TAPIT COLT ON TOP AT KEESEP MONDAY

It didn't take long for Monday's session of the Keeneland September sale to anoint its market leader, as a gray son of Tapit livened up the early going of the auction's eighth day selling. The colt, catalogued as [hip 1942](#), went to Ron Winchell for \$450,000.

Winchell's manager David Fiske handled the bidding from a back row inside the sales pavilion. "He is a Tapit, and nobody likes Tapit more than we do," Fiske explained of the purchase. Racing for Winchell Thoroughbreds, Tapit won the 2004 GI Wood Memorial before retiring to Gainesway in 2005. "We seem to have a near insatiable appetite for Tapits," Fiske chuckled. He estimated the operation has eight foals and five yearlings by the stallion, as well as six horses in training. Among those in training is graded stakes winner Hightap and stakes winner Remit.

The yearling is out of Victory Road (Ikari), another with connections to Winchell. Winchell and Gainesway purchased Victory Road, in foal to Honour and Glory, for \$47,000 out of the 2004 Keeneland November sale. The mare sold again, with this Tapit foal in utero, for \$75,000 at Keeneland November 2008 to the bid of Davant Latham on behalf of Alina Muther's Copper Penny Stables. Since then, the mare's three-year-old filly Touching Beauty (Tapit) was second in the 2009 GII Matron S. and won this year's GIII Comely S., and her four-year-old Noisy Feet (Tapit) became stakes-placed.

Of the price tag, Ron Winchell commented, "I was expecting it to be a little less, however, I was not surprised. Tapit is obviously red hot right now, and the standouts seem to bring all the money. This one ranked the highest on our purchase wish list. I own half of his two-year-old full brother, Tapaway, and he is highly regarded--so that helped to move him up on the priority list." Asked what the plan for the youngster was, Fiske said succinctly, "Win a Grade I." **Cont. p2**

The session topper was consigned to yesterday's sale by Brookdale Sales, as agent for Copper Penny.

Brookdale's Joe Seitz was gratified with the result.

"Surprised [by the price] wouldn't be the right word, because he was such a special horse," Seitz said shortly after congratulating Fiske on the purchase. "He really took off in the courtyard, with a lot of great shows for all the right people. It was a terrific sale, but at the same time I think he's a terrific horse. It was the perfect cross, because the mare has already done it twice. It was almost a no-brainer. During challenging times like this it was good money and we're all very pleased. It couldn't happen to a nicer or more deserving lady than Alina Muther."

A Lucky Copper Penny...

Yesterday's session-topping yearling was a rousing success for the fledgling Copper Penny Stables of Alina Muther. Reached for comment later in the day, Muther was still excited about the result.

"I'm not at the sale, so I watched the video streaming," Muther explained from her Pennsylvania home. "I have to say I was quite thrilled."

Muther has only recently gotten into the breeding game, and Victory Road, who she picked up for \$75,000 with the Tapit colt in utero at the 2008 Keeneland November sale, was one of her first broodmare purchases.

"A couple of years ago I was looking to buy a few mares and Pete Siegel, who is a pedigree advisor, called me and told me about the mare," Muther recalled. "He was intrigued by the Tapit pipeline--she had three Tapits and was in foal to Tapit. And Pete told me that he thought Tapit was the real thing...that he had all the makings of an epic sire. That was back before Tapit became the real thing--I think he just had Stardom Bound at that time. I wasn't at the sale, but I had Davant [Latham] go eyeball her for me, and he said she was quite a lovely mare."


Muther was in Lexington in late April of 2009 and decided to take a drive to see if she could catch Victory Road foaling at Clovelly Farm.

"I drove in, the barn was lit up and the farm guy told me that she was right there," Muther recalled with a laugh. "So I was patting her and she was getting ready to foal when I realized I was petting a mare called Victory Roll and I was on Normandy Farm. It was the wrong mare on the wrong farm. I got to the right farm and I was staying with her until 1 a.m. when I decided maybe she wasn't going to foal that night. So I left, then found out that she foaled 40 minutes later."

