PERSISTENTLY TO BELDAME

Persistently (Smoke Glacken) appeared to exit her victory over Horse of the Year **Rachel Alexandra** (Medaglia d'Oro) in Sunday's GI Personal Ensign Invitational in fine form, according to trainer Shug

McGaughey. "A lot of times it doesn't hit them until a couple of days later, but she cooled out great," said McGaughey. "We've retooled [her schedule] to point for the [GI] Beldame S. [at Belmont Oct. 2]; that's our next stop." The four-year-old won her first start of the season going a mile in a Gulfstream allowance Jan. 10. In the money in her next two over that trip, the filly

failed to fire when eighth trying a sixteenth further on the Belmont sod May 14. Third in a \$50,000 optional claimer on Belmont's main track June 18, she relished the extra yardage, winning by two lengths in her latest start in a nine-furlong test at the Spa July 30. "It's funny, I always thought she was a come from behind sprinter," McGaughey said. "When the book came out and there was a two-other-than going a mile and an eighth, I thought, 'Well, might as well give it a try.' She ran a great race that day. [Sunday] I think she would have run around there again. Her pedigree says that--I should have been a bit smarter. I remember Heavenly Prize struggled a little bit early in her three-year-old year and we ran her in the [GI] Alabama S., 10 furlongs] and then it was all different." According to McGaughey, who has trained four winners of the event including the late Ogden Phipps' Heavenly Prize in 1995, Persistently was not originally intended for the Personal Ensign, however, the decision was made to give it a go after conferring with owner Ogden 'Dinny' Phipps. The senior Phipps also campaigned champion Personal Ensign, who died earlier this year at age 26. "[Dinny] Phipps said he thought if it came up a short field, he would like to give this a try, which was probably down deep what I wanted to do, too," McGaughey explained. "Going into it, believe me, it was all 'Let's see what happens.' We weren't going into it thinking we were going to win."

Life At Ten Also Possible for Beldame...

Trainer Todd Pletcher reported that **Life At Ten** (Malibu Moon), who pressed Rachel Alexandra for much of Sunday's Personal Ensign before finishing third, returned from the race in good order. "She was tired, no doubt about it," said Pletcher. "In that situation, if you're going to try to win, and no one else has any speed...if our objective was to be Grade I-placed or to secure second, we would have approached it maybe a little differently. We wanted to try to win, and ultimately, got tired doing that." Looking ahead, Pletcher indicated the GI Beldame S. was a possibility, with the ultimate goal the GI Breeders' Cup Ladies Classic at Churchill Downs Nov. 5. "I don't think we'll need to run her at 1 1/4 miles again," said the trainer. Defending Horse of the Year Rachel Alexandra also came out of the race in good order, confirmed trainer Steve Asmussen yesterday. "How she comes back to the track is our focus now," said Asmussen. The four-year-old is expected to return to the track Wednesday.

COOLMORE TO STAND CANFORD CLIFFS

Canford Cliffs (Ire) (Tagula {Ire}--Mrs Marsh {GB}), by Marju {Ire}) is set to stand at Coolmore Stud for the 2012 breeding season, the *Racing Post* revealed yesterday. The G1 Irish 2000 Guineas, G1 St James's Palace S. and G1 Sussex S. winner is currently owned by a syndicate involving Robin Heffer and the British Horseracing Authority Chairman Paul Roy, with the latter understood to remain a shareholder until the end of this season. According to the trade daily, the imminent deal will mean the Richard Hannon trainee will race on in Heffer's colors this term and next before taking up stud duties in 2012.

MINER'S RESERVE INJURED

Miner's Reserve (Mineshaft), who tired to seventh after setting the pace in Saturday's GI Travers S., will miss several months of training after sustaining a hair-line fracture to his right knee, according to trainer Nick Zito. "Friday night, when we checked him out, his legs were cold," explained Zito, who trains Miner's Reserve for Bob LaPenta. "After he ran, he got a little short walking, and we thought it was the foot, for sure. We put the foot-testers on him, and he jumped. And yesterday, he didn't get any better. So, his legs were ice cold, and we X-rayed him, and there was a line in the knee. So he'll be out for a few months." A 5 3/4-length winner in an 8 1/2-furlong test at Belmont May 31, the bay finished runner-up behind A Little Warm in a Delaware \$40,000 optional claimer before finishing in that same spot behind that rival in the July 31 GII Jim Dandy S.

