A pumped-up Patrick Valenzuela was in the irons. "What a runner he is!" said the rider. "I had so much horse under me, I couldn't believe it. It was just a question of when. 'LUCKY' IN FIRST POST-HASKELL WORK

Lookin At Lucky (Smart Strike) was back on the worktab yesterday after missing training time with an illness. The three-year-old, who hasn't raced since his impressive win in the GI Haskell Invitational at

Monmouth Aug. 1, went a relaxed four panels at Del Mar in :49.40 (26/45). "He went around easy," trainer Bob Baffert told *Daily Racing Form*. "I was going to work him on Monday, but I decided to give him a couple more days of galloping. He's going to Hollywood Park next, and he'll work

there." Baffert said that the GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Churchill Nov. 6 remains the ultimate goal for the protem divisional leader, but hasn't picked out a return spot. "I'm just trying to get him right again," said Baffert. "I can't think of any races yet. There are options out there. I'll let him tell me. I can't run him until he's training like he was before the Haskell."

KY APPROVES OUT-OF-COMPETITION TESTING

The Kentucky Horse Racing Commission on Tuesday unanimously approved out-of-competition drug testing for race horses. Aimed in particular at rooting out blood-doping agents like Erythropoietin (EPO), which can be hard to detect in post-race tests, the regulation allows the KHRC to test horses regardless of where they reside--in state or out--so long as they might race in Kentucky. Violations carry stiff penalties. Horses who test positive for a prohibited substance will be barred from racing for 180 days and required to test clean after that period. Trainers, meanwhile, will be subjected to suspensions from between five and 10 years and fines of up to \$50,000. The measure, fast-tracked through the commission in order to be in place for the Breeders' Cup World Championships at Churchill Nov. 5-6, was given 'emergency status,' which means it will go into effect once signed by Gov. Steve Beshear.

J P's Gusto was a maiden making his second start when he captured the Willard Proctor Memorial S. at Hollywood Park May 31. He lived up to 3-5 favoritism in the GIII Hollywood Juvenile Championship July 5, and added the GII Best Pal S. at Del Mar Aug. 8. Breaking from post four here, he raced up to challenge longshot Comma to the Top (Bwana Charlie) from the inside through :22.72 and :45.46 splits. The bay began to get away approaching the quarter pole, then leveled out nicely in the stretch. "This was his best effort," said trainer David Hofmans, who said he thought the 1 1/16 miles of the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, at Churchill Nov. 6, was within the ridgling's scope. "Mainly because of his attitude," Hofmans added. "He's very smart, and he waits for the

rider to give him his cues. When I saw him inside on the turn and his ears were up, I was pretty comfortable. It was obvious he was waiting for Patrick [Valenzuela] to give him his cue. The more I train him, the more I think he'll go on. He's very smart. Probably smarter than me." It was Valenzuela's second win in the Del Mar Futurity; his first came 20 year's ago on Best Pal in 1990. Riveting Reason (Fusaichi Pegasus) and Indian Winter (Indian Charlie) dead-heated for third.

Rumoush, who was seventh in the G1 1000 Guineas at Newmarket May 2 before finishing fourth at Epsom, looked in need of farther than the 10 furlongs of Deauville's G3 Prix de Psyche when third behind Zagora (Fr) (Green Tune) last time July 31, but has to prove stamina for the extended distance of this "Fillies' St Leger." Owner/breeder Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's racing manager Angus Gold told *PA Sport*, "There is obviously a bit of a question mark about the trip, but I saw her a week ago and thought she'd done particularly well physically since Deauville. We'll just have to see whether she stays and whether she's good enough. Marcus [Tregoning] has always thought a lot of her, and as long as the ground is not too soft, it should be fine." Last year G3 Prix d'Aumale winner **Middle Club** also looked to need a step up in trip when third in the Aug. 12 G3 Prix Minerve over 1 9/16 miles also at Deauville when last seen. Trainer Richard Hannon scored with a similar type in The Miniver Rose (Ire) (High Chaparral {Ire}) 12 months ago. "Obviously, this is a step up in trip, but she was not stopping at the end of the extended mile and a half at Deauville, and she is an out-and-out galloper who we think will stay," he commented. "A drop of rain would help, and I'm hopeful of a good run."

NTRA REPORT FROM CAPITOL HILL



SENATE NARROWS FOCUS FOR SEPTEMBER

Congress will have just 20 or fewer days remaining in the regular session when it returns to Capitol Hill on September 13. The return is short-lived to give those Members up for re-election sufficient time to campaign for the November 2 general election.

Heading the list of the Senate's agenda items before the next recess is a small-business financial incentives bill. Senate Majority Leader Harry Reid (D-NV) was not successful in moving the bill during the summer work period as few Republicans were on board. GOP Members have resisted the legislation as harmful to the economy. Reid has scheduled the small-business bill as one of the first roll-call votes after the Senate's return next week.