It didn't take long for Muther to think she had herself a standout foal.

"When he was a couple of months old, I saw him again and he was sparkly--that's the only word I can think of to use," she said. "He just looked special. When I saw him in the field, he just sparkled. He was very correct and all that, but beyond that there was just something special about him. It hurts to have to sell him. But I'm glad he is going to a good home, and I wish them luck with him."

Copper Penny Stable began as a purely hypothetical dream for Muther.

“You know when people say, ‘If you had money, what would you do?’ I thought I’d love to breed Thoroughbred race horses,” she said. “So a few years ago, when my husband sold a portion of his business and we had a bit of money, I decided to try it. I started with three cheaper older mares about four years ago. Those foals are two-year-olds now, and they are just homebreds. But then I decided to get more serious and get a couple better mares.”

Muther admitted the breeding industry is a tough one to break into.

“This is a very intimidating business--everybody knows everybody--and starting out was very scary,” she confirmed. “The first mares I bought, I bought privately because I was scared to death to put my hand up [to bid]. But I’ve gotten more savvy and I have some great people helping me--from Pete Seigel, my pedigree advisor, to Davant, who looked at the mare, to all the people at Clovelly, and to Joe Seitz who did a great job with the foal.”

Copper Penny currently has eight broodmares. Muther said she could see the stable growing to some 10 to 12 mares. She expects to keep and race fillies to make into broodmares and sell the colts, three of which will go through the Keeneland ring in November.

One filly likely to become part of the Copper Penny broodmare band is Coax Liberty (Successful Appeal). Purchased by the stable for \$60,000 at last year’s OBS February sale, the juvenile finished third in the Gill Adirondack S.

With an uncertain economic climate, it might seem to be a bad time to start a commercial breeding operation, but Muther remains confident.

“When I started, the market wasn’t this bad,” she explained. “And I’m a bit of a contrarian anyway. I took a hit, there is no question, with the higher stud fees in 2008. I probably won’t know how bad until the weanlings sell. But racehorses are like fine art. Good racehorses and broodmares will always be in demand.”

Although she is still a newcomer to the game, Muther sounds like someone who is hooked.

“There is just something thrilling about a big sale,” she laughed. “Looking at yearlings is just looking at potential. There is conformation and pedigree, of course, but it is really 100 percent about potential. And it is thrilling when someone else sees what you see.”

Vogel Upgrading at Keeneland September...

Carolyn Vogel sat unassumingly inside the sales pavilion, just rows in front of where a flock of professional pinhookers looked ready to strike as a filly by Arch out of Board Battle (Seeking the Gold) ([hip 2000](#)) walked into the ring at Keeneland yesterday. At the end of bidding, though, it was the New Hampshire resident who walked away with the ticket for the yearling with a final bid of \$285,000.

"She was short-listed by someone I know who saw her," Vogel said. "And she was the only one on the short list that I liked. Plus she had a wonderful look. Then, when she got in the walking ring, she looked even better."

Vogel, involved in racing for the last five years, currently has about 12 horses on the track with trainers including John Hertler and Seth Benzel. Her current stable star is Indian Burn (Indian Charlie), who won Aqueduct's Ruthless S. in January and was third in the GIII Cicada S.

In addition to the Arch filly, Vogel also purchased a Borrego colt ([hip 1887](#)) during Sunday's session of the Keeneland sale for \$215,000, and a daughter of Tapit ([hip 1114](#)) for \$105,000.

Vogel said she wasn't bidding more actively, but buying more selectively.

"I'm just as active, but I'm trying to get the quality of my string more in the mainstream where the really good races are," she explained.

Vogel added that, while she is no stranger to horses, it wasn't until a few years ago that she decided to get into racing.

"I've had horses all my life and there finally came a time when I thought perhaps I ought to try and do it after thinking about it for a long time," she explained. "I had Thoroughbreds, but not racehorses. So I decided to dip my toe into the racing game. I'm trying to do it myself--I don't want to just sit back and let other people do it for me. So far things have been pretty successful."

