PATH TO PROMINENCE

Jessica Harrington may not be a name familiar with the flat fraternity, but the County Kildare conditioner is well known for her exploits in the jumping sphere, and the unbeaten **Pathfork** (Distorted Humor) can widen her influence in today's G1 Vincent O'Brien National S. at The Curragh. Impressive when scoring over course and distance in a strong maiden July 18, he accounted for **Glor Na Mara (Ire)** (Leroidesanimaux {Brz}) and three re-opposing rivals in the Aug. 21 G2 Futurity

S. with apparent ease. "He worked well on Tuesday, and I have been delighted with him since he won the Futurity," commented his trainer, who handled the great chaser Moscow Flyer (Ire). "The fact that he won there made the call about supplementing him for this pretty easy. I haven't looked beyond The Curragh, and we'll take it one step at a time."

Ballydoyle Four Strong...

Aidan O'Brien, who has few peers when it comes to dominating his country's top-flight juvenile contests, is looking for an eighth renewal since 1996. O'Brien is strong in numbers once more, but **Zoffany (Ire)** (Dansili {GB}) is the clear-cut number one contender from Ballydoyle. He bids to emulate Danehill Dancer (Ire) (Danehill), One Cool Cat (Storm Cat), George Washington (Ire) (Danehill) and Mastercraftsman (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) in adding this to his success in the G1 Phoenix S. over six furlongs here last time Aug. 8. It was Glor Na Mara who was again the victim in that contest, with Zoffany's late swoop taking him a half-length clear at the line. That margin may have flattered the runner-up, as Johnny Murtagh had been trapped behind rivals until late on. **Cont. p2**

WILD THING

Godolphin may have been off the scoresheet in most of the British Classics of late, but there is no arguing with their prowess in the G1 St Leger, and **Rewilding (GB)** (Tiger Hill {Ire}) is a warm order to add a sixth renewal today. Third in the June 5 G1 Epsom Derby after being transferred from the Andre Fabre academy, he returned from a planned break to put **Midas Touch (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}) to the sword in York's G2 Great Voltigeur S. last time Aug. 17, and connections are in confident mood. "There has been a very slight improvement with his condition since he won at York, but, if he runs as well as he did there, then I think that he can win," Mahmood Al Zarooni commented. "Ideally, he would prefer some cut underfoot. He works better in the mornings on the gallops when they are on the softer side, but his form in Britain and France shows that he is quite versatile when it comes to the ground. Frankie Dettori said that Rewilding needs time in his races to get into his rhythm, and a strong pace will help him. You never know what is going to happen, but it will be a very good horse that beats him." **Cont. p3**

Zoffany is backed up by stablemates **Samuel Morse (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}), **High Ruler** (Mr. Greeley) and **Rudolf Valentino (GB)** (Oasis Dream {GB}), who were third, fourth and fifth, respectively, behind Pathfork in the Futurity last time. "Zoffany looks like he's our best two-year-old, he's very slick and very

quick and has got a very good chance," said Johnny Murtagh of the horse who appears to have been the prime reason for him staying in Ireland and not making the trip to Doncaster. Godolphin captured this in 2004 with Dubawi (Ire), and it may be significant that they have supplemented Washington Singer S. winner **Janood**

(Ire) (Medicean {GB}). "It is a big step up for Janood from winning a listed race, but he has done nothing wrong in both of his starts and we need to find out how good he is," Saeed bin Suroor said. "He has been working very well and is an improving colt. He is taking on some of the best two-year-olds around, but I am hopeful that he can run a nice race." It is rare to see Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum's Darley silks these days, but **Casamento (Ire)** (Shamardal) carries the famed maroon-and-white after a smart winning debut over this trip at Tipperary Aug. 26. "He is in very good form, and he has come on a fair bit for his run at Tipperary," trainer Mick Halford said. "It is a huge step up in class for him, but he is a horse that we have liked from the beginning and I am optimistic that he'll run well. There are some very good horses in the line-up, but we entered him for the race in April and he has progressed well all season. He was impressive at Tipperary and, while I wouldn't like to see the ground turning soft, he won't mind an ease and yielding ground should be fine for him."

O'Brien Shooting for 'Tree' Since '01...