Other areas that the Senate is targeting in September include votes on extending the 2001 and 2003 Bush tax cuts, climate change and appropriations. If new appropriations bills do not pass by the end of the Congressional fiscal year on October 1, Congress will likely resort to a continuing resolution (CR) on spending.

The November elections remain the dominant concern of both parties, with polls showing Republicans poised to recapture the House and possibly the Senate.

Having beaten stable companion Sholokhov with ease in the G2 Futurity S. on his previous visit to the track, the imposing bay appeared to have only the G3 Vintage S. scorer Naheef standing in the way of another straightforward success. In the event, the way he brushed aside that Godolphin raider was breathtaking, with his rush from rear under a typically confident Mick Kinane suggesting he had all the world at his feet ahead of the 2002 Classics. Despite there being some stellar performances in this race down the years, nothing has come within two seconds of his outstanding winning time that eclipsed the previous all-aged record. It is no surprise that Aidan O'Brien spent the next spring talking of the Triple Crown and said at the time, "Hawk Wing looks more like a four-year-old and has a lot of class and a huge stride. He has a lot of speed, but also stamina in his pedigree and is a wonderful-looking colt with great presence." The remainder of Hawk Wing's career is history, but the flash of brilliance in evidence in this performance was burning bright once more in the Lockinge at the start of his truncated four-year-old campaign.

HOBEAU DISPERSAL ENDS AN ERA

The legendary Hobeau Farm will be completely dissolved when the last of five yearlings goes through the Keeneland September sales ring next week. The dispersal, which began last May, has featured record-setting sales toppers and has reinforced the enduring legacy of the Florida breeding and racing operation founded by the late Jack Dreyfus in the 1960s.

The dispersal of Hobeau has been a mixed bag for the farm's longtime manager Craig Wheeler.

"It's bittersweet," Wheeler admitted. "It's sad to see the whole thing come to an end, but it's rewarding to see us end up with such fine stock to sell. Our horses are running good right now--they've been running in some big races. It's very rewarding to know that we did a good job raising and breeding some nice horses. But it's hard to see 30 years' worth of my work--50 years' work for Mr. Dreyfus, but 30 years for me--come to an end. It took a little bit of time to mentally accept it and move on to the next era, but that's what we've done. Mr. Dreyfus isn't around, but he would have been real proud to be presenting these yearlings to the market."

Beginning in 1962, Hobeau Farm was ranked in the top 10 in national earnings for 15 consecutive years and was the country's leading earner in 1967. Dreyfus received an Eclipse Award of Merit in 1977. Among its early stars, the farm was represented by Beau Purple, who defeated five-time Horse of the Year Kelso three times, including in the 1962 Man o' War S. Hobeau was also responsible for upsetting Triple Crown winner Secretariat twice, with Onion in the 1973 GII Whitney S. and with Prove Out in that year's GI Woodward S. Those accomplishments helped earn the farm's future Hall of Fame trainer Allen Jerkens the title of the "Giant Killer."

More recent stakes winners to carry Hobeau's blazing orange silks include **Swap Fliparoo** (Exchange Rate),

who won the 2006 GI Test S. and **Miss Shop** (Deputy Minister), who captured the 2007 GI Personal Ensign S. **Delightful Kiss** (Kissin Kris) carried Hobeau's colors to victory in the 2007 GII Ohio Derby, while multiple graded stakes winner **Kelly Kip** (Kipper Kelly) set

four track records and earned over \$1 million while racing for the farm from 1996 through 2000.

Dreyfus, who founded the Dreyfus Funds and was credited with inventing the commonplace mutual fund, was a member of The Jockey Club and served as chairman of the New York Racing Association's Board of Trustees in 1969 and 1975. The Alabama native sold the 2,200-acre Hobeau Farm in Ocala in 2005. He died in March 2009 at the age of 95.

The Hobeau Farm dispersal began with a bang at last year's Fasig-Tipton Midlantic sale when a son of Tapit topped the auction with a final bid of \$850,000. It was the highest price ever paid for a horse at public auction in Maryland. Out of Shopping (Private Account) and a

half-brother to Hobeau's Grade I winner Miss Shop, the colt was named Trappe Shot. He has gone on to win this year's Long Branch S. and was second in the GI Haskell Invitational at Monmouth Park.

The dispersal was again in the headlines this spring when a daughter of Limehouse out of Deputy's Delight (French Deputy) topped the OBS Spring Sale with a bid of \$500,000. The half-sister to Delightful Kiss, now named Delightful Mary, made an impressive start to her racing career with a 3 3/4-length debut victory at Woodbine Aug. 8.

Wheeler became Hobeau's assistant manager under Elmer Heubeck in 1979. He took over as farm manager when Heubeck retired in 1987. His long association with the farm has made its success even more special.

