BATTLE ROYAL

There is no doubt that the scratch of Canford Cliffs (Ire) (Tagula {Ire}) has diminished today's G1 Queen Elizabeth II S., but the Ascot feature should still stir the soul if **Makfi (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}) and **Rip Van Winkle (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) bring their A-games. Apart from a flop at the Royal meeting in the June 15 St James's Palace S.--when he was reportedly sick--Makfi has done no wrong, and represents the Classic generation, which has bested their elders in this event 20 times since 1980. His latest dismissal of Europe's Group 1 brigade of Goldikova (Ire) (Anabaa), Paco Boy (Ire) (Desert Style {Ire}) and Fuisse (Fr) (Green Tune) in Deauville's G1 Prix Jacques le Marois Aug. 15 sets a lofty standard, and the rain has come to further his cause. Mathieu Offenstadt's colt beat Canford Cliffs in the G1 2000 Guineas. His trainer Mikel Delzangles reported, "He's been working very well. I was surprised he beat horses like Goldikova and Paco Boy in that way, but physically he had grown and strengthened a lot since Royal Ascot, when he scoped dirty with a throat infection afterwards. He doesn't mind soft ground, whereas others do, but he doesn't need it, as it was fast for the Guineas. He is straightforward and can adapt to follow any pace." Godolphin, successful four times since 1996, rely on the talented **Poet's Voice (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}), who looked an improved performer when brushing aside the solid yardstick Main Aim (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}) in the G2 Celebration Mile at Goodwood Aug. 28. He had shown high-class form as a juvenile when winning the G2 Champagne S. at Doncaster 12 months ago, before his natural enthusiasm got the better of him, and it is only in his last two starts that he has been able to rate and show his strength in the finish. "Poet's Voice won very nicely at Goodwood, and he has been in very good form since that victory," trainer Saeed bin Suroor said. "He came back sound and healthy, and his final piece of work went well. He is coming up against some very good milers, but he deserves to take his chance, and I am hopeful that he can run a good race as long as he settles." **Cont. p2**

WHITE HOT IN FILLIES' MILE

White Moonstone (Dynaformer) bids to emulate the recent luminaries Crystal Music (Nureyev), Gossamer (GB) (Sadler's Wells), Soviet Song (Ire) (Marju {Ire}) and Rainbow View (Dynaformer) in successfully defending an unbeaten record in the prestigious G1 Meon Valley Stud Fillies' Mile S., which is due to move to Newmarket from 2011. Unchallenged on her first three starts, she registered facile wins over six furlongs here July 23, in Newmarket's seven-furlong G3 Sweet Solera S. Aug. 7 and Doncaster's G2 May Hill S. over this trip Sept. 10, and carries the hopes of the Godolphin team. "White Moonstone was very impressive at Doncaster, and she came out of that race in very good order," trainer Saeed bin Suroor commented. "She worked well on Tuesday morning, and I am happy with her. This is a tough race, but she won at Ascot on her debut and is improving all of the time." Tough opposition comes in the form of **Theyskens' Theory** (Bernardini), who followed a five-length maiden win at Newmarket July 31 with a smooth first black-type score in Goodwood's G3 Prestige S. G1 Dewhurst S. scorer **Beethoven (Ire)** (Oratorio {Ire}) and the Apr. 17 G3 Minstrel S. scorer **Air Chief Marshal (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) as Ballydoyle seek safety in numbers. Allowed to make his own running when sixth on his seasonal bow in Royal Ascot's Queen Anne June 15, Rip Van

Winkle had pace help when runner-up to Canford Cliffs in Goodwood's Sussex S. July 28 before going it alone again when annexing the Aug. 17 G1 Juddmonte International S. over an extended 10 furlongs at York. While Cape Blanco (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) was never meant to be merely a pacemaker in the G1 Irish Champion S. at Leopardstown last time Sept. 4, the exaggerated hold-up tactics employed on that occasion gave Rip Van Winkle a mountain to climb. Johnny Murtagh, who steered him into a distant second there, told *PA Sport*, "Everybody knows what I think of him. I've always thought he was special, and I'm looking forward to tomorrow when it's another big day again. He won it last year, so he obviously likes the track. They seem to be very confident about Makfi. He'll be a tough nut to crack, but I'm looking forward to riding Rip again."