Aidan O'Brien has garnered two further editions of the St Leger since Milan (GB) started the ball rolling in 2001, and is represented this year by the Voltigeur second and third Midas Touch and **Joshua Tree (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}). Beaten four and 2 1/4 lengths, respectively, by Rewilding on that occasion, they have ground to make up, but the former has always looked in need of extended distances, while last year's G2 Royal Lodge S. winner Joshua Tree was having his first run in 11 months there. Midas Touch is reunited with Colm O'Donoghue, who partnered him when fifth in the Epsom Derby and a half-length runner-up to Cape Blanco (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in the Irish equivalent at The Curragh June 27. "Both of them ran very well at York, and it was Joshua Tree's first run in a long time, so we were delighted with his run. He seems to be in good form since," the Ballydoyle conditioner said. The Elite Racing Club's homebred **Dandino (GB)** (Dansili {GB}) is bidding to provide trainer James Given with a first Classic success, and warmed up for this with a respectable first foray into pattern company when second in Goodwood's G3 Gordon S. last time July 27. "He's done incredibly well since Goodwood, and I wouldn't have changed a single day in between," his conditioner said. "He has physically developed well and is 10 pounds heavier now than going into Goodwood." **Arctic Cosmos** (North Light {Ire}), who is trained by John Gosden for his wife Rachel Hood and fellow-owner Robin Geffen, has 1 1/4 lengths to find with Dandino after finishing third in the Gordon, and this trip will help in that respect. "It's a phenomenal race and a privilege to have a horse taking part in it," Gosden said. "He's a progressive horse, any rain will suit and he'll stay the trip. The big, galloping track on Town Moor will suit more than Goodwood." Sir Michael Stoute finally ended his long drought in this race with Conduit (Ire) (Dalakhani {Ire}) two years ago, and relies on Khalid Abdullah's June 18 G3 Queen's Vase third **Total Command (GB)** (Sadler's Wells), who needs to rebound from a disappointing ninth of 10 in the Voltigeur. "His preparation for the Voltigeur went badly, we felt he badly needed the race," Stoute told *PA Sport*. "He had a skin infection and a joint infection, and he was getting messed around. The ground was probably quick enough for him at York, too. Everything has gone smoothly since then, and we have done what we wanted with him."

Sans Frontieres followed a win in Newmarket's G2 Princess of Wales's S. July 8 by defying a subsequent penalty in the Aug. 14 G3 Geoffrey Freer S. Trainer Jeremy Noseda said, "I have been delighted with the horse and feel that he is in top order. I would be a little concerned if the ground went heavy and, therefore, he will keep an entry in the G2 Prix Foy at Longchamp. The Irish St Leger is the ideal race for him and, if he runs, he will have an outstanding chance." Godolphin's colors were carried to glory by Kayf Tara (GB) (Sadler's Wells) in 1998 and 1999, and this time put forward last year's Doncaster St Leger runner-up **Kite Wood**, who reportedly had back issues when only sixth as favorite for the Geoffrey Freer last time. "Kite Wood was disappointing at Newbury and didn't stay the distance of the G1 Gold Cup at Royal Ascot," trainer Saeed bin Suroor said. "He has been working nicely recently and deserves another chance in a big race. He has the class to run well, and I am hoping to see him produce a better performance." Johnny Murtagh takes the ride on ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ **Flying Cross**, who was making a belated three-year-old bow when winning a 12-furlong conditions event at Tipperary Aug. 26. "Flying Cross needs to improve a little bit, but he's one of those slow-developing types who is starting to come right at the right time of the year," his jockey commented.

Arabian Gleam returns to his favorite race, which he garnered in 2007 and 2008 before finishing only third to **Duff** 12 months ago. He was third last time behind French invader Chinchon (Ire) (Marju {Ire}) in the GI United Nations S. at Monmouth July 3, and comes into this off some productive-looking works over Saratoga's Oklahoma turf course. **Al Khali** was the victim of a premature ride last out in the GI Sword Dancer S. Aug. 14, in which he struck the lead and opened up on the far turn before understandably tiring to be third in the late stages. The Grade III winner should be well-placed in a race with no confirmed frontrunners, and the one-furlong cutback he will get here should be to the big ridgeling's liking. **Simnard's** prior form does not suggest that he should be in the hunt at this level, but the unsung five-year-old is in the hands of legendary Canadian conditioner Roger Attfield. Attfield has excellent numbers when shipping horses down from Woodbine to compete in New York stakes races (five-for-19, 26-percent over the past five years). **Simnard** has never gone this far, but is two-for-two at ten furlongs and looks to be training forwardly since a last-place finish in a Gulfstream allowance in January. **Previews cont.**

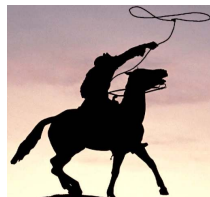

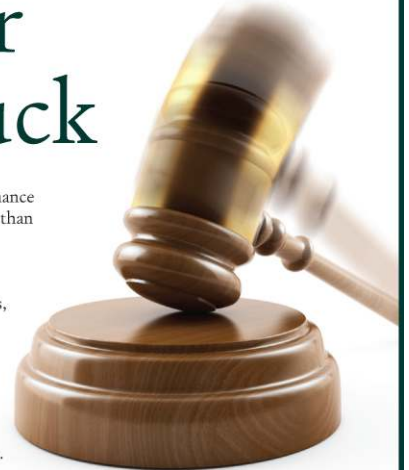
Position Limit Sidelined...

"Although we would have loved to see her run in the Breeders' Cup, we hope the extra time off will have the additional benefit of allowing her to grow and mature without any pressure and be even better in 2011."

