UNBRIDLED'S SONG COLT TOPS THE CHARTS

Bonnie and Tommy Hamilton of Silverton Hill, active buyers all week, made their biggest splash at the Keeneland September Yearling sale yesterday, going to \$560,000 to secure the day's top-priced lot. Tommy Hamilton, sitting alongside bloodstock advisor Ben McElroy inside the sales pavilion, saw off Fox Hill Farms

for [hip 1447](#), a son of Unbridled's Song out of graded stakes placed Sweet Nanette (You and I). "He's a very athletic horse, by a top sire," McElroy commented. "His half-brother Sherriff Cogburn (Vindication) looks like a very promising runner--he ran a six on the sheets. So

we'll see. It's more than we wanted to give, but he looks like a nice horse." Hamilton agreed that the exploits of Sherriff Cogburn, who is now two-for-two after winning the Aug. 6 Prairie Meadows Juvenile Mile, figured into his decision to purchase yesterday's session topper. "I know the family," Hamilton said. "I saw the two-year-old run and he looks like he has a lot of talent. And we just thought the yearling was a really athletic horse."

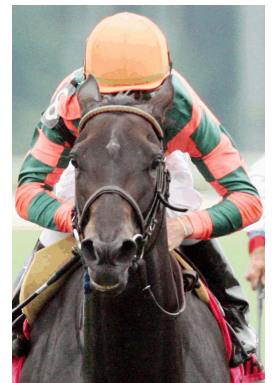

McElroy admitted he has high expectations for the gray yearling. "Hopefully he's a two-turn horse. On the first Saturday in May." Silverton Hill is enjoying a breakout year on the racetrack, most recently capturing the Curragh's G1 National S. with Pathfork (Distorted Humor), who they purchased for \$230,000 out of this sale a year ago. Yesterday's Unbridled's Song colt was the ninth yearling purchase of the sale for the Hamiltons. They also bought a son of Mr. Greeley ([hip 795](#)) for \$385,000, a filly by Smart Strike ([hip 144](#)) for \$370,000 and an Include colt ([hip 141](#)) for \$340,000. Whether the yearlings will stay in the U.S., where Silverton Hill won the 2007 GI Blue Grass S. with Dominican (El Corredor), or travel to Europe where the couple is currently enjoy much success on the track, will be determined next year. "We like to get the horses back to the farm, turn them out and break them and then next spring we'll decide where they need to go," Hamilton explained. The \$560,000 yearling was consigned to the sale by Gainesway, as agent for the colt's breeder, Eldon Farm Equine. Gainesway-consigned horses also topped the proceedings at Keeneland Thursday, when a pair of yearlings by Smart Strike sold for identical bids of \$550,000.

Baffert Goes on Buying Spree...

Bob Baffert has been busy at the Keeneland September Yearling Sale this week, and the silver-haired trainer was back in action yesterday to secure a pair of colts for longtime clients. Early in Friday's session Baffert outbid Zayat Stables to acquire a son of Malibu Moon on behalf of the Lanni Family Trust for \$470,000.

"I really didn't want to pay that much for him, but he looked pretty special," Baffert said of the gray colt, who was consigned by Paramount Sales. "But he's the kind we're looking for and you have to pay for the good ones. This horse looked the part and I figured he was going to be high because he had 15 scopes or something ridiculous. Everyone is landing on the same horses."

Later Friday, Baffert was forced to \$500,000 to bring home a son of Ghostzapper ([hip 1368](#)) out of Grade I winner Skipping Around (Skip Trial) for Mike Pegram, Karl Watson and Paul Weitman.

"They are the only ones to answer their phones," Baffert said of the trio who race champion Lookin at Lucky (Smart Strike). "Donato Lanni told me about him. I waited for him, scouted him out back. He looked good back there. I see them in the back and call people and say, 'I like this horse.'"

"He looked exceptional and it's a great family," Baffert said of the yearling. "I love Ghostzapper. I think he's a great horse. I think he's just a little slow coming around."

Baffert is excited about a pair of fillies by the Adena Springs stallion; he trains recent stakes winner Subsidized and American Story, unbeaten in a pair of starts at Del Mar this summer. Still he was surprised by the price tag on the yearling.

"I didn't think he would cost that much," Baffert said. "But he looks very fast and we're all looking for fast. You can't steal a horse here."

Duignan Over the (Malibu) Moon...

Gabriel Duignan, co-breeder of [hip 1247](#), a colt by Malibu Moon, watched from the pavilion door just under the press box as bidding progressed on the yearling and, when the hammer fell at \$470,000, the Irishman pumped his fist and let loose a big smile.