Last year's G1 Gran Criterium winner **Hearts of Fire (GB)** (Firebreak {GB}) has already shown a liking for this track when third despite a troubled trip in the St James's Palace, but needs to show more than when subsequently fourth in the July 4 G1 Prix Jean Prat at Chantilly and fifth in the G3 Sovereign S. at Salisbury Aug. 12.

Getting a Line on Morning Line...

He makes his stakes bow in the \$1-million GII Pennsylvania Derby, but **Morning Line** (Tiznow) looked more than ready in his last outing. The dark bay cost Thoroughbred Legends Racing Stable \$700,000 as a KESEP yearling, then started just once as a juvenile, running fourth at Aqueduct in November. Making his second appearance at Monmouth May 22, he ran second after setting the pace. Morning Line was the even-money chalk at the Oceanport oval June 27 and ran to

his odds, romping to a front-running eight-length score. Second in a Saratoga allowance July 31, he made every pole a winning one at the Spa Aug. 21, hitting the line 11 lengths to the good. The Nick Zito trainee will have plenty of company on the front end today. **Exhi** went gate to

wire in the GII Coolmore Lexington S. at Keeneland in April and came from second to take the Marine S. at Woodbine May 29. In the lead all the way in the Victoria Park S. June 27, he chased Concord Point (Tapit) throughout to be runner-up in the GII West Virginia Derby Aug. 7. **First Dude** set the pace before running second in the GI Preakness S. and third in the GI Belmont S. and GI Haskell Invitational S. He pressed through honest splits in the GI Travers S. Aug. 28 before weakening to third.

Johnny Murtagh chose **Together** over her Ballydoyle stable companion **Misty For Me (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) in both the Aug. 8 G2 Debutante S. and Aug. 29 G1 Moyglare Stud S., and was proven wrong as she trailed that stable companion when third and fourth, respectively, in those seven-furlong Curragh contests. He told *PA Sport*, "She's a very good home worker. She's always shown us that she's got loads of speed, loads of class, but she still has to win a group race.

The most talked-about juvenile in Europe after his smooth debut win over a mile at Newmarket Aug. 13 and 13-length romp in a seven-furlong Doncaster conditions event 15 days ago, he is in the mold of some of Henry Cecil's standard-bearing juveniles of the past such as High Estate (Ire), Be My Chief and Reference Point (GB). His typically understated trainer is keeping a lid on things at present, but jockey Tom Queally is finding it difficult to conceal his excitement. "I've made no secret of what regard I hold him in, but the place to prove it is on the racecourse," he said. "The bookmakers rate him a big odds-on shot and he is going to have to win to justify his reputation. I was very happy with him when I last sat on him on Tuesday on the Limekilns gallops and there will be no excuses." Khalid Abdullah's Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe also told *sportinglife.com*, "He looks like a quality horse and he's certainly shown he's well above average. There's not a racehorse owner in the world that doesn't dream of having that one very very good horse and certainly we have to be hopeful for him."

Lightly raced **Apart** was a rough-trip fifth in his lone start at two, but came back to graduate by 7 1/2 lengths at Churchill Downs May 16. Second in allowance test June 13, he closed ground to be fourth in a NW1X July 4. The dark bay colt prepped for this in the local Prelude S. Aug. 28 and, despite stumbling at the start, got up to win by 1 1/2 lengths. **Hurricane Ike** was second in the GIII Bay Shore S. and captured the GIII Derby Trial S. in the spring. He was being pointed for the GI Preakness S. when he was sidelined by hind end problems. Thrown to the wolves for his comeback in the GI King's Bishop S. Aug. 28, he ran a creditable fourth. The Florida-bred stretches out in his second start back. Undefeated **Golden Moka** kicked off his career with three victories in Panama. Let go at 10-1 in the North American bow in the third leg of Canada's Triple Crown, the July 25 Prince of Wales S., he pressed the pace before drawing off to post the 2 3/4-length upset. Trainer Brian Lynch, who took over the colt's conditioning when he arrived from Panama, told *Daily Racing Form*, "He's a real laid-back, cool dude. If he was a guy, I'd like to hang out with him."