Ninth in the 2007 G1 St Leger, Samuel hit the board in the following May's G2 Yorkshire Cup before winning the Listed Grand Cup at the Knavesmire track that same month. He was on the shelf for two days shy of two years after running second in the Listed Esher S. at Sandown in July 2008. Returning to action with a fourth in this term's renewal of the Esher last time July 3, the lightly raced six-year-old continued his rise back up the ladder with a second to Opinion Poll (Ire) (Halling) in the G2 Lonsdale Cup at York Aug. 18, and exacted revenge on that rival with a career high in this. Racing in fourth for most of this marathon until inching into third at the top of the long straight, he was urged to the front approaching the final quarter mile and stayed on resolutely under a drive for the win. "Samuel's been through a lot and is really enjoying his racing now, so this win is just brilliant," claimed jockey William Buick. "I love riding these staying horses because they try so hard. He's very decent and is a real character. Before the race, I thought the only way I'd beat the others is by stretching them--because I knew my fellow stayed the trip well--and he did that today." TDN Q&A

Alex Waldrop took the reins as president and CEO of the National Thoroughbred Racing Association in 2007. The former president of Churchill Downs and partner in the Kentucky-based law firm Wyatt, Tarrant & Combs sat down for a telephone Q&A session earlier this week with the *TDN's* Steve Sherack to discuss a wide range of topics, including the NTRA's Check-Off Program and Safety and Integrity Alliance, VLTs in Kentucky, threats and opportunities to the Thoroughbred industry in Washington D.C., and his transition from the courtroom to the racetrack.

Growing up in Kentucky, what are some of your earliest memories of Thoroughbred racing?

My childhood was spent in Western Kentucky, which is a *long* way from a racetrack. The Kentucky Derby stands out as an early childhood memory that really left an impression on me. As a Kentucky native, you *always* followed the Kentucky Derby, and I guess I fell in love with horse racing on television.

How did you first get involved in the industry?

I began practicing law in Louisville, Kentucky, and the firm that I joined represented Churchill Downs. I began working a great deal with a partner in charge of that account, and eventually wound up going [to Churchill Downs] as general counsel. I spent the next 13 years attending every race that Churchill ran [as general counsel, president and senior vice president of public affairs]. In those days, if you were on the senior management team at Churchill Downs, you were there on race day. It didn't matter what else you did or what your job was--even the general counsel, which is what I did at the time.

I gained an incredible amount of experience and knowledge, and really grew to love the horse racing industry and all the people involved--frontside and backside.

Candidly, though, it wasn't until I came to the NTRA that I began to learn a lot about horse racing from a national perspective. As great an opportunity as Churchill Downs provided me, it wasn't until I came to the NTRA that I began to see the challenges and the possibilities for horse racing on a national, and even an international scale. I learn something every day, love what I do and the opportunity I have and don't take it for granted.

Night racing has become very popular at Churchill Downs. Could you ever see the Kentucky Derby being run beneath the lights?

We talked a lot about that when I was there. While I think you should never say never, I do think that the Kentucky Derby is more than a horse race. It's a live event, and as much of a fascination as America has with the Kentucky Derby, it's one of those slices of Americana that everyone wants to experience one day in their lives. If you can maintain that in a night-time venue, then sure. But that's the challenge. I'm not sure you can. Attracting 60,000 to 70,000 people to that infield makes for a special environment. It would be hard to replicate that in a night-time venue. But 20 years from now somebody will be reading these comments and saying, 'Wow, how short-sighted was he.' You never know. It certainly works now, and it could hardly get bigger. It would be hard for them to contain it. You would do it for television ratings, no question. Even those are very strong though. You look at those ratings compared to other national major sports and there's just a handful of sports that outdraw the Kentucky Derby. That 5:30-7:00 p.m. timeslot that they occupy is a pretty good one. I know the television guys like it, and I would listen to them before I'd make any radical changes.

The slot machine/VLT issue has really divided the public in Kentucky. What's the NTRA's stance on this controversial topic?

The NTRA is careful to avoid intervening in any state issue, especially where our members are on different sides. However, I can say in Kentucky that our members are united in their belief that VLTs would still be a good alternative for Kentucky racetracks.

Having worked on that issue personally for the better part of 10 years when I was at Churchill Downs, I know how important it would be to Kentucky racing to be offer alternative gambling, but I also know how difficult and how challenging an environment it is politically in Kentucky. What they've done with Instant Racing is a good first step. Perhaps this can be successfully implemented so that people will come to see that they don't invite the kinds of problems that the naysayers allege will occur--crime, bankruptcy, etc. The public will hopefully begin to see these as entertainment options that the vast majority of people will choose, and will do so without any risk of financial ruin or psychological damage.

How has the emergence of popular social media platforms Facebook and Twitter affected the NTRA? Has it helped connect with fans?