Arch Filly Rewards Harrigan...

Bill Harrigan's Miacomet Bloodstock purchased Board Battle (Seeking the Gold), carrying her first foal, for \$70,000 at the 2008 Keeneland November sale. The mare's yearling Arch filly returned to Keeneland yesterday, netting her connections a serious profit.

"All of these top people were looking at her and coming back to look at her again," Harrigan, celebrating his biggest sales success, said. "I knew she was going to sell well, but I didn't dream this."

Board Battle is out of Stuart Janney's graded stakes placed Proxy Statement (A.P. Indy), and from a long line of Janney homebreds, including Deputation, Carriage Trail and Criminologist.

"I know the family quite well," Harrigan responded when asked what had attracted him to Board Battle in 2008. "I've done a lot of work for Shug McGaughey and the Stuart Janney family."

Of the yearling, Harrigan said, "She's a big scopey Arch filly that had a fantastic temperament. She has a really good mind on her. She'll take to just about anything and I think she's very athletic. I think she'll make a stakes horse, but maybe not a two-year-old."

Harrigan currently has 12 broodmares at his Georgetown farm. Board Battle was bred to Stormy Atlantic last spring.

Hardin Gets His Holiday...

Late in Monday's session of the September sale, Bill Hardin struck to take home a son of Harlan's Holiday for \$275,000. The colt ([hip 2323](#)) was consigned by Brookdale Sales as agent for his breeder, Audley Farm. He is the first foal out of the unraced Tamina (Dixie Union), a half-sister to stakes winners Changeisgonnacome (Cherokee Run) and Little Miss Pamela (El Prado {Ire}). Hardin currently has a racing stable of eight head, all with trainer Steve Hobby.

"We just loved the colt when we saw him yesterday," Hardin, a retired FBI agent, said. "He has great conformation and he's a beautiful horse and a great mover."

Hardin has been in the racing game for years, but is hoping this yearling will help him upgrade his stock.

"We just moved up to spend a little more money and move up to a little better horse," he reflected.

Hardin was satisfied with the colt's price. "We were prepared to pay that," he explained. "It was good value for the dollar."

Bidding Strong at Keeneland Monday...

Keeneland's eighth session provided plenty of spirited bidding and very few buy-backs. Yesterday's session featured an RNA rate of just 21.9 percent, while the sale's cumulative buy-back rate is 27.8 percent.

"We're getting a lot of them sold with not a lot of buy-backs," confirmed Frank Taylor of Taylor Made Sales Agency. "I think sellers have adjusted their expectations and set the reserves pretty low. And then the market is pretty good, too, so we're getting them sold. We're getting a lot of RNAs from earlier in the week sold, too."

Taylor admitted he is surprised by the competitive September market.

"The market is a lot stronger and better than I thought it was going to be," he said. "Hopefully, it will just keep going."

Kitty Taylor of Warrendale Sales agreed.

"The market is very strong," she said. "We've only had five RNAs [versus 15 sold] today, so we've done very well. I think it's more business as usual, people are back in there and swinging. We had a lot of vetting in our barn and we've gone well past our reserves for most of our horses."

Bloodstock agent Mike Ryan shook his head incredulously.

"It's extraordinary," he said of the market. "There are lots of good physicals, but that's nothing new. The better horses stand out above the crowd, and they're selling unbelievable. There is still a lot of money here. People are really having to chase horses. It's very active. I'm not sure why, but I love it. It's a great sign. From the buying end, looking at horses and seeing what they're bringing, it's fantastic. I didn't see it coming. I didn't think it would be this robust. It's very lively and primarily domestic. There is not a whole lot of overseas spending. So that is reassuring."

Book Three Ends on High Note...

At the conclusion of book three of the September sale, Keeneland officials were pleased with the auction's strong results.

"All indicators look very positive, the not-sold rate especially," said Keeneland's Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell.

For yesterday's session, 83 of the 379 horses offered were reported not sold.

"I think, going into the sale, the biggest discussion was, because of the cost to produce these yearlings, would trade take place?" Russell continued. "And what we've seen is that trade is taking place, and at a very good, acceptable level."

