Dutrow on Verge of Career High With A Little Warm...

At the beginning of the summer, trainer Tony Dutrow sat down with 15 or so of his employees and asked them to take a minute and consider the opportunity at hand. The barn was perennially a national leader by winning percentage, but had only seldom enjoyed success in the kinds of races that make trainers household names. This summer, however, might be different. Thanks to the support of prominent owners like Fox Hill Farm's Rick Porter and Ned Evans, Dutrow's shedrow was populated by a number of exciting horses. At

the forefront were a pair of top three-year-olds: Fox Hill's **Winslow Homer** (Unbridled's Song), the GIII Holy Bull S. winner who was on the verge of returning from injury; and Evans's **A Little Warm** (Stormin Fever), the winner of Gulfstream's six-furlong Spectacular Bid S. who had shown two turns were in his wheelhouse by finishing second in the GII Louisiana Derby.

"I've won a lot of races. I've won a lot of stakes races. But major races, I've fallen short there," Dutrow admitted during an NTRA national teleconference yesterday. "So this summer, we gathered up our whole crew and we talked about the opportunities facing us. And we all made the commitment to each other, and to the horses, that we were going to focus, and to try our very, very best to accomplish such a goal. The thing that I wanted to bring attention to is the importance of these once-in-a-lifetime opportunities. I just wanted our team to take that one minute and realize what's in front of us." **Feature Presentation cont. p2**

ARLINGTON OAKS WINNER DQ'D

Stone Farm, John H. Adger, Oakcrest Farm and Michael Stidham's **Upperline** (Maria's Mon), the 4 3/4-length winner of the July 3 GIII Arlington Oaks, has been disqualified after testing positive for the non-steroidal anti-inflammatory etodolac. In addition, trainer Mike Stidham has been suspended for 15 days. Stidham is the third Arlington conditioner to have an etodolac positive at the meet. Nick Canani has had five horses fail tests for the drug and received a 30-day ban, while Ingrid Mason was handed a 15-day suspension after a single etodolac positive.

Snowtop Mountain (Najran) has been awarded the win, and the first-place purse of \$59,400, in the Arlington Oaks, with **Dundalk Dust** (Military) moved to second and **Chantilly Nayla** (Five Star Day) to third. Etodolac, a Class 3 medication under Association of Racing Commissioners International guidelines, is prescribed to treat arthritis in humans, but is not approved for use in horses in the U.S. Stidham will begin his suspension Sept. 6. Canani has filed an appeal.

Fast forward a few months, and Dutrow has endured a roller-coaster ride of a summer. Winslow Homer returned to romp by nine lengths in the Curlin S. at Saratoga, setting himself up for a run at the GI Travers S., only to emerge from the race with a season-ending fracture to his left foreleg. The Dutrow-trained **Havre De Grace** (Saint Liam), a fast-improving three-year-old filly owned by Fox Hill, has now finished second in two heartbreaking losses to pro-tem champion Blind Luck (Pollard's Vision), finishing a nose back in the GII Delaware Oaks in July and a neck adrift in last Saturday's GI Personal Ensign S. at the Spa.

"Horse racing is built on disappointment, and we have certainly had our share of it," said Dutrow.

This Saturday, however, A Little Warm has a chance to make all the hard work, tough beats and ill-timed injuries worthwhile. The homebred colt, coming off an impressive win in the GII Jim Dandy S. at Saratoga, will be one of the favorites for the Travers, and would be giving Dutrow the biggest victory of his career should he be able to see out the 10 furlongs of the race.

"He's trained for the Travers just fantastic," Dutrow said yesterday. "We couldn't feel any better about his ability or how he's trained into the race."

Early in the season, A Little Warm looked like his future would be in the sprint division. He captured the Spectacular Bid in January, then finished second to D' Funnybone (D'wildcat) in the seven-furlong GII Hutcheson S. at Gulfstream in February. Dutrow was content to keep him going short, but Evans implored his trainer to consider testing A Little Warm around two turns, and Dutrow acquiesced. In the nine-furlong GII Louisiana Derby, A Little Warm gave a fine account of himself in his first route try, making all the pace before just being tagged late by a rallying Mission Impazible (Unbridled's Song). **Cont. p3**

Lack of graded earnings kept A Little Warm from a shot at the GI Kentucky Derby, and a fever derailed him from the GI Preakness S. When he finally made it back to the track, he was again sent around two turns, this

time in a Delaware allowance June 29, which he won by an easy 2 1/2 lengths over Miner's Reserve (Mineshaft). Still with something to prove when he entered the gate as a 4-1 chance in the July 31 Jim Dandy, A Little Warm attended solid opening splits of :46 4/5 and 1:10 4/5, but kept on motoring late and

won the race over Miner's Reserve and Afleet Express (Afleet Alex) in a sharp 1:47 4/5.

Dutrow was asked if he was surprised how well A Little Warm finished up in his last two races.

"Yes," he said candidly. "Not much surprises me about horses, but I was a bit surprised [he] was able to finish as well as he did going two turns, with such limited experience."