Virtually all of our marketing has a *substantial* component for social media--even our television. Our webstream product, called NTRA Live, includes live chat and is driven primarily by social media. We even advertise for the broadcast using social media. We don't have a large budget that can afford network television the way the NTRA did once, even two years ago, so it's a cost-effective way of reaching a large number of people, and the right demographic groups as well.

Even middle-aged adults, the baby boomers, are beginning to embrace social media. It's a great way to get the word out. There's no question that it's the future of marketing for our business. Thankfully, for the most part, horse racing is embracing it and seeing it as a huge opportunity. NYRA and Keeneland have done a great job. Most of the major racetracks are using social media and other Web 2.0 platforms to get the word out. It's one of the beauties of horse racing. Unlike many other major sports, we easily adapt to the Internet. Not only from a viewing standpoint, but from a wagering standpoint. One of the huge advantages that we have moving forward is the resilience of our product. We criticize ourselves for being old and slow to change, but it's really untrue. Look at the history of our sport--we've innovated many times to maintain our status on the sports landscape in this country. We've embraced the internet as openly as any sport that I'm aware of. We may not have the MLB's financial resources to put forth this gargantuan website, and we may not have the cooperation that some of the sports leagues have, but we certainly don't lack for enthusiasm, passion, or for interest when it comes to social media and other advertising via the web.

Earlier this year the NTRA website began providing live coverage of major stakes races, including the seasonal debuts of Zenyatta and Rachel Alexandra. How's the feedback been so far?

NTRA Live is our web-based product, which is unique in that it's not a live-streaming video of an event, but in fact, it's a produced show. We take the stream of the race from the racetrack and we add our own commentator in Randy Moss. He brings in live or taped interviews from people who are at the track or in the paddock. We add Eric Wing, who runs a live chat that goes alongside so people are able to comment constantly throughout the broadcast and interact with one another. I've been involved in the broadcast on the chat, and we've had other guest commentators involved as well.

Rachel Alexandra and Zenyatta really catapulted this project and have drawn viewers from all over the world. We routinely now see people from 30-40 countries tune in to watch our broadcasts. I wish I could show you all the comments. They thank us profusely because without that web broadcast, there's no way they would be able to see that race. Some tracks do webcast, but most don't. Providing them with this service has been huge. That makes a difference--not only for the perception of Thoroughbred racing in America in the international community, it also helps the Breeders' Cup because they strive to be more of an international competition each day. It also gives us here in the U.S. a broader perspective of what we're doing, and appreciation of the fact that people from around the world are watching us every day. It's been heartening to see the response and hear the many thanks that we've gotten.

We found ourselves too often unable to broadcast key races because of rights and monetary issues--it just isn't feasible for us to spend the \$250,000 it would take to cover. Now, with this property, we can very easily turn on the broadcast and produce the show for a fraction of the cost. There are still some rights issues, but we think it's the future of simulcasting racing because of the international opportunities. It's been an interesting experiment, we've learned a lot and it's been worth every nickel that we've invested.

What's the NTRA's Check-Off Program?

The NTRA's Check-Off Program is a mechanism for funding our legislative action campaign. That funding is used to support our federal lobbying, and our legislative programs. Buyers and sellers at the sales can contribute 1/4 of one percent of the horse's sell price, which equates to \$2.50 for every \$1,000 of the value of the horse. Over the last 10 years, we've raised almost \$10 million to fund our lobbying efforts. We've been very successful as a result.

Why should buyers and consignors support the Check-Off Program?

It's pretty clear that without the NTRA's presence, there really would be no united effort for the racing industry. The NTRA's voice is unique in that it's the *only* voice out there for horse racing. No one else is protecting the industry's interests in Washington D.C. There are other individual efforts and interests, and there are other *broad* efforts for *all* horses and *all* equines, but no one else out there is looking out solely and particularly for Thoroughbred racing.

The beauty of the Check-Off Program is that it's broad-based. It doesn't matter whether someone is in Book 1 or 6 [at the sale]. Those dollars go specifically and entirely to support the legislative campaign. That in itself makes our campaign invaluable in Washington D.C. Lawmakers hear from lobbyists all the time. It's rare that they hear from the industries speaking with one voice. That's why the NTRA has been so successful, because we are more than just a hired gun lobbying for them. We are an industry association that speaks for the industry with one voice and, as a result, we've been successful.

Are there any extra benefits for those who Check-Off?

One of the great benefits of the Check-Off Program is that it makes you eligible to participate in the other

aspect of our legislative effort, which is Horse PAC (Political Action Committee). The PAC supports the federal political candidates. Our legislative action campaign spends money on lobbyists and on research—that would be what we call soft-money contributions. The PAC makes hard-money contributions directly to candidates to support their candidacies.

They are two different efforts and both are important. People who do both are vital to this industry. The Horse PAC has raised almost \$2.5 million since 2002, making it the largest PAC in horse racing or gaming in America. In a short period of time, we've established ourselves as players on the national stage through the Horse PAC. It's important to keep up those contributions as well.

