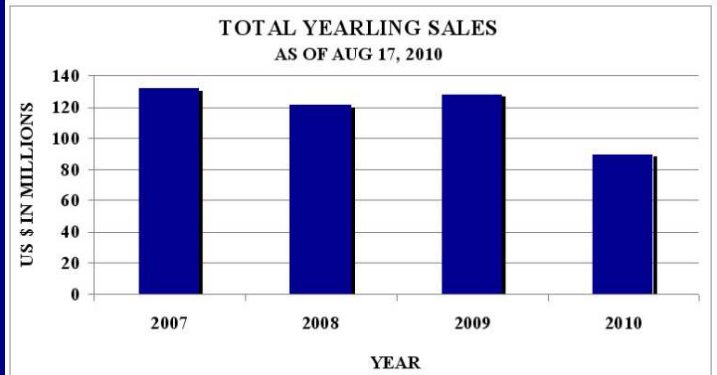

"The rise in withdrawals and five percent fall in sold/ring clearance rate at Arqana's August sale in Deauville resulted in their sale dropping at exactly the same rate -- 30 percent in gross, 17 percent in average -- as the three Fasig-Tipton sales in North America. Since 2007, the four July-August yearling sales covered have seen 17 percent fewer yearlings catalogued, 25 percent fewer sold, for a 32 percent drop in gross (call it a third) and a nine percent drop in average. At least further stud fee adjustments in 2011 might help lay the groundwork for future profits." - Bill Oppenheim

Added Delloye, "The 'branding' helps, too. We set out to create a whole new brand. With the help of our shareholders, we came up with a new name--Arqana--which is short, and easy to pronounce in any language [and means nothing, by the way], and the Aga Khan's design team helped us create our distinctive logo. The revival of the French racing scene, and the emergence of new, highly professional operations like the Ecurie des Monceaux alongside long-time stalwarts of French breeding like Etreham [Marc de Chambure], Quesnay [the Head family], Mezeray [Charles-Henri de Moussac], Capucines [Eric Puerari and Michel Zerolo], Haras de la Rebourriere, Haras de la Louviere and many others has assured us of a constant stream of quality stock, professionally presented--even before we were able to attract many Irish consignors and those from England, such as Newsells Park."

In spite of the August Sale's reversals this year, Arqana is continuing its renovations of the sales grounds--a new panoramic restaurant is scheduled to open later this year--although they are handicapped by being restricted to 350 stalls, with no prospect of adding more in this burgeoning resort area. They are across the street from the Deauville racecourse, though, and sometimes--especially in December--stalls are available at the racecourse for the overflow. With the most buoyant domestic market in Europe, and attracting increasing numbers of consignors from Ireland and Great Britain, Arqana's future is bright. But, Hoyeau thinks, it could be even brighter. "If French commercial breeders continue to upgrade their mares, and if we can attract a new range of stallions which will justify breeders keeping their mares in France rather than sending them to Ireland and England to be bred, we can step forward again," said Hoyeau. Though horses like Linamix and Anabaa have stood for as much as €50,000 in the recent past, currently the most expensive sire in France is the Haras d'Etreham's Elusive City, who stands for €20,000. The French breeding industry is only about one or two higher-level stallions away from providing the vibrant Arqana operation with the ammunition for even bigger advances in the future.

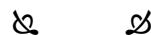

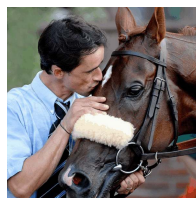
