WIDE-OPEN TRAVERS DRAWS 11

The prevailing sentiment regarding the 141st running of the GI Travers S. at Saratoga? It's anybody's race.

Trainer Kieran McLaughlin, who made the 11th hour decision to drop **Trappe Shot** (Tapit)'s name in the Travers hat, couldn't pinpoint a standout. "I'm afraid of them all," McLaughlin said with a smile. Todd Pletcher saddles GI Kentucky Derby hero **Super Saver** (Maria's Mon), and obviously likes his chances, but

added, "I wouldn't be surprised by anybody winning." John Kimmel, who handles New York-bred **Friend Or Foe** (Friends Lake), narrowed the field a bit. "It's a wide-open race; seven or eight horses have a legitimate chance," Kimmel remarked. "It's going to come down to who gets the trip and who runs his race on the day." The morning-line favorite at a tepid 7-2 is, appropriately, July 31 GII Jim Dandy S. winner **A Little Warm** (Stormin Fever). First or second in eight of his nine career starts, the Ned Evans homebred drew post five.

★ "TDN Rising Star" ★ Trappe Shot, runner-up in the Aug. 1 GI Haskell Invitational S. at Monmouth last time out, drew post two, and is the 4-1 second favorite. Explaining why he and owner Nicholas Brady opted for the Travers rather than the seven-furlong GI King's Bishop S. on the Travers undercard, McLaughlin said, "We feel like he can get the mile and a quarter, and it's not too often you can be the second choice in the Travers." As for his draw, the conditioner offered, "Well, we won't have to worry about being wide."

Pletcher was philosophical about getting the far outside in the 11-horse field for Super Saver. "Eleven might be a little farther out than you'd ideally like, but he's capable of doing just about anything the rider wants," he said. "The interesting thing to me is that most of the speed has drawn inside. He can fall in there somewhere [behind the speed], it just depends on how fast the pace is and where [jockey Calvin Borel] feels comfortable tucking him in." Super Saver ran eighth in the GI Preakness S. and weakened to be fourth in the Haskell, but Pletcher expects improvement in the Travers. "I think he ran an improved race in the Haskell," he said. "I think he got a little tired the last 100 yards, and he should move forward off that race." Trainer Nick Zito sends the trio of GII Jim Dandy S. runner-up **Miner's Reserve** (Mineshaft), GI Kentucky Derby second-place finisher **Ice Box** (Pulpit) and GII Dwyer S. hero **Fly Down** (Mineshaft). Miner's Reserve has been assigned post one. "I would have preferred to be a little outside with Miner's," Zito offered. "It's a tough post. We'll see. First Dude is outside of him. Trappe Shot is outside of him. It doesn't look too promising there, I'll be honest with you. The other two are fine, they come from behind. But that's kind of rough." **Field, p2**

won last year by WinStar Farm's Rule (Roman Ruler), was previously worth \$750,000. "We are committed to making the \$1-million Delta Downs Jackpot one of the most important two-year-old stakes on the national racing calendar," said Paul Chakmak, COO of Boyd Gaming. "The late November date and \$1-million purse will provide a path

for a run at the 2011 Triple Crown." Delta Downs Jackpot Day, worth \$2.4 million in total purses, will also feature the \$500,000 GIII Delta Princess S. for juvenile fillies, as well as two juvenile races for Louisiana bred horses--the \$250,000 Delta Legacy for colts and the \$250,000 Delta Jewel for two-year-old fillies.