You are also eligible to participate in the NTRA Advantage program [when you support the Check-Off Program]. You can get discounts on John Deere tractors, Sherwin Williams paints, etc. We're adding new partners daily, and continuing to grow the program.

How has the recession impacted participation in the Check-Off Program?

There's no doubt, we've seen a substantial drop since 2006--almost a 50-percent drop in our contributions. It's essentially mirrored the drop in North American sales. We fully understand all the challenges that buyers and sellers face in this marketplace.

We haven't seen a diminishment in the effort, even though we've seen some significant decline in contributions. We still have over 1,000 people in this industry who contribute on an annual basis to the program. We still have strong support from all the sales companies in America--Keeneland, Fasig-Tipton, OBS and Barretts. People have cut back because of the economy; we've been able to make up the difference through our member dues. We all have to be reminded to be vigilant. And it costs money to be vigilant.

How big of a hit was it to have the four Churchill Downs tracks--Arlington, Calder, Churchill and Fair Grounds--pull out of the NTRA this year?

Anytime we lose a member, it's disappointing for us. Churchill is a big member, so it was a financial blow, although in the last three years we have moved increasingly away from dues as our exclusive funding source. In fact, today only about 30 percent of our funding comes from dues. So it wasn't devastating for us financially, and we continue to be in contact with Churchill. They will hopefully participate in our newly revamped NTRA National Handicapping Championship, and we continue to accredit their racetracks. I can't say that we've closed the chapter on that one; it's still a conversation that's ongoing.

How much money does the NTRA spend annually on federal lobbying efforts, and what are some of threats/opportunities facing the industry in Washington D.C.?

We spend about a million dollars a year on our lobbying efforts. Right now, we're focusing on two major threats that are facing the industry. One would be online wagering. We're watching I-Gaming, and to what extent the Barney Frank bill will legalize other forms of internet gambling that would be competitive to the horse industry. The Barney Frank bill would subject us to a new regulatory and tax system, which would not be good for us--we have to get an exemption from that. I-Gaming is a major issue that we're watching now because as that goes, so does the horse industry. I'm not sure that it's going to pass anytime soon, but we certainly need to monitor it. The second issue involves Wire Act questions that continue to surface. Credit cards and processing has been a real challenge since the implementation of the Internet Gambling Enforcement Act.

There are some huge opportunities out there, too. It's not just about defensively protecting against threats. We're always on the lookout for tax vehicles to lower the capital gains holding period on racehorses from 24 months to 12. That's the way most other investments are. There are also opportunities out there to eliminate the automatic 25-percent federal withholding that major horseplayers are subjected to. It's a real difficulty for people who hit large exotic wagers in excess of \$5,000. We're trying our best and have a couple of good ideas, not only legislative, but also a regulatory route for eliminating that 25-percent withholding. We think we may have one before the end of this session. With the Bush tax cuts coming to an end, there may be an opportunity for us. Stay tuned.

Does the NTRA support the National Racing Compact?

We don't have a formal position on it--we have members who support it and we have members who do not. We've never taken a vote. We were on the steering committee that helped draft the model legislation and business plan that's been developed, but we've not taken a position because of the concerns raised by some of our members.

Do you think that the Racing Compact is gaining momentum? Where does it currently stand?

It didn't pass in New York--it's going to have to be re-introduced. The bill that has now been developed is better. I think that the RCI (Racing Commissioners International) is becoming better organized and that

they have more of a strategic view of it now. They are more actively promoting it, too. From that perspective, I think it has a better chance of passage. There are still unanswered questions that some of our members and others have--how will it ultimately be implemented and whether it will result in the loss of state's rights. Some participants, horsemen's group and others, are concerned that it could be

used as a bully pulpit to force organizations or states to go along with plans that really haven't been developed by the consensus of the industry--that's an ongoing concern. We continue to look for ways to address those concerns in the way in which proposals would be presented to the Compact. That's a huge part of where we're focused right now in making sure that horsemen's groups in particular are listened to and incorporated into Compact regulations.

A lot of times on major racing days, graded stakes tend to go off at the same time or overlap. Is there anything that the NTRA can do to help organize post times?

Over the years there have been several efforts to do just that. Certainly there's more coordination that can happen. There's a variety of reasons why things get out of balance. You start out fully attempting not to run on top of one other, but delays happen. Races aren't run in a clockwork fashion the way we would like. My 12 years at the racetrack taught me that--there's a delay here, there's a need to hold the windows open for a minute or two there, etc. When you have live animals as your participants and competitors, there's much room for change. When you have multiple stakes going off, it makes it more and more difficult to coordinate. We're always looking for better ways to do it, but it's a huge challenge because of the nature of our game.

Any parting thoughts?

