Stacelita (Fr) (Monsum {Ger}) needed to dig deep, but had enough in the tank to fend off the game **Antara** (Ger) (Platini {Ger}) in yesterday's G1 Darley Prix Jean Romanet at Deauville. Sharply away to steal the early lead, **Stacelita** (Fr) (Monsum {Ger}) allowed Board Meeting a two-length advantage

until turning for home. She was sent to the front in early stretch and came under a late drive to hold on as Antara ran out of runaway. "When we decided to keep Stacelita in training as a four-year-old, the plan was to win a Group 1 race this year, so it is mission accomplished now," said trainer Jean-Claude Rouget. "Since the beginning of the year we have indicated that we'd like to run at the Breeders' Cup, but that has changed because it is very expensive to run there and Middy will always be a tough filly to beat. The plan is to now go for the [G1] E.P. Taylor S. [at Woodbine Oct. 16] and then the [G1] Hong Kong Cup [at Sha Tin Dec. 12]."

Starting out with an impressive nine-length maiden victory at Nottingham July 16, Dream Ahead bypassed last Tuesday's G3 Acomb S. at York in favor of this contest and justified his connections' decision to do so by winning with aplomb. He raced under a tight hold behind the leaders in the center of the track until coaxed into contention passing the quarter-mile marker. Quickening smartly to take control with 150 meters remaining, he was ridden out in the closing stages and belied his inexperience to comfortably register a career high. "After he won so easily first time out, we had him entered in the Acomb, but after consulting with the owner, we decided to come here as we thought the [likely] softer ground would help. The ground was good today and the [winning] time is fast, but if the ground had been softer I think he would have been even more impressive. The plan is to now go for the [G1] Middle Park [S. at Newmarket Oct. 1], but we have not ruled out the [G1] Dewhurst S. [at Newmarket Oct. 16] as I think he will probably be able to see out seven furlongs [of the latter race]." Explaining his passage through the contest, William Buick, who was fresh from his G1 Arlington Million win on Saturday, added, "He broke well and I took him back a little. He traveled well throughout, even though he had no cover, and two [furlongs] out he was traveling so strongly I thought it would take a very good horse to beat us." Tin Horse, who lost his unbeaten record after suffering a troubled trip in the July 25 G2 Prix Robert Papin at Maisons-Laffitte, fared best of the rest and ran on well without seriously threatening Dream Ahead. "We knew he hadn't quite run his race in the Papin because one horse had taken him out and he jumped on the bit much too early that day," reasoned the owner's Racing Manager Gilles Forien. "Today, with cover, he has run his race and the logical next step would be to take him to the [G1] Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere [at Longchamp Oct. 3]."

Sailing through wins in last term's G1 Prix Saint-Alary and G1 Prix de Diane, Stacelita was awarded September's G1 Prix Vermeille by Longchamp's stewards, but lost her six-race unbeaten tag when seventh in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe back there Oct. 4. She was then outspeeded when fourth in the G1 Prix d'Ispahan on seasonal return back at the Bois de Boulogne track May 23 before regaining winning ways in the G3 La Coupe back there June 14, and was a last-out second behind Middy (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB})--yet ahead of Antara--in the July 31 G1 Nassau S. at Goodwood. "We took a gamble running her in the Nassau, because this race has always been her main target," explained Rouget. Successful in last term's G2 Prix Vicomtesse Vigier at Longchamp, Americain was transferred Stateside and finished third in his final start for Todd Pletcher in a one-mile allowance race on the Gulfstream turf Jan. 3. He made a low-key debut for current connections when fifth in the Listed Prix La Moskowa at Chantilly June 16 before taking a Clairefontaine conditions event July 8, and was a three-length winner of the Listed Prix du Carrousel over this course and distance last time July 30. Restrained to race midfield having been prominent through the first furlong, Americain was niggled along on the home turn. Pushed through a gap to hit the front inside the eighth pole, he was hand ridden to land a second pattern-race win.