Asked if the low buy-back rate was more a reflection of low reserves or increased bidding, Russell said, "It's a little bit of both. I think the good horses are bringing more than people are expecting and, at the other end, some are getting sold because people have decided that their cash flow is more important than anything else."

During yesterday's session, 296 yearlings sold for \$15,130,700. The average was \$51,117 and the median was \$39,500. At last year's eighth session, 274 head brought \$9,744,700 for an average of \$35,565 and the median was \$25,000. In total, 1,521 horses have grossed \$173,754,700 so far this year. The cumulative average is \$114,237 and the median is \$70,000. Through eight sessions of the 2009 September sale, 1,747 yearlings brought \$171,778,500, for an average of \$98,328 and a median of \$55,000.

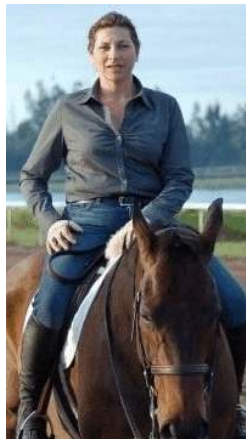

Kim Valerio purchased this horse as a pinhooking prospect for \$33,000 last year at Keeneland November. Put back through the ring here, he realized a price over six times greater. "He was a beautifully balanced colt," said Valerio. "He had a Danzig feel to him, he was so well-balanced. He looked fast and looked like he'd have nice speed. He

was a gorgeous horse." Valerio had purchased the Rockport Harbor colt on behalf of an undisclosed Irish businessman. "I don't pinhook much--I do about two or four horses each year," she explained. "With this client, whatever money I make, he lets me roll back into buying more horses." Yesterday's transaction was a result of that parlay. For the same client, Valerio privately acquired a filly off the track named Express Chick (Hennessy). She resold the mare, in foal to Majestic Warrior, for \$150,000 at last year's Keeneland November Sale. "We made about \$100,000 on that, and we rolled some of that money back," Valerio said. Valerio was plenty familiar with Express Chick's pedigree, as she'd purchased her half-sister, last year's GI American Oaks heroine Gozzip Girl (Dynaformer), for \$60,000 as a KEESEP yearling in 2007.

Earlier this year, Valerio, for a different client, had another major pinhooking success when she sold The Factor (War Front) to George Bolton for \$250,000 at Barretts March. The Factor was originally a \$40,000 FTKJUL yearling. The colt is currently in training with Bob Baffert and has yet to make his debut, but has generated some buzz. "He got a little sick--he had a little temperature," Valerio explained of the delayed bow. "He's a pretty for-real horse, and Bob's not going to take any chances with him. So he's back galloping and he'll breeze soon, and he'll run at the Hollywood meet." She added, "He's beautiful. He looks a lot like Silver Charm, that one."

Grandmas' Girl was hammered down to Fred Hertrich III for \$95,000 at the 2008 Keeneland November Sale while carrying this colt. The following year, the mare's half-brother Gentleman Chester (Chester House), already a MSW, ran a very good second to Just as Well (A.P. Indy) in the GIII Arlington H., and was beaten 3 1/2 lengths when fourth in the GI Sword Dancer Invitational S. at Saratoga. Those pedigree updates added a bit more sheen to this colt, who got his connections out on the mare's purchase price--and then some.

Jody Huckabay explained that one group of his clients had purchased the colt from another group, which had an eye on pinhooking. "We liked the colt a lot at that time--he was big and striking, with a big walk on him--and we decided to roll him back here," said Huckabay. "He's a very nice colt and had a lot of play on him--the majority of them racehorse people [end users]. There were very few pinhookers on him, but as we've seen throughout this whole sale, when the racehorse people line up, fun things can happen. David Ingordo was on the horse; Steve Asmussen was on the horse. So there were some very good people on him. I was also happy with the response we got for a son of Bob and John, a freshman sire [by Seeking the Gold], as things have shifted to the more proven horses. But that also indicates how nice this colt was. He is big and powerful and looks like he can go two turns." Earlier in the sale, Elm Tree enjoyed another big consigning success when [hip 658](#), a filly by Malibu Moon out of GSP Erhu (Tactical Cat), topped the fourth session on Glen Hill Farm's \$700,000 offer. The filly was bred by Elm Tree and Popatop.