One of the things that we as an organization have been putting a lot of energy and focus into is the NTRA Safety and Integrity Alliance. We believe that it is an important foundation for marketing and advocacy. Aside from the fact that safety and integrity are hugely important to our fans, the people who are watching and wagering on Thoroughbred racing, it's very difficult to market something that doesn't have integrity. It's very difficult to promote or advocate for something in Washington D.C. if you can't assure lawmakers that you're doing everything that you can to keep your athletes safe. The Alliance is an important support for all of the other initiatives that the NTRA does. Increasingly, we're finding that having a voice and having a platform like the Alliance makes us more credible spokespersons for the industry, especially in the event that there would ever be a high-profile catastrophic injury. As an industry, we can step up and say that we're doing the things to address these issues. Two years ago, we didn't have much credibility when we stood up and said, 'Trust us, we care about the horses' safety.' That didn't work. But today we can point toward the Alliance and to the Track Accreditation process. We could say that we know that there are 20 tracks out there that are doing the right thing, there are many more that are stepping up and looking at ways to join the Alliance, and that the industry is addressing its problems and not ignoring them. That goes a long way to solving the problem--doing what's right by the horse, and also giving us a credible response to our fans and general public when crisis arrives.

Was the Eight Belles tragedy the lightning rod that got this going?

It was happening before then. I'd say that Barbaro was probably the wake-up call to the industry. Barbaro and his injury created a lot of positive focus on the industry's efforts on keeping our athletes safe. Barbaro was probably the crisis that was the catalyst for a real change. It was not until people saw the potential downside to doing nothing, or at least doing less than all we could do. It wasn't until Eight Belles and equally Big Brown, to be honest. The outcry from the public to the use of steroids in our game was probably--according to our polling--equally as troublesome as Eight Belles's catastrophic injury. We knew we had a lot of things to address, and it brought the focus to the Safety and Integrity issues in ways that we as an industry never had before. You had good work coming out of the Safety Committee, TOBA, Breeders' Cup, etc. There was a lot of concern at the time about the lack of structure in the business and a lot of calls for federal intervention. We looked at other industries like health care, insurance and education who use the accreditation model to reform their business, and did the same. It's worked out very well so far, but there's still a lot of work to be done and tracks to accredit. People are not just saying the rights things, they're doing them, and that's exactly what the Alliance was intended to do.

VINTAGE YEAR FOR BRANDYWINE

In the mind of Brandywine Farm's Pam Robinson, the two horses had drawn the wrong post positions for the 136th running of the GI Kentucky Oaks. Champagne d'Oro (Medaglia d'Oro), a filly who did her best running on or near the front, was out in the 10 hole, pegged wide with several speed horses to her inside to consider. Jody Slew (Slew City Slew), on the other hand, liked to come from well back, like she'd done when she won the Tiffany Lass S. and Gill Silverbulletday S. But she was to the inside, in post two, and would be forced to show early foot in order to establish position in the crowded 14-horse field.

"I thought, boy, if we could just reverse their post positions," Pam said. "They were both put into situations that were opposite to their running styles."

In the end, Pam--watching the race from the comfort of her living room in Paris, Kentucky, and Taylor the Jack Russell nipping at her heels through the day should she get too loud cheering home a horse--saw her concerns realized. The two fillies were indeed compromised, maybe by post position, maybe by an assortment of factors. Champagne d'Oro ran 11th; Jody Slew was 13th.

But Pam was still proud of her girls, and proud of her and husband Jim's Brandywine Farm. After all, breeding (in the case of Jody Slew), foaling, raising and selling two Kentucky Oaks starters is a massive accomplishment.

"We were probably the only ones who knew it or cared, but it was an exciting day," she said. "It's a nice accomplishment."

Besides, there would be other races. In Champagne d'Oro's case, her very next race. Bred by Liberation Farm, and sold from Brandywine's 2008 Keeneland September consignment for \$210,000, the Southern Equine colorbearer dropped a 39-1 surprise in the GI Acorn S. on the Belmont Stakes undercard, and showed that was no fluke when she romped by 4 1/2 lengths in the GI Test S. at Saratoga in August. Sandwiched between those starts was a runner-up effort in the GI Prioress S.

Brandywine's success has carried over to its two-year-olds, particularly in recent weeks. Embellished (Bellamy Road) became the first black-type winner for her freshman sire when she broke her maiden in Northland Park's Princess Margaret S. in July, then made it two straight, taking the Bird of Pay S. there by seven lengths Aug. 28.

Teryns Song (Artie Schiller), also from the first crop of her sire, made an eye-catching grass debut in an Ellis Park maiden special weight Aug. 29, winning off by 2 1/2 lengths, while the well-regarded juvenile Overseas Market (Stormy Atlantic) ran a strong second at Saratoga in his second start Sept. 3.

Other 2010 runners who were bred, raised, and/or sold by Brandywine include the stakes winners National Pride (Macho Uno) and Kilderry (E Dubai), and the stakes-placed Valid Sum (Street Cry {Ire}) and Mr. Goodkat (Tale of the Cat).