What hasn't been a surprise to him is A Little Warm's quality.

"I always believed he was a very good horse," said Dutrow. "I always thought, until the Zayat horse [Eskendereya] came along and took control of the crop, that A Little Warm was as good as any horse out there. I just didn't realize A Little Warm was so capable at a mile and an eighth. It just took me a little while to realize his full potential at that distance."

While he adds another furlong Saturday, A Little Warm will also be adding plenty of weight. He carried 115 pounds in the Jim Dandy, but will tote 126 pounds in the Travers.

"I worry about everything, that included," Dutrow said of the 11-pound weight swing. "Whenever they haven't done something, you can only speculate on how they will do it. We're in uncharted waters, but our choice is to take this step with him, and we're so looking forward to the Travers with him."

Despite this summer's ups and downs, Dutrow said that he and his staff have been enjoying the ride, and remembers that talk he had with them.

"So far it's been fantastic, and we're very proud," he said. "We've come a long way, and it's been a lot of fun. I don't think anybody's working any harder than they have, I just think everyone needed to realize--to stop for just one minute--and think about this, to take it seriously, and focus. Focus on what's at stake. I don't think anybody could try any harder, could work any harder--our numbers, year after year after year, didn't get there from us not applying ourselves. We're really, really enjoying this. But we know we still have a lot of work to do. This could possibly be a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity." -LM

NEW NAMES

About the most important features of the APEX (Annual Progeny Earnings index) method of rating sires are that, within the limits defined, they enable us to both quantify and rank stallion performance. The key concept is that we measure the frequency with which a sire's runners achieve three percentile-defined earnings thresholds, which collectively add up to the top eight percent of earners from runners. The three categories are: top two percent of earners (designated 'A Runners'); the next two percent ('B Runners'); and the next four percent ('C Runners'). The three groups are also then combined to create 'ABC Runners'--the top eight percent of earners. At least in North America and France, any horse that becomes an 'ABC Runner' in a racing season or calendar year can be said to be "paying its way." Hence the appeal of discovering which sires are actually good at doing this, and which aren't.

Because earnings-based ratings systems really work best using annual results, a horse is counted as a 'runner' (and potentially an A, B or C Runner) every year it races. This method uses the last seven years of results, to ensure sufficient sample sizes while keeping the data 'fresh,' i.e. not allowing sires to live on past glories, but requiring them to keep up to date. The APEX method has the big advantage of being able to integrate various racing programs and currencies into the ratings: we simply find the two-percent, etc. thresholds in each country or countries and currency, and add the results together. The results are always pretty interesting.

The first thing we notice when we look at the four key 'Top 50' tables--A Runner and ABC Runner Index, and Number of A Runners and ABC Runners--is that Lane's End's venerable A.P. Indy is the number one sire on all four lists. This is huge because so often the leaders in quantity as opposed to frequency (as measured by the indices) are completely different sets of horses, but not in this case. On his way to his seventh number one year-end ranking in the most important category--this is like 'Best Picture'--his A Runner Index (4.88) is streets ahead of younger sires Speightstown (4.08) and Dalakhani (3.92) among the 632 sires that had 200 or more year-starters between Jan. 1, 2004 and Aug. 1, 2010.

Because an index of 1.00 equals two percent A Runners from runners in a calendar year ('year-starters'), A.P. Indy's 4.88 A Runner Index means 9.76 percent of his year-starters become A Runners. He is siring them at nearly a 10-percent rate, whereas his nearest pursuers are around eight percent.

Since 2004, only seven percent of A.P. Indy's year-starters have been in Europe or Japan. He's an all-American sire, that's for sure, but to lead all four of these categories--2.92 ABC Runner Index (over 23 percent of his year-starters); 111 A Runners since 2004 (Sadler's Wells second, with 109, then a gap back to Giant's Causeway, in third, with 94); and 266 ABC Runners--well, I'd call it a truly mighty performance. He's maybe as good a sire

as his great-great-grandsire Bold Ruler, eight times the leading sire in North America, but whose very existence in tail-male really depended on A.P. Indy being this good.

When you look at the current top 20 sires by A Runner Index, they now seem to divide among three different groups: seven 'Older sires' (pre-big book era, even if they had big books), which includes, besides A.P. Indy (4.88), California's Unusual Heat (3.88) and Canada's Bold Executive (3.71), as well as Sadler's Wells (3.84), Storm Cat (3.23), Monsun (3.72), and Kingmambo (3.06); six 'Major established commercial sires'--Galileo (3.75), Smart Strike (3.16), Lemon Drop Kid (3.14), Giant's Causeway (3.09), Unbridled's Song (2.97) and Street Cry (2.96); and seven 'Young contenders', with their first foals now four-year-olds--the American quartet of Speightstown (4.08), Candy Ride (3.70), Medaglia d'Oro (3.68) and Tapit (3.58)--as well as Europeans Dalakhani (3.92) and Oasis Dream (3.19), and the surprise American representative in the top 20, Mineshaft (3.24), among sires with their first five-year-olds in 2010. **Cont. p6**

We have learned over the years that the A Runner Index for top young sires inevitably falls as they have more crops, so it is perhaps not as significant that F2006 Speightstown ranks second overall by A Runner Index at the moment, and F2005 Dalakhani third, as it is that their results show they are top young sires. The four top F2006 sires (first foals 2006, so first four-year-olds 2010) lead their sire crop not just by A Runner Index, but also by number of A Runners (Speightstown 26, Medaglia d'Oro 24, Tapit 21, Candy Ride 19), which is a sure indication they are getting quality in quantity.

