**MAKFI TO BANISH MEMORY OF DEFEAT**

Mathieu Offenstadt's **Makfi (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}) suffered his only defeat in five career outings when seventh behind Canford Cliffs (Ire) (Tagula {Ire}) in the June 15 G1 St James's Palace S. at Royal Ascot, but trainer Mikel Delzangles believes his star sophomore will be a different proposition in Saturday's G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. when he returns to the Berkshire venue. Makfi announced his arrival on the scene with a victory in the May 1 G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket, but was suffering from a throat infection when undone at the Royal meet. He bounced back to form in a

stellar renewal of the Aug. 15 G1 Prix Jacques le Marois at Deauville. "Makfi is in very good form and he came back very well from his race at Deauville," Delzangles offered. "He worked [at Les Reservoirs gallops in Chantilly] Monday and did some very nice work. He wasn't well the last time he ran at Ascot and there's a possibility he may remember that experience. He won't be sick on Saturday so, hopefully, he'll do much better this time. Christophe Soumillon, who won on him in his last race, will be on board again on Saturday."

**DIXIE UNION COLT TOPS KEESEP TUESDAY**

Agent Ben Glass, Gary and Mary West's racing manager, ponied up \$210,000 to secure the highest-priced offering during Tuesday's session of the Keeneland September sale. Offered by Hill 'n' Dale Sales Agency, [hip 2706](#) is a son of the recently deceased Dixie Union out of Sky Select (Sky Mesa). He was bred in Ontario by Steven Dilorio, who acquired the second dam Annasan (Corporate Report) for \$400,000 carrying Sky Select at Keeneland November in 2004. Annasan is the dam of Canadian Horse of the Year A Bit O'Gold (Gold Fever). Glass has signed the tickets for 18 yearlings thus far at the September sale, totalling \$3,722,000 for an average price of \$206,778. **KeeSep cont. p2-4**

Keeneland sold 297 horses for \$7,995,400 during yesterday's session. The average was \$26,921, and the median was \$18,000. The buy-back rate was just 19.5 percent.

"We continue to be encouraged because with each session, the clearance rate remains very strong," said Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell. "One of our main goals for this sale, and for this new format, was that horses brought to market would sell. Fortunately, trade has been very good so far."

**Nothin' But Net cont.**

Aoyama purchased the mare to support the young Storm Cat stallion Seeking the Dia, who Aoyama campaigned in Japan. Bred in Kentucky by Jayeff B Stables, the son of Group 1 winner Seeking the Pearl (Seeking the Gold) finished first or second in 16 of 28 races in Japan and earned \$4,982,968. He accounted for five black-type wins and finished second in 10 races that carried Group 1 status in Japan, including consecutive editions of the Japan Cup Dirt in 2005 and 2006.

Aoyama retired Seeking the Dia after the 2007 season and initially stood him in Japan. But John Sikura's Hill 'n' Dale Farm made a play for the stallion, and the now-nine-year-old was shipped stateside.

"John sent me to Japan to go and look at him during his first season," said Lanni. "He was a very sound horse, always ran in the top races in Japan, and was always there in Group 1 races. He just never won one, so that's why we were able to get our hands on him. In Japan, you can't run on any kind of medication--no Lasix, no bute--and he was a very sound son of Storm Cat."

Aoyama purchased three mares at the 2008 Keeneland November Sale to send to Seeking the Dia, including Champagne Sue, who produced a filly by the stallion this spring. Champagne Sue is a half-sister to Grade II winner Sapphire N' Silk (Pleasant Tap) and to this year's GIII Affirmed S. hero Golden Itiz (Tiznow). Further, she is a half to the dam of MGSW & MGISP Shared Account (Pleasantly Perfect), a rock-solid grass performer over the last two seasons.

At the same November sale in 2008, Aoyama acquired Painted Rose (Stephen Got Even), in foal to Discreet Cat, for \$75,000. Aoyama also did well with that transaction, selling the resulting Discreet Cat colt to Goldmark Farm for \$150,000 at this year's Fasig-Tipton July Sale.

Lanni described Aoyama as a young, enthusiastic supporter of racing. "He's a really good guy and he loves the game," said Lanni. "He really supported [Seeking the Dia] in Japan and now those foals are yearlings."

# RACETRACK Round-Up

**Whither Workforce?**

Connections have yet to commit G1 Epsom Derby winner **Workforce (GB)** (King's Best) to the Oct. 3 G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe at Longchamp, but were encouraged after the Juddmonte Farms homebred pleased in a racecourse gallop at Sandown yesterday. Partnered by Ryan Moore, he worked approximately one mile around the Esher course and finished well clear of his two stablemates, G3 Joel S. winner **Confront (GB)** (Nayef) and the maiden winner **Official Style (GB)** (Dansili {GB}). "There is nothing definite [regarding the Arc], but this is another box ticked and it's encouraging," Khalid Abdullah's Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe told *Racing Post*. "Is it a green light? No, it's an amber. Now we have to see him go the right way, check out fine and see how he does. [Owner] Prince Khalid [Abdullah] needs to be confident enough to give the go ahead and that will come from the horse and [trainer] Sir Michael [Stoute]."