Champagne Dreams...

The journey of Brandywine Farm, Jim and Pam Robinson's commercial breeding operation, took a path longer than the 470 miles that separate Chapel Hill from Lexington. But it's a good place to start. Just about 13 years ago, a loose caravan of 11 semi-trucks rumbled northwest from North Carolina, climbed and crossed the Blue Ridge mountains, and pulled into Paris, Kentucky, on a cold January day, carrying the lives and livelihood of the Robinsons.

The 'livelihood' took the form of Thoroughbreds, mostly broodmares and newly turned yearlings, the sole freight of eight of the semis. There were nearly 100 in total, and they were the driving force behind a whirlwind two months that saw Pam make the abrupt decision to retire from a long and successful career in academia, and the couple uproot Brandywine from one state to another.

"We came up from North Carolina for the [1997] Keeneland November Sale with two weanlings," explained Pam. "One sold for \$182,000, and the other brought \$125,000. Those were very good sales then, and we probably had \$35,000 in the two of them combined, including the price of the mares carrying them. We had always known we'd retire to Kentucky, so while we were there, we decided to look around at property."

The Robinsons fell in love with one of the first farms they were shown, a beautiful spread over several hundred acres in Paris that, strangely, featured a house that had the exact floor plan of the house they owned in North Carolina, but reversed. They put in an offer. It was accepted. Entertaining, but ultimately rejecting the idea of splitting their time between the two farms, they hurriedly put their North Carolina farm on the market, knowing getting real estate sold can take months or longer. It took days.

"The first people who came and looked at it bought it," laughed Pam. "So we owned a farm in Kentucky and no longer owned a farm in North Carolina and thought, 'Well, we better move!'"

New Start in the Bluegrass...

For the Robinsons, both natives of Ohio, moving to Kentucky was the official start of their second careers. Jim was a retired electrical engineer who spent 30 years with General Telephone and Electronics (GTE). His work there included research on fiber optics and long-range telecommunications. By the time he retired, he was GTE's director of transmission and protection for the Southern United States.

Pam's resume was no less impressive. She was just 24 when she earned her first Ph.D, in the field of medical sciences. She went straight to work for the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, where she found that all of the graduate students she was teaching were older than she was. Pam also taught or studied at Ohio University, Ohio State University, and Michigan State University.

Always in the background, though, were the horses. Jim had grown up on a large farm, and the couple had three pleasure horses when they first settled down in North Carolina in the mid-1970s. A neighbor had horses, too, Thoroughbreds, and they took an interest that grew from a dabbling here and there to a full-scale breeding operation.

"Over 15 years or so, three or four turned into a hundred mares and five stallions," said Pam.



Despite being away from the hub of activity in Lexington, the Robinsons were still breeding for the commercial market, which meant a lot of miles during breeding and sales seasons. It was a lot of work, too, "and very *expensive*," said Pam.

When the Robinsons found and purchased the farm in Paris, followed shortly by the sale of their North Carolina property, Pam was confronted with a tough decision: retire from her post at UNC, in the middle of the academic year, or stay in Tarheel country during the weeks while Jim managed the Kentucky farm. She decided to retire.

"I was the director of the graduate program for sports medicine," she explained. "I had 65 graduate students, and all sorts of things going on. I had 25 years with the university, so I had a *lot* to do to make sure everything was covered."

Friends in High Places...

Retirement's never been so much work. Not for the Robinsons, at least. Today, Brandywine has doubled in size and is one of the country's most prolific breeders. Sitting on a property that has swelled to some 600 acres, Brandywine is currently home to roughly 200 mares, down from a high of 240 mares. This autumn, Brandywine will sell an impressive 125 yearlings, almost all of which they co-bred. Twenty-three are slated for Fasig-Tipton's Kentucky Fall Yearlings Sale, while the remaining 102 head are set to go under the hammer here at Keeneland.

One of the main reasons Brandywine has grown to its current size is its association with Rob Whiteley's Liberation Farm. About five years ago, the Robinsons and Whiteley found themselves bidding on many of the same mares at auction. Armed with similar business plans, they decided to join forces. At present, of the 175 mares Brandywine owns, more than half are in partnership with Liberation.

"We let Rob make 95 percent of the breeding decisions," Pam said of the division of labor. "He does a lot of in-depth research on it, and has a really good eye conformation-wise. What we bring is the daily, hands-on work--breeding, foaling, raising and sales-prepping the horses."

Whiteley echoes the "hands-on" sentiment, and applauds the couple's work ethic.

"Jim and Pam are an amazing hands-on team, totally dedicated and experienced in every aspect of horse care," said Whiteley. "Between the two of them, Jim and Pam can do just about anything that needs doing on a horse farm, from laying water lines and wiring a barn, to providing veterinary support in crisis or routine situations."