"There was a lack of pace and that is not good for him, but he overcame it very well and quickened nicely," said trainer Alain de Royer-Dupre. "The plan is to go to the [G1] Melbourne Cup [at Flemington Nov. 2] as the owner is Australian and very keen to do that. He has to go into quarantine in England for two weeks and then three more weeks in Australia, and that is not easy for a horse trained in France. We'll see when he can go to England, but he is finished for the season in Europe." A rematch with the runner-up is in the cards after trainer Luca Cumani indicated a trip down under is also in the pipeline for Manighar, adding, "He was in a bit of trouble and struggled to get out at the top of the straight, but this is the best race he's run for me this year. Marsh Side, winner of the 12-furlong GI Canadian International in October 2008, added another Grade I to his repertoire in last September's GI Northern Dancer S. over that distance. This term, the handsome dark bay

finished seventh in a pair of starts over Santa Anita's ProRide, including the 10-furlong GI Santa Anita H. Mar. 4 before coming home a much-improved fourth--beaten 1 3/4 lengths--most recently in the GIII Arlington H. July 17. Well supported for this return to Woodbine's E. P. Taylor course, Marsh Side tracked an opening quarter in :27.50 and a half in :53.40. Forging to the front at the head of the long stretch, the seven-year-old was ridden out by Edgar Prado to collect the easy victory. It looked as though there was not much speed in the race," said Prado, who gave Marsh Side his first win in four tries in 2010. "All I had to do was help him a little bit out of the gate and then let him do his thing. He's an old pro and he knows the track. He was having a lot of fun out there."

Racing manager Patrick Lawley-Wakelin expects Marsh Side to return to Woodbine in the near future. "It's amazing," said Lawley-Wakelin. "I think there's no doubt in our mind the horse belongs here. He'll go back to California and we'll talk to [trainer] Neil [Drisdale]. I would say the Northern Dancer (Sept. 19) is definitely on our schedule."

Automatically downgraded when it was pulled off the turf, the race was dominated by It's Tea Time, who looked every bit the odds-on choice, galloping home an easy winner. Racing five wide and content to let her two rivals lead the way early, the bay overtook Hatheer approaching the stretch and turned it on late to cruise home an easy winner. "I didn't really have a preference where to have her in the race," explained winning rider Julien Leparoux. "She was most comfortable behind horses, so we just settled in the back. She ran very well and was very relaxed. I didn't have any worries about the off track, because I had breezed her on the dirt before and she traveled over it well. The trainer, Rusty Arnold, told me that this surface today would not be a problem." It's Tea Time graduated in her second career start going nine panels on the lawn at Gulfstream Feb. 21. A close second behind the ultra classy Evening Jewel (Northern Afleet) in the 1 1/16-mile GI Ashland S. on the Polytrack Apr. 3, the filly tired to ninth--beaten 10 lengths--in the GI Kentucky Oaks Apr. 30. Fourth in the grassy GIII Regret S. June 12, she closed like a freight train to score narrowly in her most recent start in an 8 1/2-panel allowance over the Saratoga lawn Aug. 1. "She ran on conventional dirt in the Kentucky Oaks, and she ran pretty well," said Arnold. "She had the one hole in a 14-horse field, which didn't work out for her. I told Julien, 'I don't know how [today's] race will play, because small fields can be funny, so do what you want.' You're always happy to win a race here, any race." She went missing after that win and returned with a dull 11th-place finish in the seven-panel GI Santa Monica H. Jan. 31. Fifth against allowance foes Mar. 10, the dark bay rallied late to be third on the turf at Hollywood May 1. Fifth in the Desert Stormer H. on Hollywood's Cushion Track June 12, the Pennsylvania-bred bagged her first victory of the season last time in the seven-furlong GII A

Gleam H. July 17. Sent off the second choice this time, the filly setted behind favorite Alpha Kitten, who reeled off opening splits of :23.08 and :46.18. Up to challenge the leader at the head of the stretch, the five-year-old gained a slight advantage and inched clear late to get the win. "She was there for me all the way around," said winning rider Victor Espinoza. "She's handy. I could do anything I wanted with her. She ran hard at the finish, but she was going to win--For sure. [Trainer] Brian [Koriner] has done such a good job with her. He has her ready. When he does his job well, my job becomes a whole lot easier." As for what's next with the four-year-old, Koriner added, "We're trying to get to the Breeders' Cup..I think we'll go to a race at Colonial Downs [Virginia] for her next start. That way we'll already be in the east and won't have to ship again. We can go to Churchill Downs from there. I don't think she has trained real great here, but it worked out." Notching a provincial double on her last two juvenile starts, Lily of the Valley kept the sequence going with a winning sophomore debut in a one-mile Saint-Cloud conditions event Apr. 13. Taking the Listed Prix Volterra back at that venue May 19, she quickened impressively to land the G3 Prix Chloe at Chantilly on her latest start July 4, and raced a little keenly in third through the ordinary early fractions here. Moving easily up to the quarters of the pacesetting Contredanse early in the stretch, she was driven right out to overhaul that rival in the shadow of the post. "I think Lily of the Valley is a genuine Group 1 filly and I'm convinced that she's even better on a left-handed course," said trainer Jean-Claude Rouget. "[Jockey Christophe] Soumillon was unable to ride her as he wished, but we will leave that until later on as her immediate future is on another right-handed course, at Longchamp, where she will run in the [Oct. 3 G1] Prix de l'Opera. With the history of this race and the ratings of past winners, I think today's race should be at least a Group 2 race with better prize money." Reflecting on the performance of third-placed Zagora, Martin Schwartz's Racing Manager Michel Zerolo added, "Zagora ran well, but it was a tactical race and 10 furlongs is a shade too far for her. The plan is to drop her back in trip for the [G1] Queen Elizabeth Challenge Cup [at Keeneland Oct. 16]."