Qualia, off at 3-1 in the GI Ballerina S. at Saratoga, lost all chance when her saddle slipped. The four-year-old bore out badly and finished many lengths last, but exited the incident without suffering any injury and gets another opportunity here. 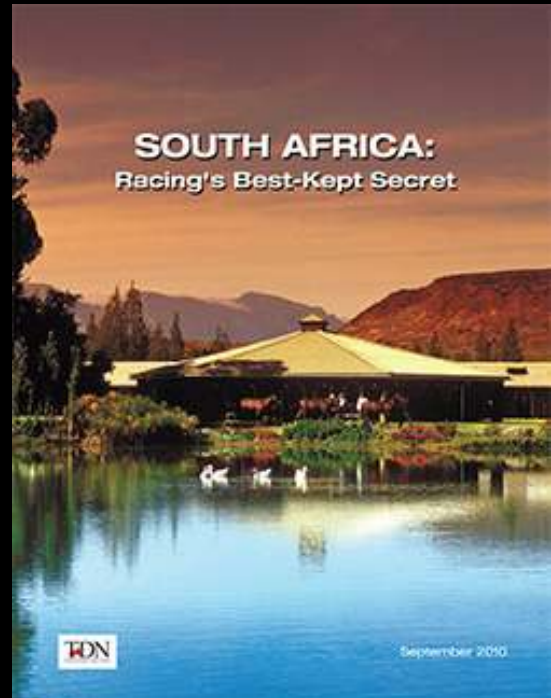

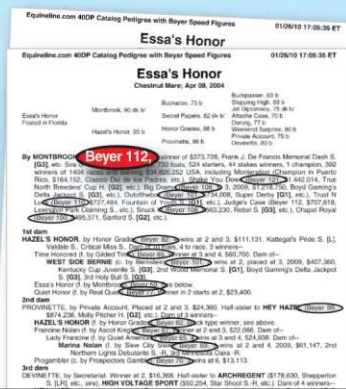

ASCOT UNVEIL NEW CHAMPIONS' DAY Officials at Ascot racecourse yesterday outlined the stellar card that will carry the title of "British Champions' Day" starting next year. Yesterday's delayed publication of the fixture list came with the finalised details of the

end-of-season meeting, to be staged Oct. 15 next year. It will become the country's richest raceday, with more than £3million in prize money on offer. As expected, the central focus will be the G1 Champion S., transferred from Newmarket, with the G1 Queen Elizabeth II