RACETRACK Round-Up

MEMORY INSTALLED MOYGLARE FAVORITE

Highclere Thoroughbred Racing's unbeaten **Memory (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) has been installed as the 4-5 favorite and heads 16 possibles for Sunday's G1 Moyglare Stud S. at The Curragh. Winner of the June 18 G3 Albany S. at Royal Ascot and the July 7 G2 Cherry Hinton S. at Newmarket, the bay currently enjoys ante-post favoritism for next term's G1 1000 Guineas. "[Jockey] Richard [Hughes] is really pleased with Memory, and though the filly messed about at home in the spring, she has become so much more professional," explained trainer Richard Hannon. "She is fresh and raring for another race, so Sunday cannot come quick enough." Her opposition for the seven-furlong contest includes G2 Debutante S. vic-tress **Laughing Lashes** (Mr. Greeley), who has been added to the field at a cost of €23,500. **Kissable (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}), who will represent last year's winning trainer Kevin Prendergast, finished behind Laughing Lashes when third in the July 15 G3 Silver Flash S. at Leopardstown, and the conditioner is hopeful of an improved performance from the bay. "Kissable has come on well, we're hoping for a good run and I think the track will suit her better than Leopardstown," Prendergast said. "Leopardstown was a bit tight for her, she got a bit far back and came home well. She definitely needs dig in the ground, which we'll hopefully get on Sunday. It's a Group 1 and we'd be delighted if we finished in the first three or four." The track condition is currently described as good, but showers are forecast for later in the week.

REWILDING HEADS ST LEGER 16 Godolphin's G2 Great Voltigeur S. hero **Rewilding (GB)** (Tiger Hill {Ire}) heads the list of 16 entries for the Sept. 11 G1 St Leger, which was revealed yesterday. The former Andre Fabre trainee, now conditioned by Mahmood Al Zarooni at Newmarket, also ran third in the June 5 G1 Epsom Derby, and will bid to improve Godolphin's record of five victories in the £500,000 contest. He will attempt to follow in the hoofprints of last year's winner Mastery (GB) (Sulamani {Ire}). "Rewilding has been very well since the Great Voltigeur [at York]," said Al Zarooni. "The race didn't take as much out of him compared to the [G1 Epsom] Derby, as he didn't go to York fully wound up. The course at York suited him better than Epsom, where he didn't look comfortable, and the strong pace also helped him. I think that he will enjoy the step up to an extended mile and three quarters because he is a light horse. We don't do much with him at home, and we pushed him too hard earlier in the season to get him ready for the Derby, which took a lot out of him. We know him better now, and we know that we don't have to be too hard on him. He has the class to run well. Rewilding needs a good pace to be at his best, but it looks like there may be one or two horses remaining who will set the gallop. I was lucky enough to be at Doncaster when Mastery and Kite Wood finished first and second last year and it was a great day for Godolphin. We love to have Classic winners, and I am hopeful that Rewilding can add to our success in the race." Al Zarooni is also responsible for fellow Godolphin entry **Buzzword (GB)** (Pivotal {GB}), but the trainer suggested that the G1 Deutsches Derby hero will sidestep the world's oldest Classic, adding, "Buzzword will probably not head to Doncaster and he could go to Turkey for the Bosphorus Cup a week earlier. He stayed a mile and a half well in the German Derby, but I don't think that he would get the extra distance of the Ladbrokes St Leger." Other notable entries include G1 Epsom Oaks and G1 Irish Oaks victress **Snow Fairy (Ire)** (Intikhab), who finished second in last week's G1 Yorkshire Oaks, and the G1 Irish Derby first and second **Cape Blanco (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) and **Midas Touch (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}), who are part of a Ballydoyle entry of six. There is one final opportunity to enter the extended 14-furlong event, a £45,000 supplementary stage Sept. 6.

STONEWALL BIDS TO RETAIN STALLIONS

Motions were filed Aug. 24 by bankrupt entities of Stonewall Farm in an effort to retain ownership of the Florida-based Thoroughbred stallions Value Plus and Da Stoops and prevent them from being sold at the Keeneland November sale, *Daily Racing Form* reports. An emergency motion had been filed by a lender, a successor to Cincinnati Capital Corporation named Stone Wall Acquisition, in an attempt to seize control of the stallion in time to run them through the breeding stock sale at Keeneland, but Stonewall Farm argued that Value Plus and Da Stoops are the ownership entities' primary assets and are vital to their Chapter 11 reorganization plans. In court filings dated Aug. 15, Stone Wall Acquisition contended that the values of Value Plus and Da Stoops has declined and would continue to do so during the course of bankruptcy. The Stonewall entities countered, saying that the downturn in the Thoroughbred market is the primary factor in decreasing bloodstock values and that they expected the size of the stallions' books and, by extension, revenues, to increase in Ocala. Cincinnati Capital has already received a \$16-million judgment against Stonewall and its owner Audrey Haisfield in Pennsylvania, but that case is being held up by the bankruptcy proceedings. Stone Wall Acquisition is one of three lenders that has filed suit against Stonewall. Fifth Third Bank has sued for about \$14 million, while JP Morgan Chase is suing for about \$7 million.