"I do think he's the best colt I've ever raised," said Duignan. "He just showed himself great since he's been on the grounds. He's always been a beautiful horse. I was involved in moving Malibu Moon to Kentucky, and this guy is a lot like his dad. Strong and sleek."

Duignan purchased the yearling's unraced dam Robbery Suspect,

in foal to Fusiachi Pegasus, for \$335,000 out of the 2006 Keeneland November sale. That Fusaichi Pegasus filly brought \$200,000 at the 2008 Keeneland September sale.

"I'm glad that he's gone where he's gone and he's in good hands, because I still own the mare," Duignan added.

Duignan was president of Castleton Lyons when Malibu Moon relocated to the Kentucky stud from Country Life Farm in Maryland in 2004. Malibu Moon, the sire of champion Declan's Moon, has been represented on the track this year by graded stakes winners Devil May Care, Malibu Prayer, Life at Ten, Funny Moon, Sweet August Moon and Odysseus.

"When I went to look at him, I thought he was the most magnificent horse I'd ever seen," Duignan recalled of Malibu Moon. "He's a fantastic sire. It would have been hard to imagine he would be this good. I thought he had a chance of being a good sire, but he's surpassed my expectations. And I think it's not over yet, because every year his mares are getting better and he's getting better with it. The last two years have been unbelievable, so look out when they hit the track."

A Heavenly Score...

Adam Corndorf's Blue Heaven Farm purchased the mare Skipping Around (Skip Trial), in foal to Ghostzapper, for \$390,000 out of the 2008 Keeneland November sale. According to Corndorf, the purchase of Skipping Around was a case of taking advantage of market conditions.

"Generally we buy yearling fillies and try to make the mares ourselves," he explained. "But we thought a couple of years ago, with the market being a little soft, to buy some proven producing mares. We saw her and just fell in love with the way she looked and she had already produced a Grade I winner. We thought we got a great deal."

The deal looked even better yesterday when the mare's Ghostzapper colt ([hip 1368](#)) sold at Keeneland for \$500,000.

The 14-year-old Skipping Around, a graded stakes winner herself, is the dam of Grade I winner Sugar Shake (Awesome Again) and stakes-placed Explosive Heat (Touch Gold).

Corndorf's biggest question mark yesterday was the yearling's sire, Ghostzapper.

"When we bought the mare, she was in foal to Ghostzapper, who at the time was as good as could be," Corndorf continued. "Obviously he's had some ups and downs, mostly down so far, but we think he's coming back. And, as everyone knows at these sales, looks sell. We came into the sale not being sure what to expect because he's by Ghostzapper, but at the end of the day he's a good-looking horse. He vetted clean and scoped clean, and we got very fortunate that a couple people liked him."

The Blue Heaven broodmare band currently numbers about 14, but that number could increase.

"We just bought a new farm in Versailles, and we have a great manager in Scott Kintz," Corndorf, who sold an Unbridled's Song colt last September for \$875,000, commented. "We're hoping that this is just the first of many more good ones that we can sell. We're always looking for opportunities to add mares. "We have a couple fillies on the racetrack that are doing well that we hope have the opportunity to make it into the broodmare band."

We have a two-year-old filly by Forestry named Maple Forest who ran second in the Sorority and may be running back in graded stakes. So it's a combination of horses that we breed that we hope can come back and be broodmares or opportunities that we find that we can buy mares."

Blue Heaven's main focus is to breed to sell.

"We breed to sell, but we're not afraid to keep one if we really really like her, or we just feel like, for whatever reason, the market is not valuing her appropriately," Corndorf said. "Generally our goal is to sell, first and foremost, so we can keep on living to fight more days."

Pinhooking Success for O'Callaghan...

Peter O'Callaghan picked up a son of Lemon Drop Kid out of Summer Delight (Quiet American) for \$120,000 at last year's Keeneland November sale and returned the yearling to the ring yesterday to sell for \$420,000 to the bid of Whitehorse Stable. The bay colt ([hip](#)

[1431](#)) is a half-brother to multiple stakes-placed Southwest (Cozzene). "I thought he was a lovely individual," O'Callaghan recalled of the weanling. "You could see the Quiet American in him. I thought he was a very good individual with a nice female family from a good breeder in Lazy Lane Farms."

Of the colt's progression from last fall, O'Callaghan added, "He did all the things that we expected him to do. He just developed a lovely top line and a lovely hip and he was always a lovely easy mover--just a good colt."