S. and G2 Diadem S. moved from their traditional slot this weekend. Also taken from Newmarket are the G3 Jockey Club Cup and G2 Pride S., with a handicap set to complete the card. "We are delighted to be hosting British Champions' Day, which is the result of the whole racing family coming together to do what is best for the sport," Ascot's Chief Executive Officer Charles Barnett said. "The Champion S. and Queen Elizabeth II S. at £1 million-plus races have the platform to become the world's premier turf events in the 10-furlong and mile categories. We look forward to working with the BHA and our European partners to develop the Diadem, Pride and Jockey Club Cup into Group 1 events as soon as possible." Newmarket's Future Champions' Day will bring the G1 Dewhurst S. and G1 Middle Park S. together for the first time Oct. 8, with the G2 Rockfel S. rescheduled and Ascot's G3 Autumn S. transferred from Berkshire. The G2 Challenge S. and Cesarewitch H. will support the two-year-old main events. "We have worked with Newmarket for many years on several initiatives, and the idea of a climax for the two-year-olds on the Rowley Mile and for the three-year-olds and upwards at Ascot has natural synergy," Barnett added. "Newmarket is the home of racing, and their part in this project is a perfect example of the innovation that they and the Jockey Club have shown throughout their long history in the sport. It is entirely appropriate that the Jockey Club Cup on British Champions' Day reflects their full partnership in this venture." Also announced yesterday was the establishment of the British Champions' Series Limited (BCS Ltd), which will oversee the new "British Champions' Series" that will run from 2000 Guineas day Apr. 30 to Ascot's finale. Comprised of the five separate championship categories of Sprint, Mile, Middle Distance, Long Distance and Fillies and Mares, the outcome will be influenced by the six highest-rated races in each category, with over £13 million available via the traditional meetings at Royal Ascot, Glorious Goodwood and York's Ebor Festival.

Karl Oliver, project director for Premier Racing at Racing Enterprises Ltd (REL), has been appointed chief executive of BCS Ltd. Oliver said, "British racing is the best in the world, but we need to give our sport a major new platform to compete for the public's attention. Britain's richest-ever day of racing is the opportunity to attract the very best British and overseas horses to compete at our top international racecourse. It can be the autumn climax that British racing deserves. By also introducing a series framework, we can highlight and use the best races throughout the Flat season to engage a much wider audience in our sport. In time, British racing can be proud that it backed British Champions' Series and British Champions' Day." Newmarket's Managing Director Stephen Wallis added, "Newmarket's board fully supports the creation of this major new platform for British racing. British Champions' Series will launch on the Rowley Mile, where we will stage two further series races and two more on the July Course. These will be followed by Future Champions' Day, which can become a focus of real excitement in the British racing calendar. It promises a superb climax to the premier two-year-old Flat season, and is a fixture befitting the Home of Racing, where many future champions of our sport are bred and trained." Newmarket will stage a new meeting Sept. 24, which replaces Ascot's QEII fixture and will stage that track's current races the G1 Fillies' Mile and G2 Royal Lodge S. alongside their G1 Cheveley Park S. and G1 Sun Chariot S., which will be run a week earlier.

STORMY ATLANTIC, ZENSATIONAL TO SHUTTLE

Top stallion **Stormy Atlantic** (Storm Cat--Hail Atlantis, by Seattle Slew) and three-time Grade I winner **Zensational** (Unbridled's Song--Joke, by Phone Trick), currently standing at John Sikura's Hill 'n' Dale Farms in Lexington, will join the Haras La Pasion stallion roster in Argentina for the 2011 Southern Hemisphere season. "Hill 'n' Dale has long enjoyed a mutually prosperous relationship shuttling leading sires such as Mutakddim and Indygo Shiner to Argentina," Sikura said. "We look forward to the same success with La Pasion, whom we feel are emerging powers within the Argentine industry. I have visited their farm, and the facilities and people are first class. They are actively breeding and acquiring top mares, and we are all excited about providing access to our stallions in their quest to become a world class stud farm." The sire of 55 stakes winner, Stormy Atlantic is another successful stallion by Storm Cat, who's sirens Bernstein, Pure Prize and Easing Along are making an impact in Argentina. Zensational, the only horse to win three consecutive Grade I sprint races in the U.S., just completed his first year at stud. La Pasion, owned by Ricardo and Nicolas Benedicto, bought over 100 mares in the U. S. over the last few years, with many of them racing in Argentina for leading owner Rubio B. Stables. In 2010, La Pasion acquired a half interest in champion sire Easing Along, and own a major share in Exchange Rate.



RACETRACK Round-Up

Evening Jewel Possible for F/M Sprint...