"I was solely in charge of planning the breeding for the last 20 years, so it's personally rewarding to me," Wheeler said. "When I first came to Hobeau, we probably had 400 head of horses, and Mr. Dreyfus kind of left the direction of the farm to me. Over time we thinned it down to maybe 20 to 25 mares, but they were the finest of what we were breeding through every year. Every now and then, Mr. Jerkens would buy a horse at the races that was exceptional that would come back to join our broodmare band and bring in some new blood. The last few years we had two Grade I winners with Miss Shop and Swap Fliparoo, and then we had Delightful Kiss who won the Ohio Derby and the Iowa Derby, and we had Kelly Kip. They were present-day pedigrees that were hitting. I know that if we had time to hold on to these yearlings, we would be coming up with some more stakes horses."

For Wheeler, working at Hobeau Farm was a unique experience and one he obviously treasured.

"It's very challenging, any time you run a place that big," he admitted. "But my favorite thing probably was just to be associated with such giants as Mr. Dreyfus, Mr. Jerkens and Elmer Heubeck. You just don't come across those legends in normal life. They are icons. Mr. Dreyfus raced strictly for the sport of it and the beauty of the animal. It wasn't for any financial aspect of it, it was all for the sport of it. And that is a whole era gone by."

Dreyfus was a major reason behind Wheeler's passion for working at Hobeau Farm.

"I was one of the real, real fortunate ones because Mr. Dreyfus was the best man in the world to work for," Wheeler recalled. "He gave me a free rein and never questioned--even if something didn't work. He didn't reprimand you or anything. Every phone call he would thank me for the time and effort and thought I put into running his operation. That's the kind of gentleman he was. You try a lot harder for somebody like that. I would beat myself up more over something like that than for something with one of my own horses."

And the location couldn't be beat.

"Our farm was 2,200 acres--it was some of Florida's most beautiful land," Wheeler continued. "It was non-typical Florida. It was rolling hills with big oaks and lakes, so you almost felt like you were in Maryland or someplace other than Florida. You had the Florida weather and then the countryside of upcountry."

Before the lights go out completely on the Hobeau Farm era, there are still five yearlings to sell at the Keeneland September sale. All are consigned by Three Chimneys. The first, [hip 90](#), is a half-sister to Trappe Shot and Miss Shop, as well as to graded stakes-placed Bought in Dixie (Dixieland Band) and Bulling (Holy Bull).

"She's got a little bit more bone than Trappe Shot and a little more substance to her body," Wheeler said of the daughter of Street Cry (Ire). "She has a great mind to her--that was the most impressive thing about her. She has great bone and is a very balanced individual. I think she is going to be a real standout."

The dispersal also includes [hip 538](#), a colt from the first crop of Kentucky Derby winner Street Sense out of Cool Pussycat (Tabasco Cat). The yearling is a half-brother to multiple graded stakes-placed A True Pussycat (Yes It's True). [Hip 1343](#) is a filly by Bluegrass Cat out of Shop Glack (Smoke Glacken); [hip 1874](#) is a daughter of Harlan's Holiday out of Shop Here (Dehere); and [hip 3315](#) is by champion Bernardini out of Deputy's Delight (French Deputy).

With the dispersal of Hobeau Farm, Wheeler now focuses all his attention on his own breeding operation, which includes a broodmare band of about 14 head.

"I've been breeding all along," he explained. "Mr. Dreyfus always encouraged me to keep some horses on my own. We basically breed to sell, but if they fall through the cracks--and with this economy the way it is, sometimes you're forced to go to the races and try to prove their quality there."

The broodmare band may be getting a little smaller, though.

"I'm probably going to thin it down just a shade more," he continued. "It's so hard because the market is so picky and it's so expensive to raise them and get them there, that you've got to be prepared to go to the races. If they have one little flaw, they're not accepted, yet they could be a really good racehorse."

Still, Hobeau Farm will always have a very special place in Wheeler's heart.

"Hobeau, in the very end, when it's all said and done, me and Hobeau were one and the same," he explained. "I raised my family there. We ran the whole thing and developed it to change with the times. It's really like losing a part of you when you close down an operation like that." -- *Jessica Martini*

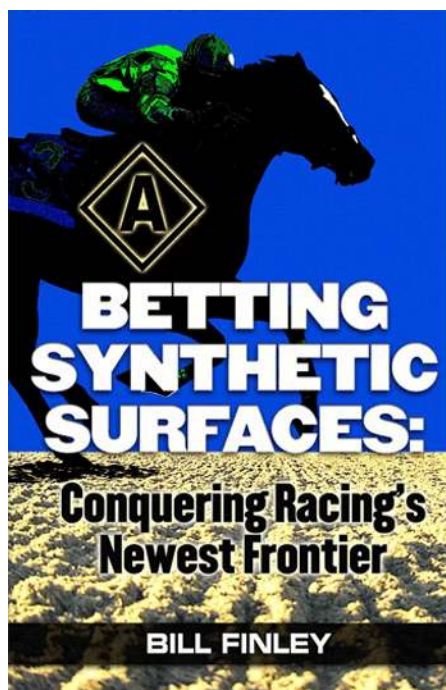