The \$420,000 price tag was gratifying. "You never expect to do that," O'Callaghan added. "But there is a lot of competition for the very good horses and he was obviously one of

them. I was lucky enough to have him." O'Callaghan's Woods Edge Farm has been very busy through the first week of the September sale, and the Irishman admitted it can be a difficult market. "It's been very selective," he said of the market. "The good horses are selling well, there is great demand for them. But there's not a lot of depth of buyer here. If you don't make the cut with the big players, it's a struggle. Everybody is very selective now. They know exactly what they want to buy. Every box has to tick--the physical, the sire, the female family. It's very tight."

Game Day at Keeneland...

Most are familiar with Bill Parcels on the football field, but may not be as acquainted with the former Dallas Cowboys and New York Giants coach on the racing scene. Hall of Fame trainer D. Wayne Lukas, who was bidding on behalf of himself and Parcels from inside the pavilion, went to \$350,000 to secure a son of Corinthian--Summer Scene (Belong to Me) from the consignment of Dromoland Farm. The colt was previously a \$160,000 purchase as a weanling out of last year's KEENOV sale.

"We are friends and have owned a horse or two before," explained Lukas. "We'll keep on fishing until we catch one."

The 10-year-old Summer Scene, purchased by Eamon Cleary for \$150,000 at Keeneland November in 2008 with this foal in utero, is a daughter of Heat Lightning (Summer Squall), who is already responsible for champion two-year-old and GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile hero Stevie Wonderboy (Stephen Got Even) and GSP Queen Joanne (Mr. Greeley). Heat Lightning, a \$1.1 million KEENOV purchase, is also the dam of Theyskens Theory (Bernardini), winner of the Aug. 28 G3 Prestige S. at Goodwood.

"He's a very nice individual," offered Lukas. "I really liked Stevie Wonderboy in the pedigree and the recent update [Group 3 winner Theyskens Theory]. He might get us two turns. We don't just want to have a racehorse, we want one that can run two turns."

As for the young Gainseway stallion who won the GI Met Mile, GII Gulfstream Park H. and Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile, Lukas added, "I like Corinthian very much. He's a first-season sire, so we don't know what he's going to do as a sire yet, but he's getting nice-looking foals. I love the fact that this colt is by a super miler and has the Roberto influence [sire of third dam, Mystical Mood]."-CB

Repole Making a Mark at Keeneland...

Repole Stables, who has been enjoying a successful summer on the Eastern racing circuit, arrived at Keeneland with some money to spend at the September sale this past week. Heading yesterday's trio of purchases was Hip 1290, a Mill Ridge-consigned son of Street Cry (Ire) out of Sand Springs (Dynaformer), winner of the GI Diana S. and GI Just a Game Breeders' Cup H. and an earner of \$1,270,058 over four seasons on the track. The bay, a half-brother to SW and GSP Mellon Martini (Sadler's Wells), was bred by Richard Santulli's Colts Neck Stables. Sand Springs was purchased for \$2.3 million in foal to Kingmambo at Keeneland November sale in 2007.

"He looked like the real deal," said New Castle Farm's Jim Crupi, acting on behalf of Mike Repole. "He had good balance, a nice walk and just looked like a racehorse. And he has the pedigree to be a good horse too."

Later in the session, Crupi tapped into a similar sireline when going to \$140,000 for hip 1304, a colt by first-crop sire Street Sense (Street Cry {Ire}) and the second foal out of Scarlett Cruise (Pulpit). A member of the Woods Edge Farm consignment, the bay is a grandson of MSW Ladies Cruise (Fappiano), dam of MGSW Admiral's Cruise (A.P. Indy) and MGISP Transcendental (Mt. Livermore).

According to Crupi, drawing from the father/son team from the Machiavellian line was not by design.

"I liked them as individuals, not because of the sirelines," confirmed Crupi.

Rounding out the Repole trifecta was a gray colt by Corinthian out of MSW Silver Crown (Distorted Humor). Offered by Indian Creek, hip 1356 is from the family of MGSW and GISP Powerful Punch (Danzig Connection).

"We have a team that looks at all the horses and we get all the physicals and have all the vetting done," said Crupi, explaining the operation's selection process. "We compile all the information and give it to Mike for his approval. He makes the final decision."

Through the opening week of the sale, Repole purchased seven yearlings, including four by first-season sires, for gross receipts of nearly \$1.6 million.

"They were all good racehorse, so I would think they have the ability to become good sires," said Crupi in regard to acquiring offspring by unproven stallions.

"I think the Any Given Saturdays and Corinthians stand out. Corinthian is a son of Pulpit, who is the sire of Tapit. And we all know top-class milers have the ability to become top sires.

"You can always get lucky, sometimes unlucky, you know how that goes," he continued. "The younger stallions don't have a knock against

them. Everyone has had a youngster by one of the older stallions that they can say, 'Oh, I had one of them and I hate them.' But with the younger stallions they can't do that."