During an NTRA national media teleconference earlier this summer, trainer Jim Cassidy effectively ruled **Evening Jewel** (Northern Afleet) out of this year's Breeders' Cup, citing concerns about running three-year-old against their older rivals sooner than necessary. It seems he has now had a change of heart. Winner of four of seven starts this season, including the GI Ashland S. on the Keeneland Polytrack and the GII Honeymoon H., the GII San Clemente H. and the GI Del Mar Oaks on turf, is currently being pointed for a start in the grassy GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup Oct. 16, but could cut back in distance and return to the Churchill main track for the GI Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Sprint. "I wouldn't run her against Rachel Alexandra (Medaglia d'Oro) and Blind Luck (Pollard's Vision)," Cassidy told *Daily Racing Form*. "I'd like to try the sprint. People don't realize how fast she is. I think she's a stayer, but she has speed." In her last visit to Louisville, Evening Jewel was nipped at the wire by Blind Luck in the GI Kentucky Oaks Apr. 30.

undercard, running away with a 14 1/4-length debut victory Aug. 28 ([video](#)). Not much of a secret at odds of 4-5, the Repole Stable colorbearer rattled off fractions of :22 1/5 and :45 3/5, and streaked under the wire isolated as a

much-the-best winner, stopping the clock for six furlongs in a sharp 1:09 1/5. The effort earned the juvenile a co-division leading Beyer Speed Figure of 102. Subsequent GI Three Chimneys Hopeful S. hero Boys at Tosconova (Officer) was awarded the same rating in his dazzling Belmont Park maiden victory in July.

"When Todd Pletcher has 80 two-year-olds--and he usually gets some pretty good ones in the barn--and tells you that he thinks that the best one is Uncle Mo, you have to feel pretty good about that," owner Mike Repole revealed. "I watched about 15 of his other maidens start winning races, including a bunch of mine, and with him telling me that he liked Uncle Mo the best, it made me feel pretty good."

Although encouraged by Pletcher's high appraisal of Uncle Mo as well as his promising worktab, Repole wanted to see his charge prove it in the afternoon before making reservations for Louisville, Kentucky next May. **Taking Flight cont. p10**

“It’s a big difference from a four- or five-furlong work-out and prime time before 40,000 people at Saratoga on Travers Day in a 10-horse field,” the co-founder and former president of Glaceau Vitamin Water continued. “Until they spring that latch, you’re really not sure what’s going to happen. We all know that the best horse in the morning isn’t always the best horse in the afternoon, and a lot of things can happen during a race. If you would’ve told me and Todd that the horse was going to win by almost 15 lengths in a hand ride in 1:09 1/5, and run faster during the last quarter than the first quarter, I don’t know if we would’ve guaranteed that.”

He added, “Even though he won on the lead, he really just rated. During the last quarter, Johnny Velazquez just said, ‘Alright Mr. Mo, show us what you got.’ Then, all of a sudden [track announcer] Tom Durkin says ‘Uncle Mo is in front by three,’ and by the time he tells you who is in second through fifth, Uncle Mo is up by 14 lengths. We’ll keep our fingers crossed. Racing’s not the easiest game in the world. It gets you excited and keeps you up at night, but it also gets you excited during the day. I’ve been in the game for six years as owner, and almost 30 years as a racing fan. I’ve been going to Aqueduct since I’m a 13-year-old kid and hoping for a horse like this.”

Uncle Mo heads straight to the big leagues for his next start in the GI Champagne S. at Belmont Oct. 9.

Working in company with last term’s GIII Tampa Bay Derby and GII Pennsylvania Derby runner-up Join in the Dance (Sky Mesa), he breezed five furlongs in 1:00 (2/32) over Big Sandy Sept. 19. Repole made a rare morning trip to the racetrack to get a closer look at the

 in action.

“Todd always jokes that I have the midnight shift and he has the

morning shift,” Repole said. “For me to go out Sunday morning and watch him work, I probably do that about three times a year. He went nice and easy and galloped out well. I look over at Todd and say, ‘Was that a good work?’ He replies that it’s exactly what we want, and when Todd Pletcher says it’s exactly what we want, I got to feel pretty confident.”