When Tom Evans's Trakside Farm purchased this filly in utero for \$150,000 at the 2008 Keeneland November Sale, the filly's half-sister Beyondallboundarys (Saint Liam) was a yearling. As a three-year-old this year, Beyondallboundarys has become one of three black-type winners from her late sire's lone crop, taking the \$100,000 Dearly Precious S. at Monmouth in July. The sophomore went on to be third to Rapport (Songandaprayer) in the GIII Victory Ride S. at Saratoga. That didn't hurt the value of this Grand Slam filly, who earned back a good deal of her dam's purchase price yesterday.

Julio Bozano's Haras Santa Maria de Araras S.A. purchased this colt's dam at the 2001 Keeneland November Sale for \$130,000, carrying a colt named Seizan Speed (Stormin Fever). That colt would go on to sell for \$175,000 as a KEESEP yearling. Restraint's second foal, the stakes-placed Maria Pia (Silver Deputy), made \$260,000 as a KEESEP yearling in 2004. In 2007, Restraint's son Hold Me Back (Giant's Causeway) was hammered down to Maverick Racing for \$400,000. Racing for WinStar Farm, Hold Me Back won last year's GII Lane's End S. and finished second in the GI Shadwell Travers S. and GI Toyota Blue Grass S. Grand Slam's stud fee was listed as \$35,000 when this colt was conceived in 2008, and Bozano's operation once again enjoyed a good result here. Bozano, who has been involved with Thoroughbreds for 30 years, has divisions of Haras Santa Maria in Argentina--where he has some 300 head--and Ocala, where he has roughly 45 mares. Haras Santa Maria also boards mares at Taylor Made in Kentucky.

September Sale Comparison, by Bill Oppenheim

Keeneland Sales Director Geoffrey Russell's tip that the first six days (Books 1-2) had seen exactly the same number of horses sold (941) as the first five days last year (Books 1-2, plus day 1 of Book 3) can be extended by two more days, as we compare here the first three books this year against the first three books, plus Book 4 (day 1) last year. The last two days of selling this year (Book 3, Sunday/Monday) have shown good gains compared to the second day of Book 3 last year, plus the first day of Book 4. After six full sessions plus two half-sessions (Book 1) this year, compared with the first seven days last year, the number catalogued is down four percent, but the number sold up three percent, as the clearance rate has improved by four or five percent. The gross is up seven percent using this comparison, the average by four percent. It can't be official, because there's almost no way to state it, but it works: that's why pragmatism is often a better description of reality in this business than all the theories going. (Table below)

Canford Cliffs (Ire) (Tagawa {Ire}), heading all ante-post betting lists, is one of 14 possibles following yesterday's confirmation stage for Saturday's G1 Queen Elizabeth S. at Ascot. The G1 Irish 2000 Guineas, G1 St James's Palace S. and G1 Sussex S. hero will bid for a fourth straight top-level success, but faces a stellar line-up ready to deny him. **Makfi (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}) bested Canford Cliffs in the May 1 G1 2000 Guineas, but could manage

only seventh to that rival when losing his unbeaten tag in the June 15 G1 James's Palace at Ascot's Royal meet. He was found to be suffering from a throat infection after that reversal, but regained the winning thread in a white-hot renewal of the G1 Prix Jacques le Marois last time Aug. 15. The pair will seek to continue a fine run of three-year-old winners in the Sony-sponsored event, with three of the last four coming from the Classic generation. Aidan O'Brien, who supplied two of those sophomore wins with **George Washington (Ire)** (Danehill) and **Rip Van Winkle (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), will send out the latter to attempt to become the first back-to-back winner of the contest since **Rose Bowl (Habitat)** in 1976. The Ballydoyle conditioner has five further entries still engaged. Godolphin's G2 Celebration Mile victor **Poet's Voice (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}) was supplemented at a cost of £20,000, and joins back-to-form stablemate **Rio de la Plata (Rahy)**, who finished second in the Sept. 5 G1 Prix du Moulin, in the field.