retired from racing due to a leg injury. "He has a fractured splint in his right foot," trainer Todd Pletcher told *Daily Racing Form*. "Just with the timing, where he is in his career, the thought of doing surgery and trying to bring him back next year doesn't make sense. There's not really time to get anything accomplished at the end of this year." The

grey, who was a \$160,000 FTKJUL yearling purchase, was competitive but winless in four starts this year, and crossed the wire first in the GI Gulfstream Park Turf H. Feb. 6 before being disqualified for interference. "That one stings most of all, when you're the winner and you don't get rewarded for it," said Pletcher. "He was an exceptionally consistent performer who was a multiple Grade I winner who also showed some good two-year-old form. He won on the dirt [and] ran well on synthetics. We're hoping because of his racing accomplishments and because he's such a good-looking horse, that, hopefully, he can find a home as a stallion. I think he deserves a chance." No stud plans have been announced yet for the \$943,590 earner, who finished his career with a record of 16-4-3-1.

Betfair TVG Alabama Wrap Up...

The top finishers in Saturday's GI Betfair/TVG Alabama S. exited the 10-furlong test for sophomore fillies in good order, including winner **Blind Luck** (Pollard's Vision). "She's doing well--much better than I am this morning," quipped Archie Cross, assistant to trainer Jerry Hollendorfer. "She's chilling, relaxing and is refreshed after having an hour-long walk [Sunday] morning." The chestnut has collected five victories--three of them at the Grade I level--at five different tracks this term. "We wouldn't be able to do this if she didn't travel so well," said Cross. Also reportedly doing well Sunday was runner-up **Havre de Grace** (Saint Liam). "She's doing great," confirmed trainer Tony Dutrow. "Having run as well as she did in the [GII] Delaware Oaks [a nose behind winner Blind Luck, July 10] and in the Alabama [beaten a 1/4 lengths], I think our filly proved without any doubt that she's absolutely among the best of her generation." A few barns over, Dutrow's younger brother Rick Dutrow Jr. was equally pleased with his **Acting Happy** (Empire Maker) third-place finish. "She ran a great race and it looks like she came out of it well," said Dutrow. "Everyone associated with the horse is happy this morning." Conversely, trainer Todd Pletcher was not as enthused with the performance of **Devil May Care** (Malibu Moon), who finished fourth as the favorite. "I never felt she fired during the race," admitted Pletcher Sunday morning. "She was beaten only 4 1/2 lengths, but I never felt she ran to her capabilities. She trained up to it very well and came out of it in good order. Watching the race, I was concerned down the backside, because, as slow as the fractions were, I would have expected her to really be tugging [jockey] Johnny [Velazquez] up there. He said when they turned up the backside, she was off the bridle. He was hoping that it was a good sign, that she was relaxed, but it became more and more apparent that she just never really kicked in." Looking further down the road, Pletcher said he was considering several options for Devil May Care, among them the GI Beldame S. at Belmont Oct. 2.

Pletcher Tribe Out at the Spa...

Trainer Todd Pletcher sent out a handful of workers Sunday morning on the Oklahoma training track, including **Quality Road** (Elusive Quality), slated to reappear in the GI Woodward S. Sept. 5. Quality Road, who suffered his first loss of the year in the Aug. 7

GI Whitney S., covered a half-mile in :51.86, with opening splits of :13.50 and :26.50. He completed the final quarter in :23.85. "I was looking not to get off schedule with him," said Pletcher. "He seemed to handle everything well, and came back well. The

track was sloppy, but safe, and we caught it very early. It was either go, or not go, and we went."