He added with a laugh, "At least not yet. Or not until next year."

All of the Repole Stable's purchases are destined for the Todd Pletcher barn.-CB

Momentum Continues Through Book 2...

Shortly after the final horse was led through the ring during the final session of Book 2 and the statistics were compiled, Keeneland officials expressed themselves pleased with the opening week's trade.

"I think the first week went very well and the new format was a great success," said Keeneland's Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell. "Our job was to put as many horses in front of as many buyers and retain the buyers all week and I think we accomplished that."

During Friday's fourth session of Book 2, a total of \$23,297,500 was generated from 217 head sold, with a clearance rate of 73.2 percent. Average was the lowest of four days in Book 2 at \$107,362, while median was \$85,000, equaling Wednesday's second session. Thursday recorded the highest Book 2 median at \$100,000. Leading the way yesterday was a colt by Unbridled's Song who realized a \$560,000 final bid from Silverton Hill.

"Our sale topper today was bigger than [Thursday]'s session topper [a pair of Smart Strike yearlings that brought \$550,000]," said Russell. "The trade has been good all week. The biggest fear of the sale was will trade take place. The buyback rate was the second lowest of the week [only behind Sunday's opening session]. I think that's a very good indicator that trade is taking place and that's what we were hoping for and we succeeded."

Cumulative gross for the first six days closed out at \$141,987,500 for 941 sold, with an average of \$150,890 and a median of \$100,000. The buyback rate for the first six days was 30.55 percent.

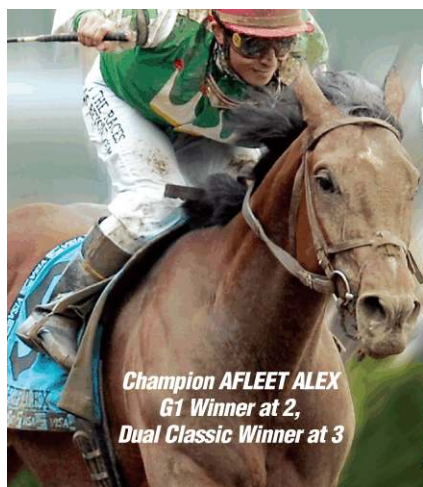
According to Russell, the new format drew mixed reviews from the Keeneland faithful.

"It's a mixed bag, some people love it and some people hate it," he admitted. "For a consignor point of view, it might have been depending on if they had a good or bad sale. But the buyers stuck around so that is the biggest compliment. Baffert is still here, Zito is still here, Sheikh Hamdan is still here. The buyers are staying and that was the goal of this, to try and keep them here as long as possible and not tire them out too much every day and keep them going."

The sale continues Sunday, with selling commencing at 10 a.m.

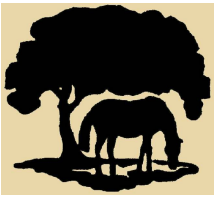

A Team Valor homebred out of South African SW & MG1SP Secret Heart (SAf) (Fort Wood), the dark bay graduated in a six-furlong event on the grass at Belmont Park July 11, then finished second in the Aug. 14 Continental Mile S. at Monmouth, but was disqualified to fourth. **Forum** missed by a nose in an Aug. 4 maiden at Saratoga, but bounced back to break his maiden Aug. 28, earning a field-best 83 Beyer Speed Figure.

May 15, skipped the GI Belmont S. and invaded from his California base to land the GI Haskell Invitational S. Aug. 1. He was removed from consideration for the GI Travers S. after spiking a temperature shortly after his Monmouth success and only recently returned to the worktab, going a half-mile in :49 2/5 at Del Mar Sept. 8. He picked it up a bit in his latest move, drilling four furlongs in :48 2/5 at Hollywood Park Sept. 14. "Right now everything looks good," Baffert told *DRF*. "He worked nice the other day." The Baffert-trained Misremembered (Candy Ride {Arg}) won last year's Indiana Derby in stakes-record time of 1:40 4/5.

Blame Expected Sept. 30 for Gold Cup...