The Brandywine/Liberation partnership is now seeing its first runners hit the track, and the early returns are promising. The aforementioned two-year-olds Embellished, Teryns Song and Overseas Market were all bred in partnership.

Whiteley said the two operations complement each other well, and added that they share similar tastes in broodmare prospects.

"Jim and I have fine-tuned a conformation rating scale, and it is uncanny how close our marks are when we compare," said Whiteley. "The fact that we have very few babies with offset knees is largely the result of our collaborative work over several years selecting athletic, well-made mares and matching them physically to stallions in the best way. After several years of establishing our commercial breeding program, we finally have the first wave of runners hitting the track, and the results are speaking for themselves."

One of the collaboration's biggest successes didn't happen on the track, but in the sales ring. In 2007, Liberation and Brandywine teamed to buy the Kingmambo mare Temperence Gift for \$52,000 at Keeneland November. The mare, in foal to War Chant, was nine at the time, and it was her sixth time through the sales ring. Her valued soared last year when her fourth foal, the filly Gozzip Girl (Dynaformer), won four black-type events, including the GI American Oaks and GII Sands Point S. Opting to strike while the iron was hot, Liberation and Brandywine decided to offer Temperence Gift at public auction for the seventh time, and the mare, in foal to Medaglia d'Oro, was hammered down to Dattt Stables for \$825,000.

Ready for More...

The Robinsons hope buyers are taking notice of Brandywine's success, and are confident its 2010 September consignment has some future stars, too.

Without a horse in Book 1, things kick off for Brandywine next Tuesday, the first of four Book 2 sessions. Included among the highlights of the draft is [hip 529](#), a bay filly by Elusive Quality out of MGSW Colcon (Pleasant Colony). They are also high on the chances of another Elusive Quality yearling, [hip 1137](#), a half-brother to Valid Sum, third in the Listed Icecapade S. at Monmouth Sept. 5, and Peruvian Horse of the Year and three-time champion Black Coffey (Spend a Buck). Others to watch out for include [hip 1424](#), a Medaglia d'Oro filly out of a full-sister to champion Flawlessly (Affirmed); and [hip 1484](#), an Any Given Saturday filly out of SP Tiny Decision (Ogygian) from the family of Street Boss (Street Cry {Ire}). All the horses were bred by Brandywine and Liberation.

They, like all the Brandywine yearlings, go through a 10-week program that includes alternating days between a walker, free-lunging in a round pen ("Which helps with manners and voice responsiveness," said Pam), and a HydroHorse, or underwater treadmill.

"They are superb for conditioning young horses--it takes the stress off the joints," said Pam. "And it's also good for their minds. They walk down a ramp, exercise in the water, then walk up a ramp. I don't think I've seen a single one of horses balk going into a starting gate. They horses love it, especially on the hot days. It's fun to watch them--sometimes they'll put their noses under the water and blow bubbles and play."

As Pam looks back at the history of Brandywine, it wasn't the move from North Carolina to Kentucky that set the tone for the operation, but rather an earlier move, from Ohio to North Carolina.

"We still have this great picture from the move," she said. "We were towing a trailer behind with our manure spreader, and in the manure spreader sat our dining room set. We must have looked like the Beverly Hillbilies. It was comical."

That blend of smarts and sophistication combined with a blue-collar work ethic has helped Brandywine make a name for a itself, but for Pam, it comes down to a simple creed.

"We just try to raise good horses and keep a good reputation for treating people honestly and fairly," she said. -L Marquardt

Breeders' Cup to Ban Medication Violators:

During a regularly scheduled meeting Friday afternoon in Lexington, the Breeders' Cup Board of Directors moved to ban any trainer from participation in the championship series who has been found in violation of a racing regulation prohibiting the possession or use of Class 1 substances according to Association of Racing Commissioners International (ARCI) guidelines. Class 1 drugs are stimulants and depressant drugs which have no generally accepted medical use in racehorses. "The establishment of these new regulations strengthens, on a year-round basis, our top priority of preserving the integrity of our competition and protecting the welfare of our athletes at the World Championships," said Breeders' Cup President and CEO Greg Avioli. In other developments, the Board approved a new international nominations program and enhancements to the Breeders' Cup Challenge series, effective in 2011. Further details will be released at a press conference Monday, Sept. 13 at Keeneland. Elections for corporate officers and for positions of committee chairmen were also conducted. William S. Farish Jr. was reelected as Chairman of the Board; Gregory C. Avioli was reelected as Breeders' Cup President; Robert T. Manfuso will continue in the role of Vice Chairman; Matthew Lutz was reelected Treasurer; and Robert Watt was reelected as Secretary. Each will serve a one-year term. Committee chairmen elected are: Clem Murphy, Racing and Nominations Committee; Antony Beck, Host Site Committee; Roy Jackson, Marketing Committee; Oliver Tait, Finance and Audit Committee; Richard Santulli, Investments Committee; and Satish Sanan, Compensation Committee.