Also on the worktab was **Life At Ten** (Malibu Moon), who is expected to make her next start in Sunday's GI Personal Ensign S. Life At Ten, whose most recent victories include the GII Delaware H. and GI Ogden Phipps at Belmont, worked in company with Stopspending Maria (Montbrook), covering five furlongs over the sloppy track in 1:02.82. NYRA clockers caught her galloping out in 1:15 3/5. "We were looking for a little more from Life At Ten, because she is running 1 1/4 miles," said Pletcher. "She not only worked well, but galloped out extremely well." Riding a six-race winning streak into Sunday's race, the four-year-old is expected to face defending Horse of the Year Rachel Alexandra (Medaglia d'Oro). "She's in very good form right now, and she's obviously on a winning streak," Pletcher added. "I think her races this year have been better than some have given her credit for, but I also think it's a very, very tall order to take on Rachel Alexandra."

Pletcher also sent out GI King's Bishop S. candidate **Discreetly Mine** (Mineshaft) and **Malibu Prayer** (Malibu Moon), who is under consideration for Saturday's GI Ballerina S. Discreetly Mine, an 8 3/4-length winner of the Aug. 2 GII Amsterdam S., went an easy half-mile in :52.32. "Most of them, we were just looking for routine maintenance," said Pletcher. "Discreetly Mine is obviously very fit, and we were looking for a nice, easy half. He got over the ground well." As for the winner of the Aug. 1 GI Ruffian H., Malibu Prayer went a half in :49.91. "I will speak with [owner] Mr. [Ned] Evans in the next couple of days and make a decision," he said.

Pletcher also confirmed that GI Kentucky Derby winner **Super Saver** (Maria's Mon) came out of Sunday's work in preparation for Saturday's GI Travers S. in good shape. "I believe the Haskell has moved him forward," said the trainer. "And I would expect an improved performance from him in what appears to be a wide-open race."

ROUND TABLE 2010

ROUND TABLE 2010: TIME FOR A CHANGE

The Jockey Club's 58th Round Table Conference on Matters Pertaining to Racing was held yesterday at the Gideon Putnam Hotel in Saratoga Springs, New York, and, despite the gloomy, wet weather, the mood was decidedly optimistic. In an 18-page letter sent at the request of Sen. Tom Udall and Rep. Ed Whitfield in May, Jockey Club President Jim Gagliano explained "how The Jockey Club, in particular, and the industry in general have been active in the numerous changes and reforms that have been made throughout the Thoroughbred industry since 2008." (Click [here](#) to read the entire letter.) That sentiment was reiterated during the two-plus hour Conference.

The Conference kicked off with presentations from four of the leading racetrack executives in the industry: Woodbine President Nick Eaves, Keeneland President Nick Nicholson, New Jersey Sports and Exposition Authority President Dennis Robinson and New York Racing Association Chairman Steven Duncker. After a very brief intermission, the topic was "Medication and Safety: A Report of Collaborative Progress." Executive Director Matt Iuliano first ran down the recent activities of The Jockey Club. Following opening remarks from Stuart S. Janney III, the chairman of The Jockey Club's Thoroughbred Safety Committee, the speakers were: National Thoroughbred Racing Association President Alex Waldrop on the NTRA Safety and Integrity Alliance; Keeneland's Vince Gabbert on the Interstate Racing and Regulatory Compact; Dr. Rick Arthur on the Racing Medication and Testing Consortium; and Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association Chairman Alan Foreman on the Drug Testing Initiative. The second half of the proceedings offered a compelling argument that, while change in Thoroughbred racing comes slowly and is often long overdue, there has been significant progress in the sport recently, and more is on the horizon. "We have accomplished more in the last two years than at any other time in the history of our sport, and we're not done yet," said Janney.

Medication and Safety...

As Alan Foreman observed, "If we can't continually demonstrate that our sport is clean and fair, we will not have a sport." Less than two years ago, in October of 2008, the NTRA unveiled the Safety and Integrity Alliance. Alex Waldrop reported yesterday that, in a short span of time, 19 U.S. racetracks, representing 60 percent of the country's parimutuel handle, have been fully accredited. "Reform is a never-ending process, and we designed [this initiative] with that in mind," Waldrop said. "There are bars to be raised and higher standards to be achieved." Waldrop also lobbied to make the standards set even more meaningful, advocating that accreditation become mandatory before a track can be licensed, and stumping for a grass-roots campaign that would see both horse owners and horseplayers boycott those tracks that don't seek accreditation. In the future, the Alliance plans to create a program that will certify not only the tracks, but other facilities that cater to the Thoroughbred. "[Safety and integrity] don't begin or end on the race-tracks," he said.