Uncle Mo, a \$160,000 KEENOV weanling, was acquired by Repole for \$220,000 as a KEESEP yearling. The 41-year-old credits Jim Crupi of New Castle Farm and racing manager Jim Martin for selecting the son of the multiple-stakes placed Arch mare Playa Maya.

“It’s 1 and 1a,” Repole said of his two man selection team. “All of my yearlings are picked out by Jim Crupi, and my racing manager Jim Martin plays a major role as well. When they called me about Uncle Mo, I couldn’t tell you that I was too excited, after having bad luck with another Indian Charlie colt. Crupi grabbed the phone from Jim Martin, and said, ‘Mike, you *have* to have this horse.’”

Repole decided to take Crupi’s advice and asked Martin to call him back when hip [1193](#) entered the ring. He set a cap of \$200,000.

“We’re on him at \$200,000, and that’s my limit, and it looks like we’re going to get him, then he goes up to \$210,000,” Repole recalled. “Then my racing manager, I got to give him credit, says ‘Mike, let’s hit him one more time.’ We hit him one more time at \$220,000, and, to tell you the truth, if someone would’ve went to \$221,000, they would’ve had him. I remember getting off the phone and thinking, ‘What a waste of \$220,000.’”

Repole added with a laugh, “And now at this last sale [KEESEP], I might’ve bought *two* Indian Charlies.”

While many of Repole’s runners are named after family members, ironically, Uncle Mo isn’t. Repole, a sports fanatic, graduated from St. John’s University in New York with a degree in sports management. His silks bear the same orange and blue colors of the New York Mets, and he continues to strongly support his alma mater’s men’s basketball program. After selling Glaceau for a reported \$4.1 billion in 2007, Repole currently owns Pirate’s Booty Snacks, as well as Energy Kitchen, a chain of health-food restaurants.

“Uncle Mo is a term my friends and I have always used--it means sports momentum,” he explained. “You want ‘Uncle Mo’ on your side--it’s all about momentum.”

‘Uncle Mo’ certainly seems to be on Repole’s side right now. After topping NYRA’s owner standings in 2009, the racing operation went from worst-to-first at the recently concluded Saratoga meeting, leading the standings with 13 victories.

“Our stable’s been around six years, and we were the leading owner in New York with 51 wins last year, but went 0-for-36 at Saratoga,” Repole said. “It was very embarrassing. Being the leading owner in New York, but not winning a race at Saratoga, you should have to place an asterisk next to it. If you can’t win a race at Saratoga, you should be disqualified as the leading owner in New York.

“Nobody remembered that I was 0-for-36 at Saratoga last year, but before the meet started this July, I told everybody. Not too many people advertise their failures, but I wanted to let them know that if I walked away this year with only two or three wins, I wasn’t going to be happy. I wanted to win that title, and we crushed the field. I put the pressure on myself, and put it out there that I was expecting a big meet. I like doing that to myself. You’ve got to talk the talk in life, and I always tell my employees in all my businesses that if you talk the talk, you got to walk the walk.”

Along with the promising Uncle Mo, Repole is also very high on **Stay Thirsty** (Bernardini), who completed the exacta in the Hopeful. The \$500,000 FTFEB two-year-old in training purchase previously annexed his diploma in style at the Spa Aug. 14 ([video](#)). Stay Thirsty is also trained by Pletcher.

“Everyone is talking about Uncle Mo, and Todd and I kind of laugh,” Repole explained. “Obviously, what he did was amazing, and he’s going to the Champagne. I hope he’s the real deal. Other than Uncle Mo, I wouldn’t trade Stay Thirsty for anybody. He’s bred to go 1 1/2 miles, not six furlongs. When I went up to him in the barn the other day, I called him Rodney Dangerfield, because he doesn’t get the respect that he deserves. I think he ran a seven or eight on the sheets last time, and he only lost to Boys at Tosconova by 1 3/4 lengths. When they race again at 1 1/4 miles, I know which one I want.” -SS

The unbeaten Roxy Gap had to put her graded-stakes debut on hold after suffering a setback the morning of Woodbine’s GIII Natalma S. Sept. 18, but the future remains bright for the Eugene Melnyk homebred.