**Pretty Unusual Dies...**

Grade II winner **Pretty Unusual** (Unusual Heat--Sci Fi Kin, by Siphon {Brz}) died Sunday due to post-surgical complications. Bred by Madeleine Auerbach and David Abrams, the bay filly was campaigned by Auerbach, Marie Goda and Jack Klugman, and was trained by Barry Abrams. She captured the 2009 Melair S. for Calbreds, and added the GII El Encino S. earlier this year. Pretty Unusual had not raced since finishing second in an optional-claiming test at Santa Anita Apr. 2. She compiled a record of 14-3-3-1 while earning \$304,152.

**Del Mar Paying Horsemen Additional Purse Money:**

Del Mar Thoroughbred Club revealed that it will pay horsemen a retroactive purse distribution that is estimated to be between \$850-900,000. The purse payments cover overnight purses only at the recently concluded meeting. Track officials indicated that checks should be ready to be sent out by November, once final figures from all sources are confirmed. The 2010 meeting finished with a total handle of \$449,711,296 and a daily average of \$12,154,359. Though the overall numbers showed a daily average decline from the previous season, the amount wagered on a per-race basis in 2010 equaled the amount wagered in 2009 as the track carded fewer races in anticipation of a decline in horse population. "Our horsemen were, along with racing fans, the reason for a successful meet this summer," said DMTC's President and General Manager Craig Fravel. "Our racing office managed the inventory well and in the end the numbers--both on the track and at the pari-mutuels--were better than expected." The track averaged 8.2 horses per race throughout the summer, just a shade below last summer's standard (8.5) and among the best per-race figures in the country. Del Mar's daily average purses for 2010, \$557,000 per day, were the highest in California.

**BETFAIR TO GAIN LONDON STOCK**

**EXCHANGE LISTING** Exchange firm Betfair will be floated on the London Stock Exchange with early estimates putting a value of around £1.5 billion on the person-to-person betting medium. If those estimates are accurate, it would see Betfair among the top 250 companies and earn it a place on the FTSE 250 Index. No new shares will be issued in the process and pricing details have yet to be revealed. It is expected that approximately 10 percent of existing shares will be made available to trade. Despite increased revenues, the company yesterday announced reduced profits for the last financial year, but believes its ongoing success will attract potential investors. "Becoming a publicly listed company will provide Betfair with the heightened profile and enhanced transparency that will help us cement our long-term relationships with customers, regulators and business partners around the world," Betfair Founder Ed Wray told *PA Sport*. The British Horseracing Authority's Chairman Paul Roy took the opportunity to reiterate the BHA's stance on the subject, and added, "Today's announcement is no real surprise to the markets. What will be of great interest is that it comes a day after the close of a major consultation process by the Horserace Betting Levy Board that strikes at the heart of Betfair's model at a time when the figure of an underpayment to [British] Racing of £30 million has been stated by a leading betting industry figure, and during which the future relationship between exchange betting and racing is under close scrutiny by the relevant authorities. British Racing is the sport upon which Betfair was founded, and from which it continues to generate a substantial proportion of its business. There are many in British Racing who for a great many reasons would not have allowed exchange betting had it been our choice as opposed to the government's. The history of the last few years has proved those sceptics to have been right. There remain a number of fundamental questions around the business of exchange betting. We are confident that these will be resolved as part of the wider issue of the relationship between racing and betting. The new government has signaled its policy commitment to ensuring a value transfer from betting to racing as it sets policy to catch up with changes in technology and the way people bet. We would entirely agree that Betfair has been 'disruptive' and 'fundamentally changed the sports betting market.' Whether intended or not, it has certainly disrupted British Racing's finances, and has created severe consequences. It has indeed, for its customers, 'eliminated the need for a traditional bookmaker,' and markets itself as 'cutting out the middle man.'" **Cont. p4**

Roy continued, "At the same time, Betfair has argued it should be treated as a traditional bookmaker for the purposes of its contribution to our sport. Betfair cannot have it both ways. Any international racing jurisdiction considering permitting Betfair to operate in their territory has to give very careful consideration to the impact on their sport, and learn from the British experience. In fact, we understand that they are offering far better terms to other racing authorities, and we call on Betfair to now engage with us constructively and end the uncertainty."

Later, Coolmore's Eddie Fitzpatrick was on hand to secure hip 247, a colt from the first crop of the 2007 G1 St James's Palace S. winner Excellent Art from Swordlestown Stud. His second dam is the high-class sprinter Pipalong (Ire) (Pips Pride {GB}), who is in turn the dam of last year's G3 Anglesey S. scorer and G1 Phoenix S. third Walk On Bye (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}). "He's a good-looking, sharp sort by an exciting young stallion and he's from a very quick and high-class family," Fitzpatrick explained.