**MIDTERM ELECTIONS SHORTEN
CONGRESSIONAL SCHEDULE**

Midterm election years, such as 2010, are those in which certain members of Congress (and some state legislatures and governors) are elected but no president is elected. These years are marked by a shortened Congressional schedule due to the time candidates must dedicate to campaigning.

Currently in recess, Congress is set to return in September. Below is a look at how the Congressional calendar may unfold for the balance of 2010.

In session: September 13 - October 8
Out: October 11 - November 12
In session: November 15-19
Out: Week of November 22 (Thanksgiving week)
In session: November 29 - Ending date TBD

Because of the general election on November 2, Congress may end the upcoming session before October 8, giving candidates additional time on the campaign trail.

Primary elections continue into September, including those in major Thoroughbred racing and breeding states New York and Maryland on the 14th.

NUMBERS UP AT OBSAUG The OBSAUG Yearling Sale began Tuesday with a Select session which realized significant across-the-board gains, and the numbers continued to soar during Wednesday's first Open session. A total of 243 yearlings grossed \$2,328,500 yesterday; during last year's comparative Open session, 190 head brought \$1,410,300. The day's average of \$9,582 was up 29 percent, while the median of \$6,500 rose a staggering 86 percent. "So far, the sale's gone well," OBS General Manager & Director of Sales Tom Ventura told *TDN*. "There are a lot of positives to talk about. All the numbers are moving the right way." Were the expectations set this high? "There's been some indications from earlier sales--the two-year-old market held up well and some of the yearling sales did show some stability. At least we've seen the bottom, and now we need to work our way up."

Topping yesterday's first Open session was [hip 300](#), a son of Mass Media out of the Defrere mare Defrills. Sarah McCord purchased the half-brother to stakes winner Awesome Son (Pure Precision) for \$50,000. He was consigned by Sharon Biamonte, Agent II. One consignor who was pleased with trade over the first two days was Beth Bayer. Bayer sold the likely sale topper Tuesday, a \$280,000 Any Given Saturday--Ricki S filly who was bought by Jeff Bonde and Mersad Metanovic, and followed up yesterday with the day's second-highest-price, [lot 244](#), a filly by Congrats--Chelsea Rose that went to Paul Sharp for \$47,000. She said many of her Wednesday horses met or exceeded expectations. "I've actually had a pretty good day today," said Bayer right after the sale. "I think I had 29 go through the ring, and bought back seven. The stars aligned on some of them. If you bring a good horse up there, there's money, there are people, and they want to buy them. If you don't have a commercial horse, you're pushing a little to get them sold. But I even got some of those horses sold, including some to end users, which is nice." Bayer attributed an improvement in RNA rates on Tuesday and Wednesday to sellers being more realistic with reserves. "They've adjusted to the market," she said. "And they're focused on getting horses sold." Despite the improvement in figures, Bayer said she didn't consider the market to be rebounding, but rather finding a groove in which buyers and seller are feeling more comfortable. "I think we're still in a transitional phase at this point," Bayer said. "I think people have accepted [the decline in the market], and now they're dealing with it." Art From Deco...

Carlos Rafael and Steve Schriever's Deco Farm sits on just 20 acres near Ocala, but the small operation enjoyed big-time success during Tuesday's lone selected session of the OBS August Yearling Sale. A filly from the first crop of Grade I winner Any Given Saturday (Distorted Humor) who was bred by Schriever and owned by Rafael brought a session-topping (and likely sale-topping) bid of \$280,000 from trainer Jeff Bonde and bloodstock agent Mersad

Metanovic. The filly, consigned by Beth Bayer as [hip 117](#), was purchased on behalf of California-based insurance executive Phil Lebherz.