“When we came in the morning of the race, she had some filling in her right hind leg, and it ended up that we don’t know whether it was a bite or a little abscess,” trainer Mark Casse revealed. “At 5 a.m. she had just below a 101 temperature, and by 6:30 a.m., it was up to 102. We pulled the blood on her and her

white [blood cell] count was almost 16,000. By about 9:30 a.m. she was at the clinic in Milton, Ontario. The good news is that she’s just getting back to the barn this afternoon [Friday]. We treated her for four or five days with antibiotics, and we’ll play it by ear. Hopefully, she’ll be able to resume training in the next few days.”

Roxy Gap opened her account with an eye-catching 6 1/2-length debut victory at Woodbine July 3 ([video](#)), then returned on quick notice to handily defeat a full field of Ontario-breds in the Shady Well S. July 18 ([video](#)). Switched to grass and stretched to a mile in an allowance contest Aug. 21 ([video](#)), the bay rolled to a 4 3/4-length wire-to-wire victory, good for a career-best 89 Beyer Speed Figure. If all goes well upon her return, Casse has his sights set high.

“We were hoping to get her back just a touch quicker,” Casse admitted. “We have the [GIII] Mazarine [S. over Woodbine’s Polytrack Oct. 9], but it may come a little too close. We’re also looking at maybe the Jessamine S. on grass [at Keeneland Oct. 14]. It would not be out of the realm for her to possibly make her next start in the [GII] Breeders’ Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf [at Churchill Downs Nov. 5]. Right now, we just want to get her happy and healthy.”

Casse also trains John Oxley’s Delightful Mary (Limehouse), who earned **“TDN Rising Star”** status following a flashy eight-length allowance win going two turns at Woodbine Sept. 12 ([video](#)). The \$500,000 OBSAPR topper was also a good-looking maiden winner in her previous outing Aug. 8 ([TDN Taking Flight](#)). She will line up next in either the Mazarine or Keeneland’s GI Darley Alcibiades Oct. 8.

“Mr. Oxley and I were quite pleased,” Casse said of her allowance win. “It was a very small field and the quality of the field was suspect, of course, but she was very impressive in the way she did it. She ended up not getting a very good Beyer [64], but I don’t think it’s a true indication of her ability. She was really just galloping the whole time. Corey [Fraser] ended up asking her for about 50 yards, and she went from being in front by a length to seven or eight. What really impressed me was that after the race, he couldn’t pull her up. The nice thing about her is that she’s push button. She’ll go when you ask her, and she’s been impressive in what she’s done so far.” -SS

CHRB DELAYS DATES DECISION At its monthly meeting Thursday in Pomona, the California Horse Racing Board put off a decision on the assignment of 2011 racing dates in order to allow for additional discussion about which organization should run the early fall dates in Southern California, *Daily Racing Form* reports. At issue is whether Santa Anita should run its own dates over the six-week period from Sept. 28 through Nov. 6, which are currently assigned to Oak Tree. That organization ran a race meet at Santa Anita from 1996 to 2009, but will run this year at Hollywood Park. The Oak Tree Association's lease with Santa Anita parent company MI Developments was voided earlier this year when Magna Entertainment, the previous parent company of Santa Anita, declared bankruptcy. Oak Tree was subsequently granted a one-year extension by Frank Stronach, but when horsemen united in their concerns over the racing surface at the Arcadia oval, the decision was made to transfer the meet to Hollywood.