Of the three F2005 sires with their first five-year-olds, Oasis Dream has far more year-starters (565) than do Mineshaft (324) and Dalakhani (268). Interestingly, when you look at the Top 50 by ABC Runner index, F2005 Mineshaft (65 ABC Runners from 324 year-starters, 2.51 ABC Index) has almost identical figures to F2006 Medaglia d'Oro (also 65 ABC Runners, from 326 year-starters, 2.49 ABC Index). They are one starter off, on either side, from having exactly 20 percent ABC Runners from year-starters, which is a 2.50 ABC Index. F2006 Speightstown, with 67 ABC Runners from 319 year-starters (2.63 ABC Index, 21 percent of year-starters) has very similar numbers.

The youngsters disappear when you look at the two Top 50 tables by number of A Runners and ABC Runners. You'll see on the table by number of A Runners 2004-10 that A.P. Indy (111) and Sadler's Wells (109) are well out in front, followed at a respectful distance by Giant's Causeway (94), Smart Strike (85), Danehill Dancer (82), Distorted Humor (75) and Unbridled's Song (73). Then come Stormy Atlantic (67) and Galileo (65), whose first foals didn't even race until 2005, so he's at least a year behind the others on this list.

A.P. Indy tops the table by number of ABC Runners, too, as you can see, with 266, which is more than 23 percent of his year-starters. In other words, he's as good as it gets. Distorted Humor (262, about 19 percent of his year-starters) and Giant's Causeway (259, about 17 percent) are the only other sires near A.P. Indy's total. Sadler's Wells ranks fourth, with 228 ABC Runners since 2004, and Langfuhr is fifth, with 216. Besides ranking sixth by number of A Runners (75), Distorted Humor also features as the number one sire of B Runners (74), and the number one sire of C Runners (113). It's no wonder Distorted Humor and A.P. Indy are crossing well; they're two of the most prolific sires of good horses in America, that is for sure.

WAGERING LEGISLATION UNVEILED IN CAL

A bill that would raise the takeout rate and legalize exchange wagering in California has been put before the state legislature. Under the bill, the rate for exotic bets involving two horses would go from 20.68 percent to 22.68 percent, and those involving three or more horses would rise from 20.68 to 23.68 percent. The takeout on straight wagers would remain at 15.43 percent. Horsemen have voiced support for the legislation. "It should be positive when people realize what it will do," Arnold Zetcher, president of Thoroughbred Owners of California, told *Daily Racing Form*. "It's a raise for trainers and jockeys and a positive step forward. It's clearly substantial and we think it can make a difference." But Jeff Platt, president of the Horseplayers Association of North America, was against the raise. "My first reaction is it leaves a bad taste in my mouth," Platt told *DRF*. "They'll see a drop in handle and total revenue because of it." It's uncertain if there will be a vote on the bill before the session ends Aug. 31.

PURSES RAISED FOR MONMOUTH FALL MEET

The average daily purses for the 22-day fall meet at Monmouth Park, which starts Sept. 11, will be \$375,000, it was announced yesterday. Purses for the meeting had been projected to average \$250,000 to \$300,000 a day. Racing will be held Saturdays and Sundays through Nov. 21. "It's always a good thing when you have more money to offer," said Bob Kulina, vice president and general manager of Monmouth. "The amount of money distributed at the Elite Summer Meet versus the amount of money available has created a surplus for the fall. It's good news for Monmouth Park, the horsemen and racing fans." Kulina added, "The numbers we've experienced this summer [during the \$1 million Elite Summer Meet] have been a game changer for racing in New Jersey. By offering more than expected this fall, we're hoping the momentum we've built this summer will continue and add to an already record-breaking year for racing in the Garden State."

That price was later matched by Sir Robert Ogden's Racing Manager Barry Simpson for Rathbarry Stud's hip 205, a son of the deceased Le Vie dei Colori (GB) whose dam is an unraced half to MGSW Eastern Purple (Ire) (Petorius {Ire}). He cost Brian Grassick Bloodstock only €38,000 at the Goffs November Foal Sale, and is set to join Wootton Bassett's trainer Richard Fahey as Ogden's yearling spending spree continues apace. "He's a very racy individual," Simpson told *Racing Post*. "He's a good-bodied with a good attitude. He's a strong colt who looks a two-year-old."