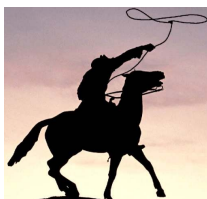

RACETRACK Round-Up

BALLYDOYLE DOMINATE CHAMPION ENTRY

Aidan O'Brien was yesterday responsible for half of the 10 remaining in Saturday's G1 Tattersalls Millions Champion S. at Leopardstown. While plans for the recent G1 Juddmonte International hero **Rip Van Winkle (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), **Fame and Glory (GB)** (Montjeu {Ire}) and **Cape Blanco (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) have yet to be clarified, the stable looks set to run at least two of that trio, with last year's

G1 Dewhurst S. and recent G3 Desmond S. scorer **Beeethoven (Ire)** (Oratorio {Ire}) and potential pacemaker **Black Quartz (Fr)** (Danehill

Dancer {Ire}) also in the mix. "We'll see how the horses are over the next few days and then make plans," O'Brien told the *Racing Post*. "Rip hasn't done a whole lot since York, whereas we've always had the Leopardstown race pencilled in for Fame and Glory and Cape Blanco." Khalid Abdullah's two entries are the Dermot Weld-trained multiple group winner **Famous Name (GB)** (Dansili {GB}) and G1 Eclipse hero and Juddmonte runner-up **Twice Over (GB)** (Observatory) from the Henry Cecil stable. Mark Johnston yesterday paid €75,000 to supplement Sheikh Hamdan bin Mohammed Al Maktoum's recent G3 Sovereign S. winner **Sea Lord (Ire)** (Cape Cross {Ire}). Godolphin has left in **Cavalryman (GB)** (Halling) and Clive Cox the G3 Rose of Lancaster S. scorer **Poet (GB)** (Pivotal {GB}), but his participation depends on the ground easing this week. "We have left him in at the moment, but we are going to need more rain," Cox told *PA Sport*. "Rain is forecast for Saturday, but the rest of the week looks dry, so we will just have to wait and see."

Memory Fine after Moyglare Flop

Highclere Thoroughbred Racing's **Memory (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) was yesterday reported none the worse for her below-par effort in Sunday's G1 Moyglare Stud S. at The Curragh. Losing her unbeaten record when sixth as the even-money favorite, the G2 Cherry Hinton S. and G3 Albany S. winner will be trained for Newmarket's G1 Cheveley Park S. Oct. 1. "There is not a bother on Memory," trainer Richard Hannon said. "She is bucking and kicking like she never had a race, so we will freshen her up for the Cheveley Park S. at Newmarket. We still think that she is a very good filly and we hope that she will bounce back at Newmarket."

Blame Arrives At Keeneland

Blame (Arch) returned to Keeneland Monday morning and will begin his final preparations for the GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Churchill Downs Nov. "He always travels good," said Glenn Brookfield, assistant trainer for Al Stall Jr.

"He stands there and begs for mints. He is quite the schmoozer." The four-year-old colt, who was stabled at Saratoga over the summer, flew in to Lexington's Bluegrass Airport at 9:20 a.m. In his most recent start, the bay won the GI

Whitney H. Aug. 7. According to Brookfield, the colt is expected to the track Tuesday morning for a jog "to survey his kingdom." He added, "He thinks he owns the place here." He will then gallop the rest of the week before breezing over the weekend. Blame's most recent breeze was recorded on Aug. 27, when he worked four furlongs in :50.95 over Saratoga's Oklahoma training track.

Starspangledbanner Has Cup Option

Coolmore's **Starspangledbanner (Aus)** (Choisir {Aus}) could be asked to make a quick return in Saturday's G1 Betfred Sprint Cup at Haydock, for which 20 remained at yesterday's six-day stage. Runner-up in the Aug. 20 G1 Nunthorpe S. at York, the G1 Golden Jubilee and July Cup hero holds entries in the G1 Prix de l'Abbaye at Longchamp Oct. 3 and G1 Hong Kong Sprint at Sha Tin Dec. 12 and also the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. over Ascot's mile. "Starspangledbanner has done little or nothing since finishing second in the Nunthorpe," Aidan O'Brien told the *Racing Post*. "He'll do something either on Tuesday or Wednesday and we'll see how he is before making any plans." Also among the entries is the triple Group 1 winner **Paco Boy (Ire)** (Desert Style {Ire}), who also holds an entry in Sunday's G1 Prix du Moulin over a mile at Longchamp. "He ran very well in the July Cup last year and the owners are keen for him to take his chance," Richard Hannon, Jr. told the *Racing Post*. "The ground will be to his liking and he's in good nick at home. He could go for the G1 Prix Moulin at Longchamp instead though; we've also left him in that." James Acheson's G1 King's Stand S. winner **Equiano (Fr)** (Acclamation {GB}) and last year's winner and recent G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest scorer **Regal Parade (GB)** (Pivotal {GB}) are other notables remaining in the six-furlong contest.

Exchange Betting Stalled in Cali?