Pathfork to Target Juvenile...

The Silverton Hill Partnership's **Pathfork** (Distorted Humor), recent winner of the G1 Vincent O'Brien National S. at The Curragh, will switch from the turf and point to the main-track G1 Breeders' Cup Juvenile at Churchill Downs Nov. 6, trainer Jessica Harrington has revealed. In addition to his narrow verdict last time, Pathfork also bagged the Aug. 21 G2 Futurity S. for a perfect three-for-three record. "Having discussed plans with Pathfork's owners, Tommy and Bonnie Hamilton [who are based near Churchill Downs], in the past week, we've decided that he'll be trained for the Juvenile on the dirt," Harrington told *Racing Post*. "Obviously, it will depend on Pathfork continuing in good form and how he takes the journey to the U.S., but we're very happy with him, and his National S. win doesn't seem to have taken anything out of him." With regard to a possible tilt at next May's G1 Kentucky Derby back at Churchill Downs, she added, "We're taking one step at a time, and we're not looking beyond the Breeders' Cup meeting."

LORD SHANAKILL Lord Shanakill (Speightstown--Green Room, by Theatrical {Ire}) has been retired to stand at the Irish National Stud, the *Racing Post* revealed yesterday. Successful in the 2008 G2 Mill Reef S. at Newbury, the 2009 G1 Prix Jean Prat at Chantilly and the recent G2 Lennox S. at Goodwood, the four-year-old, who raced for Mogeely Stud and Mark Gittins, will stand alongside the pre-eminent sires Invincible Spirit (Ire) and Verglas (Ire). Trained initially by Karl Burke, the \$110,000 Keeneland September yearling purchase also raced for the Alan Jarvis and Richard Mandella stables before ending his career with Henry Cecil. He was beaten a nose by Intense Focus (Giant's Causeway) when runner-up in the 2008 G1 Dewhurst S., and was third in that year's G1 Prix Morny, the following season's G1 St James's Palace S. and this year's G1 Lockinge S. His family includes the 1999 G1 Yellow Ribbon H. winner Spanish Fern (El Gran Senor) and the world-class Al Bahathri (Blushing Groom {Fr}), responsible for Haafhd (GB) (Alhaarth {Ire}). Overall, he compiled a record of 18-5-2-5 and bankrolled \$909,498. No fee has been set at this time.

Fourth in the Breeders' Cup Turf at Santa Anita, he also hit the board in the Dec. 13 G1 Hong Kong Vase at Sha Tin and Mar. 27 G1 Sheema Classic for a second time. He retires with a record of 16-6-3-2, and earnings of £1,793,586.

TDN MOVIE REVIEW: SECRETARIAT

The racing purists may want to snicker at the thought of a movie about Secretariat, especially one produced by Disney. Put Hollywood, Disney and horse racing in the same mix and you're sure to come out with something a little cheesy and a little loose with the facts.

The Secretariat movie is indeed all that. So what?

This wasn't meant to be a blow-by-blow documentary of the life and times of the 1973 Triple Crown winner or the people behind him. It's a movie--a Disney movie at that--and its job is to entertain. In that regard, it succeeds nicely.

The star is not Secretariat, but Penny Tweedy, who is portrayed by Diane Lane. She's ensconced in her life as a Denver housewife and is far removed from her parents' stable. That changes when her mother dies and as her father's health continues to deteriorate. Tweedy arrives to find that the stable has serious tax problems, and it seems the only hope is to sell off the assets to pay the IRS.

But Tweedy digs in, believing the solution rests with a chestnut yearling by Bold Ruler. Secretariat starts to burn up the racetrack, which prompts Ogden Phipps (James Cromwell) to offer Tweedy \$7 million for the horse. That would solve all her problems, but destroy the dream of winning the Triple Crown and bringing glory to her father's Meadow Stables. She spurns the offer and, instead, puts together a syndication deal with a

young Seth Hancock (Drew Roy).