THE JOCKEY CLUB THOROUGHBRED SAFETY COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATIONS FOR 2010

- 1) The immediate adoption by the Association of Racing Commissioners International (RCI) and all United States racing authorities of the Racing Medication and Testing Consortium (RMTC) recommendation revising the threshold for the NSAID phenylbutazone from 5 micrograms per milliliter to 2 micrograms per milliliter of plasma or serum when administered not less than 24 hours prior to post time.
- 2) The adoption of the RMTC Equine Drug Testing Standards into the RCI Model Rule book and the participation and adoption of the standards by all United States racing authorities and their associated testing laboratories.
- 3) The immediate use of the pre-race veterinary examination module (developed by InCompass Solutions Inc.) and the sharing of inspection information by all racing jurisdictions, regulatory veterinarians and racetracks performing pre-race inspections. The transparency and reciprocity of all associated "lists" kept by various racing officials.
- 4) The standing commitment by all racetracks, state racing authorities, horsemen, exercise riders, jockeys and the Jockeys' Guild to participate in the Rider Accident Database.

Vince Gabbert, executive assistant to Keeneland President Nick Nicholson, started his presentation by saying, "There is so much potential for positive change in our industry." The former deputy chief of staff for Kentucky Gov. Steven Beshear, Gabbert described the Interstate Racing and Regulatory Compact as an agreement that binds those that sign on to its contracts and provisions. "It will finally provide our sport with the potential for a national rule book," he remarked. "Most importantly, it will create uniformity." If adopted, he said, the Compact would put racing "on the road to that goal," while also developing a structure for self-governance that would limit government intervention in the sport. While several states have expressed interest in joining the Compact, New York is, to date, the only one to actually introduce legislation to make their involvement a reality.

Dr. Rick Arthur, the equine medical director for the California Horse Racing Board, introduced the first of four recommendations outlined at yesterday's Conference--the lowering of the recommended threshold for phenylbutazone from 5 micrograms to 2 micrograms. "Ninety percent of horses that suffer catastrophic breakdowns have a pre-existing injury at the site of the fatal injury," Arthur emphasized. "Why are [pre-race exams] missing these pre-existing injuries?" He pointed to the higher threshold allowed for bute. "[Examining veterinarians] tell us they can't do their jobs without new regulations," Arthur continued, adding, "This is not a radical move." According to Arthur, some 90 percent of horses tested are already at acceptable levels under the proposed rule change. "It would be crazy," he stated, "to keep the threshold at current levels just to protect the trainers "pushing it to the edge." Arthur also revealed that the Racing Medication and Testing Consortium has undertaken a project to determine the proper withdrawal times, the research results for nine medications set to be published this fall, and an additional four over the next six months.

During the final presentation of the Conference, Foreman described the current drug-testing system as "archaic and dysfunctional," and went on to detail the steps needed to fix it. "This is the hub of the system set up to protect our industry--it is our first line of defense," he offered. The biggest problem, he offered, was the lack of standards required of the drug-testing facilities. The second recommendation to come out of the Conference urged the adoption of the RMTC Equine Drug Testing standards. "The standards are tough, stringent, and absolutely necessary for the future of our sport," he stated. The labs responsible for the testing in New York, California, Pennsylvania, West Virginia and Delaware, and the facility that will take over the testing in Kentucky in 2011, have signed letters of intent to comply with these standards.

"They represent 60 percent of the daily handle, and 50 percent of the purses," Foreman said. "This will hasten the much-needed uniformity and collaboration." The New York Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association provided the funds that will allow the New York lab to comply with the standards, and The Jockey Club has pledged to provide financial assistance to any facility seeking accreditation. The Consortium has also merged the oversight of quality assurance and lab proficiency. "It's a totally new concept for our industry," Foreman asserted. The Jockey Club is funding a program for the long-term storage of frozen samples, making them available when new testing procedures are developed. "I think that's a pretty good report card," Foreman concluded. "The negative perception is beginning to change...it doesn't have to be an albatross around our necks. We have made encouraging strides, but this is just the beginning of an ongoing effort. There can be no hesitation or margin for error if we are to regain confidence in our sport."