A bill to allow exchange betting in California was altered over the weekend to delay the implementation of the controversial form of wagering until at least 2012, according to *Daily Racing Form*. "It gives everyone in the industry time to work through their issues and come up with the regulations," said Keith Brackpool, chairman of the California Horse Racing Board (CHRB), told the publication.

The bill, AB2414, is currently being considered by the California state legislature, which has yet to pass a budget despite today's scheduled recess. The legislature could stay in session beyond today, meaning the final outcome of the bill is not yet certain. As of last week, there were three major components to AB2414, including one that would raise the takeout on two-horse exotic wagers by two percent, (from 20.68 percent to 22.68 percent), and boost the takeout on three-horse exotic wagers by three percent (from 20.68 percent to 23.68 percent). The generated revenue would be earmarked for purses--up to \$30 million a year, say proponents.

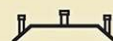
A second, more controversial component would have made legal exchange betting--made popular overseas by operations such as Betfair. That portion of the bill has been opposed by both Magna and Churchill Downs, which own and operate advance deposit wagering (ADW) platforms, while supported by Betfair, which owns and operates TVG, the television network and ADW. The bill also enjoyed support from the CHRB, California Breeders Association, Hollywood Park, Del Mar, the Oak Tree Racing Association, the Jockeys' Guild, and the Thoroughbred Owners of California (TOC). But TOC president Arnold Zetcher said he was fine with a delay in exchange wagering. "It gives everybody enough time to understand the exchange portion," he told *DRF*.

California would have been the first state in the U.S. to allow exchange betting, though New Jersey is considering it. In the current form of AB2414, the takeout increase would go into effect in December. The third component of the bill designates money to the Breeders' Cup when it is held in the state.

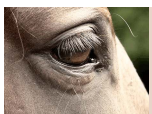

One of the hot topics in the British racing press in recent weeks has been whether the American bloodstock industry still has a lot to offer Europe. Consignor Ted Voute, discussing the lack of European interest at the Saratoga sales in the *Racing Post*, cited "a lack of turf sires standing in the U.S., as well as the underlying feeling of unsoundness voiced by many trainers of U.S.-bred stock."

Then Michele MacDonald speculated in *Thoroughbred Owner & Breeder* that European buyers will be in short supply at Keeneland's September sale. Mark Johnston, a qualified vet who regularly saddles more winners than any other British trainer, commented:

"There is definitely less reason for Europeans to come. If you are looking where to buy the best horses, it's in Europe. Also, I've always been concerned about the high percentage of yearlings in America that have been given some kind of surgery. They are not as sound as European horses." [but Johnston quickly strove to balance that view by adding that "there are still a high number of horses with exciting pedigrees, so we want to come. But I think we'll be choosier than before and buy fewer horses."]

Tom Goff, of Blandford Bloodstock, added that he would be at Keeneland for 10 days, "as will a lot of Europeans. They'll want to buy horses by good stallions, but there are quite clearly a finite number of stallions that are of interest to Europeans."

Goff too beat the drum for European stallions, saying, "The American bloodstock industry needs to realise that at the moment the European stallions are the best in the world."

In defending the American position, Keeneland's Geoffrey Russell pointed out that "the two most influential stallions of my lifetime are Northern Dancer and Danzig--and remember, neither one of them ran on turf."

It was hardly inexplicable, though, that these two stallions should have had such a huge impact in Europe. Northern Dancer, after all, had a pedigree which featured the exceptional European stallions Nearco and Hyperion in the first three generations, together with the record-breaking Derby winner Mahmoud. As a son of Northern Dancer, Danzig had these same bloodlines and his second dam, Petitioner, was an imported daughter of the Epsom Oaks winner Steady Aim.

It isn't just coincidence that two of the American stallions with the greatest appeal to Europeans have close links to Europe. The Irish-foaled Street Cry is out of the Irish Oaks winner Helen Street, whose sire--Troy--was a magnificent winner of the Epsom Derby. Then there's Medaglia d'Oro, whose sire El Prado was the product of a mating between the Irish Classic winners Sadler's Wells and Lady Capulet.

There now looks to be every chance that Europeans will be paying very close attention to the second-crop yearlings by Bernardini, even though there is little in his pedigree to suggest that his stock would shine in Europe.

This winner of the Preakness, Travers and Jockey Club Gold Cup in 2006 has had only four runners in Britain, but three of them have won. The first to do so was Theyskens' Theory, whose background was detailed on Pages 11 and 12 in the Aug. 29 edition of TDN. Despite failing to find a buyer at last year's Saratoga sale, this impressive filly won her second start by five lengths at the end of July and then earned the position of ante-post favorite for next year's 1,000 Guineas with her victory in the G3 Prestige S. three days ago.