"She was a beautiful, lovely filly," said Bayer. "She had great size, great scope, and a beautiful walk. She shipped in here, and was a 'wow' kind of filly, I thought. She carried her class all the way through. She was perfect to show and did everything right every time you brought her out. You knew she was pretty special when she was in the barn."

Added Bayer, "We knew she was going to sell very well, we just didn't know how well. After \$200,000, we were very excited. Don't get me wrong--we were excited to get to \$200,000, but after that it was *really* exciting. We thought she'd top the sale, we just didn't know what she'd bring."

Named Going Mavericki, the filly represents a long, mildly convoluted trip that began when her dam, Ricki S (Prized), was offered at this sale in 2003.

Ricki S is a daughter of Brassy (Dixie Brass), who had been acquired privately by Schriever as a broodmare roughly eight years ago. Brassy had produced two foals when Schriever bought her, the second of which, Brass Hat, would go on to be a multi-surface star who is still competing in graded stakes at the age of nine. Back in 2003, however, Brass Hat was still five months away from debuting in a \$15,000 maiden claimer at Turfway when Schriever offered Ricki S, the first horse he bred from Brassy, as a yearling at OBS August. Bidding was less than spirited, however, and Schriever bought her back for just \$3,500. That proved to be the right decision when, within a year's time, Brass Hat collected his first graded stakes win in the GII Ohio Derby. Brass Hat would go on to win the 2006 renewal of the GI Donn H. at Gulfstream and, in total, has now won five graded events and banked \$2,097,921.

In a career limited to three starts, Ricki S also showed some ability. In her second start in April of 2005, she closed from some 20 lengths back to take a two-turn grassy maiden special weight at Tampa Bay by 6 1/4 lengths. She made a similar run to be second in an allowance race a month later before being retired.

While Brass Hat was doing his thing through the middle of the decade, Schriever, an Orlando-based businessman who works in construction, joined forces with Carlos Rafael. A native of Peru whose family is involved in politics, Rafael, a lawyer by education, opted not to pursue that line of work and instead follow his heart into horse racing.

"In Peru, the horses were a hobby for my family," Rafael explained. "We never made our living at it. My father is involved in politics in Peru, and we have a farm there, but he didn't have much time to devote to it. It was something we did on the weekends. When I came to the U.S., I came to get my law degree. But I didn't want to do that. I loved the horses and I love the people, and I said, 'I can do this.'"

Rafael began managing a farm in Ocala in 1999 and, five years later, struck out on his own, teaming with Schriever to buy Deco Farm.

"It's a small operation, but we have good mares with good pedigrees," said Rafael. "[Schriever] has a few mares that he owns, I have a few myself, and then we are partners on a few. We are just trying to keep going in the right direction."

While Schriever is listed as the breeder on Going Mavericki, Rafael and Schriever owned the filly in partnership originally before Rafael bought out his partner in March.

"She was born at our place--I foaled the mare--and I liked the way she was looking," Rafael explained. "She was coming along so well, I was actually debating whether I should take her to Kentucky. But I decided to leave her in Ocala because I thought she could be a big fish in a small pond. It worked out well."

Ricki S produced a colt by Grand Slam this spring, while Brassy had an Any Given Saturday filly, who, like Going Mavericki, has been purchased outright by Rafael.

"I'm very happy [with Tuesday's result]," said Rafael. "We've got the mama, the Grand Slam colt, who looks like a really nice horse, and we have Brassy, too."

Not facing such division heavyweights here, the Majesty Stud homebred tracked Johannesburg Smile through a half in :47.88 before asserting himself shortly thereafter. He had a clear lead in midstretch, but looked to be getting leg weary as odds-on Ibboeye began to make up ground up the center of the track. **Cont. p4**