Congress Passes Small Business Jobs Act:

(Edited Press Release) The U.S. House of Representatives has passed the amended Small Business Jobs Act (H.R. 5297) by a vote of 237 to 187, affirming changes made to the bill by the U.S. Senate Sept. 16 when the Senate passed the measure. President Obama is expected to sign the bill into law on Monday. The White House pressed Congress for swift action to bring relief to America's small businesses. The Act contains provisions that impact those buying Thoroughbreds or farm equipment this year and next. The Small Business Jobs Act:

- Doubles the current expensing allowance to \$500,000 for 2010 and 2011. The expensing allowance would have otherwise been \$250,000 in 2010, and dropped to \$25,000 thereafter. Also, for 2010 and 2011, the new Act increases the dollar amount of horses and other property that can be purchased to \$2 million before the phase-out of the expensing allowance starts.

- Reinstates 50-percent bonus depreciation for purchases made in 2010. Bonus depreciation had expired at the end of 2009.

"This is extremely welcome news for our industry, especially for sellers who are taking their horses to market and buyers who can realize significant tax benefits in the same year they purchase their bloodstock. Horse farms that purchase farm equipment are likewise eligible for valuable tax breaks," said Alex Waldrop, president and CEO of the NTRA. Added Case Clay, president of Three Chimneys Farm in Midway, Kentucky, "Every little bit helps when buying and selling Thoroughbreds, especially in a tough environment, and to have some of these benefits improved and extended to both buyer and seller is very beneficial to our industry." *For more information, click [here](#).*

DUBAWI ON TOP AGAIN IN MILAN On the eve of today's G1 Queen Elizabeth II S., where Dubawi (Ire) has two live contenders in Makfi (GB) and Poet's Voice (GB), Darley's red-hot sire was at the forefront during the first session of SGA's September Yearling Sale. His hip 50, whose dam is the 2002 G3 Premio Omenoni winner Kathy College (Ire) (College Chapel {GB}), was the subject of a bidding war between Richard O'Gorman and Scuderia Rencati, with the former prevailing at €190,000 on behalf of Darley. The strong February-foaled bay from the draft of Azienda Agricola Rosati Colarieti is a half-brother to Rosendhal (Ire) (Indian Ridge {Ire}), who has twice been listed-placed domestically.

Late in the session, Rosati Colarieti provided another highlight when their son of Ad Valorem--initially bought back--was sold privately to leading buyers Scuderia Incolinx for €130,000. Hip 102 is the half-brother to one of Italy's finest recent exports in Joanna (Ire) (High Chaparral {Ire}), who has added this year's G2 Prix de Sandringham, G3 Prix de la Porte Maillot and G3 Prix Imprudence to her success in the 2009 G3 Prix du Calvados, and was last seen finishing runner-up in the G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest.

Scuderia Rencati earlier paid €105,000 for Razza del Sole's hip 58, a filly named Maria Vezzera (GB) who is from the first crop of Authorized (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) out of a half to the millennium G3 Gallinule S. winner and G1 Irish Derby runner-up Glyndebourne (Ire) (Sadler's Wells). Diego Romeo's Scuderia Incolinx has enjoyed much success of late, with his silks being carried by the reigning G3 Premio Parioli and G2 Derby Italiano hero Worthadd (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}). Apart from the aforementioned Ad Valorem colt, he also acquired Razza del Sole's hip 34, a son of Singspiel (Ire) named Il Gioco (GB) who is a full-brother to the listed winners Zar Solitario (GB) and Solista (GB) for €95,000; Agricola del Parco's hip **85**, the full-brother to Pressing (Ire) (Soviet Star) for €70,000; and Razza del Velino's hip **110**, another by Authorized (Ire) who is a half-sister to the 2001 G2 Premio Guido Berardelli scorer Fisich (GB) (Halling) and three other black-type performers, including last year's listed winner Fumigadelagiusta (GB) (Galileo {Ire}), also for €70,000. **Cont. p8**

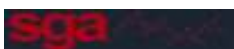

Grizzetti Galoppo Srl matched that sum for hip [73](#), a daughter of Mizzen Mast from the Oriano draft.