British winner number two for Bernardini came on Aug. 6, when Godolphin's \$350,000 purchase Biondetti made a winning debut at Newmarket, at the expense of the subsequent winner Buthelezi. Winner number three came a week later when Treasury Devil, a colt who failed to find a buyer at \$1,000,000 at Saratoga, scored in excellent style over seven furlongs at Newbury. The one non-winner, Zanazzi, has been second in each of her three starts.

Although the scene of Bernardini's success is a surprise, there was every reason to expect him to make the grade. He is extremely well qualified on the score of racecourse performance, pedigree and conformation. The compilers of the 2006 World Thoroughbred Racehorse Rankings rated him the joint-top three-year-old with Discreet Cat on a figure of 128, ahead of such talented European colts as George Washington, Rail Link and Dylan Thomas.

He is also the son of two Grade I winners, his sire being the dual champion sire A.P. Indy, and he represents the prolific A.P. Indy-Fappiano cross which has also produced the very promising stallion Tapit, along with such as General Quarters, I Want Revenge, A.P. Adventure, Sky Diva and Great Hunter.

Bernardini's conformation is also largely fault-free and the word handsome could almost have been coined specially for him.

Having said all that, he didn't look a natural for the European industry. Just look at the facts.

Although A.P. Indy has sired Grade I winners on turf and has a total of nearly 80 graded winners to his credit, his European-raced progeny have nothing better than a couple of Group 3 successes to their credit. These came from Mingun in Ireland and Admiral's Cruise in England. Even Mineshaft (who was in fine form with Discreetly Mine and Fly Down over the week-end) showed nothing like the full extent of his ability on European turf. Timeform rated him 109 at three, but 132 after his Horse of the Year exploits on dirt the following year.

Extend the search to A.P. Indy's stallion sons and you'll again find they have had very limited success in Europe. They have collectively sired more than 80 graded winners but, prior to Theyskens' Theory's success, only one of them had scored in Europe, this being the Pulpit colt Govinda, a Group 3 sprint winner this year in Germany.

Of course the mere idea that a male line is unsuited to European conditions can quickly become a self-fulfilling prophecy, as a male line can't correct this impression if buyers or breeders aren't prepared to give it a chance.

It has been a similar story with the Fappiano male line, which has supplied only a handful of group winners in Europe. The only members to have hit the group target are Tasso, Volponi, Empire Maker and Bernardini's broodmare sire Quiet American.

So why is Bernardini making such an eye-catching start east of the Atlantic? Fortunately for him, he is owned by people with very large racing interests in Europe, so he should enjoy opportunities often denied American-raced stallions.

It is also important to look at the bottom halves of the pedigrees of Bernardini's three British winners. Theyskens' Theory--a three-parts-sister to Stevie Wonderboy--is out of a mare whose grandsires are the European champions Storm Bird and Roberto. Biondetti --a three-parts-brother to the graded American turf winners Indy Five Hundred and Delta Princess--is out of Lyphard's Delta, winner of the G2 Nassau S. at Goodwood. And Treasury Devil is out of Nureyev's very talented daughter Crystal Music, winner of the G1 Fillies' Mile.

All three winners are out of grand-daughters or great granddaughters of Northern Dancer. As Bernardini's pedigree features only one line of Northern Dancer, back in the fourth generation, he represents something of an outcross for many European mares. Although his stallion career is still in its infancy, it's tempting to wonder whether he could be one of the horses capable of putting American stallions back in the ascendance.

Haisfields Ordered to Pay \$14.7 Million:

Audrey Haisfield and son Marc have been ordered by Pamela Goodwine, a Fayette, Kentucky circuit court judge, to pay Fifth Third Bank a sum of over \$14.7 million as the guarantors of loans taken out by Stonewall Farm, reports the *Daily Racing Form*.

Fifth Third, which has also sued 14 Stonewall-related entities over the loans, came to an agreement with Stonewall Farm to put more than 100 of the farm's broodmares and their produce into receivership earlier this summer. A judgement total of \$14,759,670,24 does not include a \$300,000 credit for proceeds from the sale of the stallion Strong Contender (Maria's Mon) to Marc Haisfield. Eight Stonewall entities have filed for bankruptcy in Florida and Kentucky.

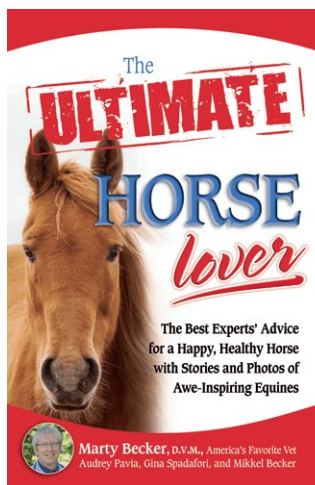