It doesn't come easily, but Tweedy and Hancock succeed and raise the money by piecing together the syndication package. Secretariat wins the Triple Crown. The taxes are paid. Everyone lives happily ever after.

None of it could have happened if not for Tweedy. The movie is set in an era when a powerful female figure in horse racing was even more of a rarity than it is today, and Tweedy has to not only have an iron will, but deal with the old boys' network. She may not look tough, but she is. You don't want to mess with her.

Every movie of this sort needs a villain and in this one, it is Sham and his trainer, Frank 'Pancho' Martin (Nestor Serrano). They arrive on the scene intent on derailing the Secretariat Express and, ultimately, ruining everything Tweedy has been trying so hard to accomplish. Martin oozes arrogance. He must be defeated.

Martin's portrayal is an exaggeration, as are so many things in this movie. Creating a good story comes first. They don't mind playing around a bit with the facts, especially when it comes to Sham. He first meets Secretariat in the Wood Memorial, in which Secretariat finished third. The winner was his stablemate Angle Light, while Sham was second.

The Wood Memorial sequences are so hazy that you're not quite sure who won--Sham or Angle Light? I thought they had Sham winning it. Some who have also seen the movie agree with me. Some say they got it right, with Angle Light winning. Others aren't sure. Maybe that's the idea, to leave you with the impression that Sham won the Wood and can again conquer Secretariat in the upcoming Kentucky Derby.

It's also important that Tweedy is set up as an underdog, which is probably why there's not a single mention of Riva Ridge in the movie. If the viewing public knew that Tweedy won the Kentucky Derby only a year earlier, might she be thought of differently, as more establishment than plucky, easy-to-root-for newcomer to the game?

That sort of thing might matter to a typical *TDN* reader, but John Q. Public doesn't know the first thing about Riva Ridge, who won the 1973 Wood Memorial or what Pancho Martin was really like. That's who the movie is for, the person or family who wants to spend their \$9 at the multiplex and get, in return, a pleasant, entertaining experience along with their buttered popcorn. The preview audience at the screening I attended stood and applauded at the end.

When it comes to provoking that sort of reaction, Disney certainly knows what it is doing. They make the Secretariat gang as likeable as can be. Laurin (played by John Malkovich) is a colorful, good-hearted eccentric. Eddie Sweat (Nelsan Ellis) is loyal and dedicated. Secretariat himself is not just a great racehorse, but also playful ham who poses for pictures and demonstrates in no uncertain terms his disdain for a reporter who dares to question his greatness.

The movie is not Oscar material; it's not deep and it is predictable. But it's a nice, fun, pleasing movie. *To watch the trailer, click [here](#). Opens October 8.*

Jack Kelly Passes Away: *(Edited Press Release)*

Jack Kelly, an Equibase chartcaller and field supervisor since 1998 and a longtime fixture on the Thoroughbred racing scene, died early Monday at Columbia-Presbyterian Medical Center in New York City after a long illness. He was 61 years old. Kelly, a native of Philadelphia and a graduate of Cal State/Hayward, was introduced to racing at a young age and was handicapping races by the time he was a teenager. He called charts at the Fresno Fair races in the early 1980s for the racing publication *SportsEye*. By 1982, he was calling charts on the Southern California circuit and in 1984 he joined the *Daily Racing Form* staff on the East Coast. Over the next 14 or 15 years, he covered racing at a number of tracks in the mid-Atlantic area for *DRF* as either a columnist or chart caller. When the licensing agreement between *DRF* and Equibase was signed in 1998, Equibase hired him as a field supervisor. Kelly once estimated that he had worked at 44 different racetracks through the years, and had probably called over 50,000 races. He is survived by his wife, Nancy, who is vice president of development for Grayson-Jockey Club Research Foundation and executive director of The Jockey Club Foundation; three sisters and a brother. 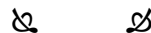