Blame (Arch), who registered a mild upset of Quality Road (Elusive Quality) in the GI Whitney H. at Saratoga Aug. 7, will have two additional works at Keeneland and is expected to arrive in New York Thursday, Sept. 30 in advance of his run in the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup Oct. 2. "He'll breeze this Sunday [Sept. 19] and on the 26th," said trainer Al Stall Jr., who trains the four-year-old for Adele B. Dilschneider and Claiborne Farm. "The plane leaves Kentucky for New York on Thursday morning and he'll go into John Terranova's barn." Blame last breezed Sept. 12 over the Keeneland Poly, going six furlongs in a race-like 1:11.80. "His last work was a really strong work," Stall said. "He's doing great; he's ready. He's a very happy horse--not picky about anything. We thought he was doing great [in Saratoga] this summer and we're looking forward to heading back that way." Among the rivals he could encounter in the Gold Cup is GI Travers S. hero Afleet Express (Afleet Alex), though trainer Jimmy Jerkens remains non-committal at this point. "He's doing OK," Jerkens said. "We don't know yet if we are going to the Gold Cup. We're undecided."

Abbaye for Zebedee?...

Richard Hannon yesterday revealed that he is considering a tilt at the Oct. 3 G1 Prix de l'Abbaye with Julie Wood's **Zebedee** (GB) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}). Successful in the July 27 G3 Molecomb S. and Friday's G2 Flying Childers S., the juvenile colt would have to be added to the field for Longchamp's Arc day five-furlong dash. "I've half a mind to supplement him for the Prix de l'Abbaye rather than go for something like the [Oct. 9] G3 Cornwallis S. at Ascot. The worry was whether Richard Hughes could do the weight, but I believe he would carry eight stones seven pounds and he can do that."

Salona Awarded Zukunfts-Rennen...

Connections of **Salona** (Ger) (Lord of England {Ger}) have won an appeal to have the result of the Sept. 3 G3 Zukunfts-Rennen overturned. Initially a half-length second to Nice Danon (GB) (Sakhee) in the seven-furlong Baden-Baden contest, the racecourse stewards had opted to leave the result unchanged despite an objection from Salona's owner-breeder Klaus Hofmann that the winner had interfered with his filly in the final furlong. His subsequent appeal to the Direktorium (German Jockey Club) resulted in the amended result announced on Thursday. That move in turn provides Gestut Etzean's young sire Lord of England with a third black-type winner from his first crop.

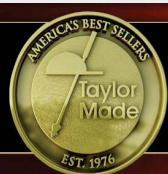

RCI Vote to Lower Bute Threshold:

The Association of Racing Commissioners International have unanimously voted to recommend lowering the threshold of the non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drug phenylbutazone, or bute. The committee acted based on recommendations from the RCI Regulatory Veterinarians Committee, the RCI Drug Testing Standards and Practices Committee, the Racing Medication and Testing Consortium, the Jockey's Club's Thoroughbred Safety Committee, the Jockey's Guild, the Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association and the American Association of Equine Practitioners. There had been some opposition to the model rule change, as the National HBPA, the Thoroughbred Owners of California and the California Thoroughbred Trainers submitted statements urging RCI to not approve the change. The proposed change will lower the allowance of phenylbutazone to two micrograms per milliliter of plasma or serum, down from five micrograms. Maryland and Pennsylvania already employ the two-microgram threshold. The change will not be fully adopted until it is approved by the RCI Board of Directors at an October meeting.

Out-of-Competition Testing Starts in Kentucky:

An emergency regulation has been signed by Kentucky Governor Steve Beshear which clears the way for the start of out-of-competition testing from racehorses at any location and at any time. The governor's approval gives the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission extra authority to test urine and blood samples from unraced horses at racetracks, training centers and farms, including locations outside of Kentucky. It is the fifth racing jurisdiction to introduce out-of-competition testing, joining Illinois, Indiana, New Jersey and Ontario, Canada. New York state is also on the brink of approving the testing. The KHRC and its committees were eager to expedite the process, so as to comply with the requirements of Breeders' Cup Limited that its host tracks have the ability to conduct out-of-competition testing. This year's Breeders' Cup will be held at Churchill Downs Nov. 5 and 6. The commission also simultaneously approved rules to reduce the number of post-race samples it will test for illegal drugs by half.

Old Friends Name Brida, Nyren to Board:

Officials at Old Friends, the Georgetown, Kentucky-based Thoroughbred retirement facility, has elected former New York trainer Dennis Brida and owner Carol Nyren to its board of directors. Brida, 62, became a full-time trainer in 1978, and conditioned Dixie Brass to wins in the GI Met Mile and GII Withers S. Brida is a previous executive director of the New York Thoroughbred Breeders Association and was part of the Empire Racing group, which competed for the New York racing franchise when it came up for renewal in 2007. Nyren is best known as the owner of Dry Martini, winner of the GII Suburban H. in 2009. She most recently conducted the grand opening celebration at Old Friends's satellite facility in Greenfield Center, New York.

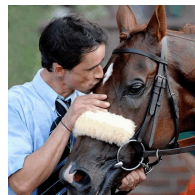
